TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Antrim, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on the 12th day of March, 1968, at ten o'clock in the morning to act upon the following subjects:

The Polls will be open at ten o'clock in the morning and close at six o'clock in the afternoon.

The Articles in the Warrant will be taken up at seven o'clock in the afternoon.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers, Agents and Trustees for the ensuing year.

2. To hear the reports of the Auditors on the Town Officers' accounts, and act thereon.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower its Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) for Summer Maintenance of Roads and Bridges, including surface treatment and maintenance of tar roads, for the ensuing year or take any other action thereon.

5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) for Winter Maintenance of Roads and Bridges for the ensuing year or take any other action thereon.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nine hundred thirteen dollars and forty six cents (\$913.46) in order to obtain from the State Highway Department the sum of six thousand eighty nine dollars and seventy two cents (\$6,089.72) to be used for Town Road Aid or take any other action thereon.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to support the Monadnock Region Association. – Monadnock Region Association

8. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue as a public highway a small portion of the Whitten or Stage Road, so-called, running easterly from Route #31 near the Rablin residence, said discontinued portion being approximately a little more than two hundred (200) feet in length and starting at the east side of Route #31 and to authorize and empower the Selectmen to convey by deed the discontinued portion of highway and land of the Town surrounding said discontinued portion of highway to Richard L. and Jessie H. Rablin, in consideration of the conveyance to the Town by said Richard L. and Jessie H. Rablin of a new roadway to replace the discontinued portion of said Whitten or Stage Road, and to accept as public highway that new portion of Whitten Road as conveyed to the Town by said Rablin, and located on the north boundary of land of Buxton and running easterly from Route #31, approximately two hundred (200) feet to a point where it joins the old Whitten Road, or to take any other action thereon. - Selectmen

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Tennis Court on Jameson Avenue and built by the Chamber of Commerce, on Park Land already belonging to the Town of Antrim or take any other action thereon. — Antrim Chamber of Commerce

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed one thousand two hundred seventy five dollars (\$1,275.00) for the purpose of purchasing a Grace two way street sweeper or take any other action thereon. — Selectmen

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) for the purpose of reappraising the real estate in the Town of Antrim; three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) to be appropriated at the 1968 Town Meeting, and three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) to be appropriated in the 1969 budget or take any other action thereon. — Selectmen

12. To see if the Town will vote to increase the salary of the Tax Collector to seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.-00) or take any other action thereon. – Selectmen

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) for maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year, or take any other action thereon. — Fire Commissioners

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,-500.00) to be used to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of purchasing a new fire truck at such time as it becomes necessary, or take any other action thereon. — Fire Commissioners

15. To see if the Town will vote to adopt as a Town Ordinance the regulations in regard to subdivision and development as outlined and recommended by the Planning Board and printed in the Town Report, or take any other action thereon. - Antrim Planning Board

16. To see if the Town will vote to adopt as a Town Ordinance the recommendations of the Antrim Planning Board in regard to the acceptance of new town streets and highways or take any other action thereon. – Antrim Planning Board

17. To see if the Town will vote to have a committee of seven appointed to gather material for an historical narrative of what has transpired in Antrim during the period extending from the date of the Cochrane History of 1877 to the present date and raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the purpose of defraying the expense of said committee, or take any other action thereon. — Ellerton H. Edwards, Byron C. Butterfield

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) for the purpose of constructing parking lot guard rails, and a 12 foot by 20 foot bath house together with toilets and sanitary disposal facilities, said amount to consist of three installments of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) each for the years 1968, 1969, 1970; the raising and appropriation of said sum to be contingent upon additional sums being made available for the same purpose as follows: Antrim Lions Club – \$1,200.; Land & Water Conservation Fund – \$2,700.; all in accordance with plans and specifications on exhibit at this annual meeting, or take any other action thereon. – Antrim Conservation Commission, Antrim Lions Club

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for aerial photo coverage of the Town, said photos ($40'' \times 40''$) to be on a scale of one inch to equal 400 feet for the use of Town Officers and Agencies to facilitate preparation of a land ownership map and aid in other planning and development activities of the Town; said photos to be suitably mounted on a wall map rack and to permanently remain in the Selectmen's Office, or take any other action thereon. — Antrim Conservation Commission

