GENEALOGICAL RECORD

BIOGRAPHIES

Christopher Janse Abeel (1621-1684) was born in Amsterdam, Holland, and emigrated to America about 1647, settling in Beverwyck (Albany.)

Joshua Adams (1731-1772?) was born in Canterbury, Conn., and either settled in Egremont, Mass., or moved to the vicinity of the Hudson, where his descendants have ever since resided. His son, Dr. Peter Charles Adams, settled in Coxsackie, and was Sheriff of the County and State Senator. The family descends from Henry Adams of Braintree, Mass.

Jonas Addoms (1753-1837) was born in New Jersey, March 26 1753. At the outbreak of the Revolutionary War he was residing in New York City, and became a member of the corps of five months men which served on Long Island. Later he was attached to the Quartermaster's Department in New Jersey under Col. Pickering, and in 1782 was commissioned Second Lieutenant in Col. Lamb's regiment of Artillery. A few years after the close of the war he was appointed to a position in the Custom-House which he retained for thirty-three years. He was a member of the Society of the Cincinnati. His death occurred July 16, 1837.

Pietro Caesar Alberto (1617-1680?), a native of Venice, came to America about 1630 and settled in New Amsterdam, where, in 1642, he married Judith, daughter of Jan Mange, from Amsterdam. He resided on the Heeren Gracht (now Broad Street) and owned a farm at the Wallabout, which he obtained by patent in 1643. His descendants are known as Alburtis and Burtis.

Richard Alsop (1660-1718), while yet under age, received a commission in the Newtown, L. I., troop of horse, according to Riker. Inheriting the estate of his uncle, Thomas Wandell, he continued to reside upon it until his death, in October, 1718. Elbert Anderson was a famous merchant, and was the leading cabinet maker in New York in 1798. His son, Elbert, was a great army contractor in the War of 1812.

Laban Andrews (1728-1813) was a descendant of William Andrews who emigrated from England about 1639 and settled at New Haven, Connecticut, where he died in 1676. His son, Samuel, removed to Wallingford, Connecticut in 1672. Laban Andrews after his marriage in 1758 settled in Windham, Greene County, New York.

George Christian Anthon was born August 25, 1734, at Salzungen, in the Duchy of Saxe-Meiningen, and was the son of John Michael Anthon and Dorothea Rosina Louisa, daughter of John Theophilus Cramer, Pastor at Unterella. George Christian Anthon became a surgeon in the Dutch West India trade, and while on a voyage to Surinam in 1757, his vessel was captured by a British privateer and carried to the port of New York. He became a surgeon in the British Army, serving at Albany and Detroit, and finally settled in New York City, in 1786. From 1796 to 1815, he was a Trustee of Columbia College. He died December 22, 1815.

Allard Anthony (1620-1685) was one of the first five Schepens in New Amsterdam, being appointed to that office in 1653. He was a rich and influential man, the consignee of a firm in Holland, with a store in the old church building erected by Wouter Van Twiller. He owned a farm in the country, just above Wall Street, and had a city residence, one of the finest private buildings of its time, in Whitehall Street. The year that he became Schepen, Allard Anthony went to Holland as a special agent of the people of New Amsterdam, to present their affairs to the Amsterdam Chamber, and in 1664 he was elected Sheriff of the county, an office which he continued to hold under the administration of the English Governor, Colonel Richard Nicolls, and retained until 1673. His son, Nicholas, became Sheriff of Ulster County. The family is supposed to have been of Spanish origin.

John Archer resided in Fairfield, Conn., for a short time after his arrival in New England. Thence he removed to Fordham, in the year 1648, where, in 1666, he became the first Lord of the Manor of Fordham. He was Sheriff of New York City in 1679.

Joseph Aspinwall (1673-1748) was the son of Peter Aspinwall, who emigrated from Toxteth Park, Liverpool, England, and settled at Dorchester, Mass., from whence he removed to Muddy River (now Brookline), where, in 1661, he married Prudence, daughter of Peter Palfrey, of Salem and Reading. Joseph was born October 9, 1673. Before he was of age he went to sea, soon commanding a vessel of his own, and, in 1700, having settled in New York City, married Hannah, daughter of Christopher Dean. In 1710 he was made a freeman of the city. Later in the following year he removed to Saybrook, Conn., and a few years later to Dedham, Mass.

John Jacob Astor (1763-1848) was born in Waldorf, a little village in the Grand Duchy of Baden, not far from Heidelberg, July 17, 1763. In 1783 he emigrated to this country and settled in New York City, where he engaged in business, soon becoming, mainly through his wonderful shrewdness and foresight in real-estate investments, one of the wealthiest citizens of the new world. He died March 29, 1848.

Nicholas Bayley, the first member of the family to reside in New York, was one of the proprietors and a magistrate of the town of O'oest Dorp or East Town, under Governor Stuyvesant, in 1660. East Town was afterwards known as Westchester. In 1667 and 1686, Judge Bayley was one of the Patentees under a Grant from King James II, the Dutch having surrendered their claims to Manhattan and the surrounding country. In 1696, as one of the Patentees of the Borough of Westchester, he received a Royal Charter from King William III, confirming the former grant. He was a son of Nicholas Bayley, who landed in Virginia, in 1620, from England.

Isaac Bedlow was from Calais, France, and was a merchant and shipowner in New York, and an active, useful citizen. He frequently held office under both Dutch and English governments, and was both rich and powerful. He was the owner of Bedlow's Island, then known as Oyster Island, but in 1670 Governor Lovelace changed its name, as appears in a grant, which recites that as Mr. Isaack Bedlow has greatly improved this little place it shall be called Love Island, and made a "Privileged place Where no warrant of Attachment or arrest shall be of force or be served unlesse it be by ye peace of Criminall Mattrs."

Wilhelmus Beekman (1623-1707), the son of Hendrick Beekman and Maria Baudartius, was born at Hasselt, Overyssel, April 28, 1623. In 1647 he emigrated to New Amsterdam, where, September 5, 1649, he married Catalina, daughter of Hendrick De Boogh. Appointed, by Stuyvesant, Vice-Director and Commissary of the West India Company at Fort Amstel, on the Delaware, he resided there for some years. In 1664 he was appointed Commissary at Esopus (Kingston), where he became active in local affairs. He died September 21, 1707.

Thomas Benedict (1617-1690) emigrated from Nottingham, England, to New England, in 1638, and shortly afterward settled at Southold, L. I., from whence he removed to Huntington, and later to Jamaica. After residing in Jamaica for some years, he crossed the Sound to Norwalk, Conn., where he remained until his death.

Cornelius Janse Berrien settled in Flatbush, Long Island, in 1669, and there married Jannetje Stryker, daughter of Jan Stryker. In 1685 he removed to Newtown, Long Island, where, the previous year, he and his brother-in-law, Abraham Brinckerhoff, had bought over 400 acres of land at the head of Flushing Bay. Cornelius Janse Berrien was prominent in Newtown as a town officer and deacon in the Dutch Church, and died in 1689.

Gerrit Bicker (1629—) is believed to have been born in Holland, and to have come to New Amsterdam in the service of the Dutch West India Company. In 1649 he was appointed by Gov. Stuyvesant, Commissary of the Dutch Colony on the Delaware, in which capacity he served until the Dutch power was overthrown by the Swedes in 1654. He died previous to 1659, as, in that year, his widow married Nicholas Velthuysen. Abraham Bininger (1720-1811) was born in Bulock, Canton Zurich, Switzerland, January 18, 1720, and came to this country in 1734, landing at Savannah, Ga. Eight years later, having become an active member of the Moravian Church, he removed to the then recently established settlement at Bethlehem, Pa., where he became a devoted missionary to the Indians, and spent many years in teaching them agriculture and building, as well as religion. In 1756, he and his wife, Martha Mariner, went to the islands of St. Thomas and St. Croix, where they spent two years in similar missionary work among the blacks. In 1758 they returned to Bethlehem, but removed thence, in 1770, to Camden Valley, N. Y., and were among the first settlers of the town of Salem, Washington County, N. Y. He died there, March 8, 1811, aged 91 years.

Robert Blackwell (-----1717?) was probably born in England. He first appears in this country as a merchant at Elizabethtown, N. J., from whence, in 1676, he removed to Long Island. Through his marriage he came into possession of the island in the East River, since known as Blackwell's Island, and which is now owned by the City of New York.

Jan Janse Bleecker (1642-1732) was born at Meppel, Holland, July 9, 1642. He emigrated to this country at the age of sixteen, and settled at Rensselaerwyck (Albany), where he died November 21, 1732. He was prominent in civic life, being, at various times, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, member of the Colonial Assembly, Chamberlain, Recorder and Mayor. He also served in the Albany militia, and as a volunteer in the French and Indian wars. On January 2, 1667, he married Grietjen, daughter of Rutger Jacobsen (Van Schoenderwoert). Of his eleven children, two of the sons left descendants to carry on the name,—John (1668-1738), who married Anna Costen, and Rutger (1675-1756), who married Catalina Schuyler (born January 14, 1678), daughter of David Pieterse Schuyler and Catalyn Ver Planck, and widow of Johannes Abeel. Of his daughters, Catharine (1670-1734) married Abraham Cuyler, Jane (1673-1755) married John Glen, and Margaret (born March 8, 1680) married Henry Ten Eyck.

John Boardman, or Bordman, as the name was first written, was born in Preston, Connecticut, and was a soldier in the Revolutionary Army. He removed to New York State and settled in Vanderhuyden, afterwards called Troy, in what was then Albany County, now Rensselaer County, and was established in business there in 1784.

Jan Louwe Bogaert (1630—) emigrated from Schoenderwoert, Holland, in the ship *Spotted Cow*, in 1663, and settled in Bedford, now a part of Brooklyn. In 1672 he removed to Harlem, where he served as a magistrate, 1675-6. In 1706 he sold his Harlem farm (which he had purchased from Montagne) to Johannes Benson, and removed to New York City.

Everardus Bogardus (1607-1647), minister, was born at Woerden, near Utrecht, Holland, and emigrated to New Amsterdam, with Governor Van Twiller, in April, 1633, having been ordained by the Classis of Amsterdam the year previous. He was a widower when he arrived, but, in 1638, he married Anneke Janse, widow of Roeloff Janse. Rev. Mr. Bogardus resigned from his pastorate in New Amsterdam in 1647, and sailed for Holland, but was drowned off the coast in the English Channel while on his way thither, in the ship *Princess*, on September 27, 1647.

John Bowden (1751-1817) was born in Ireland. After studying for the ministry, he came to New York City, and in 1774 was appointed assistant at Trinity Church. At the outbreak of the Revolutionary War he went to Norwalk, Conn., and then to Long Island. When the war closed he went to England, and in 1789 was appointed to a church in the West Indies. In 1801 he returned to New York, and was made Professor of Moral Philosophy at Columbia College, in which position he remained until his death in 1817.

John Bowne was born at Matlock, in Derbyshire, England, March 9, 1627, and was a son of Thomas Bowne, who was baptized there in 1595. The father, with his son John, above, and daughter Dorothy, arrived in Boston, Massachusetts, in 1649. John Bowne eventually settled in Flushing, Long Island, and he and his wife became Quakers. He was arrested for permitting Friends to assemble under his roof, and was sent a prisoner to Holland, but was immediately released, and, after visiting England and the West Indies, he returned to Flushing. Hannah, wife of John Bowne, was in the Quaker ministry, and died at London, while on a religious visit there in 1677. Mr. Bowne afterwards married twice, his second wife being Hannah Bickerstaffe, and his third, Mary Cock. He died on the 20th day of 10th month, 1695. John Boyd (1725-1779) was born in Kilmarnock, Scotland. In early life he emigrated to the north of Ireland, where he married Ann Logan. He came to this country in 1762, settling first in Albany and then in Johnstown, N. Y., where he erected a saw-mill. When the Revolution broke out he was engaged in mercantile pursuits in Albany. He died at Johnstown, July 6, 1779, leaving nine children,—eight sons and one daughter. His sixth son, Dr. Thomas Boyd, was born at Albany, April 19, 1772, and on October 22, 1793, married Sarah Graham, daughter of Rev. Chauncey Graham and Elizabeth Van Wyck, of Fishkill, N. Y. In 1805 he settled in New York City, where he became one of the most distinguished physicians of his day, and, at the time of his death, March 18, 1856, was the oldest practitioner in the city. He was a charter member of N. Y. Academy of Medicine.

Sidney Breese (1709-1767) was born in Shrewsbury, Wales. He was a purser in the British Navy as late as 1754, and was stationed at New York, where he settled, and was Master of the Port in 1763. His wife was born in New York, and was a daughter of Captain Pinkethman, of the British Army. They were married in 1733. Sidney Breese is buried in Trinity Churchyard, where his epitaph is well known. The epitaph was written by himself and reads as follows:

"Ha! Sidney! Sidney! Lyest thou here? I here lye, Till time is flown To its extremity."

He was a popular and hospitable man and a merchant of integrity.

Joris Dircksen Brinckerhoff (1609-1661) came from Holland in 1638, and settled in Brooklyn, L. I., where he died January 16, 1661. He was one of the magistrates of Brooklyn, 1654-1660, and at the time of his death was an elder in the Dutch Church there.

Thomas Brinkley, or Brinckle, was a Lieutenant in Colonel Lewis Du Bois' regiment, the Fifth Regiment of the Line, during the Revolutionary War. Family tradition reports him one of Major André's guards. He died in 1795.

Jonathan Brooks (1722----) came to this country from England about the middle of the 18th century, and settled in Blooming Grove, Orange County, N. Y., where he purchased a farm.

John Broome (1738-1810) was an old merchant of New York City. He was a member of the New York State Constitutional Convention of 1777, and Lieutenant-Governor of the State in 1804. During the whole of his public career he was prominent in New York, and was for many years at the head of some of the leading charitable and commercial institutions of the city. An important thoroughfare bears his name.

Willem Hendrickse Brouwer (-----1668) owned property in New Amsterdam in 1655, but in 1657 he was residing in Beverwyck (Albany). In 1662, he, with his elder brother, Philip, took up land in Schenectady, and was one of the original patentees of that place. He was buried in Albany, August 3, 1668.

Samuel Brown, son of William Brown, settled in Westchester County, N. Y., in the early part of the 18th century. His son Thomas (1719-1804) removed to Peekskill, and, later, resided at Nine Partners, Dutchess County, N. Y.

William Bull was born at Wolverhampton, Staffordshire, England, in 1689, and emigrated to this country about the year 1715, settling at Hamptonburgh, Orange County, N. Y., where he resided until his death.

Jacob Burhans (——1677?) first appears, in 1660, as a soldier in the Netherlandish service on the Esopus, "in the Company of his Noble Honor the Director General." He settled at Kingston, Ulster County, N. Y. (then variously called Wiltwyck, Esopus, Swaenenburgh, Atkarkarton), where his name is on the list of church members on the date of the organization of the Dutch Reformed Church in that village, under Dominie Harmanus Blom, December 7, 1660. He was a Schepen at Wiltwyck in 1666, and Commissioner of the Court in 1667. He died previous to September, 1677. His son, Jan, arrived in America, April 16, 1663, in the ship *Bonte Koe*, and settled at Kingston, where he died about 1708.

Arent Harmanse Bussing emigrated to America in 1639 from Bentheim in Westphalia, where, according to Riker, "the family was not unknown to fame." He settled at Flatbush, L. I., where he purchased a farm and two town lots. In 1662 he sold this property and removed to Harlem where he had acquired a large tract of land, and was later in 1673 appointed a magistrate. He married first, May 24, 1673, Susannah Delamater, and second, March 31, 1678, Divertje (Eva) Lubbertse. She was born 1657. On March 2, 1676 he was made Corporal of the Night Watch to guard against Indians. He died in 1718.

