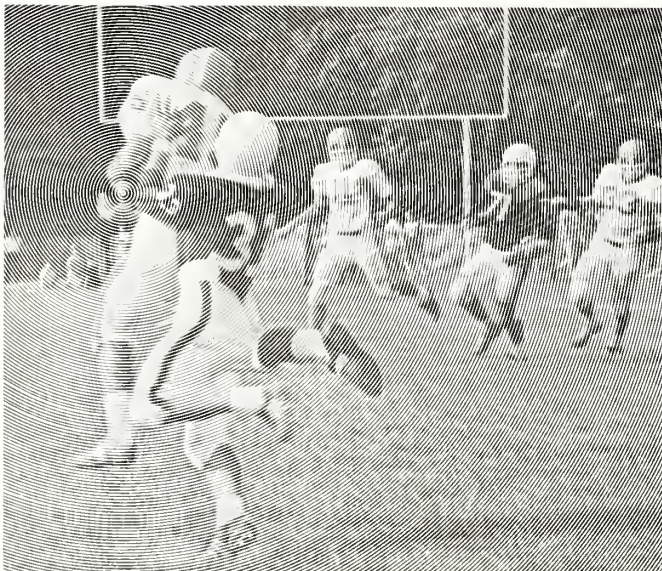


## FOOTBALL

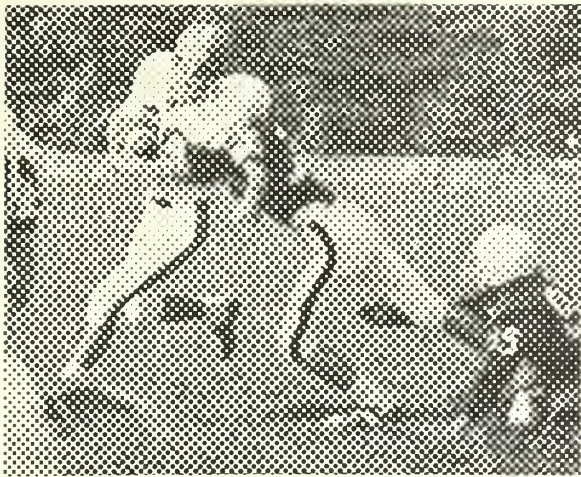

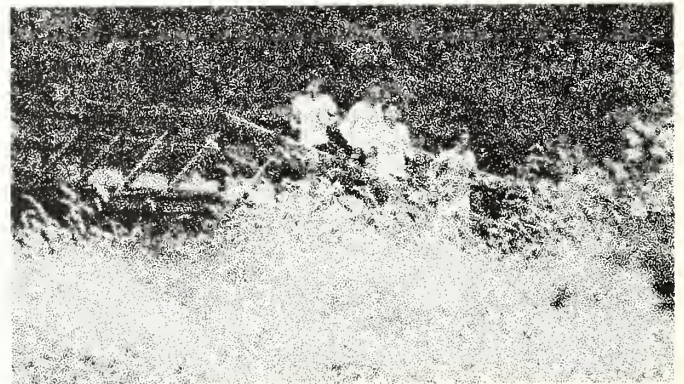


# CROSS COUNTRY

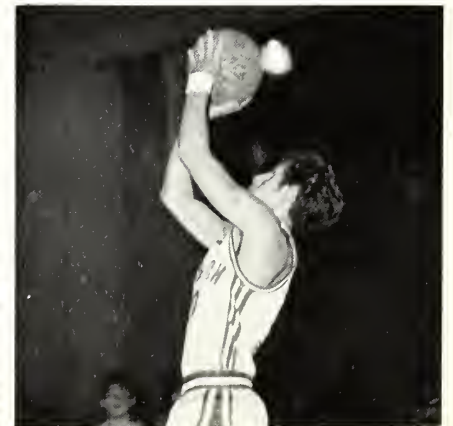