20. To see if the Town will vote to establish as an ordinance of the Town of Antrim, the following: No trailer or mobile home shall hereafter be located or relocated within the Town of Antrim; unless the same shall be in a duly established and licensed trailer or mobile home park, or unless a person desiring to locate, or relocate a trailer or mobile home not in such a park, shall, upon petition and public hearing, obtain the permission in writing of the Selectmen and the Planning Board meeting as a joint Board of the Town; said party shall have a right of appeal as set forth in Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 31, Section 74 and following as if said joint Board were a board of adjustment, PROVIDED **NEVERTHELESS**, that this provision shall expressly not apply to any trailer or mobile home which is used as a dwelling and located within the Town of Antrim on the effective date of this ordinance; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that a temporary location of a trailer or mobile home for a period of one year shall be granted by said joint Board for the purpose of providing shelter for the owner while building a permanent residence, or take any other action thereon. - Antrim Planning Board

21. To see if the Town will vote to accept the report prepared by Anderson-Nichols & Company, Inc., Consulting Engineers, dated March, 1967, entitled "Preliminary Report on Sewerage and Sewage Disposal System" or take any other action thereon. – Sewerage Study Committee

22. To see if the Town will vote to approve the recommendation of the Sewerage Study Committee and to establish a committee consisting of the Selectmen and the Sewerage Study Committee to carry out and implement said recommendations, to authorize said committee to prepare proposed agreements with the Town of Bennington for the receipt and treatment of sewerage from the Town of Antrim and to work with Bennington to determine the location of a treatment facility and to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the expenses of said committee, or take any other action thereon. – Sewerage Study Committee

23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to file in behalf of the Town of Antrim an application (in form and manner required by the United States and in conformity with P.L. 560, 83rd. Congress) and do whatever else may be required for an advance, in the amount not to exceed seventy thousand dollars (\$70,-000.00) to be made by the United States to said Town of Antrim to aid in defraying the cost of final report, plan and engineering preparation for sewerage collection and sewerage treatment facilities for the Town of Antrim, and to take any other action therein. – Sewerage Study Committee

24. To see how much money the Town will raise for statutory requirements and carry the above articles and appropriations of the School Meeting into effect.

25. To hear the reports of Committees and act thereon.

26. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

The Planning Board decided early in the year to work on a feasible Subdivision and Development Plan to be submitted to the Town this year.

After meeting with the Hillsboro and Deering Planning Boards in April, at their invitation, we felt a real necessity for presenting to the Town an Ordinance for Regulations of trailers, mobile homes and trailer parks.

A Special Hearing was called prior to the Special Town Meeting held on August 1, at which time the article regarding location and relocation of trailers was defeated, and the article to license trailer parks was passed.

Byron Butterfield was appointed for a five year term to the Planning Board and was again elected chairman. Stanley Tenney was appointed for a term of three years to fill the unexpired term left open by the resignation of Mrs. Eleanor Lane.

The Board accepted an invitation from the Selectmen in Hillsboro to join a survey of available men and women for employment in our area.

A decision was made to present to the Town a plan for proposed subdivision and Development Regulations at the Town Meeting in March to be preceded by a Special Hearing on February 29.

Three proposals will be included in the Town report:

1. Proposal for Subdivision Development. "We recommend the passage of the subdivision proposal."

2. Proposal for adoption of acceptance of new town streets and highways. In compliance with a vote taken at the Annual Town Meeting, March 14, 1967, the Antrim Planning Board makes the following recommendations. "That all new street or highways of the Town shall, before acceptance by the Town, meet with the satisfaction of the Selectmen in regard to construction and have a minimum right of way of fifty feet and dead end streets be equipped with a turn around at the end of the street with a minimum radius of sixty feet from the center of the outside edge of the right of way.

3. Proposal for Ordinance for location and relocation of trailers and mobile homes. At our February meeting we had as our guest Mr. Kenneth Reynolds, Executive Secretary of the Monadnock Region Association who was able to supply us with much valuable information. We hope to have Mr. Reynolds back again in the near future.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION REPORT

During the past year Antrim Conservation Commission has concentrated its efforts towards the recreational needs of the Town, particularly with reference to sanitary facility requirements for the public beach at Gregg Lake.

Bath house and toilet accommodations there have long been recognized as a necessity. Recent regulations (July 1966) by the Water Pollution Commission, Bureau of Sanitary Engineering have brought this matter into sharper focus. In its handbook "Regulations Pertaining to Public Swimming Pools and Bathing Places", Regulation 1 states "... these regulations to include all places conducted under the auspices and management of any municipality, corporation, company, etc. ..., and open to the public, whether on a fee or free basis, ... together with shores, buildings, equipment and appurtenances pertaining thereto."

