SEOUL STATION MINUTES October 7, 1947

The second regular meeting of Seoul Station was held at the Coen Billet on Tuesday October 7th at 7:30. Those present were: Mr. Coen, Dr. & Mrs. Fletcher, Mr. Genso, Miss Johnson, Mr. & Mrs. Phillips, and Mr. & Mrs. H.G. Underwood.

Mr. Phillips opened the meeting with prayer. The minutes were then read and approved.

Miss Johnson informed the meeting that the normal class for the Bible Women would be held from October 15 to 17.

Mr. Genso reported for the Chauffeur Committee that a chauffeur, Kim Chai Un (), had been hired on September 24th at a salary of ₩5000 per month.

Mr. Genso reporting for the property committee, said that the Government were not interested in any new projects in connection with the mission houses now used by the station, but would continue to make repairs on them as per contract. He also said that his request for a service road had been refused for the time being. He mentioned that the price of glazed tiles at the present was ₩200 or ₩250 a piece for 2 ft. long tiles.

The secretary read a letter from the Foreign Missions Conference Group in Seoul, dated September, concerning scholarships to Koreans and the group's action about purchasing of a food supply.

Dr. Fletcher, reporting, read the minutes of the last Executive Committee meeting, in which each station was requested to make plans for evangelistic meetings and report to the next meeting of the Executive Committee; and each station was asked to make up a basic three months supply of food to be acquired and stored up until needed. It was moved, seconded and carried that the Maintenance Committee be asked to draw up a list for a three months food supply and turn it in to the Executive Committee before their next meeting.

Miss Johnson reported for the Committee forming the Fellowship meeting. The following recommendations were brought before this meeting for approval:

1. The name suggested for this meeting to be Presbyterian Family Night.
2. Date and time: the 3rd Tuesday of each month, from 5:30 to 9:30 P.M.
3. The membership: to include all present and former missionaries, and the children of missionaries resident in Seoul.
4. The place of meeting: at the various billets, in October at etc.
5. The program to be as follows:
 - 5:30 to 6:00 - Devotional period, leaders to be chosen by the chairman
 - 6:00 to 7:00 - pot-luck supper
 - 7:00 to 7:30 - social intermission
 - 7:30 to 9:30 - conference, to include:
 - a. Personal reports - not to exceed 10 minutes in length, preferably written, from all members, with one-third of the total membership reporting

- each month - one report each quarter from each one.
- b. A report on matters of common interest by the chairman.
- c. A report by the station secretary, on items not reported above.
- d. A discussion of any important matters (1) as planned by the chairman (2) as brought up on the floor.
- e. Closing prayer.

These recommendations were discussed one by one and it was moved, seconded and passed that the date of station meeting be changed from the first Tuesday of every month to the second Tuesday of every month, and family night be on the 4th Tuesday of the month. It was moved, seconded and carried that we adopt the amended report eliminating everything after the word "conference".

Mr. Coen passed on to meeting the request for a teacher to teach two 80 minute periods of English Bible a week at the women's Seminary.

The need for a superintendent-secretary to collect rent and evict tenants from the Korean houses belonging to the mission was brought before this meeting. It was moved, seconded, and carried that a Committee, composed of Mr. Coen Mr. Phillips and Mr. Genso, be given power to find such a secretary.

It was moved and seconded that the time of Station Meeting be changed from 7:30 to 5:00 P.M. and be held at the Coen Billet.

The next meeting of the Station will be on November 11th at the Coen Billet at 5:00 P.M.

Dr. Fletcher closed the meeting with a prayer.

STORY TELLING CENTER November, 11, 1947

The third regular meeting of Seoul Station was held at the Coen billet on Tuesday November 11th at 5:00 P.M. Those present were: Mr. Coen, Miss Clark, Dr. & Mrs. Fletcher, Mr. Genco, Miss Delmarter, Miss Johnson, Dr. & Mrs. Phillips, Dr. & Mrs. Underwood, and Mr. & Mrs. Underwood.

Miss Johnson opened the meeting with prayer. The minutes were then read and after correction approved.

Mr. Coen reporting for the F.M.C. said that the hymnbooks with words but no music, were being unloaded the following day and could soon be purchased; The paper was still looked for; and that the group was in favour of a purchasing agent such as obtained in Japan.

Mr. Phillips, reporting for the property committee, said that the occupants of one of the servants houses had been successfully evicted. It was voted to have Gimsi and her son occupy the newly vacated house.

Miss Delmarter reported the following recommendation and items for information for the evangelistic committee, for information: 1) Miss Delmarter's piblewoman and helper be given a salary of ₩3000 per month 2) that all churches and groups be urged to buy and use the forthcoming Sunday school quarterly, and hold regular pible study for adults as well as children. For information:

1) the expenses for the worker's class amounted to about ₩225 for postage, there was an average attendance of 25, and as a result of the class two missionaries have been out to one church for a week's preaching, to another for a couple of days, and a request for classes has come in from two other churches. (copy of report filed)

It was moved and passed to approve the salary for Miss Delmarter's piblewoman. Miss Delmarter then asked for a prayer that: 1) the thanksgiving offering be used for the purpose for which it was gathered, 2) the presbytery, which was to meet from Nov. 18-20, be touched to see the needs of the church, 3) the evangelistic campaign of the general Assembly 4) our own meeting. Dr. Fletcher and Mrs. Ethel Underwood offered the prayers.

Mr. Coen reported that Kim (김관사), and Dr. Evelyn Koh had been placed on the scholarship committee; blanks had been taken out but few had as yet been returned; He suggested that a revision of the committee was desirable. It was moved, seconded and passed that the scholarship committee be composed of two members of the station, and that these two members be Dr. Underwood and Mr. Coen.

Mr. Genco reported that his committee had, upon the recommendation of Pastor Han (한경치) engaged Elder Paik from October 18th at a salary of ₩6000 as a Superintendent-secretary.

It was moved, seconded and passed that the chauffeur's salary be raised to ₩4000 as of November 1st.

The meeting adjourned for supper.

Following supper Mr. Coen led devotions, and we sang the hymn "When I survey the wondrous Cross".

8 November 1947

Dr. Fletcher then reported for the Executive Committee. The board has asked the Executive Committee to call together all the Presbyterian missionaries in Korea to act as a committee of the whole to make plans for the reorganization of the mission, such plans to be submitted to the board before the 1st of December. The meeting was called for Tuesday Nov. 18th at 9A.M. at the Green Picket.

Mr. Coeb brought up the matter of station reports, and it was moved that the Chairman arrange for the presentation of written personal reports of not more than ten minutes. Carried. It was moved, seconded and carried that the chairman extend an invitation to the missionaries in government service to meet with us at our regular station meeting each month. It was moved, seconded and approved that station meeting be changed to 4 P.M. It was moved that the chairman notify the people concerned as to the action taken with regard to participation in our regular station meeting and make arrangements with the Committee.

Mr. Phillips gave the closing prayer.

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SEOUL STATION MINUTES

December 9, 1947

The fourth regular meeting of Seoul Station was held at the home of Mr. & Mrs. H.G. Underwood on Tuesday December 9th at 4 P.M. Those present were: Miss Clark, Mr. Coen, Dr. & Mrs. Fletcher, Mr. & Mrs. Genso, Miss Johnson, Mr. & Mrs. Phillips, Dr. & Mrs. Underwood, and Mr. & Mrs. H.G. Underwood.

Dr. Underwood opened the meeting with a prayer. The minutes were then read and approved, and the correspondence read.

Mr. Phillips reported for the property Committee, stating that a second house had been vacated and had been furnished to Kim ^{Chun Yong} and Song. The Chinese who has the iron foundry had been notified in writing that he would be charged rent for the ground on which he stores his pig iron as from December 1st. He agreed.

Mrs. Fletcher reporting for the maintenance Committee read the suggested plan for future meetings:

- January - Coen billet not a supper meeting
- February Lutz home
- March Coen billet
- April H.G. Underwood home
- May Coen billet

It was moved and seconded that the January meeting be an afternoon meeting to be held on January 10 at the Coen billet at 2 P.M. The whole plan was then approved.

Mr. Coen reported that the Scholarship Committee had had one meeting with the Rev. Kim ^{기진} and Dr. ^{Coen} ~~Kim~~, and had looked over the applicants for scholarships. They passed one action: it was approved to try to assist nurse Kim Young Soon to go to the United States. She wishes to study Biologie, baby welfare, work, milk stations. She knows English. No other applicants required action. A copy of the rules governing the selection of applicants for scholarship has been filed.

It was moved seconded and passed that the chairman appoint a committee to draw up a minute to be forwarded to Mrs. Moon. Dr. Underwood and the secretary were appointed.

Dr. Fletcher reported for the Executive Committee that Dr. R.N. Smith was being released by the military government at the termination of his contract and he wished to reenter the mission.

The meeting was then adjourned for supper.

Mrs. Genso re-opened the meeting with devotions and Katherine Clark led in prayer. We were asked to remember Mr. Clark who was ill.

Personal reports were then read. Mrs. Lutz informed the station that she and Mr. Lutz were to leave for the United States immediately, because of the ill health of Mrs. Lutz's mother.

Mr. Coen suggested that we reorganize the station. It was moved, seconded and passed that the chairman appoint a nominating committee. Mr. Phillips, Miss Johnson, and Mr. H.G. Underwood were appointed. Mr. Phillips was asked to call the committee together. The meeting was then adjourned.

8TH JANUARY, 1948

The fifth regular meeting of Seoul Station was held on January 8, 1948 at 2 o'clock at the Coen billet. Those present were: Mr. Coen, Miss Delmarter, Dr. & Mrs. Fletcher, Mr. & Mrs. Genso, Mrs. Phillips, Dr. & Mrs. N.H. Underwood, Mr. John Underwood, Mr. & Mrs. N.G. Underwood.