John Cannon (1677-1748) was a son of Andries Canon and Jannetje Plúck, and was baptized in the New York Dutch Church, November 3, 1677. On September 23, 1697, he married Marytje (Mary) Legrand, daughter of Pierre Le Grand, a French refugee, and Janneken De Windel, his wife. John Cannon was made a freeman of the city on February 2, 1699. He was a boatman, his skiff plying between New York and Staten Island, and he was the proprietor of "Cannon's Wharf" in 1728. This wharf adjoined Schermerhorn's Wharf, and the two extended towards, if not over, Fulton Market.

Thomas Carhart (1650-1696), the son of Anthony Carhart, of Cornwall, England, came to America in 1683, as private secretary to Col. Thomas Dongan, Governor of the Province of New York. In 1691, having removed to Staten Island, he was appointed Clerk of Richmond County.

Abraham Carmer, or Kermer, came from Hamburg, and was married in this city on December 1, 1656, to Metje Davids, who came from Arnheim on the Rhine. He lived "south of the wall of this city," on what is now New Street.

Joseph Carpenter (1635-1683), born at Amesbury, Wiltshire, England, was the son of William Carpenter and Elizabeth Arnold, his wife, who emigrated to New England in 1635, and, in the following year, settled in Providence, R. I. About 1663, he removed to Long Island, where he assisted in founding the town of Oyster Bay and Musketa Cove (now Glen Cove).

Elie Chardavoine was from Saujon, near the southern coast of St. Onge (Saintonge), France, and came to New York in 1692. His wife, Anne Valleau, was from the Ile de Ré.

Thomas Cheesman (----1785?) came to New York City from Philadelphia previous to August 31, 1756, on which date he was made a freeman of the city, his occupation being given as that of shipwright. He subsequently returned to Philadelphia, where he died, shortly after the close of the Revolutionary War.

Alexander Clark, "mariner," was made a Freeman of the City of New York, April 11, 1716. He lived on the south side of Wall Street, where the Wall Street extension of the Stock Exchange now stands (1904).

Moses Clark (1730-1806) was descended from an English soldier who, after the close of the war with Spain, went to Rochelle, France, where he married, and from whence, in 1681, in company with a number of Huguenot refugees, he came to America and settled at New Rochelle, N. Y.

George Codwise was a prosperous merchant in New York City. After his marriage, in 1760, he lived on the west side of Franklin Square. He originally came from Santa Cruz, W. I.

Cadwallader Colden (1687-1776), the son of Rev. Alexander Colden, of Berwickshire, Scotland, was born February 7 (O.S.), 1687, in Ireland, while his parents were there on a visit. Graduating, in 1705, from the University of Edinburgh, he studied medicine, and in 1710 came to America and settled in Philadelphia, where he practiced his profession until 1718, in which year he removed to New York City. Dr. Colden was a man of considerable literary and scientific attainments, and was also prominent politically, being Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of New York from 1761 until his death, serving for much of this time as Acting Governor. On the 11th of November, 1715, while on a visit to Scotland, he married Alice Christy, the daughter of a clergyman of Kelso. His death occurred at his country place, "Spring Hill," near Flushing, L. I., on the 20th day of September, 1776. John Constable, M. D. (1728-1785), was born in Dublin. He was a surgeon in the British Army, and in 1753 came to Montreal during the French War. In 1762 Governor Colden granted him a commission as surgeon in the first regiment in the pay of the Province of New York. He removed to Schenectady, but died in New York City, April 17, 1785, and was buried in St. Paul's Churchyard, New York, where a large monument is erected over himself and wife. His son William was one of Lafayette's aides during the Revolutionary War, and subsequently became a wealthy merchant trading with India and China.

Barent Jacobse Cool was among the very early Dutch settlers of New Amsterdam, although the precise date of his coming to America is not known. In 1633 he was already a person of some consideration in the colony, and on the 8th day of June of that year he, with Commissary Jacob Van Curler and five others, signed a treaty with the Sachem Tatoepam, Chief of the Sickemanes Indians, owners of the river of New Netherland, called "Connetticuck," by which, in consideration of their receiving twenty-seven ells of cloth, six axes, six kettles, eighteen knives, and various other articles, the aforesaid Indians sold a tract of land called "Sicajook," being the flat extending about one league along the river and one-third of a league in width to the high land, on condition that all tribes might freely and in safety resort to the purchased land for trade purposes. The treaty also provided that the Sachem Altabacuhote was to dwell on the purchased land with the assent of Chief Margaratin of the Sloops Bay Indians.

About 1637 Jacobse Cool married Marietje de Grauw, daughter of Leendert de Grauw, a member of one of the Walloon families who were the first settlers of New Amsterdam. The baptism of their nine children all appear on the records of the Reformed Dutch Church of New Amsterdam, except that of his eldest son, Jacob Barentse Cool, who was born in 1638. Barent Jacobse Cool was enrolled as a "Burgher" of New Amsterdam on the 14th of April, 1657, and took the usual oath of obedience to the city authorities and of fidelity to the States-General of the United Netherlands, to the Dutch West India Company and to its Director-General. In October, 1664, after the surrender of New Amsterdam to the English, he took the oath of allegiance to the King of England. He was living on the 21st October, 1671, when he acted as sponsor at the baptism of his grandson, Johannes Willems Van Vreedenberg. The exact date of his death and that of his wife is not known, but the latter was still living in 1668.

George Copland (1762-1820) was born in the Orkney Islands, Scotland, and settled in New York City previous to 1785. On the 20th of May, 1787, he married, in New York, Margaret Robison, who was born in White Haven, England, in 1765.

Thomas Cornell (1595-1655) was born in Essex, England. In 1635 he emigrated, with his family, to America, and settled at Boston, where he remained two years, going from there to Rhode Island. In 1642 he obtained a large grant of land in Westchester County, N. Y., where he resided until his death in 1655.

Thomas Cornish, an Englishman, a cooper by trade, was one of the founders of Newtown, Long Island, about 1650. After passing through New England, his party crossed Long Island Sound and located in Dutch territory. Peter Stuyvesant, as Governor of New Amsterdam, recognized their claims and welcomed them as settlers. The name of Thomas Cornish appears upon a petition to Governor Stuyvesant. His descendants lived at Newtown during the Revolution, and actively supported the cause of freedom.

Martin Cregier (1612-1689) was a native of Holland, and emigrated to New Amsterdam previous to 1643, in which year he received a grant of land. He was one of the first burgomasters of the city, serving for several years. He was active in both civil and military affairs, being appointed in 1656 captain of the Dutch forces on the Delaware, and later being placed in command of the military forces of the New Netherlands. He led the expedition sent against the Indians after the massacre at Esopus in 1663, and in 1664 was one of the signers of the Articles of Capitulation at the surrender of New Amsterdam to the English.

Anthony Crispell (-----1708), or Antoine Crepel, as the name was then spelled, was born in Artois, an ancient province of France, now comprising a portion of the Department of Pas de Calais, on the borders of Belgium. Driven from his native country by religious persecution he went to Mannheim, in the Lower Palatinate, where he married Marie, the daughter of Mathew Blanshan, or Blanjean, another French refugee. In 1666 he came to the new world, with his wife and father-in-law, in the ship *Gilded Otter*, and settled at Esopus (Kingston), later removing to the "Nieuw Dorp," now called Hurley, about three miles away. In 1677 he was one of the twelve patentees of New Paltz.

John Cruger (-----1744) came to America from Germany previous to 1700 and settled in the City of New York, where he soon became prominent in commercial, political and social life. He was an alderman for twenty-one years (1712-1733), and in 1739 was elected Mayor of the city, which office he held at the time of his death, August 13, 1744. On the 5th of March, 1703, he married Maria, daughter of Hendrick Cuyler, of Albany, by whom he had three sons and six daughters. His eldest son Tileman died unmarried at the age of twenty-five. John, the youngest son, was Mayor of New York (1756-1766), and was for seventeen years a member of the Provincial Assembly, serving for some time as its speaker. He died unmarried.

William Cruikshank (1760-1831), son of Theodore Cruikshank, was born in Boynsville, Aberdeenshire, Scotland, in June, 1760. Previous to 1785 he settled in New York City, where he engaged in business as a wholesale grocer, having obtained a contract from the Government to furnish supplies to the Indians. His house, No. 40 Greenwich Street, then on the water front, overlooked the site of the first docks in the city, which were afterward built under the supervision of his son James Cruikshank (1804-1895). In April, 1795, he married Sarah, daughter of William Allen and Phoebe Blake, by whom he had eleven children. He died January 9, 1831, and was buried in the family vault in the old New York Marble Cemetery on First Avenue.

Joshua Curtis (1742-1795), the son of Zachariah Curtis and Lina Wheeler, was born at Goshen, Conn., and after attaining his majority removed to Chatham, Columbia County, N. Y. At the close of the Revolutionary War he settled on a tract of land in the vicinity of Fort Stanwix (near Rome), Oneida County, N. Y. He died August 2, 1795.

Matthew Davis (1745-1780) was born in New York City of English parentage, April 30, 1745. In 1769 he married Phoebe Wells, of Goshen, N. Y., then in her sixteenth year. He was for some years engaged in business in South Street, having a summer residence in Sussex County, N. J. He served in the War of the Revolution as Quartermaster in Col. John Lasher's regiment of militia, and died September 24, 1780, from the effects of a wound in the shoulder.

Lawrence De Camp, son of John De Camp, was a French Huguenot of Picardy or Normandy, who came to New Amsterdam in 1664 and settled at New Utrecht, L. I. He lived there until 1688, signing the oath of allegiance as "Laurens Janse De Camp 23 Jaere" on the 26th of September, 1687. Shortly afterward he removed to Staten Island, where he was still living in 1701. John Delafield (1748-1824) was born in England, March 16, 1748. He came to America in the ship *Vigilant*, landing in New York City, April 6, 1783, and opened a banking office in Water Street, in which business he amassed considerable wealth. December 11, 1784, he married Ann, daughter of Joseph Hallett, of Hallett's Point, L. I. His death occurred July 3, 1824. Mr. Delafield was a man of great force of character and held an important place in the business and social life of the city.

Stephen De Lancey (1663-1741) was a French Huguenot, born at Caen, in Normandy, October 24, 1663. He fled from his native country to avoid the religious persecutions that followed the revocation of the Edict of Nantes in 1685, and arrived in New York, June 7, 1686, where he engaged in mercantile pursuits and soon became one of the most noted and wealthy merchants in America. His store was on the N. E. corner of Broad and Pearl Streets, and his residence during the latter years of his life was on the west side of Broadway, a short distance above Trinity Church.

Cornelius Delavan (1688-----) is said to have come from Rochelle, France, with a colony of Huguenots. He married Deborah, daughter of John Green, of Stamford, Conn., October 3, 1712. Their grandson, Timothy Delavan, was commissioned 2nd Lieutenant in Captain Waterbury's Company, in Colonel Ludington's Regiment of the Fredericksburgh Precinct, Dutchess County, N. Y., on May 28, 1778.

David Demarest (1620-1693), born in Picardie, near Amiens, France, son of Jean des Marest, came to New Amsterdam in 1663 in the ship *Bonte Kou*, and settled on Staten Island, where he was a magistrate in 1664. Later he removed to Harlem, on Manhattan Island. In 1678 he settled upon his estate of several thousand acres, partly in New Jersey and partly in New York State. The wife of David Demarest, Marie Sohier, was born at Nieppes, France, and they were married July 24, 1663.

William Denning (1740-1819) was born, according to family tradition, at St. John's, Newfoundland. When quite young he went to New York City and entered the mercantile house of William Hawkshurst, whose daughter Sarah he married June 28, 1765. During the Revolution he was a member of the Committee of Safety and of the Second and Third Provincial Congresses, was one of the Commissioners of Accounts, and held various other public offices. He represented the City of New York in the State Assembly, 1784-87 and 1798, and was a member of the State Senate, 1798-1808. His wife died October 14, 1776, and in the following year he married her sister Amy, widow of Phineas McIntosh. Mr. Denning died at his home, 341 Broadway, New York City, on the 30th day of October, 1819.

Teunis Denyse (——1661) came to America from Binneck in Utrecht, Holland, 1638, and settled in New Amsterdam, from whence he removed to Flatbush, L. I., in 1655. His marriage is the third one recorded in the records of the Collegiate Dutch Church of New York City, February 11, 1640. The family is of French origin, and is supposed to have come from Champagne and have lived but a short time in Holland. In the early Dutch records of New York the name is sometimes spelled Nyssen.

Johannes De Peyster (1620-1685) emigrated from Haarlem, Holland, previous to 1649. Possessed of some wealth he engaged in mercantile pursuits, and soon acquired position and influence, becoming successively schepen, alderman, burgomaster and deputy-mayor, declining in 1677 the office of mayor on account, it is said, of his imperfect knowledge of English.

Nicasius de Sille (1610—), the son of Burgomaster Laurens de Sille and Walburga Merwyns, his wife, was born at Arnheim, Holland, September 23, 1610. In 1653 he came, with his five children, to New Amsterdam, having been appointed First Councillor to Director-General Peter Stuyvesant. From 1654 to 1656 he was Commissioner of Boundaries, and in the latter year was appointed Schout Fiscal. He was Vice-Director during Stuyvesant's absence in the West Indies, December, 1654, July, 1655. He was one of the original proprietors of New Utrecht, L. I., and in 1657 he built the first stone house in that town. He was a man of unusual attainments, and occupied a position of much influence in the community.

Tjerck Claeszen De Witt (1620-1700), "of Grootholdt en Zunderlandt," came to New Amsterdam previous to 1656, where, on April 24th of that year he married Barbara Andries of Amsterdam. The following year he removed to Albany, where he had purchased a house and lot which, in 1660, he exchanged with Madame de Hutter for land in Wiltwyck (now Kingston). Here he lived until his death, February 17th, 1700. He was active in the government of the village, occupying various offices of honor and trust. In the Indian massacre of 1663 he was severely wounded, and his daughter Taatje, then about four years old, was carried into captivity, but was rescued by the expedition under Captain Martin Cregier. She afterward married Captain Mattys Mattysen (Van Keuren.)

George Dominick (1739-1832) was a Captain in the New York City Militia, September 15th and November 3rd, 1775, under Colonel John Jay. After the Revolution he became a vestryman of Trinity Church. He was born in the Ile du Ré, France.

Cornelis Doremus (——1715) emigrated to this country from Middleburg, the chief city of the Province of Zeeland, Holland, with his wife and several children, settled for a time in New Amsterdam, and then removed to Bergen, New Jersey, where his son Thomas was born.

Francis Doughty (1605?-----), minister, emigrated from England and settled at Taunton, Mass., about the year 1633. Owing to a disagreement with the church over a doctrinal matter, Mr. Doughty and about one hundred families moved to the island of Aquidneck, the present site of Newport, R. I. Subsequently the Dutch authorities granted Mr. Doughty a tract of land at Mespath, which embraced nearly the whole of Newtown, Mespath and a part of Flushing, L. I. After the burning of Mespath village by the Indians, Mr. Doughty sought refuge in New Amsterdam with his followers. Within the fort he established an English Church and preached regularly to his flock. It is claimed that he was the first preacher in the English language in New York City.

Jacques Du Bois (1625-1676) was born at Wicres, near Lille, France, the son of Christian Du Bois, of an old Huguenot family. In early manhood he went to Leyden, where he became a manufacturer of silks and cloth, and where, April 25, 1663, he married Pieronne Bentyn. In 1675, with his wife and three sons, he emigrated to America and settled at Esopus (Kingston), where he had been preceded by his brother Louis, and where he died the following year.

