Weed Out The Weak

hese are rugged times for federal law enforcement agents. We know that, recently, you have been the targets of sharp criticism. Here at *SOF*, many of us are Vietnam vets. And we understand, better than any other group in America, how that feels. We understand the natural tendency to respond as though criticism is directed at you, personally.

We remember what it was like to be subjected to scorn, contempt, and even outright hatred when we returned from Vietnam. We won't forget the flower-children who adored humanity so much that they spat on their own people in uniform, while "peacefully" lobbing bags of urine and dog feces. We remember what it was like to suffer under a lying and greed-inspired bureaucracy who used us to solidify their personal political agendas.

We remember how ashamed we felt when indifferent leadership, with inadequate supervision, led to the massacre at My Lai. We remember those who cursed us then — many of whom condemn us now for our criticism of aspects of your leadership. We also remember how bitterly we, in the field, resented the blame heaped upon us for the failures of our civilian and military decision makers. Most importantly, we remember what it feels like to watch comrades die during a mission so poorly defined, and so utterly lacking in direction and competent strategic planning, that it was doomed to failure - and thousands were needlessly sacrificed.

We have identified and are critical of a number of current failings in federal law enforcement. But, these failings are *not* your fault, and we are not blaming you. However, we hold accountable *some* of your leaders. We hope to see the weak and incompetent among them weeded out; and to see those who deserve punishment re-



ceive it in spades. Then, we want reforms installed that will clarify missions and provide training, guidance and oversight to ensure that the errors of the past are not repeated.

We are not voicing this simply because we are good citizens. Ultimately, we want to see federal law enforcement restored to its rightful stature and function. Unlike many of those who currently claim to support you, we have trudged down your road; we know what it feels like and do not want to see you treated the way we were. SOF is not your enemy. We swore the same oath to defend the same Constitution as you; you





I WAS THERE

Folded Flags, Empty Caskets

he field phone urged that I not doze off. It was Ed Taylor, division operations officer.

"John, hate to bother you but the 3/22 had a bad explosion on one of their tracks this afternoon. They lost the entire crew. The old man is going out there at first light and he needs to be brought up to speed on exactly what happened. I've got a chopper that can take you to brigade headquarters, and they can get you to the company location."

"I'll be up in about 20 minutes," I said, wondering what sort of accident could have caused a mortar carrier to explode. At the command post, Ed further advised me that the 3/22 had been engaged in a minor skirmish with VC earlier that afternoon, but that the explosion was not enemy-inflicted.

The assistant operations officer at brigade had little to add to what I knew. Apparently, the young lieutenant company commander, standing behind the track, had been blown backward when it exploded. He was shaken but otherwise unhurt. The track had been firing its 81mm mortar on an enemy location when the accident occurred.

The brigade chopper took me to the company location and dropped me off in the middle of a dark field. I was beginning to feel quite alone until I was hailed by a human voice that materialized into a silhouette, which I followed into the company perimeter and

into a nearby track.

The lieutenant couldn't have been more than 24 but his young face showed the wear of war. As I looked at him, I thought of the Korean War, where such young faces were covered with beards and handlebar mustaches — for many, hoping to conceal their youth. The hardened old sergeants didn't give a damn how old they were. They just wanted them to be honest and willing to learn, and to care about their men. They didn't mind sharing responsibility. Most had trained 15-20 platoon leaders in their life times.

He shook my hand and offered me a seat on one of several packs strewn around the APC. The lights gave a yellow-greenish glow that made it easier for someone coming from total darkness to adjust. I told him who I was and why I was there and in-

formed him that he could expect a visit from the division commander at first light. I wanted to talk to anyone who saw or would have knowledge of the explosion, to include the platoon leader or platoon

I also wanted his perspective first, as commander, and second, because of his close proximity to the incident. The lieutenant's

eves were tired and he still looked a bit woozy from the explosion some eight hours before. His voice was calm and modulated as he related to me the facts as he knew them. The company had been engaged in a light skirmish earlier in the day and it was near dusk when he decided to "circle the wagons" and set up a perimeter. Someone spotted what they believed were VC and they fired several mortar rounds, attempting to zero. They began to "fire for effect" while he was standing behind and off to the side of the track when it suddenly exploded, killing the crew and almost completely destroying the APC. The ammunition on the track was the probable cause of the extent of the explosion.

He was knocked down, as were several others, but without other injuries. Tears welled in his eyes as he spoke. I thanked him and asked if there was someplace I could question others. They had already set up an APC for me, and a sergeant had a list of those they felt I would want to interview.

"Thank you again, Lieutenant. I'll inform you of my findings in the morning after I check out the track." We shook hands and the sergeant escorted me to a nearby track, where I would spend the rest of the night conducting my investigation. It was now 0230, with dawn only hours away. Time was crucial if I were to have a report, hopefully with some valid conclusions, for the CG.

The platoon leader and platoon sergeant could add little. I interviewed several others in the immediate vicinity but no one had any idea as to what caused the explosion. Having been a 60mm mortar section leader in my early enlisted days, I could only conclude that a round misfired in the

sergeant. Some 75,000 of the venerable M113-series APCs have been made over the years, nearly 3,000 of those being M125series mortar carriers. With a nominal issue of 114 81mm mortar rounds, the mortar carrier was no place to be if the basic load went up due to hostile action — or operator error. Here ARVN troops and their U.S. advisers sweep an area west of Saigon in conventional APCs.



SOF ON OKC BOMB: PRO & CON

Richard Sherrow's article "Bombast, Bomb Blasts & Baloney" (Jan. '96 SOF) was excellent and factual. The fatuous claims, in another publication, that ammonium nitrate (AN) has too much moisture, or that 4,800 pounds is too much to detonate, or 4,800 pounds of fertilizer plus fuel oil (FO) wouldn't do that much damage, obviously come from the uninitiated (no pun intended).

AN fertilizer is available everywhere: at your home and garden store, agricultural-chemical supply, farm-supply store, etc. This isn't quite as good as explosives grade (harder prills), but still works like a damn. The only "preparation" needed is the right amount of FO

True, the velocity of detonation of ANFO is 10,000-14,000 feet per second (fps) slower than many other commercial explosives, but the huge volume of gas pressure given off during detonation is what does more damage than the detonation wave itself.

The detonation wave likely shattered and cracked the [Oklahoma City] structure all over, but the gas pressure wave would likely be what brought everything tumbling down. (Sort of like the "air blast" from a gigantic avalanche.) This air blast, along with the detonation wave, likely was responsible for some of the closer (2-3 blocks, anyway) peripheral damage to other structures.

To put it in simple terms, for simple but pretentious people like Ted Gunderson, high-velocity explosives (22,000-26,000 fps) tend to *shear*, while lower-velocity commercial products like ANFO *crush* the medium. I base these statements and observations on 14 years' experience with commercial explosives, both as a technical representative and as a blasting foreman in the logging, mining, and construction industries.

Keep the excellent articles and coverage coming, gentlemen. In 20 years of reading *SOF*, I haven't been disappointed yet.

I read with great interest Richard Sherrow's article in the Jan. '96 SOF and would like to explain or correct some points he may have mistaken.

The cited description [from The Spotlight publication of the "Gunderson Device" as an "electro-hydrodynamic gaseous fuel device" is not necessarily self-contradictory nonsense. Hydrodynamic pertains to the interacting forces and motions of an incompressible fluid; it specifically applies to the physics of detonations. Electro-hydrodynamic is a modification of the term to include Ampere or Lorentz forces arising from large electric currents passing through the fluid. (Lightning is an "electro-hydrodynamic" phenomenon whose destructive potential is often similar to that of an explosive.) That electrical forces might have a prominent role in the "Gunderson Device" is suggested (but unexplained) by the electrical references in the diagram.

"PBNX5" may or may not be a bogus nomenclature. If it is truly some new kind of explosive, it may not be widely known. The reported high densities may also be a possibility if powdered metal is an ingredient, to provide a high heat of combustion. Metal additives could include titanium (density: 4.5) and zirconium (density: 6.44), both of which have been considered as ingredients of highburn-rate, solid rocket propellants. A mixture of 25-percent PBX and 75-percent zirconium, by weight, would result in a composite density of 3.8, corresponding to one of the density values cited.

A striking feature of the "Gunderson Device" schematic diagram [reprinted in *SOF*] is its

similarity to the primary/secondary configuration of a thermonuclear bomb: A primary detonation (e.g., the PETN capsule) provides an energy release used to compress and initiate a secondary detonation (e.g., the "PBNX5" column). If this process simultaneously involves the application of large electric currents, phenomena quite unlike conventional chemical explosions may result. ...

The "Q" clearance required to gain special access to nuclear weapon-design information is no fiction, as suggested by Sherrow. It is a clearance investigated by and issued by the U.S. Department of Energy. ...

Also, the comparison of a 5,000-pound ANFO truck bomb to a [WWII, German] V-2 missile's impact is not technically appropriate. All physical damage is produced by the application of forces; in explosions, this involves transfer of momentum from the bomb gases to the target. Perhaps a sixth of the truck bomb's blast was directed toward the Murrah Building (a cone with a 90-degree apex angle), and perhaps the bomb gases were moving at 500 feet per second (fps). This would result in about 0.4 million pound-seconds of impulse available to interact with the building. The V-2, in addition to its 1,650-pound warhead, consisted of 8,840 pounds of dead weight impacting at 3,300 fps, resulting in 0.9 million pound-seconds of impulse coupled directly into its target. ... The relative damage effects of a truck bomb and a V-2 might be quite different. It is inappropriate for Mr. Sherrow to compare them as he did in his SOF article.

FULL AUTO

Art & Science Of Machinegunnery



f you ask most "recreational" shooters who own an M60 GPMG or some type of Browning machine gun what the T&E (Traversing & Elevating) mechanism is, they will tell you it attaches the rear of the gun to the tripod and is used to elevate the gun up or down and move it from side to side from one fixed target to another. Ask them what all the numbers indicate on the elevating hand wheel and the traversing bar and they'll just shrug or mumble something incoherent. Ask the majority of soldiers or Marines lying behind an M60 GPMG mounted on an M122 tripod the same questions and you'll get the same response. This is a military tragedy, as the science of machinegunnery was once highly regarded in the armed forces and a great deal of time and effort was expended upon mastering its complex skills. Today, most so-called machine gunners are little more than trigger-pullers who only know how to point and shoot.

Before we discuss the T&E mechanism and how to use it in a professional manner, we need to understand some basic terminol-

ogy and concepts concerning deployment of a machine gun that is fired from a bipod or tripod (not a shoulder-mounted submachine gun or assault rifle). As I have said many times before, the machine gun is an area-target weapon. Although it is often employed against point targets, it was not originally designed in the late 19th century with this in mind.

When a machine gun is fired in bursts, no matter how sturdy the tripod or how many sandbags have been placed on its legs, all

> of the bullets do not follow the same trajectory like some sort of laser beam. This is a function of vibrations induced by varying tolerances between the gun and the cradle. and between the cradle (or flex mount) and the tripod itself. In addition, each cartridge will have enough of a difference in propellant charge weight and projectile weight and configuration, no matter how minuscule, to produce a slightly different trajectory. Furthermore, shifting winds and other nonhomogeneous atmospheric conditions will also spread the trajectories in a burst group.

This group of trajectories formed by a single burst is called the cone of fire by machine gunners. When this cone of fire strikes the ground it forms an elliptical pattern referred to as the beaten zone. As the range to the target increases, the elliptical shape of the beaten zone becomes shorter and wider. The slope of the ground also affects the shape of the beaten zone. When firing onto slopes, the beaten

zone becomes shorter, but retains the same

width. When firing onto ground that slopes away from the gun, the beaten zone will become longer. The center of the beaten zone is called the *center of impact*.

Fire from a machine gun is classified with respect to 1) the ground, 2) the target and 3) the gun itself. There are two classes of fire with respect to the ground. When the angle of fall of the bullets with reference to the slope of the ground is such that the area of danger is for all practical purposes confined to the beaten zone (when this occurs, the length of beaten zone is also shortened by a considerable margin), this is referred to as plunging fire. Plunging fire is obtained by firing from high ground onto low ground, firing into sharply rising ground, or firing at extremely long ranges. When the center of the cone of fire from a machine gun does not rise above the height of a standing man (6 feet), this is called grazing fire. A machine gun fired from a sandbagged tripod over level or uniformly sloping ground can achieve grazing fire at ranges up to 800 yards with a .30 caliber gun.

Four types of fire can be defined with respect to the target area. Frontal fire is delivered at an angle perpendicular to the front face of the target area. Flanking fire is delivered along the side of the target. Oblique fire, a term rarely used anymore, is obtained when the long axis of the beaten zone is at an oblique to the long axis of the target area. Enfilade fire occurs when the long axis of the beaten zone coincides with the long axis of the target area. It can be either frontal fire, if the enemy troops are moving toward or away from the gun in a single-file column, or flanking fire, if the gun is positioned on the enemy's flank and they are moving abreast. Enfilade fire makes the most efficient use of the machine gun's capabilities, as it places the greatest number of bullets on the target area.

There are six classes of fire with respect to the gun and understanding them is a key factor in mastering the proper use of the T&E mechanism. Fixed fire is that which is delivered onto a point target that can be adequately covered by the depth and width of the beaten zone. Searching fire is fire distributed in depth by successive changes in elevation of the gun. Searching fire is employed against targets too deep to be covered by the length of the beaten zone. A burst is fired after each change in elevation. While the exact amount of elevation change depends upon the range and topography, on level ground, a change of 2 mils is usually employed as it results in the successive beaten zones overlapping each other.

Traversing fire is distributed in width by successive horizontal changes in the gun's point of aim. Again, a burst is fired after each change in the gun's horizontal position. UNITED STATES

Marines cut back on traditional roles with the Navy to save manpower: detachments withdraw from Navy cruisers and those on aircraft carriers reduced 40%. Worse, the Army is moving in: Its choppers are deployed on carriers and some amphibious vessels get Army "air bosses."

CIA reports "mole" Aldrich Ames exposed nine Soviets later executed for working for U.S. and also aided in massive misinformation campaign designed to portray the Soviet military as far more powerful than it was, possibly wasting billions of defense dollars. In 95 cases, CIA passed along reports from sources it knew were suspect without labeling the confidence level of the data.

RUSSIA

In an increase in activity, Akula and Oscar II subs shadow U.S. aircraft carriers and missile subs near American coasts. CIA reports Russia still regards prep for nuclear war with United States to be high priority. Analysts say military's nuclear waste dumps on the Kola Peninsula are more dangerous than Chernobyl.

A package of radioactive cesium is discovered in a Moscow park. Planted by the leader of the raid on southern Russia, Chechen rebel Colonel Shamil Besayev claims to have four more packages combining TNT and radioactive material.

Hours after the army raises its flag over the captured city of Jaffna, LTTE rebels launch a carbomb attack on a police post near Kalmunai and follow up with an infantry assault leaving 69 dead. An investigation of captured LTTE records shows that \$7 million per month paid by the government to employees in rebel-held areas had in fact almost entirely been diverted into LTTE coffers. LTTE reorganizes for long-term querrilla warfare.



SCIENCE INTO JFK ASSASSINATION

Bad news for fantasoid Oliver Stone and other conspiracy promoters: Exacting scientific studies done by members of the International Wound Ballistics Association should lay to rest forever the weird speculation that has swirled around wound ballistic and forensic evidence aspects of the John Kennedy assassination. Questions left unanswered by the Warren Commission have dangled tantalizingly before conspiracy buffs for decades, and these questions have bred with misconceptions to spawn a whole publishing genre dedicated to the proposition that

unrationalized aspects of physical evidence "proved" there were more than one shooter. This in turn "proved" there was a conspiracy among men. Just who these men were supposed to have been, varied with the particular theory being pitched but promoters almost universally seized upon loose threads of ballistic evidence to "prove" their theory.

Alas for the conspiracy industry, those loose ends have now been woven into a coherent and precise knot by a cadre of scientists who have experimentally recreated the physical ballistic phenomena that have been so puzzling. Considering the importance of the case, this should have been done three decades ago by the Warren Commission, but it was not.

Now that the insight and scientific methodology of contemporary specialists have resolved the haunting questions, anyone with even a passing interest in any of the bogus theories should read the result of this new work. Fortunately, copies of the 30-page report have been published in Volume 2, Issue 2 of Wound Ballistics Review, the journal of the International Wound Ballistics Association. Gestapo," June '92), has been dismissed in federal court, according to Steve Sessinghaus, Lawmaster's attorney. The suit, which also named ATF Special Agent Blair Ward as a defendant,

alleged abusive excesses of authority and unnecessary property damage. A judge decided that the property damage was not sufficient to justify a civil tort claim, Sessinghaus said. (Wonder how the judge would feel if it had been his house that was trashed.) Ward was also the architect of misery for the Louis Katona family in Ohio (see "Miscarriage of Justice," April '94). An Appeal is under consideration. —JLP

CIVIL DEFENSE EXPENDITURES

Civil suits filed against federal agents in the bloody aftermath of Waco now total more than \$1

billion. Uncle Sugar is spending your tax dollars to defend, among others, nearly two dozen BATF agents named as individuals in the several suits. Except one: Robert Rodriguez, the only ATF agent who had the courage and intelligence to try to stop what he knew would be a disaster, was advised by the Justice Department that he will have to pay for his own legal defense.

Rodriguez, the undercover agent who had pleaded in vain for more time to build a legitimate case, later tried to call off the ill-planned raid, telling raid commanders Chuck Sarabyn and Phil Chojnacki that Branch Davidian leader David Koresh was aware a raid was imminent. Sarabyn

and Chojnacki ordered the raid to go ahead anyway, subsequently lied to federal investigators about knowing their cover had been blown and then tried to scapegoat Rodriguez for the raid's failure.

CONCEALED CARRY STATS

The success of right-to-carry laws has antigunners wringing their hands and stumbling over themselves trying to put a negative spin on the matter. But the most recent data from the FBI Uniform Crime Reports show that states with right-to-carry laws have significantly lower overall violent and firearm-related crime per capita. For instance:

- —handgun homicide rate 41% lower
- —overall firearm homicide rate 29% lower
- —firearm robbery rate 38% lower
- —firearm aggravated assault rate 19% lower
- —overall firearm violent crime rate 29% lower

Further, rates for various crimes where the criminal does not use a firearm are significantly lower (an armed society is a polite society, etc.): overall violent crime 22% lower; homicide rate 31% lower; robbery rate 36% lower; aggravated assault rate 14% lower.

In Florida, the homicide and handgun homicide rates have dropped 22% and 29% respectively since they adopted a right-to-carry law in 1987 — while the national rates rose 15% and 50%. Florida's overall violent-crime rate during this period has risen less (17.7%) than the Unites States as a whole (22.3%) — and today only 30% of Florida's violent crimes involve the use of firearms.



WIRETRAPS

Last year the Federal Bureau of Investigation reached out and put the touch on Congress to force telephone companies to provide enough wiretapping capacity to keep up with new developments in technology and criminal endeavors. The FBI recently published a small notice in the Federal Register, announcing just how much capacity it estimated it would now need. If granted, it would represent a vast

taps. Federal wiretaps now number about 800 a year, the FBI says. Their requests are for the ability to monitor one of every 100 calls and tap up to 1,000 phone lines in specific localities. That sweeping capacity would certainly imply some vast changes to us. The bureau emphasizes that each wiretap would be under court order and based on probable cause and that they do not seek to weaken that standard. But can you imagine a judge giving proper consideration to a stack of a thousand probablecause documents? It makes one suspicious that they have some more surprises in store to facilitate implementation of what they have in mind. And we have to wonder just what that is.

High technology is being used more and more in crime, and police agencies need the tools to combat it - but if they required 800 wire taps last year, why do they require the ability for millions

WEAPONS SHORTS

Beretta USA Corp. has received an \$18.5 million follow-on contract to supply 45,098 M9 9mm pistols to the Navy; contract includes an option for another 28,000 for other military services. Since initial 1985 contract for 315,930 pistols and follow-on contracts for 77,000 more, Beretta has delivered some 390,000 M9s to DoD customers. Largest federal law-enforcement order has been for 16,000 for the INS.

An agreement has been signed between Romania and Bell Helicopters for Romanian production of 96 AH-1F Cobra attack helicopters, with Bell providing tech transfer, production tooling and training.