The meeting was opened with the singing of several verses of "Every Morning Mercies New", and "Spirit of God Descend". Mrs. Fletcher led devotions on the "Presence of God", closing with the hymn "Jesus Thou Joy of Loving Hearts" and a prayer.

The station was asked to remember in their prayers Dr. Crane, who is suffering from a heart attack.

The chairman welcomed Mr. John Underwood back to Korea. The minutes were then read and approved after correction.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE Miss Delmarter informed the meeting that the house at the bottom of the Genso property - Mission property - had a vacancy and could this be secured as a place for her Bible woman to live. Moved, seconded and passed that the matter be referred to the property committee with power to act.

HOSPITALITY AND HOUSE COMMITTEE It was moved, seconded and passed that Mr. & Mrs. Phillips have the use of the room Miss Johnson had, when the latter moves to Andong.

- EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE** Dr. Fletcher reporting for
1. the Emergency Executive Committee, asked that each station bring to the attention of each of its members the item in the Board's General letter 98 regarding letters to supporters and asked members of the station to prepare a personal report for 1947 or each portion of it that they had been on the field. A copy of this report is to be sent to Mr. Reilsnauer and a copy to be filed with the Korea Mission Recording Secretary at the Mission meeting on January 21st.
 2. Each station was also asked to prepare a budget for 1948, to be presented at the Mission Reorganization meeting on January 21st.
 3. Kim Yong Song () is to go to the States when a suitable school has been found where she can study child welfare work, and when the final details have been attended to.
 4. A meeting of all Northern Presbyterian Missionaries has been called for January 21 at 9 a.m. to last not more than three days at a place decided on by the Arrangements Committee.
 5. The material for radio use throughout Korea for audio-visual work has been approved and the establishment of a recording station has been authorized.
 6. The meeting was informed of the resignation from this Mission of Rev. R.T. Baugh, Dr. D.B. Avison, and of the intended visit of Miss Flory.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the secretary be asked to convey the above suggestion to the Missionary Fellowship Group at their meeting.

Personal reports were then read by: Mr. Phillips, Mr. Genso, Mrs. H.H. Underwood, and Mrs. H.G. Underwood

Dr. Fletcher announced that Dr. Decker of International Missionary Council plans to be here in February, that Dr. Knapp of the World Sunday School Association was expected in March.

Mr. John Underwood closed the meeting with a word of prayer.

The next meeting of Seoul Station will be held at the Lutz billet at 4 o'clock on February 10.

SEOUL STATION MINUTES

February 10, 1948

The sixth regular meeting of Seoul Station was held at the Bigger home on Tuesday February 10th at 4:00 P.M. Those present were: Mr. Joen, Miss Delmarter, Dr. & Mrs. Bigger, Mr. & Mrs. Phillips, Mr. & Mrs. Genso, Dr. & Mrs. H.H. Underwood, Dr. & Mrs. Fletcher, Mr. & Mrs. H.G. Underwood; Guests were: Mr. & Mrs. Lyons and Dr. Chu.

Mr. Joen opened the meeting with a word of prayer. The minutes were then read and after correction approved.

EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE Miss Delmarter informed the meeting that the Korean Sunday School quarterly was available at \$1.00 a copy, and that several copies of the Westminster quarterly and "Forward" had been received. Anyone who wished to make use of these copies should go to her for them.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE Mr. Phillips reported that as the mission houses on the Yondong compound were under the army building materials, other than nails, paint etc. were not as yet needed. These had been ordered. He also stated that the tenant occupying the servant's quarters at the bottom of the Genso house had agreed to stop the sale of liquor on the premises; that the empty room in that house was not really empty as the occupier was expected to return after vacation.

WELFARE Mrs. H.H. Underwood reported that all material for relief was to be delivered to the Salvation Army training home and to be redistributed from there. Relief goods were expected to come in next week. Notices to put in the relief bundles saying "These are given to you in the name of Jesus Christ, our Saviour" are being printed. One scientifically run milk station has been started.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE Dr. Fletcher reported that housing was needed for the single women missionaries who were expected shortly. He also informed the meeting that Dr. Decker was expected perhaps on February 11th; and that the new commissary was working out very well in Japan.

Mr. Joen said that Dr. Chu, secretary to the Chinese delegation to the U.N. Commission, had been invited to attend station meeting.

Dr. Bigger informed the meeting that the Government approved Severance's request for one million won subsidy a month for a period of six months. The Department of Public Health and Welfare are to help with the running and teaching of the institution.

Miss Delmarter asked the meeting whether or not the single missionaries were to continue to be allowed personal helpers. If so, where are they supposed to live. Such personal helpers were urgently needed for help in country evangelism. It was moved ~~and~~ seconded, that the Property

Committee be requested to investigate the practicability of securing housing for Bible women and helpers for the single women of the station.

It was moved, seconded and passed that the property Committee be instructed to secure use of all the servant quarters belonging to the mission as rapidly as possible and see that proper tenants are installed in them.

Mr. Coen informed the meeting that the servants quarters for the other houses are under contract to the government along with the houses to which they are attached.

Dr. Bigger, in answer to a question, stated that any mission sold to a Japanese or to a Japanese concern was considered vested property. That sold to a Korean was in a different category and might be more difficult to recover. Most of the property was sold to the provincial Government or their organizations. It has not yet been determined whether or not this is considered as sold to Japanese or Koreans.

Miss Belmarter announced that the World Day of Prayer would be February 15. She also announced that beginning the first Saturday in February a class to teach the Sunday School lesson to Sunday School teachers would be held each Saturday. The country Presbyterian Class was meeting on March 17 to 24, they would decide whether or not to recombine with Seoul Presbyterian.

Dr. Fletcher announced that the radio team would arrive February 19 and leave again on the 24th.

The meeting was then adjourned for supper.

Mrs. Phillips re-opened the meeting with devotions, reading verses from the book of John on the "Love of God".

The chairman welcomed Mr. & Mrs. Lyons back to Korea, and asked Mr. Coen to introduce Dr. Chu of the U.M. Secretariat, who were all three then extended the privilege of the floor.

After personal reports from Mrs. Genso and Mr. H.C. Underwood, Dr. Chu spoke a few words and then answered questions.

Dr. Bigger informed the meeting that Dr. Wilson was expected back in Korea.

The next meeting of the station will be March 9 at 4 P.M. at the Coen Billet.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Mr. Lyons.

Dr. Fletcher also announced that Mr. & Mrs. John Henry Van Lerop were on the reinforcement list for 1948. He reported that John Underwood would continue as B.A.N.A. representative until such time as Mr. C. Judy should arrive.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE It was reported that a circular vote requesting the return of the missionary residences from the Army. *was being circulated for signature.*

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE Mr. Coen reported that two names were to be sent to the Executive Committee - those of Hong Gong Nim (김홍동) who wishes to go to Cornell, and Kim Jong Han (김종한). Twelve other names were being kept on file for further information. Six were being dropped.

EMPLOYMENT COMMITTEE Mr. Coen announced that a new secretary had been employed the last week in February for a trial period, at ₩0000 per month.

NEW BUSINESS Since Mr. Coen was expected to leave shortly for the United States the meeting was asked to replace him on the various committees to which he belonged.

It was moved, seconded and passed that Dr. Underwood replace Mr. Coen on the Evangelistic Committee, Mrs. Fletcher on the Property Committee, Mrs. Genso on the Scholarship Committee, Mr. Phillips on the Employment Committee, Mr. Genso as billet manager and station treasurer.

Mr. Genso announced that all hundred yen notes not bearing the Korean plum blossom emblem would have to be redeemed before April 24th or be a total loss to the owner. Dr. Fletcher read a letter of request from a Korean pastor asking for help from the Station to recover a house in the red light district from which he had been evicted. The house is to be used as a temporary home for refugees. It was moved, seconded and passed that Dr. Underwood be asked to act as representative of the station to help in this matter.

The chairman welcomed Miss Hartness, Miss Davie and Mrs. Henderson back to Korea and gave them the privileges of the floor. He also welcomed the Mr. & Mrs. Lampe and Mr. & Mrs. Robertson and extended to them the privileges of the floor.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE Mr. Genso reporting for Mr. Phillips read the following recommendations:

- Property Com.
Report.
1. Regarding the adjustment of the girls' school compound and the site to the west of the former Genso residence, since the school is in the midst of constructing a wall and the question is a very urgent one, recommend that the matter together with other property matters be left with the Educational and Property Committees with power.
 2. Recommend that we approve in principle giving the girls' school permission to build a certain number of teachers' houses to the south of No. 100-7 Yun Dong along the roadway which forms the entrance to the Joen Pillet.
 3. Since Dr. Fletcher holds the power of attorney from the Board, and since the M.G. look to him for requests from our mission, recommend that we ask him to find out from the M.G. if they plan to repair the wall and gate which forms the main entrance to D.H. No. 54 (55 and 56 the wall and gate which forms the main entrance to the Joen Pillet), the wall to the west of No. 100-0 Yun Dong and the embankment in front of No. 100 - 7 Yun Dong. If the M.G. do not plan to make these repairs the property committee should proceed to get estimates, present same to the Executive Committee and see that the work is done.
 4. Mr. Genso was requested to continue making contract for the rental of our former servants quarters at Yun Dong.

The recommendations were then taken in order, the first, third and fourth being passed.

18 April 1948.

Dr. Fletcher read a letter from the Government about the return of houses. Mr. Phillips requests that in accordance with the above letter and the action of the circular vote that the return of the Genso house be asked for.

4. In case any of these houses are released on short notice, before we have immediate need of them, recommended that the property committee be given power to act in the matter of temporary occupancy and protection.
5. That we have an official survey made to determine the boundary of the wall on which repairs are to be made on the west line of the compound.