Louis Du Bois (1626-1697) was baptized at Wicres, France, and died at Kingston, Ulster County, N. Y. He married Katryn Blanshan, at Mannheim, Germany, on October 10, 1655. At an early age he went from France to Germany to avoid religious persecution, and in 1660 he came with other Huguenots to America, settling at New Hurley, Ulster County, N. Y. After its destruction in 1663 by the Indians, he was one of the party which rescued his wife and other captives from the savages. In 1666 he was one of the patentees of New Paltz and was early at Kingston. In 1669 and 1673 he was Overseer for Hurley. He removed to New Paltz in 1678, and in 1682 was magistrate there. About 1687 he returned to Kingston, and there resided until his death.

William Duer (1747-1799) was the son of John Duer and Frances Frye, and was born in Devonshire, England, March 18, 1747. At the age of fifteen he obtained a commission as ensign in the English Army and served as aide-de-camp on the staff of Lord Clive. On the death of his father he retired from military life, and in 1768 went to New York, where he engaged in business. July 27, 1779, he married "Lady Kitty" Alexander, the daughter of William Alexander, Lord Sterling, a Major-General in the Continental Army. Mr. Duer was a member of the New York Provincial Congress, 1776-7, and of the Continental Congress, 1777-8. He died May 7, 1799. His eldest son, William Alexander Duer, was President of Columbia College, 1829-42, and another son, John Duer, was a leading jurist, being for some years Chief Justice of the New York Supreme Court.

Walrand Dumont (-----1713) was born at "Coomen, Flanders," now Commines, Department du Nord, France, eight miles north of Lille. He went to Amsterdam, Holland, and from there came to New Amsterdam in 1657, being adelborst or lieutenant in a company of soldiers sent by the Dutch West India Company to Director-General Stuyvesant. He settled at Esopus (Kingston), where he was a member of the military council in the second Esopus war, and also served as Schepen or magistrate, 1669-1671. He married January 13, 1664, Margaret Hendricks, "of Wie, near Sivol," widow of Jan Arentsen. She was still living in 1728.

Joost Durie (1650-1727?), of a French Huguenot family, emigrated to this country with his wife and mother from Mannheim, in the Palatinate, about 1675. He settled at New Utrecht, L. I., where he purchased a farm which, some years later, he sold to Gerrit Cornelisse Van Duyn, and located on the "debatable ground" between Newtown and Bushwick, in which latter town he took the oath of allegiance in 1687. He died about 1727. The name is now generally spelled Duryee and Duryea.

Philip Du Trieux (1585-1653?) was a Walloon, who came to New Amsterdam under Minuit's administration, and was granted in 1640 a patent for land. He was Marshal of New Netherland. His widow appeared in a court action in 1653.

William Edgar (1739?-1820) came to America from Scotland in 1760 and resided in Canada, where he was engaged in the fur trade until 1783. In that year he removed to New York City, and in 1784 was naturalized as a citizen of the United States.

Christoffel Elsworth was "a boat builder of respectable standing" who resided for many years on the "Smith's Fly," now Pearl Street. He was a freeholder of New York in 1655.

Moses Ely (1756-1838), son of William Ely and Elizabeth Perkins,—and a descendant of Richard Ely who emigrated to New England from Plymouth, Devonshire County, England, about 1660, was born at Livingston, N. J., November 18, 1756. He served in the war of the Revolution, and at its close settled in New York City, where he engaged in business, residing on Lombard Street (now Trinity Place). He subsequently returned to his birthplace, where he died July 14, 1838.

John Embree (1697-1769) was born in Flushing, Long Island. He is said to have been the son of a French Huguenot who settled in New Rochelle, Westchester County, N. Y., shortly after the revocation of the Edict of Nantes by Louis XIV in 1685, subsequently removing to Flushing.

Peter Embury came from Ireland, and reached New York August 10, 1760. He was a brother of Philip Embury, who established the Methodist Church in New York, and who at first preached in a sail loft in William Street, between John and Fulton Streets, and afterwards in a church built in John Street. This family was originally from the Palatinate, traditionally bearing the name Von Emburg, and settled in Ireland during the reign of Queen Anne.

Pierre Fauconnier (1660-1749), born in France of a prominent Huguenot family, removed to London, England, where, with his wife, Magdalene Pasquereau, he was naturalized April 4, 1685. He came to New York as early as 1702. On June 27th of that year he was made a freeman of the city, and in December following he and his wife, with others, petitioned for certain lands on Staten Island. He held important official positions under the colonial government and received large grants of land.

Robert Field (1605-1673?) was born at Halifax, England, in 1605, being baptized there March 9th of that year. In 1638 he was living at Newport, R. I., from whence he removed to Flushing, L. I., where he was a patentee, October 10, 1645.

Jonathan Fish (1610?-1663?) was born in England, and, with his two brothers, Nathaniel and John, emigrated to America about 1635. He first settled at Lynn, Mass., and in 1637 removed to Sandwich on Cape Cod. In 1659 he joined in the settlement of Newtown, L. I., where he served for several years as a magistrate. His name appears frequently on the town records in an official capacity, and he was the owner of a twenty-shilling purchase right in the town lands, which right was inherited by his sons Nathan (1650-1734) and Samuel. His grandson Jonathan (1680-1723) built the "Old Corner House" in Newtown, and gave the ground on which the old Presbyterian Church now stands.

Richard Floyd (—1700) came from Brecknockshire, Wales, about 1650 and settled first in Massachusetts, but in 1656 he removed to Setauket, town of Brookhaven, L. I., of which he was one of the original settlers, and where he took a very active part in public affairs. He was treasurer of the corporation created by the British Parliament in 1650 to raise funds for propagating the Gospel among the heathen. His great-grandson, William Floyd, was one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence. Joseph Fowler (1610-----) was born in Dalbury Lees, Derbyshire, England, and was descended from Reginaldus Le Fowler who died in 1301. Joseph Fowler was in Maspeth Kill, now Newtown, in 1655, and in 1656 was taxed \pounds I for 20 acres at Middelburg. In 1657 he signed the remonstrance to the Governor of New York, protesting against injustice to the Quakers. He married Sarah, daughter of Richard Betts of Hempstead, Co. Middlesex, England, and sister of Richard Betts who was an original patentee and magistrate of Newtown.

Andrew Garr (1745-1812) was a ship-builder and had extensive ship yards on the East River at the foot of Rutgers Street and on Water Street. In 1793 he was elected a member of the Saint Andrew's Society of the State of New York. His son, Andrew Sheffield Garr, graduated from Columbia College in 1796, practiced law in the city fifty-three years, and was one of the original members of the Saint Nicholas Society.

John Gottlieb Gassner (1738-1822) was born at Leipsic, Saxony. He came to the City of New York prior to 1764, and died there February 17, 1822, his grave being in St. Paul's Churchyard.

John Gabriel Gebhard (1750-1826) was born in Waldorf, Germany, a son of the village pastor of that place. He received his education at Heidelberg, completed his theological studies at Utrecht, and was licensed to preach by the Reformed Church of Holland, after which he emigrated to America. June 3, 1773, he was married, at Philadelphia, to Anamaria Magdalene Gebhard, and later became pastor of a Reformed Dutch Church in New York City. In 1776 he was called to the Dutch Church at Claverack, N. Y., where he remained until his death in 1826. In 1777 he founded the Washington Seminary at Claverack, afterward called The Hudson River Institute.

Ryer Elbertse Gerritse in 1653 had a patent for land on the Third or Fossen kil, bounded south by Columbia Street and east by Broadway, Albany. His wife Maritje Barentse had been the widow of Gerrit Van Schaick.

John [G.] Glover (----1800) came to this country from Ireland about the middle of the 18th century, and settled in New York City, where he was engaged in business for a number of years. To distinguish himself from a contemporary John Glover he adopted the letter G. as a middle initial. He died in February or March, 1800, leaving him surviving his wife and seven children, John, Andrew, Sarah, Jane, Elizabeth, Ann and Maria. **Francis Goelet** was a member of that branch of the Goelet family which left La Rochelle, France, at the time of the Huguenot troubles of 1621, and which settled in Amsterdam. In the year 1667 Francis Goelet, having lost his wife, came to New Amsterdam with his only child Jacobus, was pleased with the situation, and fixed on that place for his future residence. He left his son to the care of Mr. Phillipse, one of the first people of that place, and sailed for Amsterdam with the intention of returning with his effects, but as he was never afterwards heard of it was supposed that he was lost at sea.

Peter Guernsey (1748-1799) was a lawyer and landed proprietor who removed to Dutchess County, N. Y., from Litchfield, Conn., previous to the Revolutionary War. His ancestors settled at Milford, Conn., about 1639, and were connected with the early history of the New Haven Colony.

Jonathan Haight removed from Rye to Cortland, N. Y., where he died before 1780. He married Susanna, daughter of Ebenezer Theall, and their son Jonathan bccame a prominent citizen of Westchester, having been commissioned lieutenant in 1759, and afterwards commanding a company in the 2nd Regiment, Col. George Brewerton, which formed part of the Expedition against Havana in 1762. He died at Fishkill Landing in 1782.

Thomas Halsey (1592-1678) was a mercer in London, afterwards living in Naples, Italy. He emigrated from England to Lynn, Mass., about 1639, and in 1640, in company with a number of other Englishmen who had settled in Lynn, purchased a large tract of land on Long Island and founded the town of Southampton. His father, Robert Halsey, owned the estate at Great Gaddesden, Hertfordshire, England, which is still in the possession of the English branch of the Halseys. Phoebe, wife of Thomas Halsey, was killed by the Indians at Southampton, L. I., in 1649.

Alexander Hamilton (1757-1804) was born in the Island of Nevis, W. I., January 11, 1757, and died in New York City, July 12, 1804. At the age of fifteen he came to this country, arriving at Boston in October, 1772, and proceeding to New York. After attending school at Elizabethtown, N. J., he entered King's College, New York, now Columbia, and while he was a student there the Revolutionary War broke out. He immediately took an active part, being a master of controversial writing, and in 1776 he was given command of a company of artillery which soon became a model organization. He became an aide on Washington's staff, but taking offence at a reproof given him by that general, resigned in 1781, remaining, however, in the army. After the war he studied law, and while thus occupied, Robert Morris offered him the post of Continental Receiver. Owing to his great abilities and his fortunate marriage, promotion was rapid, and when the Treasury Department was organized in April, 1789, Washington placed him at its head. After great services rendered to his country, Mr. Hamilton accepted the challenge of Aaron Burr, his political enemy, met him on July 11, 1804, at Weehawken, and fell, mortally wounded, at the first fire.

Francis Harison (-----1740) was the third son of the Rev. William Harison, Rector of Cheriton, England, Master of S. Cross Hospital, Winchester, and Prebendary of Winchester, and Dorothea Morley, his wife, and grandson of Sir Richard Harison, of Hurst, Berkshire. He came to New York with Francis, Lord Lovelace, Governor of the Province, in 1708. He was recommended to Governor Hunter by Henry St. John (afterward Lord Bolingbroke), and was appointed Sheriff of New York in June, 1710, occupying this office until July 23, 1717, when he was appointed Surveyor and Searcher of the Port of New York. He was Farmer of the Excise and Examiner in Chancery, and on January 15, 1720, was advanced to the Governor's Council by mandamus. On the death of Caleb Heathcote in 1721, he succeeded that gentleman as Judge of the Court of Vice-Admiralty in New York, his jurisdiction being subsequently enlarged so as to include Connecticut and New Jersey. In June, 1724, he became Recorder of the City of New York, in which office he remained until 1735, when he returned to England.

Abraham Hasbrouck (-----1717) was born in Calais, France, about the middle of the seventeenth century, of an old Huguenot family. Forced to leave his country by the religious persecution which in those days beset the Huguenots, he went, with his father, his brother Jean and his sister, to Mannheim in Germany, from whence, in 1675, he emigrated to America and settled at Esopus (Kingston), where he had been preceded by his brother, and where on November 17th of that year he married Maria, daughter of Christian Deyo. In 1677, with his brother Jean, Louis Du Bois, Anthony Crispell, Hugo Freer and other French Huguenots to the number of twelve in all, he obtained from Governor Andros the grant of a large tract of land in Ulster County, upon which they settled, and to which they gave the name of New Paltz. He was commissioned captain of a foot company for Kingston and New Paltz in 1685. He was from 1698 to 1701 a member of the Provincial Assembly and was one of the founders of the Walloon Protestant Church at New Paltz in which, for many years, service was conducted in the French language. He died of apoplexy on Sunday, March 17, 1717. His wife died March 27, 1741 in her eighty-eighth year.

Pieter Janse Haughwout (1621?-1661?), with his wife and two sons, Leffert and Pieter, sailed from the province of Drenthe, Holland, April 15, 1660, in the ship *Bonte Koe* (*Spotted Cow*) and settled at Flatbush, L. I., where he shortly after died, as in October, 1662, his widow married Pieter Jacobse Van Nortwyck. The descendants of his son Pieter retained the family name of Haughwout, but Leffert's children assumed the surname of Lefferts, by which name most of their descendants have been since known.

George Havens (1653-1706) was born on Conanicut Island, near Newport, R. I. In 1699 he bought of Nathaniel Sylvester 1,000 acres of land in Shelter Island, Suffolk County, N. Y., and settled there in 1700. A portion of this original purchase is now owned by Henry P. Havens, never having been out of the Havens name.

William Haviland (1620-1697), born in Gloucestershire, emigrated from England to Newport, R. I., where he was a Freeman in 1653. He was appointed a Representative in Assembly from the same place, and a Commissioner to the General Committee at Portsmouth in 1656. He was a large land-owner at Newport. As early as the year 1667 he removed to Flushing, Long Island, and purchased land on Madnan's Neck. His name appears on the lists of the valuations of estates at Flushing as early as the year 1675 and as late as 1683. He received a patent for land in Flushing in 1685. He married Hannah Hicks, a daughter of John Hicks, a land-owner and a Justice of the Peace at Hempstead, Long Island.

Stephen Herrick was born in Preston, Conn., February 12, 1705, and married there November 11, 1726, Phebe Guile of the same place. They forthwith removed to Amenia, Dutchess County, N. Y., their eldest son being born there November 10, 1727, and their son Joseph on May 5, 1735.

Martin Hoffman (1625—) was born at Revel, on the Gulf of Finland, and is said to have been a Ritmaster in the army of Gustavus Adolphus. He emigrated to America in 1658, settling first in Esopus, where he assisted in a repulse of the Indians in 1658. He removed to New Amsterdam, where he became a large tax-payer, and his name appears in a directory of that city in 1661. He afterwards returned to Kingston and received a grant from the English Crown of land in the town of Kingston in 1688. He took the oath of allegiance in 1689. Although he married twice, the second wife, Emmerentje De Witt, was the mother of all his children.

Kilian Hogeboom was born in Holland and emigrated to this country some time after the year 1712 with his son Jeremiah. He settled at Claverack, Columbia County, N. Y., where he purchased a farm.

Philip Hone. The earliest ancestor in New York was a Hahn or Von Hahn, about whom nothing further is known. Philip Hone, grandson of the American progenitor, was born in New York, his father residing and transacting business in John Street. Mr. Hone entered the auction and commission business with his elder brother John. About the year 1820 he retired from business and visited Europe. On his return he became interested in politics, and after serving as Assistant Alderman of the Third Ward, became Mayor in 1825. The year of his mayoralty was marked as one of great magnificence and hospitality, the expense being defrayed from his private resources. Under the Presidency of General Taylor he was appointed Naval Officer of this Port, which office he held at the time of his death, which occurred May 5, 1851, at his residence, corner of Broadway and Great Jones Street.

Israel Honeywell (1660-1720) emigrated from England to America about 1680, and settled in Westchester County, N. Y., where his son Israel (1687-1762) was a soldier in 1715.

Alexander Hosack was a Scotch artillery officer who distinguished himself at the capture of Louisburg in 1758.

Matthias Houghtaling (1644-1706) was an engineer and surveyor. On July 8, 1697, Governor Benjamin Fletcher, as representative of the English Crown, granted him a patent of land known as "The Houghtaling Patent," recorded in Book 7 of Patents, in the office of the Secretary of State at Albany. This patent includes a large portion of the present towns of New Baltimore and Coxsackie in Greene County, and much of it remains in the present possession of the descendants of Matthias Houghtaling.