The Army has let contracts for production of new MILES gear that will classify hits as from enemy or friendly fire, and show if the hit is fatal or disabling. It weighs 80% less than existing systems.

U.S. Special Operations
Forces are buying 192 miniature
underwater GPS receivers
(MUGRs) from Trimble, USA, to
be used in covert ops such as
maritime over-the-horizon insertion/extraction missions; will provide SpecOps forces with
precise, real-time position and
navigation information.

India has contracted to buy 100,000 AKM rifles from Romania's Romtehnica for \$85 each, after the Bulgarian MoD failed to supply the weapons per contract at \$65. India's homegrown 5.56mm hybrid weapons system (assault rifle, carbine, light machine gun) is now four years behind schedule. India has also bought 30 million rounds of ammo, reportedly from North Korea. These weapons are for selected army and internal security units. **

WHAT-A-SAW

We received a What-A-Saw for T&E just before a freak early storm here in the Rockies dumped a load of wet snow on trees that still had their leaves, blocking the streets with more test material than one could hope for. We worked the What-A-Saw hard and it thoroughly vetted itself.

The What-A-Saw is a compactly folding triangular bow saw with three blades nesting in the spine, which will virtually disappear in the corner of a ruck or under the seat of a vehicle, but be worth its weight in gold when you need a saw, because it's a real saw. Its three blades will cut everything from limbs to lumber; from frozen bone to steel pipe.

The 21-inch cross-cut blade cut 10-inch green maple with no problem. We have some hours on a Swede saw, and this little cross-cut, bow-saw blade is as efficient as any of its type we've yet seen. After

cutting more than a rick of green maple it's still as sharp as out of the box. The "utility" blade did a fine job on dry and hard wood, frozen meat, bone and plastic pipe. The hacksaw blade proved as good as any, and will cut a much larger piece than will a regular hand hacksaw: We cut through a piece of 8-inch well casing in a single pass; where we'd have had to cut from four sides with a regular hacksaw.

The What-A-Saw weighs less than a pound with all three [replaceable] blades; is only 3x21x1 inches, folded, and has a unit cube of only .073. PUNCH-UP GATE

In a truly bad Harry Truman burlesque, the Prez has offered (if he were an ordinary person, which he happily is not) to bring his defense of Hillary to the nose of New York Times columnist William Safire, who had the temerity to call her a congenital liar. Those are strong words, and we don't fault the Prez for feigning a physical inclination toward her defense, especially since that defense would make as much sense as any other, as far as actually refuting myriad allegations of her wrongdoing.

It may be impolite to attack the families of politicos, but not if they have injected themselves into the public political arena. During the election Hillary warned us that she and Bill were a "two-for-one blue-plate special," and we should have realized this was not mere supportive rhetoric. Although nobody elected her to anything, she's been in our face ever since. as self-righteous as can be. A "sinner with sainthood on her mind" columnist Maureen Dowd called her. Noting that we of the great unwashed are supposed to trust that Hillary is working for the greater good, Dowd put it succinctly: "Her primary sin is the sin of sainthood. There are corners that only holy people will permit themselves to cut. Piety and power are old partners."

In a totally beside-the-point attempt at defending Hillary, the Prez said, "There are worse things than wanting every American child to have health-care coverage." "Certainly," writes Dowd, "but it was the First Lady's secrecy and righteousness in trying to push through her 1,364-page bill that doomed the [national health-care] effort, just as her secrecy and righteousness bollixed up the lives of bureaucrats working in the travel office."

Just how truly righteous vs. self-righteous is Hillary's "righ-

teousness"? In his controversial column entitled "Blizzard of Lies" Safire minced no words: "Americans of all political persuasions are coming to the sad realization that our First Lady ... is a congenital liar. Drip by drip, like Whitewater torture, the case is being made that she is compelled to mislead, and to ensnare her subordinates and friends in a web of deceit."

The 10,000% Profit

Strong words, which Safire then backed with examples: such as her story about reading *The Wall Street Journal* to explain her 10,000% profit in 1979 commodity trading, which "we now know was a lie told to turn aside accusations that as the Governor's wife she profited corruptly, her account being run by a lawyer for state poultry interests ..."

Hillary's Travelgate Surrogates

"The abuse of Presidential power known as Travelgate." Safire noted, "elicited another series of lies," when Hillary induced a White House lawyer to flatly assert Hillary did not order the firing of long-serving White House travel aides - who were subsequently harassed by the FBI and Justice Department, to justify their firing and replacement by Hillary's cronies. A memo longhidden from investigators now tells us that there would have been "hell to pay" had Hillary's wishes been ignored. The career of the lawver who carried Hillary's lie to authorities is now shot ... but Safire noted that Hillary did lie for good reason: "to avoid being identified as a vindictive political power player who used the FBI to ruin the lives of people standing in the way of juicy patronage."

Safire had many points to make regarding Hillary's lies swirling in the aftermath of Vince Foster's death — good points but too voluminous to quote here —

and of "lost" documents that suddenly turn up when the FBI locates copies elsewhere. "By concealing the Madison billing records two days beyond the statute of limitations," Safire noted, "Hillary evaded a civil suit by bamboozled bank regulators." More records are expected to be uncovered, and former aides' and partners' memories refreshed, he expects, since "they were willing to cover her lying when it advanced their careers, but are inclined to listen to their own lawyers when faced with perjury indictments."

Creature Of Habit

"Therefore, ask not 'Why didn't she just come clean from the beginning?' She had good reason to lie; she is in the long-time habit of lying; and she has never been called to account for lying herself or in suborning lying in her aides and friends," Safire concluded.

On tour to promote her warm 'n' fuzzy book It Takes A Village (no it's not about Vietnam; it's a kid's book), Hillary alluded to those who dare question her pure motives and conduct only by saying her Mamma told her to never give in to bullies. Ah, yass, Hillary Pureheart is only a victim of cruelly partisan Republican bullies and male chauvinists who can't stand a woman in power.

Some would say it's the duty of the loyal opposition to oppose that which they are in opposition to, especially if they smell something crooked. As for those who are uncomfortable with her power, just maybe the objection simply is to someone in a position of power — male, female, or a Democrat who is still deciding — who has never been elected to that power.

And some, of course, simply don't like any person who doesn't think enough of others to tell them the truth. 🛪

In December 1995, SOF received word that John Garang de Mabior, commander of the Sudanese People's Liberation Army (SPLA), would be in Washington, D.C.,

in the history of revolutionary and conventional warfare.

During the Sudan's "Anyana 2" movement in the early 1980s, Col. is supported by Iran, Libya, and Saudi Arabia; its weaponry is mostly old Soviet and British equipment. Regular units of the Sudanese army are supplemented by young, poorly

> trained mujahideen. Khartoum also arms various Muslim

tribal militias. The government is believed to have sheltered terrorists involved in the World Trade Center

bombing as well as would-be assassins of Egypt's President Mubarak.

SOF: Bashir's forces launched air raids against civilian targets, despite U.N. protests that the Khartoum government had introduced "a new and very dangerous element" in the civil war. It has continued unabated. I've witnessed the terror bombings of civilian targets and churches. What is the U.N. currently doing to stop this?

Garang: What is the U.N. doing? Well, the bombings have been going on ever since the war started. They

against the Sudan's National Islamic Front (NIF) government. Senior SOF Correspondent Rob Krott, who previously had reported on the SPLA in the field, was dispatched for a long-awaited interview with Garang. (Krott's previous reports from Sudan are "Land Without Mercy - War Without End," Aug. '94, and "We Kill Them Like Sheep," Sept. '94.) They met in an Ethiopian restaurant in Washington.

Garang is a former Sudanese army colonel who holds a doctorate in agricultural economics from Iowa State University. He also is a 1975 graduate of the U.S. Army's Infantry Officer Advanced Course. A student of the writings of von Clausewitz, Mao

Garang was sent south to fight the guerrillas but instead joined them and emerged as their leader. He disputes the notion that the war simply is a religious-ethnic conflict between Christian and animistic African blacks in the south and the Muslim, Arabic-speaking north. Rather, it is the result of economic and political discrimination. The SPLA received military support from Ethiopia, but Garang strongly denies NIF claims that the SPLA has received aid from Uganda and Eritrea. His SPLA comprises 25,000 to 40,000 troops, mostly of the majority Dinka tribe.

The Khartoum government of General Omar Hassan Ahmed al-Bashir

use high-altitude Antonov [Soviet-made] bombers to bomb the civilian population; to bomb cattle; cattle camps; to deny food to the population. These atrocities have been ongoing for the last 12 years. What is the U.N. doing? Nothing. There was talk at one point about safe havens for the civilian population. There was talk about an air-exclusion zone where the civilian population would be protected in certain areas, but all this came to naught.

SOF: One of the major targets seems to be churches. I witnessed this at Chukudum and Pagari [southern villages]. Yet the SPLA weren't in these structures or in any way using them. Is that the situation today?

Garang: Churches have been bombed. Hospitals have been bombed. Villages without any SPLA presence have been bombed. Cattle camps have been bombed. It is part of the tactics of Khartoum to kill off the civilian population of southern Sudan. The government in Khartoum has said this. They want the land, not the people. So it is part of Khartoum's

strategy. They define the SPLA, or the "rebels," as anybody in SPLA-held territory. For example, they have been asked by humanrights groups about prisoners of war. They do not have prisoners of war. We have prisoners of war; the International Committee of the Red Cross [ICRC] and other human-rights groups have access to them. They interviewed them. They send letters to relatives and receive letters from their relatives. So we ask human-rights groups to ask the Sudan government about the POWs they've captured from us. Their response was that they don't have POWs because these are "civilians": When they are captured they go back to civilian life.

SOF: I assume you have attempted to pro-

cure surfaceto-air missiles. The CIA supplied the Afghan mujahideen with Stingers and it turned the tide against the Soviets. If you could protect your people from air attack, what would the impact be?

Garang: It would improve the situation for the civil population because the air bombardment

does not effect the SPLA; it affects the civil population. The targets of the bombardment are the churches, hospitals, population centers. The SPLA live in bunkers. They know what to do and how to protect themselves from bombardment. When they bomb our positions, they will do that


for hours and hours but there will be no casualties. ... If the SPLA had effective anti-aircraft guns to bring down the Antonovs, it would definitely help the civil population.

SOF: Is the SPLA currently receiving overt military aid from any source? And why hasn't the bulk of black Africa come to your aid?

Garang: In the past, we received some assistance from some Arab countries, not black Africa. It's a matter of political interest and objectives. At the present time we are receiving no military equipment from any sources ... not from any foreign sources ... but from the Bashir government: We have captured a lot of military equipment. ... In a large offensive, the Parajok Offensive, we captured six tanks, T-55s, in good condition. We captured three 130mm field guns, and five 122mm D-30 howitzers. We captured 20 120mm mortars, lots of small arms and ammunition.

After 1991, the NIF was talking about capturing this and that place ... Bor, Kapoeta, Torit, and so on. But they do not talk about what weapons they capture from us. They do not capture tanks, they do not capture artillery. So our major source of military supplies is the NIF government itself.

A second source is the international black market. You can

buy T-55, T-62 tanks; you can buy howitzers; you can buy recoilless guns. And so we buy. Both of us [SPLA and NIF] actually get weaponry from the outside. The Bashir government doesn't manufacture tanks or artillery. We also don't. So we go and look for supplies. [Bashir] gets them from his friends. He has no

obligation to say where he gets his armaments from; I also have no obligation [laughs] to say where I get my equipment from. But, certainly, we are not getting armaments from any foreign government.

SOF: It was reported that you captured two or three thousand German G3 assault rifles?

Garang: Four thousand G3s.

SOF: So what do you suppose happened to all of their previous owners; did they just throw down the weapons and run away?

Garang: No. We got the guns, but the people — of course, some were killed; some throw away their weapons. That's what happens in war.

SOF: It's rumored that the Eritreans have

helped you and may in the future. What has been the Eritrean involvement?

Garang: There is no involvement. We have nobody with the Eritreans. It is true that Eritrea has their differences with Khartoum; they have broken diplomatic relations. Khartoum is supporting this group ... the Eritrean Islamic Jihad. They [Khartoum] are supporting the

Lord's Resistance Army in Uganda. But there is no Eritrean involvement in the war in southern Sudan. Khartoum has made accusations of help [to the SPLA] — from the Ugandans, the Eritreans, the Ethiopians, Egyptian tanks, Tanzanians, South Africans — to explain away their defeat. As I told you before there is not

ing us. By this time, Khartoum has announced that they had killed 263 Ugandan soldiers in the Sudan. That's ridiculous. ...

SOF: If western democracies offered you military aid, what would you ask for?


Garang: If anybody were to offer aid — western democracies, any democracies [laughs] — anybody who would help our cause, I would ask for that equipment that would address the principal threat ... to the civil population: the Antonovs. So we need effective anti-aircraft guns. Second are tanks, armored vehicles, and antitank missiles. I would ask for logistical support, vehicles, medical support, ammunition stocks for weapons we already have, and communications.

SOF: In the Sendru Hills I witnessed "human wave" attacks of mujahideen. In [SPLA officer] Oyay Deng Ajak's words, "We kill them like sheep." The SPLA seems to hold its own as of late, but will it be able to go on the offensive and take Kapoeta and Juba [NIF airbase] ...?

Garang: It is not the SPLA that are killing the mujahideen like sheep. No, it is the NIF. It is criminal for the NIF to send these human waves. We

define the object of combat to be ... to render your opponent noncombative, not to slaughter him like sheep. And if he is unarmed, we define it in our regulations that it is criminal to kill such a soldier. So we have many prisoners of war. ...

I know people talk about capturing this and capturing that ... capturing Juba, Torit, Kapoeta. We are going to conduct the war according to a definite plan, a plan to achieve our overall objective: to bring down the NIF regime. The strategic aim of war is to destroy your opponent's capacity to wage war on you. ... If the enemy's armed forces are destroyed they will have no capability to

defend Kapoeta or Torit or Juba.

SOF: Yes, you're attriting them in large numbers — I've seen that. But is that then the object: a war of attrition?

Garang: Where in the past there was an emphasis on occupying land, that is not important or strategic—the possession of territory. We [now] are emphasizing the destruction of the enemy armed forces. The possession of territory will be a result, not an objective, of defeating the enemy's armed forces. We have demonstrated this. We have destroyed them. We have put out of action more than 6,000 troops in the Parajok-Pagee-Nimule actions.

The SPLA's mobile artillery: a multiple-rocket launcher that was captured from the Sudanese army and mounted on a light truck.

SOF: On 18 January 1994, the Archbishop of Canterbury addressed the [British] House of Lords concerning the Sudan: "Sudan is crying out to the world for help ... but Sudan is also crying out for justice." Has the Sudanese Rehabilitation and Relief Association [SRRA] been successful in its appeal to Christian churches in America and Europe for funds?

Garang: I would say no. They [SRRA] have not been successful. We have not been able to get any assistance. Especially, an issue we have raised with

church groups is to help us acquire radio equipment, radio broadcasting facilities. That is something that church groups can easily afford. But we haven't made any headway.

SOF: So, a Voice of Sudan?

Garang: Voice of Freedom... Voice of Peace... Radio Free Sudan! Some church groups are involved in relief. Some groups are doing much in the way of humanitarian relief. But it is woefully inadequate.

SOF: Much of the government terror bombing I saw was directed at Catholic missions at Chukudum and Parajok. What is the SPLA's relationship

with the Vatican? Has the pope dictated any policy or issued a decree regarding the persecution of Catholics in the Sudan by Khartoum?

Garang: Well, we have our indigenous churches: the Catholic dioceses and Protestant churches as well. They are organized under the New Sudan Council of Churches, so there is some assistance from Catholic and Protestant church groups, and our local churches are doing a good job. But there is no direct assistance between the movement and the Vatican.

SOF: In the Sudan there has

been a resurgence of slavery unparalleled anywhere in the world. It has been heavily documented by the U.N. Working Group on Slavery and others, yet nothing seems to be done about it. There was a recent report on TV about [Nation of Islam] Minister Louis Farrakhan's visit to Khartoum. The question was raised, "How can Farrakhan meet with this regime when it supports the slave trade and Bashir himself is reported to own slaves?" The answer from Farrakhan's people was that it was all "Jewish propaganda." What's the SPLA response to this?

Garang: It is not propaganda. It is reality. There is slavery, a resurgence of slavery in the Sudan. It has been documented by various human-rights groups. Christian Solidarity Interna-

tional was in the Nuba Mountains and northern Bar-El-Ghazal and they brought back slaves: real people that have faces and have names. So the debate is not whether there is or there isn't; it is whether the Sudan government supports it or sponsors it. It does. It condones it as a weapon of war. I met Minister Louis Farrakhan in Kampala last year and I don't want the issue of slavery in the Sudan to become a propaganda issue in the United States. ... Minister Farrakhan can take it up with the Sudan government. I know he is against slavery and when it is established to his sat-

Christmas was bittersweet for Lynne Kent. Buoyed by the joy of her loving son, five-year-old Scotty, her financial picture brightened just before the holidays, when the government returned a valuable gun collection seized in January 1995. But it was her first Christmas without the man she loved.

"Scotty doesn't remember a whole lot," she told Soldier Of Fortune in January, recalling the tragedy of a year earlier. "He just knows that Daddy had an accident with a gun in the woods."

But the death of Richard H. Kent, a well-respected and highlydedicated Ohio lawman, was no accident.

In a metaphysical sense, the 47year-old Kent was the sixth and final victim of a sadistic killer named Jeffrey Don Lundgren. But in another, more immediate way,

Kent was the humiliated victim in yet another example of shameless media grandstanding and unnecessarily zealous paramilitary overkill by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.

"There is no question that the ATF triggered Rick

Kent's suicide," said James H. Jeffries III, of Greensboro, N.C., the attorney who won the gun collection's return. "Rick Kent was a lifelong law enforcement professional who was literally crippled by his dedication. There's nothing so low as kicking a man when he's down, and that's what the ATF did. When Kent was down and out, these bastards descended on him like the hairy hordes. It was like shooting fish in a rain barrel."

Like a tragic hero in Greek mythology, the seeds of Kent's demise were ironically sewn in the moments of his latest and greatest triumph, which was itself born of a horrifying tragedy.

Five members of the Dennis Avery family were murdered and dismembered by the psychopathic Jeffrey Lundgren, who buried the body parts beneath a barn in Kirtland, in northeast Ohio. In January 1990, when Police Chief Dennis Yarborough needed outside help, he called on Richard Kent, head of the newly built Lake County Regional Forensics Laboratory.

As a widely recognized expert in forensic chemistry, firearms, ballistics, explosives and trace evidence, and respected for his intelligence and meticulous work habits, Kent had played a major role in designing the \$1.5 million lab, which provides blood-typing, drug analyses and ballistics tests for law enforcement agencies throughout the Midwest. Kent "was key to that whole operation," according to Lake County Administrator, Kenneth Gauntner Jr.



ATF-Assisted Suicide

"The Best I Could Get"

"I knew I had to assemble a team of experts" to ultimately solve the mass murder, Chief Yarborough said. "I knew Rick Kent was the best I could get."

Kent would ultimately spend two days in icy, waist-deep water

beneath the barn, groping through the murky sludge of the burial pit to retrieve the body parts, shell casings and other evidence that would convict Lundgren. Although praised for playing a major role in solving the case, Kent was haunted by the specter of his

gruesome task.

"I can't tell you how many times I've woke up from dreams with Lundgren staring in my face," Kent once recalled.

The nightmarish experience also left Kent with physical as well as psychic scars. Digging up the watery grave, Kent severely injured his spine, leaving him in excruciating pain that multiple surgeries and a plethora of pain medications did not relieve. The physical torment and grotesque memories combined to leave Kent depressed, his wife told SOF. He was under psychiatric care and his growing dependence on prescription drugs ultimately cost him his job.

In August 1993, Kent pleaded guilty to wrongly using the crime lab's pharmacy license to obtain codeine-based analgesic compounds. In recognition of his distinguished 17-year law enforcement career and the

job-related circumstances that led Kent to his courtroom, the judge sentenced Kent to a two-year drug treatment program in lieu of conviction. Still in pain, forced to hobble along with a cane, Kent retreated to the home he and Lynne had built in 1987, complete with a basement laboratory.