In accordance with Property Committee action passed by the station on April 10, and Ex. Com. action 1 A 48-74 we report that the work on the rebuilding of the wall on the west side of the compound, costing approximately

250,000 won, will be started as soon as official survey of the line has been made. This action to be reported to the Executive Committee.

- IV That the Property Committee be authorized to make contracts for the building of a retaining wall to the south of #100-7, and for the rebuilding of two entrance gates at the southeast side of the compound. (Approx. cost 250,000 won)
- V That the Property Committee be authorized to sell property (house 200-1, Yun Chi Dong) formerly occupied by servants of the Holcroft house, and outside the west wall of the compound.
- VI That in case this property is sold, other servants quarters be provided for this residence.
- VII That the Property Committee be given power to act in the approval of necessary repairs to house 100-5 and that the report be passed on to the Executive Committee for final approval.
- VIII That we acknowledge receipt of a letter from Commissioner Lord, enquiring as to the possibility of renting one of the houses in Yun Chi Dong, and reply that as soon as the noons house will be released, favorable consideration will be given Commissioner Lord for renting this house.

The meeting was then adjourned for supper.

The committee will then be authorized to spend this money for such cases as it approves. Passed with the ammendment that this may cover wife and children and no case may exceed .50 without Station approval.
3. \$2400 Relief of Destitute
 1. Recommend that \$600 be set aside for special station relief program. This would involve half salary of a relief worker whose duty it would be to investigate, in conjunction with the CWS city relief committees, the most destitute cases and then dispense appropriate relief. This program to be carried out under the supervision of Mr. Kinsler. Passed.
 2. Recommend that \$600 be set aside as a fund on which individual missionaries may draw for special relief needs known to them (and approved by this committee). Passed.
 3. Recorrend that \$1200 be used in an intermission relief program, details to be worked out by this (or Station Welfare) Committee and other interested missions in Seoul. Passed.

It was passed by consent that the Evangelistic Committee be a committee to administer the \$400 for medical expenses of patients in the hospital.

It was passed by consent that the Evangelistic Committee and Dr. Fletcher administer the relief program.

The Property Committee further recommended that all future property requests be made in writing.

2. That the Property Committee be given authority to make repairs up to \$10. Passed.

We request the Mission to urge the Board to recognize the special nature of the Mission work already begun among Refugee Christians from the North, and that a separate appropriation over and above the regular budget be granted to sustain this work (for the Academies, the University, the relief work among refugees) and that a separate appointment of missionary personnel be made for this work, and that the Board recognize this action as a definite plan looking toward the future reoccupation of North Korea.

EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE Miss Bergman reported for the Educational Committee the following recommendations which were passed:

1. Seoul Station recognizes the need for additional Christian Education in Seoul particularly for refugees from the north and encourages the use of northern restoration funds to assist refugee schools. However, it asks the Mission and the Board to realize that the Christian schools formerly in Seoul are now carrying at least three times their pre-war load. Therefore if the Mission or Board recognizes or has recognized any refugee schools, the budget and personnel for these schools should be over and above budgets and requests for current work in South Korea.
2. That, although Seoul Station recognizes the need for Christian Education and has sympathetic interest in Soong Rui Girls Middle School, in as much as the Station has not the funds or the personnel to support additional schools, the question of the re-establishment of Soong Rui Girls' School in South Korea be referred to the Executive Committee of the Mission.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE Mrs. Kinsler reported for the Hospitality Committee the following recommendation:

Recommend that the Mission plan for kitchen facilities in the Mission Dormitory so that families may keep house during Language School. Passed.

Mrs. Kinsler read the Station Report. It was moved, seconded and passed to accept the report with hearty thanks.

The Station voted to excuse Mr. Genso from attending Annual Meeting because of ill health.

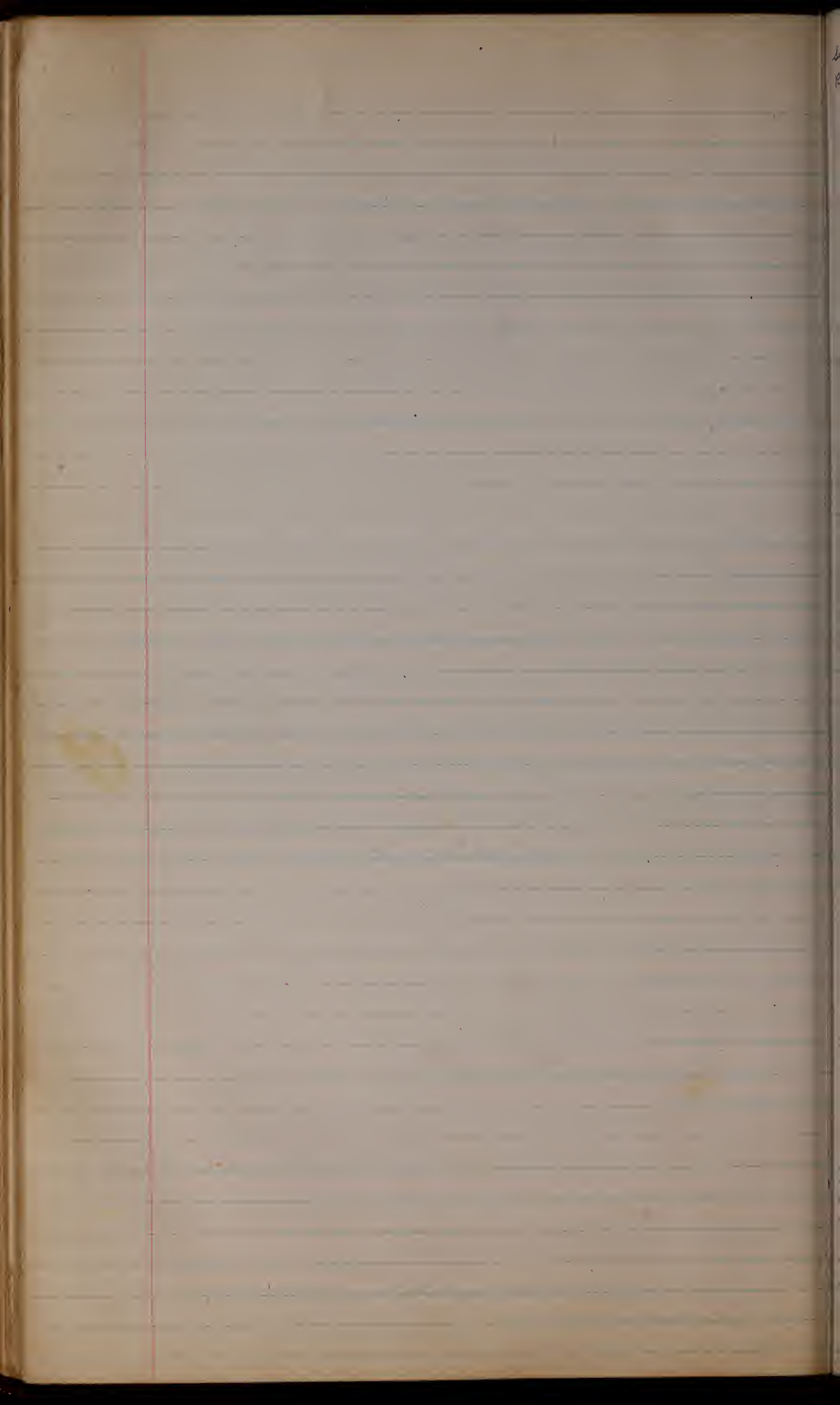

OFFICERS Election of officers was held, and unanimous ballots were cast for Miss Delmarter as Chairman, and Miss Hartness as Vice Chairman. The Property Committee told of a letter from Petrie Mitchell asking to rent one of the mission houses in Seoul, and similar requests from Youth for Christ workers were mentioned. The Director of KAVA (Korean Association of Voluntary Agencies), British Red Cross Girls, Nu Il Hang's daughter, and Mrs Genso were brought up as possible occupants of mission houses in the future. General discussion on the advisability of renting the houses followed.

The motion was made and carried to rent houses only to mission-associated groups.

The motion was made and carried to consider the Kerr house and houses #3, #4, and #5 (Voekel, Kinsler, and Blaine houses) as available for renting, with the exception of the spare rooms on house #3.

It was voted that all rentals should end by June 1, 1954.

It was decided to make a priority list of people to whom the mission would rent houses. After discussion, it was voted to approve rental of the Kinsler house to Petrie Mitchell, the Kerr house to the Director of KAVA, and the Voekel house to Youth for Christ workers.

Terms of rental and repairs were next discussed. \$75.00 a month was suggested as rent. It was agreed that the mission would assume responsibility for emergency repairs, fixing the furnaces, and providing storm windows for at least two sides of the houses to be rented. The servants' houses were not to be included in the rental.

The need for a new form letter to thank senders of relief goods was brought up. Miss Skarin was appointed to write a new form "Thank you" letter.

It was decided to have the Secretary compile a monthly list of prayer requests to be sent to Eleanor Van Lierop, and to write Mrs. Van Lierop a letter of appreciation for making the prayer request pamphlets.

A motion was made and carried to invite all members of the Mission to Seoul at whatever time Dr. Leber is in Seoul during his coming visit to Korea; October 26 - November 6th..

General discussion was held to determine reasonable salaries for servants, and comparison was made of some of the salaries being paid.

The meeting closed with prayer by Miss Delmarter.

The Station approved this request to the Executive Committee.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE - The Station approved the request of the Hospitality Committee that two dozen folding chairs be furnished Seoul Station for community purposes.

SOCIAL WELFARE COMMITTEE - The proper manner of relief distribution was discussed, and Mr. Sheldon and Mrs. Kingsbury were asked to record and acknowledge relief packages coming to the Station.

