NSCA show is refreshing change

One of the numismatic events I look forward to each year is the annual spring convention of the National Scrip Collectors Association. As a dealer, I welcome the refreshing change this meet provides from the usually hectic show schedule. NSCA puts on a most unusual show; no admission is charged, and the organization even provides dealers with free bourse tables. Needless to say, at these meets every table is filled!

This year's meet was held

the first weekend in May, at the new Holiday Inn at Oak Hill, W. Va. Although the show didn't officially open until May 1, a Friday, I arrived one day early. Having attended NSCA events regularly since the early 1970s (I am a charter member of the organization), I knew that much of the buying and selling would take place among the "regulars" Thursday.

This year was no exception. By mid-afternoon many of the motel's rooms were bustling with activity. Books of tokens (or "scrip," as coal mine company store tokens are called by collectors) were everywhere, and those members who came with choice material to sell or trade were doing a brisk business.

My reasons for attending these meets are threefold. First, and probably most important to me, is the opportunity to visit the many friends I have made over the years. Secondly, as a dealer I can purchase good material to fill cus-

tomers' want lists. And, finally, as an avid collector of exploder tokens I have an excellent opportunity to acquire needed pieces. (These tokens were used by coal mines to control the usage of explosives. Most exploder tokens have, on one side, the name or initials of the issuing mine, while the other side has an inscription such as GOOD FOR 1 KEG POWDER, ONE CAP, ONE DETONATOR, or 2 STICKS MONO-BEL.)

Incidentally, not all National Scrip Collectors Association members confine their collecting to coal mine company store scrip. Lumber company store scrip is a specialty of many, and a smaller number of members (this writer included) are also interested in the scrip issued in the South by cotton mills for use in their commissaries. And, although the majority of members include only metallic scrip in their collections, a few are interested in paper scrip and stock certificates issued by mining companies.

May 1, and although I had been up most of the previous night looking at scrip, I was there bright and early setting up my table. At a time like this, sleep can wait. Obviously I was not alone in this thought; before long the room was alive with activity.

W.M. Ritter Lumber Co. was sold for \$70, the highest price of the sale. A rare and interesting "Meat Check" from the St. Bernard Coal Co. of Earlington, Ky., fetched \$60, and a Robinson Creek Coal Co. 25-cent piece brought \$48. A five-piece set of tokens issued by the Yankee Mercantile Co. of Yankee, N.M., found a new owner for \$54.50.

A few of the tokens were sold for bargain prices. For example, a 1-cent piece of Maryland New River Coal Co., Store No. 1 (from Winona, W. Va.) sold for just \$5, as did the next lot, a Clinchfield Coal Corp., Store B (Danle, Va.) 1-cent token. Both of these tokens are scarce types. By the end of the sale, most members were ready to retire to the rooms

for a good night's rest. At 8 a.m. Saturday, May 2, NSCA President Crawford Blakeman called the membership meeting of the organization to order. It was noted that in addition to those members in attendance from surrounding states, there were also collectors from such far away places as Alabama, Florida, Illinois, South Carolina and Texas. The Ancill Donohoe trophy for the best article printed during the past year in the organization's publication, "Scrip Talk," was presented to Lowell Howard for his article about the Cray, Ky., mine. First place exhibit award went to Crawford Blakeman for his display of rare Kentucky coal tokens, and second place was awarded to Mark F.

Elwood Maples for their exhibit of United Mine Workers Association exonumia (this exhibit also received the People's Choice award). A highlight of the annual meetings is presentation of the coveted Fred Lange award for distinguished service to NSCA. I was pleased to see a good friend, Paul Jensen, named this year's recipient. Paul, who has been a hard worker and dedicated supporter of the organization for many years, was obviously caught off guard when the decision of the committee was announced.

Some scrip collectors are attracted to non-numismatic memorabilia relating to coal mining, and in recent years many such items have been offered for sale at NSCA meets. For example, one member has made a specialty of post cards with scenes of coal mines. Miners' lamps have become very popular, and quite a selection of interesting types could be found at this year's meet. The meet opened at 8 a.m. ★Please turn to page 79

One of the highlights of NSCA meets is the Friday evening auction of scrip. As always, this sale was attended by many collectors eager to bid for the "goodies" being sold. The material offered in these sales is consigned by members, and the commission charged by NSCA pays for the expenses of putting on the show.

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Organized in 1972, its membership now stands at nearly 400. The group's regularly published newsletter, "Scrip Talk," is edited by Walter Caldwell (who also serves as NSCA janitor, according to the mashead). In addition to association news and a mail-bid sale of scrip, each issue includes articles relating to scrip and the companies that issued it. Every member is entitled to run a free classified ad in each issue.

Two standard catalogs of coal company scrip have been published by NSCA. Authored by Donald O. Edkins, one volume catalogs all known scrip from West Virginia, some 7,400 varieties. The second volume includes more than 6,600 tokens from other states. A
