



PREFACE.

A PREFACE, as a rule, contains the writer's apology for the appearance of his book. Such hardly seems necessary in the present instance. But it will be convenient to place upon record the various sources of information from which the materials of this work are drawn.

The main evidence for the entries given in the Register proper was afforded by a continuous series of School lists from the year 1835 to the present time. These were from 1835 (possibly from an earlier date) to 1850 printed annually in December. For entries during the years 1850–54 I had to rely upon the manuscript lists in Dr. Harper's Daily Absence Book. Printed lists, published half-yearly for the period 1854–1880, were kindly lent me by the Rev. H. P. Price. Since 1872 a School Register has been carefully kept, giving the name and age of each boy and his parent's or guardian's address. For permission to make use of this and other records in their custody my best thanks are due to the late and present Headmaster of the School.

The School lists, of course, give only the surname of each boy, and it was here, in assigning an identity to each name, that my real difficulty lay. But the task was rendered easier by the kindness of former Housemasters, who allowed me to make use of their private Boarders' lists. My thanks are specially due in this

connection to Dr. Harper, Mr. A. M. Curteis, and the Rev. O. W. Tancock.

I also derived much help from Dr. Lyon's Boarders' list (1823–1845) sent me by the Rev. O. W. Tancock, and from some Examination lists (1830–33) in the possession of the Rev. James Penny. The Register of Foundationers would have been found more useful, had it been more accurately compiled.

To Mr. W. B. Wildman I owe a deep debt of gratitude for the valuable assistance he has rendered me in the preparation of my book. No one was better qualified than he to write the chapter on the School Buildings. Chapters I., II., IV. of the Introduction, and the Appendix on the Cadet Corps are furnished by him; much too of the interesting matter in the notices of Headmasters is due to his research. The notes on Housemasters are based upon information kindly given me by the Rev. A. Wood. The Appendix on the Gymnasium was written by Mr. H. R. King: that on the Musical Society is an expansion of a paper by the Rev. A. W. Upcott. The list of names given in Appendix B. is derived from records left by the Rev. John Cutler, formerly Head-master of Sherborne, for which I am indebted to the courtesy of Mr. John Cutler, Barrister-at-law,

The poem, which forms the frontispiece of the volume, was most kindly written by Mr. Lewis Morris specially for this work.

In addition to those already mentioned, I would also take this opportunity of thanking a large number of Old Shirburnians for information given respecting themselves and their schoolfellows, more particularly Mr. M. H. Green, for a University Honours list (kindly copied for me by Mr. H. E. A. Cotton), and Mr. H. T. Twynam for several books containing the addresses of Old Shirburnians. My

thanks must also be accorded to my friends, Mr. H. R. King and Mr. L. S. Milward, for help rendered in revising the proof-sheets, and to my sister for compiling the Index.

In the entries of the Register I have endeavoured to maintain as much uniformity as was possible in a work of this kind. The chief distinctions, intellectual and athletic, of school life have been given, and, where such could be ascertained with certainty, the date of leaving. In the case of members of a University, the M.A. degree has not been noted.

Despite constant revision during the five years since this work was commenced, I cannot but be conscious of many errors, both of commission and omission. Where such are discovered, I should welcome corrections or additions, in case a second edition should ever be called for.



HISTORICAL INTRODUCTION.

I. THE SCHOOL BUILDINGS.

"And in his ears
The murmur of a thousand years."

To attempt a description of the School buildings without first telling the story of their origin, would be to rob the subject of half its interest. Something, therefore, must be told about the origin of Sherborne and its position in early English history.

The traveller who visits Sherborne for the first time soon finds out that he is in no ordinary English country town; the size of the Church suggests this to him, the group of School buildings suggests it. And, if he looks at those buildings with any care, he discovers that, among much that is new, there is a great deal that is old, and that this old work, a little of which dates as far back as the end of the 7th or the beginning of the 8th century, contains specimens of every epoch of architecture. A man who knows the usual arrangement of a Benedictine monastery has no difficulty in calling up before his mind's eye here in Sherborne the Abbey as it stood in the 15th century; he is easily able to fit in the buildings, which have passed away, with those which still remain. This, however, has been made a much easier task for those who are away from Sherborne, if they will only study for a few minutes Plan I., which shows very clearly, considering the mass of detail in it, what the shape of the Abbey buildings was at the dissolution in 1539. what monastic buildings still stand, now given up to School

purposes, what monastic buildings have disappeared and where these buildings stood.

Foundation of Town and Abbey.

After what is now the county of Dorset had been won for Wessex from the West-Welsh—a result completed about the year 681—the territory thus gained was added, so far as matters spiritual went, to the see of Winchester. But it soon became clear that such a vast diocese must be divided, and King Ine of Wessex determined therefore to divide his realm into two dioceses, an eastern and a western. Of the western diocese, which consisted of the modern counties of Dorset and Somerset with part of Wilts, the first bishop was S. Ealdhelm, Ine's kinsman, formerly Abbot of Malmesbury. In this new diocese, a region which stretches from Bridport to Bedminster and from Poole to Porlock, no better spot for the Bishop's seat could have been found than Sherborne, and we are not concerned to defend Ealdhelm's choice against the criticisms of William of Malmesbury (Gest. Pont. 175). The important point for us to notice is, that to its central position Sherborne owes its claim to be considered the second city of Wessex; here S. Ealdhelm fixed his Bishop's settle in the church of the lately founded Royal Monastery beside the clear spring or stream, the Fons Limpidus, which in the vulgar tongue was called Sciraburn.

Our town has no earlier history; it never was a Roman centre nor a British stronghold. Here, then, round about the Royal Minster of Ine and Ealdhelm, grew up the second city of Wessex, for the Oxon Dorchester seems ere this either to have passed into Mercian hands, or at any rate to have been felt to be too exposed a site for a West Saxon See. The date of the foundation of the Bishopric is 704, that of the Monastery and School perhaps a few years earlier. From the beginning down to the year 1122 the Bishop of the diocese, whether his throne was at Sherborne or at Sarum-on-the-Hill, was also the Abbot of

the Monastery and the Lord of Sherborne, and beside us, where the ruined castle of Bishop Roger still stands, was his chief dwelling-place.

The dignity, which for a brief space Sherborne held as Sherborne for a time the capital capital of Wessex, it owed to its situation; it lies to the of Wessex. west of and just within the skirts of what was once the forest-tract of Westwood or Selwood, on the high ground midway between sea and sea. The Fons Limpidus flows into the Parret, and so to the Severn sea; the stream, which rises some eight miles to the east of us, flows out by Christchurch into the English Channel. Unlike the Gwent of Hampshire, in which lies the capital of the older Wessex, Winchester, this backbone of the West on which our town stands is not easily accessible to marauders from the sea. King Ecgberht of Wessex (802-837) in right of an overlordship, which stretched from the Forth to the English Channel, styled himself "King of the English," but this greatness of Wessex was shortlived. The Northmen were again beginning to send forth their pirate-fleets as in the days of Hengist and of Cerdic; these Northmen, Danes as they were now called, swept like a storm over England; letters, arts, religion, governments disappeared before Only in one corner of the land did Englishmen hold their own throughout, namely in this Western or newer Wessex, of which Sherborne was the centre. Between the years 833 and 918 three Bishops of Sherborne, Abbots of our Minster, chiefs of that society of which this School formed a part, fell in battle against the Danes,-Wigberht, Eadmund, and Werstan. Æthelwulf, Ecgberht's successor, fought a good fight for his realm, and his best general and righthand man was Eahlstan, Bishop of Sherborne. The first complete victory over the Danes was won in 845 at the mouth of the Parret, and it was Eahlstan who won it. The dust of this warrior rests in

Sherborne, that of Æthelwulf at Winchester, for as yet the capital of the older Wessex was safe enough to be the chief seat of government. But it was not so with Æthelwulf's two elder sons, Æthelbald and Æthelberht: from 860 to 878 Winchester was too exposed a site for the West Saxon capital; Sherborne became the royal city. Hence it is, that Æthelbald and Æthelberht are buried in Sherborne Abbey; hence it is, that Sherborne, like Glastonbury and Winchester, is in some sort an earlier rival of Westminster itself. King Æthelwulf was succeeded by each of his four sons in turn, and their graves mark the headway made against the Dane; Æthelbald Æthelberht lie at Sherborne, Æthelred at Wimborne, and Ælfred at Winchester in the old home and capital of his race. When we remember how Sherborne was from 860 to 878 the royal city of Wessex, there is nothing absurd in our supposing that King Ælfred himself was once a boy in Sherborne School, the old School of the Monastery.

Sherborne declines in importance.

After the complete conquest of West-Wales, Devon at least, if not Cornwall, was added to the diocese of Sherborne: in 909, however, the dioceses of Somerset and Devon, with their sees at Wells and Crediton, were taken out of the diocese of Sherborne, and at the same time the diocese of Wilts and Berks, with its see at Ramsbury, was taken out of that of Winchester. Probably at this time, too, that part of Wilts, which had belonged to Sherborne, was added to Ramsbury, as it certainly formed a part of that diocese in the days of Eadward the Confessor. The diocese of Sherborne now consisted of Dorset only, and henceforward Sherborne was not central in the see. In 1058 the dioceses of Sherborne and Ramsbury were joined together by the Confessor under the rule of Bishop Hermann, who in 1075 removed his see to the waterless hill of Old Sarum, as being more central in the new diocese thus formed. There can be no doubt

that this transfer affected considerably the importance of Sherborne.

