Kudos to the Civilian Marksmanship Program!

The Civilian Marksmanship Program deserves a gold star - no, half-a-dozen gold stars, for initiating a program to recruit hi-power shooters to serve as instructors in the U.S.Army Designated Marksmanship Instructor Courses. The Squad Designated Marksman (SDM) is trained in advanced marksmanship techniques that facilitate him engaging man-sized targets from 200 to 500 meters. This type of accuracy, the Army has finally figured out, is what is needed to engage elusive targets in the WOT where Islamic Vermin Scum are often intermixed with civilian noncombatants. Each infantry squad is supposed to have one troop who is a trained SDM. The Army had to turn to the civilian sector for assistance, as they simply do not have enough qualified marksmanship instructors to accomplish this mission.

Because Mother Army, had discounted the significance of individual marksmanship over the past few decades, all the Advanced Marksmanship Units (AMU) at major bases, such as at XVIII Corps, located at Ft. Bragg, which I commanded before flying off to Vietnam in 1968, were

disbanded. This resulted in only the AMU at Ft. Benning having the knowledge and experience base to teach advanced marksmanship. But they did not have enough instructors, so, the Army turned to the CMP to identify and recruit qualified civilian shooters to fill in the gap. CMP volunteers serve on a volunteer basis, but their travel expenses are reimbursed while they are on assignment. For further information check, out the CMP web site at www. odcmp.com/Programs/MRIApp.pdf Or "google" "Civilian Marksmanship Program," punch up the Dec. 05 newsletter and then click on "Army SDM Instructor Program Grows With CMP Support," It is certainly gratifying that some elements of the organized shooting community have shown the initiative to provide the Army with a much need service. Good on the CMP; good on the Army for having the flexibility to utilize volunteer help and good on the cadre of 40 volunteers who have volunteered their time! We, in the shooting community, owe a "Atta-boy" to all involved in this program.

Corporal Jeff Starr, USMC

Others have died for my freedom, now this is my mark'.

Corporal Starr, like thousands before him ... has made his mark. It, like his patriotism, will not be wiped away by cheap tears and the whining of those who want to "cut-and-run" in Iraq.

Support our Troops in Afghanistan

My son is currently serving with Task Force Fury in Afghanistan. I run a support program that sends weekly care packages, and sent over 800 Christmas Shoeboxes filled with presents to them. My program was written up in the Washington Post, put on the AP wire service and has appeared in newspapers throughout the country, even made Stars & Stripes.

The unique part of our program is that the soldiers e-mail us with their needs and wants. They have been asking for copies of your magazine, which I have been unable to find locally. Is there any way you could send them some copies, even back issues? I can furnish names and addresses of soldiers who would be willing to share them with other soldiers.

The guys in Afghanistan get left out due to the media focus on Iraq, and ask for so little. Would you please help me help them? They have been in combat longer, survive in worse weather conditions and generally get the short end of the stick in supplies and equipment. Yet they serve us all bravely.

Any help you can provide will be greatly appreciated.

This short note doesn't tell half the story about this Great Gal and the work she is doing. We were glad to ship out several cases of SOF to the addresses she supplied, of course, but that was a drop in the bucket compared to what she's accomplished on her own, working five-day weeks, then cleaning houses weekends to pay the postage on items donated for the troops, mostly by the good folks in and around Culpeper.

She has info packs for donors she can send to folks who want to send care packages themselves, with checklists of items requested by the soldiers (she is unique in that she takes requests directly from the boots on the ground), with needed items, names/addresses of soldiers, usually the First Shirt, and info about customs regulations, postal forms and so on (send her a large SSAE for this).

Around Christmas time she had sent out nearly a thousand individual shoeboxes and bags of goodies in large shipping cartons, and at this writing is still sending out 3-4 large boxes a week -- and will as long as the troops are there (and the boxes all got there in time for Christmas).

Pat also works as a clearinghouse for donors, directing them to organizations already up and running, as well helping folks start their own group to send care packages to our guys. She has contact with organizations that are non-profit, so donors can take the tax deduction if they want. She still works directly with the soldiers of Task Force Fury and Task Force Bayonet in regard to care packages.

More info? Send a large SSAE to the above address. Specific question? E-mail Pat at the above e-mail address. Items or cash to donate? E-mail and she can give you points of contact for non-profits who can receive the funds, or shipping info on items you want to donate, or specific needs with names/addresses you can send to directly; she can also e-mail the info pachet.

Frequently asked-for comfort items? All the usual suspects: socks, disposable razors, paperback books, sweet and salty snacks, foot powder, sunscreen, lip balm, pipe cleaners, AA batteries for NVGs, trail mix, packets of cocoa and Kool-aid, toothpaste/brushes, chewing gum, hard candy, beef jerky, potato chips in a can, soap, waterless towelettes, scarves/stocking hats/gloves (subdued colors)...You remember – all the stuff you needed in the field yourself.

One Gold-Hearted Pat Jacobs is worth ten "professional non-profit agencies" rattling the tin can at the end of the pay line. Help her work where you can.

Items List For Our Troops


On Veteran's day we are holding an event to help out our troops here and overseas.



And they are reorganized as a non-profit so your donations in cash or in kind are tax-deductible. Check 'em out and grab your checkbook. Highest Immigration in History – 50% Illegal?

A Center for Immigration Studies analysis of new Census Bureau data (available online at http://www.cis.org) shows that the immigrant population (legal and illegal) reached a new high in 2005. The data, which the Bureau has not yet analyzed, also show that 2000-2005 is the highest five-year period of new immigration (legal and illegal) in American history. Almost half of new arrivals are estimated to be illegal aliens.

The new report provides a detailed picture of the socio-economic status

of immigrants, including estimates for illegal aliens. States with the largest increase in immigrants are California, Texas Georgia, New Jersey, Maryland, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Washington, Virginia, Arizona, Tennessee, Minnesota, and Nevada. The report was prepared by the Center's Director of Research, Steven Camarota.

Immigrant Troubles Down Under

Muslims who want to live under Islamic Sharia law, instead of Australian civil law, have been put on notice by the Australian government officials. While the government targeted radicals in a bid to head off potential terror attacks, and a day after a group of mainstream Muslim leaders pledged loyalty to Australia at a special meeting with Prime Minister John Howard, he and his ministers made it clear that extremists would face a continuing crackdown.

Treasurer Peter Costello, seen as heir apparent to Howard, hinted that some radical clerics could be asked to leave the country if they did not accept that Australia was a secular state and its laws were made by parliament. "If those

are not your values, if you want a country which has Sharia law or a theocratic state, then Australia is not for you," he said on national television. "I'd be saying to clerics who are teaching that there are two laws governing people in Australia, one the Australian law and another the Islamic law, that is false. If you can't agree with parliamentary law, independent courts, democracy, and would prefer Sharia law and have the opportunity to go to another country which practices it, perhaps, then, that's a better option," Costello said. Asked whether he meant radical clerics would be forced to leave, he said those with dual citizenship could possibly be asked to move to the other country.

Education Minister Brendan Nelson later told reporters that Muslims who did not want to accept local values should "clear off". "Basically, people who don't want to be Australians, and they don't want to live by Australian values and understand them, well then they can basically clear off," he said. Separately, Howard angered some Australian Muslims by saying he supported spy agencies monitoring the nation's mosques.

UN Gun Ban Defeat in Brazil

A Brazilian correspondent of John Farnam's wrote: "Good news from here in Brazil! Last 23rd October our federal government made a national public consult [referendum] about the continued private ownership of guns. The question we Brazilians had to answer was, 'Do you agree to ban the public, commercial sale of all firearms and ammunition?' Only two answers were allowed: 'Yes' or 'No.' 'No' won by 64 to 36, a huge majority.

"IANSA, the UN, and other Marxists were shocked that their little stunt went down to such a decisive defeat, despite all the effort they put into it. They tried to assure us Brazilians that we're all too stupid to own guns. They got it shoved up their nose!

Peacekeepers Help Make Kabul Safe For Democracy

Kabul, 16 September. After last week's rocket attacks, a deadly car bomb blast downtown, reports of shots fired near our camp and the Afghani Presidential election rapidly approaching in October, we learned in our Orders-Group, (O-Gp) that nine suicide bombers had entered the Kabul area. In an effort to counter this threat, Bravo Company intensified its patrolling activities in and around the 2-kilometer perimeter of Camp Julien, located in southern Kabul. I took this opportunity to go out with a Section [Squad] from 5 Platoon in order to get a feel for the terrain and see the reaction of the local populace to our patrolling.

After receiving detailed orders and conducting rehearsals, we mounted up in our Light Armoured Vehicles or LAV IIIs. Dressed in our new digital-style Canadian Pattern, (cad-pat) combat clothing for desert operations, we wore our armoured vest with chest and back plates, load-bearing vest, (LBV) for carrying our rifle magazines and other essential equipment, and Kevlar helmet with a mounted Monocular Night Vision Goggle (MNVG) for observing in the dark. We carried our heavy-barrel C8 [M16A2] rifle with infra-red, (IR) pointer and SureFire flashlight, both mounted on a rail system. We also had two C9 [M249 SAW] gunners with us as we depart Camp Julien.

It was nearing last light and we were dropped off approximately 2 km north of camp. For security reasons, vehicles only leave camp in pairs, and our two LAVs stopped in the middle of the road while the patrol quickly dismounted with security out on the flanks, with two air sentries per vehicle standing in the rear of the LAV's watching their arcs – and our backs. Traffic stopped and locals stared. Ramps up and the LAVs quickly departed. We immediately leaft the main road in single file and headed down an alley followed by 10 or 15 kids who soon lost interest when they realized that we

aren't giving anything away.

I'm fifth in the Order of March, (OOM) in a 10-man dismounted foot patrol, behind the Navigator, Patrol Commander, Language Assistant, and Signaller. It's now dusk and the alley we're moving along varies in width between 6 and 10 feet and is bordered by adobe walls measuring 6 to 12 feet in height that surround homes, act as fences and delineate property lines. As we meander our way along these alleys, dusk turns to night and we proceed down uneven dirt paths with trenches dug down the middle that act as open sewers, reeking of shit, piss and garbage. As we progress, we pass by Afghanis going about their business; Some of them occasionally greet us with "Salim" or "Hello." But mostly they just stare. We quickly realize that they only know one or two words of our language and have no replies for "How are you?"