"He couldn't forgive himself," Lynne recalled, "the fact that there was a question that his behavior had been at odds with the law. He had a difficult time finding purpose, in keeping up his self-esteem. His gun collection was the only thing left for him. He loved guns, and he was a recognized expert. He invested in collectibles and told me his collection would be worth quite a bit of money one day. They were the one thing, outside of his family, that he had left to provide meaning and a sense of self-worth."

Enter the ATF

Rick Kent's enthusiasm for firearms began at age 12, when he learned to dove hunt. Top of the News

Three years later, he joined the National Rifle Association and, at age 16, the Ohio Gun Collectors Association. He visited a small college in Colorado that taught gunsmithing and firearms manufacturing skills, but didn't like the campus, so he returned to earn chemistry and economic degrees in Ohio. In 1970, Kent became an auxiliary police officer in the small town of Eastlake.

A year later, at age 23, he was hired as a full-time officer for the Chester Township Police Department, where he was promoted to lieutenant by the time he departed. Continuing his education in his spare time, Kent was named Outstanding Law Enforcement Graduate from Lakeland Community College in December 1973. By 1975, he was part-time instructor there, a teaching post he held for 10 years.

In January 1976, Kent left the police department of Chester Township and joined the staff of the newly-formed Lake County Regional Foren-

sics Laboratory. He met Lynne, whose parents lived next door to Rick's mom and dad, and they were married in 1981. Along the way, he completed postgraduate training with the FBI and the DEA, and worked as an independent consultant for munitions manufacturers and insurance companies. And, he continued to collect guns.

Much of his collection had been purchased under a Federal Firearms License. He had been advised by ATF's compliance division that his FFL was not being renewed. It expired in November 1994. Kent purchased six guns after that date, records indicate, but they were acquired for his personal collection, as an investment. Despite the suspicions of ATF, Kent was not a convicted felon. Under the terms of his sentencing, he had no criminal record but he was not supposed to keep guns. The ATF, citing "suspicions" that Kent had falsified his FFL, wanted to seize the entire collection.

Lynne Kent was at work and Rick was home with

Scotty on 27 January 1995, when two dozen ATF agents and local lawmen, many dressed in Kevlar helmets and anti-ballistic vests, surrounded the Kent home in Geauga County. Brought along as observers were several members of a Boy Scout troop, a local television news crew and newspaper reporters. The ATF, of course, later denied inviting the news media.

"They Just Arrested My Daddy"

"Several law enforcement officers in Lake and Geauga counties criticized the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms ... for its handling of the case," The Plain Dealer reported. "They questioned why the raid turned into a spectacle for the media, and why two dozen officers were at the scene."

Wanting to shield his little boy from cameras and the confusing crowd, Kent phoned a friend to come pick up

> Scotty. "They just arrested my daddy," the youngster blurted to the family friend as he was led out of the melee.

'Rick called me at work," Lynne Kent told SOF. "He told me to please not come home. I felt like I needed to accept that. But when could I come home? My little boy needs to come home. It was more than seven hours from start to finish. Scotty and I finally got home at about 10 p.m."

The ATF seized 121 rifles and shotguns, telling news reporters that the haul was worth a half-million dollars. (The collection's actual value is estimated at about \$100,000.)

Local media and authorities pondered Kent's whereabouts after the raid - but his pain had ended.


When agents found 70 cases of ammunition stored in the basement, they called in reinforcements, and neighboring residences were briefly evacuated by the federal agents because of an unspecified "danger" posed by the ammo.

"There was so much there, it would be a stretch to believe he was just collecting these things," John Pasaka, assistant agent in charge of the ATF's Cleveland office told news reporters, who duly reported that Kent had amassed an "arsenal" of "specially modified assault rifles"—that were actually off-the-shelf semiautomatics.

Attorney Jeffries scoffed at the suggestion there was any danger posed by Kent or his gun collection.

"Here you've got a bunch of agents in Nazi helmets and body armor. At the same time, they bring in a bunch of Boy Scouts in uniform. You tell me if they thought

As we approached Oklahoma City, the car radio offered a heartland mixture of golden oldies, country music, and the latest livestock prices - the sounds of Midwestern normalcy. It was hard to believe that scant months earlier this same radio was breathlessly broadcasting minuteby-minute updates of the horror that had overtaken the city. Racing up Interstate 35 on that tragic April 19th, National Affairs Editor James L. Pate and I rode in stunned silence, transfixed by gripping tales of dramatic rescues and reports of Middle-Eastern terrorists, interspersed with the rising death toll.

Neither Jim nor myself was sure what to expect on our arrival in Oklahoma City. Admittedly, I was a bit skeptical. This was by no means my first disaster scene and I was fully aware of the media's tendency to play fast and loose with the facts in their unbridled rush to get a story out. That skepticism vanished as we stood in what can only be described as the war zone that was once downtown

Oklahoma City. For blocks around bombed-out buildings teetered on the verge of collapse.

But that was then, and this was now. In the days following the bombing, chief suspects Timothy McVeigh and Terry Nichols were arrested and indicted by a federal grand jury. A highly publicized manhunt for John Doe Two was mounted, accompanied by a \$2 million reward. But the dead were buried, debris cleared, and soon even the reward and the much ballyhooed search for John Doe Two were canceled, the FBI then claiming there was no JD2, that it was all just a big mistake. In record time, the gutted structure of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building crumpled to earth in a cloud of controlled-demolition dust. Despite the fact that architectural engineers had determined that the central core of the building was structurally sound, and could be rebuilt, the order was to tear it down.

In a warm and fuzzy feel-good statement, Oklahoma Governor Frank Keating explained that it was being done, "In the interest of public safety, and to allow the healing process to begin." As far as the rest of the country was concerned that was that. The bad guys were in jail, there was no John Doe Two and downtown Oklahoma City was once again neat and proper. All was right with the world and things were back to normal. But in the words of folks in Oklahoma, "That dog don't hunt." They knew that something was amiss, even if the rest of America didn't.

My return to OKC was prompted in great part by pleas of many of the bombing victims themselves. Impressed by what they considered to be Soldier Of Fortune's no-nonsense approach to journalism, they asked SOF to take an open and objective look at the situation. They wanted the truth. Their lives had been torn apart, not only by the bombing, but by the aftermath. They found themselves besieged by an onslaught of every breed of con artist and publicist imaginable. In their words, "We're sick of the crazy conspiracy

theories. But at the same time, we know damn well that the government isn't being fully honest with us."

The greatest challenge was being able to sort out the facts from the fiction. Human nature being what it is, many people feel a need to be part of the action and in any major event these are the ones who have a story to tell. They were really there, in the thick of it ... even if they weren't. In most cases it is no great feat to separate the facts from the fibs, but at times it may take a bit of sleuthing. Like putting a jigsaw puzzle together, each piece has to be compared to others to see if it fits, and it all has to be done objectively. We may not like the final picture but if it turns out to be true, we're going to have to live with it.

The Crime Scene

Like everyone else in the country, when I returned to the site where the Murrah Building once stood, I expected to see nothing more than a fenced-off vacant lot and the rest of the surrounding area cleaned-up, rebuilt and back to normal. Forget that idea. Had the TV cameras bothered to turn around we all would have seen what I did. The area still looked like a war zone! Like scenes from Beirut and Sarajevo, blasted-out building shells littered the landscape. The fragpocked Oklahoma Water Resources building stood empty and broken. Next to it, the Athenian Greek restaurant, a third of it ripped away in the 19 April blast, hung on the verge of collapse. A block to the northeast the old Kilpatrick Hotel stood shattered, its interior still cluttered with tions in this puzzle remains: Is there a John Doe Two? After interviewing numerous eye witnesses, I have very little doubt that there is no JD2. No, what comes up over and over is that

the personal possessions of former occupants. Neither boarded-up, nor fenced-off, these crumbling death traps still stood as silent testimony to the devastation eight months earlier. Public safety? Healing? Give me a break!


Search For John Doe Two

One of the most persistent ques-

there is in reality John Does Two, Three, and Four! Multiple credible witnesses have placed three other men with Timothy McVeigh in the vicinity of the Murrah Building the morning of the blast. By following a timeline of witnesses the path of the bomb truck and its occupants becomes clear.

Shortly before the blast, David Snider was standing on the loading dock of a warehouse south of the Murrah Building, waiting for a truck to pick up a load of equipment. Thinking the yellow Ryder truck turning onto the street in front of the warehouse was the one he expected, he waved to flag it down, getting an icy stare from a person he identified as McVeigh. JD2, a muscular Hispanic or American Indian, was driving. Snider said the heavily loaded truck was forced to slow to a crawl over the pot-holed brick street in front of the warehouse, giving him eye-to-eye contact with McVeigh.

Minutes later, the Ryder truck pulled into Johnny's Tire Company where a man got out and asked employee Mike Moroz directions to 5th and Harvey streets, the location of the Murrah Building. Later, Moroz picked McVeigh out of a line-up, identifying him as the one who asked

for directions. Moroz also saw JD2 in the truck.

At least five more witnesses place McVeigh, John Doe Two, and the Ryder truck at or near the Murrah Building. In addition, two more men were placed with McVeigh and JD2 that morning, along with a brown Chevy pickup and a white sedan. McVeigh's yellow Mercury had been parked behind the YMCA, a note in the window indicating car trouble and requesting the car not be towed. The morning of the bombing it had been moved, and was now parked in front of the Athenian restaurant. After parking the Ryder truck in front of the Murrah Building, McVeigh was watched by witnesses as he went to his Mercury and drove away with John Doe Two.

Ironically, although these witnesses saw McVeigh and the other John Does, and even helped with the

composite sketches of the suspects, none of them were ever called to testify before the grand jury. When grand juror Hoppy Heidelberg addressed these and other concerns in an October 5th letter to federal judge David R. Russell, his only reply was a terse letter from the judge immediately dismissing him from the grand jury and ordering him to keep silent, under threat of criminal action.

Even as the dead and injured were being pulled from the rubble of the federal building, persistent accusations began to surface that government

agencies may well have had prior knowledge of this horrendous act of terrorism, either in the form of threats possibly through an undercover "sting" operation gone terribly awry. If either of these possibilities prove to be true, is it part of some giant con-

spiracy? Or, more likely, an incredible act of gross stupidity? For those who are convinced we are in the throes of a massive conspiracy, their fears fueled by the tales of a plenitude of cottage industry "patriots-for-profit," I suggest they check their medication. For those who are equally convinced that our government agents would never lie, I can only say, Ruby Ridge Hearings, Waco Hearings, World Trade Center.

As was promised in the January issue of SOF, we are continuing to dig for answers. While there is, as of yet, no "smoking gun," some very interesting developments have surfaced:

• The OKC Fire Department Tapes: As was reported, not just 911 tapes but OKCFD radio log tapes for at least two days prior to the bombing seem to have been "accidentally" recorded over. Log tapes obtained by SOF for April 19th appear to have more gaps than Nixon's Watergate tapes. In addition, numerous Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests for copies of the OKC Police Department radio logs for the same time frame have been met with a brick wall of silence. Further, OKCFD Chief Dispatcher Harvey Weathers acknowledged that he was aware that the FBI contacted Assistant Chief Charles Gaines on Friday, 14 April to advise him of a potential terrorist threat in OKC. Glenn Wilburn, who lost two grandchildren in the bombing, stated that when he confronted Chief Gaines about this allegation, Gaines adamantly denied it ever happened. Relating Gaines' "loss of memory" to Weathers, Wilburn told me that Weather's reply was, "Well, you asked me and I told you. I'm not going to lie for anybody. A lot of people don't want to get involved in this."

• Tinker Air Force Base: A civilian employee at Tinker AFB said that in the weeks prior to the bombing the base had gone on THREATCON C alert status, "...at least twice." Base officials refused comment.

An interesting side note: On the night of 16 April, TRIGEN, a government-contracted steam generating plant in downtown OKC experienced a minor, but loud, steam "blow out." SOF obtained a copy of TRIGEN's log sheet for that night, that states at 2315 hours: "police are pounding on control room window, checked with

them and their report was of a major explosion and possible terrorist takeover of building. They [police] said they were going to notify the bomb squad. I [log writer] explained situation was under control & back to normal. They said in the future to please pick a slower night for them for this to happen. He [police] said, y'all scared the SHIT out of the people in the hotel (quote). blamed it on the full moon, laughed, and on their way they

went." (Italicized emphases added.)

For not being on any kind of threat alert the police response was, to say the least, mighty peculiar. Documents such as this continue to surface, each helping to put the pieces of this puzzle together.

• ATF "Sting" Operation: Another specter raising its ugly head concerns reports that agents of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms may have had an undercover sting operation going on the night before the fatal

blast. Whether or not it had anything to do with the actual interception of the bomb truck, as many are coming to feel, is pure speculation at this point. What we do know is that Lester D. Martz, Special Agent in Charge (SAC) of the Dallas ATF office, confirmed to several people that ATF did, in fact, have an undercover sting operation going on the night of 18 April, that was finally called off sometime around 0600 hours the morning of

the 19th. When pressed as to whether this operation was in any way connected to the bombing, Martz is quoted as saying, "I can neither confirm or deny that."

In addition, unconfirmed reports by at least three separate witnesses claim that members of the OKC Police Department bomb squad were

seen near the federal building more than an hour before the blast. SOF is still pursuing these reports.

• Prior Threats: Reports have also surfaced concerning prior threats to federal government facilities in Oklahoma City, as well as in other major U.S. cities. Allegedly, the Justice Department had received at least one written communique warning of possible bombings of federal buildings, listing Denver as the probable target.

SOF has a copy of the alleged threat letter and is working on verifying its authenticity.

• ATF Tip-Off: Was ATF geared up for possible terrorist activities? While ATF agents Luke Franey and Chris Cuyler were assuring Edye Smith (Edye lost two sons,

Chase, age three, and Colton, two, in the bombing) and her family that ATF wasn't on any kind of an alert, ATF Director John Magaw was on CNN telling national viewers that ATF was on a nationwide "Waco alert."

Glenn Wilburn, Edye Smith's step-father, mentioned that surely ATF would have to consider 19 April a significant date because of Waco. Wilburn told SOF that Franey and Cuyler just looked blank and both of them swore they hadn't a clue about the significant step in the significant step in the significant step.

nificance of that date. Interestingly, Jim Pate and I were attending the memorial service at Mt. Carmel when the word came down about the bombing. The first thing the news media began to intimate was that the OKC bombing was somehow connected to Waco.

There are other witnesses who claim to have knowledge about ATF being warned not to be in the Murrah Building on 19 April. SOF has spoken to many of them, but at this point it is felt that more information needs to be developed before making any judgment on these sources.

 Illegally Stored Explosives: Another issue plaguing the feds are charges that they were illegally storing explosive items in the Murrah Building. Although they vehemently deny these charges, evidence to the contrary has been cropping up. When asked about even having stun grenades in their offices, ATF SAC Martz again denied it: But wait! On 22 April, Alex McCauley, ATF's Oklahoma City Resident in Charge (RAC), was surveying the damage to the ATF offices, when, according to what a witness told investigative reporter J.D. Cash, McCauley turned to another agent and said that the day before the bombing he (McCauley) had passed out 50 stun grenades in the office and, "...the guys put them in their desks, and now the damn things are

DUBRAVE, BOSNIA

Convicted cannibal and serial murderer Jeffrey Dahmer would have felt right at home here, so why were three sentries from Bravo Troop of the U.S. Army's 3/5 Cavalry posted outside the gutted remains of a roadhouse turned rebel Bosnian Serb command post so hyped-up about two stray dogs playfully gnawing on a partially decemposed human skull?

"Shit, we [were] drinking wine

from that last night," mocked a Bravo Troop SAW gunner. "No, really, we didn't Hey, do you really think it's a civilian?"


"Someone's grandmother," another Bravo Trooper said in a morbid halflaugh. "Look at the way those dogs are going to town with that thing."

"Just like that boot out there," the third sentry added, pointing at a combat boot half-hidden in the snow and fog about 6 meters away. "I could swear there's still a foot in it. Damn, this place is fucked up."

The order to "look alive" couldn't have come soon enough for the three sentries or for the other Bravo troopers, most of whom were rapidly growing tired of fighting off the cold and diesel fumes from four idling Bradley fighting vehicles and a half-dozen Humvees. After taking the rebel Serb position without firing a single shot, senior officers with the 1st Armored

America's "Cavalry Charge" Into Peace



Division, led by Colonel Gregory Fontenot, arranged for commanders from all three warring factions to meet face-to-face at the road house and discuss a number of issues relating to security and the Dayton peace agreement.

Colonel Fontenot, as many might remember, was censured by the Pentagon for remarks he made in a Wall Street Journal interview during the first weeks of U.S. deployment to the Balkans. Fontenot was quoted as saying, "Croatians are racists" and "kill people for the color of their skin." The Croatians complained; Fontenot received a letter of reprimand and the matter was dropped.

Both the Serbs and Croats arrived minutes apart and on time, with the Bosnian military representatives acting shocked when told they were almost an hour and fifteen minutes late, claiming someone fed them bad information, probably in an effort to make them look disrespectful to their former enemies and American hosts.

This Is Not Mogadishu

In less than a week, under threat of forcible eviction by NATO troops, all three sides were going to have to withdraw two-and-a-half miles from all front-line positions, forming a NATO-patrolled-and-controlled demilitarized zone (DMZ) that would

snake its way up and down the breadth and width of Bosnia.

Sound familiar? Maybe not.

The U.S. Army and its NATO allies, in contrast to the disgraced and now defunct United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR), didn't arrive in Bosnia with any hang-ups

about blowing away the first Serb, Croat or Bosnian that even blinked at them the wrong way. Unlike Somalia or Beirut, there will never be any television footage of U.S. soldiers being dragged through the streets or held hostage by rebel gunmen because they didn't have orders to defend themselves. The rules of engagement are clear - a soldier has only to feel threatened to fire his weapon. Plain and simple.

Learning from its past mistakes, the U.S. Army rolled onto the

Balkan killing fields with enough armor, attack helicopters and fighter jets to make even Saddam Hussein feel a bit uneasy. The proof, certainly, was in the pudding.

On New Year's Eve, for example, the 1st Armored Division, sitting comfortably in near-endless convoys of Bradley fighting vehicles, armored Humvees and Abrams tanks, blew by rebel Serb, Croat and Bosnian checkpoints without even slowing down long enough to see if anyone was trying to challenge them. If anyone had, however, it would have been the biggest and last mistake of their lives.

A new, meaner dog was on the block — and he was hungry.

The dozen or so Serbs who previously controlled the roadhouse sensed rightly that Bravo Troop was itching for a kill. They basically surrendered the position and their weapons to the first American trooper driving a Bradley who pulled up demanding to know why the Serbs were still standing and not yet on their knees begging for forgiveness.

"Did you see that painting inside?" a press officer with the 3/5 Cav asked a group of journalists milling around the conference tent. "That says it all." The painting referred to depicted rural Bosnian Muslim life in the region, and was obviously the centerpiece of the roadhouse's dining room.

There was only one problem. The Serb soldiers, who only a few hours before had lost their lease on the place, perhaps during a few moments of playfulness, shot off the faces of each of the painting's subjects, put a bullet through the groin of each woman in the painting, gouged out the face of a young boy, shown in the

painting sitting on his mother's knee, and even put a slug through the face of former Yugoslavian strongman Marshal Tito. Hatred between the warring factions had reached the stage where paintings were being ethnically cleansed.

Meanwhile, as Col. Fontenot and his adjuncts continued to referee the three warring factions through two solid hours of accusations, threats and discussion, elements of Bravo Troop's security detail wasted no time in making sure no uninvited guests would crash the talks. Bravo Troop SAW gunners took up positions on the second floor outdoor terrace. Perimeter guards were posted and an antisniper team quickly put up blinds,

mounted their Remington 7.62x51mm NATO M-24 sniper rifle on an improvised table and set out to identify possible threats.

"I didn't know that Soldier Of Fortune was headquartered in Colorado," said Specialist Troy Hardwick, from Orlando, Florida, as he calibrated the M-24's scope. "That's interesting, because John Denver, you know, the singer, was a Marine sniper in Vietnam. Yea, do you believe it?"