In the year 998 or 999 Bishop Wulsige introduced the Sherborne Benedictine rule into his monastery here. That this date under Beneis correct there is little doubt, though Hearne, in quoting and finally gets an Abbot of its the charter of Æthelred, by which this change was made, own. has substituted for Wulsige the more famous name of Wulsin. S. Wulsin, Bishop of Sherborne, died on the 8th of January, 973. Unfortunately for us, this charter of Æthelred, with that of Wulsige, which Hearne also quotes, is not now known to be extant. The record of Sherborne in Domesday is specially interesting. The Bishop appears as temporal lord of Sherborne, but nine of the manors which he holds are set apart for the maintenance of the monks, whose Abbot he is. The monks, therefore, had no freehold of their own; and the Bishop and the monks are mentioned as a body, a corporation, which was in the habit of acting together, in that curious entry in Domesday in which occurs the only mention of any of the Conqueror's sons. This entry tells how William the Red took away a possession of the church of Sherborne without the consent of the Bishop and the monks. The words concern some lands at Stalbridge, and run thus: "de eadem etiam terra tenet Manasses iii virgatas quas W. filius regis tulit ab ecclesia sine consensu episcopi et monachorum." the year 1122, Roger Bishop of Sarum and Abbot of Sherborne gave our Abbey an Abbot of its own by a charter of Henry I., and he made the Abbot and the monks a separate corporation holding property of their own apart from him. The first Abbot on the new footing was Thurstan.

Of all the Abbots of Sherborne none, not even Ealdhelm Bishop Roger himself, was more remarkable than Roger of Caen, the builder of the chief minister of the "Lion of Justice"; the first of that Church and great family of statesmen and financiers which gave four Sherborne.

Bishops to the English Church. He stands out in history not only as a statesman, but also as a builder of the first He created and organised the English Court of Exchequer, and his grandnephew, Bishop of London, is the author of the Dialogus de Scaccario. Architecture, both military and ecclesiastical, was a special taste of Roger's, and to him William of Malmesbury, his contemporary, ascribes the introduction of that later form of the Norman style, the fine-jointed masonry, of which we have such splendid fragments here in Sherborne, both in his Norman Castle and his Norman Church. he built on the site, no doubt, of the house of his predecessors in the see, his minster on the site of Ealdhelm's, which he pulled down. One little fragment he left us of the time that was gone, of Ealdhelm's own work, in the north side of the west wall of the present Abbey Church. way, which may still be seen there, carries us back to the end of the 7th century. The fact that the Abbey Church of Sherborne was not rebuilt earlier under Norman rule is proof positive, if we had no other, that Ealdhelm's church here was, in workmanship, superior to most of the pre-conquest English Churches. That it was a fine church is evident from what William of Malmesbury says of it. Writing of Ealdhelm (Gest. Pont. 378) he says: "habuitque sedem Scireburniæ, ubi et ecclesiam, quam ego quoque vidi, mirifice construxit." The defect in our Church was not its masonry, but its size; it was not on a large enough scale to satisfy the new ideas.

The Abbey Buildings at the dissolution of the monastery. The Abbey buildings, as we find them at the dissolution, are of various dates, but, with the exception of the fragment of Ealdhelm's church just mentioned, we cannot be sure that any are older than Bishop Roger's time (1102-1139). It is the peculiar distinction of Sherborne School among those comparatively few ancient schools of England, which

with a brief period of interruption—in our own case only eleven years—date back to the beginnings of Christianity in England, that it has kept so much of the old walls and of the very shape of the monastic house to which it belonged. It is worth a thought that out of all the Abbey buildings only two are still used by the sort of people by whom they were used in the eighth century. These two are the Church, in which the parishioners still gather as they did then, and the "Schole-House," in which Schoolhouse boys still gather as they did then, not now, however, to receive there food for the mind, but food for the body. In the Church the parishioners were almost intruders, for it was the monks' own church; the monastic school was not a very imposing part of the domestic buildings, nor were the scholars of first importance in the community. But now the last are first, and the first are gone. Among the scholars in Sherborne School, only a few years before Roger became Abbot, there was a little boy, who was destined to play a great part in monastic history; his name was Harding. In after years he became a monk, and took the name of Stephen. He is S. Stephen Harding, the real founder of the Cistercian order.

Sherborne history, that the account in Hutchins' "Dorset" is neither clear nor quite correct. An excellent account by Prof. Willis will be found in vol. xxii. of the Archæological Society's Journal. But it cannot be out of place to remind those students how strongly the anarchy of Henry VI.'s minority is brought home to us by this riot and burning. Well might men say in those days: Vae tibi, terra, cuius rex est puer.

The principal buildings of a Benedictine abbey were always grouped round the cloister-garth, which, as a rule, stood at the south side of the nave of the church. At Sherborne the cloister was on the north side. To understand what I am now going to describe, it will be necessary for readers to follow closely Plan I. In the centre of the garth was the conduit, used as a lavatory. The cloister had on each side eight bays, with six windows looking into the garth and built into walls of an earlier date. The builder of these cloisters was Abbot Frithe (1349-1371); the builder of the conduit, now removed to the parade, was Abbot Meer (1504-1535). The north wall of the cloister abutted on the Norman undercroft of the Abbot's Hall (now the chapel of the school). This hall is built in a line not parallel with the

church; hence resulted the irregular plan of the cloistercourt. The cloisters were vaulted, for the springing-stones, wall-ribs, and shafts still remain, mutilated, in the north wall of the north aisle of the church, and in the east wall of the class-rooms under the present school library. These walls formed the south and west walls of the cloister. On the east side of the cloister, forming a continuation of the north transept of the church, stood the monks' dormitory; under this was the chapter-house, and to the north of the chapterhouse, also under the dormitory, was the day-room of the monks; south of the chapter-house was the slype leading to the graveyard or "lytten," which is now the Headmaster's lawn. This slype still exists of thirteenth century construc-Its western exit is blocked up by a buttress of 1560, and over it still stands a portion of the dormitory, with single-light window almost untouched inside, but modernised outside. Eastward of this dormitory block, and about twenty-five yards north of the abbey choir, stood the Priory, with its garden to the north of it. Its site and shape are shown on Plan II. It became the property of the school in 1749, and was then removed. To the east of the Priory, on the site of the Headmaster's private house, stood the Infirmary, of which no trace is now left, except, perhaps, under-ground.

On the north side of the cloister, and south of the Abbot's lodgings, stood the Refectory. This, too, has entirely disappeared; but the abbot's lodgings and the kitchen are still standing, though much altered, and in parts rebuilt and converted into the Schoolhouse studies. The east and south walls of this block are modern, but the north wall is in the main of fifteenth century date. Here still stands a fine old chimney with panels, once carved with the symbols of the evangelists. Here, too, is a fine doorway of the same date with canopy and niches above it. In the projecting octa-

gonal block beside it were the stairs to the upper floor, and on its roof are some fine gargoyles like those of the Abbey Church. The chimney belonged to the kitchen. Next to the abbot's lodgings, and west of it, stands a very fine 15th century hall on a substructure of late Norman work. This was originally the abbot's hall, now it is the school chapel. It has been very carefully restored and increased in length by the addition of two bays to the west end. Of the undercroft, four bays, at least, and one of the low pillars are ancient Norman work; the windows are modern, and are fac-similes of those in Boxgrove Abbey. The magnificent timber-roof of the chapel is of the 15th century; but the chapel windows are modern.

On the west side of the cloister we have another fine 15th century hall on a substructure of the 13th century; this substructure was reached by a doorway, now blocked up, leading from the undercroft of the Chapel. This hall, now the Library, has been little altered from its 15th century condition; the stonework of the windows has been repaired and their number increased, the flying buttresses have been added, as well as two smaller ones, on the west side; a small adjoining block on the west, containing a staircase, has been removed, but it was standing in 1733 as is evident from Plan II.

This hall has a fine timber-roof of the 15th century similar to that of the chapel; the three northern bays, however, are of simpler details than the rest, and this appears to indicate the existence of a partition. The only ancient stairs to this upper floor, which still exist, are in a circular turret at the south-east angle of the building; this staircase is lighted by a 13th century single-light window. At the top of this staircase there is a doorway, now blocked up, leading into the upper story of the south alley of the Cloister, where the monks' Library probably

was. To what use the monks put this fine hall is a matter of dispute; Mr. Herbert Carpenter calls it the Guesten Hall, but there was at Kirkstall (a Cistercian Abbey, it is true) a building in the same relative position to the Church, and this building was the Dormitory of the Conversi. Mr. Carpenter, therefore, is not altogether averse to the theory, that the building under discussion was put to the same use. At Battle Abbey the Domus Conversorum stands on a substructure as ours does and adjoins the Abbot's Hall. The great staircase to the Library is modern.

