You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said Lee on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways, state aid and trunk line roads.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the School Board and Citizens of Lee:

In the ten years since the adoption of the present school law in 1919, notable progress has been made in education throughout the state. One notable feature of that progress is equalization, whereby the strong communities help the weak ones to obtain approximately equal privileges. The School District of Lee is one of the towns that profits by this state aid. Another feature of this decade of school progress is the lengthening of the school year throughout the state to 36 weeks, with a 3.2% increase in average attendance at the same time. In other words, we have added one and one-third years to the average schooling of children in the small towns by furnishing eight full years of 36 weeks each. Moreover, high school enrollment has increased one-third, or nearly seven times as fast as elementary enrollment. Normal school enrollment has increased from 240 to 294, with a decrease in per capita cost to the state from \$324 to \$135 per student. This has enabled an increase in the proportion of trained teachers from 63% to 83% of the total number. Small districts may now have the satisfaction of knowing that they are able to give their boys and girls an education that can compare favorably with that furnished in larger neighboring communities.

Slate blackboards have been installed at North Lee. If similar equipment is placed in the South Lee schoolhouse next summer, all three buildings will then possess this advantage. I recommend that grading be done around the front of the South Lee schoolhouse.
