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


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

INTRODUCTION.

The Friars who came to England, devoted to a life of poverty and detachment from the world, in less than a hundred years were occupying some of the highest offices both in Church and State. Their advent aroused opposition and jealousy, and the Black Friars were admitted to the City of Hereford only under pressure from the Pope. In the present register we find a widespread desire to find burial in their cemeteries and to support and enrich their foundations; they are the executors of nobles and kings, their grievances are remedied by special commissions from the Apostolic See¹: within fifty years no less than three bishops of Hereford² were taken from the mendicant orders, all of them statesmen of honour and repute, who had held the most coveted positions the Crown had to offer. Of this popularity and influence the original cause was undoubtedly the evangelical fervour and single-minded piety which characterized the brethren. Thus commended to the attention of the great they were much in vogue as confessors, especially to the higher classes, who could obtain a licence to substitute their services for those of their parish priest. Kings employed them as keepers of their consciences, and their advancement to important and lucrative offices of state became inevitable. But the great advantage the Friars possessed over other ecclesiastics was their mobility; it was a part of their system to move without restraint from one convent to another, they mixed freely with all classes, their dress was at once a passport and a disguise. It was, therefore, natural that they should be employed as agents and messengers where confidence and intelligence were required, and as a necessary consequence they were involved in most of the political movements and intrigues of their time. The career of John Gilbert well illustrates this; a simple Dominican friar, he held in succession the bishoprics of Bangor, Hereford, and S. David's, was Chancellor of Ireland, Lord Treasurer of England, and for several years a member of the commission which governed the realm of England in the name of Richard II. There is no evidence that this success was attained by any unworthy

means, either intrigue or the following the fortunes of a faction, nor had wealth or family influence any part in it. His name is doubtfully given as Gilbert, Gilberd, and Gilberts, and the only notice of his relatives is a licence to his sister, Margaret Gilbert, to have an oratory within the diocese of Hereford.¹ It may be concluded that he was a man of character and ability, who owed to his order the opportunity which was used to such good purpose.

Gilbert was translated from Bangor to Hereford in 1375, after a rule of only three years. From the first he was immersed in high politics, and committed the administration of the diocese very largely to his vicars general. Till 1386 he managed to fulfil the special functions of a bishop; in that year his political career reached its climax, and he was compelled to appoint a suffragan. The general discipline of the diocese did not suffer from this enforced absence of its head, the visitations of deaneries and monasteries seem to have been systematic, irregularities of the clergy, as in the case of the vicars of Monkland² and Clifton,³ were punished by removal from their cures, absentees were sternly recalled to their duties⁴, and in smaller matters there is evidence of a strict and minute control. Thus William Mody was not permitted to exchange his benefice of Winforton till he had performed a penance previously incurred.⁵

The chancellorship of Ireland, conferred on the bishop 8th April, 1380,⁶ was the gift of the ministers of the Crown, but on October 23rd, 1386, the king himself appointed him treasurer of England. The chancellor and the treasurer were the two great executive officers of state, and in changing them at will Richard thought to throw off the control of those who had hitherto directed his government. The attempt was short-lived, and in the following November he was compelled to delegate his royal authority to a commission of fourteen, which for two years practically ruled the country in his place. In this commission, though it was composed of persons opposed to the king, John Gilbert, as treasurer, had a place, and during the continuance of its regime retained his office. When in 1389 the king resumed the reins of government he was dismissed from his post, but consoled for its loss by a translation to the See of S. David's.

His position during these years was that of a civil servant of proved ability taking little share in the factions of the time, obnoxious to none of the contending parties, and incurring no resentments or blame. He was employed on an embassy to France in 1384, was executor to the Earl of March,¹ and is constantly mentioned in patent rolls as obtaining pardons for various offenders. After his translation his energies were confined to his new diocese, and unlike many of the political prelates of that age, he retained till his death his honours and his liberty, applying himself to nothing more serious than a reform of the statutes of his cathedral. The choir of the church of his own order at Haverfordwest was chosen to receive his remains when in 1389 death closed his career.

