The Founder.

SIR ANDREW JUDD, Knight, was born at Tonbridge. He became a Skinner and a Merchant of Muscovy, and was Lord Mayor of London in 1550-1. The Charter of the School was granted to him by Edward VI. in 1553, but it is not known in what year Scholars were first admitted.* The Founder died in 1558.

^{*} In Dr. Knox's and Mr. Rivington's Histories of the School, 1558 is given as the date of the appointment of the first Head-Master; but all that can be proved is that the School came under the management of the Skinners' Company in that year or the next. The Founder's Will shows clearly that the School previously existed, but remained in his own hands during his lifetime. There is also evidence, though not amounting to proof, that John Proctor was Head-Master at the time of Wyat's Rebellion in 1554.

Hounders of Exhibitions.

In the following list holders of these Exhibitions will be distinguished by the letters (F.), (W.), (S.)

Henry Fisher, (F), a servant of Sir Andrew Judd, after his master's death not only carried out all his intentions with respect to Tonbridge School, but also himself gave certain houses to the Skinners' Company, out of the rents of which they were to provide an Exhibition for a Tonbridge Scholar at Brasenose College, Oxford.

^{*} Since the death of the Rev. Edward Ind Welldon in 1879, there has been no Second Master, no such post being provided for in the "New Scheme."

- Sir Thomas White, (W), the founder of St. John's College, Oxford, provided that, "in respect of the great love we did bear Andrew Judd, Knight, builder of the Grammar School there," one of the fellowships in his College (which were probationary for the first three years) should always be held by a Scholar of Tonbridge School.
- Sir Thomas Smythe, (S), (grandson of Sir Andrew Judd), founded in 1619 six Exhibitions, to be held for seven years at either of the Universities by Scholars from Tonbridge School.

The "Witworth" in the above list is, undoubtedly, Lord Whitworth, who is known from other sources to have been at the School under Mr. Cawthorn and his successor. The "Hull" in the same list must be Christopher Hull, of Sidcup, to whom Lord Whitworth was fag. Lord Whitworth became an officer in the Guards, and filled various posts at the Courts of Russia, Poland, and Denmark. His seat was at Knowle, where he raised at his own expense the Holmesdale Battalion of Infantry, six hundred strong. He is chiefly celebrated for having been twice publicly insulted by Napoleon, when performing his duty as British Ambassador at Paris during the Peace of Amiens. He died in 1815.

- Ralfs, Edward. 1825-32. Son of Ralfs. Assistant to a surgeon in London. d. about 1840.
- RICHARDS, William Steward. 1822-8. Third son of the Rev. Edward Richards. b. 1808. Head Class, 1826-8. Head Boy. Judd Exhib. Scholar of Jesus Coll., Oxford. B.A. 1831. M.A. 1834. Ordained 1831. Has held curacies at Little Bookham, Fetcham, Stoke d'Albernon and Limpsfield, in Surrey. Since 1842, Rector of Terwick, Petersfield, Hants. Author of "A Verse Translation of the Odes, Satires, Epistles, and Ars Poetica of Horace."
- Robison, C. S. 1819-24. Son of Colonel Robison.
- Selby, Thomas. 1821-5. Only son of the Rev. Charles Bridge Selby. b. 1807. Of Whitley and Wimbush Hall, Essex. d. 1874.
- SNOWDEN, Charles Crowe. 1824-30. Son of Charles Snowden, M.D. Head or Sixth Class, 1828-30. Head Boy, 1829-30. Judd Exhib. Worc. Coll., Oxford. B.A. 1834. M.A. 1838. Ordained 1835. Held curacies at Hove, Charlton by Dover, Broadstairs, Ramsgate, and Newcastle-on-Tyne; and the Vicarage of Mitford, Northumberland. d. 1880.

STONE, Gideon. 1824-5. Son of R. Stone.

Taylor, Charles. 1825-7.

