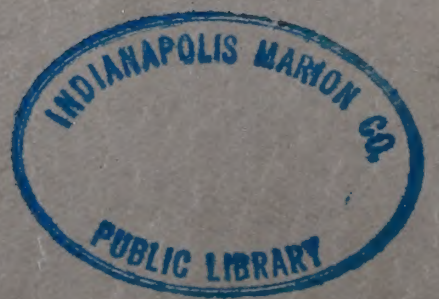
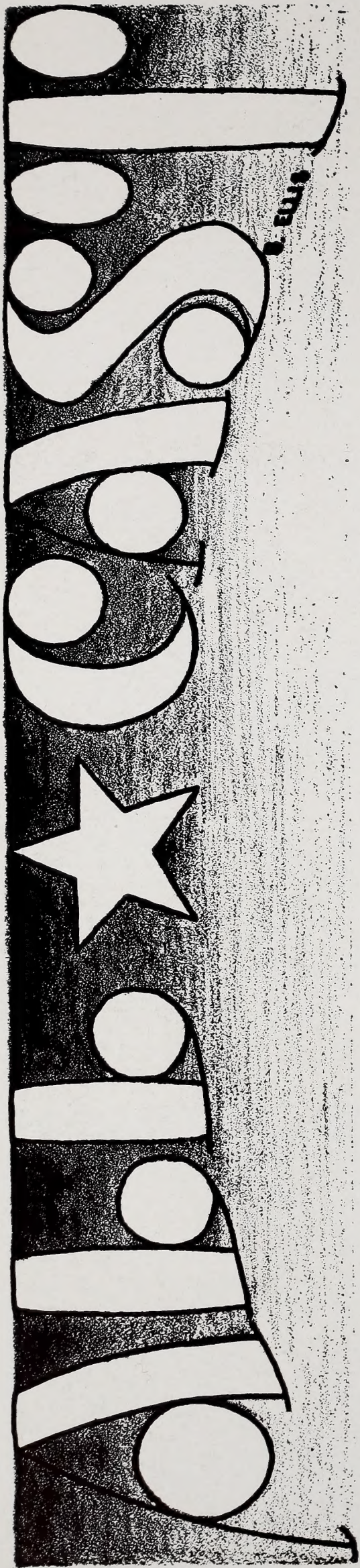