We continue down these darkened alleys, careful not to twist our ankles on the rutted paths or step in something foul in the open sewer, as we scan the rooftops and fence lines for snipers or signs of an impending ambush. Beat-up old vehicles bump past us as we close our "disengaged eye," trying not to spoil our night vision, aware that they could be carrying a suicide bomber or a Vehicle Born Improvised Explosive Device (VBIED). The threat here is real. Unlike Bosnia, where we seldom if ever left the paved roads or hard-pack, here we judge the roads and dirt paths by a "risk assessment" dependant on the amount of local traffic.

Occasionally, we stop for a navigation check, as we twist and turn our way in what seems like a random manner in these maze-like roads, knowing that at any moment we could be ambushed from any direction. On our radio, we occasionally hear the Patrol Commander or Patrol Second in Command, (2IC) issue instructions to watch a certain T-junction or to change direction or formation as the path narrows and widens or twists and turns. From a nearby Mosque, we hear the Muslim nightly prayers echoing down the "road," not really knowing from which direction the sound is coming. We hear a radio playing in a home, as people go about their nightly business and we go about ours. The alleys are extremely dark, as this area has no electricity. The occasional light we do see is from a kerosene lantern. The night is overcast with no moon and a bit of a wind, which kicks up dust and forces us to squint into the dark. We change direction and now the mud walls act as a wind tunnel and a dust devil passes through the patrol. The boys are bunching up and I tell them to spread it out to three paces between each man and to watch their arcs of fire. The Language Assistant stops

for a piss against a wall.

A Busload of Tomorrow

We see lights approaching and hear singing. A bus bumps its way past us, full of singing kids waving at us. We wave back and try to regain our night vision and stay focused on our mission. Intelligence tells us that 95% of the locals support us. Kabul is home to more than three million people and 5% of three million still leaves a lot of bad guys around to ruin your day! Each of us has a green chem. light, cracked and protruding about an inch out of our vests so we can identify "friend from foe" without the aid of our night vision goggles. On occasion, we lower them to check out a suspicious door-Continued on page 32



The One-Way Fight

ver the past few weeks, we'd been warned about signs of impending action. These signs - and worries - always precede big events in Iraq, and we were approaching the National Elections on 15 December. Quite a while ago, a large body of insurgents and terrorists - in the hundreds according to after-action reports – attacked the Abu Ghraib prison facility about four miles away, apparently in an effort to free some of their buddies captured during anti-terr raids and campaigns. It was a pretty big shootout for a few hours, and quite a surprise, as it wasn't expected that the enemy could concentrate that many people for such an attack. They are normally too scattered, too diverse, and too disorganized to get together like that, not having a central command structure, central goals, common ethnic groups, etc. to bring them together. In spite of its unusual organization, the attack was a complete failure, with few American casualties and many enemy deaths, including a few of the prisoners who were hit by insurgent mortar fire during the attack.

But, following that attack, there had always been the concern that it might happen again, and with better planning. My work and quarters locations are somewhat vulnerable. The work site is valuable because of what we do.

Baghdad is one of the centers of fighting due to its mix of Sunni and Shi'a inhabitants. Every home has at least one AK - fact, not hyperbole. There are gunshots every day, often every hour, from the village, with a few explosions thrown in for good measure, so it is a bit tense around here. But the gunfire is usually ineffective and the mortars and rockets have missed hitting people here most of the time. On occasion we found out the villagers fought off enemy insurgents coming to attack us through their village. We are not sure it is because they support what we are doing, or are territorial - thinking that we are "their" targets, not anyone else's. Such is the nature of internecine warfare in Iraq.

If anyone attacked through our perimeter wall with car bombs, to open it up or to take down one or two guard towers, we and our "homes" would be on the route to the main targets. The other bases in the area have larger components of combat troops than we do, adding to our exposure.

So, when we hear the "signs," of impending attack preparation, we take them seriously. The problem is, every time there is a major event like the elections coming, we always hear rumors of enemy actions in response.

As I said, the elections were coming this week. My office worked as usual until around 2000 or 2100 hours, then, as we have been doing for the past three or four Saturdays, a

Leathernecks Critique A Hard-Won Victory

"Ramadi was rough." — Sergeant Clayton T. Anderson, Assistant Sniper Team Leader "Seminole Bravo"

irst Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment, First Marine Division is back home at Camp Pendleton, California licking its wounds after its third combat deployment to Iraq since spearheading the attack that led to the downfall of Iraqi president Saddam Hussein. 1/5 deployed to Ar Ramadi, the capital of Al Anbar Province, in the heart of the so-called "Triangle of Death," west of Baghdad in March of 2005. The battalion returned home six months later.


The "Fighting Fifth" lost 15 Marines and a Navy corpsman KIA and 130 WIA in Ramadi, more KIAs than the two previous deployments combined. Five of the KIAs were due to enemy snipers. The other Marines, most of whom were on their third deployment to Iraq, died as the result of IEDs.

Improvised Explosive Devices are feared more than enemy snipers in Iraq today. Like hand grenades and horseshoes, you only have to be close with an IED. They are stealthy like snipers in that they can't be seen, and strike without warning. And they are much more deadly. IEDs can rip open armored Humvees and amphibious assault vehicles like cans of sardines.

Lance Corporal Marty G. Mortenson and Corporal Kelly M. Cannan with 1st Platoon, Company A, were killed a month into the deployment when an improvised explosive device detonated near their convoy.

Saddest Day

Two months later, the battalion suffered its biggest blow when six of its warriors were slain in Ramadi on June 15. Five of the Marines were killed when their Humvee was destroyed by



an IED.


Corporal Tyler S. Trovillion, a grenadier and team leader, died alongside four comrades from 3rd Squad, 2nd Platoon, Company A - Corporal Jesse Jaime and Lance Corporals Chad B. Maynard, Dion M. Whitley and Jonathan R. Flores - when an IED exploded directly underneath their Humvee.

Petty Officer 2nd class Cesar O. Baez, a corpsman with the Jump Platoon, was killed by an enemy sniper in a separate incident the same day. Baez, 37, had

completed law school and passed the California bar exam while in the Navy.

According to Tovillion's best friend, Lance Corporal Ben A. Lively, from Richardson, Texas had a knack for spotting IEDs. He had uncovered several in Ramadi, but the veteran of two previous deployments to Iraq never saw the one that ended his life and snuffed out the lives of four other Marines in a blinding flash.

"I know guys in our battalion who were hit by 16 or 17 IEDs during our



deployment to Ramadi," said Sgt. Anderson, who had two close calls.

"We knew we were gonna get hit," said Anderson as he recalled the night his Humvee ran over an explosive device, probably a 60 "mike-mike" mortar round, buried too deeply in the road to cause catastrophic damage to the armored vehicle but still make a big boom. The blast sent fireballs up both sides of the high-back steel-plated Hummer Anderson's 8-man team was riding in, but they survived without a scratch.

On another occasion, the team was heading to a private home in Ramadi when the driver missed a turn. Instinctively, Anderson ordered him to cross the median strip of the duallane highway instead of continuing on to an intersection "Sierra Bravo," one of three sniper teams in 1st Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment, started out at Camp Pendleton as a five-man team and morphed into an eight-man team in Ramadi. ahead. As they crossed the median, an IED detonated in the intersection, spraying their Humvee with bits of shrapnel. Not everyone in the battalion was as lucky.

Captain John W. Maloney, the commanding officer of Charley Company, was killed on the evening of June 16, 2005 when an IED detonated beneath his Humvee. His .50 caliber machine gunner, Lance Corporal Erik R. Heldt, was also killed in the blast. Maloney, a prior enlisted Marine, and his company were conducting a vehicle reconnaissance of a portion of the company's AO when the IED exploded.

At Maloney's memorial service at Camp Snake Pit in Ramadi six days later, the battalion commander, Lieutenant Colonel Eric M. Smith, read a letter Maloney's wife wrote to the Marines of C Company:

"John was very proud to serve alongside you and took every chance he had to brag about you," wrote Maloney's widow, Michelle, who is left to raise two young children.

Company C's Executive Officer, First Lieutenant Latham E. Fell followed Smith's eulogy by saying Maloney always put his men and friends before himself. "What I remember best about him was his total commitment to his Marines," said Fell, "He demanded the highest levels of performance from his men, but even more so from us."

Tough Tour of Duty

Like it did during World War Two, the Vietnam War, and during the invasion of Iraq, First Battalion, 5th Regiment once again paid the butcher's bill in blood, but 1/5 always doles out more death and destruction than is inflicted upon one of the best battalions in the United States Marine Corps.

"Ramadi was rough," said Sgt. Anderson, assistant team leader of "Seminole Bravo," one of three eight-man sniper teams in 1/5. This was Anderson's third combat tour, a "Trifecta" of sorts. One week after returning to Camp Pendleton, Anderson talked about his tour during a late night telephone interview that lasted more than an hour.

"Ramadi's like the lion's den of their little religious war," said Anderson, "and while we were there, we didn't fight many Iraqis. The insurgents were mostly from other countries."

There weren't many veterans of Operation Iraqi Freedom who deployed to Ramadi. Only 120 or so from the original roster of 1,100 made the third deployment.

Anderson was a SAW gunner in First Platoon, Charlie Company during the invasion of Iraq. When Anderson returned home in May 2003, he was selected to attend Arabic language school. When 1/5 deployed to Iraq the following spring, Anderson was attached to CAP, the Combined Action Platoon, as a squad leader. He and his squad patrolled the farmland outside of Fallujah trying to win the "hearts and minds" of the local population, in hopes of learning the whereabouts of insurgents and weapons caches being used against Marines in Fallujah. Not since Vietnam had the Marine Corps deployed a Combined Action Platoon in a combat role.

