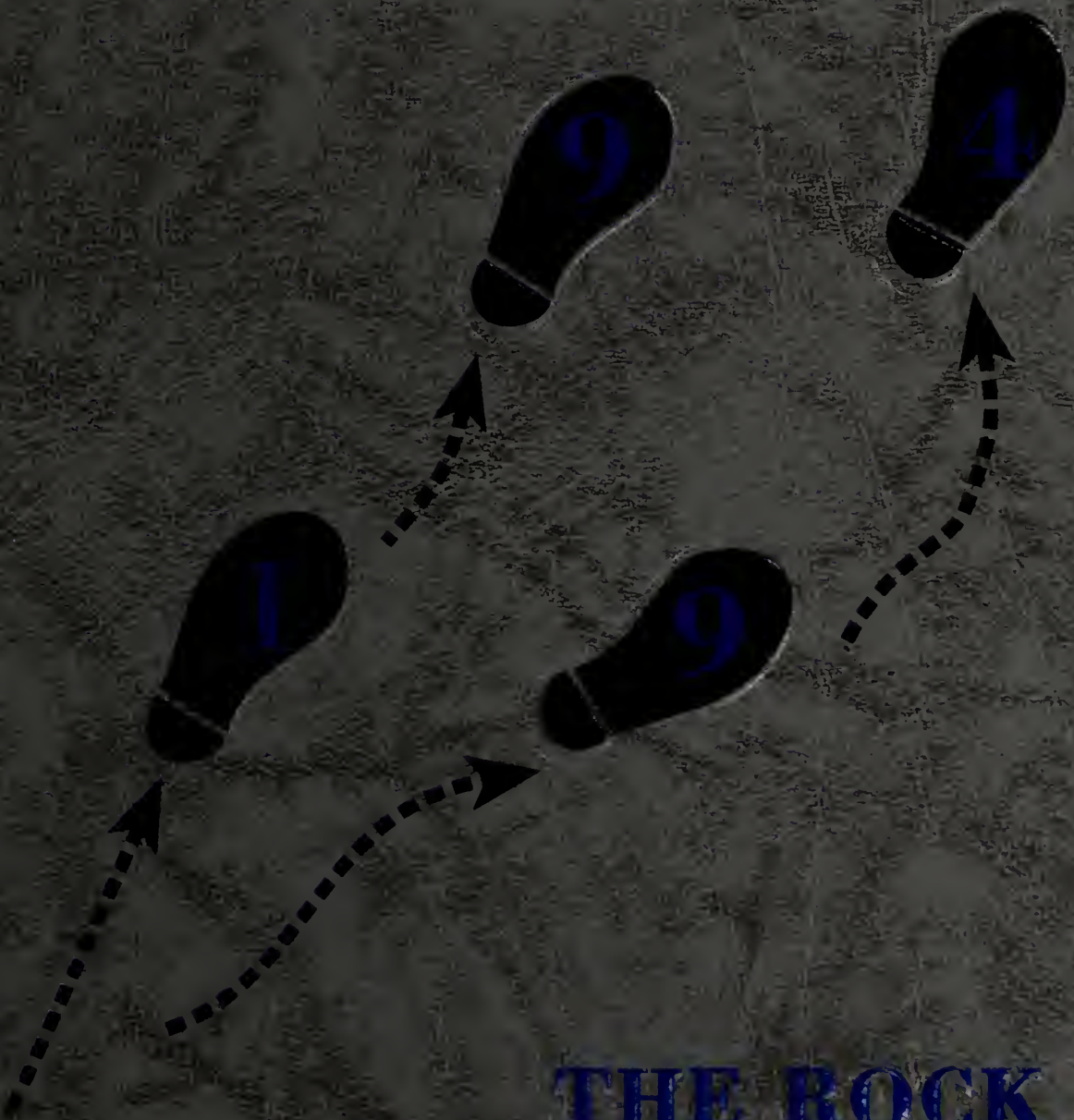

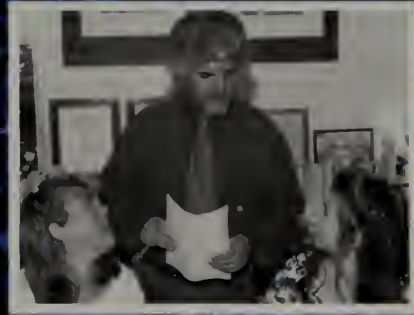

Whether It Be Out of the Classroom, Out of the School or Out of the Ordinary, PSHS Students *Step Out* and Are Involved in a Variety of Activities