Simon Hoyt (1595-1657) was first of the name to come to America from Dorsetshire, England. He landed at Salem, Mass., in 1628 or 29, and afterwards removed to Flushing, L. I., where his name was changed to Haight by an Act of Legislature in 1698, and where he obtained a grant of land from the Indians.

Robert Huestis, who died in 1652, was an inhabitant of Greenwich, Connecticut. His son Robert was of Westchester County, N. Y., where he acted as magistrate September 13, 1662. He was appointed a Justice by Governor Stuyvesant. In 1663 he was made a freeman of Connecticut from Westchester (both colonies claiming jurisdiction). On August 6, 1665, he signed the famous Eastchester Covenant. He became a Quaker and his descendants continued in that faith.

William Irving (1731-1807) was born on the Island of Shapinshay, one of the Orkney group of the Northern coast of Scotland. In 1761 he married Sarah Saunders of Falmouth, England, and two years later emigrated to America and settled in New York City, where he became a prosperous merchant. Their son Washington Irving was a famous writer, and one of the founders of The Saint Nicholas Society.

Augustus Jay (1665-1751) was born at Rochelle, France, March 23, 1665, the son of Pierre Jay, a prominent Huguenot. Shortly before the revocation of the Edict of Nantes, the family, forced by religious persecution, fled to England, from whence Augustus emigrated to America, going first to Charleston, S. C., and shortly after,—about 1697,—to New York City, where he became prominent in social and business affairs. He died March 10, 1751.

Thomas Jones (1665-1713), born in Strabane, Co. Tyrone, Ireland, was an officer in the army of James II, and took part in the Battle of the Boyne. Two years later (1692) he came to America, settling first in Rhode Island and then going to Long Island. He married the daughter of Captain Thomas Townsend, through whom he came into possession of a large tract of land at Fort Neck, L. I. His grandaughter, Arabella Jones (daughter of David), married Richard Floyd, and her descendants assumed the name of Floyd-Jones. In 1704 Thomas Jones was commissioned by Lord Cornbury to be Sheriff of Queens County. In 1710 he was appointed Ranger-General for Long Island. He died in December, 1713, and is buried in Grace Churchyard, Massapequa, L. I. His epitaph reads as follows:

"Here Lyes Interred the Body of Major Thomas Jones, who came from Strabane, In the Kingdom of Ireland, and settled here and died December 1713.

> From distant Lands to this wild waste he came, This seat he chose and here he fixed his name, Long may his Sons This peaceful spot Injoy And no ill fate his offspring here annoy."

Joseph Ketchum was a large land proprietor near Poughkeepsie, Dutchess County, N. Y.

Samuel King (1633-1721), the first of the name in New York State, was born in England. He was the second son of William and Dorothy King, afterward of Salem, Mass. Soon after the death of his father in 1651 he removed to Southold, L. I., where he became a large land-owner. He married, October 10, 1660, Frances, the daughter of William and Clemence Ludlam of Southampton, L. I., and died November 29, 1721, leaving a family of three sons and four daughters. His grave is in the old burial-ground at Orient, L. I. Hendrick Hendrickse Kip (1600-1680) came to New Amsterdam prior to 1643, and became one of the leading men in New Netherland. He was a bitter opponent of Director-General Kieft, owing to the conduct of the latter in ordering the Indian massacre at Corlears Hook and Pavonia. After Kieft's departure for Holland, Kip's rise was rapid. He was one of the Nine Men in 1647 and 1649, a Schepen in 1656, a Magistrate in 1660, and filled other offices.

Theunis Jacobsen Klaarwater (1624-1715) was born in Baarn, Holland. His ancestors were among the founders of the Dutch Republic. He was a soldier of Holland, a graduate of the University of Leyden, and a man of comparative wealth. He emigrated to America about 1660, and settled at Esopus (Kingston), N. Y., where he was one of the early members of the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church, founded there in that year. In 1664 he was chosen a commissioner to present to the British Crown the protest of the inhabitants of Kingston against the arrogant and illegal conduct of the commander of the English garrison stationed there. Later he removed to Bontecoe in the town of New Paltz. In 1709 he was one of the grantees, from Queen Anne, of a tract of 400 acres of land in the town of Shawangunk.

Johan Van Bergen Knickerbacker was the third son of Godfrey, Count Van Grimbergen, by his wife Honorine, daughter of Count Hoorn Van Beausignies. He was a captain in the Dutch navy and served in Brazil, afterwards in the land forces at the attack upon Antwerp. After the death of William II he came to America, arriving in 1652. His son John Knickerbacker was born at Albany, N. Y., and moved to Schaghticoke, N. Y., in 1709. The old homestead is still in possession of the family, and it was there that Irving gathered many notes for his "Knickerbocker."

John Christopher Kunze, D. D. (1744-1807), was born in Germany and ordained there as Lutheran minister in 1770. He was minister in Philadelphia from 1770 to 1784, became Rector of Christ Lutheran Church in New York (the so-called Swamp Church at the corner of William and Frankfort Streets) in 1784, and died as such in 1807. He was one of the most learned divines in this country, was Professor of German and Oriental Languages in Columbia College, and one of the founders of the present German Society for the protection of German immigrants. Warmoldus C. Kuypers (1732-1797) was born in Holland. He studied for the ministry, and after being licensed to preach went to the Island of Curaçoa as King's Chaplain. Leaving there in 1769 he settled at Rhinebeck, Dutchess County, N. Y., as pastor of the Reformed Dutch Church there. Later he removed to Hackensack, N. J. His wife was Johanna Wesselina Wolda.

John Lamb (1735-1800) was a General in the United States Army, and very prominent in New York during his life. He was included in the first list of voters ever prepared in New York State.

George Lane resided in Rye, County of Westchester, Province of New York, from 1666 to 1719, when he died, according to the town records of Rye. He was one of the founders of Christ Episcopal Church at Rye, and on February 28, 1695, was elected a Warden of the Church.

Gerrit Frederickse Lansing of Hassel, in the Province of Overyssel, Holland, came to New Amsterdam and probably to Rensselaerwyck about 1750, with his six children. He was probably dead before October 3, 1679, as on that day it is of record that his children made a joint conveyance of property.

Pieter Pieterse Lassingh (1620?-1695) was born in Amsterdam, Holland, about 1620. He emigrated to the new world about 1658 and settled at Albany, where he established a brewery which he carried on for a number of years, and a one-half interest in which he sold in 1678 to Sybrandt Goosen Van Schaick.

Richard Latting or Lettin, emigrated from England in 1638-9, and settled in Concord, Mass., subsequently removing to Fairfield, Conn. In 1653 he went to Long Island, residing at Oyster Bay and Hempstead, dying in Hempstead about 1672.

Thomas Lawrence (1625-1703) obtained a tract of land in Newtown, L. I., in 1655, and was a patentee under the patents by Governor Nicholl, March 6, 1666, and by Governor Dongan, November 25, 1686. Subsequently he purchased the whole of Hell Gate Neck, then consisting of several valuable farms extending along the East River from Hell Gate Cove to Bowery Bay. He was commissioned by Governor Nicholl, Captain at Newtown, April 21, 1665, and by Governor Leisler with the rank of Major, December 30, 1689. In February following he was intrusted with the raising of troops in Queens County to aid in defending Albany against the French. Among the meagre records which are left of Leislers' times, is the entry of an order to Major Thomas Lawrence, dated 29 July, 1690, "to press seventy men, horse and foot, as he shall think fit; and horses and provisions; and dispatch them to Southold for the defence and protection of their Majesties' subjects there" from an apprehended attack by French cruisers. He died at Newtown in the month of July.

William Lawton was born at West Point, May 1, 1795. Toward the close of the war 1812-1815, when the British fleet showed itself off Sandy Hook, he left his employment in a counting-house in New York City and enlisted in the New York Company of Col. Sitcher's Third Regiment of Volunteers as Sergeant-Major, and afterwards, as Adjutant-Major, served till the end of the war. He projected the formation of the New York Stock Exchange and assisted in its formation. He projected and built the Schuvlkill Valley Navigation and R. R. Company, the first railroad in the country, for the accommodation of passengers as well as freight. He was one of the original charter members of the High School of New York named in the Act of Incorporation, April 4th, 1825, and was one of the original 25 Trustees of the High School Society of New York elected under the Act. He was foreman of one of the first volunteer fire companies of the City of New York. His son, Doctor William Lawton, served during the Revolutionary War as Surgeon's Mate in the 5th and 15th Mass. Regiments. Was appointed by President George Washington as Surgeon's Mate at West Point, May 12th, 1794. He was an original member of the Society of the Cincinnati.

Claude le Maistre sprang from an ancient house of Brittany, the Lords of Garlaye, whose chateau and estates lay in the diocese of Nantes. It was eminent in the church, the bar, the civil service and the army. One of its members, who held command in Picardy, settled there and became allied, about 1520, with the Lords of Caumartin. Claude le Maistre, Sieur d'Hedicourt, becoming a Protestant, was imprisoned and fined in Amiens in 1588 by the League. He was a man of talent and spirit and showed great valor in opposing the entrance of the Spaniards into that city in 1597. Claude le Maistre, the emigrant, was undoubtedly of this family, members of whom had removed to Artois, settling in Richebourg, near Lille, in Flanders, where he was born in 1610, and where he married Jeanne de Lannoy.

The breaking out of the war between France and Spain in 1635, caused a considerable influx into England of emigrants from Picardy, Artois and Flanders. Among them was Claude le Maistre, who, after

a sojourn in Canterbury, at a later date crossed over to Holland with other Huguenot refugees, probably on account of the civil wars then raging, and we find him in 1652 an exile and widower, settled in Amsterdam, when, on April 24th of that year he married Hester, daughter of Pierre du Bois, with him a wanderer from Canterbury, where Hester was born. The du Bois family were Huguenot exiles who had found a refuge in England at an earlier date. He came with his wife to New York in 1652, and at first settled in Flatbush, where he remained ten years, and became the owner of a farm and two village lots. He sold these in 1662, buying two allotments of land in Harlem from Daniel Tourneur, to which he removed at that time and took out a patent for them in 1668. He served four terms as Magistrate between 1666 and 1673 and was chosen a Deacon in 1675. But his sympathies were with the French Protestant Church and service, and, consequently arose the controversy with the town regarding the parish clerk's services which so disturbed his later years. He died in 1683, leaving six children by his second wife. His sons were called Delamater.

William Leonard (1734-1805) was born in Germany, January 8, 1734. He came to America early in life and settled in New York. He held a commission as 2nd Lieutenant in Captain William Hecht's Company of German Independents in the New York Militia. This commission, still extant, is dated 1772 and signed "William Tryon." In the War of the Revolution he raised and equipped his own company, and maintained the same throughout the war at his own expense, thereby becoming greatly impoverished. The name under which he served is not certainly known, but it is believed to have been an assumed one, as, having held the King's commission, he was certain of execution if captured. He was a member of the German Society of New York, which is attested in a paper signed by Baron Von Steuben, President.

Antoine L'Espenard (1643-1696). Accompanied by Abeltie, his wife, he left Rochelle, France, in 1669, for America, and in 1670 his name was recorded as one of the settlers at Albany, N. Y. Governor Dongan on January 22, 1687, was ordered to maintain friendly relations with the Marquis de Denonville, Governor of Canada, and placed in the hands of L'Espenard documents to be carried to Canada. During the visit of L'Espenard he learned that French troops were preparing to make a winter expedition against Albany and to burn the city. He hastened to Albany and informed Colonel Peter Schuyler, who led an expedition against the French Settlements on Lake Champlain. L'Espenard removed to New Rochelle, N. Y., where he erected a grist-mill upon a grant of land on the east side of Davenport's Neck. The old family mansion stood at the easterly end of the mill pond. He died there in 1696. His sons wrote the name Lispenard.

Moses Levy (1665-1728) was born in Spain, went to London as a young man, and there engaged in business as a merchant, and was the owner of many vessels engaged in the carrying trade. After a successful business career he came to America, and landed in New York City in 1705.

Francis Lewis (1713-1803) was born in Landaff, Wales, where his father was a clergyman of the English Church. His parents died while he was a young child, and having come into possession of some money at the age of twenty-one, he invested it in merchandise and came to New York. His business took him to many foreign countries. In the "Old French War" he took an active part, and while in the fort at Oswego as a purchaser of supplies for the British troops, Montcalm reduced the fortress, imprisoned the garrison, and Lewis was sent a prisoner to Canada, whence he was sent to France and regularly exchanged. At the close of the war the British government gave him five thousand acres of land as compensation for his services. Mr. Lewis was a delegate to the Provincial Convention of 1775, and to the Provincial Congresses of 1776 and 1777. He was also a delegate to the Continental Congress, and was a Signer of the Declaration of Independence. He served on a number of important committees, in recognition of which, on his retirement from Congress, that board appointed him a Commissioner for the Board of Admiralty. The British wasted and plundered his property during the war, and took Mrs. Lewis prisoner, confining her in a close prison for many months with no bed and no change of raiment. After great suffering she was exchanged through the agency of General Washington, but her constitution was ruined and she died some two years later. Mr. Lewis survived his wife until December, 1802.

Stephen Lines (1735-1757), born at Bethpage, L. I., son of Stephen Lines and Penelope Cock, removed to West Somers, Westchester County, in 1786. He was a surveyor and miller, and active in the Society of Friends.

Robert Livingston (1654-1728), born at Ancram, Scotland, December 13, 1654, was the son of a Presbyterian clergyman who went to Holland about 1660 and became the pastor of a church at Rotterdam. In 1674, at the age of 20, he emigrated to America and settled at Albany, where he soon became prominent, holding numerous official positions. He gradually acquired the Indian title to large tracts of land on the east side of the Hudson River below Albany, for which, in 1686, he obtained a patent from Gov. Dongan, and which he had erected into a manor with advowson and other manorial rights. In 1683 he married Alida, daughter of Philip Pieterse Schuyler and widow of Rev. Nicholas Van Rensselaer.

Jacob Lockman (1771-1855) was born on Staten Island, July 21, 1771. He served as a private in the War of 1812, and afterward settled in New York City. He was a member of Trinity Church.

Pierre Lorillard (1746-1776) or l'oreillard, was a tobacconist in New York City, and founder of the Lorillard family in this country. He was murdered by "cowboys" at Haverstraw.

Peter Low (1724-1811) and his descendants lived in Poughkeepsie, Dutchess County, N. Y., on what is now the site of Vassar College. The Low burial ground was reserved with right of ingress and egress, but in 1887 the family removed the bodies of Peter, his son Aaron and grandson Jacob to the Poughkeepsie Rural Cemetery.

Richard Lownsbery, originally from Yorkshire, England, came to America from Leyden, Holland, in 1643, and settled at Esopus, Ulster County, going thence to Rye, N. Y.

William Ludlam (—1665) of Matlock, Derbyshire, England, came to America about 1640, landing probably at Boston. Later he settled in Southampton, L. I., where he was a farmer and miller. In 1652 he purchased the mill at Watermill, which remained in the family for several generations. He died at Southampton in 1665, and his will is the first one recorded in the Surrogate's Office of New York County.

Gabriel Ludlow (1663-1738), the son of Gabriel Ludlow (1634-1690) of Frome, Somerset, England, and Martha Cary, his wife, emigrated to this country in 1694 and settled in New York City, where, April 5, 1697, he married Sarah Hanmer, the daughter of a surgeon in the British Navy. In 1699 he was appointed Clerk of the House of Assembly, which office he held for many years. He was also a vestryman of Trinity Church.

