Dear Jamie:-

The curtains are starting at last. They were a long time about it because we have had guests almost continuously for some time. Cousin Hester was here from Carpenteria for three weeks. And at last I have seen your Aunt Susie and the girls. That was a real treat, tho the visit was very short. Howard almost wept when Baby Nancy went on to Santa Barbara without stopping at all. They played together for a time in the Ferry Building.

To return to the curtains. They are not just what you need but I thought would do for the short time left at Hermon perhaps. They will scarcely stand another washing. Then when we finally find out whether this house is to be rented furnished, unfurnished, or sold, we can send the curtains from your grandmother's room, which are the only good long ones, or else get new for your Hester room. They may be furnished there.



Your father rushed around with such a fierce light in his eye, looking for Korean things for you, I almost expected to be packed off as an interesting specimen. However those are things of your grandfather's that you want & keep; I will send you a couple of embroidered things to give away - the work of the girls, not real Korean embroidery. We shall have to wait until we get home for that.

No work or study with the clock in front of you when you feel your time is limited and make yourself work faster. If you have not time and the right word won't come - fear it in mind, but go ahead. It will save lots of time and please, please, do keep up in all your subjects. Your father even hesitated about putting in those novels lest they prove a temptation. ~~the clock~~ Too, or bicycle, would take time that apparently needs to be put on study. Then we must have you in Korea for a year before you graduate. That can't be done either, if you lag. I think the whole trouble is a method of study you have gotten into. Re-

remember how you used to wait for a certain  
minute to come before you would begin to  
practice when you were a little chap. Just  
things waste minutes, then hours, and the  
usefulness of a life may be seriously im-  
paired. You know - but enough of this

since he was a boy to go to the mission field

since they went to school. They have a  
director of play who is evidently very good.  
In the street cars they drive me crazy, first

"Mama, its my turn, what does B.R.EAD spell" etc. etc.

Howard continues to let his light shine in public places. On the Key Route he was so naughty about sitting where his father told him. Finally subsiding, he began to sing "Trust and obey for there's no other etc, at first softly - then for the edification of the car full. He still carries his pocket testament, hauling it out every once in a while to remark "This is a good book, its true. Aren't you glad papa gave it to me?"

Evenings we have an early supper and play ~~dominoes~~ anagrams or card dominoes with them. If we had to row we should be here practically this whole term, I don't believe we could have let you go.
