## The City

Huddled snugly along US 301, Statesboro, Georgia, "the tourist city", thrives on the transients. These passers-through are not only vacationers, but college students who inhabit this otherwise quiet Southern town for a time and then move on.

North, South, East and West converge into the apex of activity as Main Street becomes the focal point of interest and memories for the old timers. The new Statesboro is characterized by the six-lane highway transversing the city and the modern enclosed shopping mall. The burgeoning apartment complexes which are rapidly encircling the college provide a direct contrast to the white-columned homes of Southern aristocracy. The newer subdivisions exhibit all of the symptoms of a growing suburbia. Only a stone's throw away are the reminders of a depression era; bleach-boarded homes with sagging front porches and weedtangled wells.

Finally discovered by the thriving pizza peddlers and hamburger havens, Statesboro has accumulated, in a short time enough of these establishments to satisfy at least one requirement for GSC's "forthcoming" university status. If a burger-fry-and-shake doesn't chase away the Statesboro blues, the frustrated student can get away from it all as Bullock County's lakes and farmlands offer a contrast to the pressures of town and campus life.





## The College

"Down among the murmuring pine trees Where old nature smiles" - the alma mater bespeaks of a Georgia Southern of days gone by. Some of the oncemurmuring pines may now be whimpering as many of their number are cut down for the much-needed roads and buildings on the ever-expanding GSC campus. A pass through the main gates or a spin around Sweetheart Circle, however, assures the fearful alumnus that all beauty has not been sacrificed in the name of progress.

Most people are attracted by the size of Georgia Southern. It seems small enough to make the newcomer feel a part of it, but sufficiently large to keep the freshman confused the first week or so.

One never has much trouble telling the buildings apart. Each new structure seems to have its own distinctive architecture and personality. The "escapes" such as Sweetheart Circle and the lake greatly enhance livability.

The sixty-eight year-old institution which is now Georgia Southern College went through many growing pains to attain its present status as a major Georgia college. A flip through a few old copies of the "Eagle Eye" shows the 73-74 student just how far GSC has come in the area of rules and regulations. The college has certainly come a long way acadmically. With an eye pointed toward university status, the administration has laid the groundwork for an expanding curriculum to keep pace with the growing needs of students.

The closing words of the school song express future hopes: "From the blue and broad Atlantic, Balmy breezes blow, Wafting far GSC's spirit, May she ever grow."





## The People

No matter how many lofty buildings, well-stocked libraries, PhD's or spaceage facilities an institution has, it is the people that make a college. From the friendly Williams Center maintenance man to the President Emeritus, the Georgia Southern non-student population is a study of people. Each has a unique function at GSC and plays a large part in the more permanent personality of the college. By the same token, each student at Southern is uniquely different. Although the preponderance of students come from the state of Georgia, enough people enroll from other states in this country and from abroad to make a varied student population. ## This Way . . .

"Student must present his time card and trial schedule card signed by his faculty advisor to be admitted for registration at Station A. Proceed to Station B. Student will present his time card and receive his registration packet, then proceed to Station C. If the packet is not available, student reports to Station E for assistance. Trial schedule card is validated and time card is picked up at Station C. Proceed to Station D to turn in pink control card and pick up master schedule card. At Station G, secure Landrum box and proceed to Station H or I. Student presents advisement card and obtains course cards at Station H. If a scheduling conflict occurs, go to Station J - others go to Station K. At Station $K$ fill out registration packet and master schedule form. Veterans attending under GI Bill, go to Station L; others go to Station M. Auditors check advisement card with course cards, master schedule card and form. Go through door $N$ to Station O. Student clears housing and the fee card is stamped at Station O. Proceed to Station P. Student clears the Comptroller's Office, and the clerk takes fee and traffic control cards.
