

PREFATORY NOTE.

THIS SERVICE BOOK AND HYMNAL has been compiled to meet a want in the editor's own pastoral work. Should it receive the approval of others, and meet a like want for them, he will be glad that with God's blessing it has found an enlarged sphere of

usefulness.

The aim has been to provide offices in harmony with the church services, so that the moulding influence of the Sunday-School, the Catechetical Class, and the Family, shall prepare the children and catechumens for a due appreciation of these services, and a devout joining in the worship of the congregation; and, further, to provide a book convenient in size, and having all desirable requisites as to contents and form, and yet so inexpensive that, at little cost, a copy may be placed in the hands of every scholar.

The anthems and prayers for the Church Festivals and occasional services, will provide for the proper observance of the Festival Seasons, and obviate the necessity of using specially prepared

forms.

For the selection of the music and pointing of the anthems, the editor gratefully acknowledges his indebtedness to Mr. Walter Bausman, and for the music for the versicles to Mr. Spencer M. White, who have had much and valuable experience in training young people and young voices, and in leading the service of praise in God's house.

The hymns sung with frequency in the Sunday-School are few in number, and the collection in the Hymnal, consisting of the favorite and best hymns,

will be found ample for all ordinary uses.

The opening part of the First or the Second Sunday-School Service, with the Anthem for the Epiphany Season, and the Collects for Christian Missions, will provide an appropriate service for the meetings of Missionary Societies; and the Service for a Guild or Society, and the Collect for a Sewing-School, will meet a want in almost every congregation.

The Catechism on Confirmation, and the Rules for the Confirmed, will prove a desirable aid in the instruction just preceding, and helpful to holy living

SERVICE BOOK AND HYMNAL.

FIRST SUNDAY-SCHOOL SERVICE.

At a given signal from the Leader, the School shall rise; and he shall lead and the School respond, in the following Service:

Leader.—Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in Thy sight, O Lord, my Strength and my Redeemer.

School — A men

The Leader shall now say:

If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us; but if we confess our sins, God is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Then all shall unite in the Confession:

Almighty and most merciful God, our heavenly Father, we confess that we have sinned against Thee, in thought, in word, and in deed. We have come short of Thy glory. We have broken Thy commandments and turned aside every one of us from the way of life, and in us there is no health. Yet, O Lord, for the sake of Thy Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy upon us, pardon our sins, and grant us Thy peace. Purify us, by the inspiration of Thy Holy Spirit, from all inward uncleanness; and make us able and willing to serve Thee in newness of life, to the glory of Thy holy Name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

L.-O Lord, open Thou my lips.

The Scripture Lesson shall now be read by the

Leader and the School antiphonally.

After the reading of the Lesson, the School rising, the Service shall continue in the following order, except in the Festival Seasons, when the appropriate Anthem and Collects shall be used—those for Advent on the Sundays in Advent; those for Christmas on Christmas and on the Sundays after Christmas; those for Epiphany on the Sundays after Epiphany; those for Lent on the Sundays in Lent; those for Easter on Easter, and on the three Sundays after Easter; and

those for Ascension on the Sundays after Ascension. The Festival Prayer shall be used on the Festival Day. All standing, the Benedictus or any other Anthem shall be said or chanted.

And, we beseech Thee, give us such a due sense of all Thy mercies, that our hearts may be unfeignedly thankful, and that we may show forth Thy praise, not only with our lips, but in our lives, by giving up ourselves to Thy service, and by walking before Thee in holiness and righteousness all our days; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

BLESSED LORD, who hast caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning, grant us Thy holy Spirit to illumine and sanctify our minds and hearts, that we may be both apt to teach, and ready to learn, the lessons of Thy saving truth; that by patience and comfort of Thy holy Word, we may embrace, and ever hold fast, the hope of everlasting life, which Thou hast given us in our Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

O LORD JESUS, tender Shepherd, who hast said, Suffer little children to come unto Me, and forbid them not; bestow Thy blessing, we beseech Thee, upon all children and youth. Save them from every sin. Confirm them in Thy grace. Constrain them to love and follow Thee. As they grow in stature may they also, after Thy holy example, increase in wisdom, and in favor with God and man, and so truly and godly serve Thee in this life, that in the world to come they may have life everlasting. Then all unite in saying or chanting the Lord's Prayer.

L.—Let us pray.

ALMIGHTY God, Fountain of all goodness and truth, receive our thanks for the lively oracles of Thy grace, which are able to make us wise unto everlasting life; and mercifully grant, we beseech Thee, that the words we have heard with our outward ears, may through Thy blessing be so grafted inwardly in our hearts, that they may bring forth in us the fruit of good living, to the honor and praise of Thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A Doxology, which may be the Gloria Patri, shall now be sung, and then, if the Pastor be present, he shall pronounce this Bendiction:

THE GRACE of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Ghost, be with you all. *Amen*.