- Thomas, Francis Burdett. 1819-27. Second son of William Thomas. b. 1810. Afterwards assumed the name of Kearsey in place of Burdett Thomas. Head Class, 1825-7. Elected to but did not accept a Judd Exhib. Solicitor. Practised in London. Resided at Burstow Hall, Surrey. d. about 1881.
- Thomas, Thomas Kearsey. 1824-31. Third son of William Thomas. b. 1814. Sixth Class, 1829-31. Judd Exhib. St. John's Coll., Oxford. B.A. 1836. M.A. 1837. Ordained 1839. Formerly Curate of Cusop, Herefordshire. Since 1860, Rector of Winforton, in the same county, and Chaplain to the Earl of Roden.
- THORPE, William Thomas. 1821-7. Son of William Thorpe. Wine merchant at Hastings. Resided at Battle. d. about 1840.

WAITE, Henry. 1822-6.

Ward, Charles. 1825-9. Son of William Ward. Went to India. d. some years ago.

- Ward, Thomas. 1823-5. Son of William Ward. Member of the Royal College of Surgeons. Retired. Resides at Southampton.
- West, James John. 1818-25. Second son of J. E. West. Head Class, 1823-5. Head Boy, 1823-4. Judd Exhib. (the first elected). Scholar of Jesus Coll., Camb. B.A. 1829. M.A. 1832. Ordained 1831. Rector of Winchelsea. d. 1872.
- West, William Ashburnham. 1818-25. Eldest son of J. E. West. b. 1807. Head Class, 1824-5. Private gentleman. Resided at Tonbridge. J.P. and D.L. for Kent. d. 1881.
- Wise, George. 1825-31. Eldest son of George Wise. Tonbridgeware manufacturer. Resides at Tonbridge.
- WOODGATE, Francis. 1822-7. Son of Francis Woodgate. Succeeded his father in the Underriver Estate, but latterly lived and died in London.
- Woodgate, Henry. 1822-7. Son of Francis Woodgate. Solicitor in London, and afterwards at Romsey, in Hampshire. Died at Bexley Heath, Kent.

- Auchmuty, Samuel Forbes. 1826-30. Head or Sixth Class, 1823-30. Brasenose Coll., Oxford. Fisher and Hulme Exhibitioner. B.A. 1834. M.A. 1836. Ordained 1838. Curate of Walcot Church, Bath, and then of Elm, Somerset. From 1840 to 1867, Curate-in-charge of Broad and Little Blunsdon, Wilts. On Broad Blunsdon being made a separate Rectory, Mr. Auchmuty became the first Rector, and died there shortly after restoring the Church.
- BAKER, Arthur. 1826-35. Son of Robert Baker. b. 1817. Sixth Class, 1833-5. Judd Exhib. Wadh. Coll., Oxford. Held the Curacies of Trinity Church, Marylebone; Aylesbury; and All Saints, Marylebone. d. 1868.
- Knox, Vicesimus. 1826-32. Eldest son of the Rev. Thomas Knox (Head-Master of Tonbridge School, and son and grandson of his two predecessors). b. 1816. Possessed remarkable powers of extempore oratory. d. 1832.
- RAINIER, Daniel. 1826-34. Entered the 98th Foot, 1836. Served with the Expedition to the North of China in 1842, and was present at the attack and capture of Chin Kiang Foo and the landing before Nankin (Medal). Commanded a division of the Bengal Army. Major General, 1867. d. 1871.
- SMYTHE, George Augustus Frederick Percy Sydney (Honble).
 1826-8. Eldest son of the sixth Viscount Strangford. A lineal descendant of Sir Andrew Judd, whose daughter, Alice, married Thomas (Customer) Smythe. One of their sons was Sir Thomas Smythe, a great benefactor of the School. The Honble. G. A. F. P. S. Smythe was afterwards at Eton and St. John's

Coll., Camb., where he was noted as a speaker at the Union Society's Debates. He was afterwards one of the three leaders (the other two were Lords Powys and John Manners) of the Young England Party. He is said to have been the original of the character of Buckhurst in D'Israeli's "Coningsby." He was elected Member of Parliament for Canterbury, and became an Under-Secretary of State. - Carruthers, Frederick Fraser. 1826-32. Second son of John Carruthers. b. 1816. Went to some college at Oxford. Called to the Bar at Lincoln's Inn. Practised as a Barrister and Solicitor at Toronto, in Canada, where he died.
- FAUNTLEROY (assumed the name of Malcolm), Henry. 1826-8. Smythe Exhib. St. John's Coll., Camb. B.A., 1833
- Hunt, Edward. 1826-7. Second son of Anthony Hunt. Formerly a merchant at Maidstone, now a merchant in London.
- Hussey, Edward Law. 1826-8. Second son of William Hussey (Mayor of Maidstone, 1838). b. 1816. Was afterwards at school at Brighton. Admitted a Solicitor in 1838, and practised at Maidstone. Afterwards took up Medicine as a profession, and became a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons in 1849. Has been successively Surgeon-Accoucheur to the Finsbury

