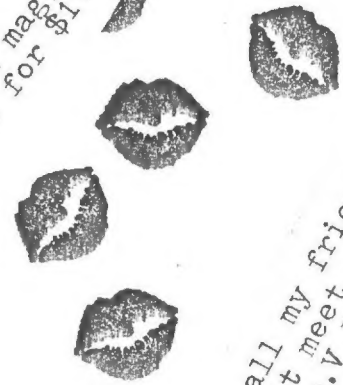

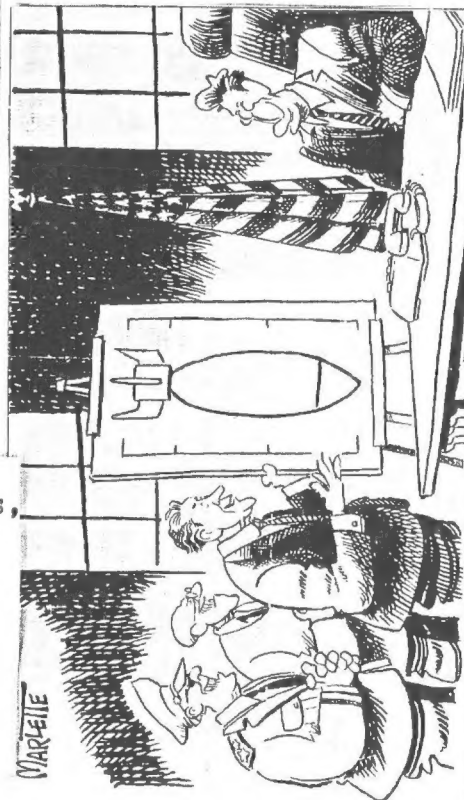

SP:How long has UNSEEN FORCE been together?

G:In this line up, a little over a year.

D:The band has been a band about 2 yrs., but w/Bob & Bobby 1.

S:June 1st.

SP:When are ya'll planning on your record coming out?

D:Soon! Two months, two & a half; maybe 3.

G:Hopfully 6 wks., it's being mastered up in N.Y. right now. Then it'll go to Texas to be pressed.

SP:How do you like the scene here as to Rich. maybe?

S:There are alot more kids!

G:Starz is a really weird place, we've never really played anywhere like it before.

BY:Yeah, it has a really weird sound.

D:The kids are alright, some people who live here might think it's fucked, but everyone seemed pretty nice.

SP:what about touring?

D:Well, as soon as our record is out and we have some reviews in like MRR, and maybe FLIPSIDE, we'll use that as a base to go on but we're setting it up right now. Probably in the fall.

SP:Where are you planning to go?

D:We're gonna go up north and work are way across to Cal., then back across, down through Arizona & Texas, up to Kansas city, just to get exposure & the name out.

S:We're putting our record out on our own label, "TERBULANT REC". We're hoping to get picked up by a major lable.

SP:Where do you get your roots from?

D: All over the place, man, just everywhere. It's like a big melting pot of music. Heavy metal, to H.C.; I used to listen to ZZ TOP, AND the ROLLING STONES, and that influenced me.

G: HA! Your out of the band!

D: Just alot of bands,

S: BROKEN BONES

G: It's hard to tell what comes out in our music, but alot of people say we sound like C.O.C., or DISCHARGE.

D: We try to be original; develop our own style.

S: WE're trying to break away from H.C., and trying to put a little more time & thought into our songs; be a little more melodic!

SP: Is there any particular reason for the name "UNSEEN FORCE"?

S: It's open for self-interpretation.

D: Yeah, it can mean different things to different people. The name came to us strangely, Greta and I were in PA. watching the weather, and the lady said "These are the unseen forces, controlling the weather." Wow! UNSEEN FORCE, cool name. To some of us it's like a force that controls everything, like god, if you believe in god, or jah, or budda.

G: It's not a religious name----

B: It's just UNSEEN FORCE!

SP: What do you think about violence in the scene?

S: As far as what we've seen, it's not really out of hand, but we haven't been around that much either! Rich. is pretty tame----

G: And Maleigh has a great scene!