Corporal Anderson was wounded along with 75 percent of his platoon when they were ambushed outside Fallujah. Anderson was hit in the elbow by a ricocheting AK-47 round, but had no lingering effects after the wound healed. But the incident changed his mind about how he wanted to spend the rest of his enlistment. He wanted to be the one doing the

"ambushing," instead of waiting for someone else to pull the trigger. When he returned to Camp Pendleton, Anderson applied for Scout Sniper School. He never attended the school, but he was assigned to 1/5's Scout Sniper Platoon. Anderson was an expert marksman, and that's what SSP needed. There was at that time, and still is, a shortage in the Marine Corps of 8541s, the MOS [Military Occupational Specialty] of Scout Snipers. Anderson's ability to shoot and speak Arabic made him extremely desirable, and he deployed to Ramadi as an assistant sniper team leader. But he didn't get the rush he thought he would get.

"The battalion just didn't have the character it had when 1/5 invaded Iraq," said Anderson. "And the fact we really didn't have time between deployments to do complete workups [which] hurt us in the field," Anderson said. The battlefield had also changed dramatically since Anderson rode through the sand berms that separated Iraq from it neighbor, Kuwait, and engaged enemy soldiers in the strategically important Ramalyah oil fields just a few klicks inside the border.

Marine snipers stacked up insurgents like cords of wood in Fallujah in the spring of 2004. City elders begged Major General James N. Mattis, commanding officer of First Marine Division to pull back his snipers. They apparently thought Mattis had hundreds of them. Before "Mad Dog" Mattis and his Marines could apply the coup de grace to Fallujah, politics entered the picture, and 1/5 was ordered to pull its cordon back 10 to 15 miles. Enemy insurgents, including snipers with Syrian passports, managed to swim across the Euphrates River after dark and slip downstream to Ramadi.

When 1st Battalion, 5th Regiment, the unit this reporter was embedded with during Operation Iraqi Freedom, returned to Ramadi in the spring of 2005, the bad guys were waiting for them.



At first, Marine snipers ruled the roost. They shot and killed almost everyone who was caught carrying a weapon on the streets, but it wasn't long before the "Hunters" became the "Hunted" in the Triangle of Death. Enemy snipers in Ramadi were better than the ones 1/5 faced in Fallujah. For one thing, they were better shots – no more "spraying and praying." They not only nailed Marines on rooftops who exposed themselves, but also picked off targets on the move.

Staff Sergeant Ramon E. Gonzales-Cordova was killed as he led a platoon of Iraqi Security Forces and several Marines on a foot patrol through Ramadi. Gonzales-Cordova was the platoon sergeant for 2nd Platoon, Company C during the fighting in Fallujah and for the first three months or so of this deployment, when he was selected to train new members of the ISF and lead them on counter-insurgency sweeps in Ramadi.

Sniper fire also killed Corporal Garry W. Rimes, a rifleman and scout with 2nd Platoon, Weapons Company, but

Purple Hearted Another Finest Generation... Tactical PSYOP Team 1291 deployed to Iraq in September, 2004 as a three-soldier "slice" of Tactical PSYOP Detachment 1290. TPT 1291 was tasked to support "Rattlesnake" 2-14 Cavalry, a maneuver squadron organized under the 1-25 Stryker Brigade Combat Team. SPC Joshua Yuse patrolled with his team and their supported units across a broad sector of western Nineveh Province. While executing psychological operations in support of Iraq's first free elections, Yuse was wounded in a gunfight at Tal 'Afar Castle 17 January, 2005 and evacuated. This article, written by his team sergeant on the day of the incident, is the story of SPC Yuse's last operation in Iraq.

He's young enough to be my son. Annoying enough, too. When I beat on his hooch door this morning to get him up for a mission, he was his typical floppy-jointed, addle-headed, eye-rolling self. It was pouring down rain, I was standing out in it wearing PT shorts and a raincoat, and I had no patience: "Get up, time to move. You're goin' down with Apache."

Long groan -- but he knew what the mission was since last night.

"Quit your bitchin', Yuse," I told him. "You're lucky as Hell. You get to hang out at the castle, and I have to go ride the hatch in this shit."

Yuse was going downtown to broadcast over the LRAD – i.e. "Long Range Acoustical Device," a gizmo originally designed to warn boaters away from the exclusion zone surrounding naval vessels – while I was going to charge around town in one of Charger Troop's Stryker armored vehicles, broadcasting pro-election messages, pre-recorded in Arabic, from a man-portable loudspeaker system.

"Yeah...I guess," he said, squinting and rubbing the back of his head, sullen as a teenager – which, at 21, he practically is.

"Be at the office no later than zero-seven-thirty," I told him, before throwing on a uniform and four hundred bucks worth of raingear to go there myself.

I was closing in on a peak experience of blood pressure when he slouched through the bunker door at 0729.

"I took the trailer off."

"Oh," I said. "How we doin' on fuel?"

"I filled it last night."

Good To Go

"Alright, let's get your pack together."

"I already got it, sergeant -- it's ready to go."

"Damn, Yuse. I hardly know you!"

Goofy grin from him: "I do what I can, sar'nt."

And so I dropped him down at Apache's hangar, ran to the DFAC (Dining Facility, i.e. mess hall) to pick him up a box breakfast, and presently, off he went into Tall 'Afar.

But I never made it out on my mission today. After I put together my briefing memo on new PSYOP (Psychological Operations, the branch of the army that communicates on behalf of the supported commander) products for the squadron commander and walked it over to the TOC (Tactical Operations Center) I ran straight into the battle captain.

Shot Up

He said, "Oh. It's good you're here. Yuse's your guy, right? We got a report he was shot in the neck..."

"WHAT?"

". . . but apparently he was wounded in the hand. A fragment hit him in the chin, and it bled all over, and they thought he had a neck wound."

"IDF (Indirect Fire, i.e. mortars [likely] or artillery [not so likely] or SAF (Small Arms Fire)"



PSYOP troop with a .50? You bet: sometimes you have to make them listen. Yuse gets some alternate training on one of Apache 1/5 Infantry's Barretts at the FOB Sykes range.

"We don't know yet."

"Are they bringing him in now?"

"We don't know yet."

Everything takes too long, and the cavalry's axiom is true: the first report is always WRONG. And so I grabbed my troop data notes, dropped off my memo for the SCO (Squadron Commanding Officer, a lieutenant colonel billet. I didn't get along well with ours) and CPT Murphy and I settled the report.

I dropped by Charger Troop to beg off my day mission, then I went to the aid station to wait. Everything takes too long, and Murphy's Law (no relation) never fails us: Yuse couldn't be evac'd immediately due to continuing contact, which required Apache's available combat power to stay onsite and fight. Then, after Apache's company commander personally rolled his own vehicle out to the castle and picked up my soldier, they hit an IED on the return trip.

Everything takes too long. It took twenty (20!) minutes for Apache Six-Six to move from the ECP (Entry Control Point) across the base to the aid station, because a convoy of civilian fuel tankers was plugging up the roads all over the FOB. Bureaucracy is everywhere; logistics govern every transaction of our lives.

Good to Hurt: Means You're Alive

When Stryker A66 finally rolled into the aid station lot and dropped ramp, my kid soldier was sitting inside, holding up a bloody bulb of gauze the size of his head. He looked mighty uncomfortable.

The first words out of his mouth were, "I'm alright, sergeant."

It seems that Yuse was running the LRAD when the castle came under fire, as it usually does when that bullet magnet is in operation. He put down his DVR (Digital Voice Recorder: invaluable little tool for PSYOP and a good reason to mooch lots of batteries from the Air Force, who always had them and were good to us)/MP3, picked up his rifle, and took up a security position along the battlements. When the sniper found him, the neck-aimed bullet hit him in his forward hand, bounced off his rifle and dug into his armored vest with a heavyweight punch. A fragment of the bullet jacket flew up and cut his chin to the bone. Infantry and commo soldiers gave him buddy aid. They said he wheezed pretty hard. They said he stayed alert and responsive.

They said he never complained.

What Yuse did do, after he was shot: he trained up a commo sergeant on how to run the LRAD, so that while he

waited for evac, he could keep his mission going. He secured, or caused to be secured, all of his sensitive items and PSYOP equipment. He marveled at the bullet they dug out of his vest. He told everybody not to worry about him, and reminded them to keep their heads down.

Everything takes too long. At the aid station, one x-ray salvo wasn't enough; they had to go two rounds with that. The shaky-handed lab tech who tried to start Yuse's IV failed five times on his right arm before someone else took it away and plugged it in properly, upstream of his bullet-riddled left paw.

Hope It's Not Wasted

Through all that, nothing but some wincing and the occasional, "Oww."

And this comment: "I'll tell you one thing. These elections better work. They better get democracy, and freedom, and their rights, and hot chicks in tight jeans.

"I hope I didn't take this bullet for nothing."

And so, although everything seemed like it was happening in slow-mo, Specialist Joshua Yuse was treated, given a bit of morphine, and presently evac'd by a UH60 Blackhawk helo.

I made sure he had his IBA (Interceptor Body Armor) with the souvenir slug in one pocket, helmet, coat and the bloody DCU (Desert Camouflage Uniform) blouse with his name on it. They can wash it out at the hospital. They do it all the time.

I held onto his weapon, which caught the bullet as it exited through the meat of Yuse's left thumb. That weapon is NMC (non-mission capable) and irreparable — it won't ever cycle again without the bottom half of it being replaced. Later, I would have to strip rounds out one by one, and crush the magazine with pliers before I could remove it. I pray my driver's left hand will recover better than his rifle.

Then I stood and watched him lift off, and saluted him in my way. I doubt he noticed. He was trying not to drop his IV bag, which sounds like a simple trick until you try it while juiced to the gills on morphine and battling the shaky shock of adrenaline withdrawal.

Another Finest Generation

I'll miss Yuse here, and not just for the work he does, which is plenty if I remind him often enough. I'll miss him pulling dumb stunts, working so hard at not working that it exhausts him just to think about it, starting to do pushups just because I gave him a hard look, teaching me how to play Yahtzee (then beating the crap out of me), and schooling me

at ping-pong until he gets impatient and starts hitting the ball too hard to spin it down onto the table.

He's a near-total dingbat with no sense of planning who still manages to get things done; a lazy sloth who works like a sled dog. A good kid with bad manners; a graceful athlete who trips over his own size twelves. This is the overgrown boy I have to kick out of the rack every morning, remind him to check the oil, bring his gloves on mission, and shower periodically.

