The Jane Voorhees Zimmerli Museum in New Brunswick is a gem you might want to discover for yourself. Although parking is a bit difficult during the week, on street parking is free and available on the weekends and the museum is open noon to five those days. The museum is large, airy, with both permanent and guest exhibits. There is a cafe as well as a lovely gift shop. Your editor was there Sunday afternoon for a talk by the awardwinning (mainly picture books) writer/illustrator Uri Schulevitz. There is an exhibit of the watercolor illustrations of Takayo Noda (up until July 6) for her book "Into the Garden". What a great time I had speaking with these artists (Takayo was there for Uri's talk and then sat in her exhibition room!) and having my photo taken with them! (I was there with 3 other aspiring children's book writers/illustrators). Also up now are exhibits of Contemporary Russian Art, Inspired by Literature-Art & Fine Books, and the permanent exhibits.
