Welcome to February!

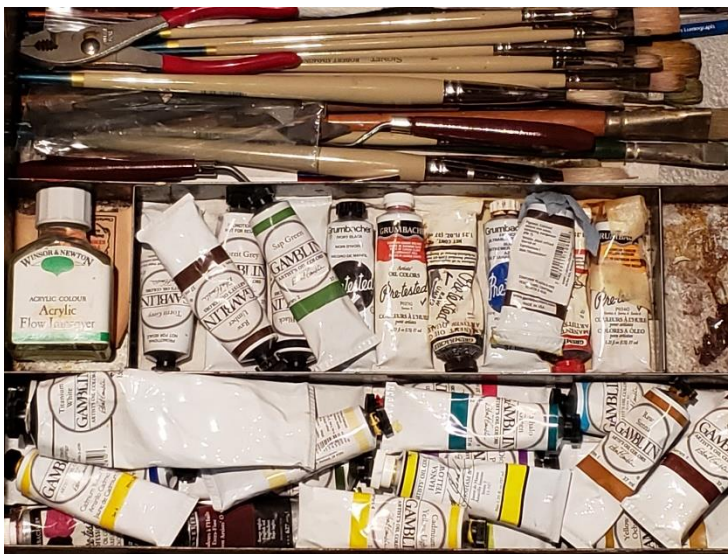
Message from the President:

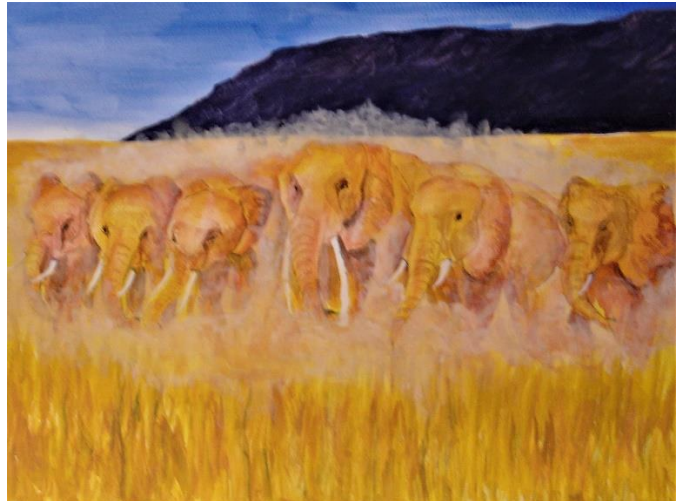