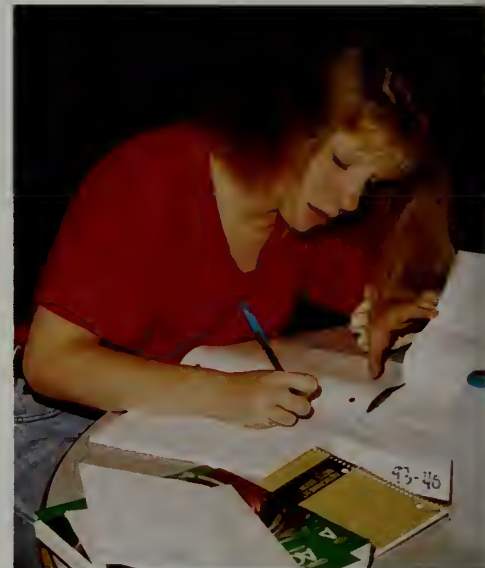

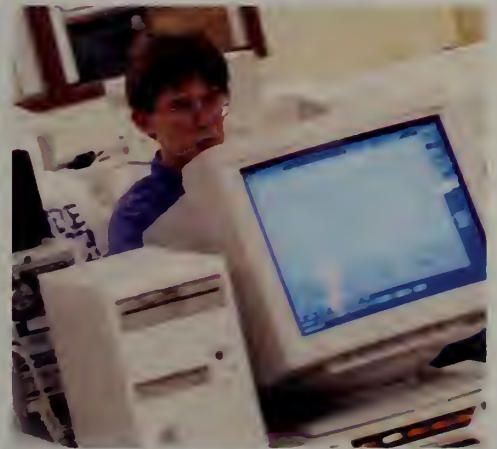

It's A Tough Job

Finding A Job May Be Harder Than The Job Itself

While the number of help wanted signs appear to have increased in 1994, students may still have a difficult time finding a job. As Melissa Cook laments, "I'm only fifteen and it's hard to get a job because most people won't hire you if you're under sixteen." Many students feel there are too many work restrictions on those under sixteen.

Finding a job can take anywhere from a few days to a few months or even a year. Julie Leary says, "I looked for a job for about a year before I got my job at Star Market." Since Star Market in Cedarville opened last spring, many PSHS students have found employment there.

Sara Gogan looked for a job for a couple of months. She said she "went all over Plymouth" before she found her job at NRM - a music store at Independence Mall.

Other students are luckier at finding em-

ployment and land a job right away. Jackie Collins got her job in about two days. "They (Village General Store in Manomet) called me back the same day I applied. It wasn't a tough, grueling process."

Jenn Malone was especially lucky finding three jobs! She got one at Sears, one at TCBY and one at the Plymouth Skating Rink, but ended up leaving Sears -- two jobs were enough for one girl.

Finding an available position is not the only problem in the job search. Transportation, school schedules, extracurricular activities and free time all have to be juggled to meet work schedules. Even if there's a help wanted sign out there, it may not be for a job that fits with these other considerations. Finding a job may prove to be harder than the job itself!

Many students feel that jobs are necessary to pay for senior expenses. Siobhan McDonough notes, "I'm glad I have a job because Montreal and other things like senior pictures are so expensive."