S: Everyone goes to shows, and just has a good time.

BY: Not really heavy metal, but that stuff kinda breeds violence, like when MEGADEATH came to richmond, they were saying like, kill lybians and stuff like that.

D: I believe there are 2 kinds of people in the world, GOOD & BAD. It doesn't matter your color or anything, cool people will be cool, and assholes will be assholes.

S: Cool people can be assholes too, and assholes can be cool.

D: Every person is intitled to get aggressive from time to time, YOUR ONLY HUMAN! But there's people who go out and give other people shit all the time. People will always create violence, VIOLENCE BREADS VIOLENCE,---

G: WE can't make generalizations about this scene or that scene, because every scene has it's assholes, a whole scene can't be belamed!

D: Really you'll find it in all music scenes, The redneck scene, hippie scene, what ever, so next question.

SP: Well that's about it, anything final to say?

G: Our record will be out, and will be \$7.00, from us.

D: There's a lot of good RICH. bands, MILK, ALTERNATIVES.

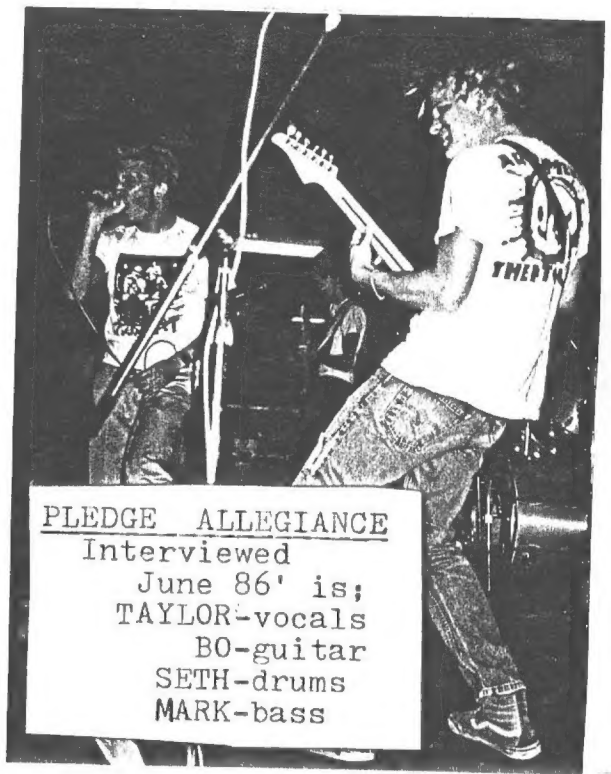
S: Some are coming out on SST records;

P:How long has PLEDGE ALLEGIANCE BEEN TOGETHER ?
P:Well, we used to be Y.F.A. but I guess that doesn't count, so about a year and a half.
P:Do ya'll have anything on tape or anything like that ?
P:We got a demo out, and we're hoping to get signed to a label, to pay for pressing and all that.
B:Yeah, we still don't know how much it's gonna cost, and we still haveto send it out.
P:What else do you have planned for the future ?
P:A record, LOTS OF WOMEN, no really a record, maybe a tour.
P:What like east coast or something ?
P:Yeah, maybe if we get a record out a large one, probably next summer.
B:We'll tour some where next summer, we're hoping to play Baltimore this summer, or New York, or some where like that.

SP:What do you think of the scene today ?
T:Well, it's got it's good points and bad points, it's got it's problem people who think they've got to be real "punk rock!" and who have to beat up everything.
B:It's got it's conflict; everyone's against someone else.
T:Fuck the system!
B:Everyone has their hair a certain way! No one wants to be themselves.
SP:What's your opinion on straight edge,etc.?
T:Well as a band we're not real straight edge ya know,we're into the positive thing and all that though. I'm straight, and have been for about 4 yrs., and nobody has any drug or alcohol problems in our band so.....
SP:Where do you get your influences from ?
T:Oh hell! We get influenced by everything; metal, hardcore, etc.

SP:How would you compare Richmond to V.B. ?

