

Call for Artists

Farmstead Arts will hold their annual Members Show April 2 - May 28, 2017 and is seeking artists to showcase their talent. There will be an opening reception on Sunday, April 2 from 1 - 4 PM. Current Farmstead Arts members and their family members, age 14 and up, as well as those who submit their membership application with their entry form, are eligible to participate. Entry and Membership Forms are available on the Farmstead's website at https://farmsteadartscenter.org/.

Entry deadline is March 24. Exhibit Hours will be Sundays except Mother's Day, from 1 - 4 and Monday - Wednesday from 10-1.

This is a non-juried show. There is no entry fee but the Farmstead will receive 20% of any sales. Artists will set the selling price or state that the piece is not for sale. Artists may list up to 4 potential pieces for display. Artwork can include, but is not limited to, watercolors, oils, acrylics, photography, pastels, drawings, mixed media, fabric and sculpture. Hanging artwork must be framed and wired and not larger than 18" by 24". All work must be family friendly.