The following requests of the Social Welfare Committee were approved to be presented to the Executive Committee:

- (1) Request that Chang Sin Dong Widows' Home be granted \$800 (200,000 Hwan) for housing.
- (2) Request that Tong Won Widows' Home be granted 3,500 HW a month for a widow nursery matron.
- (3) Request that Tong Kwang Widows' Home be granted up to \$800 for a building to house ten families.
- (4) Request that Su Saik Widows' Home be granted up to \$1400 subject to further investigation by the Social Welfare Committee.
- (5) Request that Young Nak Church be granted \$600 (150,000 HW) to make tents on recently acquired property into a widows' home.
- (6) Request that So Sa Orphanage be granted a sum for

repairs on their building, the amount to be determined by the Executive Committee.

It was decided that Station meetings would be held on the second Tuesday of each month at 7:30 P.M.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Mr. Kingsbury.

Mr. Wenrich stated his view that non-voting members of the mission should have a chance to express their opinion in such matters. The Station agreed to put this statement on the records.

Recommendation to Rules and By-Laws Committee: A motion was made and carried that all circular votes be circulated in writing with adequate explanation of the matter to be voted on, and that the Station bring this recommendation to the attention of the Rules and By-Laws Committee of the Mission.

2 June, 1954

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SOCIAL WELFARE COMMITTEE - The committee reported that a man had been hired to help with relief sorting and distribution.

Mrs. Clark was appointed to the Social Welfare Committee.

Some discussion was held regarding the source and distribution of Multi-purpose food.

EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE - The Evangelistic Committee stated that tracts were being distributed rapidly. Many had been taken to the General Assembly Office.

MEDICAL COMMITTEE - Mrs. Adams was asked to find out the procedure for physical examination of servants.

A motion was made and carried granting barbed wire fencing for use by the radio station and by Pierson Bible Institute.

Wages of servants were discussed and it was generally agreed to raise them 2000 Hwan a month in view of the increased cost of living.

Mrs. Adams read her Annual Report.

In order to hear all Annual Reports and take up matters for the docket, it was decided to meet on June 3rd following Prayer Meeting, and again on June 4th at 4 P.M.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Mr. DeCamp.

The recommendation that Miss Delmarter's Bible woman be moved out of the gateman's house and put into a room adjoining Miss Hartness' cook's house was passed.

The property committee reported on the assignments of servants' houses. It was agreed to accept the report. The single ladies were requested to make arrangements to give up one of their servants' houses to the DeCamps.

It was agreed to give the property committee power to investigate the possibilities of dividing Kim Pung Choon's house into two houses and to report to the station.

The matter of the garbage pile came up again for discussion; it was suggested that the matter be turned over to the legal man of the mission. It was voted to erect a small building next to the warehouse for the use of the warehouse keeper, taking whatever extra was needed after warehouse funds were exhausted from the residence rehabilitation funds.

The matter of the boundary between the compound and Chungsin School came up for discussion. It was moved to request the transfer of Section X as marked on map (west of House 1) of the Executive Committee. After further discussion it was voted to table the matter.

Mr. Foreman led in prayer. The meeting was adjourned at 5:55.

FIRST ADJOURNED MEETING (same day)

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Miss Delmarter. Three hymns were sung, and Miss Delmarter led in prayer. Dr. Clark took the chair.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Mr. Wenrich resumed the report for the property committee. He reported that the committee had looked at the property in question during the supper hour and had a new recommendation. It was voted, upon the committee's recommendation and that of Dr. Adams that the property committee be commissioned and to have an exact survey made of the compound as a whole, including the new boundary line, and that such survey be submitted as a whole to the Executive Committee.

After some discussion, it was voted to have a driving school for station members who could not drive, the cost to be charged to maintenance. Mr. Wenrich volunteered his services in teaching. The question about allocation of transportation funds came up. By general agreement, it was decided that it would be better to try it for another month because of August and July being very irregular months, before decision was made.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE

Mrs. DeCamp reported for the hospitality committee. Assignments of language school students to various houses were read and agreed upon.

EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE

The evangelistic committee reported. Miss Delmarter asked for a policy of what to do about split off churches. Mr. DeCamp asked how long we should continue to support pulled-out groups. After some discussion about policy, it was generally agreed that the evangelistic committee should work on the problem at their own meeting, with special attention to peace making committee.

Sept. 1954

EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE, CONTINUED

Mr. DeCamp stated that he thought that since the 24FF (undesigned gifts) fund came mostly from chaplains in the Seoul area, that the Executive Committee should be asked to have it used in the Seoul area. Dr. Adams explained that it was a kind of emergency fund. After some discussion, it was voted that Seoul station ask the Executive Committee to approve \$400 for use in the present emergency in Seoul presbytery, to provide certain expenses.

It was reported that no station secretary had been hired as yet. It was suggested that the evangelistic committee arrange for the posting of new missionaries concerning the church controversy in Seoul presbytery; Dr. Adams was asked to explain briefly at the next meeting.

Mr. Sheldon asked about the possibilities of the Christian Endeavor's starting a small magazine of devotional material, etc. Discussion but no action.

PERSONNEL

The question came up of appointing a station representative or committee on the Hyubiwei. No action. The question came up on teachers for CCU. No. Action. A letter to Soongsil and CCU saying that we are not simply ignoring their requests for teachers was suggested. No action.

It was voted that the costs of chaplains luncheons be taken from the undesigned gifts.

Problems concerning Pungkwa School and Kyungsin School were discussed. No action.

It was agreed that another adjourned meeting would be called after prayer meeting Sept. 9. The next regular station meeting was set for Oct. 4, 4:00 P.M., at the DeCamps. Mrs. DeCamp led in prayer. Meeting was adjourned.

SECOND ADJOURNED MEETING

The second adjourned meeting was called to order Sept. 9, 1954, at 8:30 P.M. by the Chairman, Dr. Clark.

Mr. Wenrich reported for the property committee. After considering two requests for the use of the garage near Foreman house, the committee recommended that Mr. Voelkel be assigned the garage for his car. It was so voted. (M. Shaw moved, Mrs. Clark seconded)

It was voted that Mr. Raetz should be allowed the use of his room rent free for a month or so until he moves.

The property committee reported that Kim Pung Choon's house had been investigated and that it would not be possible to make two houses from it. They recommended that the house be assigned to Pai-si. After the motion was moved (H. Voelkel) and seconded, Mr. DeCamp said he wondered if there could not be a definite understanding that there was to be no sharing of the servants houses except by consent of the property committee. Mr. DeCamp moved, Mrs. DeCamp seconded a motion that the matter be left in the hands of the transportation committee only. Both motions were voted upon. Results were indefinite. It was voted that if the Voelkels wished for a bucket-a-day stove that it should be supplied. (Miss Delmarter moved, Mrs. DeCamp seconded).

Miss Delmarter asked whether a window should be cut in one of the rooms at the Kinsler house. There was discussion.

SEOUL STATION MINUTES

10 October, 1955

The twenty-second regular meeting of Seoul Station was held at the Ladies' house at 4:45 on October 10, 1955. Those present were: Mrs. Adams, Dr. & Mrs. Clark, Mr. & Mrs. DeCamp, Mr. & Mrs. Forman, Miss Hartness, Dr. & Mrs. Kinsler, Mr. & Mrs. Sheldon, Miss Swallen, Mr. & Mrs. Underwood, Mrs. Van Lierop, Mr. & Mrs. Voelkel, Sally Voelkel, and Mr. Wenrich.

Mr. Sheldon opened the meeting with a Bible reading (Luke 1: 68-79) and prayer. The minutes were read and approved.

CORRESPONDENCE

Two letters concerning the dentist for Severance were read. Arising out of these, it was moved and passed that in the question of the permanent assignment of housing the hospitality and property, ^{Committee} should consult together and then make recommendations to the Station.

Mr. Wenrich's letter concerning the policy for voucher requests for Whan payments was read and discussed.

Mr. Mitchell's letter regarding the Kerr house was read.

The request from the Committee of the General Assembly's Student Hostel for ₩50,000 for wood was read. It was moved and passed that this request be laid on the table.

EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE

Dr. Kinsler reported for the Educational Committee that there were requests for rehabilitation money from the Academies connected with the Station amounting to some \$176,000. Miss Hartness reported on Pierson's new constitution. She stated that Government regulations allow for only six members on the Board, and that the present proportion of four Koreans to two missionaries could easily be changed.

MEDICAL COMMITTEE

Mrs. Adams reporting for the Medical Committee, pointed out that the Station has done very little to help Severance in the matter of personnel. It was unanimously voted to ask Dr. Adams to write to the Board to enquire what action was being taken to procure the doctors and nurses for Severance which have been on the Station asking list for the past several years.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

The property committee recommended that when there is enough money a gravel path should be put around the compound.

There was a request for the reimbursement of ₩30,000 which has been given to get one of the servants out of one of the servants' quarters, to be paid out of the Seoul Residence Rehabilitation fund. It was moved and passed to approve payment of this ₩30,000, and to ask the property committee to collect those amounts which are owing from former employers to reduce this amount. It was then moved and passed that in the future these matters be the responsibility of the individual concerned.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE

Mrs. DeCamp reported for the Hospitality Committee that there would be no raise in Board rates before the first of December. It was moved and passed that the Board rate be \$2.00 a day for members of the Mission and \$2.50 for non-members.

KAVA

Mr. Wenrich reported that the KAVA food order would be delivered to the warehouse on 12 October. For the information of the station

he also reported that 50% of the cost was for handling and 20% for duty.

SOCIAL WELFARE

The Station was informed that a request from a school for a sewing machine had been turned down.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

Dr. Kinsler reported that the Executive Committee had approved the money for No Chun Hyung (노 전 형).

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE

It was moved and passed to refer the apportionment of the itineration funds to the Evangelistic and Transportation Committees.