Hardwick's partner and spotter, Spec. Alan Folk, a native of Arkansas, shifted gears and ended the conversation by saying that all he needed to begin shooting was to see someone through his binoculars, anyone, lifting a weapon and pointing in their direction.

"I don't know if I would shoot to kill, first time off," Folk said. "It depends. Maybe I would try to wound him. Now, if he was already loaded and refused to put down his weapon even after I shot at him with

a strong warning, then I would blow him away."

Heil Hittner

Linking Eagle Base, Tuzla, the U.S. Army's headquarters in Bosnia, with the Sava River pontoon bridge is Route Arizona — 70 kilometers long and the lifeline of NATO's Operation Joint Endeavor. Where rebel Serb, Croat and Bosnian army checkpoints, bunkers and frontline trenches once stood, the 1st Armored Division now has its own checkpoints

manned by Bradley fighting vehicles, Abrams tanks and Lieutenant Brian Hittner, a Nebraska native and (along with his twin brother) West Point graduate.

Hittner's troop of Bradleys manned the first checkpoint south of the pontoon bridge, placing themselves smack in the middle of the Croatian army in Bosnia (HVO) and an entire Serb brigade guarding the entrance to the Posavina Corridor, the strategic strip of land linking Serbia proper with the Bosnian Serbs' self-proclaimed republic. Defusing tensions would normally be a job in itself, but Hittner, a self-proclaimed "low-level

diplomat with a gun," was also expected to get both sides to quickly sit down with him, identify all minefields within his sector and begin, no later than 1300 hours that day, to clearly mark the fields with red and white striped tape. He had one other mission: Keep all sides from shooting at the other side's soldiers.

Serb commanders billeting in a bomb-smashed house 20 meters from Hittner's Bradleys told the lieutenant that Croats were still shooting at their men

as they walked from bunker to bunker with lunch pails. If they were going to begin marking the minefields, the shooting was going to have to stop, the Serb commander warned.

Hittner quickly mounted his command Bradley and, with two other fighting vehicles from Charlie Troop along for security, headed 3 kilometers north for a chit-chat with HVO officers.

"Heil Hittner," the first HVO officer sarcastically said, giving the American a Nazi salute.

"You have a funny name," the Croat said. "Almost like Hitler. OK. Well, let's see your maps and what you want my men to do."



No one, including Lt. Hittner and the three Bradley gunners, was amused. Hittner quietly regrouped his men for an assessment, devised a quick plan and returned to the Croats for round two.

"I'm sorry," the HVO officer told Hittner, "but I will have to wait for my com-

mander to come in order to do anything with you." Hittner agreed upon a 1300 meeting time and went back to his checkpoint for a quick lunch.

A few minutes after Hittner returned to the position the HVO senior commander for the region, with a British army NATO liaison officer in tow, arrived and got the ball rolling.

"You Americans are all cowboys,

aren't you?" the British army major acidly scolded. "Why didn't you clear this with my office? You just can't come here and demand that everyone begin carrying out operations like this without me being involved."

Anglo-American relations had hit a new low, but Hittner wasn't biting. His orders were firm and, without even a hint of "I'm sorry" or "Gee, did I step on your toes?" Hittner laid his map of the area on the hood of the HVO command car and began asking for distances and numbers.

The Brits had been shut out.

Although running more than two hours late, Hittner was pleased and drove back to his checkpoint to inform his men and the Serb soldiers waiting at their bunkers with tape and fence posts.

It was now time to drive north to bring the first of what will become a flood of *SOF* reader-donated paper-back books to the headquarters and headquarters company of the 3rd Battalion, 5th Cavalry Regiment of the 1st Armored Division.

shipped them to the Gulf — along with 2,000 free copies of the magazine — to our troops in Desert Shield/ Desert Storm. The troops loved 'em.

When we arrived, a thankful Captain Tony Carbone, commander of HHC of the 3/5, gladly accepted our first shipment on behalf of all the men and women serving in Bosnia with him.

"Keep sending them," Capt. Carbone said. "Thank you, SOF."

Our duty fulfilled, we headed back to SOF HQ in Tuzla. Serbs from Belgrade to Sarajevo were get-

ting ready to celebrate Orthodox New Years, and word had gone out to all NATO troops to be prepared for a night of shooting, drinking, more shooting, more drinking and possible confrontation with drunken Bosnian Serb soldiers looking to vent a little steam by shooting an American GI or two.

This was going to be fun.

With nightfall quickly approaching, we tightened the Velcro straps on our Second Chance body armor, made sure the front and back, high-velocity ceramic and Kevlar plates

were covering all our vitals. Then we hopped in our Russian-made Lada Niva jeep ("The Mountain Goat"), convoyed up with U.S. Army vet and journalist friend Jim Bartlett and headed for the rebel Serb stronghold of Brcko (pronounced Birchko).

Brcko sits along the Sava River, northeast of Tuzla, and is one of the main garrison towns within the Serbs' vital Posavina Corridor. Brcko saw near hand-to-hand fighting between HVO, Bosnian and Serb troops less than three months before. The idea of a peace treaty existing between the two bitter enemies had still not filtered down to the average Serb in the street.

Evidence to that was the large number of Serb paramilitaries, or Chetniks, who still roamed the streets in search of a Muslim woman to rape or a Muslim house to loot and burn. But since every last scrap of Muslim cultural or ethnic influence had been erased from Brcko years before during the first waves of ethnic cleansing, the Chetniks were reduced to occasionally shooting their assault rifles into the air,

Learning from its past mistakes, the U.S. Army rolled onto the Balkan killing fields with enough armor, attack helicopters and fighter jets to make even Saddam Hussein feel a bit uneasy. The proof, certainly, has been in the pudding.





The Americans scored their first victory. The HVO had, in essence, agreed not to shoot at Serb soldiers carrying our similar mine identification operations and to begin similar operations of their own.

SOF, as many readers already know, is collecting paperback books for American troops deployed to Bosnia, Hungary and Macedonia. During the Gulf War, SOF panhandled thousands of books from readers and

into empty shops along the shrapnel-scarred main street and even at themselves when they became bored with every other option.

"It's been pretty quiet most of the night," a soldier with the 3/5 Cav's Delta Troop remarked, a mechanized infantry unit with cavalry designation, at his base camp on the outskirts of Brcko. "Except for that guy across the street who keeps pumping 9mm pistol slugs into his barn, it's been OK."

Too quiet for our tastes.

We needed more shooting, more drink and more confrontation, so we drove like maniacs down Route Arizona onto the 1st Armored Division's secondary road, Route Apple, and into the Serb village of Gornji Zabar. We weren't disappointed. Gornji Zabar's cafes and bars were packed with Serb soldiers returning from the front lines, drunken locals and plenty of fresh young Chetnik women.

Our entrance at the Prima Cafe stopped everything, including a serious game of nine ball between two fully armed and aggressive Bosnian Serb soldiers.

The Americans had arrived.

We crashed their New Year's Eve party and didn't bother to apologize. Our moment of self-satisfaction, however, was short-lived.

"Who is driving the car with Zagreb (Croatia) plates?" a local policeman loudly queried. He was flanked by two Bosnian Serb Army MPs.

All eyes then shifted to the three of us, sitting in our corner seats,

half-empty glasses of beer still on the table. Sweat began to form on Jim Bartlett's brow.

Jim had failed to tell us that he rented his white VW Rabbit in Zagreb, and the mere sight of a

Croatian license plate might be reason enough for every Serb in the Prima to forget the Dayton Peace Agreement, forget it was New Year's Eve, forget the 1st Armored Division was less than a kilometer away and gut and skin us alive just for laughs.

"No one?" the policeman again asked, looking right at us. "OK. Happy New Years."

A sigh of relief quickly flashed across our faces: We were safe for now. We quickly paid for our beers, went outside and without a thought went about tearing the license plates off of the car and drove off into the night.

It was back to Tuzla for some sleep. Along the way we had heard that the U.S. Army was drawing up plans to speed-up the evacuation of the estimated 600 mujahideen fighters still terrorizing journalists and non-believers from their bases in central Bosnia.

ranging from pistols to machine guns. Most often, a handgun is selected, simply because it's less conspicuous and thus easier to conceal. That's justification enough if your area of operation is usually a cocktail party or the opera, but those defending their homes, dancing through a dynamic entry in a crack house, crawling under barbed wire on the

battlefield or hiking in wilderness areas crawling with dangerous game and more recently two-legged vermin, are wise to move up to a shoulder-mounted weapon. When it comes to wound ballistics, handguns, even those chambered for the mighty .45 ACP round, rest securely in last place.

Semiautomatic versions of battle (7.62x51mm NATO) and assault (5.56x45mm and 7.62x39mm) rifles can penetrate too easily through walls in urban areas with potentially disastrous results to innocent people, including your family. Only a very few own registered full-auto Title II submachine guns, assault rifles and light machine guns. They are, in any

event, politically incorrect for most civilian and even many law enforcement applications. That leaves the shotgun and it is, in very many scenarios, the very best possible choice.

"The best alley cleaner of all." So the late Elmer Keith once referred to the 12 gauge shotgun. During the Malayan counterinsurgency conflict and in Vietnam as well, it often armed the vulnerable point man and provided ambush response. Within the framework of its limitations, and maximizing its salient characteristics, the combat shotgun with its mul-

tiple-projectile ammunition provides short-range lethality matched by no other firearm.

The United States Armed Forces have within recent years obtained significant quantities of the Mossberg

(O.F. Mossberg & Sons Inc., Dept. SOF, 7 Grasso Ave., P.O. Box 497, North Haven, CT 06473-9844; phone: 203-230-5300) Model 500 and 590 slide-action shotguns after the extensive test conducted to meet milspec requirements that included firing 3,000 rounds of 00

buckshot through each of the test specimens. Mossberg was awarded its first military contract on 30 May 1979, for the Model 500 modified to meet the United States Military Specification MIL-S-3443D. Since that time no other manufacturer's shotgun has passed United States milspec.

Very few armed professionals will dispute the combat shotgun's superiority at ranges under 35 yards. The argument has always been between proponents of the slide-action or "pump" shotgun and those who advocate semiautomatic shotguns. The U.S. Armed Forces and many law enforcement agencies still adhere to the slide-action shotgun, although in a high-anxiety environment, operator-induced error can produce a disastrous stoppage. If slide-action shotguns are not jacked smartly and completely to the rear and then all the way forward with the same degree of force, they will short-cycle. If this occurs, the operator has no alternative but to immediately transi-

tion to his sidearm. The trade-off is that semiautomatic shotguns, whether recoil- or gas-operated, simply do not usually demonstrate RAM-D (Reliability, Availability, Maintainability and Durability) qualities to the level required by the military.

SEAL Scatterguns

During the Vietnam War, the U.S. Navy used some Remington Model 7180 semiautomatic fighting shotguns (derived from the Model 1100) aboard "swift boats" operating on the Mekong River, while a handful of Model 7188 selective-fire versions went to the SEALs. They did not exhibit acceptable reliability and most were turned in for Remington or Ithaca slide-action types.

The partnership of Oscar Frederick Mossberg (born in Sweden in 1866) and his two sons, Iver and Harold, began in March of 1919 in New Haven, Conn. with their manufacture of the Brownie, a small, four-barreled semiautomatic pocket pistol chambered for the .22 short, long and long-rifle rimfire cartridges. Three years later they began production of a .22

hammerless slide-action rifle based upon the Savage Model K, the tooling and design for which they purchased for \$1. During the Depression years Mossberg survived with a series of .22 rimfire single-shot and repeating bolt-action rifles, .410 gauge shotguns and single-shot lever-action rimfire rifles. Their .22 rimfire boltaction and hammerless semiautomatic rifle series were expanded during the late 1950s.


On 21 August 1961, Mossberg's first Model 500 12 gauge slide-ac-

tion shotgun came off the production line. Its most salient feature was a thumb safety mounted on top of the receiver at the rear, which blocks the trigger. While popular in Europe, in the United States only Stevens had used this safety location on their Model 200 and 520 shotguns. From the perspective of human engineering, this is a far superior location for a manual safety to the cross-bolt type found on the trigger guards of the Remington Model 870, Ithaca Model 37 and Winchester Model 12, against which Mossberg's Model 500 was designed to compete.

The method of opera-


tion was otherwise conventional and similar to other slide-action shotguns. When the forearm is racked fully forward, as the bolt moves to its final forward position, the bolt slide (a steel investment casting, as are some of the trigger mechanism's components), which is attached to the twin action arms, continues forward just enough to pivot a locking block (under partial spring loading from the firing pin spring) through a slot in the top of the bolt body so that it can engage a recess in the top of the barrel exten-

Mossberg's ghost ring rear sight consists of a stamped sheet-metal, over-size, peep-aperture that gives a shadow-like effect with extremely fast sight alignment at close-range buckshot distances without compromising the requirement for precision sighting with solid projectiles at longer ranges.

sion and lock the bolt into battery. As the bolt and barrel, when locked together, absorb most of the recoil impulse generated by firing, this permits the mill-finished, forged receiver to be fabricated from black (matte or gloss) anodized, high-strength aluminum alloy.

The Model 500 series has numerous other attractive features. The twin action arms (or "slide bars"), introduced in 1970, add smoothness and strength to the slide-action mechanism. Other features include extralarge, dual extractors (the right-hand extractor has a sharp-edge claw, while

M590 Disassembly/ Assembly Procedures

Depress the action lock lever (on the left side directly in back of the trigger guard) and open the action completely by sliding the forearm fully rearward. Make sure that there are no shells in the chamber or magazine tube. Move the forearm forward until the breech face is in the middle of the ejection port. Unscrew the magazine tube's end cap by turning it counterclockwise. Remove the barrel from the receiver. With a brass or nylon drift (no greater than 3/16-inch in diameter) push out the trigger housing's retaining pin. Separate the trigger housing from the receiver by first lifting the rear end upward.

Remove the cartridge interrupter from the ejection port side inside the receiver and the cartridge stop from the opposite side. Move the forearm/ action slide assembly rearward so that the bolt group and bolt slide are three quarters of the way rearward. When the bottom of the bolt slide is aligned with the clearance cuts in the sides of the receiver, lift the bolt slide up and out of the receiver. Slide the bolt group forward and out of the receiver through the barrel opening. Pivot the front end of the elevator up. Squeeze the elevator's two arms at the bottom end to disengage them from their recesses in the receiver and separate this component from the receiver. Remove the forearm/ action slide assembly by sliding it forward and off the magazine tube.

No further disassembly is required or recommended. After cleaning and lubrication reassemble in the reverse order. The hammer must be fully cocked to permit the trigger housing group to be inserted in the receiver.


the left-hand extractor's claw is rounded) for positive extraction under the most adverse conditions. Another important characteristic is the straight-line feed of a shell from the lifter (or "carrier") into the chamber. This provides positive feeding with reduced friction between the shell and chamber. Unlike other designs, such as the Remington Model 870, there is no lifter to be depressed. Just drop the shell into the receiver on top of the bottom of the bolt slide and push it into the magazine tube. There is both a cartridge stop and cartridge interrupter, one on each side of the receiver's interior walls at the rear end of the magazine tube. The stamped, sheet-metal ejector is held to the left wall of the receiver by a threaded screw.

Additional safety features include interlocks to prevent the trigger from being pulled until the bolt is completely in battery. There is a trigger disconnector as well, and it requires the complete release of the trigger between shots before the hammer can be released to rotate forward and strike the spring-loaded firing pin once more. The trigger housing itself is made of an injection-molded black synthetic material which is a standard feature on all Mossberg civilian and law enforcement slide-action shotguns. It is also specified on some of the U.S. military contracts.


Fighting Shotgun Lineup

Soldier Of Fortune was recently sent four Mossberg combat-type shotguns for test and evaluation. With one exception, all were equipped with a standard shotgun-type threaded brass front bead sight and longitudi-

nally serrated sighting channel along the top surface of the receiver. The first specimen was a conventional law enforcement type with an 18.5-inch cylinder bore barrel and an overall length of approximately 38 inches an envelope designed for use in patrol cars. It weighs about 6.5 pounds, empty. All Mossberg slide-action shotguns will now chamber both 2 3/4-inch and 3-inch Magnum shells. Both the forearm and buttstock were made of walnut-stained hardwood. Called the Model 50404, this Mossberg's Speedfeed buttstock holds two spare shells on each side of the stock under spring tension.



shotgun has a magazine capacity of five rounds, for a total of six shells. The receiver has a glossy black anodized finish and the steel parts, except for the bolt body which has been left "in-the-white," are blued (black oxide). Its suggested retail price is only \$281 which is another characteristic of the entire Mossberg product line throughout the years: incredible value for the price. The buttstocks of these Mossberg shotguns are equipped with rubber butt


Mossberg Model 590 MILS has a ventilated heat shield over the top of the barrel, extending from the receiver up to an inch in back of the rear magazine-tube support band.


pads with sharp edges. These recoil pads should have their edges rounded to facilitate speed mounts and inhibit snagging clothing. Length of pull, measured from the center of the trigger to the end of the recoil pad, is about 14 inches on all four shotguns.

The M590's rear barrel band holds the front sling swivel stud and a bayonet lug for the M16's M7 bayonet. The magazine tube's machined-steel, threaded end cap is stepped to accept the M7 bayonet's barrel ring.



Another of Mossberg's law enforcement shotguns is the Model 50576, which also sells for only \$281. It carries the same finish as the Model 50404, but has a black synthetic buttstock and heavily ribbed forearm. The magazine capacity is seven rounds for an eight-round total (including one in the chamber). Its 20-inch barrel is equipped with Mossberg's Accu choke tube system. Some law enforcement agencies and military organizations prefer more tightly choked barrels than cylinder bore. Theoretically, this means no choke at all. However, most manufacturers add 0.002-inch or 0.003-inch constriction at the muzzle to even out the spread of shot and prevent donut-shaped patterns. Our test specimen was provided with improved cylinder (45-50% of the shot within a 30-inch circle at 40 yards), modified (60%), full (70%) and extra full (80%) choke tubes. These threaded tubes are easy to change with the tool that was

furnished. These choke inserts cost only \$18 each. Improved cylinder choke is recommended for firing rifled slugs. Overall length of the Model 50576 is 40.25 inches and the weight is about 7.5 pounds, empty.

Remember, every shotgun barrel, even those of the same make, model and sequential serial numbers, will throw a pattern different from any other and you must pattern your shotgun at varying distances with the exact loads you intend to employ.

USMC Approved

Mossberg introduced a nine-shot (eight rounds in the magazine; one in the chamber) slide-action shotgun based upon the proven Model 500 action in 1987. Called the Model 590, it was first adopted by the United States Marine Corps. Part of the milspec requirement for this contract was the ability to remove the magazine's end cap, withdraw the magazine spring and follower (all

Mossberg slide-action shotgun magazine-tube followers are made of steel), and clean the magazine tube without further disassembly of any other components. To accomplish this, two strong steel magazine-tube support bands are brazed to the barrel. The rear band holds the front sling swivel stud and a bayonet lug for the M16's M7 bayonet. This leaves the front end of the magazine tube unblocked, permitting the operator to gain easy access for maintenance, with the further benefit of increasing the magazine capacity from

More Bang For Your Buckshot

Workhouse loads for the 12-gauge combat shotgun are without doubt rifled slugs and 00 buckshot (pellets of .33 caliber). Federal (Federal Cartridge Co., Dept. FF, 900 Ehlen Drive, Anoka, MN 55303; phone: 612-323-2300) is my choice for 00 buckshot. Federal and Remington (Remington Arms Co., 1011 Centre Road, Delle Donne Corporate Center, Wilmington, DE, 19805-1270; phone: 302-993-8547, fax: 302-993-8606) provide rifled slug loads of comparable quality. Both Federal's so-called Hi-Shok/Hollow Point Slug (product No. F127-RS) and Remington's Slugger (product No. SP12SMag.-RS-5PK) are "one-ounce" (but actually 435 grains, nominal), hollow-base, rifled lead slugs with no more than incipient dimples at their tips.

The Federal slug measures 0.70-inch in overall length while the Remington projectile is slightly longer at 0.80-inch. These almost .70 caliber projectiles will penetrate up to 14 inches of soft tissue while expanding to about 1.1 inches in diameter. The temporary cavity produced is significant with a missile this size and will add to tissue disruption.

