Tracking down Turkey's rarest and most fascinating gemstones

Lots of beautiful stones here...

Given Turkey's unique geography, which is spread across two continents and surrounded by four seas, coupled with vast mountain ranges and diverse climates, it should come as no surprise that the country is home to a number of natural wonders, including a variety of very rare and sought-after stunning gemstones.


While some are rarer than others, with a number that only exist in Turkey, there is no better time than now to cherish these precious finds and embrace them for their health and healing properties. Whether you don these semiprecious gemstones and minerals as jewelry or simply keep them close to you, each of these seven stones from Turkey has its own believed benefits that can help us get through these trying times.

Zultanite is a rare and more recently surfaced gemstone that is only found in Turkey and has become one of the most popular stones of the millennium for its color-changing properties. Also referred to as csarite or sultanite, zultanite is the world's rarest type of diaspore – a mineral named after the word diaspora, which in Greek means to scatter, in reference to the way the gemstone sparkles and reflects light. Considered to be 10 times as rare as diamonds, zultanite has only ever been found from one source: the Ilbir Mountains of Milas, located in Turkey's Aegean province of Muğla.

Not so foolish after all! Pyrite, aka 'fool's gold' can actually contain tiny amounts of the real stuff

No foolin'!

Though long derided as 'fool's gold,' pyrite might actually contain trace amounts of the precious metal that could be extracted through environmentally friendly means.

Researchers at Curtin University and the University of Western Australia, both in Perth, and the China University of Geoscience in Wuhan reported on the 'invisible' gold in pyrite in a mew research published in the journal Geology.

'Previously gold extractors have been able to find gold in pyrite either as nanoparticles or as a pyritegold alloy, but what we have discovered is that gold can also be hosted in nanoscale crystal defects, representing a new kind of 'invisible' gold,' lead author Denis Fougerouse, a geologist from Curtin's School of Earth and Planetary Sciences, said in a statement.

The more deformed the crystal is, the more gold there is locked up in defects. The gold is hosted in nanoscale defects called dislocations – 100,000 times smaller than the width of a human hair.' The gold in pyrite has been long overlooked, Fougerouse explained, because it's only observable via atom probe tomography (A{T), a technology which uses a position-sensitive detector to deduce atoms' location.

Long-lost fragment of Stonehenge reveals rock grains dating to nearly 2 billion years ago

Now that's some old rocks!

A long-lost piece of Stonehenge that was taken by a man performing restoration work on the monument has been returned after 60 years, giving scientists a chance to peer inside a pillar of the iconic monument for the first time.

In 1958, Robert Phillips, a representative of the drilling company helping to restore Stonehenge, took the cylindrical core after it was drilled from one of Stonehenge's pillars — Stone 58. Later, when he emigrated to the United States, Phillips took the core with him. Because of Stonehenge's protected status, it's no longer possible to extract samples from the stones. But with the core's return in 2018, researchers had the opportunity to perform unprecedented geochemical analyses of a Stonehenge pillar, which they described in a new study.


They found that Stonehenge's towering standing stones, or sarsens, were made of rock containing sediments that formed when dinosaurs walked the Earth. Other grains in the rock date as far back as 1.6 billion years.

This prized material has been used to adorn great works of art from pharaohs' coffins to the Sistine Chapel, and it's also touted for its connection to "cosmic wisdom" and use in feng shui. In fact, it was once more precious than gold.

We're talking, of course, about brilliant blue lapis lazuli, which can be found on King Tut's coffin and other funeral items. In crushed form, it became the bluest blue in an artist's palette — ultramarine — so expensive that Michelangelo couldn't afford it.

Bench Tips from Brad Smith

JUST A DROP

Hobby shops and model airplane stores carry small plastic dispenser bottles that are handy for putting a drop of flux, oil, or glue just where you want it. They have a length of small metal tubing coming out the top that lets you squeeze out very small drops.

I use one with a short length of tubing for oil when I'm sawing or when drilling harder metals like steel. Another bottle I found in a plastics store has a longer length of metal tubing on it. Plastics people use them for dispensing fast drying glues to join pieces of acrylic. The long metal tube let's you reach into tight places. Either of these is handy for flux at the soldering station.



FOREDOM MAINTENANCE

If you have a Foredom flexshaft, it makes sense to check it over every so often to be sure it's running properly. But how to do that? You've probably lost the little booklet that came with the unit. Well, being the good company it is, Foredom has put together an extensive set of videos on how to everything.

The series covers set-up, lubrication, replacing a sheath, motor maintenance, and handpiece maintenance. Few if any special tools are needed. You can watch the videos at www.foredom.net/flexibleshaftmachinemaintenance.aspx particularly under "Foredom Basics" or the "Foredom Shafting..." categories.

Any repair parts needed are available on the Foredom site or from most jewelry supply catalogs. If you have any question about their products, a phone call or an email will get quick answers.