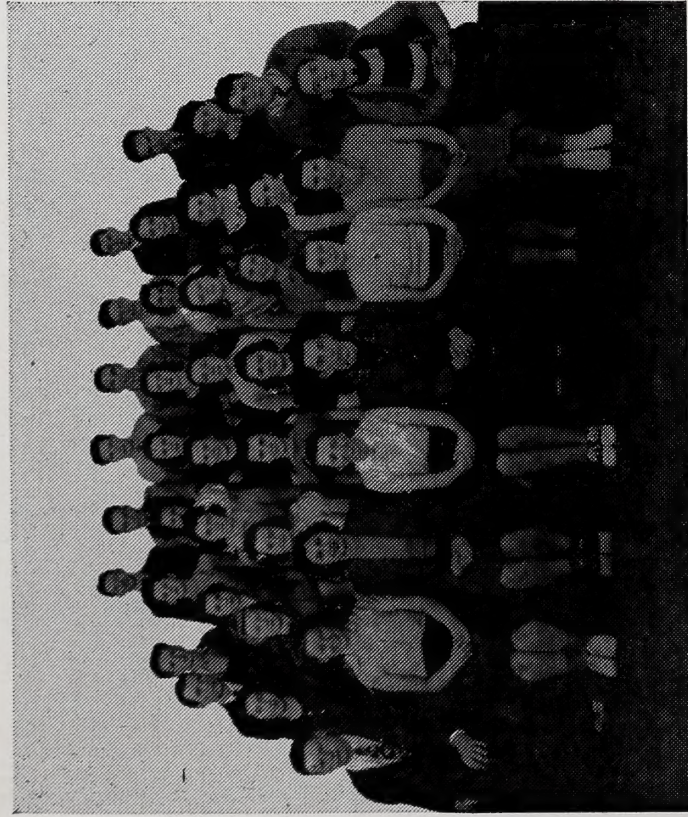
## **"THIS WAY, PLEASE"**

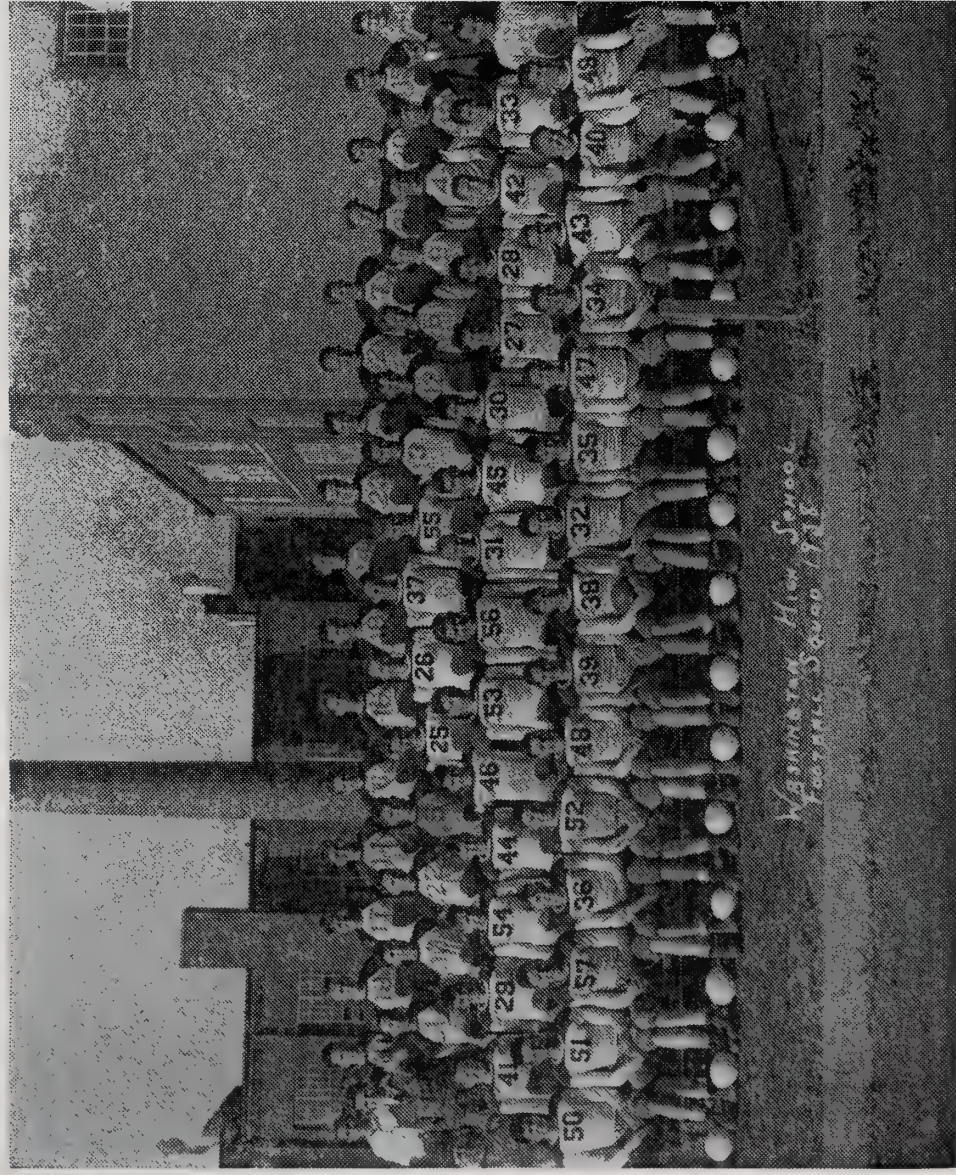