The south alley of the cloister had an upper story entered as above described; if the piscina, still to be seen in the wall, is in its original position, there must have been a chapel here. There is now no door from this cloister into the Church; the arched recess on the inside of the wall of the north aisle of the Nave may have been a doorway; if so, the groining of the cloister must have been specially treated on a corbel; otherwise the shaft would stand in the middle of the doorway. There was, before the restoration of the Abbey Church, begun in 1848, a doorway in the west wall of the north transept, but it is The four-light flowing windows of the now blocked up. north aisle come below the level of the cloister-vaulting; these windows are modern and were put in by Mr. R. C. Carpenter, one of them in the place of an old and similar window, which must have been blocked up by the upper story of the cloister; the three buttresses here are modern.

The ancient Early English Lady Chapel was originally of three bays, with smaller chapels on each side; these latter were of the 15th century, similar in style to the choir aisles, and separated from them by stone screens. At the present time only one bay of the old Lady Chapel and the smaller southern Chapel are standing. This southern

Chapel is that of St. Mary-le-Bow; its fine fan-vault still exists, so also do the piers and arches of the one bay of the older Lady Chapel. How these Chapels were converted into the "Old House" I shall tell further down. The "Schole House" of the Abbey stood on the site of the later schoolroom, which is now the Schoolhouse dininghall, and is marked B in Plans II. and III. The monks' graveyard, as I have already noted, is the lawn in front of the Headmaster's house, part of the Great Court was also a graveyard, part a garden; the Headmaster's garden contains the site of the Abbey fishponds; the Abbey mill was by the present Bath, probably on the site of the carpenter's shop and the Museum; the farm-buildings were on the site of Abbey House and Abbey Lands, now School boarding-houses; the Abbey Barn, converted into a dwelling-house, is still called Abbey Grange; the great gate-tower has left one of its doorways and other fragments in the lane which leads from the Parade to the Church; the Almonry and the Hostel for travellers lie along the north of Halfmoon Street. It is now time to pass to the post-reformation history of the School.

The dissolution of the Monastery and the re-founding of the School.

For eight centuries and a half the Monastery and School of Sherborne had continued doing their work for the education of men and boys in this part of England, till on the 18th of March, 1539, Abbot John Barnstaple, with 16 monks, surrendered the Abbey, with all that belonged to it, into the hands of King Henry VIII.; the Abbot and the monks retired with good pensions, and the former died Rector of Stalbridge, in 1560, ten years after the school was refounded. On the 4th of January, 1540, Henry VIII. demised to Sir John Horsey, Kt., "councellor to the said Kinges grace," the house and site of the dissolved monastery, with all the demesne lands of the monastery situate in and about Sherborne. On the 25th of March, 1540, the

parishioners bought from Sir John Horsey the Abbey Church "for one C markes;" the Chapel of Alhalowes, which had been made the parish church one hundred years before, was abandoned, and what had been the church of the monks now became, by purchase, the church of the The dissolution of the monastery of course parishioners. involved the dissolution of the school; the want of the school was soon keenly felt, and on the 13th of May, 1550, King Edward VI., by letters patent, refounded Sherborne School, in answer to the petition not only of the inhabitants of the town, but also of "many others his subjects of the whole neighbouring country." By virtue of this charter our school takes precedence of all other post-reformation schools in England, for it is the first of them. In 1850, when the tercentenary of our renewed existence was celebrated, the following spirited lines were written to commemorate it by an old Shirburnian, Mr. Bruce Pryce, brother of Vice-Chancellor Knight Bruce:

Maiorum pietas ter centum illustrior annos

Hanc uoluit Musis consenuisse domum.

Sit uiridis tamen illa, precor, sit cruda senectus,

Antiqui mores ingeniumque recens.

This is a pious wish, and none hopes more sincerely than I that it will continue to be fulfilled, but in the year 1850 Sherborne School had been in existence not merely 300 years, but 1150 years, and surely that fact was worth recognising. The break in our existence of 11 years is not longer than the time which elapsed between the execution of Charles I. and the restoration of Charles II., and if historians do not date the beginning of the English Monarchy from 1660, why should we date the foundation of Sherborne School from 1550?

Just as in 1122, by King Henry I.'s permission, Bishop The Endow-Roger erected the Abbot and monks of Sherborne into a School. corporation separate from himself, so in 1550 did Edward VI. erect Sherborne School into a separate corporation, and endow it with the following lands, which had belonged to chantries connected with the Abbey:

- a. The chantry of Martock, in Somerset, with its rights and appurtenances and a capital mansion belonging thereto.
- b. The property of the said chantry, situate at Bradford, Brande or Bryan, and Barnardsley or Barnsley, in the parish of Wimborne, in Dorset.
- c. The chantry of St. Katharine, at Gillingham, with the capital mansion situate at Gillingham, and all lands, messuages, &c., in the occupation of situate in Gillingham, Silton, Milton and Cumbermead, formerly the property of the said chantry.
- d. All houses lands and rents in Lytchett Maltravers and Sturminster Marshall, belonging to Gibbon's chantry in Lytchett Maltravers.
- e. The free chapel of Thornton, in the parish of Marnhull, with its endowments.
- f. Thirty acres of land in the parish of Symondsbury, which had belonged to the chantry of St. Katharine, in the parish of Ilminster.

These lands were to be held by the Governors of the King, paying yearly into the Court of Augmentations 13s. 4d.; this payment has long ago been redeemed, and these lands the Governors still hold, with the exception of the Chantry House of Martock, which was sold in 1884.

The proper title of Sherborne School.

According to the charter of 1550, our school is styled Libera Schola Grammaticalis. It is libera, because it is free from the control of any superior body, except Parliament; it is not, as it once was, under the control of a monastery, nor is it under the control of a collegiate body, as are the grammar schools of Eton and Winchester. It is gramma-

ticalis, because it is a seat of higher education, grammatica; it has a right to the epithet regalis, because it is a royal foundation; but since the year 1871, when the Scheme of the Endowed Schools Commissioners came into force, its only legal title is Sherborne School, though here in Sherborne it may be convenient to speak of it as the 'King's School,' in contradistinction to the other schools of the place.

The Governors, twenty in number, who were nominated The Governors. by the King in his charter, were also then members of another Sherborne corporation; they were the Master and Brethren of the Hospital of S.S. John, in Sherborne, and from that time forward, until the introduction of the new scheme, a man who was elected a Brother of the Hospital of S.S. John was immediately afterwards elected a Governor of the School: but the two corporations were in law entirely distinct, owning separate estates and furnishing separate accounts; and the Minute Book of the Governors shows that the Master of S.S. John's Hospital was not necessarily Warden of the School. Though the term 'governors' is very early used to describe the governing body, the usual term in the Minute Book is the 'Company.'

Though the King had given us a Charter and an en- The first site of dowment, he had not furnished us with any premises, in which the school could be carried on. Sir John Horsey held all the domestic buildings of the Abbey, and it was therefore necessary to rent from him and in course of time to buy premises for this purpose. In the first school account extant, that of the 3rd year, there is a payment of 4d. "rente of ye Scholehouse" of the dissolved Monastery. In the year 1554, in the "accompte of Jarvis Aysshelee, "Warden and Receptor of all the rentes and revenues of "the said schole from the ffeaste of Saynte Mychell the "Archangell in the ffirste yere of ye Reynge of our

"Soveraynge Lady Queene Marye unto the said ffeaste of "Saynte Mychell in the ffirste and seconde yere of the "Reynge of Phillippe and Marye by the grace of God of "Englonde, ffraunce, Napilis, Jerusalum, and Irelonde, "Kynge and Queene," there is an entry of the payment of £40 to Sir John Horsey "in parte payment for the Schole-"house and the Plumbe-house with two gardens, whereof "one is called the Abbey Lytten, with all the voyde grounde "comynge of the late Chapell called the Bow and the "Ladye Chapell, and all that ground belonging to the said -"Scholehouse for the space of 99 yeres." In the following year there is a payment of £10, and afterwards other payments, until in 1629, the property passed entirely into the hands of the Governors, in consideration of a payment of £12 to Sir John Strangways and other trustees for a certain Coker, who then possessed the reversion of the The premises and ground thus obtained are marked by a red boundary in Plan II., where the block marked A is the Lady Chapels and B the Monastery schoolhouse. Blocks C and D were of course not vet built. and the two gardens alluded to are the piece of ground with red boundary lying to the north of the Abbey in the The Abbey buildings then standing within same plan. this space, beside the Lady Chapels and Monastery scholehouse, were the monks' Dormitory and the Plumbe-house, already ruinous and used as quarries. The north side of this enclosure was occupied by the Priory as shown in Plan II., but the Priory was not to belong to the school for The work of pulling down the Monastery Scholehouse and of building a new schoolroom on its site was at once begun; for we find an entry of the expenditure of 2s. 6d. for "takynge downe of the helyngstones (i.e. the roofing) of the said scholehouse," and another of 3s. 9d. "for ye takynge downe of walles of the saide house and for

"ryddynge of the same." After the work of destruction was over, timber was purchased "in the pke for the schole"; the "fellynge of it" and the ready sawing in the park are all items in the expense, the total of which comes to 24s. 6d. Next follows the "makynge of ye tymber worke" and, "makynge uppe of the two syde walles," and other details until a whole schoolhouse is erected at a cost of £12 15s. 3d.