It was suggested that only those who had licences be allowed to drive the Mission vehicles.

The Station was reminded that only the chauffeurs were allowed to drive the big trucks.

It was recommended that the Transportation Committee make clear those who were allowed to drive the various types of Mission vehicles.

The meeting was adjourned for supper with a prayer by Dr. Kinsler, to reconvene at 7:30.

Supper was interrupted by the presentation of a request from the directors of the Presbyterian Theological Night Seminary that Mr. Voelkel consent to be their President. It was moved and passed that, in view of the fact that Mr. Voelkel has a full assignment of work, we inform the Presbyterian Theological Night Seminary that we are not in a position to consent to his accepting such an additional responsibility.

The meeting reconvened at 7:45 with the singing of hymn 107, "I'm found a friend". The Chairman read Luke 18: 18-30.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Dr. Kinsler reported for the information of the Station that the Mission had no money for new projects. He also said that the missionaries were not doing the country evangelism which the Korean Church had hoped they would do. Soongsil University, which is now in operation, has in a request for directors and missionary personnel. A new food order should be in by the end of October, and that a Montgomery Ward Order would be made up in the near future. Dr. Kinsler also reminded the members of the Station that any requests for the time of individual missionaries from institutions had to be cleared through the Station.

PIERSON REPORT

Miss Hartness reported that the doctor below her house has suggested that he would like to build a house to our specifications and by our contractors on a piece of ground he owns near Pierson to be exchanged for the house and ground now the Principal's house. It was suggested that the lawyer check on the difficulties of transferring the property.

Mr. DeCamp, Seoul Station representative on the Audio-visual Committee, announced that there is a great deal of equipment, such as slide projectors, slides and filmstrips, flannelgraph, public address systems, which is little used and is therefore available for country work. He also mentioned that the Readers Service books were at his house.

The question of assignment of work for Ben Sheldon was raised.

It was moved and passed to refer the matter to the Evangelistic Committee.

PROPERTY AND HOSPITALITY JOINT COMMITTEES reported the following recommendations.

It was recommended that the Station vote to approve a loan up to \$300.00 from the Seoul Residences Rehabilitation fund to fix up the downstairs of No. 3 house and then apply to the Executive Committee at their January meeting to repay the loan. Passed.

It was recommended that the Station offer the big room downstairs to the Noels with the proviso that they provide their own furniture. It was moved and passed to refer this matter to the Hospitality Committee with power.

It was recommended that Sam Moffett be offered his choice of the upstairs or downstairs apartments, and the dentist Dr. McInnis be assigned the other. Passed.

Er. Kinsler, Community Church pastor, suggested that the different Missions meet once a month at a Union Prayer meeting. The Station approved the suggestion.

Mr. Sheldon read a request for one million whan to buy a farm for the hostel at No Riang Jin (노량진). It was moved and passed that we answer that we regret we do not have funds for such a worthy project.

Dr. Clark adjourned the meeting with prayer.

14 November, 1955.

The twenty-third regular meeting of Seoul Station was held at the home of Mr. & Mrs. Voelkel at 4:45 on November 14, 1955. Those present were: Dr. & Mrs. Adams, Mr. & Mrs. DeCamp, Miss Hartness, Mr. & Mrs. Voelkel, Dr. & Mrs. Clark, Mr. & Mrs. Spenser, Mr. & Mrs. Forman, Mr. Sheldon, Mr. & Mrs. Kinsler, Dr. Van Lierop, Miss Delmarter, Miss Kraege, Miss Voelkel, Mr. Urquhart and Mr. & Mrs. Underwood.

Mr. Sheldon opened the meeting by reading II Corinthians Chapter six and Dr. Adams led in prayer. A letter about theft insurance premiums and another about the 1955 budget accounts from Mr. Wenrick were read. The Station was reminded that the Montgomery Ward order, which should be ready by 15 January, should be made up for the station as a unit.

The minutes were read and approved.

EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE

Dr. Kinsler reported for the Educational Committee. A request for a teacher for Kyungsin was presented to the Station. It was moved and passed that Seoul Station permit Mr. Sheldon to teach up to two hours a week on Saturday morning at Kyungsin .

MEDICAL COMMITTEE

Mrs. Adams stated that the Medical committee was preparing a list of medicines and simple treatments which the missionaries themselves could use. This list would first be sent to Dr. Scott for his approval. Dr. Adams reported on the answer received from Dr. Smith with regard to the doctors and nurses requested for Severance. Dr. Smith wrote that the Board had been looking for someone, but had had few applications.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

The Station discussed the matter of insulating the attics of the Mission houses. The matter was laid on the table for the present.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE

Mrs. DeCamp reported that there would be a joint tea for the Moderator, Dr. Wright, to be given by the members of the Station and the members of the Korean General Assembly, at the Seminary Chapel, on November 29. The Station would have a Station reception on the evening of November 28th, at 7:30. Miss Kraege suggested that a servants party be planned for sometime before Christmas. It was moved and passed that this matter of the Servants party be referred to the hospitality committee with power, and that Miss Kraege be asked to help with the arrangements. The motion to have a Station Thanksgiving dinner failed.

SOCIAL WELFARE

Mrs. Clark reporting for the Social Welfare Committee asked Seoul Station to request the following funds from the Executive Committee.

1. \$900.00 for repairing The Soosack (수색) Widow's Home. Passed.
2. \$200.00 for emergency food needs; to give kimchi money to about 40 of the neediest families. Passed.
3. \$180 for rent of a house for Tong Won (동원) Widows' Home. Passed.

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE

The transportation committee reported that the mileage for the second and third quarters of 1955 had not exceeded the allocations and that therefore all claims could be met in full.

Mrs. DeCamp requested that when a person was referred to the Charity Fund for medical assistance that they be given a note to certify their eligibility for such assistance.

The meeting was adjourned to reconvene after supper. Mr. Van Lierop led in prayer.

The meeting reconvened at 7:40. After the singing of the hymn, "Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah", Mr. DeCamp led devotions by reading Psalm 86.

EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE

Dr. Clark, reporting for the Evangelistic Committee, recommended that 1. Mr. Forman be asked to give four days a week, between the present term of language school and the Spring term, to country evangelism, concentrating on the South district. After discussion which made it clear that Mr. Forman's main assignment was still language study this motion was passed. and 2. Mr. Sheldon be assigned to the Kimpo district.

It was moved and passed that these two men carry on their work in these districts in consultation with Miss Hartness.

YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK

Mr. Sheldon reported on the visits of Mr. Stacy Woods and Mr. Cho Fan who were in Korea to visit the Young People's Work. Mr. Sheldon reported that current denominational and organizational rivalries have disturbed Student Christian work, with the result that the Korean National Christian Council has refused to recognize any particular group although it holds itself ready to coordinate and encourage young people's work. Mr. Sheldon indicated that at the present time Church centered rather than school-~~or~~organization-centered work seemed to offer the most promise.

PIERSON BOARD REPORT

Miss Hartness reported that at a called meeting of the Pierson Board, at which all ten members were present, a secret poll was taken to see who could be considered for the position of Principal. ^{신 의경} Harold Voelkel and Allen Clark were suggested if they were available.

Dr. Adams, referring to a letter from Dr. Smith, indicated that the "Women's Project" for 1956 might be Korea. He asked the Station to suggest appropriate projects. He said that Dr. Smith had made specific reference to a science building for Chungsin, and a nurses home for Severance.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Dr. Kinsler.

EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE

Mr. Kinsler reported for the Educational Committee. He said that a formal request for \$80,000.00 for a science building had been received from the Board of Chungsin Girls School. It was moved and passed that the Station representatives on the Executive Committee and on the local level Hyup Wi Hoe (협위회) be instructed that the Station considers that a Presbyterian Women's University is a more suitable project, but if this is unacceptable to the Board the station recommends the science building for Chungsin Girls School.

It was suggested that the Station should consider the question of a principal for Pierson Memorial Bible Institute. Miss Hartness reported that the Pierson Board wishes a missionary as principal, and that there was a strong request for Dr. Allen Clark to act as principal for one year. Miss Hartness also reported that the city is planning to build a road between Pierson and the athletic field so that the plan to exchange the principal's house for one built on land adjacent to Pierson, brought up in the October Station Meeting, would no longer be desirable. It was moved and passed that the request for Dr. Clark to act as principal of Pierson be referred to a combined Evangelistic and Educational Committee.

Miss Delmarter wished her vote for Chungsin recorded.

MEDICAL COMMITTEE

Mrs. DeCamp reported that the list of drugs mentioned in the November meeting was going around to the various houses.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE

Mrs. DeCamp reporting for the Hospitality Committee said that that committee recommended that the Station Board rates remain the same. It was announced that the servants party would be on Saturday, 17 December at 7 p.m.

SOCIAL WELFARE COMMITTEE

Mrs. Kinsler reported the following requests from the Social Welfare Committee:

1. \$200.00 for finishing the building of the An Hoong Ne (안홍내) orphanage, 27 orphans under Chaplain Kang. Passed.
2. \$500.00 for a field for rice or vegetables for the same orphanage. Passed.
3. that the above \$500.00 be made available for the purchase of the land on which the An Hoong Ne Orphanage stands, ownership to be in the name of the Mission or General Assembly, if the funds promised by a U.S. Army Unit for the purchase of the land are not forthcoming by December 30, 1955. Passed.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

It was moved and seconded that a rental of \$10 a month be asked from It. & Mrs. Noel. Passed.

EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE

It was reported that a request had come from Taiwan for help for the school fees of pastors' sons.

The meeting was adjourned to reconvene after supper. Mrs. Kinsler led in prayer.

The meeting reconvened at 8:10. After the singing of one verse of the hymn "When ^{We Walk} with the Lord", Mrs. Forman led devotions by reading Proverbs 15 the first six verses, and Matthew 5: 43-48. Dr. Moffett led in prayer.