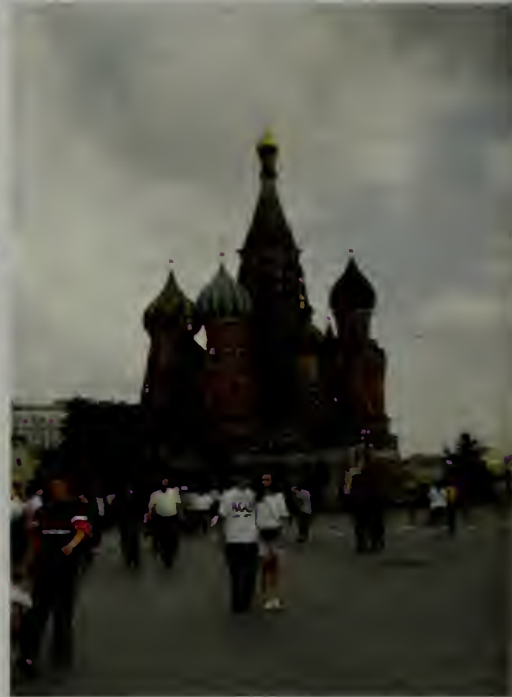

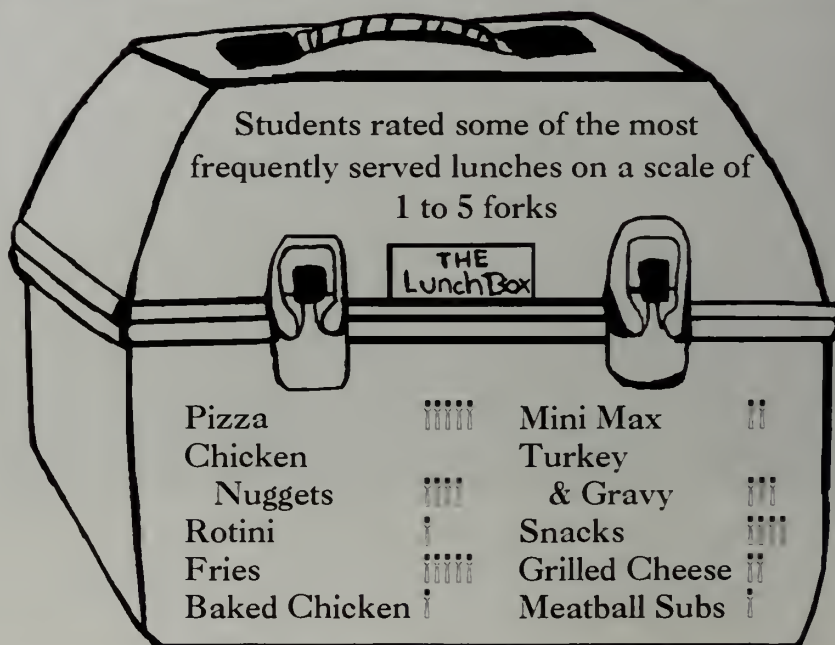

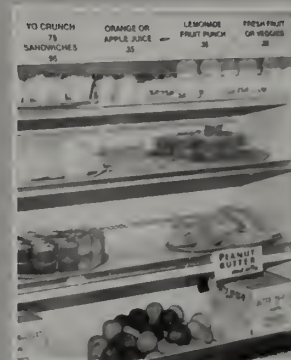

The Juniors' first activity was a Food Drive for Plymouth's homeless. This drive was an overwhelming success and was greatly appreciated by the local homeless families.

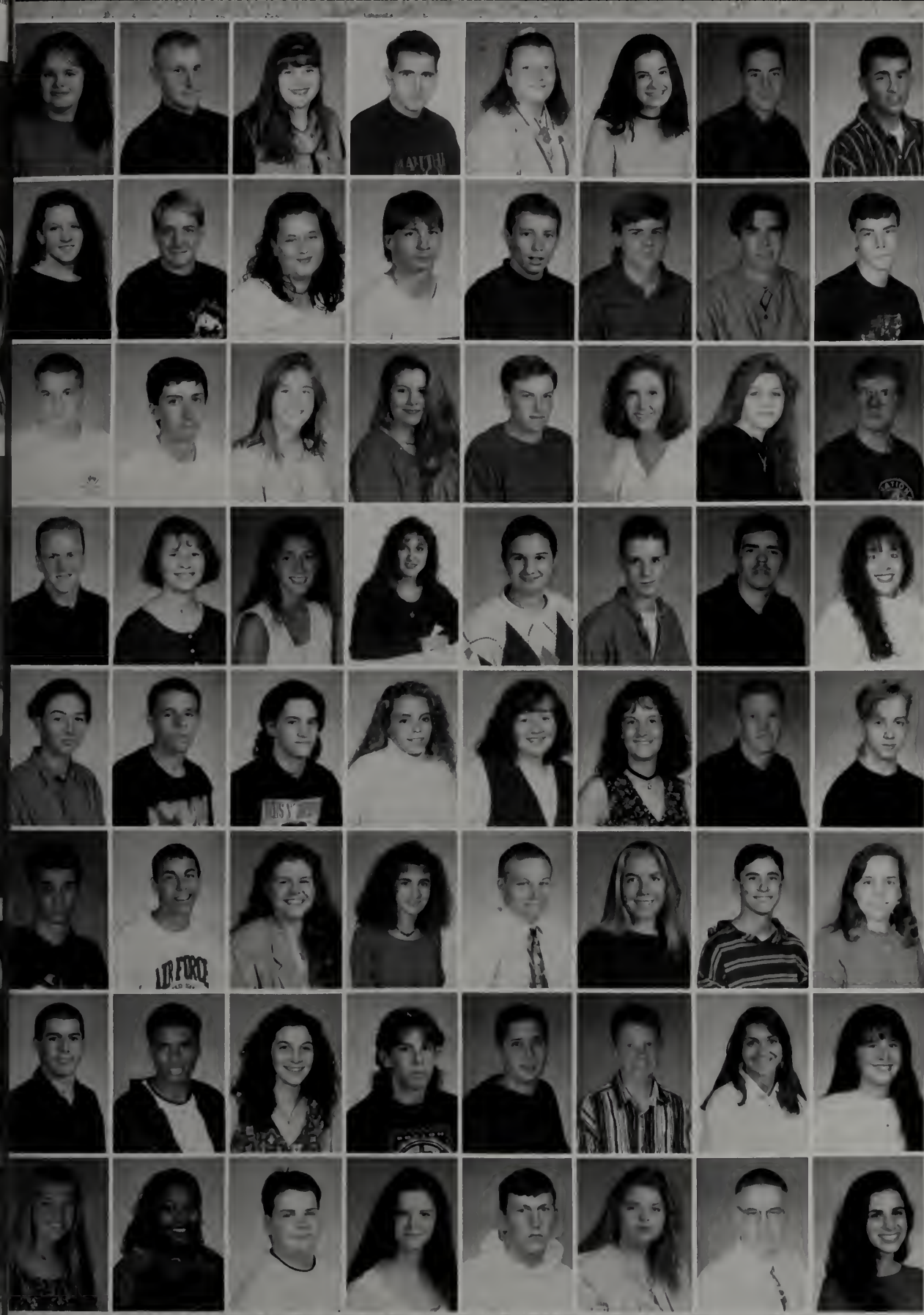
On October 19th the Junior Class held its annual English field trip to *bewitching* Salem.

