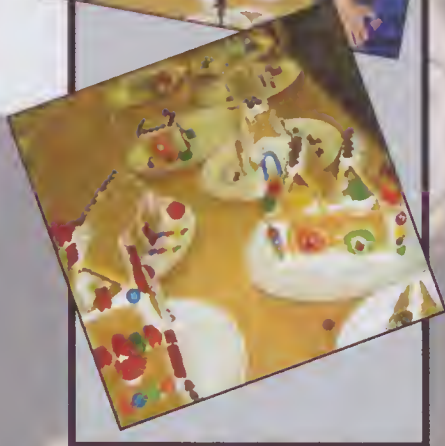

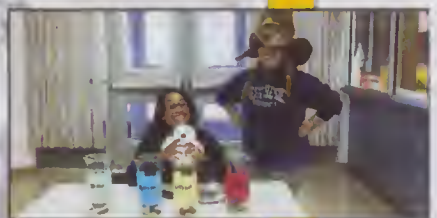

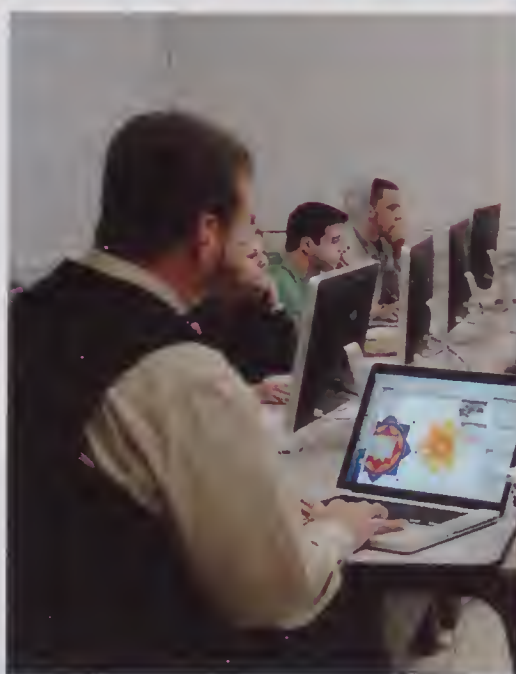

Safety John O'Donnell (sophomore) was named as the PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week - quite an honor! Sean McCartney even stepped up to the challenge of being the first freshman starting quarterback in the face of team injury since 2001's Bob Findora. These boys may not have had a postseason to speak of, but the 2011-2012 team will be there to crush the opponents with their skill, determination, and hard work. The West Chester cheerleaders have set high expectations for themselves in the past for which they want to continue reaching. Therefore, getting the new participants into Purple & Gold mode will definitely take a lot of dedication and commitment. To begin their preseason, the cheerleaders headed to The University of Scranton in the beginning of August. At Scranton, the WCU cheerleaders, along with approximately 50 other universities, including Divisions I, II, and III, competed to stand out at this prestigious camp. The cheerleaders learned numerous new cheers and stunts and worked side-by-side with UCA staff to improve their cheerleading abilities. They had daily evaluations, for which they unanimously earned many blue, superior ribbons. West Chester University competed against other schools in many categories, including best chant and fight song, where they placed in each. The cheerleaders also brought home a Game Planning Award for their unique traditions and school spirit. After only a week to recuperate, the cheerleaders headed to William Tennent High School in Bucks County. There, they choreographed the varsity and junior varsity routines and taught it to the squads in three short days. These routines consisted of numerous stunts, pyramids, dance, jump and tumbling sequences. The William Tennent cheerleaders will continue to improve in practice and will eventually take these routines to competition this winter. The cheerleading team moved to campus a week early to conclude their preseason. They worked on perfecting numerous cheers, sidelines, stunts and pyramids, as well as their full squad tumbling. They also prepared their fight song routine and field traditions. For the first season, the cheerleaders will work together with the West Chester University band to choreograph a pre-game routine. These long days of practice will help to prepare the cheerleaders for their nine-month season. Throughout the season, the cheerleaders not only practice twice a week, but they have 6 a.m. workouts, decorate the locker room to support the school's football team and also balance school work and jobs, easily. The Women's soccer team had an incredibly successful year! Last year's nationally-ranked team returned with all the talent and drive that led them to three conference titles in the last four years. The defending Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference champions started off very strong this year, completely shutting out their opponents and winning their first seven games. The similarly thus-far undefeated Bloomsburg University got the best of them, but the undaunted Golden Rams persevered to win against Indiana University (PA) in a critical Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) victory. They continued to top their opponents, shutting out both Philadelphia University and Millersville University. The Golden Rams successfully defended their Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference title with a thrilling 4-3 victory over California University (PA) in a penalty kick shootout, and while challenging California again, took home their fourth regional championship in the past six years! They advanced to the NCAA Division II Quarterfinals, but their incredible luck ultimately ran out in their defeat by Saint Rose College. Many of the talented athletes were honored for their astounding accomplishments. Senior Sarah Oswald was named PSAC women's soccer athlete of the week, ECAC player of the week, and PSAC women's soccer player of the year. A total of six West Chester University women's soccer players were named to the 2010 NSCAA/Performance Subaru Division II Women's Soccer Squad: Oswald, sophomore Lyndsie Bernardini, senior Jessica Bennett, senior Cindi Nickles, and junior Tara Malkiewicz were named to the first team, and senior Devon Swaim was the lone second team selection. Oswald, Bernardini, and Nickles were picked to the 2010 NSCAA/Performance Subaru Women's NCAA Division II All-America team, and Oswald and Malkiewicz were each named to the 2010 Daktronics, Inc. NCAA Division II Women's Soccer All-America teams.

