And do note the following: our own **Doug Axmann** will be doing an airbrush demo for us on November 20th. Wow!

DUES ARE DUE; do you know that? Please send your checks made out to RVAA to our Membership Chairman Doug Axmann, 16 Schoolhouse Lane, Somerville, NJ 08876. Dues are \$30. Individual, \$35. Family, and \$15. Student (through high school). Dues will get you all these demonstrations, two or three exhibits a year (including our Holiday Extravaganza at the Somerset County Library, which runs a month), the annual Big Apple Trip, the newsletters, and last, but not least, lots of camaraderie.

Open call for a Plein Air Paint Out! at the historic Boudinot-Southard-Ross property the weekend of October 14 & 15th. The 50+ acre site has two large open fields, three buildings including a large main house, a long treelined driveway, and some terrific vistas due to it's height. Additionally, there will be lots of activity with adults and children around the site. Painters are welcome to set up in a quiet or active place to paint and enjoy the fall

weekend. There is no charge for the event. Depending on the output from the weekend, the possibilities for exhibition are open so painters will be encouraged to register at the site. The Particulars: site is 135 North Maple Avenue in Basking Ridge, 07920. A little over 1 mile from Exit 30A of Route 287. Coming from the North, it is about a quarter mile past the light at North Maple Avenue and Madisonville Road. From Basking Ridge, it is about 3/4 mile out of town on North Maple. Property is on the East side of the street. (This site recently hosted 2006 Mansion in May.) Saturday October 14th 10am - 5pm, Sunday October 15th, 12-5 pm. Admission is free. Other activities planned include: actors portraying historical characters, colonial crafts for children, historic exhibits, kite flying, the Flag Man of Bernards Township, Scavenger Hunts, limited access to the historic house, and some live music. The Boudinot-Southard-Ross Property is joining 23 other sites participating in the Somerset County History Weekend linking history, culture and arts around the County. This is a rare opportunity to get on the property as it had been privately held until 2005 when it was purchased by Somerset County. It is not open to the public.

AND The Third Annual Paint Out will be held this year at Princeton Academy on October 21, 2006. Princeton Academy, an independent Catholic school for boys holds the event for the community in support of local artists. "I envisioned the Paint Out as a way to bring painting alive for our students," said Sandra Tasca, event founder. The Paint Out offers "the fabulous experience observing the creation of a work of art can be." Students, parents, community members can watch it all and then purchase the completed painting in the evening. There are no fees for artists to participate. Artists can arrive as early as 6:00 am and painting concludes at 4:00 pm. Painters are treated to coffee, tea, and breakfast snacks; burgers, cookies, and a drink at lunch; and a wine and cheese closing reception beginning at 4:30. The reception, held in the Manor House, is also the venue for a silent auction of the paintings completed the day of the Paint Out. There is a People's Choice Award of \$100. plus other prizes donated by several local art supply vendors. Princeton Academy of the Sacred Heart is located at 101 Drakes Corner Road in Princeton, NJ, at the intersection of The Great Road and Drakes Corner Road.
