We thank them all for showing their work and for show sitting......Susan Boyd, Sherry Engelberg, Bill Gilbert, Bill Metz, Eleanor Morehouse, Eleanor Nugent, Diana Patton, Olga Phelps, Donna Souren, Patricia Yuan, and Rosemary Zangara. Unfortunately we did not have many sales. In fact Bill Metz sold the only painting...this was fun, however, because Bill is a chemist by vocation and this is the first painting he has sold. As he said to me, "I guess now I can say I'm a pro artist?" Very cool! We were allowed to leave the price list for the show sitters and we could

sell the works within the library (unlike last year when we had to do it outside the library), although actual prices could not be on the paintings. Because of this, we did have a link to our website and the prices. Our webmaster, Gardner Patton, put our names and the titles and prices up on our website. Only those who saw the actual paintings had the link. This way, if there wasn't a show sitter present, people could use their phones or the library's computers to discover the paintings' prices immediately. You might want to travel to New Brunswick to the Zimmerli Museum, a world class museum in our own neighborhood. Besides the permanent exhibitions there are several current shows, including Diana Burko: Glacial Perspectives, until July 31, 2014 (Machaver Gallery) For over 40 years, Diane Burko has traveled around the Americas and Europe, taking pictures and making sketches of volcanoes, hot spring fissures, glaciers, mountains, and rain forests in order to paint these landscapes in her Philadelphia studio. She has had more than 30 solo exhibitions in museums and galleries across the United States. This year (2013), Burko was selected to participate in a collaborative voyage to the Arctic in the company of other artists, scientists and journalists sponsored by the nonprofit organization The Arctic Circle. This exhibition of paintings and photographs reflects Burko's interest in extreme landscapes and her ability to transform visual and technical data into dynamic views of some of the most sublime landscapes on earth.