John Macy (1748-1838) was born on the Island of Nantucket, March 28, 1748. He was a descendant of Thomas Macy, who emigrated from the parish of Chilmark, near Salisbury, England, about 1639, and settled at Salisbury, Mass. At an early age he removed from Nantucket to Ghent, N. Y., where he died November 23, 1838.

Cornelis Maessen (—1648) of Buren, in the Province of Guelderland, Holland, came to this country with his wife and eldest son in the ship *Rensselaerswyck* in 1631, and settled on a farm on the east side of the Hudson River, a few miles below Albany, which he had leased from Kilian Van Rensselaer, the Patroon. Both he and his wife died in 1648, leaving a considerable property and several minor children, for whom Teunis Dirckse Van Vechten and Cornelis Teunisse Bos were appointed guardians and trustees. One of his sons, Maas, is said to have adopted the name of Bloomingdael; the others became known as Van Buren. President Martin Van Buren was one of his descendants.

Jacques Magny was a Huguenot from Saintonge, France. He was a member of the Narragansett Colony in 1686 and subsequently came to New York City.

William Malcolm (1750-1792) was born at Aberdeen, Scotland, and at the outbreak of the Revolution was residing in New York City. Being an ardent partisan of his adopted country, he was a "Son of Liberty," and raised, at his own expense, the Second (Malcolm's) Regiment. He was Assistant Adjutant-General of the Northern Department under General Gates. At the close of the war he commanded the militia of New York and Richmond Counties, with the rank of Brigadier-General. He was alderman, 1785, member of the Legislature for several years, and one of the founders of the Chamber of Commerce.

John Mason (1734-1792), a Presbyterian clergyman and Doctor of Divinity, was born in Scotland and came to America in 1761. He settled in New York City, where he organized and was pastor of the Associate Reformed Church in Cedar Street, now the Scotch Presbyterian Church in 96th Street. During the Revolutionary War he was Chaplain to the posts of the American Army along the Hudson, and is said to have fought at the Battle of White Plains. After the war he returned to New York and resumed his pastorate.

General Alexander McDougall was born in the parish of Kildalton, Island of Islay, Hebrides, Scotland, 1732. He came with his father, Ronald, to the Colony of New York, 1738. In early life he

followed the seas. In the war of 1756 with the French, he commanded the vessels of war Tiger and Barrington, sailing under letters of margue out of New York. Subsequently a successful merchant in that city, he devoted himself ardently to the cause of the colonies. In 1770 one of the most active "Sons of Liberty" and a promoter of the nonimportation measures, in 1774 he presided at the great meeting in the fields and drafted its energetic resolutions. He was the first person arrested by the British authorities after the united action of the colonies, and was imprisoned twenty-three weeks. He was a member of the provincial Congress of New York; in 1775 1st Colonel of the first New York Regiment; in 1776 Brigadier-General. In October, 1776, he commanded the division of the army at Chatterton Hills, Westchester, where he twice repulsed the British and Hessians. In 1777 he was Major-General, and was in 1778 in command of all the posts in the Highlands and commanded at West Point from July 19th to December 6th, 1779; June 20th to July 4th, and September 20th to October 5th, 1780; from June 20th, 1881, to January 18th, 1782. In 1780 and 81 he was also a member of Congress, and in 1781 elected by that body Minister of Marine, but declined the position for renewed active service in the field. He was first president of the New York Society of the Cincinnati. After the Revolution a leading member of the State Senate and first president of the Bank of New York, he died in New York City, June 8th, 1786, and was described by Washington as "A brave soldier and a disinterested patriot." He is buried in the family vault of the McDougall, Lawrance and Hawkes families, in the 1st Presbyterian Church, 5th Avenue corner of 12th Street, N. Y. C. McDougall Street, in New York City, running from Washington Square to Spring Street, was named in his honor.

Alexander McDougall married in 1751, during a visit which he made to Islay, Ann Langville, daughter of Stephen McDougall, and returned with her in the same year to the Colony of New York. He had three children. His two sons died unmarried—John in the Canada expedition, 1775, and Ronald Stephen from the results of injuries received in the field, 1786. His only daughter, Elizabeth, married John Lawrance, the Judge Advocate-General of the Revolution who officiated at the trial of Major Andre, was U. S. Senator, and was subsequently appointed the first United States Judge for the District of New York. Tablets have been erected to General McDougall's memory in the Church above mentioned, and in the Chapel at the U. S. Military Academy at West Point.

Roger McGraw was born in Belfast, Ireland. He came to this country with his friend, Sir William Johnson, and was associated with him here. Mr. McGraw's wife, Jane Harding, came from Londonderry and was Scotch-Irish. Her grandfather Harding was one of the defenders of the city of Derry, and lived to a great age, receiving much honor from his countrymen.

Charles McKnight (1750-1791), born in Cranberry, N. J., October 10, 1750, was the son of a Scotch-Irish Presbyterian clergyman, his grandfather, also a clergyman, having emigrated to America in 1740. He studied medicine and surgery, and in 1777 was appointed Senior Surgeon of the Flying Hospital of the Middle Department of the Continental Army. At the close of the war he settled in New York City and became Professor of Surgery and Anatomy in Columbia College. He married Mary, daughter of Gen. John Morin Scott.

Peter Jansen Mesier, born about 1631 it is supposed, in Normandy, came to America, and in some early records is written Pieter Janszen ; in 1673 at New York the house, garden and orchard of Pieter Janse Mesier, near Fort Willem Hendrick, were ordered demolished by Governor Colve. Sometime between 1682 and 1686 he obtained a part of the Van Cortlandt lot and erected a windmill on the bluff toward the North River. The lane to the mill was forty feet wide, and from Broadway it passed nearly midway between Liberty and Cortlandt Streets to Greenwich Street, thence northward to the present line of Cortlandt Street, where the windmill stood according to Miller's Plan. The mill appears in views of New York as late as 1746. March 29, 1701, the Corporation granted to Mesier for f_{20} the land in front of his purchase from high to low water mark. In 1686 Mesier and his wife, Maritje Willems, were members of the First Reformed Dutch Church, and lived on the "Strand," as the west side of Whitehall Street was then called. He died in 1691, and in 1698 his sons Abraham and Peter were admitted freemen of the city.

Elijah Miller (1732-----) was commissioned Lieutenant by Governor William Tryon in 1772, and was made Adjutant by General Nathaniel Woodhull in 1775. Elijah Miller's house at White Plains, which is still standing, was used by Washington as his headquarters.

John Moore (1620?-1657), minister, was at Lynn, Mass., and Southampton, L. I., in 1641, finally settling in Newtown. He was an Independent, and the first minister of the town. In consequence of his interest in the purchase of Newtown from the Indians, the town awarded eighty acres of land to his children, thirty years after his decease. His widow married Francis, son of Rev. Francis Doughty.

Adam Mott (1620-1686) was a native of Essex, England. He came to New Amsterdam about 1640, and in 1643 married Jane Hulet. After her death he married Elizabeth Redman, step-daughter of John Richbell, the first patentee of Mamaroneck. In 1660 he bought a tract of land at Great Neck, L. I., some of which is still occupied by his descendants. He was a Lieutenant in the Provincial forces, and in 1666 was appointed Commissioner to settle the dispute between the Dutch and English residents of Long Island. He died at Great Neck in 1686.

Henry Melchior Muhlenberg (1711-1787), born at Eimbeck, Hanover, Germany, September 6, 1711, was a son of Nicholas Melchior Muhlenberg, a member of the Council of Eimbeck. He was educated at Gottingen and Halle, and became a Lutheran minister. In 1742 he settled in Philadelphia, Penn. His wife, whom he married April 23, 1745, was a daughter of J. Conrad Weiser. They resided in New York City in 1751-52 and in 1759-60. He died at Trappe, Montgomery County, Penn., October 7, 1787.

William Mulford (1620-1687) and his brother John went to Long Island from Salem, Mass., having come to this country from Devonshire, England. William Mulford's name appears on the Town Record of Southampton, L. I., in 1645, but he finally settled in East Hampton in 1649. He was a farmer.

Elihu Murray (1753-1835) was born at Hadley, Mass., October 12, 1753, and was a son of William Murray and Mercy Scott, his wife. Immediately after the fight at Lexington he volunteered under Captain Israel Chapin, marched to the siege of Boston, and was in the Battle of Bunker Hill. On the day of his discharge he volunteered again. He took part in the Battle of Long Island and the evacuation of New York, and was wounded at Throck's Neck. After the Battle of Saratoga, in which he took part, he was commissioned Captain and assigned to the Quartermaster-General's department. He removed to New York State about or before 1800.

Adolf Myer (1638-1711) emigrated from Ulsen, a parish of Bentheim, in the German province of Westphalia. He arrived at Harlem, N. Y., in 1661, where he gained good standing, and April 29, 1671, married Maria, daughter of Johannes Verveelen. He was Alderman in 1691-1693, representing that section of New York then called the Out-Ward, and also served as an Elder between 1691 and 1701. He had much to do with the early allotment of lands under the Dongan patent and signed the deeds.

Isaac Nichols (1748-1835) was a lieutenant in the Revolutionary War, and served in the Quebec and Saratoga campaigns. He was one of the first Justices of the Peace in the city of Brooklyn.

Andrew Norwood (----1684?) of Barbadoes, also of New York. was the son of Richard Norwood, a distinguished Englishman, who was one of the most eminent of the original settlers of the Bermudas or Somers Islands. Andrew Norwood was a resident of the West Indies, and communicated to the Royal Society, in 1668, "Observations in Jamaica." He seems to have immigrated to New York before the assumption of the government by Sir Edmund Andros, for in March. 1672, an order was issued to lay out two towns on Staten Island, and in September following he received a grant of 150 acres of land on the shore of Staten Island, near the present Quarantine Ground. In 1677 he was appointed Surveyor of Staten Island. Andrew Norwood is also mentioned in "A Two Years Journal in New York," by Rev. Charles Wooley, who was chaplain at the garrison of Fort James in New York City in 1679, as follows : "The Fort and Garrison of this place lieth in the degree of 40th and 20 minutes of northern Latitude, as was observed and taken by Mr. Andrew Norwood, son of the Famous Mathematician of that name, and by Mr. Phillip Wells and Van Cortlandt Junior, Robert Rider and Jacobus Stephens, the seventh of July, 1679, with whom I was well acquainted and at that time present with them."

Jan Ogden (1600-1681) emigrated from Northampton, England, about 1641, and settled in Stamford, Connecticut, where he was a magistrate. In May, 1642, he and his brother Richard entered into a contract with Governor William Kieft, Gisbert op Dyck and Thomas Willet, of New Amsterdam, Churchwardens, to build a stone church in the fort 72 by 50 feet, for the sum of 2,500 guilders (\$1,000), to be paid in beaver, cash or merchandise; one hundred guilders to be added if the work proved satisfactory; and the use of the company's boat to be given the builders, for carrying stone, a month or six weeks if necessary. The work was satisfactorily completed. Later John Ogden removed to Southampton, L. I., where he acquired what was known as the "Second" or "Quogue" purchase, which he sold a year or two later to Capt. John Scott and removed to New Jersey and began the settlement of Achter Kol (Newark Bay). He was among the first to settle Elizabeth, N. J.; was appointed October 26, 1665, a Justice of the Peace, and, November 1, 1665, one of Governor Carteret's Council. He became Schout of the six towns in 1673.

John Janse Oothout (-----1695) was a brewer whose name first appears in the Albany records about 1664. He settled in the "Grayneybos" (pine woods) opposite Albany. He married Hendrickje, daughter of Cornelis Van Nes. His will, recorded in Albany, is dated March 13 1688, and was probated January 3, 1696. In it he mentions the following children : Johannes, Hendrick, Mayekay, Antje, Jannetje and Arien (12 years old.)

Pieter Ostrander came to this country with his wife and three children in the ship *Spotted Cow* in 1659. He is said to have been a cadet in the Dutch Army. He settled at Kingston, Ulster County. About 1662 he assumed the name Ostrander or Van Ostrander, signifying the East Strand or sea-shore from which they had come.

Brinton Paine (1737-1820) was born in Amenia, Dutchess County, N. Y., and was great-grandson of Stephen Paine of Rehoboth, Mass., who came from England in 1729. He served throughout the French and Indian War, and when the Revolution broke out he was one of the first to enlist, holding at first the rank of captain. For two years he was confined on the prison ship in New York harbor, but through the friendship of De Witt Clinton he was finally exchanged, and served until the end of the war, attaining the rank of Colonel. He represented his district in the Assembly at Albany, 1779, 1780, 1784-5, 1786 and 1787, when a grant of land was given him at Newtown (New Elmira, which was named after his grand-daughter, Elmira Theall). He was the first judge of Tioga County, N. Y., and negotiated peace with the Indians.

Amos Partridge (1758-1844) served in the Revolutionary War, being among those who marched to the relief of Fort Ticonderoga in 1775. At the close of the war he settled in what was afterward known as Keene, Essex County, N. Y., where he resided until the spring of 1826, when he moved to St. Lawrence County. He died January 3, 1844, and is buried in the Purmont burying ground in De Peyster, N. Y.

Joost Paulding emigrated from Cassant, Holland, about 1688, on April 1 of which year, in New York City, he married Catharine Duyts. He resided for a time in Eastchester and Phillipse Manor, where he was Treasurer of the old Dutch Church. In 1709 he married, for his second wife, Sophie, widow of Theunis Krankheit, and in the following year removed to New York City, where he resided until his death.

John Pell (1643-1702), styled "Sir John Pell" in the early Westchester County records, came to America in 1670 to take possession of "Pelham Manor," which had been devised to him by his uncle Thomas Pell. He was First Judge of the Court of Common Pleas (1688), and first member of the Provincial Assembly (1691) for Westchester County; Major of Horse (1692); one of the first Vestrymen of the Westchester Parish Church and Chairman of the "Grand Committee," and the Committee for the defense of the Frontier during the French and Indian War.

Samuel Pell was of Harlem, N. Y., in 1673, and afterward of Oyster Bay, L. I. His son William removed to New York and established a ship-yard at "Golden Hill," on the East River.

William Penfold was an English sea-captain who settled in New York City, where, on the 18th of June, 1713, he married Elizabeth, daughter of John Lawrence. While on one of his voyages he was lost, with his vessel, at sea. His widow survived until 1751.

Frederick Philipse, born in Holland, emigrated to New Netherlands while a young man. In 1662 he married Margaretta Hardenbrook, widow of Pieter Rudolphus De Vries. In 1692 he married Catharina Van Cortlandt, daughter of Oloff Stevense Van Cortlandt, and widow of John Dervall. He acquired the largest fortune in the colony. His residence and mercantile establishment were in the Brower Street, although towards the close of his life he lived much of the time at his manor house, near Tarrytown. Mr. Philipse filled various public offices, under the English as well as the Dutch Administrations. He died in 1702; his widow survived him several years. Of his children, Philip, born in 1663, died in the West Indies; Adolphus, born in 1665; Annetje, born in 1667, married Philip French in 1694; Rombout, born in 1670, died before attaining mature years. Eva married Jacobus Van Cortlandt in 1691. She was the daughter of Pieter Rudolphus De Vries and Margaretta Hardenbrook, and was legally adopted by Mr. Philipse.

Alexander Phoenix settled in New Amsterdam in 1643, having probably emigrated from Scotland. In 1652 he removed to Rhode Island, having purchased a tract of land in Narragansett. As late as July 29, 1679, he was living near Wickford, R. I. His son, Jacob, who was born in New Amsterdam in 1651, returned there about 1686, being married there June 4th of that year to Anna Van Vleck, widow of Willem Pieterszen Beeck. Daniel Phoenix (1737-1812), their descendant, was a prominent New York merchant, a member of the Committee of Loyal Refugees who received General Washington in New York at the close of the War of the Revolution, and was Treasurer and Comptroller of the City of New York for many years.