Mostly, he's just too much of a goofy kid for me to have expected him to take this like a man.

Yuse doesn't want to be deployed to Iraq. He wants to chase women around Seattle, and go to college and find out what he wants to be. He wants to play video games, drink some beer, and buy a Mustang.

Guys my age are supposed to gripe about how kids today are letting the world go to Hell in a hand basket, how there aren't any standards for behavior anymore – after all, we've taken such good care of the place. It's not like we're passing along a turd and expecting them to polish it . . . right? Maybe it's because guys my age usually work with guys my age. Guys Yuse's age are just parts for the big machine in civilian life: laborers, clerks, apprentices. Yuse went from busboy to combat soldier. Now he's WIA, and he doesn't even have the good sense to snivel about it.

He was subsequently evaced to 67th

CSH (Combat Support Hospital) for surgery, then on to Landstuhl. As they loaded him onto the C130, he was fretting about letting down my team and our detachment by flying out to Germany.

I don't want to hear any more whinging over the passing of "The Greatest Generation." For God's sake, open your eyes: ain't no generation better than his.

Specialist Yuse didn't take it like a man. He took it like his brothers across the generations, and earned his flagon of mead at Valhalla or at least his schooner of Bud at the local VFW.

He took it like a soldier. 🕱

SPC Yuse made an excellent recovery. Occupational rehabilitation helped him regain sufficient use of his left hand that he was able successfully to complete Air Assault training in November, 2005. He was promoted to the rank of Sergeant on 19 November 2005. The following day, he was presented with the Purple Heart Medal, Army Commendation Medal with "Valor" device, and Combat Action Badge for his actions in Iraq, by Seventh PSYOP Group Commander COL Gary Medvigy. Following their tour, TPT 1291 was relieved by a full 16-soldier tactical PSYOP detachment.

My students learn how to nail all those no good punks out there with invincible strikes that no one ever sees coming. They know how to inflict serious damage very, very fast. They know that "Mr. Nice Guy" is fine for polite discourse, but no way to win a fight against someone with bad intentions.

In addition to having the largest school in all of Ireland, I am the man who introduced Mixed Martial Arts over here several years ago when I ran the first Irish Vale Tudo Open. Three of my students entered that competition - and all of them won national titles.

I've been seriously involved in martial arts and boxing for over 18 years. Not only that but I was one of the pioneers who brought submission fighting to Ireland. So believe me, I've seen fighting, I've taught fighting and I've done it myself.

As for the use of Irish bare-knuckle technologies, I don't just teach "how to" on the subject. On occasion I've had to use my knowledge to put some punk in his place.

The first time I used one of these Irish bareknuckle techniques was about 10 years ago, when I had a fight during a sparring session with some other clubs in Dublin

I was moving and picking off my heavier, slower opponent with jabs that he couldn't see coming. The guy had no idea of the "art" of boxing I was using and I was jabbing him at will so he must have felt pretty stupid.

The next thing I know he's firing full power clubbing punches and I'm covering up on the ropes

The referee yells "break" and the guy keeps punching. The referee physically grabs him from behind and drags him off me.

As I was in sparring mode and was much younger and nicer then - I didn't immediately react the way I would today. So when the fight restarted and the same thing happened, I started to wise up right quick

When he came at me I decided to give this "waste of oxygen" something to remember me by when he looked in the mirror.

As he charged forward I met him with all my weight behind a modified dirty right jab. All I can tell you here is I didn't hit him with my knuckles because I had big 16-ounce gloves on. Yet, because the Irish bare-knuckle strategies can be adapted to the ring, with or without gloves, the result was the same. The genius rammed his nose into my strike and his face went one way while his nose took a detour towards his right ear.

I quickly moved out of the way faster than I have ever moved in my life. It wasn't so much the caveman swings he was still trying to throw as the spraying blood I wanted to avoid. As we proceed, a door slams, startling us, and we watch as two men move off down the alley for some unknown destination. We change direction and come into a large open area. We spread out and continually watch our arcs of fire, scanning left to right then right to left, far, middle and near, the rooftops and the fence lines. A soldier stumbles in a pothole and almost goes down but regains his balance. Our senses are heightened, the patrol is alert. We hear voices as we approach another intersection and see a faint light ahead. We pass by a small kiosk, built into the side of a mud wall, with two locals counting that day's receipts. They look up briefly as we pass and then return to their business, ignoring us. Bicycles with friction lights mounted to the tires go by, their bells ringing to let us know they're

there. We watch, not really trusting.


We proceed down another narrow alleyway in loose file and come to an open area surrounded by dilapidated buildings. Alternately on each side of the path, with our backs against the walls and fences, we move on, covering each other with interlocking arcs of fire, just in case. We halt for another nav check and the Patrol Commander radios in a Situation Report, to HQ. The Patrol Commander then gives directions to the lead man and we move off and cross the dark open area ahead of us. I lower my MNVG and night becomes an eerie green day. People are walking this way and that, oblivious to us. I activate my IR pointer, which is only visible through my MNVG, and see that wherever the IR beam strikes, my rifle barrel points. It is correctly zeroed and ready for action if required. There is no real tension

- only a sense of mission.

We come to a paved road and turn right. I check my watch and see that we've been on the move for 90 minutes and we're now heading west, back toward Camp Julien. Vehicle traffic is heavier as we straddle either side of the road in loose file and move toward camp and a much-needed shower. Sweat has soaked through our clothes though the pace had been slow. It now picks up a bit and the Patrol Commander tells the lead man to slow down as we have an old man along with us. He is, of course, jokingly referring to me.



come to another junction and turn left and see the bright lights of our camp to our South, less than a kilometre away. We pass by numerous small shops and kiosks that are still open for business; Kids wave at us, local music is playing. An Afghani walks beside me and hands me a piece of fruit. I ask, "What's this?" He replies that "it's sweet, it's good." I thank him and take a bite, savouring the cool taste and moisture. I realize that I'm very thirsty, but as we're almost "home" and I can wait for water. I again hear the sound of prayers coming from some far-off Mosque.

A car drives by and screeches to a halt near the front of the patrol. We raise our weapons and I hear the Patrol 2IC say from the rear, "I signalled him to slow down." The Patrol Commander responds, "That scared the shit out of me. They don't know our hand signals." I move off the road and cover a flank, while the Patrol Commander moves to the vehicle and talks to the driver through the Language Assistant. The vehicle drives off. We relax and lower our weapons. We again begin to move and the Patrol 2IC tells the boys to space it out and watch their arcs as "we aren't

home just yet!"


We pass the once-proud King's Palace, now looking old and sad in the shadows after years of war and bombings. I imagine someone opening up on us from the top floor and mentally wargame the battle. We turn right and head toward the Afghan Militia Forces gate. The AMF guards wave us past as we radio in our position to HQ and request permission to close down.

After debriefing us, the Patrol Commander heads off to write his Patrol Report. The Patrol 2iC accounts for all the serialized equipment and I pass on a few words of wisdom to the men, from my own observations. We've covered five kilometres in two hours and honed our patrolling skills in an area of operations where the threat is real. Everyone is back safely with a better appreciation of our training and more experience for the next patrol. Chugging back a litre of water, I head off for a much-needed shower and wonder what tomorrow will bring. We're here on a six-month tour of duty and still have four months to go. The Presidential Elections are just around the corner and hostilities are expected to increase. The intense work-up training we had at home in Edmonton, Alberta, prior to deploying is paying off. The soldiers are primed, our equipment is excellent and we'll be ready for whatever the future holds. R



Know Thy Enemy... And How To Operate His Weapons (Part One)

In the movie Charge Up San Juan Hill, one of the Rough Riders, upon capturing an enemy position, threatened to kill a Spanish soldier unless he showed him how to operate the Maxim machine gun in order to use it against the rest of the Spanish on San Juan Hill.

Although the firearms of all countries essentially worked the same for hundreds of years, the end of the 18th Century saw major changes: In addition to belt-fed machine guns, early examples are the U.S. Model of 1911 and the P08 ("Luger"). During World War II, differences became even more widespread, but the importance of learning how to operate enemy weapons was often overlooked. This left much of the hands-on experience to on-the-job training. Sometimes it came too late.

Familiarizing troops with foreign weapons before battle re-

quires that such weapons be on hand. In the wake of Vietnam one would think that the U.S. Military would have retained boatloads of weapons used against us as a component of basic training, especially since the same weapons are more prolific than ever, but such is not the case. Special operations forces receive training with foreign and enemy weapons, because they often work behind enemy lines, but regular troops do not.

The result is that, although we began hostilities in the Middle East over two decades ago, and are deeply embroiled in a struggle there for the foreseeable future, many of our troops have no idea how an AKM works, much less how to operate it effectively. Training someone else to operate it is simply out of the question, but this is beginning to change.

Long recognizing the need to provide effective foreign

The Men

Beginning with 200 of America's finest, Unites States Marines from Camp Pendleton's 1st Marine Division received a week of intensive training in Gunsite's new Foreign Weapons Class during the final months of 2005 – prior to their redeployment in early 2006, for many their third time. By a stroke of good fortune, I was there for the first wave, as 25 Marines hit the sands of Arizona about as far away from a beach as they

are in Iraq as you read this.

Although the weather's a lot better in Paulden than in the Middle East, the terrain at Gunsite is very similar to the "sand box" and this made things very realistic, especially when running some of the drills the Marines were put through. Every one I spoke with was totally impressed with the training.

One of the requirements of the Major in charge of the unit was that no full-face photos be shown of his men, so you'll see only profiles, or blurred faces in these pages, and no names will be mentioned. Many of these men are married and all have families, and terrorists know no boundaries.

One question I asked was whether the class would be offered to civilian contractors or civilians in general. While this isn't out of the question, Gunsite anticipates an increasing demand by the U.S. Military for this training, and the Military's needs will naturally come first.

weapons training to U.S. Troops, Gunsite, of Paulden, Arizona, recently took the bull by the horns. Investing thousands of dollars in brand new former ComBloc weapons, Gunsite began developing an extensive training course in how to operate them, and to train others to do so. With Gunsite's long and excellent relationship with the United States Marine Corps, it didn't take long for the mountain to come to Mohammed (political incorrectness intended).