After a few moments of silent prayer, all shall quietly, and in order, retire, and while retiring a Recessional Hymn may be sung.

SECOND SUNDAY-SCHOOL SERVICE.

At a given signal from the Leader the School shall rise, and the Service proceed in the following order:

Leader.—O Lord, open Thou my lips.

School.—And my mouth shall show forth Thy praise.

L.—The Lord be with you.

S .- And with Thy Spirit.

ALMIGHTY GOD, unto whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid; cleanse the thoughts of our minds, we beseech Thee, by the inspiration of Thy Holy Spirit, that, being delivered from every unholy motion of the flesh and spirit, we may perfectly love Thee, with a pure heart and sanctified lips worship Thee, and worthily magnify Thy holy Name; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

A Hymn or an Anthem shall now be sung, and be followed by the antiphonal reading of the Scripture

Lesson.

After the reading of the Lesson, the School rising, the Service shall proceed in the following order, except in the Festival Seasons, when the proper Anthem and Collect shall be used.

L.—Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost;

S.—As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Amen.

ALMIGHTY GOD, who, by Thy Son Jesus Christ, didst give commandment to the holy Apostles, that they should go into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature; grant to us whom Thou hast called into Thy Church a ready will to obey Thy word, and fill us with a hearty desire to make Thy way known upon earth, thy saving health among all nations. Look with compassion upon the heathen that have not known Thee, and on the multitudes in our own land that are scattered abroad as sheep having no shepherd. O heavenly Father, Lord of the harvest, have respect, we beseech Thee, to our prayers, and send forthlaborers into Thy harvest. Fit and prepare them by Thy grace

A SHORT CATECHISM ON CONFIRMATION.*

Q. What is Confirmation?
A. It is a Sacramental Rite of the Church.

Q. What is this Rite called in Holy Scripture?
A. The Laying-on of hands.

Q. Who instituted Confirmation?

A. The Apostles of the Lord Jesus, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, Acts VIII, 17, and xix. 6.

Q. What does St. Paul call it?

A. One of the principles of the doctrine of Christ. Heb. vi. 1, 2,

Q. How is Confirmation bestowed?

- A. By the Church, through her Ministers, after the example of the holy Apostles, by the Laving-on of hands, with prayer.
 - Q. How many parts are there in Confirmation? A. Two: 1. Our part. 2. God's part.

Q. What is our part?
A. We solemnly, in the presence of God, and of His people, renew the promise and vow of

our Baptism:

1. To renounce: a. The Devil with all his ways and works; b. The world with its vain pomp and glory; c. The flesh with all its sinful desires.

2. To believe all the Articles of the Christian

Faith.

3. To follow Christ, and to keep His commandments all the days of our life.

Q. Do we, then, in Confirmation, lay ourselves under a new obligation?

^{*}In this Catechism, and the Rules for the Confirmed, the order, and to some extent, the language, of a Tract on the same subject, has been adopted.

A. No: we solemnly acknowledge and confirm the obligation that lies upon us already by our Baptism.

Q. Are all the baptized, whether confirmed or not, bound to keep the yows and promise of

their Baptism?

A. Yes; and they should earnestly desire the blessing of Confirmation to help them to fulfill these vows.

Q. What is God's part in Confirmation?

A. God answers our act with a special blessing: confirms us in His covenant of grace; and gives us in larger measure His Holv Spirit, by whose help alone we can fulfill our vows by leading holy and obedient lives.

Q. What, then, is the grace of Confirmation? A. It is the gift of spiritual strength, to enable us to fight against sin, the world, the flesh, and

the Devil, and to follow our BLESSED LORD without shame all the days of our life.

Q. What is required of persons coming to Confirmation?

A. That they should be able to say the Lord's Prayer, the Apostle's Creed, and the Ten Commandments; and further, be instructed in all things which a Christian ought to know, believe and practice to God's glory and his own salvation.

O. What still further is required of candi-

dates for Confirmation?

A. They should humbly, with prayer, examine themselves; be in earnest in giving themselves up to God with a whole heart; sincerely purpose to love and obey, serve and trust Him. to their life's end; and then, with thanksgiving and joy for this gracious privilege, come and be confirmed in God's covenant of salvation.

Q. After Confirmation what other and greater

blessing has the Church for us?

A. The sacrament of the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ, called also the Lord's Supper, the Holy Communion, and the Eucharist.

Q. What is the blessing of the Lord's Supper?
A. Christ gives Himself to be our Food, to nourish, strengthen and refresh our souls to

everlasting life.

Q. How should we come to this Holy Supper?

A. After self-examinaton; with penitence for sin; with the sincere desire and purpose of forsaking all sin; with faith; and with thanksgiving for this blessed privilege.

