












### Spreading the CHEER

The West Chester cheerleaders have set high expectations for themselves in the past for which they want to continue reaching. Therefore, getting the new participants into Purple & Gold mode will definitely take a lot of dedication and commitment. To begin their preseason, the cheerleaders headed to The University of Scranton in the beginning of August. At Scranton, the WCU cheerleaders, along with approximately 50 other universities, including Divisions I, II, and III, competed to stand out at this prestigious camp. The cheerleaders learned numerous new cheers and stunts and worked side-by-side with UCA staff to improve their cheerleading abilities. They had daily evaluations, for which they unanimously earned many blue, superior ribbons. West Chester University competed against other schools in many categories, including best chant and fight song, where they placed in each. The cheerleaders also brought home a Game Planning Award for their unique traditions and school spirit. After only a week to recuperate, the cheerleaders headed to William Tennent High School in Bucks County. There, they choreographed the varsity and junior varsity routines and taught it to the squads in three short days. These routines consisted of numerous stunts, pyramids, dance, jump and tumbling sequences. The William Tennent cheerleaders will continue to improve in practice and will eventually take these routines to competition this winter. The cheerleading team moved to campus a week early to conclude their preseason. They worked on perfecting numerous cheers, sidelines, stunts and pyramids, as well as their full squad tumbling. They also prepared their fight song routine and field traditions. For the first season, the cheerleaders will work together with the West Chester University band to choreograph a pre-game routine. These long days of practice will help to prepare the cheerleaders for their nine-month season. Throughout the season, the cheerleaders not only practice twice a week, but they have 6 a.m. workouts, decorate the locker room to support the school's football team and also balance school work and jobs, easily. The squad hopes to be more involved in the community this year by reaching out to youth groups in the area by doing a monthly volunteer activity and perform exhibitions at various high schools.




#### Together Everyone Achieves More

The Women's soccer team had an incredibly successful year! Last year's nationally-ranked team returned with all the talent and drive that led them to three conference titles in the last four years. The defending Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference champions started off very strong this year, completely shutting out their opponents and winning their first seven games. The similarly thus-far undefeated Bloomsburg University got the best of them, but the undaunted Golden Rams persevered to win against Indiana University (PA) in a critical Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) victory. They continued to top their opponents, shutting out both Philadelphia University and Millersville University. The Golden Rams successfully defended their Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference title with a thrilling 4-3 victory over California University (PA) in a penalty kick shootout, and while challenging California again, took home their fourth regional championship in the past six years! They advanced to the NCAA Division II Quarterfinals, but their incredible luck ultimately ran out in their defeat by Saint Rose College. Many of the talented athletes were honored for their astounding accomplishments. Senior Sarah Oswald was named PSAC women's soccer athlete of the week, ECAC player of the week, and PSAC women's soccer player of the year. A total of six West Chester University women's soccer players were named to the 2010 NSCAA/Performance Subaru Division II Women's Soccer Squad: Oswald, sophomore Lyndsie Bernardini, senior Jessica Bennett, senior Cindi Nickles, and junior Tara Malkiewicz were named to the first team, and senior Devon Swaim was the lone second team selection. Oswald, Bernardini, and Nickles were picked to the 2010 NSCAA/Performance Subaru Women's NCAA Division II All-America team, and Oswald and Malkiewicz were each named to the 2010 Daktronics, Inc. NCAA Division II Women's Soccer All-America teams.








### Look At That Birdie!!

The women of West Chester University's 2010 Division II Cross Country Team had a successful season, both athletically and academically. The hardworking athletes had an overall GPA of 3.64, ranking sixth amongst the other Division II programs. The team opened its 2010 career with a ninth place finish at the Delaware Valley College Invitational. The women continued with a strong season, placing sixth at the Kutztown Challenge, taking fourth on Lock Haven's course, and ending the season with an 11th place at the 2010 PSAC Championship. The program was lead by determined athletes, such as sophomore Kristina Koutsouros, who made a big impact on the program this year. Kristina won many meets this season and placed first at the Paul Short Invitational; she clocked a time of 22 minutes, 4 seconds for her first college win-the fastest time any Golden Ram has achieved on that course in the past six years. Lyndsey Ratasiewicz was also one of the strong competitors on the team, and at the University of Delaware Invitational, she also set a new record for the Rams. Both of these dedicated team members received all-region honors in leading West Chester's women's cross country team. They bolstered their team to a strong 12th place finish at the 2010 NCAA Atlantic Region Championships at the end of the season.





