The Raritan Valley Arts Association was started in 1939 by Arthur Trippanera and a few other artists; I believe it's the oldest artist association in New Jersey. Our dues are among the lowest; we have eight free demonstrations a year, an online presence and a newsletter, an annual bus trip to New York, and we have 2 or 3 shows a year in which we can exhibit. It would be almost

criminal if RVAA ceased to exist. Obviously the President should try to be at most of the meetings.