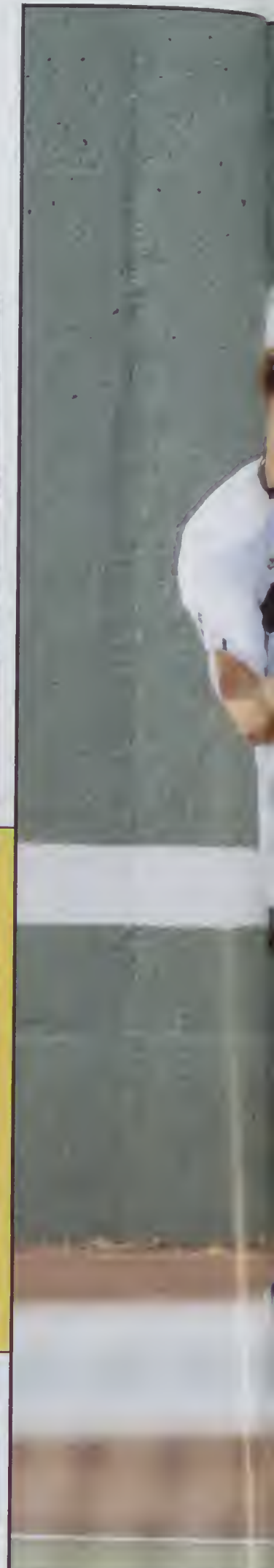
GOING *for the* KILL

The West Chester women's volleyball team had a very successful fall season this year! They launched off to an excellent start, winning their first three games at the Kutztown Invitational. At the Ram Fest, they also shut out their opponents they hosted in four home matches. They saw their amazing winning streak come to a close against Gannon, and the Rams then lost three of their first PSAC Western Division crossover matches. The volleyball team's newcomers, freshman Jamie Hughes and classmate Chelsea Clemens, led the team to a 3-0 win over PSAC rival Cheyney University to end their three-game losing streak, and they went on to win their next four matches and with top kills and assists by Michelle Powers, Kelly Martin, Lexi Kegerise, and Helen Fitzpatrick. These matches evened out their record in conference play, but a pivotal loss to Lock Haven put them in third place. The team earned mixed results over the next few weeks, sweeping many non-league matches but falling to PSAC rivals such as California, Indiana, and Clarion. The Golden Rams later defeated the East Stroudsburg Warriors and the Bowie State Bulldogs, sealing a playoff spot in the PSAC postseason tournament. After reaching the PSAC quarterfinals for six straight years, the Rams continued in their determination and hung on for a 3-2 win over visiting Millersville in the regular-season finale, but bowed out of the postseason in the quarterfinals when they fell to top-seeded Lock Haven in a very close match. After a very tough run in PSAC matches, the women held their own, and ended the year 23-12 overall and 8-11 in the PSAC Eastern Division. Congratulations to senior middle hitter Michelle Powers, who was named to the first team All-PSAC East squad, and to Lisa Campbell, Helen Fitzpatrick and Lexi Kegerise, who were all second team honorees. Powers was also named to the 2010 American Volleyball Coaches' Association (AVCA) Division II All-Atlantic Region squad for her accomplishments this season.