During the period covered by the register the war with France occasionally flickered into flame, though for the most part it had degenerated into a species of brigandage. Prayers were requested from the Church for two expeditions against the French, that of the Duke of Buckingham, the king's uncle, into Brittany in 1380,² and the crusade of the bishop of Norwich in 1382.³ The latter had obtained a great reputation for courage and vigour during the rising of the peasantry; he alone of the nobility had taken active measures against the mob, and had in person routed the rioters and repressed all disaffection in the Eastern counties. Urban VI had come to the determination, if possible, to dethrone the rival pope by violence; the bishop of Norwich, the model of a warrior churchman, was marked out as a leader just suited for such an undertaking, especially as the first to be attacked were the French, his country's hereditary enemies as well as the chief protectors of the false pope. Accordingly a papal bull authorized him to raise an army, which was to be rewarded with all the spiritual privileges usually promised to those who fought against the infidel, and the extermination of Clement and all his followers was strongly urged. A campaign in the low countries, where the French were attempting the subjugation of the townsmen of Ghent, began with some considerable success for the bishop, but want of support from England crippled his efforts, and his military career closed in failure and disgrace. At this time England's foreign policy was chiefly concerned with the attempts of John of Gaunt to assert his claim to the crown of Castille and Leon; the Spaniards, as

supporters of the French pope, had been excommunicated, and again Urban dignified the filibustering expedition which the Duke of Lancaster proposed to lead against them with the name of a crusade. He deputed the bishop of Hereford to be his commissary to organize the forces of the orthodox, and permitted him to promise special indulgences and other favours to all who joined or assisted the invading army. Prayers were offered in all English¹ churches for the success of this new holy war,² but in the end the Duke was glad, after a short campaign, to surrender his claims to his daughter, who married the heir of the king of Castille.

The upheaval of the peasantry did not much affect the diocese of Hereford, and the offences recorded which infringed the rights of the Church are of the familiar type; the Ross woods were as usual wasted and despoiled,³ Welshmen committed depredations on the borders, and made no distinction in favour of church property⁴; in the wild deaneries of Clun and Pontesbury the clergy were deterred from publishing the bishop's fulminations by threats of violence and even of death. An outrage of the same kind which occurred in 1383 seems to reveal the existence of a Charlton faction, which resented the exercise of the bishop's authority and the loss of their former power and influence. Thomas de Charlton, of Aston Whitton, not only prevented the vicar of the parish from publishing a monition, but when the bishop's apparitor afterwards served him with a citation for the offence, attacked "the honest man" with a great company of accomplices and "satraps," killed his horse, and was only restrained from murdering him by the entreaties of his servants.⁵ The clergy were not behindhand in violence: the rector of Easthope had to be removed from his benefice for the barbarous murder of the patron of the living with a knife. It was an age of brute force and its offences must not be judged from the point of view of moralists who have long enjoyed the protection of police and the assured redress of the law courts. Even the Church could only gradually leaven a society whose members were engaged in constant warfare both public and private. With the smaller peccadilloes of the flock she had effective methods of dealing, and her arm was long. The backsliders of Ledbury experienced this: they had discovered a method of shortening their religious observances on Sunday by attending the low masses celebrated in the chantries instead of

high mass in the church, and employed the time so saved in secular business and debauchery. Their irreligious device was defeated by a mandate to the chaplains forbidding them to begin to celebrate till the gospel had been reached at the high mass.

Bishop Gilbert has been erroneously credited with the foundation of the Cathedral School,¹ probably from a misunderstanding of an entry in the register. The truth was that in the exercise of his office and as a matter of discipline he restored to its proper work an institution of great antiquity, which for a short time had from special circumstances fallen into neglect. A school was an integral part of the scheme of a cathedral, and Hereford, like other cathedral foundations, had undoubtedly possessed one from the beginning, under the control of the chancellor, who at first taught the scholars himself. Since the translation of Bishop Courtenay the chancellorship had been in abeyance. Nicholas Hereford had been preferred to the office in virtue of a papal provision, but his appointment was afterwards declared uncanonical in consequence of a subsequent papal edict reserving all cathedral dignities to the Pope, which nullified the grace or provision previously granted.² The result was that for 12 years the duties of the chancellor were unperformed, and its revenues collected by Sir Peter de la Mare, the proctor of Nicholas, who allowed wholesale dilapidation of the buildings. During this time the mastership of the school became vacant, and the scholars, for there were scholars, were left without a teacher for a period as to the length of which we are not informed. The bishop, after a formal but ineffectual request to the chancellor and his proctor, filled the vacancy by the appointment of Richard Cornwall to govern the luckless boys *cum virga et ferula*.³ There was no new foundation or endowment, no new office was created, for the appointment is expressly asserted to belong *de consuetudine* to the chancellor, and the existence of a school is implied in the statement that the scholars needed a teacher. There is no evidence that the master's salary was paid from the cathedral revenue, or it might be suspected that the chapter's indifference arose from the poverty which is so often pleaded on its behalf. For the appropriation of Westbury church to the vicars choral it is urged that they have insufficient means of support and are obliged to do field work to eke out their scanty pay.⁴ The king's licence to annex