It was moved and passed to request the Executive Committee that the Mission Treasurer's duties include the meeting of incoming missionaries.

YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK

Last year money for a Young People's Worker was appropriated for one year. The year is now up. It was moved and passed that we request from the Executive Committee the sum of \$720.00 or HW360,000 for a Young People's Worker.

It was moved and passed that this and similar items be put on a list of such items to be considered for permanent inclusion on the budget.

JOINT EVANGELISTIC AND EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE

It was moved and passed to go on record as being in favor of allowing Dr. Clark to serve for one year as principal of Pierson Memorial Bible Institute if asked by the Board of Pierson, provided he gives up his Seminary teaching and cuts down as much as possible on his language school responsibilities, provided also that permission is given by the Executive Committee.

It was moved and passed that the Station Forward Evangelism fund be handled in future by the Evangelistic Committee.

It was moved and passed that the million fifty thousand hwan formerly assigned to the Central Church at Wonju be redistributed as follows: 250 thousand (중앙), 400 thousand (재일), 100 thousand (해글), 300 thousand (효재).

The chairman welcomed Dr. Sam Moffett. Mr. Underwood read a report on the Chosun Christian University which was accepted. It was moved that the next meeting of Seoul Station be at 4:30 at the home of Mr. & Mrs. Sheldon on January 9, 1956.

Mr. & Mrs. Clark asked for permission to be absent from the station for over Christmas.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Mr. Clark.

Mr. Sheldon opened the meeting by reading from the twelfth chapter of Romans, and Dr. McInnes led in prayer.

Mrs. Clark reported that there was little relief in the warehouse. The Mission Treasurer reported that C.W.S. insisted that the station relief needs be sent to C.W.S. to be handled. The people were to be sent to them to avoid duplication. It was moved and passed that a committee be appointed to go to talk to Mr. Claypool and bring back an answer to the Station. It was moved and passed that the chairman appoint this committee and report back after supper.

Dr. McInnes reported on the work at Severance. He said that his assignment was to help with the dental education at Severance and to be available to help with the dental education at the Seoul National University Dental School. He reported that he saw no reason why the Dental Department at Severance could not be of top grade. The real problems were those of equipment, water and heat. He said that he was available for check overs on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 10 - 12.

LANGUAGE COMMITTEE

It was moved and passed that members of the station be permitted to teach in the Language School during the winter term, and that the Station Language Students be allowed to attend under the direction of the Station Language Committee.

Mr. Wenrich wished to have reported to him the balances of Secretarial money. It was moved and passed that the Secretarial

money be referred to the Evangelistic Committee for apportionment with Mr. Underwood in mind.

The meeting was adjourned to the home of Mr. & Mrs. Forman for supper, to reconvene at 7:30. The chairman led in prayer.

The meeting reconvened at 7:50. After the singing of "O Master, let me walk with Thee", Mr. Underwood led devotions by reading from I Corinthians chapters 11, 12, and 13. The hymn "O Love Divine All Loves Excelling" was then sung and Mr. Forman led in prayer.

The chairman welcomed Dr. Joyce and Dr. Little to the Station.

EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE

Dr. Clark reported that the committee had apportioned the Secretarial money as last year with the substitution of Mr. Underwood's name for that of Mrs. Clark. The station approved the report.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

The Property Committee recommended that Mrs. McInnes be placed on the Board of Directors of the Guest House at Severance. It was moved and passed to accept the recommendation. After the explanation by the Field Representative that this member should be able to speak Korean, and wrestle with contractors, Mrs. McInnes resigned and Mr. Underwood was substituted for her.

The chairman reported on the procedure for protesting Executive Committee actions. He said that there was no provision made for protests of actions as such, but he had found this material relating to Executive Committee appointments of substitutes to fill committee vacancies. "..... If the Committee finds that a missionary appointed to work outside his own Station is unable to fulfil the appointment, it shall have power to appoint a substitute. It shall have power to fill ad interim vacancies caused by death, resignation or health absences. But in the case a protest is filed by the Station or Stations concerned, this action shall be reconsidered by the Executive Committee together with all communications from the objecting Stations, and the final action shall be with power until the following Annual Meeting of the Mission."

The Mission Treasurer informed the Station that money would only be paid out in the morning, and that all \$ cheques were to be handed to him personally and not to any Korean in the office. He also reported that any balances in the Secretarial and transportation accounts were to be transferred to the Vehicle maintenance account. He reported that the hymn books would be \$1.65 each. It was moved and passed that the hymnbooks be ordered.

The Chairman designated Mrs. Clark, Mrs. Forman and Mr. Wenrich to go to talk to Mr. Claypool. The Name of Dr. Adams was added to this Committee, by his own request, to look into the matter of C.W.S.

The Field Secretary reported that any station could protest an action of the Executive Committee.

Personal reports were read by Mrs. Clark, Mr. DeCamp, Mrs. Forman, and a report of Pierson was read by Miss Hartness. The meeting was adjourned to meet February 13, at 4:45 at the home of Mrs. DeCamp, supper to be at the Ladies' at 6:00. Mr. Voelkel closed with prayer.

The meeting reconvened at 7:30. After the singing of the hymn "For the Beauty of the Earth", Mrs. Underwood led devotions using the Beatitudes. Mr. Underwood led in prayer.

SOCIAL WELFARE COMMITTEE

Mrs. Clark reported on the visit to Mr. Claypool. She said that the amount of goods arriving for C.W.S. was now only 80% of what it had been. They were expecting grain and food in the near future and Seoul Station would get its share. Seoul Station would also get six bales of clothes. PROPERTY COMMITTEE

He then reported on the five year programme on housing for Seoul Station. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

It was moved and passed that the Field Secretary be asked to place on the docket of Annual Meeting the question of the relative degree of support for the various Mission related Institutions.

It was moved and passed that the Executive Committee be requested to take up the problem of institutional representation on the various levels of church and Mission conferences, including the problem of the appropriate level of representation for various types of institutions.

It was moved and passed to ask the Station Publicity to make Miss Hartness' personal report available to the members of the Station.

Dr. Adams closed the meeting with prayer.

12 March, 1956

The twenty-seventh regular meeting of Seoul Station was held at the Ladies' home at 5 p.m. on March 12, 1956. Those present were: Dr. & Mrs. Adams, Mr. & Mrs. Clark, Mr. & Mrs. DeCamp, Miss Delmarter, Mr. & Mrs. Foreman, Miss Hartness, Miss Kraege, Mr. & Mrs. Kinsler, Dr. & Mrs. McInnes, Miss Swallen, Mr. Urquhart, Mr. Voelkel, Mr. Wenrich, and Mr. & Mrs. Underwood.

The Chairman opened the meeting with devotional readings and Mr. Voelkel prayed.

The minutes were read and after correction approved.

CORRESPONDENCE

Two letters were read. It was moved and passed to refer the letter from Chungsin Girls' School to the Educational Committee. It was moved and passed to refer the letter of Mr. Sheldon's Servant to a Committee of the whole as the second item of business after supper.

MEDICAL COMMITTEE

Mrs. Adams, reporting, read a letter from Miss Bourne giving the dates of the National Nursing Examinations and those for entrance to Severance. It was moved and passed to refer Miss Bourne's request for a member to serve on a Board for the Severance Nurses' Training School to the Executive Committee, meanwhile sending someone as an observer to sit in on the meeting called for Wednesday, March 21st. Mrs. Adams was asked to be the observer. Miss Bourne's request for a representative to serve on a joint committee to assess the minimum needs to repair the Nurses' home on Severance and to report to Drs. Kim and Lee was referred to the Property Committee.

Mrs. DeCamp announced that Dr. Wright would begin giving physical examinations each Saturday morning beginning March 17.

Dr. McInnes reported on the Dental Department at Severance. He said that though the techniques were somewhat old-fashioned he hoped to bring them up to date. He requested that any young Korean Christian dentists who might be interested be sent to Severance for training.

Mr. Wenrich asked that the members of the station pay their medical bills at the time of treatment and then present him with a voucher for reimbursement. Moved and passed that the Medical Committee take up with Severance Hospital the question of appropriate fees for medical services to all missionaries.

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Foreman showed some pictures as his personal report.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

It was moved and passed that the property committee discuss and study with Severance and the Methodist Mission the renovation of the duplex on Severance. It was moved and passed that Mr. Wenrich act for the property committee in initiating the above discussion.

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- 2. It was moved and passed to make a duplex out of the former Kerr house.
- 3. It was moved and passed that the Southern Presbyterians be allowed the use of half the duplex on thirty days notice and for a rent of \$100.00 per month.
- 4. It was moved and passed that Seoul Station request \$1000 from contingent and rehabilitation funds toward the expenses of making the former Kerr House into a duplex.

In answer to the questions raised by the Field Secretary in a letter to Seoul Station Property Committee, the Station decided to hold on to the property at Yang Pyung, site of the former Winn residence. The Station also decided to hold on to the title of the land under the following church buildings 양곡, 승동 + 연동 until such time as the Presbytery has a holding body.

Mr. Wenrich requested each member of the station to draw rough plans of their houses for the Board.

Seoul Station took a recess for ten minutes.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE

Mrs. DeCamp reporting for the hospitality committee, recommended the following changes in board rates: Members of the Mission \$2.25, members of other missions \$2.75. It was moved and passed to empower the Hospitality Committee to plan a farewell for Miss Hartness.

SOCIAL WELFARE

Mrs. Clark read the following requests from the Social Welfare Committee.

- 1. Request the Executive Committee buy twenty pedal sewing machines for use as needed by the widows homes. ^{and to add to that whatever the other stations might need.} Passed.
- 2. Request \$800.00 for repairing the roof of the Hae Bang (해방) Widows' Home. Passed.
- 3. Request the Executive Committee to request C.W.S. to obtain a consignment of Share our Surplus foods for the Mission. Passed.