In 1559 and the following year, John Jewel, Bishop of First site of Salisbury, co-operated with the Governors in preparing a House, residence for the master of the school, and the sum of £18 17s, 2d, was laid out on the building and finishing necessary to turn the two Lady Chapels into a dwellinghouse (marked A on Plans II. and III.). The chief external decoration of this house was paid for by public subscription, and cost £3 11s. 4d.; the decoration consisted of the "Armes of our late Sovereynge Lord King Edward the "Sixte," which were placed on the south wall of the house; under it were placed the arms of Bishop Jewel, of Horsey of Clifton Maybank, of Leweston of Leweston, of Mullens of Westhall, of Thornhill of Thornhill, and of another not now decipherable; underneath these are eighteen sets of initials, which belong to the other subscribers, several of whom The late King's Arms were Governors of the School. were also set up over the south door of the schoolroom.

In 1605 an extension of the buildings was needed, and Extension of money was raised for the purpose by the Governors; an Buildings in order was made in 1607 for the finishing of the extension in again in 1642. that year. This building was the block north of the schoolroom and marked C on Plans II. and III.; that portion, however, of the block which on the plan protrudes to the north-east was at this time built only of one story as a brewhouse and a woodhouse. In 1642, "it is agreed that "the Warden shall for the benefit and advantage of the "school rayse upon the side walls of the brewhouse and

the School 1605-7, and xxxii

"woodhouse belonging to the schoolhouse such chambers "as may be conveniently made and raysed on the same." This brewhouse and woodhouse with its upper story was removed in 1835 to make room for the Bell Buildings.

Sherborne School under the Commonwealth.

From the Governors' Minute Book we should never guess that Sherborne Castle was twice besieged during the Civil War; the only notice which is taken of the change of government is the account of the removal of the Royal arms. On the 10th of August, 1650, in the wardenship of Hugh Hodges, "the companie doe agree that the warden doe gett workmen to take downe the Kinges armes over the schole door and at the south end of the scholehouse, it being commanded and required by Captayne Helyar, a captayne for the Parliament, to be done."

Re-building of the Schoolroom in 1670

In 1670 the scholehouse of 1554-5 was pulled down, and a new schoolroom was built on its site, the block marked B in Plans II. and III. No particulars of the building are given, but we find an order for the statue of King Edward VI. to be put up again in the same manner as it had stood in the old school, and the same four lines are to be set up beneath it as were there before. run thus:

En tibi, Flos iuvenum, Britonum Decus, Inclytus orbis Splendor, Apollinei Deliciæque Chori, Gymnasium hic pueris statuit gratumque Minerval, Vt gratis discant—discito—gratus eris.

The Headmaster, Mr. Goodenough, is also desired by the Warden to "make a paire of Latine verses to putt under the Kinges armes," which have by this time been restored to their old place over the schoolroom door. this we owe the clever chronogram which, while describing the coat of arms, gives not only the date of the rebuilding of the Schoolroom (now the schoolhouse dining-hall), but

also the date of the re-foundation of the school. It runs as follows :--

Tecta Draco custos, Leo vin DeX, fLos Decus, auctor ReX pius, hæc servat, protegit, ornat, aLit.

It should be noticed that *Draco* is the subject of *servat*, Leo of protegit, flos of ornat, and Rex of alit. The date of the re-foundation of the school is got by taking the black letters in pairs, thus:—

In this same year an alteration was made in the block of buildings marked C on Plans II. and III., and a Library was formed in this block, which Dr. Highmore, Warden, was empowered by the Governors to furnish in 1676, and in the same year the school furnaces were altered so as to burn coal.

In 1697 another addition was made to the buildings, and Further extenthe sum of £320 9s. 6d. was expended on erecting a house sion of the School Buildat the west end of the school yard, between the Priory and ings in 1697. the Plumbe-house, containing a parlour and a woodhouse, "with several chambers over it for sick boys." Two years before a violent attack of small-pox had dispersed the school. This new block, known as the "Box Buildings," is marked D on Plans II. and III.; it was removed in 1855.

In 1749 the Priory and adjoining garden, or barton, The Priory were bought by the Governors; the building itself was bought in 1749 pulled down, and the site, together with the barton, was

turned into a garden for the Headmaster. The extension thus made to the school premises will be evident to any one who compares Plan III. with Plan II., and notes the wider extent of the red boundary.

The Bell Buildings set up in 1835.

The next extension of the school premises was during the mastership of Dr. Lyon, in 1835, when the Bell Buildings were set up. For the site of these buildings, Plan I. must be consulted. Over the doorway is the following inscription: "Scholæ Regali crescente fama adcrevit hocce ædificium, MDCCCXXXV."

The New Schoolroom, the Chapel, and the Schoolhouse Studies, 1855.

In the year 1850 the Rev. H. D. Harper was elected Headmaster of the School, and under him took place a development so wide and manifold that the story of it, if adequately told, would take up as much space as I have given to the history of the buildings from the Reformation Sherborne was enviably fortunate in down to 1835. having such a man at the helm at the time, when "the grand, old, fortifying, classical curriculum" was ceasing to be absolutely supreme. Mr. Harper has been for us all, and more than all, that Bishop Roger, our former Abbot, was for England in the days of Henry I. To understand what he did for Sherborne, readers should compare Plan III. Plan III. gives the state of the school when Mr. Harper took matters in hand, with this exception, that the Bell Buildings were already in existence at his accession. All that has been added to the buildings as depicted on Plan I., with that exception, was added in his time, except the blocks coloured red, which were already begun when he left, and the portions coloured blue, which were added in the time of his successor, the Rev. E. M. Young. By genius, by energy, by tact, by patience, with wonderful forethought and a just estimate of the educational needs of the time, he worked up Sherborne into a model school; but just as he was one of the greatest of schoolmasters, so was he one who least cared to have his achievements trumpeted abroad. I will therefore write no more on this head, but will leave the record of his deeds, written as they are so deeply on our buildings, to speak for him. "Omnia, quæcumque fecit, prosperabantur."

In the year 1853, Edward Earl Digby granted by deed to the Governors and their successors the block of buildings marked "Silk Mill" on Plans II. and III., with the adjoining land. This block consisted of the Guesten Hall, the Abbot's Hall, and lodgings, with part of the kitchen of the Monastery. These buildings had for years been used as -a silk-mill; they had been grievously mutilated; floors had been inserted at the level of the wall-plates, and the beautiful timber roofs had been cut through to make dormer windows. The restoration of these buildings was put into the hands of Mr. R. C. Carpenter, and he carried out the work with singular success. The Guesten Hall was turned into a "Big Schoolroom," the Abbot's Hall into a chapel, the Abbot's lodgings and kitchen into studies for the boys of the Schoolhouse. The chapel was consecrated on 17th February, 1855. The following inscription, carved in stone and let into the north wall of the Big Schoolroom (now the Library), commemorates this generous gift of Edward, Earl Digby :-

In this same year, 1855, the block marked D on Plans II. and III., known as the "Box Buildings," was removed.

New Schoolhouse Dormi-Headmaster's House built

1860-1.

In 1860 the Governors conveyed to Mr. George Wingtory Block and field Digby of Sherborne Castle the old Headmaster's house of 1559, marked A on Plans II. and III., for the sum of £3,000, and thus a building, which had belonged to the school from the very first years of its refoundation, passed out of the possession of the Governors; they still, however, rent it from Mr. Digby. It is devoutly to be hoped that, whether the school continues to occupy this building or not, no itch for restoration will ever induce anyone to lay hands on its external walls. To "restore" it, to convert it into a 19th century imitation of the past, would be to tear a page out of history; this building is more than any other the record of the Reformation in Sherborne, writ in In the same year the new private house of the Headmaster and the Schoolhouse dormitory block were begun, and finished in the following year. These buildings are satisfactory to look upon, and harmonise well with their surroundings. Sherborne owes much to Nature, but perhaps Nature's greatest gift to us is the beautiful stone which lies so near to our hand.

The Fives Courts, 1861.

In 1861, by the bounty of Mr. George Wingfield Digby, the Fives Courts were built pretty nearly on the site of the present Big Schoolroom; they were added to by subscription in 1869, and removed to their present site (see Plan I.) in 1874.

Extension of Chapel, 1865.

In 1865 the chapel and undercroft were extended two bays westward, the details of the original work being reproduced. Some Old Sherburnians will remember the room thus added to the undercroft as the Sixth Form class-In it the debates were for years held, and it has been the scene of much stormy eloquence.

New Classrooms, 1869-70.

In 1869 the new class-room block was erected which forms the west side of the small court, of which the chapel, the library, and the wall of Alhalowes Church form the other three. The block is worthy of its surroundings.

In 1873 the Abbey Mills and lands adjoining the west The Bath, of the school premises were bought by the Governors from Drawing the Trustees of Edward Earl Digby. The mills were penter's Shop, converted into a laboratory, music-room, drawing school, and Laboratory, 1873-4. and carpenter's shop. In 1890 the armoury of the Cadet Corps was also placed here. The swimming-bath, one of the great glories of Sherborne, was made in 1873, and the first "header" was taken by Mr. Harper.

Music-room.

In 1877 the chapel was again enlarged by the addition Extension of of a north aisle built on a perpendicular cloister, which runs Chapel, 1877-9. parallel with the undercroft of the chapel. The effect of this addition on the Great Court is thoroughly good; the somewhat massive buttresses give the building a stately look, and the cloister windows are a marked feature in the In the following year Mr. Harper's old pupils undertook the decoration of the chancel of the chapel "to commemorate the invaluable services rendered by him to the school during a period of twenty-seven years, from the year 1850 to the year 1877, during which he held the post of headmaster."