The Remington Slugger shot with significantly greater accuracy in the Mossberg M590 equipped with ghost ring sights and cylinder bore barrel than did the Federal rifled slug. At 50 yards, the Remington Slugger will print consistent 2.5-inch groups. Muzzle velocity of these slug loads is about 1,600 fps through a 20-inch barrel. At 50 yards I zero the rear sight for an impact of about 2 inches above the point of aim. This will put you about 4 inches high at 25 yards, but dead on at 75 yards and only 5 inches low at 100 yards. These latter distances are the area at which slugs dominate in a gunfight.

I prefer Federal Premium 00 buckshot (product No. P154-00B), which features copper-plated shot, granulated filler and a long-range shot cup. Select the 9-pellet load as the 12-pellet, 2 3/4-inch Magnum load just plain kicks too much. These tower-dropped pellets are 97.5% pure lead with 2.5% antimony for added hardness. Two polishings guarantee sphericity. Copper-plating further increases resistance to deformation during firing. Shot is arranged in a spiral configuration within the longrange cup with granulated buffer added to fill the gaps. The granulated

seven to eight shells. The magazine tube's machined-steel, threaded end cap is stepped to accept the M7 bayonet's barrel ring. The rear sling swivel stud on all Mossberg Model 500 and 590 fighting shotguns are mounted on the underside of the buttstock at the rear.

Two of our test specimens were Model 590 military-type shotguns. Both had phosphate ("Parkerized") finishes, including the bolts. The Model 590 MILS has a ventilated heat shield over the top of the barrel, extending from the receiver up to an inch in back of the rear magazinetube support band. The receiver is drilled and tapped for a ghost ring rear sight assembly and has a 20-inch cylinder bore barrel. Overall length is 40.25 inches, with a weight, empty, of 7.5 pounds. It has a black synthetic buttstock and heavily ribbed forearm and carries a suggested retail price of \$379.

The other M590 sent to us for test and evaluation was identical to the above, except that it was equipped with "ghost ring" sights, a so-called "Speedfeed" buttstock and did not have a ventilated heat shield. Cataloged as the Model 50668, its suggested retail price is \$465. Keep in mind that each Mossberg contract to the U.S. military will almost always vary in specifications, as each contractor branch of the service wants different features.

Mossberg developed their ghost ring sight system in response to the Marine Corps' request for sights of this type on their initial contract. Originally supplied as a separate item by Sage International Inc., Mossberg introduced their own ghost ring system in 1991. The rear sight consists of a stamped sheet-metal, over-size, peep-aperture that gives a shadowlike effect with extremely fast sight alignment at close-range buckshot distances without compromising the requirement for precision sighting with solid projectiles at longer ranges. Elevation adjustment is accomplished by rotating a notched wheel under the aperture, which raises the sight up or down. Turning a slot-head screw in the center of the sight assembly will move the aperture to the right or left for windage adjustment. The fixed, blade-type front sight has a



One of the giants of this country's conservation movement died on 5 December 1995. Thomas L. Washington, president of the National Rifle Association and executive director of the Michigan United Conservation Clubs, passed away after suffering a heart attack while hunting on the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. He was 58.

Tom's achievements in conservation are legendary and will long survive him as fitting tributes to his love of nature and the Great Outdoors. Protecting the Second Amendment was another cause very dear to him; he toiled over the years for the benefit of all law-abiding, gun-owning citizens — not just NRA members.

Tom served in leadership roles in the National Wildlife Federation and Safari Club International. A resident of Lansing, Michigan, he led the suc-

respect for that man or woman's dignity. A true leader, Tom always assumed personal responsibility for his organization's setbacks. His subordinates respected him highly.

His stories spanned the globe: grouse hunts on his beloved Upper Peninsula; safaris in Africa, where once he had to sprint across the Zimbabwe border under the impetus of gunfire; fishing in Baja California; travels in China. cessful campaign in 1976 to ban nonreturnable beverage containers, which helped remove cans and bottles from the state's highways and roads. Washington conceived the idea of a Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund to purchase choice land, for public use,

Washington was a busy advocate. He also was responsible for the Wetlands Protection Act, the Sand Dune Protection Act, the Hunter Access Program, the

ban on commercial gill nets in the Great Lakes, and the Shooting Range Protection Act — all cutting-edge legislation that served as models for other states.

Tom, a Coast Guard veteran, was a bear of a man: a gruff exterior matched by great physical strength. And, as his ideological opponents quickly learned, he also possessed a powerful intellect. Few could match him in the art of debate and public speaking. Tom spent a great deal of time, in his later years, away from home and family preaching conservation ethics and gun rights. Through his force of personality and clarity of

Australian inventor Mike O'Dwyer's previous claim to fame was a device to ventilate athletic shoes while in use. But in the last few years he has focused on matters far deadlier than even the smelliest footwear: a naval defensive weapon theoretically capable of putting millions of rounds in the path of an incoming missile.

At the heart of his venture is a unique gun concept offering stupendous rates of fire, but with no mov-

After some 15,000 hours of research and investment of (U.S.) \$2 million, Metal Storm has seven working prototypes that have test-fired thousands of rounds of ammunition. Rates of fire extrapolating to 135,000 rpm have already been achieved.

Wall Of Fire

Massive firepower would be possible when barrels are bundled together; a triple-barreled system could fire at a top rate of 135,000 rpm.

Metal Storm technicians achieved this figure with a bench-test prototype, though only for a 45-round burst. Test ammunition used to date has been 9mm, with 140-grain bullets loaded to the specifications of the Sporting Arms and Ammunition Manufacturers Institute.

Metal Storm's Mk5 research prototype, a compact, 36-barrel pod loaded with 540 rounds and tested so far to a rate of 60,000 rpm, *theoretically* could fire at a mind-boggling

Aussies' Awesome Wall Of Fire



ing parts. To paraphrase an associate's comments, what O'Dwyer has created is a combination volley-firing, "Roman candle" weapon. His Brisbane-based company, Metal Storm, was incorporated only three years ago but capitalizes on a further nine years during which O'Dwyer was formulating his ideas for "wall of fire" weapons.

In its simplest form, a Metal Storm gun is a single barrel loaded with an ammunition "stick" containing some 15 projectiles. Rounds are individually preloaded in the "stick" and fired sequentially using an electrical ignition circuit.

Since there are no moving parts to reciprocate nor any cartridge cases to eject, the rounds can be fired virtually in a continuous stream, just as fast as bore pressure drops to a safe level after each shot. The maximum theoretical rate approximates 45,000 rounds per minute, per barrel, assuming uninterrupted reloading.

As such weapons as the .22LR AM 180 submachine gun have already demonstrated, a very high rate of sustained fire can damage a target completely out of proportion to the caliber and weight of the rounds fired. Metal Storm similarly emphasizes the structural damage potential of its systems, even firing at "only" 45,000 rpm.

rate of 1,620,000 rpm — a target O'Dwyer plans to reach this year. This weapon comprises 12 of the 45-shot, three-barrel units which already hit 135,000 rpm.

At present the prototype is substantially overbuilt for safety reasons. For simplicity, all firing tests so far have been conducted with smoothbore barrels. Rifling is not thought to present any additional problems, but fin stabilization could be a possible alternative. Surprisingly, O'Dwyer says that in test firing at a range of 25 meters and without securing the weapon's legs, 0.79-

inch shot groups were achieved through the unrifled tubes.

With the prototype systems, each projectile is inserted by hand, separated by 0.14-inch diameter steel spacers (or "spines") and then sealed to form a string within the rear section of the barrel. A line of barrel ports is used to charge each projectile with about 5 grains of conventional BM2 Australian ball powder, and each port is then capped with an Olin M52 electric primer. The eventual aim is to integrate the propellant with the projectile, rather than loading it from the priming port. In solid form it could even replace the spacer.

O'Dwyer is considering internal primers and even laser ignition for the final stages of development.

Using an electric ignition circuit, projectiles can be fired at whatever rate the user selects, from one or more barrels, separately or simultaneously. For prototype weapons, a computer-controlled external electronic sequencer from MeT of Brisbane is used. Production guns, however, would use miniaturized onboard electronics; weapon status would be indicated on a liquid-crystal display screen. Upon ignition, the relatively soft bullet is expanded by gas pressure to seal the bore, and compress-

sion of the unfired projectiles prevents gas seepage and flashover to the rear.

Special testing showed a rise in barrel temperature of only 3.5 degrees Centigrade (6.3 F) from firing a 15-round burst of ammunition in a single barrel at 45,000 rpm. Each round burns in a different location — a significant factor in limiting heat risks. The positioning of each projectile in the barrel also affects its external ballistics: Rearmost projectiles, for example, have the greatest length of bar-

rel through which to travel. So, with the same charge propelling each shot, there are inevitable velocity variations between rounds at different locations along the "stick." This also influences impact energy and dispersion at the target, as well as the time required between shots to allow barrel pressure to drop to a safe level before the next round is triggered.

However, O'Dwyer postulates that barrels could be preloaded with rounds tuned to eliminate these differences according to their position in the ammunition "stick"; or, variations simply could be capitalized upon to produce phased arrival at the tar-

get. Further, it might be possible to reconfigure the spacers as kinetic-energy penetrators, maybe with fins, with the projectile replaced by a sabot. Alternatively, the spine could be inserted in the nose, rather than the tail, of each projectile, with similar results.

Practical vs. Impractical

With assistance from the Australian Trade Commission office in Atlanta, Georgia, O'Dwyer has initiated discussions

with three major American defense companies toward licensing the technology for further development. He said he expects to cut a deal with one of the parties this year, and has received encouraging feedback from Europe, too.

Metal Storm is promoting its concepts in a boisterous fashion across a broad span of military weaponry scenarios. Though cyclic rates in the seven-figure bracket are a neat marketing hook, they don't mean much in isolation and certainly don't tell the whole story. Any weapon continuously fired at such rates would soon be emptied; resupply would be no small logistical challenge.

And despite the company's undis-

puted achievement in producing working demonstrator systems, it still has some way to go in creating fieldable weapons. Moreover, some of its proposed volley guns simply are not practical: They would require abandonment of conventional weapon designs for the promise of performance "benefits" that actually might be unnecessary and even impose new technical penalties, for example, in handling recoil — and not just of bigger calibers.

Nonetheless, some of Metal Storm's ideas merit serious consideration. One area where this "wall of fire" approach is particularly attractive is as a possible Close-In Weapon System (CIWS) for warships. This

last-ditch defense is intended to kill anti-ship missiles, such as the two Iraqi-launched "Exocet" missiles that in 1987 severely damaged the U.S.S. Stark (whose CIWS was switched off at the time).

Currently, the U.S. and many other navies use the 20mm "Phalanx" as their primary CIWS. This radar-guided Gatling system, firing 20mm Vulcan ammunition at 3,000 rpm, has been in service for some time; the U.S.

Navy is now looking for something with better performance.

The particular role of naval CIWS is so specialized that anything is technically possible. Metal Storm is already promoting its designs for CIWS upgrade, and company literature shows a CIWS pod system that is 24 inches square by 71 inches long, with 1,024 barrels and 17,408 rounds of 12.75mm projectiles.

This CIWS could overwhelm incoming targets at a theoretical firing rate of 10.24 million rpm. In fact, O'Dwyer is more likely to recommend four smaller pods with a quarter of the capacity; one in use and the other three for replenishment. He acknowledges there is no obvious way around the problem of having to break off an engagement to reload. And their system would not lend itself to "topping off" during lulls in action. Each

barrel (or the whole weapon) would have to be shot dry before reloading. On the other hand, the currently used "Phalanx" must also be brought out of action once the Gatling gun empties its magazine. Provided that a ship has a redundancy of defensive weap-

ons with interlocking arcs of fire, however, this is probably not the handicap as first might appear.

There also is U.S. interest in a smaller, vehicle-mounted defensive weapon. Metal Storm proposes a 64-barrel version in 9mm, with a 640-round payload and weight of less than 44 pounds. It appeals particularly to those prospective American licensees contemplating an Army requirement for a Low-Cost Intercept Device, effectively a tank-mounted CIWS for defense against anti-armor missiles.

And not to leave out the mechanized infantry, O'Dwyer has proposed a similar defensive weapon for armored personnel carriers: a 625-barrel pod 7.5 inches square and 30 inches long, with 10,000 rounds of 5mm ammunition.

Unconventional Small Arms

In assessing Metal Storm's overall potential for success, this fact simply cannot be ignored: It is *much* easier to sell new, even radical, ideas at the "big gun" end of the spectrum than with small arms, which have a very crowded R&D field serving a vast

and conservative population of con-

The quest for "improved" small arms in the West has consumed millions of dollars, taxed endless committees and sustained armies of experts, but has come up with little

> of much practical value, save for some nifty modifications to in-service weapons. The past few decades have already seen the development and use of caseless ammunition and flechettes; high-rate salvo fire from earlier Advanced Combat Rifle Program designs has been discredited; and conventional Duplex ammunition, though now fully debugged, has (oddly) not vet been taken up despite its obvious advantages.

> Nonetheless, Metal Storm is designing smaller weapons. Among them is a lightweight, 20-barrel "shotgun," only 20 inches long, holding up to 400 rounds of .223-caliber projectiles. With it, an infan-

tryman on point could lay down overwhelming, suppressive fire up to 20 rounds per burst — upon chance contact with enemy troops during patrol. Another, a three-barreled, close-quarter or midrange weapon, would have operator-controlled muzzle venting, giving the option of increasing the spread of shot.

The tiniest of Metal Storm's projects, the multi-barreled compact handgun — a 21st-century "pepperbox" — is envisaged as having four common-walled barrels, each holding six rounds, with the option of letting fly with all barrels simultaneously.

O'Dwyer recognizes that by moving down the scale, from shipboard defense to personal weapons, issues such as the capability of rapid reloading assume much greater importance. At the basic level, he sees the possibility of reloading a single-barrel gun with either a monoblock stick of projectiles or, like a revolver; several ammunition sticks loaded in a rotating cylinder. Given the severe difficulty all designers encounter in promoting radical changes in small-arms design, this has the merit of being relatively conventional and thus least likely to affront traditionalists.


Assuming that the handicap of less-than-rapid reloading (compared to the ease of changing magazines in a conventional, infantry weapon) nevertheless was accepted, reloading could be achieved barrel by barrel or by using an "ammo pack" comprising projectile/charge sticks, possibly in a loading block doubling as the rear section of the barrel. But for such weapons to ever be fielded by infantry or SpecOps troops, reloads would have to be sufficiently small, light and appropriately configured for the troops to carry comfortably in their load-bearing equipment.

Then there is the question of ignition. Plenty of medium-caliber can-

The arrival of the new year saw heavy fighting in northern Angola, spilling across the border into Zaire, between Jonas Savimbi's Unita rebels and the Marxist MPLA regime in Luanda. The MPLA is aided by highly skilled mercenaries: former soldiers and pilots from South Africa. Recruited by the Pretoria-based company Executive Outcomes (EO), these men unquestionably have played a pivotal role in MPLA victories over Unita — South Africa's old ally.

As this issue went to press, Angola's ambassador — responding to pressure from Washington — announced his government "has terminated all ties to Executive Outcomes." However, writer Al J. Venter, whose first account of EO's Angola ops was "You Buy, I'll Fly" (Jan. '96 SOF), reported that some EO elements remained in that country.

It was the first time in Angola that a sneak attack was defeated because a merc had to take a crap.

Executive Outcomes' Hennie Blaauw, a former colonel in a South African reconnaissance commando, ordered a halt for an armored column moving westward toward Unita rebel positions on the Cafunfo diamond fields. The column, under the overall command of Angolan Brigadier General Pepe de Castro, comprised 28 Russian-made BMP-2 infantry fighting vehicles (IFVs), 60 support vehicles, about 500 Forcas Armadas Angolanas (FAA) troops, and about 200 EO mercenaries, the majority of them black African soldiers under white officers. There also were 100 Katangese regulars: tough, aggressive fighters who had fled years ago to Angola from Zaire, zealous for the

day when they would return to their motherland.

The EO/FAA force was yet a day or two from Cafunfo. Because Unita harassment raids after dark had been frequent, vehicles customarily were drawn into *laager* (camp) formation each night. The BMPs, guns outward, lined the outer perimeter.

"The forest around us was one vast, thick and impenetrable blanket," Col. Blaauw said, recalling the 1995 operation. "Although they [Unita] tended to mortar us a lot whenever we halted, we weren't much concerned. We dug slit trenches. Some preferred sleeping inside the BMPs, which could take a direct hit from a NATO 81mm mortar without penetration. A mist every night also helped."

The wee hours of morning arrived uneventfully.

"It wasn't yet light when I got up and did the usual rounds," he continued. "If there was anyone asleep at his post, it was better for me to find him than the Angolans — especially if he was one of my men. Angolan officers and NCOs would shoot a sleeping guard where he lay. We only docked their pay."

Nature called; Blaauw asked his driver/radioman for a roll of toilet paper. Even with his quarter-century of military operations in the bush, the recce officer did what he long had exhorted others *not* to do: He set off into the bush — by himself — despite the threat of attack from Savimbi's anticommunist rebels.

"I ambled off toward a clump of bushes to dump in quiet comfort," Blaauw said. "I always stressed that the orders ... are inviolable: 'Tell the base commander or the duty officer exactly what you are doing and keep your weapon with you at all times. One of your mates should go with you and you should face in the direction of where any threat was likely to come.' I was watching something on my flank of the laager and not really paying attention to what was in front of me. ... I had become too casual.

e Battle Former Allies

We had been in bush too long; it was our twenty-third day out."

Blaauw undid his belt buckle. Just then, a Unita soldier with an AK-47 stepped out of the jungle a few yards away. The two made eye contact. The rebel froze. Blaauw, armed with a roll of toilet paper, ducked sideways and raced back to the nearest BMP. Moments later, someone opened up, full auto, in Blaauw's direction. Then the entire front opened up.

"By now the Unita force was hammering at the laager: an attack in battalion strength, about 250 men," the EO officer recalled.

His men quickly retaliated. AK rifles, 12.7mm and 7.62mm machine guns, AGS-17 grenade launchers and RPG-7 rockets carved crazy patterns in the jungle. The noise was punctuated by the powerful whop-whop-whop of the BMPs' 30mm cannons. As the battle grew in intensity, more gun crews went into action. A few of the BMPs rolled out in the direction of the attackers.

Blaauw figured the attack had been pre-empted. Not all of the Unita troops had gotten into position; most still were concentrated in a shallow defile below and to the north of the camp. They had not yet encircled his combat group when Blaauw encountered the soldier.

The unlucky Unita battalion soon withdrew. Blaauw then was able to appreciate his luck: The BMP behind which he crouched had taken hundreds of rounds of enemy fire. "You couldn't put two fingers together over any patch of armor without touching a dent where the paint had been cleared," he recalled. "The trees on both sides were almost cut down by the salvos."


Blaauw came out of it all with a flesh wound and was evacuated by an Mi-17 helicopter — but only long enough

to get the wound dressed. He was back in time for the next phase of action.


Russian-Assisted, African Blitzkrieg

The campaign in which Blaauw, his EO element and FAA armor took part — the recapture of Angola's Cafunfo diamond fields - likely was the largest armor assault in the world, outside Europe, since the Gulf War. Lasting 25 days, the combined-arms attack was modelled on the blitzkrieg, using the kind of tactics of violence and speed the South African Defense Forces (SADF) had perfected 10 years earlier in the border war against Angolan, Cuban, Russian and East German forces. Clearly, it was a hard campaign in the

was designed for the European battlefield, the Russian-built BMP-2s performed very well in Africa.

"It's probably the best of this kind of vehicle," Blaauw said. "As long as you keep it greased and fueled and check the water regularly, it'll go on forever." In this kind of terrain, he said, metal tracks were a great advantage over wheels, whose tires are vulnerable to bullets and mortar-shell fragments.

EO's employer, the MPLA, also had invested in heavy armor: not only T-55s, a tank ubiquitous in Third World armies,


but also T-62s. Angola's air force includes Swiss-built Pilatus PC-7 turboprop trainers fitted with rocket pods and bombs; Soviet-built helicopters, including the formidable Mi-24 gunships; and MiG-23 jet fighter-bombers.

