AUGUST VISIT TO MAASTRICHT, NETHERLANDS

A SPECIAL EVENT this year is an informal visit to the numerous underground sites in Zuid Limburg (Netherlands) and adjoining parts of Belgium - including the underground stone quarries described in a paper in the bulletin a few years ago.

The provisional programme includes all or some of:

NOORDELIJK GANGENSTELSEL ST. PIETERSBERG - ie non-tourist parts of the Maastricht underground quarries

CAESTERT - Belgian extensions of same

SIBBERGROEVE - with possible viewing of the last subterranean quarrymen still at work

GEULHEMMERGROEVE - with historic 'chapel' and 'cave-houses'

KAZEMATTEN MAASTRICHT - casemates under the City walls

RIJCKHOLT - internationally famous and important Neolithic flint mines - cf Grimes Graves

GEMEENTEGROEVE VALKENBURG - another very extensive underground quarry, with many interesting features including multi-level working - with luck we may gain access to the non-tourist areas here as well as at St. Pietersberg

KANNE and EBEN EMAEL quarries - just over the Belgian border + some of the smaller quarries in Limburg

NATUURHISTORISCH MUSEUM MAASTRICHT - for old films of St. Pietersberg

The whole week (probably approx 4th - 1ith August) will be informally run, along traditional SB lines!, by Eef Smitshuysen of Studiegroep Onderaardse Kalksteengroeven. Some limited assistance with 'sleeping-bag places' may be possible - and there is a good camp site just outside the St. Pietersberg Noordelijk Gangenstelsel on the City outskirts. Maastricht itself is an unusually pleasant place, although nearby Valkenburg (the 'Southend' of Holland, though with neither pier nor sea) tends to be full of coachloads of English schoolchildren!

CONTACT ME AS SOON AS POSSIBLE if you would like to consider joining this trip. It is evolving out of a 'prospecting' trip for a full-blown study weekend - SAE PLEASE!

FUTURE STUDY WEEKENDS

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

This year's international conference — to be hosted as usual by our associated group Societe Française d'Etude des Souterrains — will be held 7 — 9 July at Chateauponsac, near Limoges — details enclosed.

SEHDACS

The Societe d'Etudes Historiques des Anciennes Carrieres et Cavites Souterrains is based in Paris, and has just sent us issue 4 of its journal LIAISON. As with the Dutch group SOK, all interested in the serious study of underground quarries should keep in touch with what these other groups are doing on the Continent.

LLOYDS BANK GRANT AID and the CHALDON QUARRIES SURVEY

SB has been awarded a further HUNDRED POUNDS from the Lloyds Bank Fund for Independent Archaeologists for surveying these ancient quarries. Good use has been made of the compass, tape, and clinometer purchased with the PREVIOUS HUNDRED POUNDS — current estimates are that about 13,000 metres of the estimated total of 17,000 metres of quarry gallery have now been surveyed and drawn up at 1:500; if you were at the last Cambridge conference you will have seen the extent and quality of this survey. The new grant is being applied to the purchase of access tackle (wire ladder + belay) and for photographic survey. And we have volunteers, professional and/or experienced photographers, to take and process the photographs.

STONE QUARRIES SYMPOSIUM

The Croydon Natural History & Scientific Society is holding a symposium, in Croydon, on 16 March 1985. Although it is intended this should deal mainly with the east Surrey quarries, it is probable that others will feature also, for comparative purposes.