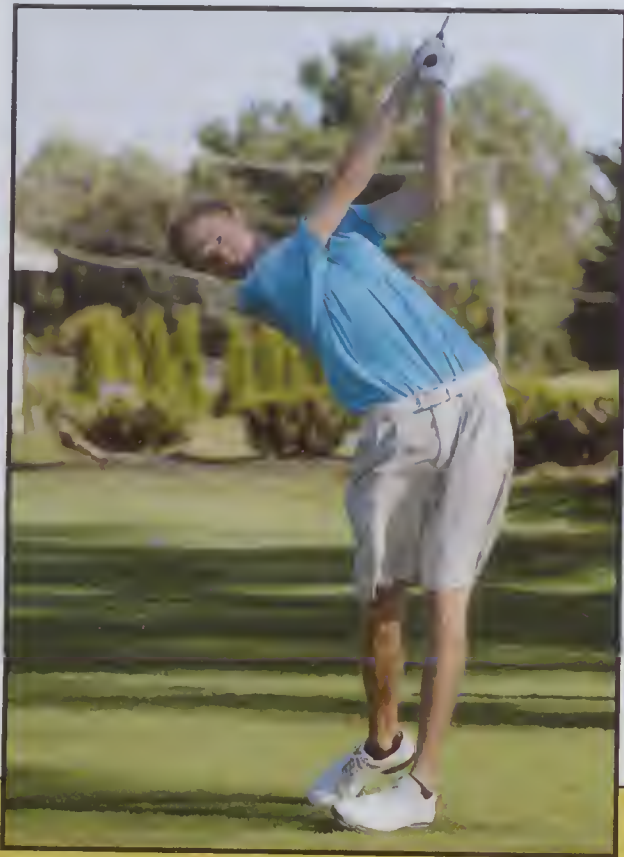

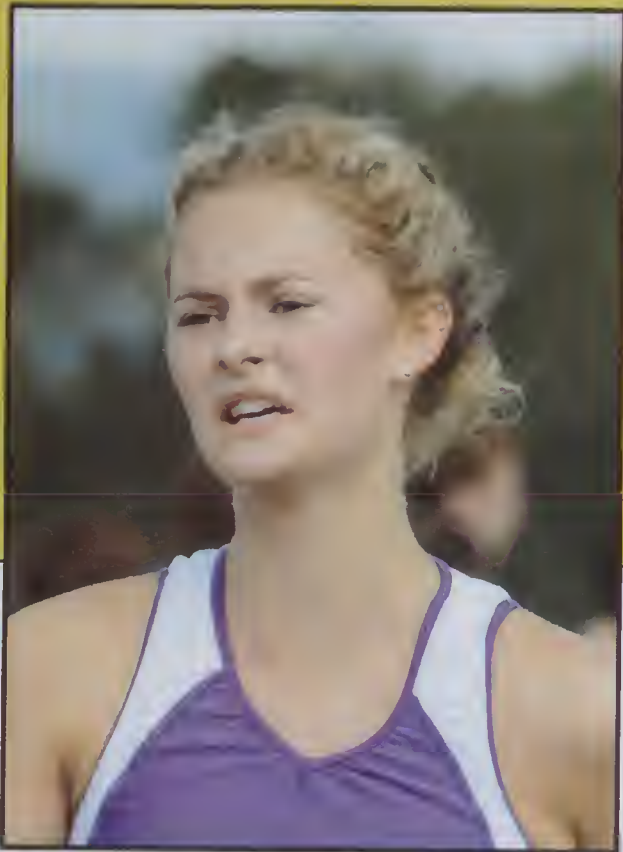

The Men's Cross Country program had an exceptional 2010 season. The team opened with a third place finish at the Delaware Valley College Invitational. Ed Bittingham led the runners to the finish line with a strong ninth place showing out of a total of 208 runners, also marking the fastest time for a Ram on this 8K course since 2004. Continuing their success, all seven runners on the team finished with times less than 28 minutes at Lock Haven University, setting six new records for that course. Further into their season, the team set three new records in the 4K race at Dickinson College. Matt Langdale finished strong and set West Chester's top time on this course over the past six years. The team finished with eighth place showings at both the University of Delaware Invitational and the Kutztown Challenge. Their season ended with a 12th place standing at the 2010 PSAC Championships and a 15th place finish at the 2010 NCAA Atlantic Regional.