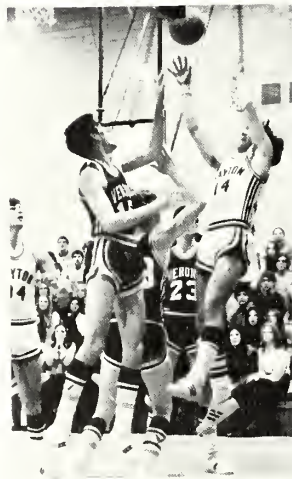
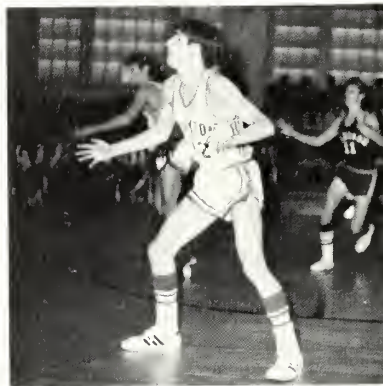
# WRESTLING

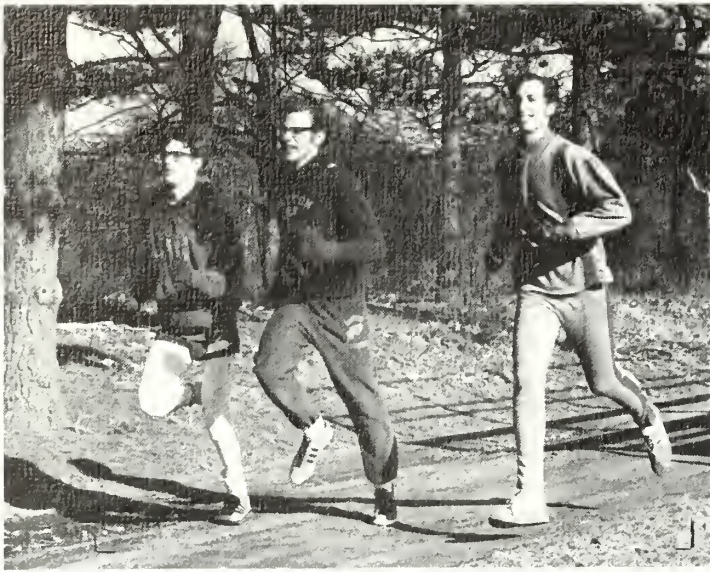
## BOWLING

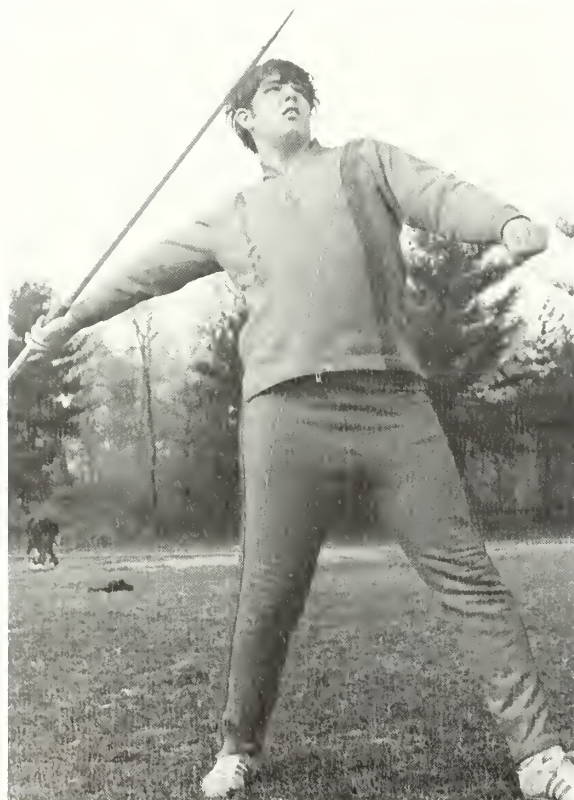


# TRACK