B:It's smaller, but in a way better (RICHMOND), there's no real conflict there. Down here, everyone seems to be in conflict, they all want to fight each other. You know, down here they get into it, and it's like "WOW!, Punk Rock ya know, tell mom to fuck off, kick the dog a couple of times.(CHUCKLES)

SP:Are all the members of the band original ?

B:Actually, Mark used to play guit.when it was Y.F.A.and I didn't play anything. Taylor played bass, this guy named George played drums, and um Ben Scott sang. Then mark went to collage, so I played guitar. Then Ben got a little faggy, so we kicked him out. Then we got mark to come back and play bass, and let Taylor

B:(con't)..sing, since he wasn't any good on bass.(laughter and a muttered F.U. from Taylor) Then we changed our name, and played our first show in Charlettesville, which has about 25 people in it's scene, and only about 10 of them showed up plus some from Richmond; Then George left.

T:I sing because I can't play bass!



SP:DOES your drummer talk ?

B:Yeah!

SP:What does your name stand for ??

S:Well it's just pledge allegiance to your friends, as the song says, not really to your country or anything.

B:To what you believe in.

S:Yeah!

B:I have a big dick!!!!

T:and I'll pledge allegiance to that!!!(laughter)

SP:closing comments ?!?!?!?!?!?!?

T:If you get anything in your nose, PICK IT!, cuz it can get backed up and go down your throught, then it will give ya a sore throught. I know.

S:And print all this, what ever it is.

SEAN WATSON:That was the drummer, he can talk, we found that out!!

RADICAL LEFT



SP: Who is everybody/?

S: My name is Sean, I play the drums, I'm 15.

K: Ken, I sing, I'm 14.

M: My names mike, I play the Bass & chello, and I'm 34 (15)

R: I'm Richard Fugar III, I'm the so call guitar player.

SP: How long has the band been together/?

K: About a year ago me and rich started to jam out, we were in a band called DAG NABIT. WE had a big black guy, Calvin playing bass for us. Then me, Mike, and Rich started jamming, and played one show without a drummer.

SP: How did you manage that/?

S: They had a guy doing beat box for them.

K: Then it was Oct. 85' and my mom drove me and Sean down to get this real shitty drum set. Ever since then we've been jamming out. We got a new set since then! (S: thank you!!!!)

M: We played from about late Nov. to about early march then we broke up, and have just gotten back together around mid June.

SP: Where doez the band plan to go from here/?

S: NO WHERE BUT UP!!!! Considering we've been down to our lowest at the Connection Hall show, and in connection to that show, what do you think, sounded like shit (YEAH! from everyone) O.K. thank you.

M: Ken's gonna move soon and we're getting a new singer, and we're probably gonna add a rythem guitarist.

S: We're gonna change the name to ken in memory of him.

M: Yeah, Ken and the Cruisers! Well he's just moving to Springfield VA. which is the same as being dead!

S: Actually we're just good friends.

SP: What do you think of the shows around here/?

K: The thing with the scene is, alot of people try real hard but there's always something to fuck things up. Like some people think they got this image where they gotta dance real tough to be a "PUNK ROCKER"!

S: I feel the thing with the scene around here, like Ken said, people have good intentions, but when you do something, and get out there and set something up, other people go and fuck it up, like what's going on with starz; the guy is trying to set stuff up, and people go and fuck it up. the scene around here has also changed, from like standard hardcore (way back when), to more of a metal influence. I don't have anything against metal, i just don't preferably like it, and I don't like the attitude of the "DIAL PUNKS" but that's what the whole scene's based on; go beat up people and shit like that

M: Yeah, I think more people are worried about the clothes they wear than what the music say's.

K: I've went out and set up shows before, and noone's ever came up to me thanx, not that I was looking for it, but it would be nice for someone to appricate the things I do.

R: Not just us , but anyband who's putting in some kind of effort at all deserves some kind of thanks. It's all a bunch of bullshit, all we do is work our asses off, and all we get is feedback. I'm sure that's how it's gonna be when you first start, with any band. But all we're trying to do is help, and everyone just critizes our ass.