Regulation 7 states "Toilet facilites, conveniently located for use immediately before entering the public pool or bathing place shall be provided for both sexes. One toilet and one urinal for every 60 males and one toilet for every 40 females shall be provided.

As a means of providing these facilities at minimum cost to the Town, your Commission has investigated the opportunities of financial assistance obtainable through the Land and Water Conservation Fund which provides monies to municipalities, on a matching basis, for developing lands and waters for outdoor recreation. We are preparing the necessary plans for presentation to the State Office of Planning in order to obtain qualification status. Upon approval by the Office of Planning, and with favorable action by the voters of Antrim, the Town is then eligible for this assistance.

Accordingly, we have submitted an article in the warrant asking the Town to raise and appropriate funds, but contingent upon additional sums being made available from the Antrim Lions Club and the Land and Water Conservation Fund.

Assurance has been given us by the State Office of Planning that the nature of our needs is consistent with the intent and purpose of the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act. With prompt application for these funds we might, therefore, expect financial assistance to be forthcoming following the July 1968 allotment of Land and Water Conservation Funds to the State of New Hampshire.

As another project we are also recommending the procurement of aerial photos to give complete coverage of the Town. These may be used in preparation of a land ownership map of taxable properties as well as having many uses in the planning and administrative activities by Town Officers and Agencies. Accordingly, an appropriate article has been entered in the Town Warrant.

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SEWAGE STUDY COMMITTEE ON THE ANDERSON-NICHOLS PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING STUDY ON STREAM POLLUTION

At the 1967 annual town meeting the sewage study committee was authorized and instructed to study the preliminary engineering study of our stream pollution problems made by Anderson-Nichols, Inc., and to explore with the proper representatives of the town of Bennington and the Monadnock Paper Mills, Inc., the possibility of making a joint effort in at least a portion of the project. We have met with representatives from Bennington and from Anderson-Nichols several times during the year. At the conclusion of this series of meetings, both towns asked for the assistance of their respective town counsels, and with their guidance we have established and agreed upon a course of action which we recommend to the town (and which is also being recommended to the town of Bennington).

We are also printing in the town report, along with this report, a summary prepared by Anderson-Nichols, of their preliminary engineering survey together with their recommendations. This committee has unanimously agreed upon the soundness of their recommendations, as have the Bennington Planning Board and Selectmen.

We recommend:

1. Acceptance of the recommendations of the engineering survey of Anderson-Nichols, which concludes that reclassification of the Contoocook River as B-1 will require that the town establish a sewage collection system and treatment facility; and that joint action with the town of Bennington and Monadnock Paper Mills, Inc., to establish and operate such a system would be the most economical and practical means of meeting these requirements.

Therefore we have included in the town warrant articles to authorize the study committee and the selectmen to take the necessary next steps to carry out these recommendations. Under these articles we ask for authority to:

- 1. Retain counsel to guide and assist us.
- 2. Determine upon the course of action.

3. Draft terms of agreement between the Towns of Antrim and Bennington, and with Monadnock Paper Mills, Inc.

4. Investigate and make recommendations as to the acquisition of the necessary land.

5. Negotiate an agreement covering the allocation of operating costs between the three parties.

In addition, in order that we do not lose too much time in the face of constantly mounting construction costs, we would recommend that, if it be the pleasure of the town meeting, the final article relating to this problem be acted upon at this time. This article authorizes the application for an interest-free loan from the Federal Government with which to complete the final planning and engineering.

We recognize that this is a most serious undertaking, but we have no choice but to conform to the state and federal requirements, and the benefits and savings from a joint approach make the sensible solution for all concerned.

SYNOPSIS OF CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDA-TIONS FROM PRELIMINARY REPORT ON SEWERAGE AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL, TOWN OF ANTRIM, N. H.

Preliminary reports on sewerage and sewage disposal have been completed for the Town of Antrim and the Town of Bennington, New Hampshire, by Anderson-Nichols & Company, Inc., of Concord.

Principal conclusions and recommendations for the Town of Antrim are as follows:

1. The need for adequate sewerage facilities is evidenced by the direct discharge of sewage into storm drains, the Great Brook, and other small brooks which drain to the Contooccok River.