The Weapons

Manufactured largely in Romania, Hungary and Bulgaria, the weapons provided for the training were almost exclusively of Russian design, most of which have been in continuous service around the world for nearly a half-century. They included the following:

The 7.62x39mm AKM Rifle

A modernized version of the AK-47, the AKM needs little introduction to most. Its main difference from the AK-47 is that it uses a stamped sheet metal receiver rather than a machined one. The AKM fires the same 7.62x39mm (M43) cartridge, uses the same long stroke gas piston and the same 30-round magazine or 75-round drum. Variations of the AKM can also be found in the newer 5.45x39mm. Each Marine was issued a semi-automatic AKM for the week of training with several selective fire models also used for training. Their full-auto rate of fire is about 700 rounds per minute.

The selective fire 7.62x39mm RPK Light Machinegun (LMG)

A long barrel version of the AKM, the RPK is also equipped with a bipod and is the standard squad automatic weapon (SAW) of most countries that issue the AKM or AK-47. The RPK sometimes has a heavier butt stock than the AKM and uses the same magazines. Like the AKM, the RPK can also be found in 5.45x39mm and it has the same rate of fire as the AKM. Both the AKM and RPK have an optical sight base on the left side of the receiver.

The selective fire 5.45x39mm "Krinkov" Carbines

Amounting to a CQB version of the AKM, the "Krinkov" has a barrel only 8 inches long with a special combination muzzle brake/flash hider. The "Krinkov" also comes with a skeletonized folding stock. It is normally found in 5.45x39mm, but the Krinkov also exists in 7.62x39mm. The "Krinkov" fires at a rate of 800 to 900 RPM and is most effective in urban or other close range combat.

7.62x54Rmm PSL Sniper Rifle

The Romanian version of the Soviet SVD Dragunov, the PSL uses a stamped receiver along with some other changes, but has all the features of the SVD and was chosen for the class because no SVD's were available. The standard sniper rifle of ComBlok countries since the Vietnam Era, the SVD is based on the AK system, but in a larger format to accommodate the longer and more powerful 7.62x54mmR (rimmed) cartridge, which has been the Russian standard for the past century. Firing by semi-automatic only, the SVD (and PSL) has both open sights on its barrel and an optical sight base on the left side of the receiver similar to that on the AKM and RPK. This base accepts a standard optical sight or a night vision scope. A skeletonized, fixed, wooden butt stock is standard as is a 10-round box magazine. The PSL has is accurate to 1,000 meters.

The 7.62x39mm RPD LMG

The predecessor to the RPK, the full automatic only RPD is also operated by long stroke gas piston and fires the same 7.62x39mm cartridge from an open bolt using a non-disintegrating linked belt. This belt holds 100 rounds of ammunition and is normally housed in a round drum-like can that attaches to the gun. The feed system is much like that used in the M60 and M240 where the rounds are pushed through the link from back to front and into the chamber. The RPD is equipped with a bipod, but does not have an optical sight base, and fires at a rate of 700 RPM. Rather than a rotating AK style bolt, the RPD uses dual slide-locking flaps. While it has largely been replaced with the lighter, less expensive RPK, it is still encountered throughout the Middle East.

The 7.62x54Rmm PKM LMG

Firing the same long range 7.62x54(R)mm round as the SVD Dragonov, the

Marines Drop 'Steel Curtain' on Iraq-Syria Border Towns Text & Photos by Cpl. Micah Snead

HUSAYBAH, Iraq (20 Nov. 2005) — The Marines of 3rd Platoon, Company L, 3rd Battalion, 6th Marine Regiment, recently pushed through buildings, streets and the constant threat of improvised explosive devices and enemy attacks to bring stability and security to two Iraq border towns in western Al Anbar province.

The platoon took part in Operation Al Hajip Elfulathi (Steel Curtain), along with more than 2,000 Marines, Sailors and Soldiers from Regimental Combat Team 2 and 1,000 Iraqi Army Soldiers. The Marines pushed through the Euphrates River Valley cities of Husaybah and Karabilah Nov.

"Our mission (was) to clear and search everything we came across," said 2nd Lt. William J. Milana, 3rd Platoon commander. "We moved in coordination with every other unit through the cities and conducted detailed searches as we went."

The goal of the operation is to restore security along Iraq's border with Syria and to destroy the Al Qaeda in Iraq network operating in the region. Before pushing into Husaybah, Marines occupied battle positions at Camp Gannon, located between the city and the border, and in the river valley north of the city. After weeks of waiting and watching, the Marines



finally had a chance to take the fight to the enemy.

"Up until this point, we haven't been able to go into the city," said Lance Cpl. Travis W. Garrett, a 3rd Platoon rifleman. "This is our chance to pay back the people who've been taking shots at us whenever they get a chance. Now, they won't be able to shoot and run."

With gunfire, mortar blasts and detonations ringing out across the city, the platoon swept through by day and rested at night. In addition to being the platoon's first combat operation since clearing the city of Sadah in October, Steel Curtain was an opportunity to get to know their Iraqi counterparts. A four-man fire team of Iraqi Army soldiers was attached to each squad in the platoon and it didn't take long for the Marines and Iraqis to bond.

"I was very impressed with them personally and profes-

sionally," said Sgt. Sean T. Selman, a rifleman and squad leader. "We initially conducted a handand-arm signal class to make sure they were on the same page with us, but they were ahead of the game. They knew our procedures for movements, searching and clearing and were just as eager as we were to fight the enemy.

"Personally, it was encouraging because I think our greatest key to success will be the Iraqi people taking defense of their country into their own hands. As that happens more and more, our job will become much less difficult."

By Nov. 9, the joint force cleared all of Husaybah and began preparations for a permanent security presence inside. The platoon uncovered several weapons caches and seized buildings used by insurgents to target Camp Gannon.

Beginning Nov. 10, the platoon and all of Company L moved into the river valley north of the cities and conducted searches for Al Qaeda in Iraq members who may have fled.

The company then moved to eastern Karabilah and began clear and hold operations there.

Deadly IEDs and



car bombs littered the streets of Karabilah as the Marines pushed into the city. On the night of Nov. 10, tragedy struck the platoon when Lance Cpl. Daniel Swaim was killed by a pressure plate-triggered IED hidden in a narrow alley. The explosion also injured an Iraqi soldier, one of the platoon's Navy corpsmen and two other Marines.

"I would rather face a

firefight with the enemy all day and all night than have to deal with IEDs," Selman said. "It's the worst enemy in the world because you can't fight it back. All we can do is deny this region to the people who would plant them here. These are people who don't care if what they do kills an American or an Iraqi, they are only interested in chaos."

The platoon faced the task of carrying on the operation without Swaim the next day.

"The enemy wants us to quit and this is the only way they can come up with to hurt us," Capt. Richard H. Pitchford, Company L commander, told the platoon the next morning. "Lance Cpl. Swaim would have wanted us to carry on. He will be missed, but the best way to remember him is to keep taking the fight to the enemy."

The platoon uncovered more IEDs as they moved deeper into the city and, on Nov. 11, another blast injured more

Marines. The platoon responded to the adversity they faced with courage and professionalism.

"They really showed what they were made of when things got bad," said Staff Sgt. Antonio O. Foster, 3rd Platoon's platoon sergeant. "They didn't lose their heads as soon as someone got hurt. Marines and corpsmen were assisting casualties, other Marines posted security without

having to be told to, everything they were supposed to do. You always prepare for these moments, but never want them to happen. Times like these are when you find out what kind of Marines you really have."

The Marines moved back to Camp Gannon, 12 Nov., to rest and refit before assuming security positions in and around Husaybah and Karabilah. While the intensity of the operation washed off of them and they came out of their worn socks and uniforms, the next battle was already present in their minds.

"At a time like this, you're already thinking about what's next," said Lance Cpl. Eric A. Thompson, a 3rd Platoon rifleman and fire team leader. "Everyone in this platoon is set on killing the guys who want to hurt us. This is a break, but it's really just time to get ready to go back out."



few of us gathered in the day room of my part of the duplex to watch DVD movies. Several men from my office were present, along with a couple from another office working in our Palace. Our women co-workers — military and civilian — were in two houses about 30-40 yards down the street.

At about 2057 hours, while we were deep into the movie The Professional, a 1990's movie starring Jean Reno, one of the guys suddenly jumped up and raced to the back door, facing the perimeter wall. As soon as he threw the door open, we all heard what triggered his rush: the sound of gunfire. Lots of it.

We are used to hearing one or two shots every now and then, sometimes with a five-or ten-round burst of full-auto fire from one of the guard tower machine guns in response to someone shooting at the towers.

Surround-Sound With Tracers

This was different. Very different. The air was suddenly filled with an immense amount of noise from continuous machine gun fire – so heavy that individual rounds could not be

distinguished. We raced outside and all we could see, lighting up the darkness from just outside the wall, were hundreds, even thousands of rounds filling the black sky with brilliant, angry red lines reaching everywhere. I have seen the attack videos from Abu Ghraib, and

this was worse in volume of fire – much worse.

"This is what it is like!" I told my office mates. I am the "old veteran" to them, having served in so many other wars. They have not seen heavy combat, just the shots now and then around the wall.

No one said anything else about what to do. Each raced back to his own room — I did not know nor care what they were doing. All I wanted to do was grab my gear and get prepared for the enemy coming over that wall so close.

It took time to throw on my 40 pounds of gear: bullet proof vest with armored



plates inside (guaranteed to stop AK-47 rounds - if they managed to hit the plates instead of the spaces between), chest pack of ammo magazine carriers, with seven magazines holding 30 rounds per magazine for a total of 210 rounds. My Beretta pistol was strapped to my leg with its extra three magazines, for another 45 rounds. My Randall knife was in front of it, as was my Surefire flashlight, bright for pinpointing targets at night. I also grabbed a special tactical flashlight that virtually blinds someone at night, and reaches for a long distance. My final, and most important grab was my M4 carbine. I had just checked one out a week before, fearing attack during the elections. This is the M16 modified into a shorter weapon, more useful in the SUV I drive around in.

