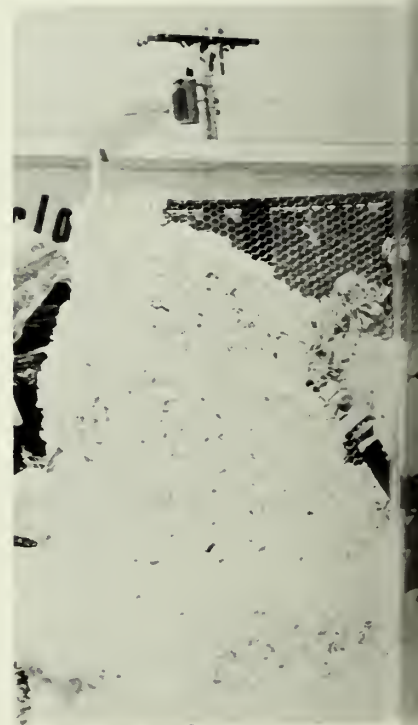


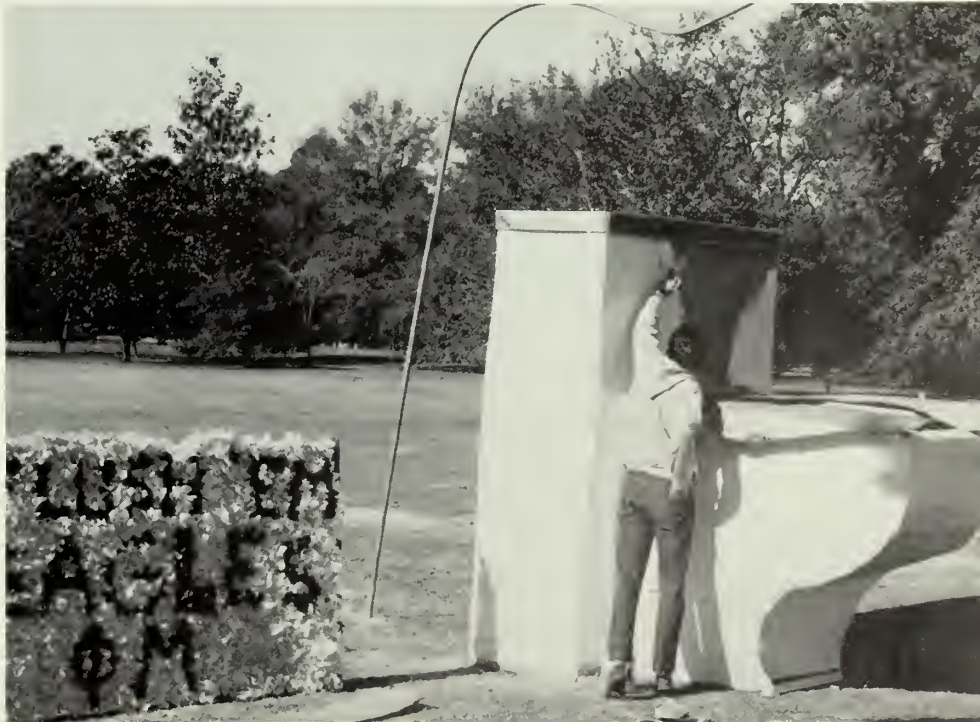
Homecoming '65! Months before January 28 students began planning . . . discussing . . . working . . . and hoping for sunshine. It all culminated in the greatest homecoming ever.

Theta Pi Omega

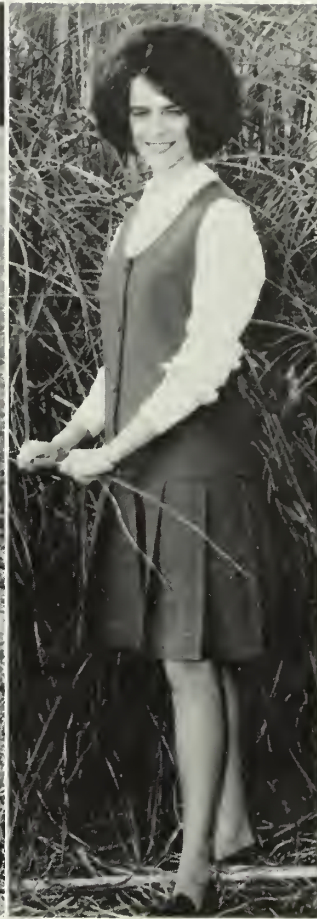
Theta Pi Omega, local service sorority, made its debut on the Georgia Southern campus in January.

The eight charter members banded together to promote leadership, stewardship, scholarship and fellowship among its members.