K: Just like off the LONGRIDERS comercial, I love this quote, and I'm gonna quote 'em "You don't have to be the best musicians in the world, you just have to meen it." Cuz like when we first started out, Rich could't play leads, sean couldn't play rolls, Mike couldn't play bass, and I just learned



K:(con't)how to talk a few mouths ago. Thats one thing about our music, it's emotions that make it all come together. When I'm on stage, it's like I let everything out, I jump real high, etc.

S:Actually we're just good friends!

SP:What do your lyrics usually deal with/?

S:I believe they deal with masterbation, hot kinky sex, no actually I'M lying they basicly deal with emotiom, most bands now have gone political, Ronald Reagan sucks, I hate politics, nuck them mother fuckers. Peace, anarchy, which doesn't make any bit of sence,I'll figure it out someday.

M:they're usually social lyrics, cuz like Sean said alot of bands are polit-ical, which isn't gonna make any difference, cuz ronnie aint gonna hear us, and be influenced by us.

S:Ya'll didn't see that, when Ronnie said "Hey Nancy, come check out this new D.K.'S album I got, look they got a song about me."

R:Gee, I'm a dick!(laughter)

SP:What do ya'll think about the V.B. police/?

S:I love 'em ya'know, I have to I sort of live with one. No but actually they are just doing their job.

R:Yeah, but that doesn't have anything to do with weather they enjoy their job; they can enjoy throwing your ass against a car and feeling it.

M:Lots of cops are assholes, but you gotta figure, theyed be assholes even if they weren't cops. You're just allowed to express it when your a cop.

S:People just have an attitude against the uniform.

CLOSING COMMENTS:

S:I believe everybody should do what they want, don't conform to what anybody says. Be yourself.

Ken; Live and let live, do what you want as long as it doesn't stop someone else; Peace, love, & happiness.

M:My closing comment is, BLAH,BLAH, BLAH, BLAH, BLAH, thats spelled B-L-A-H!

R:If you're one of the younger or newer musicians, don't get discouraged, it just takes practice; you can play any instrament you want, it just depends on how serious you are.

- SP: How long have ya been on tour?
N: 'bout two and a half weeks now.
- SP: Where have you been to?
N: We went through the south, Arizona, Texas, Louisiana, Georgia, N. Carolina, and south Carolina. Now we're going up to Philadelphia, N.Y., up into Canada etc.
- SP: Is the band political?
N: Yeah we're political, some of the stuff----it's personal too, even more so now, since we don't have our old vocalist singing for us. We wrote the lyrics we had, but he was never able to sing them with the feeling we had.
- SP: What do they usually deal with?
N: Thoughts we have that we want to show to people.
- SP: Are you trying to push anything?
T: We're trying to push as far as this is the way we feel about things, you can do what you want, but we're letting you know how we feel.
- M: We'll bring up a subject, and let you make up your own mind.
- T: No matter what it's about, politics, or just fucking daily life, if we write a song, we're not trying to push it on anybody, it's just make up your own mind, get your own thoughts straight
- N: I don't want to start describing us, cuz I don't want to label us. You can tell where we're coming from by our lyrics.
- SP: How long have you been together?
N: Jan. '85
- SP: You've come pretty far.
T: We've all been in previous bands, pretty much we've been in the same two bands. Like me and Malcome we're in TRESON, well I don't want to give the whole history, but we just joined together, and now we have this. We did some shows, got a 12" E.P. out, and should have a 7" out soon, on MIND-MATTER. Or you could mail order it, from the band.
- SP: What do you think about the CA. scene?
N: Well it goes in cycles, up & down, bad & good. Since we've been touring the country, I've become alot more positive about the future of punk and all that. It's like all these small towns everywhere like it's really alive, it's definately not Dead!!
- T: Yeah, we'll go places you never thought there would be any, and it's like BANG!, there there.
- SP: Where's the best place you've played?
N: Chareston had a good turn out, but to many red-necks turned out with it. We never got to play, a big fight erupted, right in the middle of the pit.
- T: A mettal band played the same night, it was us, R.K.L., the metal band, and a local band, sorry I don't remember the name. but all the rednecks were screaming "Kill punks, Kill punks!" while the heavy metal band was playing. R.K.L. got to play about

CHRIST ON PARADE con't.