Q. How often should we come to the Holy

Communion?

A. As often as it is celebrated; and nothing, except sickness, or circumstances beyond our control should be allowed to prevent us from attending.

Q. How should the bread and wine be re-

ceived?

A. Reverently and with care, receiving the bread from the minister, not with the fingers, but allowing him to place it in the palm of the hand, the hand being ungloved.

Q. Do we, if not confirmed in childhood, ever

become too old to receive this blessing?

A. All ought to prepare for Confirmation as early in life as possible; but none are too old to receive grace, to obtain God's blessing, to do His will.

Q. What are some of the duties of the Con-

firmed?

A. To attend regularly all the services; to take an interest in all Church meetings for business; to contribute as God has prospered them for the support of the Gospel; to engage cheerfully in Sunday-school and other Churchwork; to defend the good name of the Church, her officers and members; to promote the welfare of fellow-Christians; and to labor for the salvation of those who obey not Christ.

O Lord, give me power publicly to own and accept for myself Thy covenant of salvation made with me in the sacrament of Baptism; and grant that being fully and formally consecrated to Thy service, I may be kept faithful in the same, and be fruitful in good works, all the days of my life; for Jesus Christ, my Savior's sake. Amen.

RULES FOR THE CONFIRMED.

1. Remember that you are not your own, but God's—God's by creation, by redemption through His dear Son, by sanctification through the gift of His Holy Spirit,

2. Remember that in Holy Baptism you were made God's child, a member of Christ, and an

heir of everlasting life.

3. Remember always the vows of Baptism, and that in Confirmation you renewed for yourself the vows and promises made at your Baptism, and that God confirmed you by giving you in larger measure His Holy Spirit, to be always your Comforter and Guide.

Remembering these things, try to live every day as one ought to live who is a member of

Christ, God's child, and an inheritor of the

kingdom of heaven.

4. Pray daily—morning and evening, and in every moment of need and trial. Pray also for your friends, your Pastor and your Church, and all God's people; and the spread of His kingdom.

5. Read, study the Bible, every day, and try

to live up to its teachings.

6. Think over your life every night. If you have fallen into sin, repent, and ask God's forgivenesss, and His grace to keep you from

falling into sin in the same way again.

7. Remember the Lord's Day to keep it holy. Attend all the services of your Church. Except from sickness never be absent from the Holy Communion. Prepare for this service beforehand; and give thanks afterwards.

8. Except on some special occasion, and for special reasons, never attend any other service than that of your own Church. Be loyal to your Church; study its organization, history, spirit and usages; give as you can for its support; uphold its good name; be helpful to its members; be an earnest and active, patient and persevering worker.

9. Avoid bad company. Never go to any place where you may be tempted to do wrong, or you would be ashamed for your Savior to see you. Be true to Christ in word and deed. Win your companions to obey Christ to their

eternal salvation.

10. If you have got wrong, confess it, and get right as soon as you can. Pray to God for help. If you want advice, do not be afraid to go and ask your own Pastor.

11. Never be out of heart when you have done wrong. The Lord will forgive you if you

are really sorry. Never be over-confident when you have done right. You may fall next time.

12. Think often of the four last things—Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell. That will help you to be earnest. Think often of God's goodness. That will make you love him. And if you love him you will delight to do His commandments.

He that endureth to the end the same shall be saved.

O VERY GOD of Peace, sanctify me wholly; and, I pray Thee, preserve me in spirit, and soul, and body, blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, Amen.

The family being assembled, after a portion of Holy Scripture has been read, all devoutly kneel in prayer. It is recommended, when it can be done, particularly on the Lord's Day, that the First or Second Sunday-School Service be used, substituting these prayers for those in the Service.

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, in whom we live, and move, and have our being, we Thy needy creatures render thanks unto Thee for Thy kind care over us from the beginning of our lives unto this day, and especially during the night that is past. Since of Thy great mercy another day is added to our lives, we once more dedicate ourselves in soul and body to Thee and Thy service, in a sober, righteous and godly life: in which resolution, do Thou, O merciful God, confirm and strengthen us, that as we grow in age, we may grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

But, O God, who knowest the weakness and corruption of our nature, and the manifold temptations which we daily meet with; we humbly beseech Thee to have compassion on our infirmities, and to give us the constant assistance of Thy Holy Spirit, that we may be effectually restrained from sin, and excited to our duty. Imprint upon our hearts such a dread of Thy judgments, and such a grateful sense of Thy goodness to us, as may make us both afraid and ashamed to offend Thee. And, above all, keep in our minds a lively remembrance of that great day, in which we must give a strict account of our thoughts, words,

and actions; and according to the works done in the body, be eternally rewarded or punished, by Him whom Thou hast appointed the Judge of the quick and the dead, Thy Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