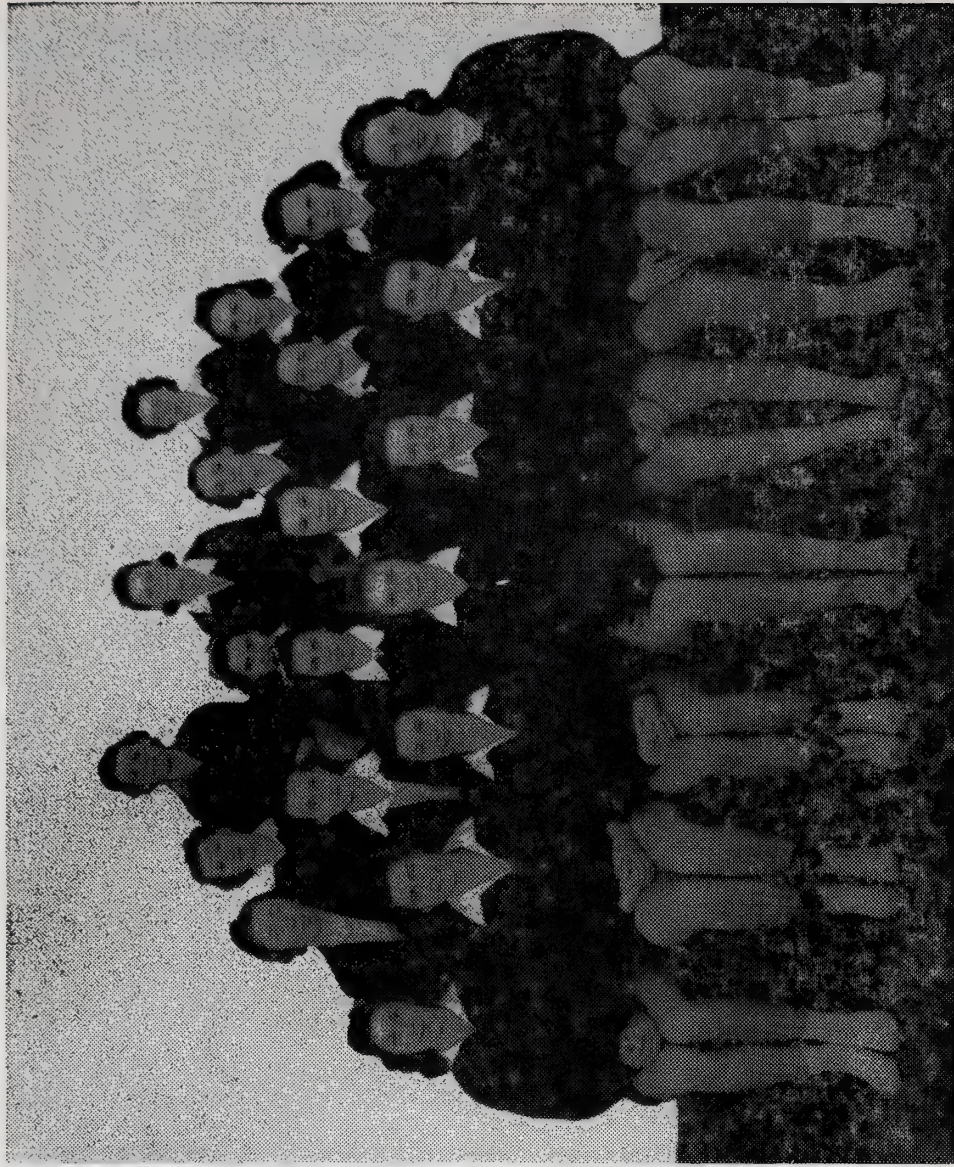

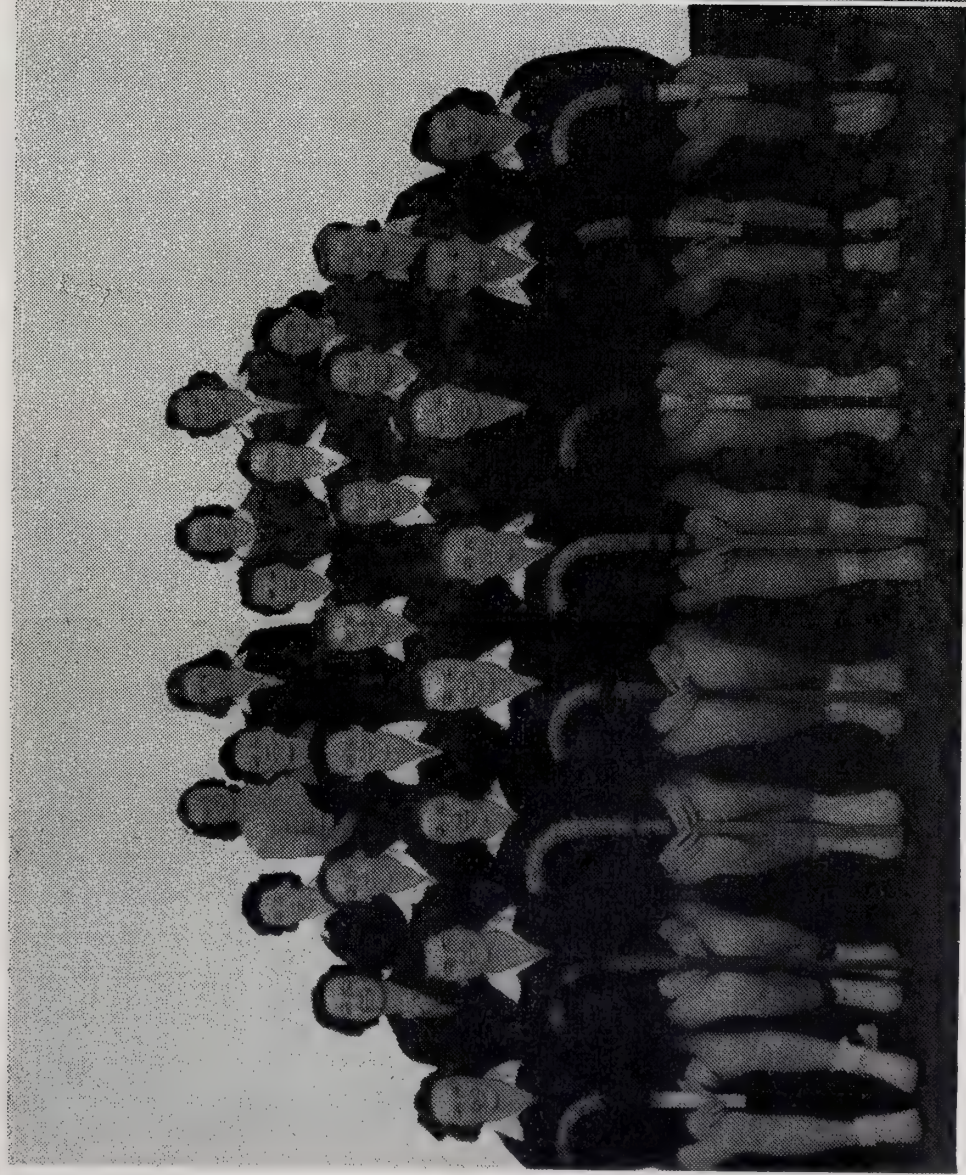