In 1877, Mr. Harper, just before his departure, had the The New Big satisfaction of seeing the foundations laid of the fine schoolre o.n., building, which is now our Big Schoolroom. It is a large and well-proportioned hall of perpendicular style, and is an excellent place for sound. In 1883 an opportunity occurred of forming, in the north wall, a recess for an organ chamber, and in 1884 an organ was placed there. The effect on the room of this addition is excellent, and, when in course of time the wainscotting is put in and the details of the existing woodwork are improved, it will be indeed a building to be proud of.

Under the Rev. E. M. Young, the buildings which

room was connected with the cloister under the north aisle of the chapel by a similar cloister, behind which was built the lavatory block, and thus the west side of the Great Court was completed. Now that the new Big Schoolroom was available not only for teaching purposes, but also for our concerts, it became necessary to devote the Guesten Hall (the former Big Schoolroom) and the music-room to other uses; in 1880 the music-room was fitted up as a museum, and in the same year the Guesten Hall was converted into a library. The library was extended and improved in 1881, and again in 1884. The conversion of this building to this purpose, and its internal improvement and decoration, are largely due to Mr. Young, and the result is a beautiful library. Of all our buildings, whether we look at it from the outside or the inside, it is, in my opinion, the most satisfactory. Its windows, some of which are of the 15th century, are of excellent proportion, and though the tracery of the window in the south end is somewhat meagre, the stained glass, with which it was filled to commemorate the Jubilee of Queen Victoria, has made this defect less apparent. The oak flooring, the oak book-shelves, the brass gas-pendants are thoroughly satisfactory.

Mr. Harper had planned were carried on. The Big School-

New Classrooms, 1883.

In 1883 a new block of class-rooms was built to the north of the present big school; this block is of good perpendicular work, and has one especially fine feature, viz., the staircase window. But the north wall ought to have been pierced by more windows; as it now stands it is almost a deformity.

Sanatorium. 1886-7.

In 1887 was completed the Sanatorium in the orchard to the west of the Headmaster's garden; its style is in harmony with our other buildings, but as it stands at some distance from the school, it does not appear on Plan I. is large and well designed for its purpose, and though it has

seldom to be used, that is not matter for regret. The Gymnasium is a temporary structure, excellent in its furniture, but unpicturesque in its appearance.

I should be going outside the scope of this notice if I were to describe the field with its pavilion, or the boarding-houses, which are dotted about the town, or the preparatory school. Excellent and essential as they are, they do not form one group with the buildings of the school. The exploits in the field will be dealt with elsewhere, and the associations connected with the houses are, after all, too special to be properly treated by me.

Such then is the outward aspect of our school to-day; it bears on its face the record of its origin and its long history; and not the school only, but much else that lies about it, speaks of England as a land of long and steady growth, step after step of which is written here in stone. In our Abbey we see the spiritual ἀποικία from our μητρόπολις of Malmesbury, but an amounia so mighty that it drew away from its mother her own beloved ruler, Ealdhelm; we see too the Cathedral Church of that vast diocese out of which in later time were made the sees of Wells and Exeter and Truro, and partly those of Salisbury and Bristol; we see in it too the last resting-place of saints and soldiers and kings, men by whose efforts England's freedom was kept alive, when all the rest of the land lay under the Northman's scourge. From the ridge, on the southern slope of which our town lies, we look down on the marshes of Athelney, whence King Alfred marched to win back the freedom of the older Wessex. In our Abbey we have the most perfect example of the perpendicular style of Western England, the style of Somerset, of Dorset, and of Gloucestershire. The Church of S. Mary of Sherborne, the Church of Bradford and of Ramsam has no peer, not even in S. Mary Redcliff. There is here too such fan-vaulting as was never

built elsewhere, not in King's Chapel at Cambridge, nor in Henry VII.'s Chapel at Westminster, nor in the Chapel of S. George at Windsor.

We have in our ruined castle, the work and dwelling-place of Roger of Sarum, a model of masonry so excellent, that it is hard for us to believe history when it tells us that this castle was built in the reign, not of the second, but of the first Henry. The gunpowder of the Civil War has blown much of it away, but it still tells very clearly what once it was. Hard by lies the home of Raleigh on its knoll beside the lake, the modern castle from which William of Orange issued his manifesto to the English people, and the wooded hills behind ring in the scene.

And last, beneath the great square Abbey tower, lies our own home, so venerable, so rich in colour, so rich in memories, the fair development of the old Benedictine spirit. There is a witchery in this spot which no words can tell; it has made itself felt on every sort of mind. Over one whom I knew its spell was such, that to the last hour of his life it held him in a bond as dear as it was strong. Alexander Longmuir, the latest benefactor of Sherborne School, fitly takes his place beside our benefactors of the past.

Harper, D.D., Principal of Jesus College, Oxford, and formerly Headmaster of the School, and to Mr. Herbert Carpenter's Paper on the Abbey and the School, vol. xx., Somersetshire Archæological and Natural History Society's Proceedings. I have also to thank Mr. Ruegg, late proprietor and editor of the Sherborne Journal, for the loan of documents and newspaper cuttings relating to the school; and Mr. Tuffin, of the Digby Estate Office, for allowing me to make tracings of the tithe maps of 1733 and 1834, which are in his custody, and upon which Plans II. and III. are based. I am also heavily indebted to the plan of the school buildings made in 1877 by Messrs. Carpenter and Ingelow, architects, upon which Plan I. is based. I thank, too, Mr. Hudson, Art Master of Sherborne School, for aiding my clumsy efforts and making these plans fit for reproduction. I have got a great deal of information from the old Minute Book of the Governors, which is now in the School Library. My thanks are likewise due to Mr. Brett, the Parish Clerk, for allowing me to consult at my leisure the old Parish Register.

II.

THE CHARTER.

THE Charter, granted by Edward VI. on the 13th May, 1550, is now in the Muniment Chest in the Library; it is exquisitely inscribed on vellum, the E of Eduardus, the S of Sextus, the D of Dei, the A of Anglie, and the F of Francie being illuminated and of fanciful design. The E is specially good; it represents Edward VI. seated on his throne, holding in his hands sceptre and orb, and is evidently meant to be a portrait of him.

The following is a true copy of the text:-

A body of statutes for the government of the School was drawn up soon after it was founded; but they have been altered from time to time by the advice of the Bishops of Bristol.

Statutes and ordinances of the Free Grammar School in Sherborne, Dorset, were made and established the 10th of October, in the 31st year of the reign of King Charles the Second, anno domini 1672.

"The Schoolmaster shall be obliged to undertake no other profession (otherwise than a minister of the Church of England) that may divert his diligence and care for the said school."

"Every scholar that shall be admitted into the said school

shall pay unto the schoolmaster 1s. 6d., whereof 4d. shall be for the master, and 4d. for the usher; and of so many as shall be yearly admitted into the said school between the feast of St. Michael and the same feast next after, the schoolmaster shall deliver up a roll of their names, with 4d. for every name so enrolled, unto the warden, to be enrolled in a book for that purpose kept by the warden, and 6d. towards the increase of books in the library, for which the warden shall yearly give an account."

"Each boy to pay 6d. yearly towards books."

Copies of the preceding and later statutes are preserved in the Muniment Chest in the School Library.

Under the Endowed Schools Act of 1869, a new scheme for the government of the School was drawn up, which came into force on the 16th of May, 1871.

III.

COMMEMORATION OF THE FOUNDATION AND GROWTH OF SHERBORNE SCHOOL.

In the year 1550 King Edward VI. granted letters patent for the Foundation of a Free Grammar School in the town of Sherborne, upon the humble petition of the inhabitants and others, and appointed certain lands, appertaining to the lapsed Chantries of the Abbey, to Governors named in the said letters patent, for its maintenance.

In the year 1554 the Governors of the School acquired of Sir John Horsey, Knight, the old Schole House of the Monastery, the Lady Chapels east of the Abbey Church, the Conduit House, the Dortoir of the Monastery, then standing on the north side of the Abbey, and a Garden known as the Abbey Lytten, for the space of ninety-nine years, and a new School Room was built on the site of the Monastery Schole House then removed. The freehold of these and some additional premises was purchased in the year 1629.

In the year 1558 Bartholomew Coombe charged his lands at Lillington by will with the payment of four marks yearly, towards the wages of the Usher of the School.

In the year 1559 a residence was provided by the Governors, with the co-operation of John Jewel, then Bishop of Salisbury, for the Master of the School, by the alteration of the Lady Chapels.

During the years 1605-7 a new School House was erected, to which additions were made in 1642; and in

the year 1670 a new School Room was built, which is now used as the School House Dining Hall.

In the year 1685 Dr. Nathaniel Highmore left a charge in his will upon the rents of certain houses in the Borough of Newland for seventy-six years, to serve as an Exhibition for a boy proceeding from the School to either of the Universities.

In the year 1749 the site of the School was further enlarged by the purchase of the old Priory and its adjoining garden.

In the year 1786 the School revenues were largely augmented through the active exertions of the Rev. John Chafie and Bartholomew Watts, Governors of the School, for the recovery of lands in the Parish of Lytchet Matravers.