Paulus Pieterse, whose descendants took the surname Paulison, was born in Merwen, Holland, and at first settled in New Amsterdam, but removed from thence to Bergen in 1660, where he was appointed Commissioner to fortify Bergen against the Indians in 1663. He also served as Commissioner to erect block houses to protect the town against the Duke of York's government. On November 20, 1665, he took the oath of allegiance to the Duke's government. His wife, whom he married at New Amsterdam, September 1, 1658, was born at Aken, Prussian Saxony, and died at Bergen, N. J., May 19, 1702.

Philip Pinkney came from Norfolk, England, and was found in Fairfield, Conn., in 1649, and in East Chester, N. Y., in 1664.

Aaron Place (1682-1770), born in Bristol, England, came over during the reign of George II. Not being allowed to take currency out of the country, he brought his fortune in the shape of silver tankards. He settled in Hempstead, L. I.

Johannes Theodorus Polhemus (1598-1676) was born probably in Switzerland, and came to New Amsterdam in 1654 from Itamaria, Brazil, where he had been settled as pastor of one of the churches established by the Dutch West India Company. On his arrival he was appointed the first minister of the Dutch Reformed Church in Midwout (Flatbush), L. I. Up to 1654 the Dutch on Long Island had had no minister nor church, and were obliged to cross the East River to attend service. In 1662 he received a patent embracing lands in Flatbush and in the Gowanus district, Brooklyn. In 1665 he terminated his connection with the Flatbush Church, and from that time until his death was the minister of what is now the First Reformed Church in the City of Brooklyn. He was the first minister of the Reformed Church in the New Netherlands to advocate ecclesiastical independence of the parent church in Amsterdam and the federation of r ganizations of the Reformed Church in the colonies.

Robert Potter, of Coventry, England, came to Massachusetts in 1634, was made a freeman, and settled first at Lynn, and afterwards at Roxbury, Massachusetts. Owing to a difference with the Church authorities, however, it was ordered that "hee bee with his family removed out of the plantation," and in consequence of this mandate he removed to Rhode Island, and bought a tract known as the Shawomet purchase, which was afterwards named Warwick. He and his family were prominent in colonial life. His great-great-great grandson, Joseph (1757), removed to New York and settled in Beekman, Dutchess County.

Peter Prall (1655-1748), or Praal, was born in Holland, and came with his father Peter in 1663. He was a captain of militia and was stationed at Blazing Star, Staten Island. His name appears amongst the signers of the Petition of Grievances of the Protestants of New York, addressed to William III, December 30, 1701.

Kimball Prince (1753-1824), son of Kimball and Deborah (Fuller) Prince, was born at Kingston, Mass., July 20, 1753. He resided at New Bedford, Mass., in 1767, and in 1777 at Peekskill, N. Y., enlisting there in the 2nd New York Regiment, Colonel Philip Van Cortlandt, serving as Sergeant and Sergeant-Major. He was at Stillwater, Valley Forge, Monmouth, in Sullivan's campaign, and the Morristown encampment. He afterwards served in Colonel William Malcolm's Regiment of New York Levies and in Colonel Morris Graham's regiment. On February 19, 1784, he married Lucretia Hempstead in New London, Conn. He thereafter resided in New London until his death, June 6, 1824.

Joris Jansen Rapelje (1600?-1663?), also called Joris Jans De Rapalie, was a Huguenot of La Rochelle, France, and a descendant of a noble family of Brittany. He took refuge in Holland, and from there sailed in the *Unity* for New Amsterdam, where he arrived in 1623. Here he remained a short time, and then went to Fort Orange, but returning in 1637 he purchased a tract of 335 acres on the Long Island side of the East River, including a large part of what was called the Wallabout, and made it his permanent home. He was a magistrate of Brooklyn in 1655, 1656 and 1660, and was one of the Twelve Men in 1641. His land is now covered by the Brooklyn Navy Yard. He married Catalina Trico, daughter of Joris Trico of Paris, by whom he had eleven children, of whom the eldest, Sarah (1625), was the first female white child born in the New Netherlands.

James Renwick (1744-1803) came to New York from Liverpool, England, in 1783, with his wife, Catharine Mee, whom he married in 1768. He was an enterprising, shrewd merchant, and a public-spirited citizen. His name appears in the first New York Directory as a member of the Saint Andrew's Society. He was one of the organizers in 1789 of "The Mercantile Society for Employing the Industrious Poor and Promoting Manufacturing," and was especially generous to Church and charitable work. His son, William (1769-1808), was also a merchant, and was the first to establish direct traffic between Liverpool and New York. William Renwick's wife, whom he married August 15, 1791, was Jean Jeffrey, daughter of the Rev. Andrew Jeffrey, of the Manse, Lochmaben. She was a great beauty, and Robert Burns addressed three of his poems to her.

Philip Jacob Rhinelander was born about the middle of the 17th century, four miles from the town of Oberwesel, on that part of the Rhine then subject to France. Being a Huguenot he was forced to flee from his home by the revocation of the Edict of Nantes, and coming to America settled at New Rochelle, Westchester County, N.Y., where he purchased land, and where he was still living in 1737.

Abraham Riker (1615?-1689), early known as Abraham Rycken, or de Rycke, is presumed to have emigrated in 1638, as he received in that year an allotment of land from Governor Kieft, for which he afterwards took out a patent, dated August 8, 1640. In 1642 Riker is found in New Amsterdam, where he continued to live many years on the Heeren Gracht, now Broad Street. He went on a trading voyage to the Delaware River in 1656, in order to purchase beaver skins. The vessel was stranded, and until she was floated the passengers lived in tents on the shore. Riker visited Fort Casimir, near the present New Castle, but returned without any peltry. In 1654 he obtained a grant of land at the Poor Bowery, and afterwards added Riker's Island to his possessions. His eldest son Ryck assumed the surname Lent, but the other sons took the name of Riker.

John Roberts (1727-1796) was born at Providence, R. I., April 21, 1727. About 1750 he sold his property there and removed to New York State, settling in Amenia, Dutchess County. He took part in the French and Indian War, and about 1763 removed to Manchester, Bennington County, Vt. He served in the Revolutionary War, being a private in Col. Seth Warner's regiment, Continental Army, from February 17, 1777, to June 1, 1780. With his four sons, he was in the battle at Bennington, in August, 1777.

Beverly Robinson (1723-1792) was the son of the Hon. John Robinson of Virginia, who was President of that colony in 1734. He emigrated to New York and married Susannah, the daughter of Frederik Philips. During the Revolution he was instrumental in raising a Loyalist regiment, of which he was made Colonel, and he also commanded the corps known as the "Guides" and "Pioneers." At the peace he went to England with a part of his family, and his extensive landed estates and those of his wife were confiscated. He died at Bath, England, in 1792, leaving three sons, Colonel Beverly and Colonel Morris Robinson, both of the British Army, and Colonel John Robinson, Speaker of the Assembly in New Brunswick. Aldert Hymanse Roosa (1621-1679), with his wife and eight children, came from Herwynen, Gelderland, Holland, in the *Spotted Cow* in 1660. He was an early settler of Wiltwyck, now Kingston, N.Y., and was made a Schepen by Governor Stuyvesant.

Claas Martense Roosevelt came from Holland in 1649. His wife is variously recorded as Hamel, Samuels, and as Thomas. His son Nicholas, of Esopus, married Heyltje Jans Kunst, and was a man of much social influence as well as business shrewdness, and was particularly successful in his dealings with the Indians.

Harman Rutgers (----1711) was probably the son of Rutger Jacobse, of Schoenderwoert, Holland, who emigrated to Fort Orange in 1636. The first mention of Harman's name in the records is as a private in the Burgher Corps of New Amsterdam in 1653. Later he appeared at Fort Orange, where he established himself as a brewer. About 1693, owing to losses from Indian depredations, he returned to New Amsterdam (then New York), where he purchased the dwelling house and brewery of Isaac De Forest, on the north side of Stone Street, near Whitehall Street. He married Catharine De Hooges, daughter of Anthony De Hooges, Secretary of the "Colonie" of Rensselaerwyck.

Hendrick Rycken (Suydam) died 1701. He came to America in 1663, as shown by the list of residents of Flatbush who took the oath of allegiance, September, 1687, where he states that he has been twentyfour years in this country. Rycken bought a house and lands in New York City in the "Smit's Vlie" on February 18, 1677, near Maiden Lane. This land he sold in 1681, having moved to Flatbush, L. I., about 1679, where he bought on February 5, 1677-8, the bouwery of Symon Hansen (Noortstrant) for 3,300 guilders (\$1,373,62), Rycken was one of the patentees of Flatbush, and is mentioned in the Dongan Charter of November 12, 1685. He died in 1701, and it is supposed lies buried under the tower of the present church. July 22, 1695, Jacob, son of Hendrick Rycken, signed his name to an indenture Jacob Hendreckse van Zuyt dam. The change in the name to Suydam by the sons was gradual, and is shown by the following deeds recorded in Brooklyn: 2 Feb., 1697-8, Hendrick Rycken and Itye Jacobs his wife convey to Rycke Hendrickse, their son, and 23 April, 1698, to "Hendrick Hendrickse, son of said Hendrick." 10 Dec., 1717, we have Ryck Hendrickse Suydam and the same man as Lieutenant Rick Van Suydam in 1715; and as Ryck Suydam, of Flatbush, Supervisor, 1728, and County Judge in 1734.

Buell Sackett (1763-1840) was born in Litchfield, Conn., the home of his maternal grandfather, Capt. John Buell, one of the first settlers of that place. On his father's side he was descended from John Sacket, who came from England to Masachusett's Bay with Roger Williams in 1630. He served in the Revolution, attaining the rank of captain and major by brevet. At the close of the war he removed to New Lebanon, Columbia County, N. Y., where he had purchased land, and where he died.

James Saidler (1751-1803) was a merchant at 136 Water Street, New York. In 1786 he was a member of the Saint Andrew's Society, and one of its officers. At the same period he was Junior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons. He died in July, 1803, and his grave is at Trinity Church, on the south side. Jane Graham was his second wife (his first spouse being a Miss Dallas), and was born in Scotland, February 3, 1771. She came to New York City in 1773 and married James Saidler in 1789.

John Sands (1649-1712) was born in Portsmouth, R. I. His father, Captain James Sands, who was born, 1622, in Reading, Berkshire, England, came to this country in 1661, and, with others, purchased Block Island from the Indians. His mother was Sarah Walker, a grand-niece of the celebrated Ann Hutchinson. John Sands is described by Niles as "a gentleman of great port and superior powers." He represented Block Island in the Rhode Island Assembly and commanded a company of militia. In 1691, he, with his brothers Samuel and James, removed to "Cow Neck," or, as it is now known, "Sands Point," on the north shore of Long Island, where he purchased land. The locust trees with which Long Island abounds are said to have been introduced there from Virginia by James Sands.

Gideon Schaets (1607-1694) was born at Leerdam, Holland. He became schoolmaster at Beest and a candidate in theology. In 1652, having been ordained by the Classis of Amsterdam, he came to the New Netherlands in the ship *Flower of Guelder*. By contract with the Patroon, Johannes Van Rensselaer, and the co-directors of the Colony of Rensselaerwyck, he was not only to be minister there, but also missionary to the Indians, teacher of the catechism, and "schoolmaster for old and young." In 1657, at the request of the inhabitants of Fort Orange and Beverwyck, he was also appointed minister of the latter place. There he lived and worked until his death in 1694. His eldest son, Reynier, was killed in the massacre at Schenectady in 1690. From his second son, Bartholomeus, and the latter's son, Reynier, are believed to be descended all of the name of Schaets or Skaats in the United States.

Richard Schell came from the Palatinate of the Rhine about one hundred and fifty years ago, and settled in Rhinebeck, N. Y.

Martin Schenck was born at Doesburg, Holland, August 7, 1584, and is said to have emigrated to New Amsterdam, June 28, 1650, in the ship *de Valckener*, bringing with him his children Roelof, or Ralph, Jan and Anetje.

Jacob Jansen Schermerhorn (1622-1688), said to have been born in Waterland, Holland, where is situated the village of Schermerhorn, His father was living in 1654 at Amsterdam, and Schermerhorn himself is more than once referred to as Van Amsterdam. It has been stated that he came to America in 1636, but it seems more probable that he arrived in 1643 under the auspices of Kiliaen Van Rensselaer. He was the twelfth male member of the Reformed Dutch Church in Beverwyck, and prospered as a brewer and Indian trader. In 1648 he was arrested at Fort Orange upon the charge of selling arms to the Indians, was taken to Fort Amsterdam and condemned to death. This was commuted to banishment for five years, and this last finally revoked at the instance of the Nine Men. These proceedings against Schermerhorn formed subsequently one of the grounds of complaint against Governor Stuyvesant to the States General. Schermerhorn suffered no loss of reputation and rapidly reconstructed his fortune. He married about 1650, Jannetje Segers, daughter of Cornelis Segerse Van Voorhoudt. In 1652 and 1653 he received patents for lands in Beverwyck and became a magistrate there. He owned a farm at Schodack and lived also at Schenectady, and died there, leaving a will dated May 20, 1688, which is recorded at Albany.

Jacob Schieffelin (1757-1835) was third of that name in America. He was born in Philadelphia, but removed to New York, and was married in Trinity Church to Hannah Lawrence, August 16, 1780. He was a Lieutenant in the British Army under General Henry Hamilton during the Revolutionary War. He left New York in 1783, but returned in 1794, and founded the drug house of Schieffelin & Co.

Johan Schrade came to this country from the Grand Duchy of Wurtemburg about 1715, with his wife, Anna Maria Schaeffer, the daughter of a Lutheran clergyman. They lived for a time in Boston, Mass., and then settled in New York City. Philip Pieterse Schuyler (1628-1683) came to this country from Amsterdam, Holland, and settled at Beverwyck (Albany), where, December 12, 1650, he married Margaret Van Slichtenhorst, daughter of Brandt Arentse Van Slichtenhorst, resident director of the colony and agent of Kiliaen Van Rensselaer, the first Patroon. He became prominent in business, political and military affairs, was vice-director of the colony (1656-1663), and Captain of the Provincial Forces (1667.)

John Scott was married in Trinity Church, New York, October 1, 1750, to Sarah Budd. Their son, John Budd Scott, married Miss Elizabeth Betts in the same church, May 26, 1779. John Budd Scott was appointed by Royal Charter one of the Governors of King's College in the City of New York, and he was appointed by the Commander-in-Chief Translator of Languages to His Majesty's British Troops.

Thomas Scudder (——1690) was the son of Thomas Scudder, who emigrated from England, 1636, and settled at Salem, Mass., where he died in 1657. About 1653, Thomas (Jr.) removed to Southold and then to Huntington, L. I., where he engaged in farming and tanning. He was one of the patentees of the town, a large land-owner, and held a number of important civic offices.

Isaac Mendez Seixas (1708-1780) was a native of Lisbon, Portugal, and came to New York in 1730. His son Benjamin (1747-1817) was a member of the New York Stock Exchange.

Richard Seymour came from Berry Pomeroy, Devonshire, England, and was an early and important settler of Hartford, Conn. His descendant, Horace Seymour, after serving as Lieutenant in Sheldon's Light Dragoons, Connecticut troops, in the Revolutionary War, came to New York State and settled in Lansingburgh, N. Y., as a merchant. He afterwards removed to New York City, where he died.

Lambert Arianse Smidt, "van Thuyl in Gelderl^t," as his marriage record (Collegiate Dutch Church, N. Y., April 9, 1682) calls him, was one of the original proprietors of the Orangetown Grant or Patent in Rockland (formerly Orange) County, N. Y., in 1686.

Nathan Smith (1728-1792) was born in Ridgefield, Conn. About 1757 he removed to North Salem, Westchester County, N. Y., where he purchased a farm, and where he resided until his death.

Samuel Smith (1700-1769) was a large land-owner and a resident of Jamaica, L. I.