2. The need for adequate sewerage facilities is imperative to eliminate pollution, health hazards, and to comply with the New Hampshire Legislature's classification of the Contoocook River. The installation of a sewerage system could also stimulate further development of Antrim and serve to attract new industry.

3. The population trends indicate that a design population of 1500 is reasonable. The average design flow of sanitary sewage is estimated to be 180,000 gallons per day.

4. Sewage must be pumped to the treatment plant due to topographic limitations which restrict complete gravity flow.

5. Oxidation ditches offer the best method of sewage treatment for the municipality by itself, because they offer advantages in construction and operating costs and because a site is available between the Village and the Contoocook River.

6. The most economical scheme for the Town of Antrim would be a joint treatment facility with the Town of Bennington and the Monadnock Paper Mills, Inc., located in Bennington in the open area north of Mill Road between the river and the Mill. The advantages of a joint facility to Antrim are savings in first cost and operating costs, added efficiency of treatment, ease in acceptance of sewage quantity variance and accommodation of future growth of Antrim, and better land use for taxable development. The plant should be designed to handle an average of 1.27 MGD and be constructed above flood elevation of 610. 7. The construction cost of treatment facilities and main pumping stations will be eligible for up to 90% Federal and State grants-in-aid. Federal aid up to 50% of the construction cost of sewers is possible.

8. It is recommended that the first costs and operating costs for joint treatment facilities be prorated to each participant on the basis of flow. The Town of Antrim should be the Owner and Applicant of grants for the planning and construction of the sewers in Antrim and their pumping stations. The Town of Bennington should be the Owner and Applicant of grants for the planning and construction of the treatment facilities and for the sewers and pumping stations in Bennington. Legal agreements between Antrim, Bennington and the Mill will be needed to detail procedures and method of payment of costs by the various participants. Since over 80% of the flow is to be Mill waste, consideration should be given to arrange that treatment plant operation be by the Mill to allow for smoother and less expensive operation.

9. Financing the local share of the project cost by taxation and use charges is the most equitable.

PROPOSED SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS FOR TOWN OF ANTRIM

Section I. Authority

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Antrim Planning Board by the voters of the Town of Antrim and in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 36, Sections 19-29, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, the Antrim Planning Board adopts the following regulations governing the subdivisions of land in the Town of Antrim, New Hampshire.

Section II. Definitions

A. BOARD means the Planning Board of the Town of Antrim.

B. SUBDIVISION shall mean the division of a tract or parcel of land into two or more lots for the purpose, whether immediate or future, of sale or building development, and requiring: (I) the extension of municipal utilities, or (2) the creation of one or more new streets, public or private, or (3) the extension of existing streets; provided however, that development for agricultural purposes is expressly excluded. When appropriate to the context of these regulations, the term subdivision shall relate either to the process of subdividing or to the land or area subdivided. It shall not include a division of land where each resulting parcel fronts on a public street previously accepted or taken by the town.

- C. PRELIMINARY LAYOUT shall be a drawing of the proposed subdivision, together with such information as the Board may require.

D. PLAT means the final map drawing or chart on which the subdivider's plan of a subdivision is presented to the Antrim Planning Board for approval, and which, if approved, will be submitted to the Registrar of Deeds of Hillsborough County for recording.

E. STREET means and includes any public or private street, avenue, boulevard, road, alley, highway, and other way exclusive of driveways serving not more than two adjacent lots.

Section III. Procedure

A. Application: Whenever any subdivision is proposed to be made and before any contract for the sale of, or offer to sell such subdivision or any part thereof shall have been negotiated the contractor or owner shall apply in writing to the Planning Board of the Town of Antrim for approval of such subdivision. The application shall conform to the specifications contained in these regulations. Application for approval shall be filed not less than five (5) days before any regular meeting with the Chairman or the Secretary of the Board who shall furnish the applicant with a receipt for same.

B. Preliminary Layout: Three (3) copies of a preliminary layout shall be filed with the Board. The Board will then study the preliminary layout and shall take into consideration the general requirements of the community and the best use of the land to be subdivided and that of adjoining areas.

C. Revision of Preliminary Layout: The Board before taking formal action shall hold discussions with the subdivider or his agents. After such discussion the Board shall communicate in writing within 60 days to the developer the specific changes, if any, which it will require in the preliminary plan, and the amount of construction or improvements it may require as a prerequisite to the subsequent approval of the subdivision plan. The Board may disapprove of the preliminary layout in its entirety, but shall state its reasons for such disapproval.