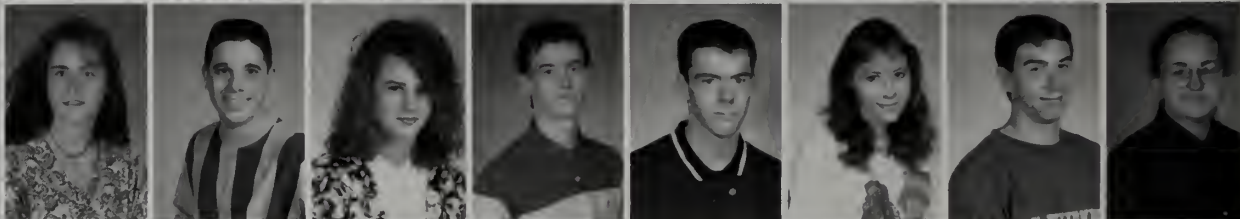

showed a lot of school spirit this year by having the second highest number of spirit links." The class raised \$133.00 worth!

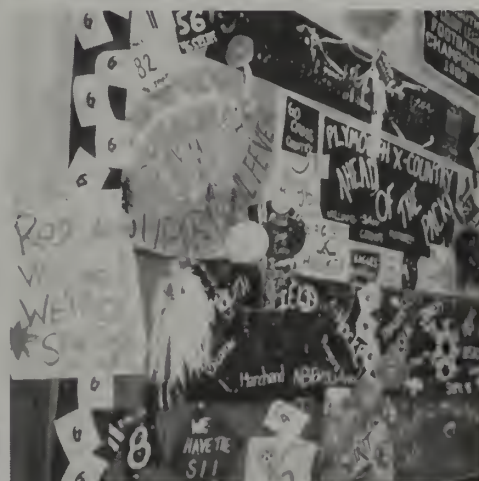
Fundraising was a necessary evil for the class. Flower sales raised money for the Semi-formal and catalog sales raised money to help defray costs of Junior and Senior years.

From the Route 44 redesign project to water line replacements and road resurfacing, detours seemed more the rule than the exception this year.