T:...15 mins., then it just turned into big fights and riots all night long. We ended up calling the cops, cuz the rednecks would have kicked the shit out of all of us. We had to have some protection for the bands to get out alright.

N: New Orleans was good!

T: Yeah, that was cool....

N: It was great.

T: But we've had alot of fun in V.B., this is the only place where people get out and do something, instead of sit on their ass and watch T.V.

SP: The band isn't stright edge I take it?

N: No not at all, but we're vegetairians, we don't eat meat!

SP: Is it hard being vegies.

N: No not really, it is just like one's personal desision, if you don't believe in eating animals, you don't. There's lots of things to eat besides meat.

SP: Closing comments:

N: Live life live.

T: And another thing I want to say is.....BELCHHHHH.....!

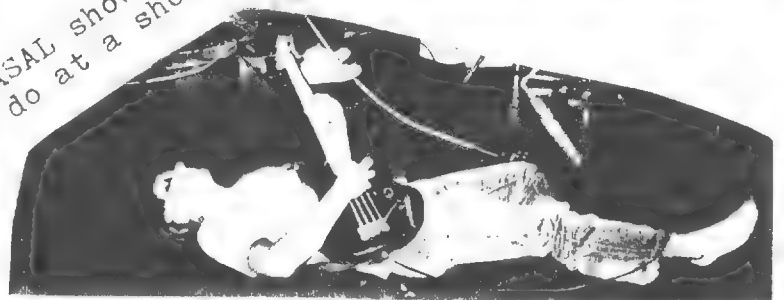

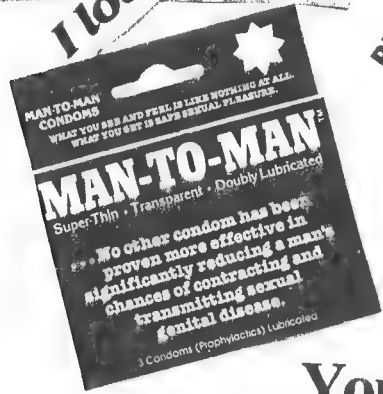

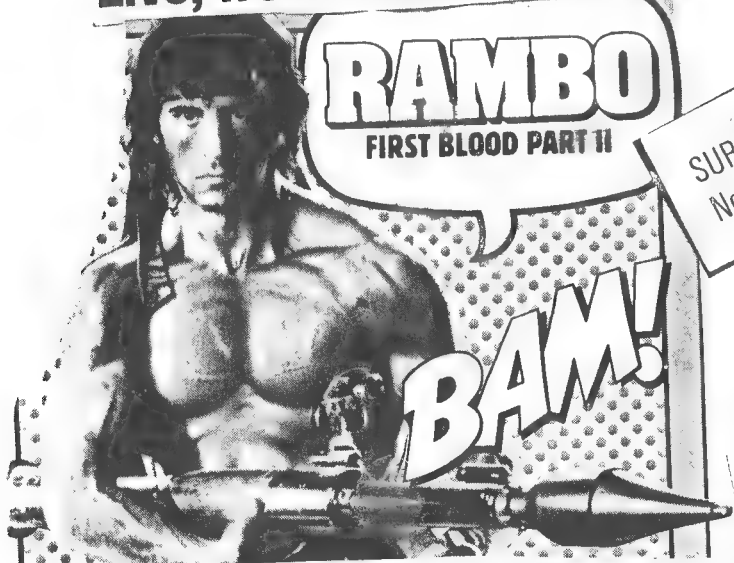

SP: Do you have any complaints about the scene??

M: Well it's alright, but at some gigs there's like a party like feeling almost alot of people just come to hang out, look cool, etc., while only a few peop come to watch the band.

SP: Are you going on tour anytime soon??