#### They did it AGAIN!

The Men's Swimming and Diving Team had an amazing 2010/2011 season. They won two out of the three meets, defeating Shippensburg and Bloomsburg at the end of 2010, and took third place in the Terrapin Cup totaling up 525.5 points. Not only was our women's team PSAC champions, but so was the Men's team! They had continued their dominance in this meet, making this their 13th consecutive win. Senior Kenny McCormick was named the swimmer of the meet for the second straight year. Bud McClernan set a PSAC meet record in winning the 200 breaststroke with a time of 2:04.64. West Chester totaled 686 points, passing Clarion who had 567.

West Chester University finished 19th at the NCAAs with a total of 62.5 points. Brendan Magarity claimed an All-America certificate with an eighth-place finish in the 200-yard backstroke on the final day of competition. Magarity touched the wall in 1 minute, 50.66 seconds to take the last All-American spot in the finals of the 200 back. Congratulations on a great season!





The West Chester Women's Gymnastics team started off their season with a positive attitude and great scores. Towards the end of the season, West Chester University broke the school record with its 186.050 and set a new school mark on the uneven parallel bars (47.300) to earn a third-place finish at the 28th Annual ECAC Division II Women's Gymnastics Championships. West Chester's Allie Aquila was runner-up in the all-around with a score of 37.600. Aquila scored a 9.525 on the vault and a 9.450 on the bars for her two best efforts. She added a 9.375 on the floor exercise and a 9.25 on the balance beam. WCU freshman Paige Griffin was fourth in the all-around with a score of 36.750. She scored a 9.500 on the bars and a 9.45 on the floor. Kaley LaFleur and Alli Aquila each turned in a solid performance while representing West Chester at the 2011 USA Gymnastics Championships held at the U.S. Air Force Academy. LaFleur scored a 9.55 on the uneven bars during session two to finish tied for 16th overall. Alli Aquila scored a 9.125 on the balance beam to place 27th overall. She also competed on the uneven bars and on the vault, scoring an 8.975 on the bars and 8.800 on vault. The Lady Rams had a great season and are showing strong





The Golden Rams are ranked ninth in the fourth poll of the season. West Chester's 4x400m relay team won a PSAC championship as the Golden Rams finished seventh overall at the 2011 PSAC Indoor Track & Field Championship. Melanie Ruff, Melinda Wentz, Sam Smarkola and Nicole Smith made up the PSAC champion foursome, finishing in 3 minutes, 57.03 seconds. Two of the members were very successful this season. Smith was tabbed all-region in the 400m. Farrell Stadium. The team has come along way with a new coach and hopes to continue on the path of growing and winning as a team.

## brian's 2010

The 33rd Annual Brian's Run was held at Henderson High School on December 5th, 2010. Brian's Run began in 1978 as a one-time fundraising event to benefit Brian Bratcher, a West Chester Henderson High School football player who was paralyzed during a scrimmage. Brian's friends, their parents and the community organized a race and hoped to raise \$500. That first year, 2,000 runners participated and the effort raised \$20,000 to help Brian with his expenses. After 1979, Brian felt he had benefited enough from the proceeds and asked to have others benefit from the annual event. For years, the race has raised funds for disabled people in the West Chester community. West Chester University contributes thousands of hours to the effort. Hundreds of students work on race day, and student organizations designate Brian's Run as one of their service efforts. Hundreds of University employees volunteer as well. This year, 1,000 runners participated in the race and the event raised \$10,000. The 5-mile course is an out-and-back loop through downtown West Chester with significant hills, finishing with one lap of the track at Henderson. Local residents and family and friends of the runners lined the streets to cheer.

Before the runners set off, there was a diaper dash for children under 3, a fun run for children ages 3-8, and a 1-mile fun run for ages 9 and up. It is a fun family event for a great cause!






### BananaDay