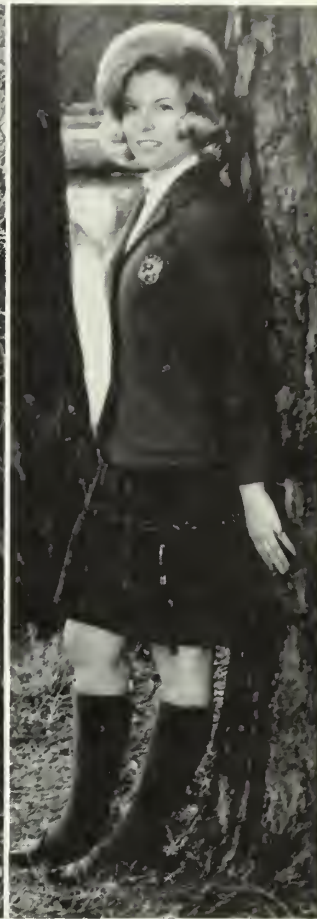

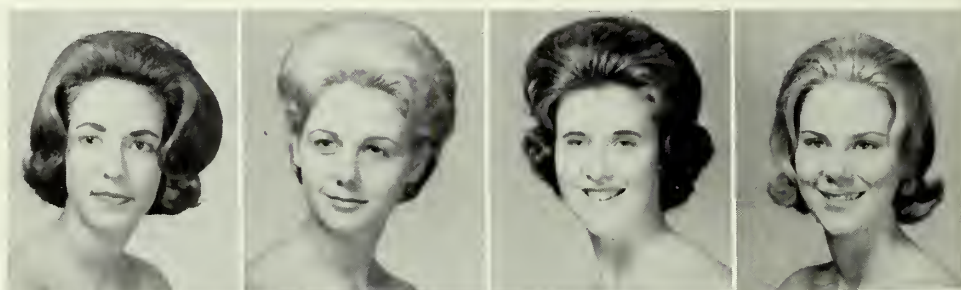


Gamma Sigma Upsilon was established at Georgia Southern College in 1955 as a Big Sister Club. It became a sorority in 1964.

The Circle K club is a service organization for college men operating on the campus and is similar to Kiwanis and other service clubs. It is a leadership and character-building group which serves the campus and the community.

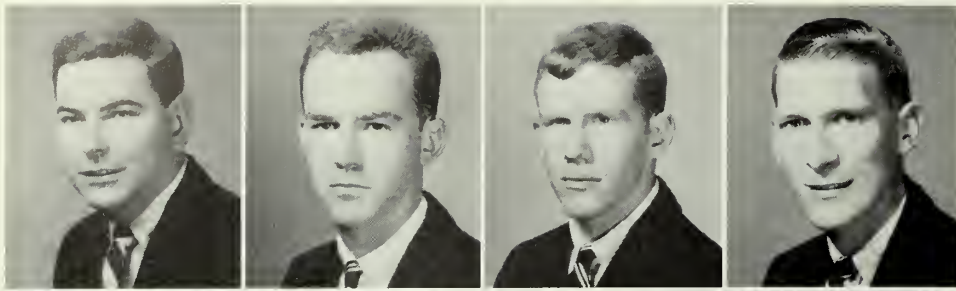

The Division, through the direction of various members of its staff sponsors an intercollegiate debating program, an English club, a French club, a German club, a dramatics club and a literary publication.

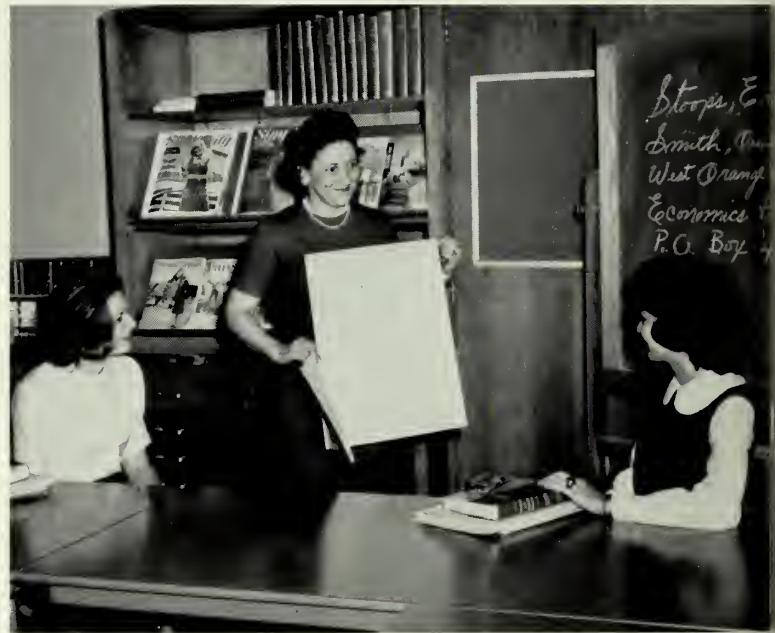