the prebend of Bullinghope to the deanery is requested and obtained because the dean had no residence in right of his office, as well as no status in the meetings of the chapter. The canons under such circumstances might not have been averse to the temporary suppression of the mastership had it been a source of expense.

Allusions to the Lollards and their propaganda are not so numerous as might have been expected, for the diocese of Hereford was specially tainted with their teaching. The inaccessibility of some of its districts afforded a safe retreat to persons wishing to avoid citations and other processes of the law, and the influence of the Duke of Lancaster, Wycliffe's protector and patron, was specially strong in its south-western borders. There is, however, evidence of a gradual awakening to the danger of their subversive teaching both to Church and State. On August 6th, 1382, a mandate was received from the archbishop for the citation of Nicholas Hereford and Philip Repyndon to appear and answer charges of teaching certain heresies.¹ They had both been clergymen of the diocese, but had become canons of S. Mary's monastery, Leicester, where they could remain in safety under the shadow of the Duke of Lancaster's castle, which adjoined that house. Nicholas Hereford had been appointed chancellor of Hereford by a papal provision on the death of Thomas Hacluit, but was refused canonical possession on a technical defect in the title. It has been unkindly suggested that his opinions were biased by the disappointment, but it is at least as likely that those opinions may have been the cause of the objection taken to his appointment. In 1383 the sheriff received, on the bishop's petition, a writ *quia significavit* to arrest a whole batch of excommunicated and recalcitrant persons, including the vicar of Stoke Bliss,² and in 1386 the king concedes powers to the bishop to imprison heretics without recourse to the sheriff.³ The uncle of Sir John Oldeastle, the Lollard leader, and himself a Herefordshire man, is mentioned twice, in each case as a loyal son of the church: a licence for an oratory is granted him,⁴ and a dispensation to marry a remote cousin's widow⁵; to the latter a John Oldeastle, litterate, is a witness.

Copies of wills are distinctly more numerous than in former registers: the convenience of a registration was no doubt becoming

recognized for reference when disputes arose. When the bishop had passed the accounts of the executors, the whole matter passed from his hands ; the original will was retained by the executors, or any person who could get hold of it, and no official copy was made. The disputes and doubts which ensued caused much litigation ; even in the case of so great a person as the Earl of March, whose will was proved at Canterbury, there was uncertainty as to who were the executors.¹ Sir John Burley, in order to preserve the rights of the beneficiaries, made a tripartite will, and provided that the executors, the Preaching Friars, and the Friars Minor should each retain the custody of a third part. The custom of inserting in the registers the testaments of persons of importance and of those who left large sums for religious purposes, was in later times extended to all wills, till at last separate calendars were kept by the bishop's officials, in which every will proved in his court was inserted.

A noticeable feature in all the wills of the time is the amount, out of all proportion to their wealth, which testators gave to religious purposes and squandered on their funeral rites. They must have been a serious drain on the personal property of the family, consisting as it did chiefly of farm stock, scanty furniture, and a heard of gold and silver coins. The burden was felt by the heirs as severely as the modern death duty, though complaints were silenced in the presence of the supposed needs of the soul of the departed. For the funeral a great banquet was made for all comers, the then large sum of £20 being in one will allotted for this purpose ; to further swell the crowd of mourners each poor person who attended the ceremony was presented with 1d. ; the number of wax tapers in the procession was regulated by the wealth of the deceased and that of the torch-bearers by the number of years he had lived ; the latter were dressed in conspicuous cloaks, often red and black ; ample payment was made to the clergy who joined in the services, and as many as possible were induced to attend by attractive presents. In addition to the actual expenses of the funeral the provision of masses for the deceased, and in the case of the wealthy of permanent chantries, took a large share of his personal property, and must have impoverished the survivors. The disappointment of heirs and the conduct of the idle class of chantry priests account for the hostility which afterwards developed against chantries rather