As Blaauw tells it, a good deal of effort in the Cafunfo campaign was devoted to logistics. EO personnel spent long hours planning air drops with Russian air-force personnel on contract to Luanda. With 1,000 men in the field, Luanda's commanders knew there must be no mistakes.

Regular supply drops were made by Russian Ilyushin-76 transport jets, usually from a safe altitude of 20,000 feet. Twenty tons at a time of fuel, food, spare parts and medical necessities were dropped in parachute clusters of between 16 and 20 bundles. "It

was very professionally done," said Blaauw. "The Russkies dropped their cargo spot-on every time."

Altitude was strictly maintained because of the constant threat of surface-to-air missiles (SAMs). The Unita troops had Russian SA-7s and SA-14s. It is not known whether Stinger missiles given to Unita by the CIA still are operational — but the Russian pilots took no chances.

From the point of view of many South Africans, EO's operation in Angola was difficult to accept. It has left a bitter taste in the mouths of some of the men: EO special forces now were effectively contracted to fight for a government that South Africa for years had regarded as the enemy, against a former ally.

Many of their comrades had died fighting the MPLA's forces. Moreover, some 700 SADF troops had been killed in 20 years of military ops aimed at destroying the South West Africa People's Organization (Swapo) guerrillas in Namibia and dislodging the Marxist government in Angola.

It is significant that Namibia now is free, President dos Santos remains in power in Angola, and the white South Africans are the ones who have been left in the wilderness.

To many citizens it's a bitter irony that their former troops, now mercenaries, have taken up where the Cubans left off and are doing the MPLA's dirty work against Unita. (Some observers point out that what EO has done in Angola would be roughly equivalent to former members of the U.S. 82nd Airborne or Marine Corps taking up arms for the Viet Cong after the Vietnam War, or former British SAS troops decamping to Argentina after the Falklands War.)

After all, some argue — often passionately — Unita leader Jonas Savimbi was a loyal and brave ally who fought a bitter struggle alongside South African soldiers against a communist govern-

ment in Luanda. Savimbi's men suffered terrible losses in gaining a military victory that was as much to the advantage of South Africa as to himself.

But that view ignores a hard, political fact: EO could not be as active as it is in Angola (or Sierra Leone, as reported in "Not RUF Enough," Dec. '95) without the full, though covert, support of South African President Nelson Mandela and his cabinet.

Mandela's Political Debt

EO men on the ground (their numbers run well into four figures) all were recruited in South Africa. They go back there on furlough. Those who are wounded or contract tropical illnesses are rushed to Pretoria; their dead (those who have been recovered) are buried there. They are insured by South African companies. The company's Boeing 727 aircraft fly with impunity from South African airports. There is nothing clandestine about what EO is doing; it even courts the international media, including CNN, American news magazines and the British Guardian newspaper.

It comes down to this: The new government in South Africa is repaying an old debt — with interest — and, at the same time, protecting itself.

For many years, before the dismantling of apartheid in South Africa, the Marxist MPLA government in Angola was the most powerful ally of the African National Congress, then in exile. Many ANC training camps


(of which the most notorious, Quatro Base, just outside Luanda, had an appalling record of inhumanity) were located in Angola.

But now the ANC is the governing party in South Africa. Mandela is president. The former commandant of Quatro Base now is the South African minister of defense. And it was at Quatro — now called Funda — that an EO armor advisory team met with the Angolan top brass, including Chief of Staff Gen. Joao de Matos, in December '94 and January '95 to plan the blitzkrieg against Unita.

Besides helping his old allies, the Angolans, Mandela is accomplishing something else: keeping occupied, and gainfully employed, a large group of SADF-trained specialists that any opposition faction in South Africa might want to recruit for its own ends. While they are busy in Angola or Sierra Leone, these technicians, pilots and special-forces soldiers are well away from any potential mischief in South Africa. For Mandela and his allies in the government, it is a very convenient arrangement.

What's more, South Africans are bringing home EO pay in the form of U.S. dollars. It is believed by many that American oil companies are picking up at least some of the tab. Angola has offshore oil fields; various American companies have an interest in that area. There even have been calls in Washington for oil executives to answer questions, at a Senate hearing, on possible corporate involvement with the Angola's Marxist government.

A Washington-based defense consultant with great understanding of such matters has said that EO has been implicated in an attempt to assassinate Unita leader Savimbi. During that attack, the rebel leader was wounded and two of his men killed. For that reason alone, it would be interesting to compel the oil companies to answer questions before the U.S. Senate about who is paying for

what — if at all — in a long-running, African civil war.

The campaign to drive Unita out of the rich, diamond fields of Cafunfo, and many of the towns of northern Angola, began on 1 September 1994, when Chris Grove, a former SADF paratroop colonel, took over the old Cuban air base at Cabo Ledo on the

coast about 130 kilometers south of Luanda.

Planning soon began to bring the Forcas Armadas Angolanas' 16th Regiment up to scratch. A month later, the first FAA battalion of 800 men was being instructed by EO personnel in preparation for the series of battles that ended in the recapture of

Cuito, Huambo, Uige and the strategic oil complex of Soyo in the northwest.

Cafunfo was a vital adjunct to these long-term objectives. FAA leaders intended to deprive Unita of access to one of the richest diamond fields in the world by capturing the town. To that end, by November '94 the first EO operational group had been formed. It mainly comprised black soldiers from disbanded, specialoperations units such as the police counter-insurgency unit, a paratroop battalion and recce commandos. EO officers were (and still are) all white South Africans.

This new force was divided into three elements: an offensive group, including air-assault units of Mi-17 and Mi-24 helicopters; search-and-rescue and reconnaissance units; a

mobile mechanized group, which began training with the FAA's new T-62 Russian tanks near Luanda area; and a training group based at the mouth of the Longa River, south of Luanda. All key personnel were South African.

By mid-January the mechanized group had begun training with BMP-2s at Cabo Ledo under EO Col. Roelf van Heerden (formerly of the SADF's 82 Mechanized Brigade). Later in 1995 van Heerden was the ranking EO commander in the eastern region of Sierra Leone, also rich in diamonds.

Meanwhile Grove, assisted by two other special-forces veterans, Col. Duncan Rykaart, formerly of No. 1 Recce Commando, and Col. (now Brigadier) Nick van den Bergh, formerly of the 44 Parachute Brigade, got their heads together with the Angolan general staff. They planned an armored op against rebels in northwestern Angola. They had to move 22 new T-62 tanks to Dondo and

James L. Jorgensen is

like millions of other concerned citizens. He was shocked by televised newscasts of the federal government's raid on a little-known religious sect outside Waco, Texas, on 28 February 1993. Jorgensen thinks that, in many ways, congressional hearings on Waco were a sham. He is convinced that the ultimate failure of these hearings makes it more crucial than ever that a special prosecutor be appointed to find the truth and punish guilty government parties.

Like most Soldier of Fortune readers. Jorgensen is also certain that highlevel federal officials continue to cover up the truth about the initial Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms raid on the Mount Carmel Center, and the final fatal fire that erupted after a tank and poison gas assault by the same Federal Bureau of Investigation agents who, eight

months earlier, scripted the bloody Randy Weaver

tragedy.

What's the big deal, you ask? Jorgensen shares the opinions of millions of other citizens about many aspects of the Waco disaster. So what?

Because unlike most people outraged over Waco, Jorgensen was, until his retirement in March, an ATF agent. He is among a growing number of federal agents who acknowledge privately that many facts about what happened remain to be learned.

Honest, Open Criticism

Unlike most of his fellow agents, though, Jorgensen expresses his doubts publicly, criticizing the firearms bureau and its bosses in the Treasury De-

partment. He does so both as deputy executive director of the National Association of Treasury Agents, or NATA, and as publisher and editor of NATA's official quarterly magazine, The Agent.

As the nominal head of NATA, Jorgensen speaks for "more than 1,000" U.S. Treasury agents (he declined to release the exact member-

ship number) from ATF, U.S. Customs, the Internal Revenue Service and the U.S. Secret Service.

"I don't want to give the impression that all of our members are lock-

step with everything that NATA says and does," he told SOF in a December interview in Detroit, where he was still working as an ATF agent assigned to a Drug Enforcement Administration task force. "NATA is a diverse organization, open to any and all Treasury agents. So there are going to be some diverging opinions."

The Agent is to the Treasury De-

partment roughly what the The Resister is to the Army, except that NATA and The Agent do not operate in secret (see "Witch Hunt for The Resister," SOF, February '96.) The

> Agent does provide the anonymity that is unfortunately necessary for agents to speak the truth in today's environment of political correctness. And it has become a source from which Treasurv agents can get the unvarnished facts on subjects as diverse as Waco, affirmative action and the U.S. Constitution.

"This is an excellent ex officio forum for Treasury agents to explain things that are going wrong and what's going right," said Robert E. Sanders, the former head of ATF's law enforcement division, now an attorney specializing in Second Amendment law. "For management, it should serve as an invaluable

source of information... be-

cause it's unfiltered by bureaucrats and supervisors... straight from the agents. For management, it is foolish not to pay attention to it."

Although The Agent is not available to the public at large, its content offers outsiders who see it a glimpse into the internal debate of rank-andfile Treasury agents (see "Untouchables Come Clean," June '95, and "Mismanaged, Mindless and Macho,"

Sept. '95.) These people are, after all, people; persons with spouses and families and jobs and mortgages, like most others of the workaday world. It is vital to the continuing debate, and to nourishing the hope that meaningful corrective change can be accomplished under our existing constitutional system, to recognize and hold this common ground. If there is any lesson for everyone on all sides to learn from the escalating tragedies of Ruby Ridge, Waco and Oklahoma City, it is this: Once the hope for debate and redress of grievances decreases, the potential for violence increases.

Unfortunately, no entity acts more quickly to stifle debate than does the federal bureaucracy. And its first target in accomplishing that end is the First Amendment right of its employees to speak out against corruption, cronyism and incompetence. Special agents in the federal government are forbidden by law from organizing a union to protect their common interests, such as when acts of official retribution are aimed at agents who speak out publicly against wrongdoing by federal agencies. NATA is not a union, but it provides legal counsel to defend members who are being wrongly punished by the government, and to force government agencies such as ATF to abide by regulations and the law.

Pricking The Federal Conscience

The person at the pointed end of NATA's legal spear is its general counsel, Kay Kubicki, who was an ATF agent for 12 years before resigning. Kubicki minces no words on why she decided to abandon her career as a special agent in the Department of the Treasury.

"It was not a tough choice," she said. "You have to get up and look at yourself in the mirror in the morning. I saw where ATF was headed; the types of investigations that were being pushed. Numbers became very important; how many numbers could you generate at the end of the year? That became the emphasis. ... They want the quick, easy hit, not the quality case against the hardened criminal. Quality has never been pushed at ATF. They'll tell you that it is. That's a big joke on the taxpayer.

"When I hired on with the federal

government in 1976, I was proud to take that job," Kubicki recalled. "I now see that job as something like job fair. If you can't get a job somewhere else, hire on with the government, because they'll take you. They do not have the standards they had when I hired on in 1976."

Kubicki cited the case of a special

agent in charge in the Southwest who's being promoted to a Senior **Executive Service** (SES) position in California. Civil service SES positions start at about \$110,000 per year. Initially, there was a minimum requirement for a four-year college degree, but the man Kubicki mentioned never got a high school diploma. Dan Hartnett, the former number-two man at ATF, who was fired in the wake of the Waco disaster, also held an SES post, despite his lack of a high school diploma.

"It's nonsense to create these types of positions and then bastard-

ize them," Kubicki said. "It's all mirrors; to try and make the American public think they are in safe hands. And there's nothing further from the truth."

Serving Those Who Serve

But Jorgensen and Kubicki are just as quick to defend competent, hardworking and honest agents still in the ranks. These agents operate at a considerable disadvantage in the current management, not only in ATF, but other Treasury Department law enforcement agencies as well, they say.

"It's foolish to say that agents are always right," Jorgensen said. "On the other hand, they're not always wrong either. We're content to ... let the facts speak for themselves, but what we insist upon is that the agents be given due process. ... This is one

of the reasons NATA was founded."

Kubicki agreed. "When we find agent members who are being disciplined for retaliatory and vindictive reasons, NATA stands behind them. The agencies have a duty to follow the personnel procedures that are mandated by law. The four Treasury agencies don't perceive it that way.

search warrant on an east-side Detroit crack house.

They are like the old Cheech and Chong routine; 'Badges? We don't need no stinking badges.' The four Treasury agencies think, 'We don't need no stinking regulations.'

"When an agent files to protect his or her constitutional rights, all of a sudden all hell breaks loose because that agent had the nerve to stand up for what's right," she said. "They become targets and they are under attack. I have yet to see an agent who files a complaint against a manager who doesn't then have to begin litigation."

While the Treasury Department takes a public stance toward NATA ostensibly equal to that of other agent-representative groups, it shows its disfavor in small but unmistakable ways.

There are organizations other than NATA that also represent the inter-

ests of federal special agents, such as the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Association, which is regularly endorsed by ATF Director John Magaw. But, in FLEOA's case, its supposed independence is a front used to parrot the administration's party line. For example, FLEOA's president, Victor Oboyski, defended ATF's actions at Waco to a House of Representatives panel, testifying that "the days of a couple of agents ... walking up to somebody's front door and knocking ... in three-piece suits to execute a warrant ... is [sic] over."

There are other groups besides FLEOA and NATA. There is the National Organization for Black Law Enforcement Executives, or NOBLE, and a female offshoot of NOBLE. There are similar groups representing agents of Hispanic and Asian descent. Another is Women in Federal Law Enforcement, or WIFLE. And the federal bureaucracy spends hundreds of thousands of dollars each

year in per diem pay, travel allowance and paid time off for members to attend the meetings of these various groups.

But not NATA. When special agent members of NATA applied for similar allowances to attend NATA's annual meeting near Orlando 15-17 February, they were denied without exception, according to Jorgensen and Kubicki.

One case NATA is following closely is that of ATF Special Agent Robert Rodriguez, who worked undercover in the Waco debacle, and tried to stop the ill-fated raid an hour before it was scheduled to launch, because he learned the element of surprise was lost. Unlike other ATF agents sued as a result of the raid, the federal government has refused, as of this writing, to provide legal counsel for his defense. If Rodriguez does not get government-sponsored defense, Jorgensen said, NATA may have to step in.

Like the public at large, Waco is a subject that continues to preoccupy ATF agents. It still dominates most other topics in mail received by *The Agent*. Those letters appear in a section called "Agent's Forum," the most popular part of the quar-

terly newsletter, Jorgensen said.

"NATA is very concerned that, at the three-year mark [after Waco,] nothing had changed," Jorgensen said. "We've got four dead ATF agents ... [who were] sent out on a suicide mission."

After being advised by Rodriguez that the element of surprise for the raid had been lost, the raid commanders, Special Agents Chuck Sarabyn and Phil Chojnacki, ordered the raid to go ahead anyway. When it failed and 10 people, including three unarmed Branch Davidians, were killed, Chojnacki and Sarabyn denied to their supervisors and the public that they had known the raid had been compromised. They tried to blame the raid's failure on the only man who did the right thing: Robert Rodriguez.

Based on his experiences as a combat veteran of Vietnam's Mekong Delta, where he was a platoon sergeant, Jorgensen is convinced that Chojnacki's and Sarabyn's decision

to go ahead, knowing the element of surprise had been lost, was one of criminal negligence. "If this had been a military mission," he said, "these two guys would have been court-martialed and probably sent to jail," he said, adding that the subsequent effort to wrongly blame Rodriguez is also probably a crime.

NATA "has never second-guessed the ... choice to use dynamic entry," said Jorgensen, who said he's seen the tactic used successfully in many cases. "But what we've also said is that, at the point where the raid commanders knew that surprise had been lost, then the decision to use forced entry was, of course, a flawed decision ... I think the best memorial to those four agents who gave up their lives doing their duty is to ensure that this never happens again ... agents being sent on a suicide mission ..."

On the second anniversary of the ATF's Waco raid, Jorgensen and other NATA officials held a press conference in Waco to call for the appointment of a special federal prosecutor to investigate the government's role, and to suggest that ATF management was covering up the role and ultimate culpability of ATF leadership in deciding to go ahead with the ill-fated operation, after learning that the element of surprise had been lost.

Protecting Principles, Or Principals?

Asked if he thought the raid time had been set later in the morning for the benefit of television cameras, Jorgensen said he had no direct knowledge of such a decision, but he did not find such a suggestion implausible. Jorgensen thinks that ATF and Treasury officials have not told the truth about the decision-making process during and after the raid. He believes a cover-up was undertaken

to protect top management.

"Chojnacki and Sarabyn were fired and then hastily rehired," Jorgensen said. "I've never seen that happen before. The government generally litigates these personnel actions for years and years. Five or six years would not be at all unusual. Yet Mr. Sarabyn and Mr. Chojnacki were hired back in a mere six weeks" after appealing their dismissal to

the Merit Systems Protection Board, the federal entity to which civil service employees file grievances on cases in which they think they have been treated unfairly.

"It appears — and I think some congressmen have openly speculated on this — that Mr. Sarabyn and Mr. Chojnacki obviously have a smoking gun somewhere," he said. "And in an effort to keep that smoking gun hidden, the government restored them to duty with back pay and attorneys' fees and all sorts of other perks, which are a matter of record. It doesn't smell right."

The rehiring of Sarabyn and Chojnacki was "a political [decision]" Kubicki said. "There is a flood of civil suits against the ATF. So it makes more sense to rehire these people because ATF has a flood of other litigation. How could you better control

your witnesses than keep them in the government. It's all about control ... These agencies are like dysfunctional families. You do not have a healthy environment to begin with. It's not to keep these agents happy. That's not a consideration. It's totally for control. They want control over Sarabyn and Chojnacki."

"One of the biggest disappointments of Waco was that there were

agents there with sufficient experience to know that going in after having lost the element of surprise was suicide," Jorgensen said. "There were agents there with combat experience; there were agents there with 15 and 20 years on the job. If someone had stood up and said, 'Wait a minute. We shouldn't do this,' it is conceivable that nobody would've have gotten hurt. No doubt, such a move would be a career risk, but this was clearly one of those times when people needed to put their job on the line."

That's not going to happen in the existing "oppressive and duplicitous management cli-

mate at ATF," Jorgensen said. And the administration of Director Magaw, the former Secret Service head who was tapped to correct ATF's management problems after the former director, Steve Higgins, was forced to retire, has only made matters worse, he said.

"Merit" System Lacks Merit

"Basically, very little has changed at ATF. The level of basic street experience of most managers — the positions comparable to those of Chojnacki and Sarabyn — is basically the same. The manner in which current managers got their positions is the way that Chojnacki and Sarabyn got their positions. It's basically through the good-old-boy system, or cronyism. And this isn't cronyism based on being a white male. There are plenty of cronies at ATF who are females ... who are black. ... It's a matter of personal loyalty. That's how you become a crony; if you have demonstrated that you will keep your

mouth shut at the right time; if you have demonstrated that you will be personally loyal, no matter what. And this kind of loyalty is unlawful in federal service."

"The so-called merit promotion system is a sham and a shame," said Jorgensen. "And it isn't just within ATF. It's bad in all the other Treasury agencies. It's never worked fairly, and it doesn't work now. And until it is

changed, you will continue to get managers up the chain of command who have little or no street experience and really aren't qualified to make some crucial decisions, as happened in Waco."

"This happens routinely," Jorgensen said. "I know of special agents in charge now on duty who have had only a couple of years on the street. I know of one who has less than two years of street experience. He impressed somebody along the way and was put in a series of papershuffling jobs. Onward and upward and pretty soon you're the SAC of a large district and you've never really done the job. It's like having somebody who's chief of surgery at a major hospital who only did some scalpel work when they were a resident medical student. It's a unconscionable situation.

"The major change needed is [to] the so-called merit promotion system. Not only has that not been done, but any semblance of merit promotion

has gone out the door at ATF, evident by the fact that more and more lawsuits and complaints are being filed by agents against the ATF," Jorgensen said. "Mr. Magaw is bold and brazen about it. He'll promote, say, a female agent to an executive position without any competition for the job. He just says that his decision and he's done it ... It's hurt morale, of course.

