

The Olympic Torch Relay will enter San Diego County shortly after 8 p.m. today, and officials are predicting large crowds and celebrations along the 200-mile route from the North County, through San Diego to the South Bay and back along the coast to Camp Pendleton and then to Orange County.

More than 200 of the 275 runners who will carry the torch through San Diego County received their assignments and running clothes last night at a reception held at the Linda Vista Boys' Club, said Bill Donahoe, one of four directors for the Olympic Torch Relay in California.

As of this morning, Donahoe said, a half-dozen runners had not been contacted about their running assignments. Donahoe said volunteers were to contact those runners by phone today.

The three-day run will include several major events. Tomorrow, they will include:

- o The passing of the torch from Padre All-Star first baseman Steve Garvey to Mayor Hedgecock about 5 p.m. at the Organ Pavilion in Balboa Park.
- o An all-day celebration in various parts of Old Town featuring singers and dancers, a cannon salute, and the Ballet Folkorico. The torch runner is expected to pass through Old Town between 3 and 4 p.m.
- o A neighborhood party planned by the Navajo Community Planners from noon to 2 p.m. to mark the passage of the runner along Zion Avenue, Waring Road and Fletcher Parkway. Events are planned at the Allied Gardens Library on Zion and at the Walker Scott Shopping Center on Navajo Road.
- o At about 11 p.m., the runner will pass Seaport Village and a fireworks salute is scheduled there.
