To the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

GENTLEMEN,

In obedience to the requisitions of an act of the 30th of March, 1811, requiring the State Treasurer to make report to the Legislature, on the fourth Monday in December annually, I have caused to be printed the annexed report of the receipts and expenditures at the State Treasury, during the financial year, ending on the thirtieth of November last.

No. 1. Exhibits in detail, the receipts and expenditures of the State Treasury for the preceding year, ending with the last day of November, designating the name of every person from whom moneys were received, and to whom moneys have been paid, and on what account; and shews a balance in favor of the Commonwealth, on that day, of sixty seven thousand four hundred and ninety-three dollars and fourteen and a half cents.

No. 2. Contains a recapitulation of the moneys received and paid in each month.

No. 3. Exhibits the sums received monthly, on account of lands and fees on warrants and patents, the amount of which is also included in No. 1.

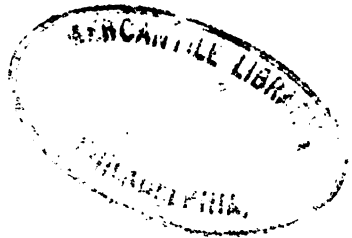
