The sole loss of the year came in a September 29 meeting with Connecticut College.

Caulfield and Pitrone captured the \#1 and \#2 Singles Flight Championships, respectively. Fellow underclassmen Kristen Gangemi and Christen Barrasso locked up the \#3
and \#4 Singles spots, while the doubles team of Tara Lambert and Beth Rafanelli triumphed in that category.

With a wealth of returning talent, the expectations for the 1995 season are high. The team hopes to make it a lucky seven for SRU, continuing their dominance of the CCC.