MIND over MATTER

The women of West Chester University's 2010 Division II Cross Country Team had a successful season, both athletically and academically. The hardworking athletes had an overall GPA of 3.64, ranking sixth amongst the other Division II programs. The team opened its 2010 career with a ninth place finish at the Delaware Valley College Invitational. The women continued with a strong season, placing sixth at the Kutztown Challenge, taking fourth on Lock Haven's course, and ending the season with an 11th place at the 2010 PSAC Championship. The program was lead by determined athletes, such as sophomore Kristina Koutsouros, who made a big impact on the program this year. Kristina won many meets this season and placed first at the Paul Short Invitational; she clocked a time of 22 minutes, 4 seconds for her first college win--the fastest time any Golden Ram has achieved on that course in the past six years. 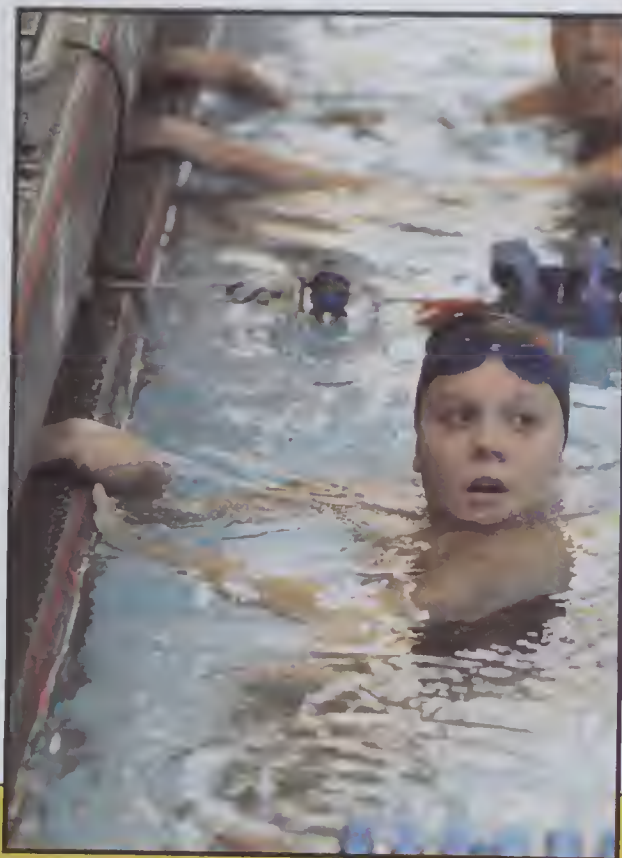