D. Final Plat: The subdivider, after official notification by the Board with respect to the preliminary plan and the changes, if any, to be made therein, shall within six (6) months thereafter file with the Board drawings of the final plat and street profiles as described in Section VI. The subdivider shall tender offers of cession in a form certified as satisfactory by the corporation counsel of all land included in streets, highways or parks and specifically by him, but approval of the plat by the Board shall not constitute an acceptance by the Town of the dedication of any street, highway, park or other public open space. Before the final plat shall have been approved the Board shall hold a public notice hearing on the plan. Notice thereof shall be sent to the subdivider by certified mail, with return receipt requested, stating the time and place of such hearing, not less than five (5) days before the date thereof, and posted in at least one public place in Town. Known abuttors shall be mailed similar notice of said hearing.

E. Approval: The Board shall, within 30 days from the date of submission of the final plat, approve or disapprove the plat in accordance with Section 23, Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. If the Board approves the plat, the Chairman or Secretary of the Board shall transmit a copy of such approval in writing to the Registrar of Deeds of Hillsborough County.

F. Certificate of Failure to Take Action: The Town Clerk is hereby specified as the municipal officer who shall issue on behalf of the Planning Board a certificate of failure on the part of the Planning Board to take action on approval or disapproval of a plat submitted to it, as provided by Chapter 36, Section 23, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

Section IV. General requirements for the Subdivision of Land

The subdivider shall observe the following general requirements and principals of land subdivision:

A. The arrangement of streets in the subdivision shall provide for the continuation of the principal streets in adjoining subdivision or for projection when adjoining property is not subdivided, and shall be of a width at least as great as that of such existing connecting streets.

B. No street or highway right-of-way shall be less than 60 feet in width and may be required to be more if a greater street width is warranted in the opinion of the Board. The apportioning of the street widths among roadway, sidewalks and possible grass strips shall be subject to the approval of the Board.

C. Except where near-future connections may be possible, dead-end or cul-de-sac streets shall not in general exceed 400 feet in length, and shall be equippd with a turn-around roadway at the closed end with minimum radius of 60 feet from the center to the outside edge of the right-of-way.

D. There shall be adequate width and area on every lot after the erection of a residence to permit the parking within the lot of at least one car for each family dwelling unit.

E. In areas not currently served by public sewer systems it shall be the responsibility of the subdivider or his agent to proved adequate information to prove that the area of each lot is adequate to permit installation and operation of an individual sewage disposal system (septic tank and drain field). If the building complies with the law regarding the State sewage disposal that will apply to this section and will be accepted.

F. Pavements, drainage facilities, curbs, sidewalks when required shall be installed and constructed in accordance with the specifications of the town at the expense of the developer.

Section V. The Preliminary Layout

Subdividers shall file with the Board three (3) copies of a preliminary layout at a scale of not more than 100 feet to the inch showing or accompanied by the following information:

A. Proposed subdivision name; name and address of owner of record; subdivider and designer; date; north point and scale.

B. Name of owners of record of abutting properties, abutting subdivision names, streets, easements, building lines, alleys, parks, and public open spaces and similar facts regarding abutting property. C. Location of property lines and their approximate dimensions; existing easements, buildings, water courses, ponds or standing water, rock ledges and other essential features.

D. Existing water mains, sewers, culverts, drains and proposed connections of alternative means of providing water supply and disposal of sewage and surface drainage.

E. Location, name and widths of existing and proposed streets and highways, and their grades and profiles and the elevations of sufficient points on the property to indicate the general topography of the property.

F. Where the topography is such as to make difficult the inclusion of any facilities mentioned above, within the public area so laid out, the preliminary layout shall show the boundaries of proposed permanent easements over or under private property. Such easements shall be not less than 10 feet in width and shall have satisfactory access to existing or proposed public ways.

G. Location of all parcels of land proposed to be dedicated to public use and conditions of such dedication, and a copy of such private deed restrictions as are intended to cover or all of the tract.

H. Preliminary designs of any bridges or culvert may be required.

I. Where the preliminary layout submitted covers only a part of the subdivider's entire holding, a sketch of the prospective future street system of the unsubmitted part shall be furnished and the street system of the submitted part be considered in the light of adjustments and connections with the street system of the part not submitted.

Section VI. The final plat

A. The final plat submitted for approval and subsequent recording shall be submitted in triplicate. The size of the sheets shall conform to the requirements of the Registrar of Deeds, of Hillsborough County, for filing.