Peter Spies (1690-1734) was a Palatine volunteer for the Expedition against Canada, in 1711, from Annsberg, N. Y.

Poncet Stelle, born in 1645, came to America from the town of Larieres, France. Banished from that country as a Huguenot, he came by way of Holland and the Island of St. Christopher to Staten Island in 1665, and removed to New York in 1678. Here he was married, and here several of his children were born.

Johannes Ster came from Holland in one of the Dutch West India Company's vessels as a sailor, and landed at New Amsterdam about 1648. Soon after his landing he gave up a sea-faring life and engaged in trade with the Indians. About 1670 he removed with his family to Fort Orange (Albany), continuing his Indian trade on a more extended scale. He died at Fort Orange, 1699.

John Stevens (——1737) emigrated from Middlesex County, England, to New York in 1699. After studying law and practicing for a time he entered business. In 1714 he removed to Perth Amboy, New Jersey.

Alexander Stewart is mentioned in old deeds as having been a resident of New York City in 1753, where his occupation is described as "wine-cooper." He was made freeman of New York City, September 21, 1742.

Dirck Storm, "from the Maiery of Bosh," Groningen, Holland, came to New Amsterdam in the ship *Fox*, September 2, 1662, with his wife and three sons, Gregoris, Peter and David, aged respectively 6, 2 and 1¼ years. He settled at Haerlem, but later removed to Bedford, Brooklyn, where he had purchased property "consisting of houses, uplands and meadows," from Maynard Journee, for fourteen hundred guilders. In 1670 he succeeded Carel de Beauvois as Secretary of Brooklyn; afterwards he served for some years as Town Clerk of Flatbush and as Town Officer and Collector of Brooklyn. From 1691 to 1703 he was Clerk of Sessions. Subsequently he purchased land in Orange County.

Isaac Stoutenburgh (1668-1711), son of Pieter van Stouten-Burgh and Aefje van Trinhoven, fled from Holland for political reasons and settled in New York. His grandson Isaac held various military positions in the State, was a member of the Provincial Congresses of 1775, 1776 and 1777, and a State Senator 1778-1780, 1785-1787.

Selah Strong (1680-1732) was the son of Thomas Strong (1635-1689) and Rachel Holton of Northampton, Mass., and grandson of John Strong (1605-1699), who, with Abigail Ford, his wife, arrived at Nantasket, Mass., May 30, 1630, on the ship *Mary and John*. At the time of his marriage in 1702 he removed to Setauket, L. I., where he purchased land. He was Justice of the Peace and Trustee of the town of Brookhaven.

Peter Stuyvesant (1591-1671), the son of Rev. Balthazar Stuyvesant and Margaretta Hardenstein, was born at Friesland. Entering, at an early age, the military service of Holland, he fought in the West Indies, became Governor of the Island of Curaçoa and lost a leg in battle during the expedition against the Island of St. Martin. In 1646 he was appointed by the West India Company Director-General of the New Netherlands. Reaching New Amsterdam in May, 1647, he at once set about reorganizing the government of the colony, pacifying the Indians and bringing order out of chaos. A man of strong individuality, great firmness and remarkable foresight, he so impressed himself upon affairs that the story of his life from 1647 to 1664 is practically a history of the colony during that period. When New Amsterdam passed into the hands of the English in 1664 he retired to his bouwery or farm, just beyond the city limits, where he died in 1682. His wife was Judith, daughter of Samuel Bayard, who survived him with two sons, Balthasar (1647----), who removed to the West Indies, and Nicholas William (1648-1698), who married (1st) Maria, daughter of William Beekman,-she died childless,-and (2nd) Elizabeth, daughter of Gerrit Van Slichtenhorst.

Tomys Swartwout was born in Groningen, Holland, in 1607, and was son of Rolef and Catryna Swartwout. He arrived in New Amsterdam in April, 1652, and settled in Midwout, L. I., representing the latter place in the Convention called by Governor Stuyvesant in 1653. He subsequently returned to Holland and died in Groningen.

Thomas Swords (1738-1780), the first of the family in this country, was born at Maryborough, near Dublin, Ireland, June 19, 1738. He came to America in 1756 as Ensign in the 55th Regiment of Foot, British Army. He was made Lieutenant at Ticonderoga for gallantry. In 1766 he resigned and resided on the upper Hudson in Saratoga County, N. Y. He is buried in St. Paul's Churchyard, New York City.

Silas Talbot (1751-1813) was a Captain in the Continental Navy, Captain and Commodore in the United States Navy. He was born at Dighton, R. I., and married Anna, daughter of Colonel Barzillai Richmond. After the death of his wife in 1781 he made New York his home, and purchased the forfeited estate of Sir John Johnson, Johnson Hall included, June 1, 1780. We have no exact date of his making his residence in New York; but it was no doubt previous to 1786. He commanded the fleet sent against the French in the West Indies in 1798 and 1799, the *Constitution* being his Flag Ship. He died at his town house in Chambers Street, New York City, June 30, 1813, and was interred in the Bancker Family Vault in Trinity Churchyard.

William Tapp (1750-1796) was born in England, December 22, 1750, and came to America at the age of sixteen. At the outbreak of the Revolutionary War he enlisted as Ensign in the 1st Regiment, Continental Line,—Colonel McDougall,—and served until 1780, when he resigned, being then First Lieutenant in the 3d Regiment,—Colonel Gansevoort. He settled in New York City, and in 1784, upon the organization of the Bank of New York, entered its employ as bookkeeper. In 1777 he married Mary Smith, of Jamaica, L. I. He was a member of the Society of the Cincinnati.

Jurian Teunisse Tappen (-----1677) came to New Amsterdam about 1630 and settled in Fort Orange, where his descendants remained for two generations. He was a man of means, and gained the friendship of people of all classes, including the Indians, who called him "The Good Chief." He married a daughter of Wybrecht Jacobse. His son Tunis carried on trade with New Amsterdam, and afterwards New York, and seems to have done business directly with Holland, indicating unusual resources and influence, as this trade was at the time in the hands of the Dutch West India Company. In middle age he removed to Kingston. Benjamin Taylor (1742-1832?) served in the French and Indian War, was taken prisoner and sent to France, and on his return settled in or near Fishkill, N. Y., where he is buried.

Conraedt Ten Eyck (-----1687) came from Amsterdam, Holland, and settled in New Amsterdam about 1650. In 1660 he owned Lot Number Ten on the west side of what is now Broad Street, New York City. He was Lance-Corporal, 3rd Company, Burgher Corps of New Amsterdam, and in 1674 possessed a fortune of \$5,000. His son Jacob was born in Holland, and moved to Albany, N. Y., where he died.

John Thompson (1618?-1688), son of William, went to Long Island in 1656, and settled at Setauket, being one of the fifty-five original proprietors of the town of Brookhaven, L. I. He frequently held responsible town offices. He died October 14, 1688.

Henry Townsend (-----1695) emigrated from England to Boston, Mass., in 1636. Later he removed to Flushing, L. I., and from thence to Oyster Bay, L. I., of which he was one of the founders.

John Townsend (——1668) was born in England, and came to this country with his brothers, Henry and Richard, about 1635. He settled on Manhattan Island, obtaining a grant of land near the "Collect" or Freshwater pond, but later removed to Jamaica, L. I., where he purchased land. In 1656 he was one of the settlers of Flushing, L. I., where he lived for some years, but during the persecution of the Quakers there, removed to Rhode Island. Later he returned to Long Island and settled at Oyster Bay, where he died.

Benjamin Tryon (1745-1830) was a farmer in that part of Tryon County, N. Y., now called Greene, in 1777. His son, grandson and great grandson were all born in the same county.

Captain John Underhill (1597-1672). Captain John, commonly called Lord Underhill, of an ancient family in Warwickshire, England, came to America with Governor Winthrop, May 18, 1630, as Captain of Militia, and was one of the first deputies from Boston to the General Court. In 1643 he was representative from Stamford to the General Court of New Haven. He was with Captain Mason in the attack upon the Indian fort at Mystic, and in 1641 he was Governor of Exeter and Dover, N. H., in place of Burdett. He left New England, and October 5, 1643, the army at Fort Amsterdam was under the command of Captain Underhill. In February, 1644, he led 130 Dutch troops

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against the Sinaroy Indians, and 700 of the latter were killed at Nanichiestawock, Bedford, N. Y. He was in many fights, yet had the confidence and goodwill of the Indians. About 1655 he settled at Oyster Bay, L. I., and was made by Governor Nicolls, some years later, High Sheriff of the North Riding of Yorkshire upon Long Island. Captain John wrote a book on the Pequot War, and in it states : "Let no man despise advice and counsel of his wife though she be a woman." He was twice married, and died July 21, 1672.

Jacob Van Alstyne (1749-1844), of Greenbush, N. Y., was Quartermaster of the 6th Regiment, Albany County Militia, Stephen J. Schuyler, Colonel, when the regiment was organized in 1775. He is reported as Adjutant under date of May 28, 1775. The regiment was also known as the 4th Rensselaerwyck Battalion.

Willem Jacobse van Boerum (1617-1698) emigrated from Amsterdam in 1649, and settled in Flatbush, L. I. On February 7, 1670, he was allotted, in pursuance of the patent of Flatbush, 25 morghens in said town, between the lands of Jan Hansen (Van Noorstrand) and those of Adrian Hegeman, with plain land and salt meadows in addition. He was a magistrate of Flatbush in 1657-62-63, on assessment roll of 1675, and took the oath of allegiance in 1687. He represented Flatbush in the Dutch Convention of 1664.

Johannes Van Brugh (1624-1697) was in the service of the Dutch West India Company in New Amsterdam, of which city he was a Burgomaster in 1656. After leaving the service of the Company he engaged in trading between New Amsterdam and Fort Orange. He married Tryntje, daughter of Anneke Jans and widow of Lucas Rodenburgh.

John Van Buskirk (1736-1814) was of New York City, and was buried in St. Paul's Churchyard, December 16, 1814. His son Cornelius was born in New York City August 22, 1776, and went to Louisville, Ky., when he was quite a young man. There he married Sarah Nelson, a daughter of Captain John Nelson, of Louisville. Mr. Van Buskirk died there, February 20, 1863.

Oloff Stevense Van Cortlandt (1600-1684) came to New Amsterdam in 1637, in the military service of the West India Company. Shortly after his arrival he was taken into the civil service of the Company as a book-keeper of stores. In 1642 he married Anneke Loockermans, a sister of Govert Loockermans, and was promoted to the office of public storekeeper. Later he established himself in business as a trader and brewer, and became successful and prominent. He was one of the "Nine Men" (an advisory council to the Director-General), and Captain of the train band. In 1655 he was appointed Burgomaster. He was a delegate to Hartford in 1663 to settle the boundary question, and in 1664 was one of the commissioners to regulate the terms of surrender to the English. He was one of the "Eight Men," and held other important offices. He died April 4, 1684.

Wolfert Gerretse Van Couwenhoven emigrated from Holland in 1630 in the ship Union as "Overseer of Farms" for Kiliaen Van Rensselaer. After leaving Van Rensselaer's service, he removed to Manhattan Island, and in 1637, with Andries Hudder, he purchased from the Indians the westernmost of the three "flats" in Flatbush, L. I., adjoining the property of Jacob Van Curlaer. Later he returned to New Amsterdam. Wolfert was one of the "Eight Men," and his son Jacob Van Couwenhoven was one of the "Nine Men." Jacob married, first, Hester Jans, a sister of Ariaentie Jans, who was the wife of Govert Loockermans, Govert having married her while on a visit to Amsterdam, Holland, February 26, 1641. Jacob mentioned above married, second, on September 26, 1655, Magdaleentje Jacobse Bysen, who survived him.

Rem Janse Van Der Beeck, the founder of the Remsen family, was descended from German and Dutch ancestors. He came to the New Netherlands in 1642, and soon after his arrival married a daughter of Joris Jansen Rapelje, and settled in Fort Orange. When his fatherin-law purchased Wallabout, he brought his family down the river and made his home in Brooklyn. He held various offices and became a magistrate during the second Dutch administration. He died in 1681, and at his funeral, fifteen of his children, with their wives, husbands and children, were present. His descendants adopted the name Remsen as their family name.

Dirck Van Der Bergh is first heard of in New York in 1689, when he appears on record as a prosperous mason until his death. In many of the land patents of Dutchess and Ulster Counties, N. Y., he is named, his purchases being extensive and valuable. One of them consisted of half of the Schuyler Patent, which included the present city of Poughkeepsie. In 1705, in a deed on record in New York City, he is described as Alderman. Jan Aertsen Vanderbilt (-----1705) emigrated from the village of Bilt or der Bylt (the hill), a few miles from Zeyst in Friesland, about 1650, and settled at Flatbush, Long Island, where he died February 2, 1705. His grandson, Jacob (1692-1760), removed to Staten Island about 1718, and settled near New Dorp, where he had purchased a large tract of land.

Adriaen Van der Donck (—1655) emigrated from Breda, Holland, previous to 1641, in which year he was sheriff of Rensselaerwyck. Later he removed to New Amsterdam, where he took a prominent part in civic affairs, being one of the leading opponents of Governor Stuyvesant, and visiting Holland for the purpose of urging the West India Company to give larger liberties to the people of the colony. He wrote a description of New Netherland as it was in 1650 which shows him to have been a man of considerable literary ability. His wife, whom he married in 1645, was a daughter of Rev. Francis Doughty. His descendants are known by the name of Onderdonk.

Abraham Pieterse Van Deusen (1605?-----) emigrated from Haarlem, Holland, to New Amsterdam, where, in 1638, he is spoken of in the records as the first miller of the city. He became prominent in public affairs, being chosen one of the "Twelve Men" in 1641, and one of the "Eight Men" in 1643. April 14, 1657, he was made a burgher of New Amsterdam, and was also Lance-Corporal of the second company of the Burgher Corps.

Jacobus Van De Water (1626-1712) emigrated from the Netherlands in 1658. In 1674 he was appointed Town Major of New Amsterdam. After 1677 he left New Amsterdam and settled in Bedford, Kings County, L. I., and in 1689 he was appointed Clerk of the County. He died intestate in 1712.

Isaac Van Duzer (1705-1792) was born in Amsterdam, Holland, and was married there, but his wife died there before he came to this country in 1730, bringing one daughter, who married a Mr. Rose. He married again and had fourteen children. He died at Cornwall, Orange County, N. Y.

Jan Thomasse Van Dyke emigrated from Amsterdam, Holland, to New Netherlands in 1652. He settled at New Utrecht, L. I., of which place he was the first magistrate. His grandson, Jan Van Dyke (1682-1764), removed to New Brunswick, N. J., in 1720, and was a member of the first council of that town. Johannes Martinus Van Harlingen (1684-1768) came from Holland to this country about 1703, and settled in Harlem, N. Y., where he married Maria Bussing in 1722. They moved to Lawrence's Brook, near New Brunswick, N. J., where he spent the rest of his life.

Peter Pieterse Van Nest came from Holland in 1647 and settled on Long Island. He was a member of the Convention "holden at New Amsterdam to engage the several Dutch Towns to keep up an armed force for public protection," 1663. In 1683 the family removed to New Jersey, and were the first Europeans to settle in Somerset County. The family Bible was printed in Leyden in 1645.

Jeremias Van Rensselaer (1630-1674), son of Kilaen Van Rensselaer, was the first of the family to take up his residence permanently in America. He married, April 27, 1662, Maria Van Cortlandt, daughter of Oloff Stevense Van Cortlandt, and from this pair all the Van Rensselaers now living under the name are descended. He succeeded his brother Jan Baptiste as Director of the Colony of Rensselaerwyck, and it was during his Directorate that the Province was surrendered to the English in 1664. After the surrender he took the oath of allegiance and was left undisturbed in the government of the "Colonie," but an English officer was put in command of Fort Albany, as Orange was now called. "Sieur Jeremias Van Rensselaer," as he was styled by Governor Colve, died the same year as the final transfer to the English.