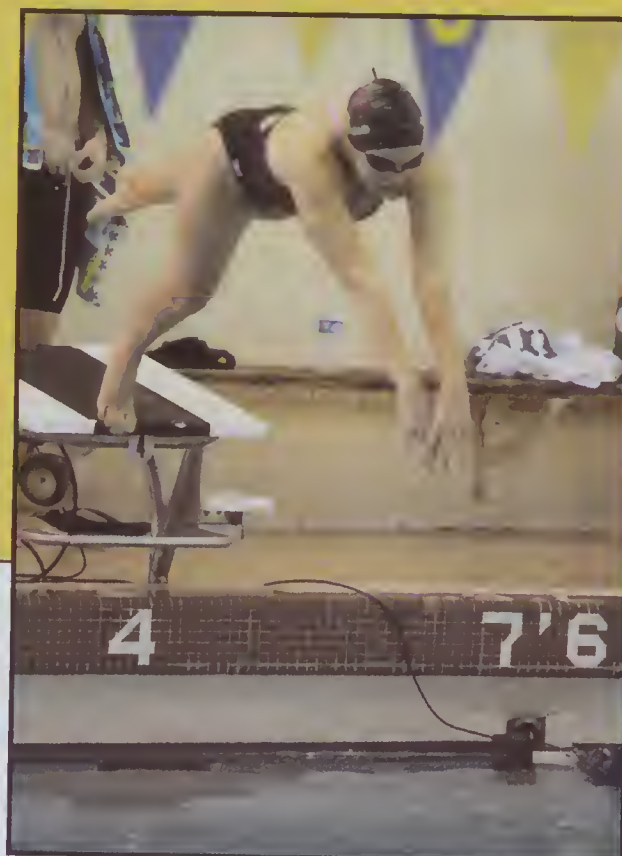

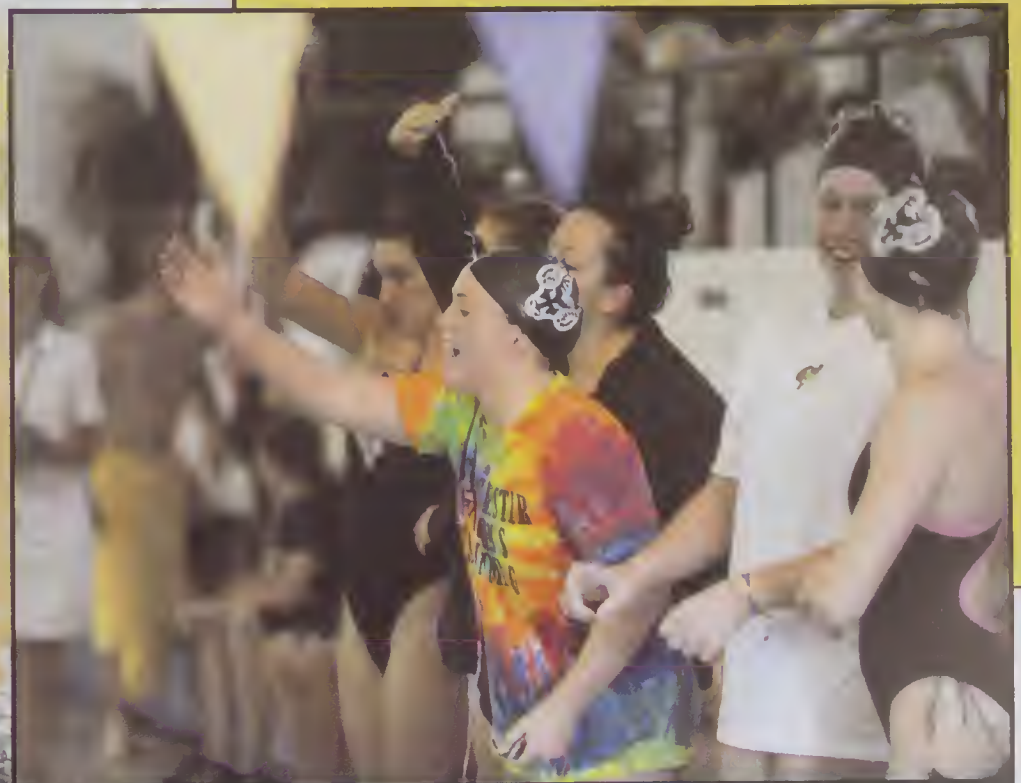

Women's Team takes PSAC

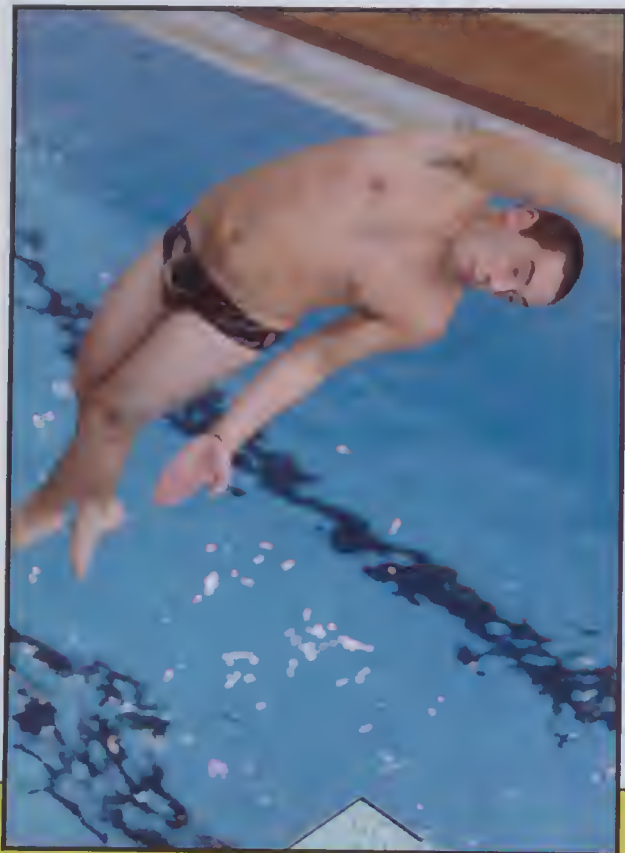

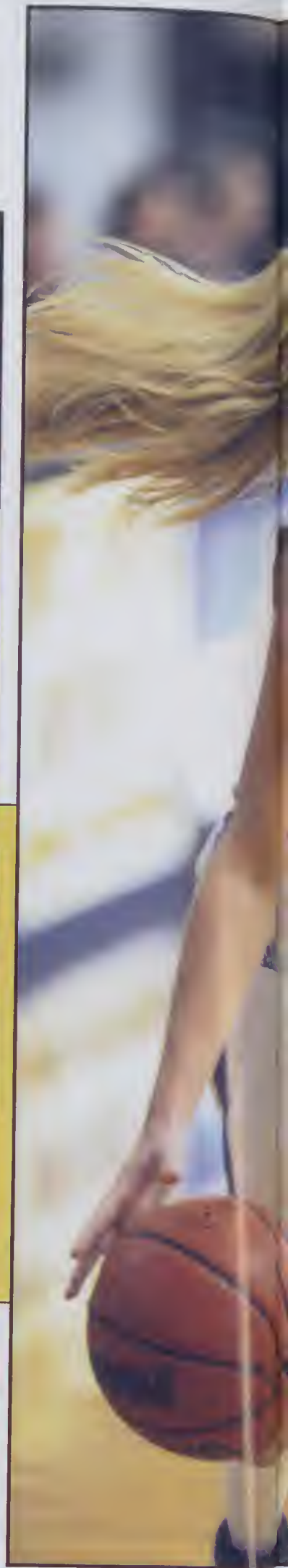

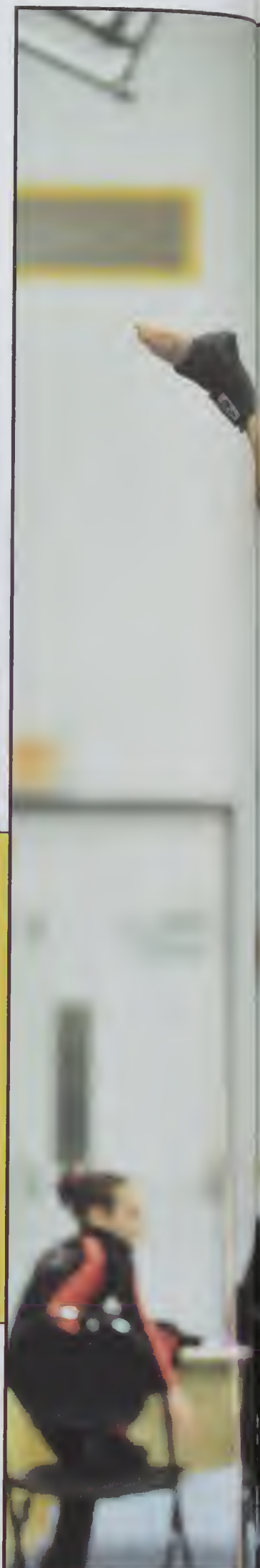
Defending Home Court

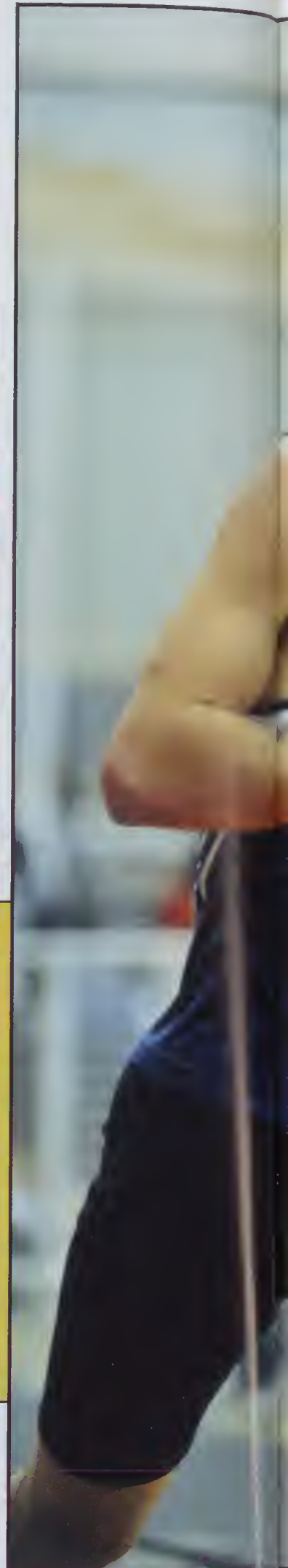

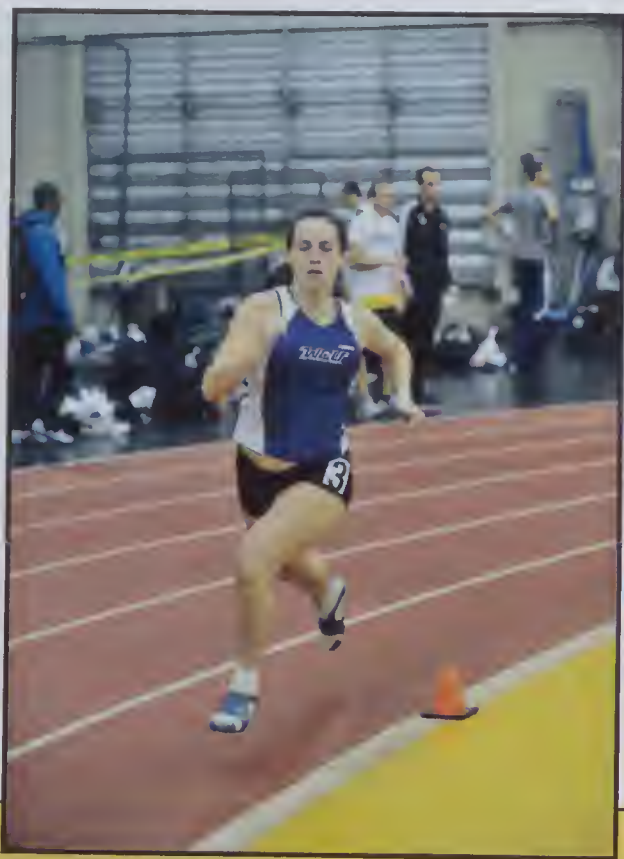
Live Free, Run Fast

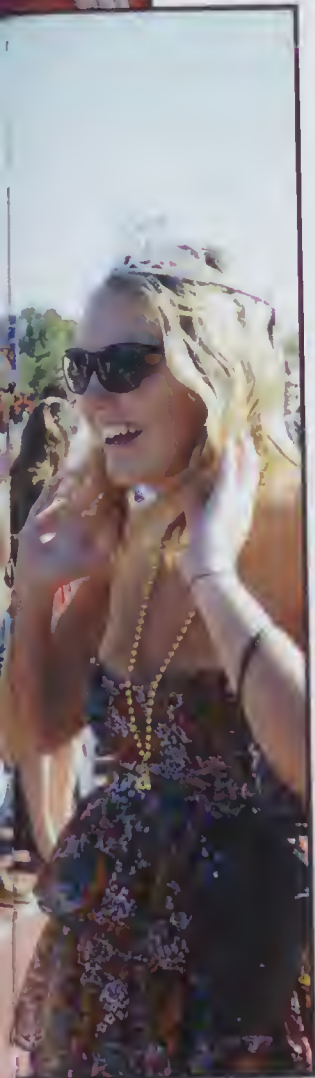
roadtrip across the USA

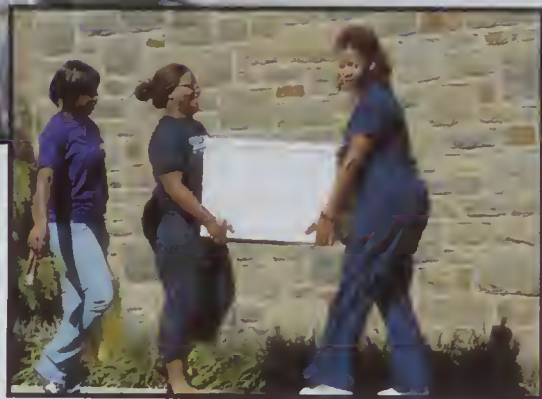

The 33rd Annual Brian's Run was held at Henderson High School on December 5th, 2010. Brian's Run began in 1978 as a one-time fundraising event to benefit Brian Bratcher, a West Chester Henderson High School football player who was paralyzed during a scrimmage. Brian's friends, their parents and the community organized a race and hoped to raise \$500. That first year, 2,000 runners participated and the effort raised \$20,000 to help Brian with his expenses. After 1979, Brian felt he had benefited enough from the proceeds and asked to have others benefit from the annual event. For years, the race has raised funds for disabled people in the West Chester community. West Chester University contributes thousands of hours to the effort. Hundreds of students work on race day, and student organizations designate Brian's Run as one of their service efforts. Hundreds of University employees volunteer as well. This year, 1,000 runners participated in the race and the event raised \$10,000. The 5-mile course is an out-and-back loop through downtown West Chester with significant hills, finishing with one lap of the track at Henderson. Local residents and family and friends of the runners lined the streets to cheer.

Before the runners set off, there was a diaper dash for children under 3, a fun run for children ages 3-8, and a 1-mile fun run for ages 9 and up. It is a fun family event for a great cause!