In the year 1835 the Rev. Ralph Lyon, D.D., Head Master of the School, advanced a sum of money to the Governors for the erection of what are known as the "Bell Buildings," the cost of which was defrayed partly by himself and partly out of the School Estate.

In the year 1853 Edward, Earl Digby, granted by deed to the Governors and their successors the Abbot's Buildings and Lands adjoining; and large sums were expended during the two succeeding years in adapting them for School purposes. The whole of the Digby Buildings, comprising the Chapel and Crypt, the School Room, three Class Rooms, and Studies for the Scholars, were opened on the 17th February, 1855, on which occasion the Chapel, which was constructed without cost to the estate, through the surrender of a portion of his income by the Rev. Hugo Daniel Harper, Head Master of the School, was consecrated.

In the year 1853, in token of the affectionate esteem entertained towards the Rev. John Parsons, M.A., Vicar of Sherborne, a sum of £300 was devoted, in accordance with

his generous wish, to the establishment of an annual prize in the King's School, of the value of about £10, for the study of Divinity, and especially of the Greek Testament.

In the year 1856 a sum of about £170, raised by his friends to perpetuate the memory of the Rev. Ralph Lyon, D.D., formerly Head Master of the School, was devoted to the institution of Examination Prizes for all Forms below the highest, with the provision that respect should be had to the moral character as well as to the intellectual proficiency of the students.

In the year 1860, in consideration of the conveyance by the Governors to George Digby Wingfield Digby, Esq., of Sherborne Castle, of the House occupying the site of the Lady Chapels of the Abbey, the sum of £3,000 was paid over to them by him for the erection of a new School House, to which a further sum of over £2,000 was devoted from the School Estate.

In the year 1861 George Digby Wingfield Digby, Esq., of Sherborne Castle, gave £200 for the erection of Fives Courts, which were added to, by subscription of the friends of the School, in 1869, and again improved out of the Estate, upon their removal to a more convenient site in 1874.

In the year 1865 the Chapel and Undercroft were extended by subscription of the Governors, Masters, Parents of the Scholars, and Former Members of the School.

In the year 1868 Anne Gordon perpetuated for ever the endowment of the Leweston Prize of £10 for the encouragement of Classical Scholarship, originally dependent upon the annual liberality of her father, Robert Gordon, Esq., of Leweston House.

In the year 1870 four new Class Rooms were built by the Governors at a cost of £1,500.

In the year 1873 the Abbey Mills and Lands were

purchased of the Trustees of Edward, Earl Digby for £5,305; and the former adapted for the teaching of Science, Music, Drawing and Carpentry. In the same year a Swimming Bath was provided for the use of the School.

In the year 1876 the Rev. Henry Hall Houghton, M.A., and the Rev. John Haydon Cardew, M.A., former members of the School, gave £500 to provide prizes for the encouragement of the Study of the Holy Scriptures in the Original Languages, in memory of the late Rev. Ralph Lyon, D.D., Head Master of the School, and the late Rev. John Parsons, M.A., Vicar of Sherborne.

In the year 1877 a Pavilion was erected upon the Cricket Ground by subscription of the Masters and Former Members of the School, at a cost of about £400.

In the year 1877 the School Chapel was enlarged by the erection of a North Aisle, and a Cloister added to the Undercroft. In the following year the Chancel was adorned, the Organ improved, and the whole building refitted. The cost of the Aisle was partly defrayed by subscription of the Governors, Masters, and Friends of the School; and that of the Chancel decoration was undertaken by former pupils of the Rev. H. D. Harper, D.D., to commemorate the invaluable services rendered by him to the School during a period of 27 years, from the year 1850 to the year 1877, during which he held the post of Head Master. The building was re-opened for Divine Service on the 23rd March, 1879.

In the year 1879 a New School Room was opened upon the 3rd July, and subsequently connected with the Digby Buildings by a Lavatory and Cloister. The whole was erected by the Governors out of the estate, at a cost of about £5,000.

In the year 1880 the room formerly used as a Music

Room was fitted up as a Museum, to which valuable contributions were made by various friends of the School. In the same year the ancient Guesten Hall of the monastery, used as a Schoolroom since the year 1855, was converted, without cost to the estate, into a Library, which was extended and improved in 1881, and again in 1884.

In the year 1881 the Rev. Brooks P. Lister gave £100 to found a prize for the encouragement of the study of German. In the same year the Chapel was further enlarged by the extension of the Harper aisle, at a cost of £430, which was defrayed by Masters, Scholars, and Friends of the School.

In the year 1883 a new block of Class Rooms was erected at a cost to the estate of about £ 1,900.

In the year 1884 an Organ was placed in the School-room, by subscription of the Masters, Scholars, and Friends of the School, and a gallery erected in accordance with the original design. In the same year the sum of £250 was expended by the Governors in conveying the pure water of the Newell Spring to the School Bath.

In the year 1888 E. Bowen, Esq., of Harrow, gave the sum of £100 for the foundation of a Prize for History.

In the year 1889 the Rev. E. H. Plumptre, D.D., Dean of Wells, gave the sum of £ 100 to found Prizes for Mathematics for forms below the Sixth.

In the year 1891 Alexander Davidson Longmuir, Esq., for 19 years Art Master of the School, bequeathed (1) to the School Library all his books, together with a valuable collection of paintings in oil and water colours by himself and other artists; (2) to the Drawing School all his apparatus as an artist, together with his prints, engravings, &c.; (3) the sum of £1,140 to be applied by his executor, either as to corpus or interest, for the benefit of the Scholars of the School.

IV.

THE GOVERNING BODY.

THE Governing Body created by the Charter of 1550 was a Corporation, with a common seal, holding certain lands as described in the account of the growth of the School and its buildings. After the Endowed Schools Act was passed in 1869, the first School dealt with was ours. By the new scheme, drawn up in consequence of that Act, and put into force on May 16th, 1871: "All lands and hereditaments, not being copyhold, belonging to the Trust, and all terms, estates, and interests therein, shall from the date of this scheme vest in the Official Trustee of Charity Lands and his successors: And all stock in the public funds and other securities belonging to the Trust, shall be transferred to and vest in the Official Trustees of Charitable Funds, by whom the dividends and income arising therefrom shall be from time to time paid to the Governors or their order." (Scheme, § 25.)

"From and after the date of this Scheme the existing Corporation of the Governors of the possessions, revenues, and goods of the School of King Edward VI. in Sherborne, in the County of Dorset, shall be dissolved, and, except as herein otherwise expressly provided, all property, rights and powers vested in that Corporation shall be transferred to and vest in the Governors created by this Scheme." (Scheme, § 29.)

"From and after the date of this Scheme, all rights and powers reserved to, belonging to, or claimed by, or capable of being exercised by, the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, or any other person as Visitor of this Trust, shall be transferred to Her Majesty, and exercised only through and by the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales." (Scheme, § 30.)

The owner, therefore, in the eyes of the Law, of our real estate is the Official Trustee of Charity Lands; the owners of any stock or other securities, which we have, are the Official Trustees of Charitable Funds. Any property beside the above is vested in the Governors, who are the managers of all the property, subject to the control of the Charity Commissioners.

The present Governing Body is not a Corporation; they are rather in the position of Managers or Managing Trustees—Managers for that part of the School property which is not vested in them, Managing Trustees for that which is.

The number of the Governors is 16; of these 16 there are 3 ex-officio Governors, viz.: the Lord Lieutenant of the County of Dorset, or some person named by him, the Bishop of Salisbury, or some person named by him, and the Vicar of Sherborne. Of the remaining 13, five are Representative Governors; four of these five are elected by Members of Parliament representing the county and borough constituencies of Devon, Dorset, Somerset and Wilts, one Governor being elected by the aggregate county and borough members of each county; each of these Governors holds office for four years, and every year one retires; the order of rotation for retirement is Devon, Dorset, Somerset, Wilts, and representatives are re-eligible. The fifth Representative Governor holds office for five years, and is elected by the Masters of the School; he is re-eligible. The remaining eight Governors hold office for life, and are called Co-optative. A Co-optative Governor is appointed by the other Governors at their first ensuing meeting after a vacancy, but no appointment of such a

Governor is valid until the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales have certified their approval of the choice under their official seal.

The proper style of the School is simply "Sherborne School," under the Scheme of 1871. This is plain from the Declaration to be signed by a Headmaster after his election, which runs as follows: "I ————, declare that I will always, to the best of my ability, discharge the duties of Head Master of Sherborne School," &c. (Scheme, § 35.)

- 1604. George Grove.
 - Richard Newman, M.A. The date of his election is not known. In the Burials Register of the Abbey Church, under the year 1641, occurs the entry "Richard Newman, schoolmaster." Toogood omits his name in the list of Headmasters, and writes, "Mr. Robert Balch succeeded Mr. Grove, but I do not find in what year, nor any particulars worthy of notice." The entries in the Minute Book under 1641 are careless.
- 1641. Robert Balch, M.A. [spelt also Baulsh]; probably the Mr. Balch of Wadham Coll. Oxf., who was tutor to Thomas Creech, and to whom the latter addressed his translation of the 14th Idyll of Theocritus. In the Minute Book, under Sept. and Oct., 1654, Robert Balch gives receipt for certain money paid to him on his resignation. His name is not given in Hutchins' list of Headmasters.
- 1654. William Bristall, "from Ottery St. Mary." On March 14, 1660, his removal was proposed, on the ground that he was a Parliamentarian.
- 1662. Rev. Josiah Allen [Allenson], "from Taunton." On Jan. 4, 1669-70, he accepts the living of "Melbury in Dorsetshire." His name is omitted in Hutchins' list.