Mr. Foreman announced that the Proxy Adoption program was progressing, and that the Agencies were looking for mixed blood children as there's plenty of people willing to adopt.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The Education Committee requested that members of the Station, when accepting invitations to teach, coordinate their efforts through the Education Committee in order to keep a proper balance among the institutions in which we are interested.

The Committee also requested the Board Members of Chungsin to inform the school that Seoul Station regretted that there was not Bible teacher available to replace Mrs. Voelkel, and no additional English teacher.

They also recommended that Seoul Station request the Executive Committee to reiterate the request to the Board for an appropriation for the Chungsin Science Hall from the Women's Work Project for 1956.

It was moved and passed by consent that Seoul Station ask the Station Chairman to appoint someone to find possible English teachers outside the Mission and encourage them to teach in Mission connected schools.

MEMORIAL MINUTE FOR DR. OLIVER R. AVISON

Seoul Station of the Korea Mission of the Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. notes with sorrow the passing of Dr. Oliver R. Avison on August 28, 1956 in St. Petersburg, Florida in his 97th year.

A member of Seoul Station for forty-two years, from his arrival in Korea in 1893 to his final return to America in 1935, he has a permanent place in the work of the Station, the history of the Mission and the hearts of those who knew him. Although not the first medical missionary, his administrative skill and teaching ability soon made him the leader in what was to become Severance Union Medical College and Hospital. In 1900, while on furlough, he spoke so fervently concerning the need for union medical work in Korea that Mr. L.H. Severance of Cleveland, Ohio, who happened to be in the audience, came up to Dr. Avison to ask what could be done in the way of a small memorial project. Dr. Avison pulled from his pocket complete plans for a hospital building. This was typical of his careful preparation for his work and demonstrated his interest in all kinds of details.

Under his guidance the school and hospital became known not only in Korea, but throughout the Far East both for the fine quality of medical service and the depth of Christian witness.

In 1916 he assumed the additional burden of the Presidency of the Chosun Christian College, built the first buildings on the present campus, and led it through the days of its early development and growth.

Seoul Station takes pride in Dr. Avison's long contribution to the work of our Lord Jesus Christ in the Seoul area, and each member prays that we in our turn may do as much for Him in this land.

2. Recommend that the Evangelistic Committee review and report on the secretarial money, and if available that the money formerly used by Mr. DeCamp be made available to Mr. Van Lierop. Passed.
3. The Committee reports a trend in the churches to go on their own in starting new churches without consulting with the Presbytery's evangelistic committee; the local church's offering for evangelism no longer goes in general to the committee on evangelism of the Presbytery. The committee felt that this should be known to the Station for its prayerful consideration and help. That specific cases should be reported to the chairman on Evangelism of the Presbytery.

EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE

Personal reports were made by Mr. Forman, Dr. Voelkel, Mr. Sheldon, Miss Delmarter, Dr. Kinsler, Mrs. McInnes, and Dr. McInnes.

Principles to be observed in the development of the Ecumenical Relationship
between the Mission and the Church

1. The principle that self-government and self-support and self-propagation are essential to the spiritual vitality and integrity of the Christian Church. The Korean Presbyterian Church has grown from the beginning on the principle that it should maintain its own financial strength and independence. This growth has been preserved by the careful limiting of funds from abroad to specific mission projects of a missionary nature and with which missionaries have been associated.
2. The principle that a Christian Church must support financially its own governing body with its own officers, offices, and activities. The Korean Presbyterian Church must support its own General Assembly, its officers, offices, and activities to remain a spiritual vital and independent Church organism. To make available funds from abroad to support the judicatories of the Korean Presbyterian Church would weaken the concept of a truly self-governing, self-supporting, self-propagating Church in the minds of the members of this Church and would be a step backward in the history of the development of true Ecumenical Mission in the Korean Presbyterian Church.
3. The principle that funds from abroad must be administered in such a way as not to jeopardize the natural effort and growth through giving of the receiving church and so as not to create situations of temptation for the use of funds in a way different from the purpose for which they are given.
4. The principle that personnel and funds given by one Christian Church to another are essentially a single expression of ecumenical fellowship and much of this expression is lost if they are separated. Such a separation of funds and personnel would rob the funds of their special significance as ecumenical sharing, and would reduce the significance of the personnel in its service in the sister Church.
5. The principle that the highest expression of ecumenical fellowship is achieved between sister Churches by the representatives of the receiving Church and the giving Church meeting together in conference as representatives of the two churches involved. We do not believe that this degree of ecumenical fellowship can be realized merely through individual fraternal workers working at individual jobs in the Church, or through separate disbursements of money given to the Church organization.

1. \$500.00 for 안흥니 orphanage for the purchase of a rice field.
2. \$1,000.00 for the 해방 Church to build a room for which they already have some materials.
3. \$3,000.00 to build rooms for a group of widows who are at present housed in tents and scattered over a wide area. (동성)

The matter of a widow with six children, a member of the Yondong Church was referred to the Social Welfare Committee.

It was voted to discuss Church-Mission Relations. It was voted that Seoul Station believes that there should be a recognized organization of missionaries (under whatever title) who can express a collective opinion to the Korean Church and to the U.S.A. Church, through constituted channels, on matters affecting the work of the Church in Korea.

The meeting was adjourned for supper with prayer by Dr. H. Moffett, to reconvene at 7:40.

The meeting reconvened at the home of Mrs. Adams at 8 p.m. Devotions were led by Dr. Mekeel, who gave us a meditation on the similarity of the trials and temptations daily met by Christ to those daily met by us. We closed with a prayer.

Personal reports were then made.

In answer to Dr. Scott's request through Dr. Moffett that Dr. Moffett go to Taegu at least a month before Dr. Scott goes on furlough it was voted that in as much as Dr. Moffett was assigned to Seoul Station by the Mission for language study he remain in Seoul until the completion of the Spring term of Language School in June.

It was voted to approve Mrs. Adam's request to be absent from the country late in March and early in April

It was voted to approve Mr. Forman's request to be allowed to make the Christian news broadcast for HLKY, in as much as the doctor has curtailed his itinerating for medical reasons.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Dr. S. Moffett.

It was voted to accept the report with thanks.

G.I. COMMITTEE

Arising out of the discussion on work with the G.I.'s Miss

She mentioned that we as a Station are doing very little to back up the efforts of the W.C.T.U. and wished discussion as to what we could do to help the Church eradicate some of the social evils which are so prevalent.

The meeting reconvened at 7:55. Mrs. Moser led the devotions. She read four verses from Luke, and then Matthey 28: 16-20, and talked on the American Church, mentioning that Christ had entrusted the commission of his Church in our frail hands. She closed with prayer.

The chairman welcomed Dr. & Mrs. Calvitt Clarke, Dr. Mills, and Mr. & Mrs. Nash of the Christian Children's Fund. Dr. Clarke addressed the meeting for a few minutes. Dr. & Mrs. Adams spoke of their recent trip to Hong Kong. Miss Ogg was introduced.

MEDICAL REPORT

CHURCH-MISSION RELATIONSHIPS

Basis for discussion in the Church-Mission Conference

On the basis of the action taken at the last Annual Meeting and the possible changes in Church-Mission relations presented by the Executive Committee to the Stations and the Stations' reactions to them we now recommend for approval by the Stations the following additional steps for the integration of missionary work into the Korean Church. These steps, if generally approved, will become the basis for further discussion on this problem between the Mission and the Korean Church representatives.

1. The Mission shall cease to function as an administrative body for Church work, and its nature and name will be changed into a Missionary Fellowship.
(Suggested date, August 1, 1959)
2. The Church-related work of the Mission shall be integrated into the Korean Church through the Church-missionary representatives' Conferences on the Station and Mission levels.
3. The Missionary Fellowship shall be maintained for the following purposes:
 - (1) The Maintenance of Spiritual Fellowship.
 - (2) 1st Alternative
The discussion and formulation of opinions and views on the place and work and aims of the ~~members of the Missionary Fellowship in the~~ Ecumenical Mission, and expression of these views through its representatives on the Church-Mission Conferences, & when desirable, to the Church here and at home. It is understood that this does not reserve any administrative or veto power over the Church-Mission Conferences.
 - 2nd Alternative
It shall meet to consider matters related to the ~~service of members of the missionary fellowship in the~~ broadening fields of ecumenical service. It shall have no administrative functions beyond matters specifically delegated to it, and the expression of the views of this body, either through its representatives on the Church-Mission Conferences or directly to the Korean Presbyterian Church or the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. or Board shall be for information only and shall have no binding authority.
 - (3) The selection of the representatives of the Missionary Fellowship on the Church-Mission Conferences and other bodies.
 - (4) The conduct of all purely missionary-related business, such as: juridical person, missionaries' living, medical care, language study, orientation, and the like.
 - (5) (Other functions as developed in the working out of the plan.)
 - (6) It is understood that if the above steps are approved a revision and enlargement of the present Church-Mission Conference constitutions will be in order. It is also understood that a new Constitution and By-Laws shall be prepared for the Missionary Fellowship.

The meeting was recessed until 7:30. Mr. Wenrich closed with prayer.

4. To bring greater help to the newer missionaries, the Guidance Committee should have monthly discussions with them, as a group, to ascertain their accomplishments so far and discover lacks or needs or problems, and pitfalls.

2. Proposed Agreement between Mission and Institution on Missionary Housing on land owned by the Institution.

a. The money for construction to be supplied by the Mission.

b. The house is to be registered in the Juridical Person of the Institution.

c. The repairs on the house, while used by the Mission, to be chargeable to the Mission.

d. The style of construction to be decided in consultation with the institution.

e. During the furlough of the missionary occupant the house shall be released to the institution if not needed by the Mission.

