The Study Outline and Its Use

The series includes outlines on art, literature, travel, biography, history and present day questions.

The outlines vary in length. If more topics are given than the number of club meetings for the season, those topics that are more difficult to handle or on which there is less available material, may be dropped. If there are fewer topics than the scheduled meetings, certain topics may be divided.

Lists of books are appended to most of the outlines. It would be well for the club to own some of the recommended books. Others can be obtained either from the local public library or from the state traveling library. When very full lists are given it is not necessary for any club to use all the books, but the longer list gives more room for choice.

The best material on some subjects may be found, not in books, but in magazines. These may be looked up under the subject in the *Readers' Guide to Periodical Literature*. Magazine articles and illustrated material may be obtained from the *Wilson Package Library*. For terms see fourth page of cover.

INTRODUCTORY NOTE

A country long popular for study has been rendered doubly interesting by the stirring events of 1917. So appropriate are the lines of Edna Dean Proctor, that they may well be recalled and applied anew:

> The people, the Russian people, God grant their night is past, And the gloom of their weary waiting, Lost in the dawn at last.

This outline, which is offered to clubs selecting the Russian empire for their year's study, may be adopted as a whole, or modified to fit the needs of the local group. By distributing the historical and geographical topics throughout the year, it is hoped to give the variety on each program necessary to hold the interest of library tastes. The political and social subjects have been inserted where some natural link made them appropriate.

The references appended to every topic have been carefully chosen and will lead the reader to much helpful and trustworthy information. The magazine articles indexed in the *Readers' Guide* and encyclopedias should also be consulted.

So well adapted for preliminary study is Nevin O. Winter's "Russian empire of to-day and yesterday" that it is hoped all members of the club will read it from cover to cover. It has also direct help for about half the topics of this outline. The other books given in the brief bibliography are recommended for any collection on Russia. All libraries will have on their shelves other books to supplement these both for general reading and for special study. But political moves since 1905 have so modified conditions that any work written before that date should be used only in conjunction with books or magazines of recent years.