B. The final plat shall show:

1. The proposed subdivision name or identifying title, the name, address of owner or record and subdivider, and the name, license number and seal of the designer, date, scale, and north point. 2. Street lines and names, building lines, pedestrian way, lot lines, reservations, easements, and areas to be dedicated to public use and areas the title to which is reserved by the developer.

Section VII. Amendments

These regulations may be amended or rescinded by the Planning Board not only following public hearing on the proposed change. The Chairman or Secretary of the Planning Board shall transmit a record of any changes so authorized to the Registry of Deeds of Hillsborough County. on December 31, 196 7

COMMISSIONER'S REPORT

The year 1967 has been one of considerable frustration for your Commissioners. We had several projects which we were unable to finish for one reason or another and we went through a period of very unusual conditions in Campbell Pond requiring chlorination far in excess of the normal amount, and resulted in an abnormal number of complaints. We flushed the lines several times due to algae growths in them and an unusual amount of dirt and mud.

On the positive side we were able to complete the new addition to the Chlorinator building and installed a new chlorine (bleach) injector of a new design which has proven very successful in other installations; so far the new unit has performed far more precisely and dependably than the old unit did, even when new.

The amount of water consumed is at an all time high, the average daily consumption during the five normal working days being 143,000 gallons, interestingly enough the consumption drops down during the weekend to a normal rate of 92,500 gallons; the conclusion being that industrial users are principally responsible for the increase. The pipe for the Wallace St. project is on the site and will be laid as soon as the ground is dry enough for ditching. The Pumping Station has been run at intervals during the year to keep the pump in condition and has been used successfully far back flushing the transmission lines.

We have tried to make a concerted effort to collect some of the delinquent water rents with some success and will continue to keep working on this problem.

The only large project for this year is the renewal of the old small iron pipe on Prospect St. This has been in the ground a good many years and may give out at any time. This renewal is consistent with our policy to renew such lines as quickly as possible, and we have included an article in the Warrant to this end.

For the first time in a good many years we felt it necessary to increase the salaries of the Treasurer by \$50, the Auditors by \$3, the Clerk by \$3, and the Commissioners by \$25. Money is also budgeted to increase the care of the Chlorinator to \$2 per trip (9 miles round trip and about 1 hr. at least) which we think is still cheap in view of the service to the Precinct.

In spite of rising costs we have tried to be realistic in the proposed budget and the amount to be raised by Precinct Taxes is slightly over 10% less than last year, and we make the following recommendations:

- 1. That 90% of the established water rents be collected.
- 2. That the Precinct raise \$2,905 62 by taxation.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

To the School Board and Citizens of Antrim:

For fourteen years it has been my pleasure to serve the Antrim and Bennington School Districts and for the most part, it has been fun. Of course, I had my moments of frustration and disappointments but in the long run we seemed to make progress. The districts acceptance of a progressive concept of educational organization is what causes me to terminate my services to the districts as of June 30, 1968 because on the very next day Antrim and Bennington becomes a part of the Contoocook Valley Cooperative School District and will no longer be affiliated with Supervisory Union No. 24 which is under my jurisdiction.

In January, I feel no different than I did in October when I wrote, in preparation for the fall Supervisory Union Meeting, "I view the leaving of Bennington and Antrim with mixed emotions. I am pleased that after several years of various studies, that they have found and entered into a cooperative program. On the other hand, since I have worked fourteen years with these communities, I feel a close affinity for them which I relinquish with reluctance. However, I recognize that progress requires change and I sincerely wish the communities success and happiness as they enter into their new educational opportunity era."

One is tempted to spend the remainder of this report in reminising a bit, but the past is past and it is probably best to look to the future.

It is not generally recognized, but great change is taking place in the field of education today. I will attempt to point out some of these areas of change, but I hasten to indicate to you that I would not do so if these problems were peculiar only to Con-Val. This is not so, every school district in the State will be faced with them.

1. The growing militancy of teachers is just getting off the ground in New Hampshire. In the next few years you will be astounded by the requests from this group. This really should not come as a surprise to you because the salaries which are being offered to these college graduated has been falling farther and farther behind those who choose to enter industry. The teachers have begged their cause for a long time and are now turning to union tactics to satisfy their desires. New Hampshire teachers have read of the success of the city teachers in their endeavors last fall and you will soon be receiving their message "Loud & Clear".