3. Recommend each householder be responsible for keeping roadsides and slopes neat around their homes.

EVANGELISTIC COMMITTEE

Dr. van Hierop reported for the Evangelistic Committee. It was voted to send the following recommendations to the Church-Mission Conference for further discussion: Recommended:

1. That Rev. E. J. Foreman, Jr. devote not more than one third of his time for one year's trial to Yang Won Presbytery. It being understood that the other two thirds be given to evangelism in country itineration in Kyungki Presbytery and this to be his only other assignment.

2. That he remain a member of Kwangki Presbytery. That his main work in Yang Won shall consist of itineration, and to help form a short term Bible Institute for which we request Bible Institute funds.

3. That it is premature to consider any change in the present organization of Mission-Station Presbytery Conference.

5. The Station and Mission is recommended that if and when the missionary work in Yang Won provinces developed, further consideration will need to be given to providing more assistance in personal time, and in financial support for the kind of church work in which the missionaries share in other places.

It was voted to send the above five recommendations on Mr. Foreman's assignment to Yang Won Presbytery to the Mission Evangelistic Committee with this added recommendation that Mr. Foreman be granted an itineration budget for Yang Won Presbytery to be provided from Mission appropriation.

With regard to the distribution of tents, it was voted:

1. That first consideration be given to churches that have not already received one.

2. That the tents be limited to Kyungki and Yang Won provinces with a few exceptions for Chungnam provinces.

3. That tents be given only to forward evangelism churches recognized by the District superintendent and that the request be made in written form by him to the Evangelistic Committee.

It was voted to extend the privilege of the floor to Rev. James Alter, missionary from India.

The meeting was adjourned for supper with prayer by Mr. Alter.

The meeting reconvened at 7:50.

After singing the first verse of several hymns Dr. Voelkel led in prayer and then gave a devotional talk based on the third chapter of Luke. Prayers were then made for the missionaries in Seoul and Tripoli.

The special committee reported on their suggested solution in regard to Sung Eui Girls school;

1. That the annual grant to the nine Middle-High Schools for two years, and a special grant of a like sum requested from the Mission Board in New York, be combined in a special fund to repay the school construction debt.
2. That the Church-Mission Conference make these efforts if the total debt after the payment of this special grant does not exceed Hw10,000,000. (This does not include installment payments on the present school site).
3. That the Church-Mission Conference instruct the Board of Directors to establish a Finance Committee, with an appropriate number of members, which shall exercise direct control of all financial matters of the school.
4. That, when the special grant is made, persons appointed by the Church-Mission Conference in consultation with the school authorities, shall directly pay off the debts.
5. That, if the school moves from Seoul, the school building and grounds be disposed of without repayment as directed by the Church-Mission Conference for similar type work.

(Yu, Ho Jun, Sim Ch'on, Horace G, Underwood)

There were two new actions:

1. To request Church-Mission Conference to make appropriate agreements with each of the refugee school covering the dispositions of the school building and property in the event of the school's return to North Korea .

1. PRESBYTERY REPRESENTATION: The matter of the composition of this Seoul area Joint Planning Committee, in the light of the new Han Nam Presbytery, was discussed. It was voted that for the present the representation on this committee should be as follows: Kyungki Presbytery 4, Han Nam Presbytery 2. It was further voted that for the present meeting the two members from Han Nam Presbytery, Pastors Lee and Kang, be recognized as official members of this committee.
2. ELECTION OF OFFICERS: The following officers were elected: Chairman - Han, Kyung Chik; Korean Secretary - Lee, Ki Hyuk; English Secretary - E. Otto DeCamp.
3. RELIEF REQUESTS: A request from the Social Welfare Committee of Kyungki Presbytery was read and discussed. Three million hwan was requested for aid in a housing project for widows. It was finally voted to request the Church-Mission Joint Work Committee to appropriate from relief funds the sum of 3,000,000 hwan to be used this winter for widows' emergency food and housing needs. This sum, if granted, will be administered by a sub-committee composed of Dr. Kinsler, Pastor Chun, and Pastor Lee (with Mrs. Kinsler and Eldar Chang suggested as consultants).
4. PIONEER EVANGELISM FUND: It was voted to divide the 1959 Pioneer Evangelism fund for this area 50-50 between Kyungki and Han Nam Presbyteries.
5. FUND FOR EDUCATION OF COUNTRY LEADERS' CHILDREN: It was voted to allow all of this fund (about \$140) this year to be used in Kang Won Presbytery to aid in the education of the children of country church leaders. This fund to be dispensed through K. J. Foreman.
6. TONG SUH MOON CHURCH REQUEST: It was voted to reply to the request for 1,000,000 hwan to help the Tong Suh Moon Church in Seoul (plus a similar request from Anyang) that we have no funds from which such help can come.
7. HAN NAM PRESBYTERY REQUESTS: The following actions were taken:
 - A. Request for one missionary to assist in the Yung Dong Po Bible Institute was referred to the Station Evangelistic Committee.
 - B. Request for \$1,000. to aid this Bible Institute in Yung Dong Po was refused.
 - C. Request for \$20,000. for the Un Kwang School referred to new Educational sub-committee.
8. EDUCATIONAL SUB-COMMITTEE: It was voted to appoint Elder Suh; Pastor Yu, Ho Joon; and Elder Horace Underwood as the new Educational sub-committee. Requests from the Ung Dam School in Paju Gun and the In Sung School in Incheon also referred (along with 7, C) to this committee.

9. SCHOLARSHIP FOR KIM, CHUNG SOON: At the suggestion of Dr. Kinsler it was voted to approve the request for a scholarship for Dean Kim Chung Soon of the Po Sung School. It is understood that this decision will be presented to the Church-Mission Joint Work Committee for their further consideration.

SHA 59-6-2 RULES FOR SOCIAL WORK ORGANIZATIONS. 4. It was voted to leave the statement on Aims (Article 1, Section 2, page 2) as it is with the insertion of "for study" after "for information" to read "for information, for study, for spiritual growth and fellowship."

Order of the Day

Property Committee

Mr. Crim and Mr. Wilson were guests.

The chairman, Mr. Robb, opened the meeting by reading John 1:1-14 and led in prayer.

The minutes were read and approved.

Telephone Committee

It was voted to amend the report of the telephone committee to read that the inter-com system be used after ten at night only in an emergency.

It was voted that "not to exceed \$350" be inserted after " for the actual cost".

It was voted to put "at the official rate (1960 - approximately 90,900)" in 1 B.

The following amended report was passed by the Station:

The Telephone Committee makes the following recommendations to Seoul Station:

1. It is recommended that the Station recommend to the Ad Interim Committee that the following policies be established regarding telephones of missionaries living in metropolitan areas.
 - A. That reimbursement for the actual cost not to exceed \$350.00 of the installation of new telephones in residences off the compounds be chargeable against the Upkeep of Mission Residences account:
 - B. That a policy be established that each missionary residence on or off the compound be supplied an individual line at the official rate (1960 - approximately 90,900hwan) at such time as lines become readily available.
 - C. It is recommended that the Station recommend to the Ad Interim Committee that for Seoul Station, the cost of local service for the station telephone be pro-rated among those living on the compound.
2. The following recommendations were made to Seoul Station:
 - A. It is recommended to Seoul Station that the use of the Station telephone be limited to residents and official business.
 - B. It is recommended to Seoul Station that the use of the station telephone by children be limited to five minutes for each call.
 - C. It is recommended to Seoul Station that the inter-communication system not be used during the Thursday evening prayer meeting or after ten o'clock at night except in emergencies.
 - D. It is recommended to Seoul Station that an accurate record be kept for long distance calls, showing date, time, place, duration and the individual making the call. Furthermore, each person will be responsible for recording this information.
 - E. It is recommended to Seoul Station that to more efficiently cover incoming calls on the station telephone, a call for volunteers be issued, the organization of the volunteer

answering service to be worked out by a person named by the chairman of Seoul Station.

It was voted to approve and recommend to the Commission Representative that permission be granted Mrs Voelkel to attend the East Asia Conference of the World Day of Prayer Movement.

Orientation Committee

The Orientation Committee made the following suggestions:

1. An Orientation Committee be elected in the fall along with other committees, for the purpose of introducing new missionaries, whether short or long term, to living and working conditions current on the field.
2. The committee would be responsible for getting in touch with a appointees as soon as word is received on the field, with information that would be helpful before arrival.
3. The committee would be responsible for meeting, as soon after a arrival as possible, with the new missionaries to help with practical matters of household requirements, transportation etc.
4. With the Hospitality Committee, the Orientation Committee would arrange for a reception for new missionaries at which time they could be introduced to the leaders of the Korean Church and institutions with which they are to be associated, as well as other members of the mission community.
5. For long range orientation to the field, the Committee would be responsible for setting up study sessions, on a bi-weekly or monthly basis, at which time members of the mission would present mission and mission-related work. In connection with the study sessions to tours to the physical plants of related institutions, and an opportunity to meet the Korean associates in each field is also recommended.
6. If the foregoing is the will of the Station the Committee suggests that Point 5 be implemented immediately.

The report of the Committee was accepted with the following amendment: That in line with the action taken at Mission Meeting the Orientation Committee make opportunity for new missionaries to visit the other Stations.

Church Station Conference

Mr. DeCamp reported on the Church Station Conference (Report is appended)

Property Committee

Dr. Clark reported for the Property Committee. Report filed.

It was voted to ask the Commission Representative to write to New York concerning the urgency of funds for purchasing a site for seminary housing, and related housing sites, and obtain the appropriate authorization of the request.

It was voted to re-refer to the Property Committee the whole question of the Yun Dong Church request for land for renegotiation and report back to the Station.

The meeting was redessed for supper, to meet at 7:30. Dr. Frei led in prayer.