than any doctrinal considerations. Sir Richard Burley, who left funds for a chantry in S. Paul's Cathedral,¹ was a nephew of Sir Simon Burley, the faithful guardian of Richard II, who fell a victim to the factions of the time the year in which his nephew's will was made. Among those to be remembered in the services was Richard's former captain, Sir Richard Pembridge, whose effigy in Hereford Cathedral is so well known. The foundation of a chantry in Ledbury Church² on a licence obtained from the king by John and Joan Hope, which on account of their decease had to be renewed, recalls the fact that these licences were very expensive, and in some cases cost as much as the lands forming the endowment. A correspondent of Sir John Fastolf in the Paston Letters³ enlarges on this subject, and mentions an ingenious expedient for avoiding the extortion:—"As touching the college ye would have made, Sir, it is too great a sum that is asked of you for your licence, for they ask for every 100 marks that ye would amortize 500 marks and would give it no better cheap. And, Sir, I told my brother Paston that my Lady Abergavenny hath in divers abbeys in Leicestershire seven or eight priests singing for her perpetually by my brother Percy and uncle Brooksbys means, for they were her executors, and they accorded for money, and gave 200 or 300 marks, as they might agree, for a priest. And for a surety that he should sing in the same abbey for ever, they had manors of good value bounden to such persons as pleased the said executors, that the said service should be kept up, and for little more than the king asked from them they went through with the said abbots, and I hold this way as good as that other. Ye may commune with your council thereof." It is evident that the foundation of a chantry was a costly matter and could only be undertaken by persons of wealth without family claims. The accessories were also expensive; though the Ledbury chantry was on a modest scale the missal was valued at 8 marks and a set of vestments at 40s.,⁴ a much greater sum than the priest's annual income. As a consequence many chantries were insufficiently endowed, and wheu from any cause their ordinary income was reduced the services had to be given up. At Ross the bishop was requested⁵ to permit the amalgamation of two chantries in the church, one founded by John Ross, bishop of Carlisle, and

the other by a town guild, neither of which could from its own funds support a chaplain.

Much space in this as in the other registers is occupied with proceedings connected with the taxation of the clergy and the collection of the tenths. The clerical order possessed the privilege not only of voting the subsidies to the king from ecclesiastical property but of collecting them without the intervention of lay tax-gatherers. The bishops, in the exercise of this right appointed, each in his own diocese, prominent ecclesiastics, or more usually religious houses, to levy the tenths granted by Convocation. Any clerical person or body who possessed property in the diocese was liable to perform this duty even if his place of residence was outside. There are signs that what was formerly a mark of confidence and honour had come to be considered a troublesome and dangerous burden: the vigilance of the Exchequer prevented the smallest default, and the whole assessment of their district was treated as a Crown debt due from the collectors, who were often entangled in disputes as to the liability of persons claiming exemption on one ground or another. An exemption had to be formally proved and admitted by the Treasury, or the sum involved was debited against the collector, and even though ultimately the exemption was proved to be regular and legal, much labour and worry might have been incurred. The prior of Bromholm, in a letter¹ dated 31st January, 1391, expresses the general feeling in the matter, "for that should glad us more than the commission the bishop of Norwich sent us on Thursday last past to gather the dimes, for that is a shrewd labour for us, a great cost and a shrewd jeopardy." In a later register it is even suggested that Bishop Marshall had appointed the abbot of Tintern a collector out of sheer malice, and the king interfered to relieve the prior of Malvern, who had the duty imposed on him in two dioceses at the same time. The prior of Leominster was excused *ad instanciam procerum regni*.²

The first recorded ordination of exorcists by a bishop of Hereford took place at Bromyard in 1380, and of the six candi-

dates four at least of them came from the neighbourhood of Leominster. Their principal office was to expel devils from the insane, and the bishop placed a book of exorcisms in their hands with the words "Receive it, and keep it in remembrance, and have power to lay hands on energumeni, whether baptized or catechumens."