^{*} Mr. John Toogood, himself an Old Shirburnian, was an energetic Governor of the School during Mr. Bristed's Headmastership. His MS. History of the School, based on the Governors' Minute Book, is preserved in the Muniment Chest in the School Library.

- 1669-70. John Goodenough, M.A., "from Ilminster." He was the author of the chronogram Tecta Draco custos, &c. [In 1673 the Dean of Sarum attempted to excommunicate Mr. William Plowman, usher (or sub-master) of the School, on the ground that his license to teach had not been given by the Dean. The Governors determined to try the matter. Mr. Plowman is ordered "to leave his place of usher unlesse he forbears to execute the office of a minister in preaching or otherwise." He resigned his post in 1675, and was succeeded by Peter Blanchard, parson of Monkton in 1681.] Mr. Goodenough was ordered in 1673 to sit with his scholars in church in the place appointed for him, and not elsewhere without leave of the Company. On Oct. 8, 1683, he was ejected from his Headmastership.
- 1683. Rev. Thomas Curgenven, M.A., master of Blandford School; resigned on being presented to the Rectory of Folke, 1694, but continued to be master till Lady Day, 1695; died 1712.
- 1694. Rev. Thomas Creech, B.D., Fellow of All Souls' Coll. Oxf., 1683-1700. He had been a pupil of the Rev. Thomas Curgenven at Blandford School, and is said to have been educated also at Sherborne; elected Scholar of Wadham Coll. Oxf. 1676; B.A. 1680; B.D. 1696; resigned the Headmastership, 1695. [Under 4th Sept. 1694, in the Minute Book, there is the notice of his election to take effect Lady Day, 1695, but "he afterwards refused the said place and came not."] He was the author of a celebrated translation (1682) as well as an edition (1695) of the text of Lucretius. Among his other less known works were translations of Horace and Theocritus. He died at Oxford, by his own hand, in June, 1700, aged 41 years. [See Dict. of Nat. Biography.]
- 1695. Rev. George Gerard, M.A., "from Blandford"; resigned, 1719; subsequently Rector of Church Stanton, Devon; died, 1721.
- 1719-20. Rev. Benjamin Wilding, M.A., of Balliol Coll. Oxf., and master of Bath Grammar School; Author of 'The Duke of Buckingham's Epitaph explained and vindicated.' An attempt made in 1721-22 to eject him for breach of School statutes involved a lawsuit, which was won by him. Died, 1733, "as he was walking with Milton's Paradise Lost in his hand, on a Sunday morning, in the Bristol Road" (Toogood).
- 1733. Rev. John Gaylard, M.A., Fellow of Emmanuel Coll. Camb., and Rector of Winford, Somerset. He had been elected usher (submaster) 1723. Died, 1743.

He resigned the Headmastership of Sherborne in 1751. [See Hutchins' Dorset,' iv. 290.]

HOUSE MASTERS.

During the Headmasterships of Dr. Lyon and the Rev. C. T. Penrose, boys were received in the School-house and a few in the house of the Rev. T. James. Subsequently under the Rev. H. D. Harper a number of additional boarding-houses were established.

- 1855-1860. The Rev. J. T. Pearse took boarders in the house on Greenhill, afterwards occupied by the Rev. P. R. Clifton.
- 1858-1863. The Rev. A. C. Clapin had what is now the Music House.

 This house was converted into the Preparatory School, which was subsequently removed to Westbury House.

- 1861. Mr. A. M. Curteis opened Westbury House as a boarding house. In 1868 he rented and largely added to Abbey House, to which at the end of the year he transferred his boys. This was the first occasion on which building was undertaken for the School outside its gates. In July, 1876, Mr. Curteis resigned his house, the lease of which was taken over by the Rev. A. Wood. On the last-named ceasing to be a house-master in January, 1888, Mr. C. S. Whitehead succeeded to Abbey House, to which large additions and improvements were made. In January, 1893, Mr. W. B. Wildman took the house on the resignation of Mr. Whitehead.
- 1864. The Rev. W. B. Stanford opened a house at the corner of Newland and Cheap Street. In 1868 the Rev. P. R. Clifton succeeded to the house-mastership, transferring his boys to a more convenient house on Greenhill, which had formerly been used for a private school. Upon Mr. Clifton's death in June, 1872, his house passed to the Rev. H. P. Price, who kept it until 1890, when the house ceased to exist.
- 1865. The Rev. O. W. Tancock opened the old Angel Hotel on Greenhill as a house, of which he afterwards bought the free-hold, making large additions. In 1880, on Mr. Tancock's appointment to the Headmastership of Norwich Grammar School, Mr. T. W. Wilson succeeded to his house.
- 1871. The Rev. A. Wood adapted two houses in Newland (Cold Harbour Lane) as a boarding house, which was opened in January. In 1876 Mr. Wood succeeded Mr. Curteis at Abbey House, and his boarders were transferred to Mr. Price's house on Greenhill.
- 1872. Mr. W. L. Hetherington took a lease of Abbey Lands, which was opened as a boarding house in January. During the year additions were made to the house. Mr. Hetherington resigned his mastership in 1880, upon which Mr. James Rhoades bought his lease and took over the house. On Mr. Rhoades' resignation in January, 1893, Mr. C. H. Hodgson succeeded to the house.
- 1872. The Rev. J. Blanch bought the freehold of the Retreat, and opened it as a boarding house in January, 1873, making large additions subsequently.
- 1883. Mr. W. B. Wildman opened a house in Newland, from which at Easter, 1885, he transferred his boarders to a new house in Westbury. On Mr. Wildman giving up his house in 1891, it was converted into a convent.

In 1886 Mr. W. H. Blake built Acreman House as a Preparatory School, to which he transferred his boys from Westbury House.

APPENDIX E.

SHERBORNE GAMES.

CRICKET.

The earliest Eleven list extant is that of 1858, and, though the names of certain members of Elevens of an earlier date have been ascertained, it has been found impossible to reconstruct with accuracy the teams for previous years.

From 1865 to 1887 an annual match was arranged with Clifton College. Only a brief summary of the results of these matches is possible here:—

- 1865. A tie. The score is lost.
- 1866. Sherborne won by 20 runs. Scores: Clifton, 52, and 104 for three wickets; Sherborne, 72, of which E. L. Tuson made 40 (not out).
- 1867. Drawn. Sherborne, 119 (M. T. Gray, 35); Clifton, 53 for two wickets.
- 1868. Clifton won by ten wickets. Clifton, 86, and 35 for no wickets; Sherborne, 66, and 52.
- 1869. Sherborne won by seven wickets. Clifton, 113; Sherborne, 139 for three wickets, of which H. T. Twynam made 43 (not out), W. H. Game 28 (not out), O. H. Channer 27, A. F. E. Forman 24. For us J. P. Wills took six wickets for 36 runs.
- 1870. Sherborne won by 11 runs. Clifton, 78, and 33 for one wicket; Sherborne, 89 (J. C. Heathcote 32, not out, O. H. Channer 25), and 143 (W. H. Game 49, H. T. Twynam 27, J. C. Heathcote 26).
- 1871. Drawn. Clifton, 358 (W. Fairbanks 129, not out); Sherborne, 32 for two wickets).
- 1872. No match played, owing to illness at Sherborne.
- 1873. Clifton won by 56 runs. Sherborne, 104 (H. Whitehead 34); Clifton, 160 (T. W. Lang 59), and 252 for two wickets (F. Taylor 133, not out, W. C. Rawlinson 60).

- 1874. Clifton won by an innings and 83 runs. Sherborne, 83 and 52; Clifton, 218 (A. H. Heath 120, not out).
- 1875. Clifton won by an innings and 35 runs. Sherborne, 178 (R. T. Finch 89), and 46; Clifton, 259 (R. E. Bush 111). In the Sherborne 2nd innings, A. H. Evans took six wickets for 18 runs.

ATHLETIC SPORTS RECORD.

The cadet company wears the territorial uniform, not the uniform of the volunteer battalion. The first battalion of the regiment won for itself at the Battle of Plassey the proud motto, "Primus in Indis," which every Sherborne cadet wears upon his cap-badge and helmet.

The idea of forming a cadet corps had often been put forward at Sherborne, but it was never worked out till the third term of 1888. On the 15th September of that year, Mr. Wildman was gazetted honorary-captain of the company about to be formed, with an establishment of 71 officers, non-commissioned officers, and privates. There was no difficulty in getting that number together, though there had been some lukewarmness on the part of certain of our School body, who thought that a cadet corps would interfere with the games of the School. Our experience, however, has shown that this notion was a mistake; parades have been so arranged as to fit in perfectly well with the regular school games, and the smartest cadets are never "loafers." In fact, "loafers" who join the company and prove incurable resign after a short trial.