During the time I was putting on the combat gear, all I could hear was the deafening roar of automatic fire from every direction. The lights in the house were switched off by me, but I could easily see by the light of the tracers arcing everywhere. Flares were descending to light up the areas as well. It only took a couple of minutes, but it felt like hours—when one needs the gear, one needs it now! My gear, including the pistol and



holster, is already attached such that when I put my pants on, the pistol is already on with them. The bullet-proof yest has the ammo on it.

I was trembling with excitement – partly fear, partly eagerness, and mostly adrenaline. I had not seen such combat

since Vietnam some decades ago. I knew what to do and knew I was going to do well, but was still afraid, knowing the odds of getting hurt or killed just went up enormously, especially if the enemy was coming over the wall — there wasn't much between him and the targets he

might come after. Just us: non-combat support people, who perform a particularly vital role and who would make excellent alternate targets to the enemy if he knew...

For a moment, there was the tempta-

tion to remain in the room, to avoid the action, to hope nothing would happen if I stayed in the room. That feeling always comes in war. It is panic, fear, and a survival instinct that most of us have. Yet, panic kills you more than cold, cal-

culating actions and decisions. Hiding in a corner gives up the initiative, makes you one of the rabbit people, hoping the fox will eat the others and be satiated before he gets to you. I knew I could not stay where I was, that I had to prepare to meet the enemy, on my terms. I've fought before, and knew I could do it again, and be successful.

I ran out of my room, outside the duplex to the corner of the house where a steel ladder led up to the roof. I wanted on top, where I could see what was going on. The rooftops of the duplexes are like a fort: the roofs are flat, surrounded by a thick 3-1/2 foot parapet on all sides, making for perfect cover. Any enemy coming toward us would have to see us, then shoot up to hit us, which would mean most of his rounds would go over us -- and they are notoriously bad shots with their inaccurate (but reliable) AKs, especially when firing on full automatic, which they usually do. The only way to reach us was via that ladder, which was in a partially enclosed space, with a wrought iron gate, which appeared to be locked with a padlock, but which in fact was not locked. Such would cause confusion to anyone not knowing their way around.

To my surprise, every one of the

guys I was watching the movie with were on that roof – all five of us. I could feel my knees trembling, more from the adrenaline and the now-eagerness to engage the foe. But I, and the others, had to wait, to see what was developing before rushing anywhere or shooting at shadows. We watched in awe, as the thousands of rounds filled the air. We talked excitedly, but quietly amongst ourselves, trying to figure out where the attack was coming from.

A Whirling Diversion

The gunfire was from everywhere that we could see towards the East, towards downtown Baghdad. There was little gunfire from the South, where the perimeter wall was 250 yards away. We began to see a pattern: it was all from the East. Therefore, I warned my cohorts, "Watch out for something sneaking through the South Wall. This going on in front must be a diversion."

We watched, more closely and less excitedly. I told my friends that any real

attack would include car bombs against the wall, to break it open like a castle breach, so that enemy forces could pour through in mass. Or that rocketpropelled grenades - RPGs - would be fired against the guard towers. But nothing like that was happening. We could see the rounds going up in the air towards our sentinel balloon some two thousand feet in the air, with its sensors and cameras aimed downward, but the shots were to no effect. Long lines of tracers crisscrossed back and forth, from all points along the East wall, stretching for a mile back and forth. This was the most coordinated attack I could possibly imagine from the insurgents. There must have been hundreds of them out there - maybe more, but I didn't want to imagine that much yet.

I was impressed at how much ammunition the enemy was expending against us... well, at first it seemed to be against us.

Having seen attacks before, I began taking note of a curious phenomena: it

seemed as if all the rounds were arcing upward. Not toward the guard towers or us, but up. Some came toward us, but again, they seemed as if they were fired from some distance away and not really at us. And our guard towers, which are quick to return fire, did not seem to be returning much of it. There was some return fire, but not what would be expected from soldiers seeing scores or hundreds of attackers moving toward them.

And again, no explosions. I was convinced that this was a diversion; that the real attack must be coming from somewhere we did not expect. But I was worrying more and more about the rounds all going up. There should have been crisscrossing in front of and into the guard towers — but there was none.

We all became uneasy with the way it seemed to be developing: What we fear most is what we don't understand.

A direct attack, I understand. But this was not like a direct attack. We were all somewhat casual – some a false

Three For The Money

Snipers' Head Shots Had To Kill Terrorists Simultaneously To Prevent Explosion

Early on a warm summer morning, a few hours before traffic began to fill the streets, a 16-man SAS patrol took up ambush positions around a Baghdad house, writes Sean Rayment.

The soldiers had been told that the house was being used as a base by insurgents - and up to three suicide bombers were expected to leave it later that morning. Dressed in explosive vests, they were fully equipped to hit a number of locations around the city. The bombers' targets were thought to be cafes and restaurants frequented by members of the Iraqi security forces.

The intelligence was regarded as "high grade" and came from an Iraqi agent who had been nurtured by members of the British Secret Intelligence Service, also known as MI6, for several months.

Expectation among the 16 soldiers, attached to Task Force Black (TFB), the secret American and British special forces unit based in the Iraqi capital, was high. Each member of the four four-man groups was a veteran of many missions where the intelligence promised much - only to deliver little. The plan for Operation Marlborough was simple: allow the three suspected bombers to leave the house and get into the street, then kill them with head shots from the four sniper teams. Each team was equipped with L115A .338 sniper rifles, capable of killing at up to 1,000 yards. The soldiers, liaising earlier with their commanders, had considered the option of entering the house and killing the terrorists - but that plan was regarded as too dangerous. The confines of the house would intensify the impact of any blast, killing everyone inside.

The SAS soldiers were told that it was vital that the three bombers would have to be killed simultaneously.

If one of them was allowed to detonate a device, scores of people could be killed or injured.

In support of the covert sniper teams was a Quick Reaction Force (QRF), which would provide a dozen extra soldiers within a few minutes in an emergency. The QRF was based in a secure location nearby and a team of ammunition technical officers were on hand to defuse the bombs.

A section of Iraqi police was also attached to the operation - although they were not briefed on the detail of the attack - to deal with any crowd trouble.

Meanwhile, 2,000 feet above the city of five million inhabitants, a CIA-controlled Predator unmanned air vehicle was providing a real-time video feed back to the TFB headquarters deep inside the secure green zone.

Shortly after 8am, Arabic translators, monitoring listening devices hidden inside the house, warned the operations centre inside the militarily controlled green zone that the three terrorist were on the move. The message "stand by, stand by" was dispatched to the four teams.

As the terrorists entered the street, a volley of shots rang out and the three insurgents slumped to the ground.

Each terrorist had been killed by a single head shot - the



snipers having spent the past few days rehearsing the ambush in minute detail.

The SAS troopers had been warned that only a direct head shot would guarantee that bombs would not be detonated.

Only three of the four snipers fired, the fourth was to act as a back-up in case one of the weapons jammed or a sniper lost sight of his target.

The message that the terrorists had been killed was sent back to the SAS headquarters and the troops moved forward to check the bodies for life. As they gingerly approached it became brutally apparent that the .338 calibre round - the biggest rifle bullet used by the British Army - had done its job.

Operation Marlborough was hailed as a complete success and one of the rare occasions on which the coalition has been able to deliver a decisive blow against suicide bombers. 🕱

Once familiar with the mechanics of the weapons, a good deal of time was spent on realistic shoot and maneuver exercises.

PKM is the standard LMG of the Russian Army. Operating by a long-stroke gas piston, the PKM uses a rotating bolt resembling that of the AK. It fires full automatic only from an open bolt using a 100 round non-disintegrating link belt that is fed from the right side. With a feed system where the round is pulled to the rear out of the link, the cartridge then comes to rest in what amounts to an inverted magazine, as the bolt is caught in the rear by the sear. Pulling the trigger then allows the bolt to feed the round down and forward into the chamber where it is fired as the bolt closes in battery. Unlike the RPD and RPK, the PKM has a quick-change barrel and a carrying handle, and can be used from a bipod or tripod, and can also be fired from the hip while standing, in an emergency.

The Glock 17

The 9x19mm NATO caliber Glock 17 pistol needs no introduction, but since this is the pistol issued to Iraqi forces, it was issued to and carried by Marines enrolled in the Foreign Weapons class throughout the week. The holsters supplied were of Kydex from Blade-Tech, of Oregon. In addition to the Glock the Marines also trained with the 9x18mm Makarov pistol.

The Rocket Propelled Grenade (RPG) launcher.

For technical information and familiarization, Gunsite provided an RPG with dummy rockets in order to offer proper instruction in how this common weapon is deployed. It is hoped that inert rounds can be legally provided for future classes.

Next month, the Leathernecks train with all the above weapons and Johnston provides a critique from the troops, and an analysis of how likely it is that more troops may be to benefit from this excellent training.





The soldier on the street below yelled back: "Iraq's national soccer team just won the regional championship match against Syria!"

They take World Cup soccer seriously here.

I guess this would have been the Great Soccer War - if only it had been fought against someone. The adrenaline wore off and I had the best night's sleep since I've been here... how deflated I was to get all dressed up for war, but nobody came. 🕱



s some of you know, my Company had its clock cleaned by the Islamist Vermin Scum in September and October. The Battalion also took quite a few hits in October as well. The numbers from this were not pretty.

Thanksgiving morn came too early for us, especially since my section has not been doing much in terms of patrols until later in the day. We had breakfast and headed to five plus hours of briefings designed to prepare us for re-deployment. Allegedly, there IS light at the end of the tunnel.

Rather than being able to crash on the couch and watch football, we headed out to a rehearsal for the evening's events.

First, we figured out the order in which we were going to load the helicopters we were using for the night's mission. Then we practiced and practiced it some more.

ments – teams or squads – would hit their blocking positions to seal off the objective before the assault element would enter and clear the house.

After several more run throughs, the boss called it good and we headed off to nap, finalize our equipment or get more to eat.

The time for us to move to the helipad came soon enough. Once there, we sorted ourselves back into some semblance of order. Infantrymen, Air Force Joint Tactical Air Controllers, Navy bomb dogs and the handlers and Iraqi translators.

Air Force fast movers checked in as being several miles up above the target, Apache gunships were moving into the area and our Chinooks (yes, they have another name but I'll leave it out of this) were one minute out from the pick-up zone we were on.