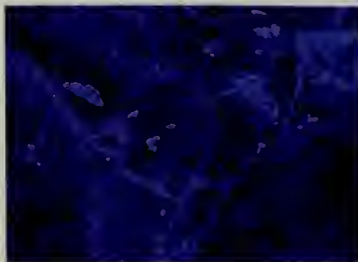

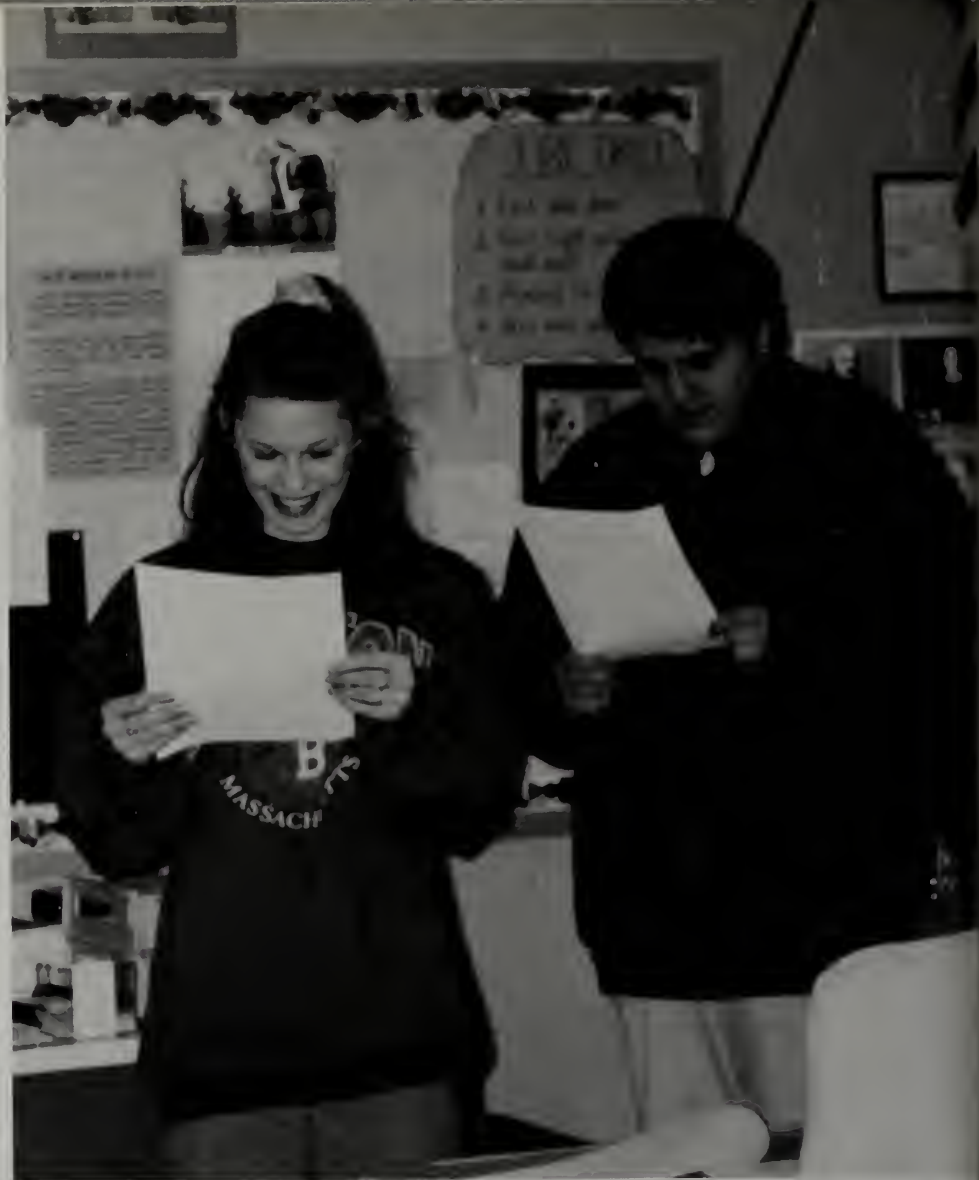

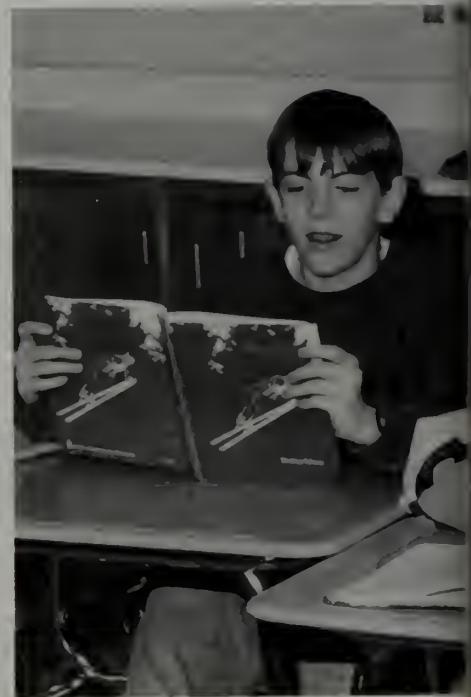

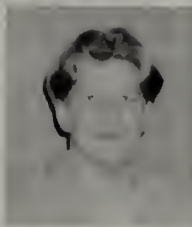

Arts Encourage Creative Expression

Paint, clay, pencil, chalk, wood and glass are just a few of the mediums art students at PSHS use to express themselves. With class options ranging from Drawing to General Art or Ceramics, students have a variety of artistic forms available to them.

In General Art students have the chance to draw, work with clay, make glass etchings and wood carvings, weave baskets and work with stained glass.

In Ceramics students learn the fundamentals of clay work and produce at least twenty works during the year including pots, vases, mugs, sculptures and dishware.

In Drawing students learn the basics about line, value, texture, color and space. Students work in many medias including pencil, col-

ored pencil, chalk, pastel, oil pastel, conte and charcoal.

For juniors and seniors who have completed two years of drawing Studio Art AP is an option. In this class students are required to complete a portfolio consisting of twenty works revolving around one topic. In early

spring slides are taken of this work and are sent to a College Board to be examined on a 1 to 5 scale similar to other AP courses.

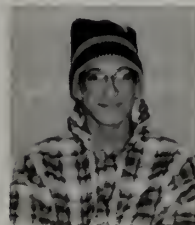

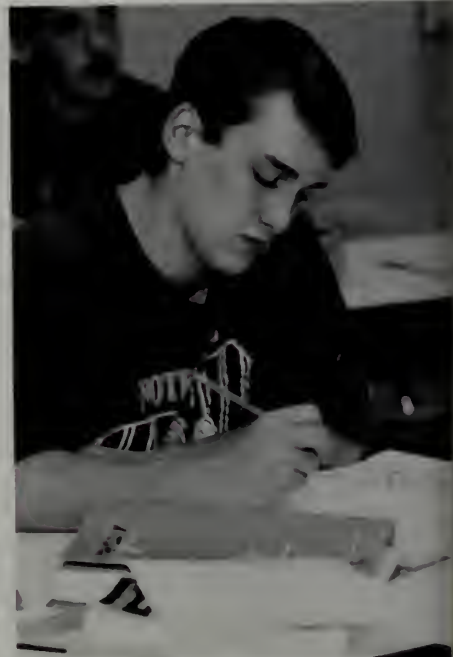

Not Just Talk and Chalk

Students Get Their Hands On While Learning

Students involved in the Technical Studies program learn many skills and have the opportunity for many hands-on experiences. During the *shop week* of classes, students learn their trades by being placed in an actual work project setting. Students learn the proper use of equipment and the Mass. codes in order to put their knowledge to work in school and on community projects.

During the *academic week*, students learn not only English and Math, but also have Related Theory classes pertaining to their specific trade which includes detailed technical information and explanations needed to succeed in their field of study.

The Technical Studies Program had many new changes this year. The program now has eleven shops in full operation - Automotive, CAD/CAM, Carpentry, Computer Science, Culinary Arts, Distribu-

utive Education, Electrical, Electronics, Graphic Arts, Metal Fab and Plumbing.

