# IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

- Read all of these instructions carefully, and save them for reference. Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.
- Clip the swivel bass on to the monitor before installation.
- Unplug the monitor from the system unit before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- Use only attachments recommended by the manufacturer; unapproved attachments may be hazardous.
- Do not use the monitor near water, for example near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool.
- Do not place the monitor on an unstable cart, stand or table. If the monitor falls, it could injure a person or cause serious damage to the appliance. Use only a cart or stand recommended by the manufacturer and follow the kit instructions.
- Slots and openings in the back and bottom of the cabinet are provided for ventilation. To ensure reliable operation of the monitor and to protect it from overheating, be sure these openings are not blocked or covered. Do not place the monitor on a bed, sofa, rug, or similar surface. Do not place the monitor near or over a radiator or heat register. Do not place the monitor in a bookcase or cabinet unless proper ventilation is provided.

- The monitor should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the label. If you are not sure of the type of power supplied to your home, consult your dealer or local power company.
- The monitor is equipped with a three-wire grounded plug, a plug with a third (grounding) pin. This is a safety feature. If your outlet does not accommodate the three-wire plug, have an electrician install the correct outlet, or use an adapter to ground the appliance safely. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the grounded plug.
- Do not allow anything to rest on the power cord. Do not locate the monitor where people may walk on the cord.
- To protect the monitor during a lightening storm or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the system unit. This will prevent damage to the monitor from lightening and power surges.

Unplug the monitor from the system unit and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

- When the power cord or plug is damaged or frayed.
- If liquid has been spilled into the monitor.

- If the monitor does not operate normally and you are following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls covered by the operating instructions; improper adjustment other controls may result in damage and may require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the monitor to normal operation.
- If the monitor has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged.
- When the video monitor exhibits a distinct change in performance.

To ensure satisfactory operation, use the monitor only with UL listed computers which have appropriate configured receptacles marked between 100 – 120 VAC-Min. 2.5A

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#### 1. GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This monitor is a high-performance intelligent multi-scan color monitor. It is designed to be compatible with all modes between 30 KHz and 54 KHz.

The microprocessor-based design was implemented with the user in providing digital controls precision, mind. user for autosynchronization auto-sizing and for convenience. userprogrammability for flexibility, as well as built-in tilt and swivel base for comfort in prolonged usage.




Figure 1 Multiscan Color Monitor

**NOTE**: To get the most from your monitor, read through this user's guide before installing and using the monitor.

#### 2. PRODUCT PACKAGE

Plan the most convenient location for your monitor and avoid using sharp object in opening the carton. Open the shipping cartons and check the contents of the package. The package should include the following items:

- Swivel base
- · Monitor
- · Power cord


If any items are missing, contact your supplier immediately. Remove the monitor from its shipping carton. Save the carton and packaging materials, in case you ever need to pack and relocate the monitor.

#### 2.1 Installing and Removing the Swivel Base

To attach the swivel base to the monitor, do the following:

- 1. Carefully turn the monitor on its side or upside-down.
- 2. Locate the cavities at the bottom front of the monitor.
- 3. Insert the pegs on the swivel base into these cavities. Push the swivel base forward until the swivel base locks in place.
- 4. Turn the monitor right side up and begin to install the monitor.

PUSH THIS SIDE TO CLIP ON.



To remove the swivel base, hold the bottom of the swivel base, then push it out. User can easily lift off the swivel base from the monitor body.

#### 3. INSTALLATION THE MONITOR

#### 3.1 Safety Checks

Make sure the monitor and system unit power switches are off, when you start connecting cables. This monitor is set for 100-120 Vac 60 Hz. Confirm the line voltage for your monitor by checking the voltage label on the rear panel of the monitor.




Figure 3 Connecting the Video Cable and Power Cord

#### 3.2 Connecting the Video Cable

The monitor comes with a built-in video cable. To connect the video cable, follow the steps below:

- 1. Plug the signal cable's 15-pin connector into the computer's video port.
- 2. Tighten the two screws on the cable connector. As Figure 3.

#### 3.3 Connecting the Power Cord

**CAUTION:** If the AC inlet in your location does not provide for this type of grounded plug, make sure to install the proper adapter for a safety grounding.