St. Alban Hall, Oxford (afterwards of Hertford College). B.A., 1835. M.A., 1838. Hon. D.D., 1856. In Holy Orders. Consecrated Bishop of Kingston, Jamaica, 1856; with charge of the Diocese of Jamaica from 1872 to 1879. Now retired. Resides in France.
- DE LUSIGNAN, George Frederic. 1827-32. Eldest son of the Rev. Michael William de Lusignan. Formerly a Schoolmaster. Resides in London.
- DE Lusignan, Henry Adolphus Fitzroy. 1827-32. Second son of the Rev. Michael William de Lusignan. Died, in Australia, about 1859.
- Haddan, Charles Whitby. 1827-32.
- Knox, Thomas. 1827-38. Second son of the Rev. Thomas Knox, D.D. (Head Master of Tonbridge School, and son and grandson of his two predecessors). b. 1819. Sixth Class, 1834-8. Served in the Kaffir War, 1846-7; the Insurrection of the Boers and Relief of Boem Plaats, 1848 (wounded); the Kaffir War, 1852-3 (medal); the Crimean War, when he took part in the Battles of Alma, Inkerman, and the Siege of Sebastopol (mentioned in despatches). - Rowsell., Thomas James. 1827-33. Youngest son of Samuel Rowsell. b. 1816. Sixth Class, 1831-3. Judd Exhib. St. John's Coll., Camb. B.A., 1838. M.A., 1843. Ordained, 1839. Has been Perpetual Curate of St. Peter's, Stepney; Select Preacher to Cambridge University in 1861-2-3; Rector of St. Christopher-le-Stocks, London; Vicar of St. Stephen's, Paddington, till 1882; since 1881 a Canon of Westminster Abbey. Chaplain and Deputy-Clerk of the Closet to the Queen, and Domestic Chaplain to the late Duke of Sutherland. Author of several collections of sermons.

- STREATFEILD, Francis Stanier. 1827-31. Seventh son of Henry Streatfeild. Formerly of the Bank of England. Has retired, and resides at Folkestone.
- Ward, Frederick Oldfield. 1827-32. Son of Stephen Scott Ward. Entered the Medical Profession, but did not practise long. Afterwards private secretary to Joseph Hume. "A man of mark in science and literature," and an authority in questions on the Purity of Water Supply and on Sewage. Author of "Outlines of Human Osteology," and many scientific papers. Died at an early age.

- Goldfinch, Henry Robert. 1828-33. Eldest son of Lieutenant-General Sir Henry Goldfinch, K.C.B. (Old Tonbridgian). b. 1817. Sixth Class, 1829-33. Head Boy. Judd Exhib. Trin. Coll., Camb. Sen. Opt. Math. Trip. B.A. 1838. Called to the Bar (Lincoln's Inn) 1842. Formerly of the Solicitors' Department in the Treasury. Has retired, and resides at Rotherhurst, near Rotherfield. J.P. for Sussex.
- Harrison, James. 1828-31. Son of Matthew Harrison (of Croydon).
- HUTCHINSON, Charles Henry. 1828-9. Son of Henry Hutchinson. b. 1817-8. Entered the Madras Artillery, 1834. Served in the suppression of the Indian Mutiny in 1857, including the pursuit of the rebels at Patna. Colonel of the Royal Artillery, 1868.
- King, John. 1828-32. Son of John King. b. 1819-20. d. 1832.

- MUNGEAM, William Martin. 1828-33. Eldest son of the Rev. Glover Mungeam. Sixth Class, 1830-33. Smythe Exhib. St. John's Coll., Camb. Jun. Opt. Math. Trip. B.A. 1837. Ordained, 1837.