The Chinooks landed and we loaded up (checking to insure that they were in fact leaking) and off we went. It is always interesting to fly over Baghdad and its surrounding environs at night – something we often do now. the US. I guess folks at home think we do not see cars on the road and yet it looked like the end of any other commute period on the roads.

Pretty soon, the "ONE MIN-UTE" call was made, passed from Soldier to Soldier to Air Controller by yelling in the ear of guy next to you.

The birds slowed, their noses rose a bit as the tail gunner left his seat. Once the wheels touched down, the mad stampede out the back started. As I stepped off the tail gate and started towards my initial blocking position, I chambered a round – we can't fly locked and loaded. I linked up with my partner in "crime",

Frank Dillard (another deputy sheriff from Tulare Co. SD) and followed the Boss – who we are supposed to keep alive and intact. The JTACs called, saying that the fast movers – Air



Force jets – had seen someone run out of the target residence westbound. The JTACs and part of my old platoon took off westbound.


The chase did not last long. Our target had been shot in the leg a few months before. The JTACS were chasing a guy with a limp ... Hmmm. The Navy K9 handlers threatened to unleash the dog. The chase ended .


Our guys caught the target, trying to hide in an irrigation ditch. He'd left his revolver in the house when he fled. It was found during the search.

Bottom line, after much work on the part of a lot of people, one very serious Bad Guy was wearing a blindfold and new bracelets, headed for an experience that was no where near as unpleasant as it should be. Like many of those who encourage others to die while trying to kill us, he ran

away instead of fighting. When our bird closed the backdoor, the IVS had tried running out the side to get away. This is


The Oppressed Karen Struggle and Survive on Faith

y first knowledge of the Karen (the largest of the seven ethnic groups native to Burma) came in the mid-to-late 1980's, when I was a young cop fascinated with special weapons and tactics as well as the whole of the arena of special warfare. Finding their way into my hands were several copies of the Soldier of Fortune magazine, which soon became my magazine of choice, feeding my passion for special weaponry, tactics, and the men who lived the warrior's style of life. In the magazine, articles about the Karen Freedom Fighters and their plight at the hands of the Burmese Junta aroused curiosity and an interest in the cause of an oppressed people, that weeks before I didn't even know existed.

Little did I know that nearly 20 years later I would be crossing the Moei River into the jungles of Burma, meeting General Htin Maung and his soldiers, the 7th brigade of the Karen National Liberation Army face to face.

In the early 1990's after 10 years of working the streets as a patrol officer, also heading up our department's special operations team, I began to bridge together my expertise in law-enforcement with another realm of warfare: the war over men's souls. As strange as it may sound, the principles between the two were similar and this cop embarked upon a journey that would ultimately lead me to the remote jungles of Burma and face to face with some of the toughest guerrilla warfare insurgents - and staunchest men of faith - in the world.

In 2000-2001, after pioneering two churches in our community approximately 30 minutes northeast of Tulsa, Okla-

homa I became acquainted with Dr. Timothy Laklem, the founder and director of Asian Tribal Ministries based out of Chiang Mai, Thailand. Dr. Laklem, a native Karen, made several trips to our home over the next five years speaking in our churches about the Karen people

and the atrocities befalling them. A relationship was formed and subsequently we began to financially and prayerfully support these oppressed but determined people of eastern Burma.

In the spring of 2005 I received a telephone call from Dr. Laklem, who was inside Burma in the jungle, inviting me to join him in Burma to reach out to the soldiers of the KNLA to encourage them and to preach the Gospel to them. I was certainly happy about the invitation but was unable to take leave from the department at the time and I told Dr. Laklem that I would have to take a "rain-check" and reschedule for later

in the year. Dr. Laklem told me that November of 2005 would be a good time of year to visit Southeast Asia, being past the rainy season and into the beginning of winter.

Pilgrimage to the Jungle

At his advice we began to plan. I hand picked a team from our church that could adapt to war-zone conditions and we began to plan out the details and raise the funds to get us across the ocean and back home again. On Halloween afternoon five men and one tough lady boarded the aircraft en-route to Chiang Mai, Thailand. After 36 hours we arrived in Thailand, meeting up with Dr. Laklem and his team. We were whisked away from the airport and into the psychotic traffic of Chiang Mai – a street cop's nightmare.

After arriving at the ATM (Asian Tribal Ministries) base we took a day or so to re-cooperate from the journey and soon the real journey began. A

five-hour road-trip from the base landed us in Mae Sot where we would be launching our missions for the next several days. After arriving in Mae Sot and checking into our hotel,

we unloaded our gear and headed out to meet with a Major of the KNLA, at his home. After a short journey we turned off the main highway onto a dirt road leading us through a thatch-hut Karen village. We came to an iron gate that opened up as we arrived and our drivers pulled through the gate and into a covered parking area. We were escorted to the house where we met with the KNLA Major and his family.

We were seated and served beverages by the Major's servants. Soon a KNLA Colonel arrived and we all shook hands and appropriate greetings were exchanged. As we sat around the teakwood table, we listened to these officers tell of the atrocities that have been committed against their people since the end of WWII, when the British withdrew their troops from Burma. This left the Karen

people to deal with the cruel Burmese dictators who had a bad taste in their mouths towards the Karen because of their alliance with the Brits, as well as the beating they took during the war.

SitRep of Beleaguered Innocents:

Story after story of these atrocities and the Karen's determination to be free from oppression and tyranny left me a little moist around the eyes. These KNLA leaders are stalwart Christians and lead their men in prayer before they lead them into battle. I sat almost spell-bound as these serious-minded


warriors gave details of battles and victories that seemed too amazing and miraculous to believe – yet they were unquestionably true. One story told by the Colonel was incredible: The KNLA 7th brigade had been fighting the Junta for three days and nights inside the jungles of Burma. The fighting had been fierce and the KNLA were running out of ammunition. The mortars had all been deployed, but all that was left was small-arms and the supply lines had been cut off.

Escape On the Wings of Eagles


The Karen had high ground, but they were surrounded by 4,000 SPDC troops. The Colonel and the Major rallied the men and called them to prayer – asking for God's help. The situation had so deteriorated that the whole brigade was in

danger of being destroyed. This battle was in the middle of the dry season and the chance of rain is slim to none. Yet, as the men prayed a cloud formed in the sky. The men seeing this prayed harder and harder and the cloud continued to grow. Soon, the sounds of thunder echoed through the mountainous terrain and soon to follow were monsoon-type rains. These 200 men of the 7th brigade formed two columns and marched down the mountain and right through 4,000 SPDC troops, who looked confused appeared unable to respond to the Karen guerilla's movement. The rain was coming in sheets and the visibility was poor, but the Karen exfiltrated within only a few feet of the well-armed Burmese army.

The Karen escaped into the jungle, leaving a confused and bewildered adversary behind, as the rain covered their

tracks and escape route. During this fierce three-day battle not one Karen was injured in any way and more than 400 SPDC troops were carried out for


These men are not only soldiers in

the Karen Army - they are also soldiers in the Army of God. After listening to many stories of victory mingled together with hardship and oppression, I presented the Colonel and the Major a gift from the USA: each were given a Bushnell Holographic Sight for their personal weapons. Needless to say, they were exuberant and thankful. Neither had seen this kind of technology. After being fed a wonderful meal by the Major's wife we departed for Mae Sot to rest up for the next day's mission.

The FOB

The next morning we departed for the border with our team. We were met by the Colonel and the Major outside Mae Sot and traveled past a large Karen refugee camp and through a series of Thai checkpoints into the remote jungle area along the Moei River. After driving down a dirt path we came to the Moei. We were soon loading into a long-boat powered by a V-8 engine. The boat driver quickly transported us across the Moei like he knew what he was doing.

As we offloaded the boat we climbed a series of steps leading into the lush vegetation and out of the river bottom. We were soon met by men wielding

Weapons are used till the literally fall apart. Note twine that secures the fore stock to the barrel of

AK-47's, M79 grenade launchers, and what appeared to be Vietnam vintage M16's. These were the soldiers of the 7th brigade. We soon were taken to the headquarter building which was made of teak wood with a leaf roof. There we met with the legendary General Htin Maung the commander of the 7th Brigade. We were seated around a table and we were served a cold Coke as Dr. Laklem introduced us to the General. We sat and listened to many stories of battles between the Karen people and the Burmese junta.

This old general was well seasoned, having served in the KNLA for 60 years. He is now 77. He is a well-groomed gentleman with a noticeably authoritative presence. He spoke to us in his native Karen tongue, interpreted by Dr. Laklem. We sat almost spellbound as this old warrior spoke of the heroic bravery of the Karen in battle. As he spoke I watched the soldiers beyond the headquarters. Many of these men were missing limbs and eyes. Young boys appearing to be no more than 12-14 years old were carrying AK-47's and M16's. Also, there were men wielding WW-II vintage MI carbines alongside more modern M79's.

Warriors only by Necessity

These warriors kept their weapons amazingly clean, many having their barrels covered to protect from moisture and dirt. They all seemed so at home in the jungle as they moved quietly


around the compound. It is such a peaceful place, being it is a war-zone with the enemy troops less than 1-2 klicks away. As we sat in the headquarters listening to General Htin Maung, it began to rain. The sounds of the jungle mingled with the light rain as the General spoke and I thought: "amazing how close paradise is to hell!" The clean smells, the peace of the jungle, mingled with the generosity of these warriors seemed to be paradise to me but the reality of the hell of war is only 1-2 kilometers across the valley.


Time and again as I spoke with these soldiers, it was emphatically impressed upon me that they do not want to fight – but to live in peace. The Burmese have for years attacked and exploited the innocence of these peaceable people and


the only reason they fight is to protect themselves and their simple way of life. We were shown photographs of rows of murdered Karen IDP (Internally Displaced People) children, tortured and killed by the SPDC. Village after village have been burned to the ground by the Burmese, sending the terrorized villagers deeper into the jungles to escape the brutality of these communists! After seeing these horrific photographs and hearing the stories of exploited innocence, I began to understand why these young warriors were willing to lay down their lives fighting against a wicked army that is superior numerically and militarily. What is it that keeps this army fighting and victorious from being annihilated by

one time that Low Tech could not beat High Tech.