M: We start July 18th, and we'll probably be back.

SP: Closing comments??

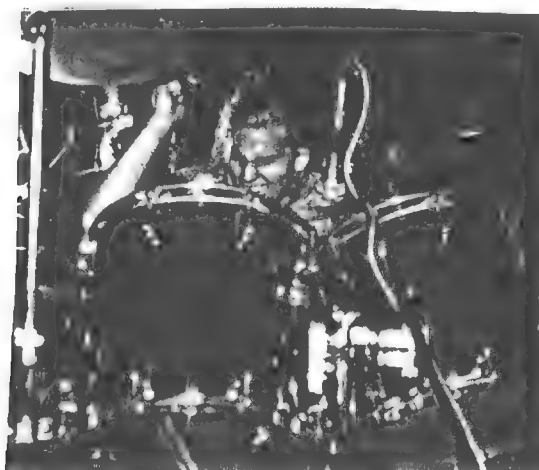

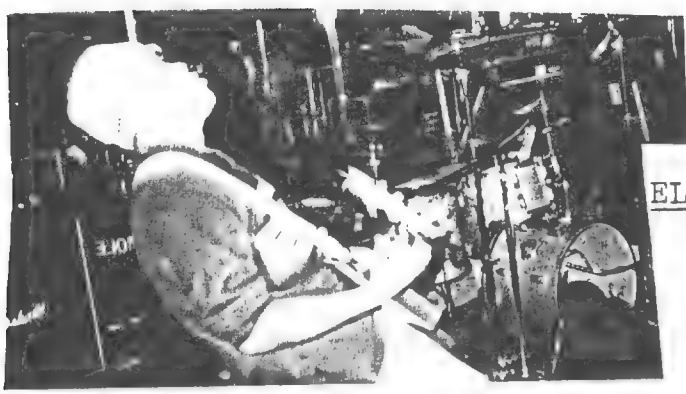

THE GUILTY

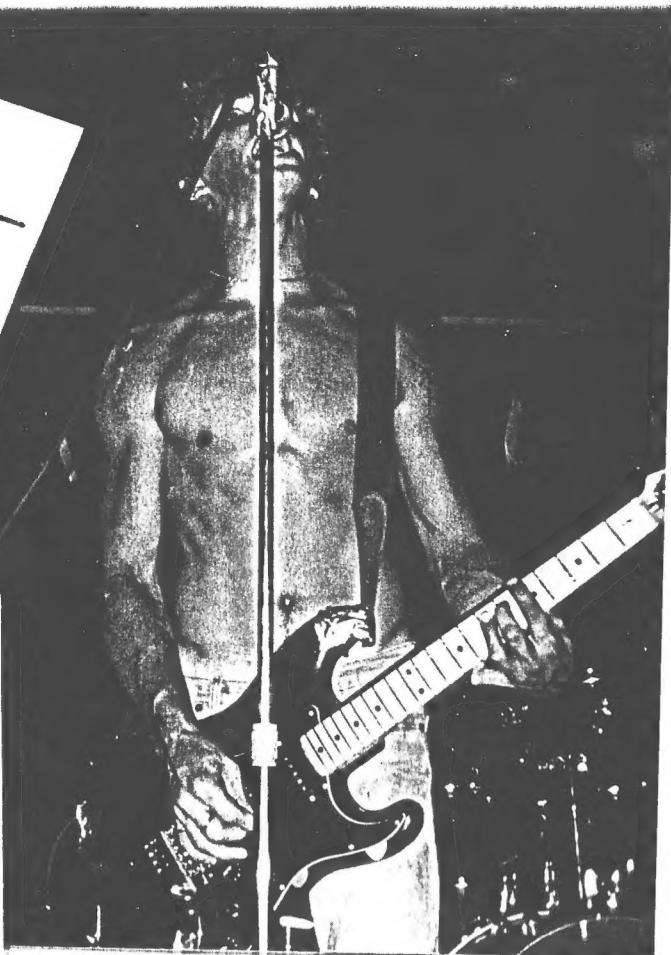