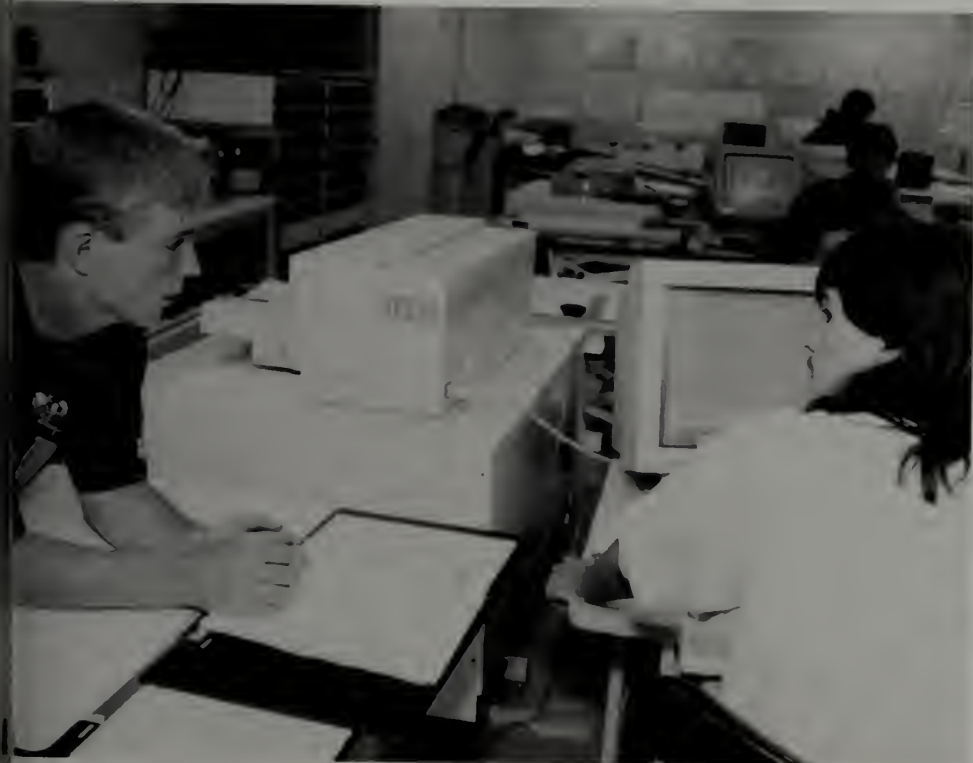
The TECH PREP program began this year. It is a two year program currently taught by Mr. Huban which begins in the junior year. It involves earning college credits while still in high school. One course was offered in business this year. If a student earned a B or better in the TECH PREP class, the credits were transferred to Cape Cod Community College. An advantage to this program is students enrolled don't have to apply to other colleges if they do not want to because they are automatically enrolled at 4C's.

In addition to new programs this year, a great deal of new computer equipment was either purchased or donated to enhance hands on experiences. The Auto Shop received a new computer from NAPA, while the Computer Science Shop set up a new series of IBM compatibles linked in a Novell Network.