This monitor comes with a power cord. See Figure 3. Plug power cord into a computer's inlet. The three-wire power cord must be provided a safety precaution to ensure proper electrical grounding.

#### 4. OPERATION THE MONITOR




Figure 4 Power Switch and Control Knob

The other control knobs are located at the base of the monitor. (See Figure 4) User could make a good appearance of the monitor to suit your personal preference by press these controls.

#### 4.1 Control Keys Meaning

**Power Indicator:** Lights up when the power is ON. Turns amber when the monitor is standby. \_

**Menu In / Function select** ( ): To switch to previous function in sequence.

**Brightness** (<): Press the key to decrease the display brightness level or the contrast level and adjust function scale to smaller.

**Contrast** ① (>): Press the key to increase the display brightness level or the contrast level, and adjust function scale to larger.

**Menu Out / Information** ( →): Press the key to the display information

#### 4.2 On Screen Display (OSD) Message

The OSD is a message that displays on the monitor screen. The OSD message can show the function scale and the mode's frequency. When user does not press key at 10 seconds later, the OSD message is been off.




Figure 5 The OSD Message

#### 4.3 Auto Save Function

This monitor provides auto save function for saving any controls change. The auto save function acts when

- 1. Function Mode and Function Adjustment change immediately.
- 2. Function Mode persists and Function Adjustment changes at 10 seconds later.

# 4.4 Display Adjustment

#### **Brightness**

Press to show the brightness adjustment window of OSD message as figure 6. Press > to increase or < to decrease the display brightness level.

#### **Contrast**

Press ① to show the contrast adjustment window of OSD message as figure 6. Press > to increase or < to decrease the contrast level.

Repeatedly press < or > until the  $\blacksquare$  symbol changes color. Press + to increase or - to decrease the vertical size of the display.

#### - V-position 🖻

Repeatedly press < or > until the  $\square$  symbol changes color. Press + to increase or - to lower the vertical position of the display.

#### - H-width

Repeatedly press < or > until the 

symbol changes color.

Press + to increase or − to decrease the horizontal width of the display.

#### - H-position 🗗

Repeatedly press < or > until the symbol changes color. Press + to move screen rightward or - to move screen leftward.

#### - Pincushion $\square$

Repeatedly press < or > until the  $\square$  symbol changes color. Press + or - until the display edges neither bulge out (barrel) nor pull in (pincushion).

#### - Trapezoid △

Repeatedly press < or > until the  $\triangle$  symbol changes color. Press + or - until the display does not slant (trapezoid distortion).

#### - Balance $\square$

Repeatedly press < or > until the  $\square$  symbol changes color. Making the desired adjustment by pressing the keys + or - to adjust the balance of the display.

#### - Parallelogram $\Box$

Repeatedly press < or > until the  $\square$  symbol changes color. Making the desired adjustment by pressing the keys + or - to adjust the parallelogram of the display.

#### -. Moire

To adjust the moire of the display.


#### - Rotation

Repeatedly press < or > until the  $\square$  symbol changes color. Making the desired adjustment by pressing the keys + or - to adjust the Rotation of the display.

Repeatedly press < or > until the green symbol changes color. Making the desired adjustment by pressing the keys + or - to adjust Green-Gain.


#### - B-drive **O**



This function is active by an operating system or Windows utility program which turns off the monitor display and also turns off, or changes the color or the monitors power indicator.

#### 6. TROUBLESHOOTING

#### 6.1 No Picture

- Check that both power and signal cables are securely connected.
- Adjust the brightness and contrast controls.

#### 6.2 Poor Picture

- Adjust the brightness and contrast controls.
- Check your display adapter configuration. (Refer to your display adapter manual.)

#### 6.3 Picture Locks or Center Shifts

- Adjust vertical center and horizontal phase controls.

#### 6.4 Picture is too Large or Small

- Adjust vertical size control or horizontal width control.

#### 7.1 Precautions

- Only a qualified service technician should open the monitor case. Components inside the monitor can cause serious electric shock. Do not attempt to remove the back cover of the monitor by yourself. Contact your monitor dealer or authorized service personnel if your monitor needs to be repaired.