No Cases, No Problems

"If any agents have been intimidated by Waco, it's the marginal producers who had to be cajoled, pushed and shoved into action, even in the best of times. But it's the ones that are less than marginal that often get promoted; the ones that make *no* cases. Remember the old adage: Big cases, big problems; no cases, no problems. If your merit promotion system is working, these people couldn't get promoted. But they do, and that is my point."


The existing process for evaluating and promoting front-line supervisors within Treasury agencies is "crucial ... because it's from those front-line supervisors that you eventually get your ASACs, your SACs, your associate directors," the NATA head said. "They all started out as front-line supervisors. So if you've got a skewed process for selecting those front-line supervisors, you're eventually going to have layers of skewed middle-and-upper-management at the SAC level and the associate director level. The process for selecting front-line supervisors must have integrity or the whole system eventually is going to be rotten to the core and cave in on itself."

Kay Kubicki agreed. "This is what corrupts and destroys the integrity of our government," she said. "I think many, many people have lost all faith and trust in the quote-unquote system. ... And once government loses its legitimacy ... it's a very dangerous situation. Because ordinary people lose respect for authority. We ... expect some order, and ... that people who break the law will be punished. And when these people in government loot our tax dollars, or commit other crimes, and they are allowed to not only get away with it, but are retired on a government pension, no reasonable person can have respect for the governing authority. The system has broken down." 🕱

non ammunition uses electric primers; but despite the widespread adoption of battery-powered small-arms accessories such as image intensifiers and laser-aiming pointers, there still would be major psychological barriers to be overcome. Electronic trigger mechanisms work well enough in match weapons but the stakes seldom are deadly on Olympic firing lines, where the targets never shoot back. Asking an infantryman to bet his life in the heat of battle on a battery-powered LCD control panel is not something even a chaplain could expect to get away with.

As to small-arms potential, most existing weapon designs already cover present requirements at least adequately, if maybe not to the degree of perfection some NATO planners still appear to desire. No penalty-free quantum leap in smallarms effectiveness seems possible without resorting to the completely unconventional - and equally controversial — "death ray" solutions. But with the adoption of a new U.N. protocol on laser weapons, even this avenue already is being closed off.

A "Repeatable Claymore"?

Another application for Metal Storm's volley-fire system is in antipersonnel area defense: a "bullet-firing Claymore." Unlike the real Claymore mine — a one-time-only weapon — Metal Storm's version could be fired many times before human intervention was required. Another of O'Dwyer's proposals, the Small Remote Perimeter & Asset Protection Pod, is for a 169-barrel weapon. Only 4 inches square and 16 inches long, it would be loaded with 10 rounds of 5mm ammunition per barrel and weigh a total of 47.5 pounds.

His "repeatable Claymore" concept further envisages a 5mm weapon with 288 barrels and 864-round payload, able to be preconfigured with firing rates and burst duration. Such a weapon could even be used as a "machine gun substitute" delivering suppressive fire during amphibious assaults on heavily defended beaches or helicopter landings at "hot" LZs. This would be a "hungry" weapon,



though, requiring sufficient space on a ship, vehicle or helicopter for extra ammunition.

And another point: Particularly in aircraft-mounted applications, the recoil of thousands of rounds fired at very high rates presents its own problems. O'Dwyer suggests this could be countered by exhaust ports venting to the rear of a pod or (maybe less practically) by blank rounds in its rear section, firing backwards.

He also predicts the bigger Metal Storm weapons will have commonwalled barrels, which further would reduce bulk and weight. O'Dwyer also believes major weight savings could be achieved using light alloys, ceramics and plastics, with thin metal bore liners, all of which would be especially useful in "throwaway" pod systems.

Many of Metal Storm's ideas, transformed into actual weapons, likely would impose unacceptable weapon handling, tactical and logistical constraints, particularly in relation to military small arms (which, though often maligned, actually have been quite well-honed in the light of

more than two centuries of combat experience). That said, none of this should be interpreted to belittle the impressive effort so far of O'Dwyer and Metal Storm nor their potential for entry in the much more specialized field of CIWS, where entirely different criteria may apply.

bright orange-red insert and is dovetailed into a high-profile, serrated ramp mount which has been securely brazed to the muzzle end of the barrel.

The black synthetic Speedfeed buttstock is an attractive feature. It holds two spare shells on each side of the stock under spring tension. The shells should be inserted into these carriers with their bases to the rear. To access a shell from the Speedfeed system, just push it slightly rearward and then pull it away from the buttstock. This gives you another four shells in reserve. I load two slugs on the right side and two 00 buckshot shells on the left.

We were also sent a pistol grip and the appropriate screws to replace the buttstock and turn any of these shotguns into a so-called "Cruiser" configuration. I cannot recommend this alteration as, in my opinion, combat shotguns should always be fired—in all anticipated scenarios—from a strong shoulder mount for maximum control and hit probability.

All of the Mossberg shotguns sent to us for test and evaluation were equipped with cable locks that can be passed through the ejection and loading ports to prevent accidental firing of the weapon under any circumstances. This is an accessory unique to Mossberg, which has spent a great deal of time and effort publicizing safety. They are to be commended highly for this campaign, but in my loop few will leave fighting weapons at the ready with cables and locks preventing the actions from

functioning. Safety is best promoted by education.

Trigger pull weights on SOF's test specimens varied from 4.75 to 5.5 pounds. The performance level during our test and evaluation was exceptionally high in all areas. All 12 gauge shotguns kick, especially with 00 buckshot and slugs. At only 6.5 pounds, empty, the Model 50404 with an 18.5-inch barrel was the lightest and thus exhibited the greatest perceived recoil. I really like the topmounted safety, but after it has been pushed forward to the *fire* position, you should shift your thumb to the side of the receiver before you press off a shot unless you want a thumb up your nose. All types of shotshells fed smoothly through all four guns and there were no stoppages at any time during our performance tests.

Not everyone can afford a thousand dollars for a custom combat shotgun. Mossberg's Model 500/590 series of fighting shotguns provides the opportunity for those individuals and agencies operating on the most modest of budgets to arm themselves with a robust and reliable scattergun with

some desirable features that guns costing three to four times often lack. Mossberg really does furnish more gun for the money. These are outstanding bargains that make no compromise with either quality or the features required by armed professionals. All Mossberg slide-action shotguns carry a 10-year limited warranty.

buffer will eventually leak into the gun's action and chamber, so the mouth of these shells should be sealed with nail polish or clear lacquer.

However, Federal's most popular 00 buckshot load by a considerable margin is now their so-called "Tactical Load" (catalog #H132-00). It also features copper-plated pellets and granulated filler. But, its big attraction is that it was designed to provide a significantly lower recoil impulse than standard 2 3/4-inch 00 buckshot. This is an important consideration for law enforcement agencies with female personnel and those who practice extensively with a combat shotgun.

At 7 yards, Federal Premium 9shot 00 Buck, when fired from the Mossberg Model 590 (catalog #50668) with ghost ring sights and cylinder bore barrel, impacted the target with all nine pellets evenly spread out within a 4-inch circle, directly to point of aim. At 15 yards, all nine pellets would impact into the torso area of a humanoid target, with six pellets in a 4x5-inch oval. At 25 yards, two or three of the pellets will strike off the torso. This is thus the outer limit of acceptable performance with buckshot fired through a cylinder bore barrel. If you want to reach out another 10 to 15 yards, you need an improved cylinder or modified choke.

For indoor defensive purposes by civilians, I recommend BB-size (.18 caliber) pellets (50 to an ounce), although they are difficult to locate in some areas. All sizes of buckshot, from No. 4 up, can penetrate two or more layers of sheet rock and result





in injury to the very family members you are attempting to protect. And yet, in juxtaposition, No. 4 buckshot loads, which consist of 27 pellets with a diameter of .24 caliber, are no longer popular in law enforcement circles, as pellets this size can be too easily deflected by articles of clothing, such as an open jacket.

Mossberg: More Gun For The Money.



Oscar Frederick Mossberg's first position with a firearms firm was at the Iver-Johnson Arms and Cycle Works in Fitchburg, Massachusetts, where he was assigned to machine work in the bicycle department. From these humble beginnings, the authors take us on an enthralling ride through the history of O.F. Mossberg & Sons, Inc. O.F. Mossberg subsequently worked for C.S. Shattuck Arms Co., J. Stevens Arms & Tool Co. and Marlin-Rockwell during World War I, where he was assigned the challenging task of synchronizing the firing sequence of the Colt aircraft machine gun so that it would not interfere with the rotation of the plane's propeller.

By 1919, Mossberg had stepped forward with his sons and started a factory in a rented loft in New Haven. Connecticut. In those early years. success depended up the Brownie pocket pistol and a succession of rimfire rifles and small-bore shotguns. These products and several others, including telescopic sights, carried Mossberg through the depression years. During the 1930s the line of .22 rimfire bolt-action rifles and .22 smoothbore guns was expanded, always stressing quality at great value for the money.

World War II saw Mossberg producing two .22 rimfire training rifles, the Model 42MB, manufactured for the United States military and primarily intended for British troops as part of the Lend-Lease program, and the Model 44US, produced solely for use by U.S. troops. In the summer of 1943, the Army Air Force requested that a .45 caliber "shot" cartridge be developed for use by downed pilots. Development of the smoothbore barrel, designed to replace the M1911A1's standard barrel, was given to Mossberg. Remington's cartridge proved to be too long to feed through





the pistol's magazine, so it had to be manually inserted into the special barrel's chamber. Mossberg's 10-inch cylinder bore barrel was adopted in September, 1945, although no quantity contract was ever awarded.

The authors take us through the postwar years in great detail, discussing the hammerless action 300 series .22 rimfire rifles, the 350 series semiautomatic rimfire rifles, the lever-action Palomino rifles and the Model 800 series bolt-action centerfire rifles. Mossberg's diversification into canoes, campers, imported rifle scopes, bicycles, golf clubs and Pederson custom guns is also described and illustrated. Every variant of the Models 500 and 590 slide-action shotguns is clearly detailed without exception.

Carefully researched and illustrated with more than 468 photos and drawings, Mossberg: More Gun For The Money was written by the founders of the National Mossberg Collectors Association, who demonstrate their enthusiasm and knowledge of the topic with every fascinating page. Highly recommended for everyone interested in the history of American small arms.

isfaction that there is slavery in the Sudan he can take it up as a cause, to fight against it. ... That is why I say I do not want this important issue to be a propaganda issue in this country, but to be a real issue that concerns particularly the African-American community. ...

SOF: Wars in Africa in this century have been particularly brutal—Congo, Biafra, Uganda, Liberia, Rwanda, etc.—with few combatants paying more than lip service to the Geneva-Hague Conventions. There has been widespread criticism and documentation of SPLA looting, rape, arbitrary killing, and destruction. This hurts the SPLA cause and confuses Westerners on the central issues. What have you done to curb excesses?

Garang: The SPLA/SPLM as a liberation movement — when you compare it to other liberation movements — we have the best human-rights record. We have prisoners of war. In the African wars that you just

mentioned I cannot think of a liberation movement that kept prisoners of war. The Sudan government, our enemy, our opponent, has no prisoners of war. They've been visited by the ICRC. We have prisoners of war; we have released them. We are actually in the process of releasing more now. We screen them. There are three categories: people who want to go back to government-controlled areas; those who want to stay with us and join our liberation struggle; and those who want to be refugees. So that's our record with respect to prisoners of war.

SOF: Earlier you mentioned regulations — a code of conduct — for SPLA troops. Could you brief us on this code of conduct?

Garang: We have a 10-point code of conduct. The first defines the behavior of a soldier towards his opponent. The guideline is that the objective of war is not just to kill the other guy, but to make the other guy noncombative. So if an enemy soldier is disarmed or unarmed, killing that solder is a crime and is punishable by our laws. So it is significant that it [SPLA code] begins with re-





specting the dignity, the human rights of the enemy soldier. We are doing this because if you instill in the minds of soldiers the respect for the dignity of the enemy then it will be that much easier to respect the dignity and rights of others.

So we go on to point two, that is, respect for the civil population. The respect for the elderly, respect for the women — treating them as your own mother, your own sister — absolute respect for the civil population, because it is for them the war is waged.

SOF: Looting?

Garang: Another point. Respect for the property of the civil population. Absolutely no looting. It is a violation of the rights of the people. It affects war, the discipline of the troops ... so we have a definite code of conduct. ...

SOF: In the past there have been accusations that SPLA troops have ambushed relief convoys. Would you care to address this?

Garang: Relief convoys? Why would we ambush relief convoys that are going to us? This is nonsensical. Guerrilla warfare — which is what we are, guerrillas - depends upon the civil population for intelligence, information, political support, for food. ... The international relief that goes to the civil population increases the food of the civil population and the civil population contributes food to us. Now why would I want to prevent an increase in food to the civil population when the civil population feeds me? ... This is a propaganda campaign emanating from Khartoum. And from journalists who want a sensationalistic story.

SOF: Since the 1991 split at Nasir and the later defection of [SPLA executive officer] William Nyuon Bany, there has been more fighting between the factions than against the government. With the fight for Juba the Sudanese military was weakening ... then the split and things began to go in Khartoum's favor. The factional infighting has done what Khartoum couldn't: destroy brigades of southern Sudanese fighters. Are you not achieving the aims of Khartoum?

Garang: Let me put it in perspective. [SPLA officers] Riek Machar, Lam Akol ... William Nyuon, later on, announced a coup. They said they had overthrown the leaders of the SPLM-SPLA. That did not succeed

and when they did not succeed they joined Bashir, they joined the NIF. The Nasir [in southeastern Sudan] faction was getting all their military equipment, ammunition, weapons, uniforms, even food in some situations, from the NIF. They literally became part of the Sudan government forces. There are southern Sudanese that are fighting in the ranks of the Sudanese Army ... there remain southerners, Nubas, that are fighting as government soldiers. The difference between this group is that they were guerrillas before. Then they got co-opted after the failure of the alleged coup - a coup which was meaningless because technically you cannot have a coup in a guerrilla movement. A coup means grabbing power, which means power is concentrated. It is in a place it can be taken. When there is a coup, in the classical sense, you run for the radio station [laughs] ... which we do not have. You run for the general headquarters, which also we do not have; we are mobile. I sleep in a grass hut. So when you say you are leading a coup, what do you mean? You want to take over the grass hut?

So it was not a coup as such. It was an action taken by these commanders to take over leadership and negotiate a settlement with Khartoum. When they did not succeed in that, Khartoum used them against us. We are not fighting ourselves. ... For an example, one [factional leader] had his headquarters a stone's throw from Malakal. If the government wanted to overrun them they would. But they allow them to exist so they would fight us. The same thing with Riek Machar in Nasir, and when Nasir no longer served any purpose for the NIF government, they overran it. There was not a single shot fired when the NIF went to Nasir. ... It is only us who have been fighting the NIF regime from 1983 to 1991. ... So that is why I say it is a misstatement of realities to say that the factions are fighting each other more than the Sudan government. ...

SOF: And how did the recent reconciliation come about?

Garang: Having been fighting us for four years, some began to realize the tragedy of what they were doing. William Nyuon, who was Riek Machar's chief of staff, came back to us and said, "Brothers, this has been



a very bad mistake." He actually came from Khartoum to Juba and from Juba to Lafon. And in Lafon they entrapped an NIF convoy that was going to Kapoeta. It was the second convoy, the first convoy passed through them and they facilitated passage. When the second convoy came the situation had changed; the officers and men in Lafon with William Nyuon decided to come back to the movement. So the NIF troops came, thought it was business as usual, and they fell into the hands of William Nyuon. William captured the commander, 70 others, two T-55 tanks and five trucks. He came to us and said, "This is evidence that I am coming back."

So it is indisputable that the Nasir faction was collaborating with the NIF regime. William Nyuon, himself, confirmed it to us and to the international community. He talks about it openly. He had met Bashir in Khartoum and he has confirmed that Riek Machar was collaborating with the NIF regime. We are now ... winning them back so that we deny them to the NIF and the NIF does not use them and the NIF is trying to pull them. They [NIF] have invested heavily on this they are spending lots of money to keep them on their side. So we are doing everything to see that our constituency, elements of our constituency, are not used [by the NIF].

We are also free to do the same thing in the north. In "Anyana 1," for example, it was the Nuba people that were the main force of Khartoum fighting us. We have neutralized this now because the Nuba people are part of the SPLM-SPLA. In the Nuba Mountains our army there is not less than 6,000 men. So in addition to denying the Nuba to Khartoum they are part of the SPLA and they are fighting Khartoum. The people of the Red Sea have organized their own movement; they are not part of the SPLA. They have their own army and we are in alliance with them. ...

SOF: In the Sudan, hunger is often the battlefield. Because of the scorched-earth policy of Khartoum towards the south, the outlook for the next generation of southern Sudanese is very grim. Thousands of orphans wander the apocalyptic wasteland that was southern Sudan. A 1993 survey found that 81% of all children under five were either moderately or

severely malnourished. Given the other losses to disease and war injuries, will the southern Sudanese survive for another generation?

Garang: That underlines what must be done ... by the international community to alleviate that suffering, by the movement, by the SRRA to help alleviate that suffering. If it is not done the southern Sudanese will continue to struggle. It is their freedom that is at stake. Because the implication of your question is, "Why don't you give up? Why don't you surrender for your own good?" If we surrender we will be slaves. If we don't surrender, we remain free.

SOF: So, better to die free men than live like sheep?

Garang: No, we don't intend to die! [Laughs] So the issue is the cause of the SPLA. The cause of the people of the southern Sudan. Is it just? It is just and it should be supported. ... We have shown that we cannot be defeated. The [Khartoum] regime has announced many times our demise. But that was exaggerated.

SOF: In the words of Mark Twain. ... [Laughs]

Garang: The report of our death was an exaggeration. We have survived, we have gone on the offensive. On the 25th of October we beat the NIF. The NIF was presenting itself to the eyes of the world, that it was invincible. It was literally telling the world that, "Yes, we are evil in the eyes of the world but we are here to stay; we can't be defeated." We [SPLA] have shown that they are evil and they can be defeated. ... We have rejuvenated the SPLM-SPLA and we have put our house in order. We are in alliance with northern Sudanese opposition groups and the NIF is isolated internationally. The NIF is losing. We are confident of victory.

SOF: I understand that you must leave now. Thank you for your time, sir. Good luck to you and the SPLA.

Garang: It has been my pleasure. You are welcome to come back to the Sudan sometime. This time, bring us some anti-aircraft guns! 💢

this up but we could make a report to the ordnance people and find out what their experience was when field testing the weapon.

At daybreak the company saddled up readied itself to move back into the old night defensive position. During the night they periodically fired mortar rounds into the position to keep any VC forces honest. Several of the tracks carrying ammo were left in the area, along with individual weapons and other personal equipment, which were quickly gathered as they prepared to move out on the day's route-security mission. I examined the track where the incident occurred: The weapon and vehicle were almost totally destroyed.

The largest body part I saw appeared to be part of a hip. Four lives had been snuffed out in an instant. The division commander choppered in and I told him what I thought had occurred, and he in turn talked to the young company commander and sent him off on the day's mission. I returned to

my office and investigated routine complaints. The men in the company put the incident behind them. They had more on their minds: their security mission that day, just keeping alive, watching out for snipers and booby traps and trying to outsmart an elusive enemy who was always there hoping to catch them with their guard down.

As I said good-by and boarded the commander's helicopter, I could only think of the families of those four dead soldiers. Their parents were probably not aware that they had lost a son. Somewhere some officer was preparing to visit and inform them of their misfortune. They would probably never know how it happened; how their sons had died. They would be informed their sons died bravely in the service of their country. They would receive a flag draped over a coffin they would not be told was empty. It would receive a military burial with honors.



changes in both direction and elevation. It is usually employed against a target area whose longer axis is at an oblique to the line of fire. Changes in both direction (usually 2 mils) and elevation (depending upon the obliquity of the target area) are made after each burst.

