Associated Press Dispatches to The Times. WASHINGTON, March 17.—Secretary Bayard has written a letter to Senator Miller, Chairman of the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations, giving him all the information possessed by the State Department concerning Barrios' movement.

The first intimation received by the department in regard to the revolution in Guatemala, was from Barrios to the President announcing that he had assumed the title of Supreme Military Chief, and that the Minister of Foreign Relations of Guatemala would come to Washington.
