This poem, read by 16 LibriVox Volunteers, describes the ups and downs and emotional frenzy of The Rubinstein Staccato Etude. The author, R. Nathaniel Dett, was a composer, organist, pianist and music professor. While born in Canada, he spent most of his professional career in the United States. During his lifetime he was a leading Black composer, known for his use of African-American folk songs and spirituals as the basis for choral and piano compositions in the 19th century Romantic style of Classical music. FOLDING INSTRUCTIONS FOR SINGLE CD JEWEL CASE INSERTS

1. Print Page 2, Cut along outer black lines, fold Cover Art over the back side of Text area. Slip into front of jewel case, Cover Art up.
2. Print Page 3 if planning to insert into back of jewel case, cut along outer black lines, fold flaps to fit into sides of case. Disassemble jewel case, slide paper in. Reassemble.