Swinging traverse is used against targets when rapid changes in direction are required. Targets of considerable width moving toward or away from the gun, or vehicles moving across the front are examples that might call for swinging traverse. To employ swinging traverse, the traversing slide lock lever must be loosened enough to permit the gunner to swing the gun laterally. Free gun fire is used against moving targets which must be engaged with rapid changes in both elevation and deflection. The T&E mechanism is moved off the tra-

versing bar so that the gun can swing freely up or down and in either direction. Swinging traverse and free-gun firing expend the greatest amount of ammunition with the lowest hit probability. They should be employed only as a last resort in combat, or by those at a civilian machine gun shoot sitting on an inflatable toilet seat with large quantities of ammunition to waste.

Whenever possible, to provide for the most accurate fire, the tripod legs should be secured by sandbags. Several sandbags under the tripod's pintle bushing will also add to the system's stability. The tripod's rear legs should be planted firmly into the ground, preferably against a wood backing, if that is available. The M2/M122 tripod's traversing bar has an engraved scale to assist in measuring or establishing horizontal angles. This scale is calibrated with 100-mil major divisions and 5-mil minor subdivisions, up to 450 mils left and 425 mils right. Note that the .50

caliber M3 tripod and its T&E mechanism are just scaled-up versions of the .30 caliber mount

The *mil* is a unit of angular measurement used in artillery and machinegunnery. One mil is equal to 1/6400 of a circle. But, the most important thing to understand about mil increments is that 1 mil is an angle that subtends a width of approximately 1 unit at a distance of 1,000 units. Thus, on the old 1,000-inch U.S. Army machine-gun target, moving the gun 1 mil will change the point of impact 1 inch. This corresponds to 1 yard at 1,000 yards or 3.6 inches at 100 yards.


The BMG T&E mechanism's threaded upper elevating screw has a longitudinal slot with a scale plate subdivided into 50-mil increments to indicate plus or minus elevation adjustments. Secured to the lower elevating screw is the elevating handwheel assembly. It's free-turning and mates with the upper elevating screw. The elevating handwheel assembly has a mil click device

built into it. The 50-mil scale engraved on the upper surface of the handwheel is divided into 5-mil major graduations and 1-mil subdivisions. Using the elevating handwheel, the maximum amount of elevation that can be obtained is 465 mils, 265 mils above the zero graduation and 200 mils below

When the T&E mechanism is oriented correctly (with both the traversing slide lever and the elevating screw joint pin — which goes through the gun's rear tripod mounting holes — to the rear, facing the gunner), the traversing handwheel will be on the left side. It also has a mil click device built into it. It has a 25-mil micrometer scale and the gun may be traversed up to approximately 50 mils either right or left using the traversing handwheel, and up to 875 mils by moving the traversing slide along the traversing bar.



all over the place." The point here isn't whether stun grenades would have had any physical impact on the structure — the point is telling the truth!

Some witnesses claim to have seen boxes marked "High Explosives" in the building rubble. In all fairness to the feds, it is possible that what was seen were undercover props. As part of their undercover operations, ATF several years ago had many different "prop" explosive devices made up by various manufacturers to aid in undercover and "buy-bust" cases. Ranging from boxes of ersatz dynamite and blasting caps to military hand grenades and rockets, these props look (even to the trained eye) to be the real thing; the only difference being that they are inert and contain no actual explosives.

Nearly 10 years ago, several cases of Soviet explosive ordnance, including rockets and HE-filled fuzes, washed up on the beaches of southern Florida. The material wound up at FBI headquarters in the Hoover building in downtown Washington, D.C. and there was a fire. Needless to say, when the ordnance began to cook-off, several District of Columbia firefighters experienced the pucker factor of a lifetime, especially when one rocket blasted off, blowing a 2-foot diameter hole in a cinderblock wall. Although the incident was buried on page 99 of the Washington Post, it sent shock waves throughout federal law enforcement agencies prompting them to clean up their own backyards. (More than 30 pounds of explosives were taken out of ATF headquarters just down the street.)

Could the passage of time have dimmed memories and allowed some of these agencies to slip back into sloppy storage habits? Although anything is possible, I seriously doubt any of these agencies would ever again allow large quantities of explosives into federal buildings, especially in large population centers. Oklahoma State Representative Charles Key, concerned about just such a possibility, has twice called for a grand jury to look into these charges. In an interview with SOF, Key stated that in both cases this request was turned

ing and the loss of the children, they were advised to apply for federal worker's compensation, as were 460 other federal employees who were victims that day. Of the 462 federal employees who then applied for worker's compensation, 460 were approved. Guess which two were denied. Part of the basic requirements for compensation state that, "The medical condition found must be causally related to factors of Federal employment." and "The injury must have been sustained in the performance of duty." In its letter of denial, the U.S. Department of Labor, Office of Worker's Compensation stated, in part, that "Your presence at your work site at the time of the explosion does not by itself establish that you were in performance of duty when your injury occurred." What? God forbid someone got up from their federal desk to seek federal relief then slipped and fell while in the federal latrine.

Glenn Wilburn, a less-than-radical CPA, has been involved in his own efforts to find out what really happened. But then he's just a nut

case, if you would believe the feds. But if that's the case why do they feel a need to tap his phone and place his family home under surveillance? Is this just his imagination? Rather doubtful. Whenever certain people come to visit, strange cars show up in the vacant lot across from his house, which when approached, take off like rabbits. On one occasion, while being visited by investigative reporter J.D. Cash and an investigator for Timothy McVeigh's attorney, they looked out to spot a young fed in his shiny red sedan observing them. And, like the black agent in the white van from earlier days, when approached with a camera he beat feet. I guess such foolishness is easier than chasing John Doe(s).

As with Waco and Ruby Ridge, everything in this case is certainly not what it would be made to appear. And as with those earlier federal screw-ups, it's going to take a lot of digging to uncover the truth. There are a lot of people out there who know more than they're telling; restrained either by guilt or fear. They need to come forward — the sooner

the better. With that, I issue a personal appeal to those who have any valid information. In the memory of all who died, their families and loved ones, and for our nation, help us uncover the complete truth.

Dange-ia-Menho on low-loader transports in preparation for the attack, which would commence from the area of Malanje, a town located some 360 kilometers east-southeast of Luanda. However, the op was postponed half a dozen times and finally canceled.

Other EO men assumed key positions. Col. Blaauw took command of Combat Group Alpha; his FAA counterpart was Brigadier Gen. Sachimo. The group included a motorized infantry battalion.

down. Representative Key is still pursuing the matter.

Just Shut Up

As was the case with Waco and Ruby Ridge, anyone who begins to voice concerns and questions the government version of events is immediately branded as a right-wing, antigovernment, hate mongering conspiracy theorist by the liberal members of the media and the minions of the Great and Powerful Oz. Soon afterward, Blaauw was detached to take command of the Saurimo sector. A tactical HQ already had been established in Saurimo, about 160 kilometers west of the Cafunfo diamond fields, by Rykaart. Combat Group Bravo then became the operational unit for the attack on Cafunfo.

To this end, Russian air crews flying the huge, droop-winged Il-76s lifted 32 BMP-2s, two at a time, eastward from Luanda.

Recons Turn Rough

Rykaart's choice of action in the east was limited. Unita was well established in the region; their forces were wide-ranging and they could strike almost at will. (Even now some tend to overlook the remarkable mobility and spirit of Savimbi's men; a bad mistake.)

EO units began immediately with disruptive actions against known rebel positions. They hit first at Xinge, the regional HQ under Unita Brigadier Bule, who consistently has shown an aggressive style of command.

This task required much reconnais-

sance work in preparation for the coming offensive. Since many of Rykaart's men had served in the SADF recce commandos, the preemptive attacks should have been a breeze. They were not. Eight EO men were killed or reported missing in action in this phase. None of the bodies ever has been recovered.

By the time Blaauw took over in Saurimo, planning had reached an advanced stage.

Because of a civil war that had been fought for 20 years, eastern Angola, though well-populated and rich in diamonds, had become fragmented. Savimbi dominated 90 percent of the countryside as well as the roads; FAA personnel and equipment could be moved only by air.

Most of the bridges linking Saurimo with the western part of the country had been destroyed in previous offensives. The few that were standing, such as those south of Cafunfo at Manuel Angola and Cuango across the river of the same name, had demolitions in place should any MPLA force move in that direction. While Blaauw acknowledged

that it would have been useful to strike out directly westward in the direction of Cafunfo, that was impossible because of a dozen or more rivers that flow north into Zaire.

Many of the roads had been mined. In this, Unita had been particularly effective. (Recent surveys by U.N. personnel have shown that it will take three to five years of concerted effort to clear the main routes in the region of land mines — and never mind secondary roads.)

For these and several other reasons it was decided that Combat Group Bravo should first move south along the main road from Saurimo and then lead westward once the strategic crossroads at Cacolo (about 150 kilometers west of Saurimo) had been overrun. It would be a succession of battles, he predicted; Cacolo was as vital to Unita's war effort as it was to the government's. It lay across the main east-west highway linking Luanda with the interior and Zaire.

From Cacolo it would be another 200 kilometers to Cafunfo. Two months were allowed for the opera-

tion. Only 25 days actually were needed.

What made the Cafunfo operation different from any other was that Combat Group Bravo went to great lengths to avoid roads. The 28 BMPs that Blaauw would use in his attacks were tracked vehicles; he would push them overland through the swamps, savannah and rain forests of northern Angola. While he was in tactical command, he was answerable directly to the senior FAA commander with the column, the Cuban-trained FAA Brigadier de Castro, an old hand at unconventional bush operations. Interestingly, de Castro and Blaauw had crossed swords before, in southern

The first phase of the operation, the capture of the crossroads, came after the Alto Quilo River had been bridged by Russian TMM bridge-laying vehicles. Luanda had allocated two TMMs to the combat group. Without them the attack would have been stopped within days.

Progress through the Angolan hinterland was slow. "Bundu-bashing" is difficult in raw Africa. This corner of the continent had never been opened up by the Portuguese by the time they left Africa in 1975.

Unita was active here. Not a day went by without the column being mortared or ambushed.

"They hit us regularly," Blaauw recalled. "But they had little effect against our armor; we just shut the hatches and plowed into their lines. They suffered terrible losses. We would be traveling along in the bush and as soon as we heard the distant plop of mortars, we would close down everything and drive on. Sometimes their aim was well off. At other times we got hit. But their NATO-supplied [mortars] had little effect on us, even if a machine took a direct hit." A direct hit by a mortar, however, was hard on the crew's eardrums.

The route chosen by Blaauw and the Angolan brigadier was a series of remote bush tracks north of the main Cacolo-Cuango road. A second, smaller column would feint west from Cacolo, but that was a diversionary tactic to keep Unita guessing.


"Our tactics caused serious prob-

lems for the Unita High Command," the EO officer said. "They had been expecting us to hog the road and had prepared accordingly. They never believed that we would head straight across country. It had never been done before. So they weren't able to bring heavy artillery to bear. If they had it might have been different. Most important of all, we avoided their minefields.

"And of course we were helped by our air superiority," Blaauw said. "Any Unita concentration or town would be plastered by EO pilots flying Russian MiG-23s and Swiss Pilatus PC-7s." The aircraft were armed with 68mm rockets and 250-and 500-kilogram impact bombs.

In desperation, Savimbi threw everything he had at the approaching column, now within 20 miles of Cafunfo. Some attacks were suicidal. Men on the ground or in soft-skinned vehicles were no match for the FAA armor. The Unita leader had detached some of his most experienced units from other areas to try to keep the FAA out of Cafunfo.

Both of Savimbi's senior com-

manders, Gen. Bok (the chief of staff/logistics) and Gen. Ben (head of operations, and Savimbi's deputy), were driving the Unita end from Cafunfo. The Unita commander heading the northern sector at the time was Gen. Luzamba, a fine tactician with much experience of battle.

The last serious resistance offered by Unita was at the small town of Firiquichi, where a large force set an ambush for the FAA column. Although some of the supply vehicles were hit, the BMPs — as in the past — simply made for Unita lines, overran them and scattered the attackers. More than 90 bodies were counted afterward, including one of Savimbi's commanders, Col. Neves, an expert in unconventional warfare. Once the EO/FAA column had taken the town, accurately sighted mortar fire rained down on the BMPs.

Then came Muvuca, and an astonishing stroke of luck for Blaauw.

A Hidden Treasure

EO pilot Lourens Bosch (who later would be shot down by a SAM and killed) was flying one of the

PC-7s returning to Saurimo after rocketing Unita positions around Cafunfo. Suddenly, about 10 kilometers west of Firiquichi, he took fire from a remote bush area near Muvuca. That was unusual; Unita never wasted ammo. He decided to investigate.

Bosch, a ballsy flyer, went in low to observe what little he could see of the ground in the forest. There were some vehicle tracks, which in itself was out of the ordinary. Then came more ground fire. Bosch flew off.

Next day, while approaching Muvuca, Blaauw — having spoken to Bosch by radio — decided to follow up. He detached two BMPs from the column and led a sortie. There was no resistance, but he also saw numerous vehicle tracks.

He informed Brigadier headquarters of his intentions and searched farther into the thick bush. Then the patrol found it: a deserted storage dump — Unita's main logistical base. Its guards had fled without offering resistance.

If some Unita soldier had not

fired needlessly at the EO pilot, Savimbi's force might have survived this action to fight another day even if they lost Cafunfo. As it was, here was a mountain of stores: ammunition, food, beer and other commodities. In that remote region it was worth more than money! There also were 400 drums of fuel — enough to keep Blaauw's column on the move for weeks.

It probably had taken Unita a year to gather this valuable material. Bringing it in overland from Zaire was an enormous task. Now it was lost.


Savimbi never had foreseen that Blaauw would move across country. The rebel leader probably had chosen this site for its remoteness and inaccessibility. It was far to the east of Cafunfo in a place where there were no towns and where few people ventured. The dump should have been secure.

Blaauw's discovery was one of the worst disasters of Savimbi's long career.

there was any real danger. Of course not. They were in costume for another of ATF's staged media productions. It was real evil."

Rick Kent was not taken to jail that night. "He didn't talk a lot" when his wife and child returned, she said. Early next morning, Kent wrote out a suicide note and left his house without saying good-bye. He visited a friend to whom he had loaned a 20gauge shotgun, telling the man he had to turn it over to law enforcement authorities. Kent drove his silver-and-blue Chevrolet truck to a remote hunting preserve in Trumbull County, near the Pennsylvania border. He parked, walked about 130 feet into the timber, put the shotgun barrel against his heart and pulled the trigger. He was found two days later.

"They had taken away his job and taken away his reputation," said Painesville Police Chief Jerry White, who had known Kent for decades and was critical of the ATF's high-profile raid tactics. "The guns were all that he had in life. Now they've taken them, too. It wasn't surprising it ended the way it did."

"I don't know how else this could have been handled," ATF Agent Pasaka said. "He was afforded as much courtesy as could be expended."

Her husband "was a person who lost most of the things in his life that made him feel like he was somebody," Lynne Kent said. "And maybe there's a message there — that we should put less emphasis on our jobs and more on what our family means. Because he meant the world to us. There are so many things I don't know, and the really sad part is that I'll never know."

Scotty Kent, too, is struggling to understand; to comprehend why the daddy he loved is never coming home again, and how such a little boy can fill his dad's empty shoes and take care of his mom. He wants to be a police officer, like his dad, she said. The day after Rick Kent's body was found, Scotty clipped his dad's picture from a local newspaper and said he wanted to take it to pre-school to show his friends.

He looked up at his mom and said, "I have to tell everyone the bad news." 突

U.S. illegally. Unlike Mr. Osorio, Mr. Andrade was not a U.S. citizen by birth, but is reportedly living in New Jersey. FBI agents in San Francisco say they tracked down and interviewed Mr. Osorio.

Yet the U.S. investigation represented only half the problem for Mr. Osorio. The San Francisco Examiner suggested that he had acted as an informant for the U.S. against his guerrilla companeros. And now Mr. Osorio says he is afraid to visit El Salvador. Yet even if Mr. Osorio aided the investigation, that doesn't absolve him of guilt in the original attack.

Sen. Shelby and some colleagues hold out hope of eventually bringing Mr. Osorio to trial in the U.S. for the killing of six Americans in El Salvador. But that's unlikely to happen anytime soon, if only because the killings occurred outside the U.S. But whatever happens with possible

criminal action against Mr.
Osorio, his case should have one salutary consequence: it should cause the National Endowment for the Arts, San Francisco city government and other taxpayer-supported agencies to look more closely at which "artists" they fund. Some of their grantees may be guilty of more than just crimes against good taste.

PARTING SHOT

The Traitor

A Peruvian military court handed down a life sentence to a young New York woman who became infatuated and then involved with a Peruvian terrorist group. This has occasioned much wailing and gnashing of teeth in the Upper West Side circles from which she hailed. These homegrown leftists conveniently ignore her close ties to a guerrilla group, the Tupac Amaru, that has been responsible for killings and much general mayhem. There may be legitimate questions raised about the fairness of her trial, but it's hard to argue that Peru shouldn't punish terrorists, whatever their nationality.

In fact, maybe it's time we held other American radicals responsible for the bloody consequences of their actions in Latin America. Start with Romeo Gilberto Osorio, a 48-vear-old U.S. citizen now residing in the San Francisco Bay Area. Mr. Osorio, who grew up in both El Salvador and the U.S., revealed last year to Ed Bradley on "60 Minutes" that he had served as a comandante in the Salvadoran guerrilla movement, the FMLN, a decade ago. On June 19, 1985, querrillas from his faction approached a restaurant in the Zona Rosa district of San Salvador and opened fire. Four U.S. Marines were killed in the attack: Sgt. Thomas Handwork, 24, of Beaver Creek, Ohio; Cpl. Gregory Weber, 22, of Cincinnati; Sgt. Bobby Dickson, 27, of Tuscaloosa, Ala.; and Cpl. Patrick Kwiatkowski, 20, of Wausau, Wis. Also slain were two Americans employed by the Wang Corp.: George Viney, 48, of Miami, and Robert Alvidrez, 47, of Lexington, Mass.

By the end of August 1985, three suspects had been arrested and charged. Eventually, they were found guilty in the attack and sentenced to prison. Mr. Osorio was not among those arrested. By the time of the "60 Minutes" interview, he had returned to his home in San Francisco and was living a quiet life. He seems to have spoken out publicly for the first time to further a reconciliation between former opponents in the Savadoran civil war.

Yet his statements suggest that Mr. Osorio is completely unrepentant about his role in this massacre of Americans. In interviews with the San Francisco

news media, he never expressed the slightest doubt, regret, or remorse about the Zona Rosa attack, nor about any of the other excesses by the left in the Salvadoran war. He described his "jubilation" at the deaths of the four Marines, and insisted "there was a need to practically declare war Ion1 the United States."

Mr. Osorio said he had not been involved in the actual shooting in the Zona Rosa, but was chief of operations of the group that committed it. He also said that during a guerrilla offensive in 1982 he ordered that any American caught in a combat zone in the northern Salvadoran province of San Vicente be executed. Mr. Osorio told me: "It didn't matter who they were. We wanted to kill some Americans."

In light of these comments, Mr.

Osorio's professional affiliations in the U.S. take on an even greater import. In 1977 Mr. Osorio cofounded the Mission Cultural Center for Latino Arts Inc., a nonprofit group in the Mission District of San Francisco. This center was set up with funds provided by the city and county of San Francisco, and it is still housed in a city-owned building. The cultural center also received \$5,000 to \$10,000 from the state of California and \$30,000 per year from the National Endowment for the Arts. starting in the mid-1980s. In the

uproar following the "60 Minutes" segment, the cultural center has feebly attempted to distance itself from Mr. Osorio, but the nonprofit's records show that he played a leading role in its decision-making process until very recently.

Not surprisingly, Mr. Osorio's revelations have prompted some to wonder whether the U.S. govern-


ment should be continuing to give him such cozy treatment. The family of Sgt. Bobby Dickson contacted their senator, Richard Shelby (R., Ala.), and demanded an inquiry into Mr.Osorio's legal liability in the death of their relative. Sen. Shelby then questioned CIA Director John Deutch and later held a closed session of the Senate Intelligence Committee, on which he serves, to investigate Mr. Osorio's status.

In November 1995, Sen. Shelby, joined by Sens. Arlen Specter (R., Pa.) and Bob Kerrey (D., Neb.), called on Secretary of State Warren Christopher to determine whether Mr. Osorio or another leftist involved in the Zona Rosa attack, Pedro Antonio Andrade, had been allowed into the