Sherborne was one of the four schools which formed the first Public Schools' Provisional Battalion at Churn Camp in 1889, thus starting a movement which has grown more wide, and which ought to tell favourably in course of time on the volunteer force in general. Sherborne has not yet distinguished itself as a shooting school. This is partly to be accounted for by the fact that until this year we were hampered by difficulties about a range.

These difficulties have now been entirely overcome, and the school has the use of the range of the "G" Company of the 1st V.B. Dorset Regiment.

The corps possesses two handsome challenge cups—the Shirburnian Cup, and the Marksman's Cup. The former was given on the 26th February, 1889, by the editors of the Shirburnian, and is held for a year by the best House shooting team. The latter was given on the 7th May, 1889, by W. Heitland Blake, Esq., Head-master of the Preparatory School, and is held for a year by the best marksman of the company.

APPENDIX G.

THE OLD SHIRBURNIAN SCHOLARSHIP FUND.

This fund was instituted in 1870 for the purpose of "establishing one or more scholarships at Sherborne School, by the annual subscriptions of old Shirburnians." For twenty years three scholarships were awarded annually; in 1890 two only were given. At the same time all donations and life subscriptions were set aside for investment, and, when opportunity offered, the balance of the annual income was applied to the same purpose. In this way by the year 1886 the sum invested amounted to £,407 12s. 1d. of New Zealand Consolidated 4 per cent. Inscribed Stock. 1891 it was resolved at a general meeting of the subscribers that all annual subscriptions should be included in the investment account, in order to complete the endowment of one annual scholarship. In February, 1893, the sum of £,126 15s. 9d. was ordered to be invested, and it is calculated that the capital of the fund will provide an annual scholarship of about £21. present trustees are Messrs. E. F. Henley and C. Chatteris. subscribers hope to offer two or more scholarships every year. The annual subscription is one guinea, paid on January 1st; by a donation of ten guineas an O. S. becomes a life subscriber. For further information regarding the fund application should be made to H. H. House, College Grounds, Malvern, the present hon. secretary.

APPENDIX H.

THE GYMNASIUM.

A TEMPORARY gymnasium, seventy feet by thirty feet in size, was erected in 1885, in the field north of the Music House. The building is not worthy of its surroundings, but the want of a gymnasium had been long severely felt, and the erection of one could not be further delayed. The gymnasium has been tolerably successful up to the present date, and as popular as this not too popular branch of athletics generally proves. It is to be hoped that we shall not have to wait many years before a good permanent gymnasium worthy of the school is built.

In the spring of 1886 a challenge cup for Houses was given by Messrs. J. Moore and H. V. Weisse, who were then masters, and this cup has been competed for since that year. On no less than six occasions has the cup gone to Rhoades' House, who have always been foremost in their public-spirited support of the gymnasium, while in 1892 Wilson's managed to wrest it from them by the narrowest possible margin. Besides the House competition there is a competition for places in the School "Six," to whom gymnasium colours are given, the number six being reduced in any year if less than six reach a proper standard of excellence. Prizes are also given to the best gymnast under sixteen and fifteen, provided a good standard is reached.

Since 1888 the school has sent up its two best gymnasts to Aldershot, to compete against members of other Public Schools, as well as representatives for the boxing competitions. The highest place reached was in 1889, when Sherborne (Kimber and Swanwick) came out equal third in the list of the schools; and two

APPENDIX I.

THE MUSICAL SOCIETY.

THE hundredth concert of the Sherborne School Musical Society was given on Monday evening, December 19th, 1887. On this occasion there was appended to the programme an account of the origin of the Society, written by the Rev. A. W. Upcott, who was himself one of its first members and its first treble soloist. With the writer's kind permission this account is reproduced here.

"The Sherborne School Musical Society was born, I think, in the spring term of the year 1871. Some of us, who were musically inclined, were dining, as we often did, at the house of our dear old master, Mr. Percival Clifton, who then did all he could for the music of the School. Mr. Sterndale Bennett had just been appointed mathematical master, and Clifton, with many of his familiar winks and chuckles, spoke mysteriously and with bated breath of a certain Society which was to perform selections from 'Judas Maccabaeus.' We did not know then who or what 'Judas Maccabaeus' might be; all our musical attempts had hitherto been confined to singing 'From Oberon in Fairyland,' and such like glees; so we received the intimation with a certain amount of awe. However, his promise was fulfilled, and not long after a few of us assembled one spring evening in a room under the school-room, and there, with the school harmonium for an instrument, and Mr. Sterndale Bennett for instructor, we attacked 'Hail, Judæa, happy land.' remember the names of many who took part in that first practice, but five of them were certainly F. G. M. Lynch, J. C. McCaul, — Brown, and E. A. and A. W. Upcott.

"The Shirburnian of those days, I fancy, rather despised these

early efforts; at all events, I cannot find much account of the first concerts. We went on grinding at the choruses. Later on the practices were transferred to an upper class-room in the new buildings, and occasional concerts were given in that class-room. I remember one practice, on a Sunday evening, being rudely interrupted by the sounds of the fire-bell, which caused a sudden exodus of the performers. But the first great concert was given in the old Town Hall, in March, 1872, the performance consisting of selections from 'Judas Maccabaeus' and Mendelssohn's 'Lauda Sion,' accompanied by a band gathered together by Mr. Sterndale Bennett. The concert, I fancy, caused no little stir in the town; I doubt if such a band had ever played before in Sherborne. Mr. T. Price sang 'Arm, arm, ye brave.' The other solos were sung, I think, by Lynch, McCaul, and A. W. Upcott.

"From that time music began to flourish at Sherborne. 'Samson' was our next victim, the upper class-room being still the scene of most of our concerts. Poor Clifton died suddenly in the middle of the summer term, 1872, having just lived to see the Musical Society an established fact.

"Of the subsequent early history of the Society the Shirburnian gives fairly regular, though occasionally somewhat meagre, accounts. I do not know what others may think of the Society in its early days; but, speaking of myself, I feel that I owe a debt of deep and life-long gratitude to Mr. Sterndale Bennett for what I learnt of music at Sherborne. I remember he played through to me Bach's Passion Music to 'St. Matthew' with running comments thereon, and I am the proud possessor of a copy of the 'Messiah' marked by his illustrious father, Sir W. S. Bennett, who happened to be in chapel once when we were practising for an anthem. Mr. Bennett had great difficulty in overcoming the traditions of the School, which were anything but musical, and the way he worked and succeeded was a lesson of perseverance. wards learnt to play the 'Sonata Pathétique' of Beethoven as I have never been able to play it since. It is not too much to say that the whole course of one's life seems to have been altered by those first glimmerings of real musical taste and training."

The subsequent history of the Society is contained in its programmes; yet there are a few events, the dates of which may be noted. On July 28th, 1873, was given the first concert in the new concert-room, now the School museum. On November 25th in the same year Mr. Parker made his first bow to a Sherborne audience. Mr. Regan appeared for the first time in February, 1874. Mr. Sterndale Bennett conducted for the last time on July 30th, 1874 (the 28th concert of the Society), when Mendelssohn's 'St. Paul' was performed. The School Orchestral Society was founded in February, 1876. Mr. Parker conducted for the first time at the 30th concert, on November 13th, 1877, when the programme included Romberg's 'Lay of the Bell.' On the first Commemoration Day, July 3rd, 1879, the new School-room was opened, and the 40th concert was given in it; the programme included Mendelssohn's 'Lauda Sion,' and Beethoven's Symphony in C. Mr. E. H. Donkin's name occurs for the first time at the 57th concert, November 4th, 1880. The same concert was rendered noticeable by the assistance of Aptommas, the harpist. The first School-song, 'Fair and Grey and Ancient,' written by Mr. James Rhoades, was sung on Commemoration Day, June 29th, 1881. At the 79th concert, on Commemoration Day, June 25th, 1884, the organ was opened by Mr. Thomas Wingham. concert, on February 19th, 1885, was devoted exclusively to Handel's works, in celebration of the 200th anniversary of that composer's birth.

Appended to the programme of the rooth concert, on December 19th, 1887, was as complete a list as could be drawn up of the choral and orchestral works performed by the Society since its formation. This included 33 oratorios, &c., by 17 composers, 153 part-songs by 60 composers (including six School-songs), and 70 orchestral works by 24 composers. The collection of school-songs is the joint work of Mr. James Rhoades and Mr. Parker, who, since the rooth concert, have given us six more. For our spirited 'Carmen' we are indebted to the Rev. E. M. Young and Mr. Parker. On Commemoration Day, June 22nd, 1888, Mr. Parker's 'Silvia' was performed, and on a similar occasion in the

following year the Society gave a most successful rendering of Sullivan's 'Golden Legend.'

At Easter, 1892, Mr. Parker resigned his mastership, and Mr. C. H. Hodgson became honorary director of the School music. "No words," says a writer in the *Shirburnian*, "can adequately express what Sherborne music owes to the musician, whose loss the school has now to deplore. A mere list of the works performed during the many years in which Mr. Parker has held the office of director of music would show how generation after generation of Shirburnians has by his means been brought to the knowledge of great works of musical genius, 'whose echoes roll from soul to soul, and grow for ever and for ever'; and though we wish him all success in his new life in London, that life can hardly be more truly serviceable than the life spent at Sherborne of high musical aims and unremitting industry and energy."