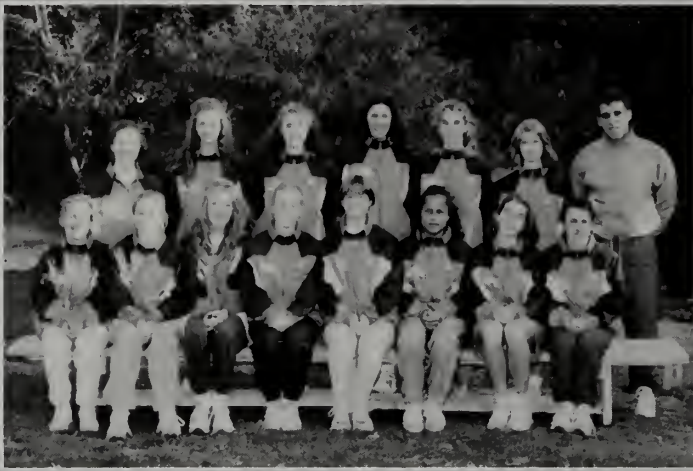

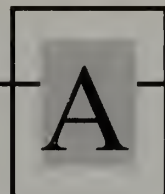

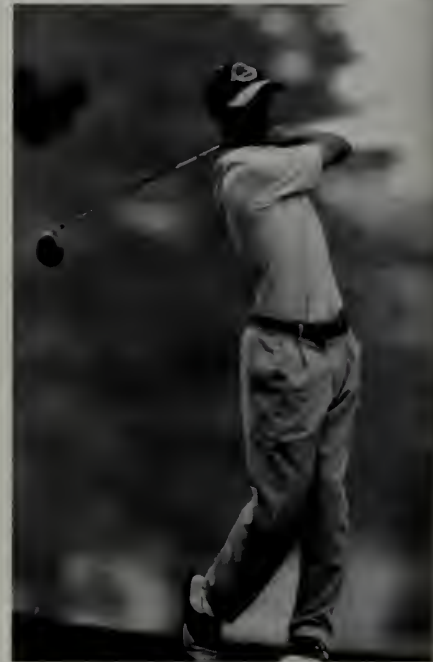

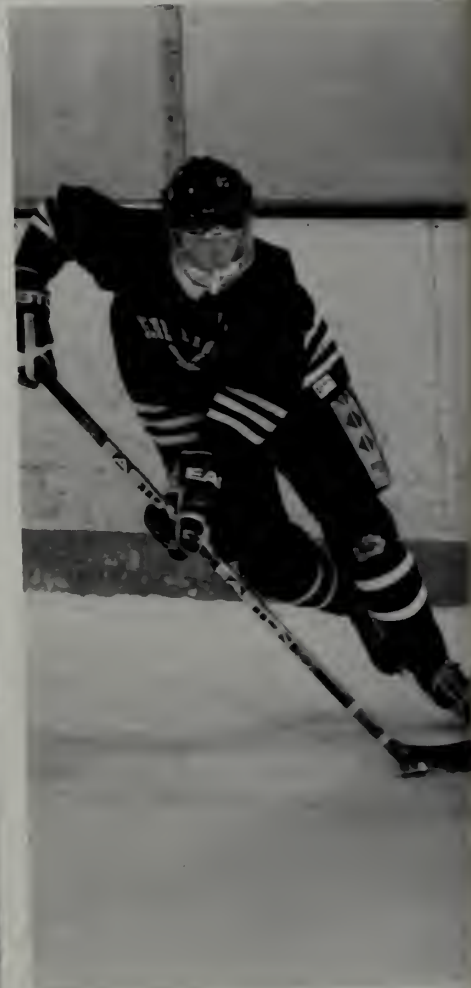

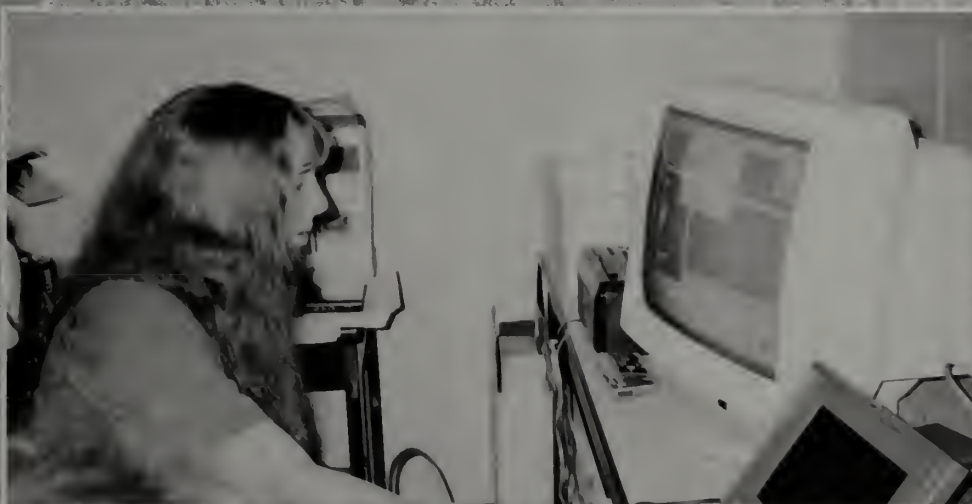

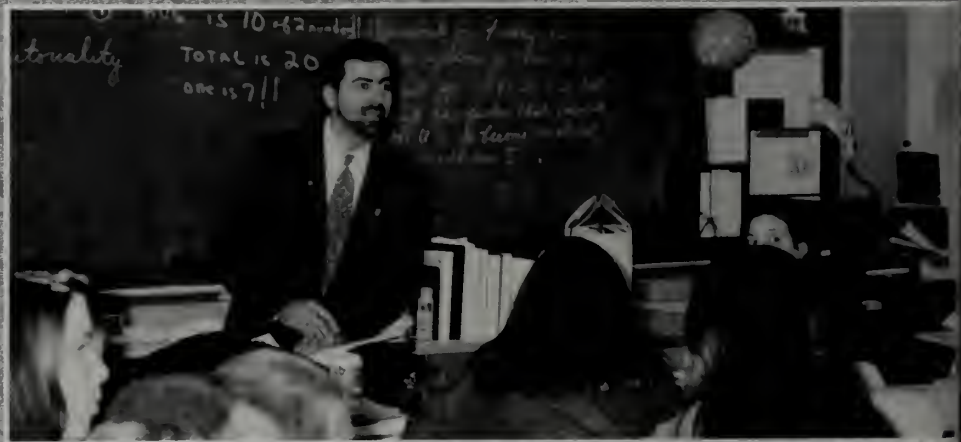

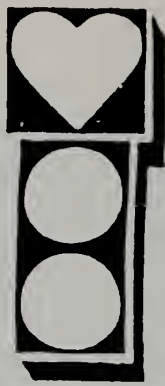




Stepping Stones

Most body copy and captions were printed in Times type on 80 pound gloss paper. *Stepping Out* was produced entirely on the MacIntosh computer using Aldus Pagemaker 4.2. The cover, designed by the staff with technical assistance from the Walsworth Art Department, is Weathered Gray 874, embossed, with Black 700 and Bright Blue 504 silkscreen. The endsheets are Enhanced Marble Gray 463.