2. A few short years ago (1962 to be exact) the implementation of the Secondary School Standards raised the eyebrows of many citizens when it required a school library in every secondary school in the State. In 1966 the new, "Elementary Guidlines for New Hampshire", recommended a library for every elementary school. Most districts are hard at work trying to build up these facilities and now we find ourselves hit with new thinking in this area. It will no longer be a library but an Instructional Materials Center. Perhaps you don't have much in the way of equipment along these lines at the present, but in the next few years the requests for such will be substantial. What is it all about? Just this: Our electronics wozards have come up with some teaching machines such as the opaque projector, the overhead projector, several kinds of reading machines including micro-film readers and others too numerous to mention. These machines have merit and are extremely helpful teacher's aids. The cost of the machines will be substantial but the procurement of film, tapes, transparencies and the like will tend to be a sizable budget item. However, this is progress and we must keep up with it.

The merging of some of our electronic companies with textbook publishing companies was not done merely to diversify the products of any particular company. Both groups could visualize the possibility of developing some learning techniques that had not been contemplated before. A few instruments have been produced and are in the trial period right now and it will be very interesting indeed to see their contribution to the Instructional Materials Center a few years from now.

3. Last February, at Atlantic City, I made a little speech at a banquet given by the Milton Bradley Company for present and former New Hampshire Superintendents. In it, I made the remark that this was a "red letter" day for the company inasmuch as its stock had reached a new high of $23\frac{5}{8}$ that day. Today that same stock was quoted at 58 on the New York Stock Exchange and it is rumored that these will soon be a 2 for 1 split. The phenomenal growth is no accident. This company has always been the largest manufacturer of educational games and is now reaping its reward for its leadership in this field. Educators are beginning to find that by employing the use of these games that they are able to motivate pupils with whom they had had a difficult time by using traditional teaching methods. Some of these games are simple and inexpensive, some are sophisticated and costly. The idea has caught on and more manufacturers are entering the field. It will be interesting, five years from now to see what impact games will have in the total instructional program. Do not become disturbed when you visit school and find this teaching technique being employed to a considerable extent — you can be assured that learning is taking place.

There are many changes taking place in the areas of curriculum and organizational structure with which you will be confronted in the next few years. Some of it will be good and some of it will be questionable, but the fact remains that great change is taking place. You need to recognize this and be prepared for what ever implications it may hold for you.

In this, my final report to the Antrim and Bennington School Districts, I wish to express my deep appreciation to the many, many, people with whom I have worked for their consideration, patience, tolerance, and cooperation over the years and extend to you my sincere best wishes for the future.

ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Working with a school system for such a short period of time as has been the case with me does not really provide time to get involved to any great degree in a program of consequence. I do not say this apologetically, for the acceptance by the district of the opportunity to join the Con-Val Cooperative is a move that ultimately should yield numerous educational benefits. However, we have worked in some areas with an eye focused on being of service to the school. I should like to comment briefly upon some of these services.

We have held a series of meetings among the principals of the schools in the Union. The purpose of these meetings has been to explore ways in which we could strengthen the school curriculum, improve the coordination of the educational process through the grades and to discuss problems of mutual concern. Through services offered by various publishing companies plans have been made to conduct workshops in reading and science. Consultants for the companies involved will work with the teachers in the aforementioned areas. The hope is to assist the staff in their use of the material in the most effective manner possible in the classroom.

Although the ultimate benefits won't be felt this year we are working towards a program of in-service education through extension courses. Depending upon need and interest at least one course each year would be offered at a convenient location in this area. Even though this district will not be part of Union No. 24 we would continue to make this program available to anyone interested.

Federal Funds continue to help make materials, equipment and services available to the district. Title III of the National Defense Education Act provides 50/50 matching funds for the purchase of equipment in many curricular areas. Under Title II of the Elementary & Secondary Education Act funds have been made available to strengthen school libraries. We have taken advantage of each of these opportunities.

Education faces a period of change unlike anything we have yet seen. Every decision affecting the school system must be predicted not only upon the immediate, but upon what it will mean ten years from now. The new educational technology, new knowledge about the ways children learn, modern flexible school facilities, teacher militancy, new relationships for the roles of local, state and federal governments in education are some of the things that will have untold effect on the educational decisions we make. If this has a meaning for the community, and most assuredly it does, it is that the school and community must work together if these challenges are to be met. Although it is a much belabored point that children are a precious commodity, nevertheless our concern for their welfare still must be our guide in making this period of educational change our slave and not our master.