Cornelius Van Santvoord (1686-1752) was born in Leyden, Holland. He matriculated at Leyden University, February 25, 1707, where he studied under the famous John Marck. He came to America in 1718 and settled on Staten Island, where he preached from 1718 to 1742 in both the Dutch and French languages. He preached in Schenectady from 1742 to 1752.

Claus Ram Van Schal-Kuyck (1755-1834), on arriving in this country, a fugitive from the horrors of the French Revolution, assumed the name of Boisaubin, after that of one of his plantations in Guadeloupe Island, French W. I. His ancestors were lords of the town of the same name, possessing a castle still in the family, situated in the Province of Utrecht, Holland.

Teunis Jacobse Van Schoenderwoert was born at Schoenderwoert, Holland, near Leerdaam, and came in the ship *Rensselaerwyck* to New Amsterdam, October 1, 1636, in the service of the Patroon, and

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settled at Fort Orange. He married Sarah Denyse, April 19, 1650, in New Amsterdam. He was a trader, worked for his brother Rutger, and had a salary from the Patroon.

Brant Arentse Van Slichtenhorst (-----1660?) came to Beverwyck from Nykerk in Gelderland, in 1648, as resident-director of the colony of Rensselaerwyck. A man of education and ability, he was devoted to the welfare of the colony, and displayed great zeal and energy in furthering the interests of the Patroon and resisting the aggressions of the West India Company. He remained in this country until about 1655, when he returned to Holland, where he died about 1660.

Willem Pieterse van Slyk was a wealthy burgomaster who came from Amsterdam with his family in 1655, and after living awhile in New Amsterdam removed to Fort Orange, where, it is said, he was in government employ.

Teunis Dirckse Van Vechten came from Vechten, Holland, near Utrecht and the river Vecht, in 1638, with his wife and son Dirck and two servants, in the vessel *Arms of Norway*, to Greenbush (now Rensselaer) and Fort Orange (Albany, N. Y.) His son purchased and received a grant of land at Catskill, N. Y., from Governor Thomas Dongan. His old stone house, built in 1690, was still standing in 1901, and, with land to the tide-flowing creek, is still in possession of the family.

Lambert Van Volkenburgh emigrated to this country from Holland during the directorship of Governor William Kieft, and appears as a resident of New Amsterdam in 1643, securing, in that year, a home under the guns of Fort Amsterdam, overlooking Governor's Island. This property he bought from Jacob Jacobsen, June 29, 1644, for 65 guilders "in cash or beavers." In 1645 he removed to Rensselaerwyck, and afterward made his residence in Fort Orange, now Albany.

Steven Coertsen Van Voorhees (1600-1684) left Hees, in the Province of Drenthe, Holland, in April, 1660, in the ship *Bonte Koe*, with his wife and children. He purchased, November 29, 1660, cornland, woodland and plain-land in Flatbush, L. I., for 3,000 guilders, from Cornelis Hoagland. He was a member of the Dutch Church of Flatlands in 1677, and a magistrate in 1664. Jacobus Gerritse Van Vorst (1641——) was living in Albany in 1687, in which year he was a public porter, and was licensed as a carman by Mayor Schuyler. His son Jellis removed to Schenectady.

Aart Jacobse Van Wagenen came to this country about 1650 from Wageningen, a town near the Rhine, ten miles west of Arnheim in Guelderland, Holland. In 1651 he was living in Rensselaerwyck (Albany), but in 1661 he removed to Kingston, being, with his wife Annetje Gerrits, received into membership in the Dutch Church there on June 24th of that year. He died previous to 1667, leaving five children, Jacob (1652-1716) who married Sara Pels, Gerrit (-----1721) who married Claartje Pels, Neeltje who married Cornelis Fynhout, Grietje who married Jacobus Elmendorf and Elizabeth who married Cornelis Masten.

Jan Varick emigrated to New York from the village of Rhenen in Holland previous to 1687, as on June 1st of that year he and his wife joined the Dutch Church in that city. About 1712 he removed to Hackensack, N. J., where he was living as late as 1720. After his death his widow kept a store at Hackensack for the sale of general merchandise. She probably died in 1736 as her will, dated 1731, was probated May 12th of that year.

Harmen Albertse Vedder (--1715?) is said to have emigrated from Holland to this country in 1630. The first mention of his name occurs in the Albany records in 1657. In 1661 he erected a salt kettle on Coney Island and claimed the island, but in a suit before the Governor and Council this claim was not allowed. In 1663 he leased a farm in Schenectady. In 1668 he visited Holland, chartered the ship *King Charles* and loaded it with goods for New Amsterdam. In 1673 he was appointed one of the three Commissioners of Schenectady and resided there at the time of the massacre in 1690.

Isaac Vermilye (1601-1676), son of John Vermilye and Marie Roubley, was born in London, his parents probably being Walloons who had emigrated to England owing to the religious troubles in their own land. He subsequently removed to Leyden, Holland, whence he sailed on October 14, 1662, in the ship *Purmerlander Kerck*, bound for New Amstel on the Delaware River. From the latter place, early in the year 1663, accompanied by his wife and family, he made his way to Harlem, on Manhattan Island. In 1663 he was chosen as an officer of a military company which acted against the Indians at Esopus, and in 1666 was an overseer or magistrate of Harlem. He lived on Van Keulen's Hook, about the centre of the block now bounded by 122nd and 123rd Streets between First and Second Avenues. In this house he died.

Abraham Isaacse Ver Planck (——-1691), sometimes called Planck, arrived in this country from Holland prior to 1638, when he obtained a grant of land near Paulus Hook (Jersey City) at what is now Communipaw,—a name derived from Pauw, a director of the Dutch West India Company, who had previously owned the property. Abraham or Abram Ver Planck was one of the "Twelve Men" under Governor Kieft. He married Maria Vingé or Vinje, widow of Jan Roos. She was a daughter of Guleyn Vingé, and as heiress of her mother, Ariantje Cuvel, afterwards wife of Jan Jansen Damen, became owner of what was afterwards known as the Kolk Hoeck Farm. Abraham Ver Planck spent most of his life in New Amsterdam as merchant and trader, having abandoned his farming enterprise at Paulus Hook. He accompanied Governor Stuyvesant in 1656 in his expedition against the Swedes on South River.

Cornelis Cornelisse Viele (1622-1689) was born in Holland. At the age of twenty-one he came to New Amsterdam in the service of the Dutch West India Company. In 1645 he married Aeltje Colet, a widow, of the Colet family of Artois. Later he removed to Fort Orange where he engaged in Indian trading and established a brewery. Upon the death of his wife in 1668, he joined with others in founding Schenectady where he acquired large tracts of land. At his death in 1689 his property was divided amongst his three sons, Arnout, Cornelis and Pieter. Arnout married in 1677 Geeritje Gerretse, and their daughter Willempie Vielé married Symon Jacobse Schermerhorn about the year 1683. Schermerhorn died in New York about 1696, and on June 20, 1699, his widow Willempie married Livinus Winne, and again married, on June 19, 1709, Johannes Van Hoesen.

John Waddell came from Dover, England, and was one of the founders of the Society Library in New York City in 1764. He married Ann Lirton November 30, 1730.

Joshua Waddington (1755-1844) came to New York City in 1776. He was one of the founders of the Saint George's Society and of the Bank of New York.

Resolved Waldron, brother of Joseph, emigrated with his family to New Netherlands in 1654, and in the same year Governor Stuyvesant made a grant of that portion of Manhattan Island lying between Eighty-second and One hundred and Ninth Streets, from river to river, to Baron Waldron and two others. In 1657 he was admitted a burgher and 1658 appointed Deputy Sheriff. In 1659 he was sent with Augustine Heermans to Maryland to vindicate the Dutch title on the Delaware. On the accession of the English, Waldron took the Oath of Allegiance (1664) and retired to private life in Harlem. He was one of the five patentees named in Nicolls' Patent. He married first Rebecca Hendricks, and second, Janneke Nagel. He left sons Samuel, William, Barent and Johannes and died in the year 1690.

Samuel Ward (1756-1832), son of Governor Samuel Ward of Rhode Island and Anne Ray, his wife, was born at Westerly, R. I., November 17, 1756. Graduating from Brown University in 1771, he entered the Continental Army in 1775, with the rank of Captain, subsequently obtaining a commission as Lieutenant-Colonel. He took part in the siege of Quebec, where he was taken prisoner and was held until August, 1776, when he was paroled and sent to New York City, where he remained until he was exchanged, just before the end of the year. Some time after the close of the war he settled in New York City, where he engaged in business. He died August 16, 1832.

Samuel Blachley Webb (1753-1807), the son of Joseph Webb and Mehitabel Mott, was born in Wethersfield, Conn., December 15, 1753. He served in the War of the Revolution as first lieutenant of Capt. Chester's Company, Hartford County militia, and was wounded at the Battle of Bunker Hill. In 1775 he was appointed aide-de-camp to Gen. Putnam, and in 1776 was made private secretary of Gen. Washington, with the rank of lieutenant-colonel. In 1777 he raised and organized the Third Connecticut Regiment, and with it took part in the expedition to Long Island, where he was captured by the British and held prisoner for three years, when he was exchanged. After the war he resided in Pearl Street, New York City, until in 1789 he removed to Claverack, Columbia County, where he dwelt until his death, December 3, 1807.

Jan Barentse Wemple (1620-1663), sometimes called Jan Barentse "Poest," came to America about 1645, and settled near Albany, N. Y. In 1659 he purchased from the Indians a plot of land in what is now the city of Troy. In 1662 Director-General Stuyvesant granted to him and Jacques Cornelisse Van Slyck, the great island at Schenectady. About a year after his death his widow married Sweer Teunisse Van Westbroeck.

Evert Janse Wendell (1615-1709) was born in Embden, Friesland. He came to New Amsterdam in 1640 in the service of the Dutch West India Company. After residing there for about five years he removed to Fort Orange, where he became prominent, serving as magistrate, 1660-1661. He was buried under the old church then standing at the corner of Yonker and Handelaer Streets, the present State Street and Broadway, in Albany.

Thomas Wenman, "upholsterer," was admitted as a Freeman of the City of New York, November 10, 1719, during the mayoralty of Jacobus Van Cortlandt. He is said to have been a connection of Richard Wenman, of Thane Park, Oxfordshire, England, and of the same family as Sir Ferdinand Wenman, one of the original members of the Virginia Company named in the second charter of incorporation, May 23, 1609.

John Albert Weygand (1721-1770), a Lutheran clergyman, was born at Hanover, Prussia. He graduated at the University of Halle, Bohemia, and came to America as minister in charge of a colony from the Palatinate, landing at Philadelphia, September 7, 1748; later he had charge of a Lutheran congregation at Germantown, New Jersey, where he married Dorothy Van Deeren, the daughter of a Lutheran clergyman of that place. In 1752 he went to New York City and took charge of the Lutheran church, corner of Rector Street and Broadway, where he remained until his death. His remains were interred in the church, which was afterwards destroyed by fire. He was a Governor of King's College, New York City.

Joseph Wickham (1662-1734) was the son of Thomas Wickham of Wethersfield, Conn. He removed to Killingworth, Conn., where he was for some years a Justice of the Peace, and about 1697 settled at Southampton, L. I., where he died July 7, 1734.

Richard Willets (——1665?) known as "Richard the Husbandman," with his wife Mary Washburn, came from England and located at Jericho, Long Island, in 1660. They were prominent members of the Society of Friends.

Henry Willis (1628-1714) was a son of Henry Willis of Wiltshire, England. He moved with his family to London in 1667. After remaining there seven or eight years they came to this country and settled in Oyster Bay, L. I. After living there a year or two, Henry Willis purchased land in the township of Hempstead, and called the place Westbury in remembrance of his old home in England.

Christian William Wilmerding (1762-1832), son of John Christopher Wilmerding and Christine Elizabeth Tho der Horst, came to New York City from Brunswick, Germany, in 1783. He was a merchant, and married Catherine Falkenhahn at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church, New York City, on September 27, 1785. He was an original member of the Tontine Association, was President of the German Society, and a member of Holland Lodge, F. & A. M. He was born in Brunswick, Germany, January 22, 1762, and died in Moscow, Livingston County, N. Y., July 19, 1832.

Johannes Wisner was a subaltern officer in the army commanded by the Prince of Orange against Louis XVI. He came to America about 1713, and settled first on Long Island, and a year or two later in Orange County, N. Y.

Thomas Witter (1713-1786) was born in the Parish of Spanish Point, Bermuda, on Sunday, October 25th, 1713. His father, Matthew Witter, was a native of that island, and the family is recorded as being there in 1614. Thomas Witter came to New York City previous to 1740, as, on the third of February of that year, he was married in that place to Mary Lewis, a native of the Island of Bermuda. He was engaged in mercantile business in the city, remaining there during the Revolution, although subject to much persecution from the British on account of his strong sympathy with the colonists. He died October 20, 1786, and was buried in Trinity Churchyard. His only child, a daughter, became the wife of Commodore James Nicholson, of the United States Navy, in 1763.

John David Wolfe (1693-1759) was born in the village of Nossen, near Meissen, Saxony, October 13, 1693. He emigrated to this country about 1725, and engaged in business. In 1741 he purchased the premises now known as Nos. 80 and 82 Liberty Street, New York City, which he occupied until his death, and which were still in the possession of his descendants in 1893. He was made a freeman of the city in 1730.

John Wood (1695-1765) was born in Pennsylvania, and removed to Hempstead, L. I., about 1724. He was a grandson of John Wood (1615-1692), of Attercliffe, Parish of Sheffield, Yorkshire, England, who emigrated to America in the ship *Shield*, in 1678, and settled at Falls, Bucks County, Pa., and is believed to have been the first English settler in that county, which he later (1682) represented in the governing body of the Colony.

Ephraim Woodworth (1732-1825), born September 22, 1732, son of Caleb Woodworth and Jane Munger, and descendant of Walter Woodworth, went to Stillwater, Saratoga County, N. Y., from Salisbury, Conn., in 1762. He purchased 400 acres of land at what is now Bemis Heights, three miles north of Stillwater Village. The house of Ephraim Woodworth was just inside the American lines at the Battle of Saratoga, in which he and his son were engaged. It was the headquarters of General Gates, and the weave shop of the hospital. In 1779 he was Captain in active service of the 4th Company of the 13th Regiment, Albany County Militia. His son Ephraim also served. After the war he became a wealthy and influential citizen of Stillwater.

George Woolsey (1610-1698) was born at Yarmouth, England, October 27, 1610. He is believed to have been taken by his father to Holland, from whence, at the age of thirteen, he came to this country, and lived for many years at New Amsterdam, where he married, December 9, 1647, Rebecca, daughter of Thomas Cornell. In 1647 he purchased land at Flushing, L. I. He was a cadet of the Burgher Guard in 1653. About 1664 he removed to Jamaica, L. I., where he died August 17, 1698, leaving six children, George, Thomas, John, Sarah (who married William Hallett), Rebecca (who married a Wiggins), and Mary. He served as Town Clerk of Jamaica for many years. James Young (1740—), one of the Long Island Youngs, removed with his family to the town of Newcastle, Westchester County, N. Y., before the Revolution, and continued to live there through the war. He and his wife died soon afterwards of smallpox, and all his papers and family records were burned at that time.

Albrecht Zaborowsky (1638?-1711) was born in Poland. He emigrated from Prussia to New Amsterdam in the ship Fox, and landed in August, 1662. Soon after his arrival he purchased land at Peremesse, now Paramus, N. J. He married Machteld Van der Linde in the church at Bergen, N. J., December 17, 1676. It is said that he studied for the Lutheran ministry, but was impressed into the army, and availed himself of some opportunity to come to this country. He died at Hackensack, N. J., September 1, 1711.