The official yearbook photographer was Yearbook Associates, McGrath Studios of Brockton, Massachusetts.

The 228 page main text was distributed in May 1994. A 24 page supplement followed in September 1994.

As stunned students looked on, fire and rescue workers prepared to remove Jackie Collins from the wreck to an ambulance. In this mock performance, her "date" Scott Ballum was dead when rescuers arrived at the scene.



After moving Laurie Westgate from the car's hood, workers bandaged and secured her to a backboard. The Medflight helicopter was unavailable so paramedics were forced to rush Laurie to a hospital by ambulance. "As I was watching," recalled Amy Marinelli, "I was thinking of our Prom and how it could really happen to one of us. It was so realistic, it was horrifying."

In a week long series of safe-prom programs, students viewed . . .

Sobering Performances

Forty-four students participated in the Annual *Dead Day* on Wednesday, May 18. "It's purpose was to visually show the number of teenagers who die daily in drinking and driving related accidents," explained Mrs. Connolly. Those dressed in black with white painted faces represented the number of fatalities from midnight to 2:00 PM. "Even though I had seen it before," remembered Kristin Gregg, "what still amazes me is the reality of how many people actually die each day."

On May 20, students witnessed what happens after an alcohol related car accident. Jeff Costa, the driver, raced around the wreck to see if his friends were all right. Laurie Westgate had been thrown through the windshield. In the back seat, Jackie Collins yelled in pain. Beside her, Scott Ballum, was dead. Luckily, this was only a mock accident sponsored by Jordan Hospital. The accident was a sobering performance for many like Ann Willard who said, "It was too real. It really opened my eyes to what could happen, especially because it was my friends I saw being taken away in ambulances and hearses."

Senior Sandra Ings said, "The whole performance was emotional, but when Scott's Dad came, the whole thing hit home. It was so painfully realistic that I had to leave."

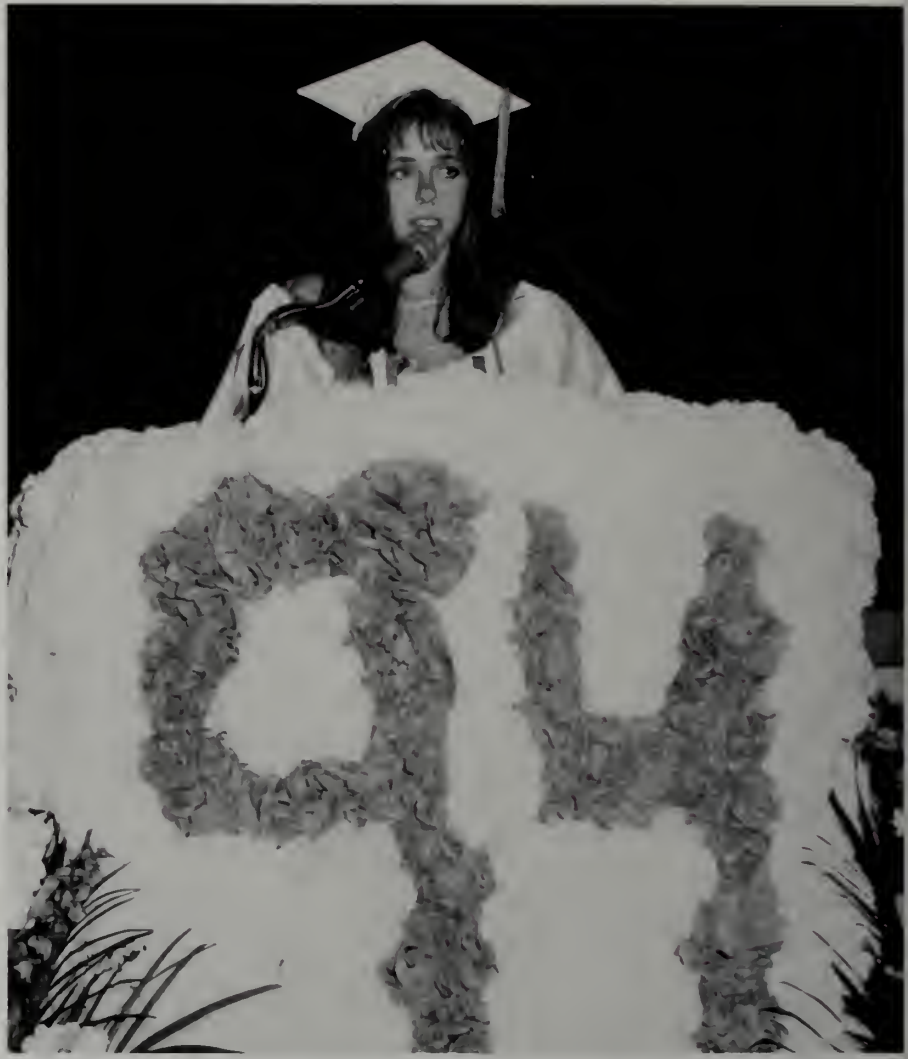