The residence and the immediate area were searched before we called for the birds to leave, or Exfil.

When the birds landed, the Boss raced on first in order to confirm one last task with the pilots. After we lifted off and cleared the immediate area, the boss grabbed up four Soldiers who were re-enlisting and they headed to back of the bird. Standing in the back of the bird, with the U.S. flag held between out stretched arms, the Boss administered the re-enlistment oath to four non-commissioned officers.

In the other bird, the Islamist Vermin Scum was probably not enjoying his helicopter ride as much as we were.

Yelling futilely, in an attempt to be heard over the noise of the bird, those gathered completed their part of the reenlistment. Our fire support NCO was taking pictures of the whole thing with his night vision goggles on the front of his camera.

The flag used in the ceremony is already boxed up. It was carried in an assault pack during the Infil flight, during the raid and then used for the ceremony during the Exfil. It has a place, albeit small, in the history of this infantry company.

Some may say that it was not the brightest thing these Soldiers did – reenlisting in the middle of this war. But they know the cost and realities better than anyone else. Not one of them had less than ten years of service already. Morale may not always be the highest but that is more a reflection of idiotic rules rocketed down from above, from the echelons above reality and the crap spewed by the media at home.

Were we thankful? Yes. Thankful that all of us came back in from the raid. Thankful that the IVS who is responsible for the deaths of U.S. soldiers was caught. Thankful that no matter how ugly things have gotten, nearly everyone here has always jocked up and gone back out. Thankful that our families and friends were able to spend the day not worrying about a terrorist attack in their neighborhoods. Thankful that we are slowly growing a generation of Warriors not affected by the legacy of the 90s that will be able to carry this fight to the Jihadists without worrying about being loved by the media. Thankful that our families and friends are waiting for us to come back. 🕱


an army far superior in weaponry and number? The answer is found in the heart and the resolve of these men and women, and I believe also with their favor with God.

As Honored Guests

As the day passed General Htin Maung assembled his men and asked if I would share the Gospel with them. The men stood barefoot at attention with weapons slung across their backs and attentively listened to every word I spoke – translated by the Colonel.

These men are living in such rogue conditions but their hearts are peaceable and beautiful. They were very appreciative of our being there – as Westerners are uncommon in their jungle. These men and their leaders begged that I come back and train them in small unit tactics and weapons in the future and yes – preach to them again.

We were fed a wonderful meal of noodles with vegetables and spices by General Htin Maung's wife there inside the jungle. We were treated with such respect and compassion. We visited




the clinic inside the compound as well as the school. We spent time with the machine-gunner's post as they looked over maps and discussed strategies. These men were genuinely appreciative for our being there and asked for us to return to train them. Not once during our visits with the 7th brigade and the 201 battalion did we meet one arrogant soldier. Each soldier was courteous and clad with humility and thankfulness even though they are revered around the world, in the circle of warfare professionals, as the best guerrilla fighters anywhere.


Pray for Peace, Keep Your Powder Dry



Dr. Laklem reports that the Burmese are sincerely responding to the cry for peace along the Thai/Burmese border with the Karen and talks are currently underway in Bangkok and in Rangoon.

Dr. Laklem's philosophy is simple: the peace of a nation must be carved by men who hold high moral standards and who are selfless without any personal agendas or perverted motives. Dr. Laklem holds that there must be mutual respect between the two entities before true peace can be attained. In recent meetings the Burmese generals have asked Dr. Laklem to open the meetings with prayer. These changes in negotiation tactics are bearing the fruit of promise for peace and stability for a people that the world has forgotten but nonetheless deserve independence and liberty. The cries of oppression from the Karen have reached Heaven and recognition and deliverance are soon to follow.

I traveled to the other side of the world hoping to help in some way and to bring hope to the people in any measure that I could. But I think I was changed by the Karen and their simplicity, hope, and faith, far more than I ever changed them. Their cause is noble and their worth immeasurable. How the Karen's plight has escaped the mainstream news remains a mystery - but these hidden people who have suffered immeasurable wrong are being vindicated by a Higher Authority. The men of the 7th brigade and the 201 battalion are noble warriors with a noble cause and they hold my absolute respect. The Karen people showed us such respect and honor and they truly are beautiful people in every dimension of the word. As we left their villages, I began to feel that I was leaving home. Now that I'm back in the USA and back to work in Detective Division and working at the churches, my thoughts are never very far away from the brave men of the KNLA and the beautiful people of the Karen. 🕱

didn't touch his driver, Corporal Robert T. Harriott, as they drove down a street in their Humvee.

Before 1/5 crossed into Iraq, Harriott, who drove TOW-1 in Counter Mech, the platoon this reporter was assigned to, yelled, "We'll cover your back. We won't let anything happen to you." And he did just that all the way to Baghdad, eating the dust my Humvee churned up ahead of him.

Open Season on Officers

Officers have always been a favorite target of enemy snipers. In the 18th Century, American rifleman Timothy Murphy killed British General Simon

Fraser at 500 yards with his "Kentucky Rifle" at the Battle of Saratoga, one of the turning points of the War of Independence.

During the War Between the States, Union and Confederate sharpshooters were killing every officer they could see. Union Captain John T. Metcalf used a .50 caliber muzzle-loading rifle with a 24x scope to drop a Confederate officer at 1,666 meters. The bullet took a full five seconds to reach the target. On the Confederate side, a sergeant in the 4th Georgia Infantry used a British Whitworth target rifle equipped with a telescopic sight to kill Union General John Sedgwick at 800 yards. Urged by

aides to take cover, Sedgwick uttered those infamous words, "They couldn't hit an elephant at this dist..." Sedgwick never finished his sentence.

Each of the three sniper teams in 1/5 was attached to an individual rifle company. Sgt. Anderson's team was attached to Bravo Company. Anderson was with Captain Jamie G. Edge, the commanding officer of B Company, the day he was killed by a sniper in Ramadi.

"I was standing right next to my Bravo Company CO when he got shot in the head," said Anderson.

"We were on a leader's recon when we found a building locked from the inside. And this guy told me there was an American radio inside that building," said Anderson, who wondered at the time how the Iraqi would know that. So we went back and told Capt. Edge, who got the whole company together and surrounded the building."

Anderson climbed on top of the roof of the building and along with other members of his sniper team, cleared the building from top to bottom. While Edge was topside trying to establish communications with battalion, he got "He was out before he hit the roof," said Anderson who heard the sonic crack of the sniper round. "As I take cover behind a cinderblock wall that rings the rooftop, another round hits right where my face would have been had I not moved a few inches to the left. If I hadn't moved, it would have hit me right in the head," Anderson who gives the Captain's killer credit for a good shot.


A few days later, Sgt. Anderson returned to the rooftop and found a bullet hole in the cinderblock wall where he took cover. Through the hole, Anderson could see the window in a nearby building where the sniper was hiding, but they never found him. Anderson lased the distance with a range finder: 557 yards,

"which is weird since the Dragunov scope is only 2.5 power and it's really only good to about 300 yards, so I don't know if [he] got lucky or what," said Anderson, "or if he had a better rifle." But Anderson was told the slug recovered from Capt. Edge was 7.62 x 51mm, the round used in a Dragunov sniper rifle.

"But I don't know if I believe that or not," confessed Anderson. But one thing is certain. Capt. Edge was not killed with a .50 caliber sniper rifle.

Before 1/5's Scout Sniper Platoon left Camp Pendleton, the commander, Staff Sergeant Brian Dow was told to be on the lookout for single-shot Steyr-Mannlicher .50 caliber sniper rifles. Iran purchased more than 800 of them in January 2005 for "use on its borders," but in February, Iran and Syria signed a mutual aid agreement, and since many of the snipers killed in Fallujah were carrying Syrian passports, intelligence suspected Iran might arm Syrian snipers with big-bore rifles. Anderson put that rumor to rest. "It didn't happen," said the young Sergeant.

In addition to killing Bravo Company's

commanding officer, enemy snipers in Ramadi also took shots at the team leader of Seminole Bravo. Sergeant Gerald Hooee took a sniper round through the pack on his back, but wasn't hit. "It was the same day that Hooee tried to detonate an IED with a .50 cal [sniper rifle]," said Anderson, "but we wound up calling EOD [Explosive Ordnance Disposal] and had them blow the IED in place.

That was the only time Seminole Bravo broke out its SASR [Special Application Sniper Rifle] during the deployment to Ramadi. Most of the shots 1/5 snipers took were well within the range [1,000 yards or less] of their M40A3s. There was no need to reach out more than a mile and touch someone with the .50 cal.

USMC Sniper Team Wiped Out

Before 1/5's Scout Sniper Platoon left Camp Pendleton for Ramadi, it reorganized into four, six-man teams. When it got to Iraq, it reorganized again. This time SSP formed three eight-man teams. "We needed more firepower and protection when we set up observation posts in private homes and buildings," said Sergeant Nolan J. Kowolski. The last thing SSP wanted was to have one of its sniper teams overrun, captured or killed.

"We went into Ramadi loaded for bear," said Sgt. Anderson. "We carried more firepower than a Marine platoon. In addition to automatic weapons and all the ammo we could carry, we also took along Claymore mines. After setting up in a house, we'd mine every approach to that house," added Anderson. While shooters were scoping the neighborhood, other members of the sniper team were scanning alleyways leading to their hide site. Sniper teams like Anderson's were attacked by insurgents

who never got through the wall of steel. Vigilance paid off.

A six-man sniper team from 3rd Battalion, 25th Regiment, 4th Marine Division, a unit famous for its heroism on Iwo Jima during World War Two, was wiped out in early August. Two days after the ambush in Haditha, a hotbed of insurgent activity in the Euphrates River valley, the website of the Ansar al-Sunnah Army posted photos from the slaughter. One picture showed a bloody body wearing Marine camouflage fatigues. Another photo showed two hooded gunmen standing in front of several rifles, apparently taken from dead Marines. In a statement that accompanied the photos, Ansar al-Sunnah said the insurgents lured the Marines into an ambush.

"The intention was to capture them alive, but they opened fire on the mujahidein," said the statement.

The United States Marine Corps has not said much publicly about the incident. There was no mention of the incident in "News From The Front" on the official Marine Corps website, but the sniper community knows what happened in Haditha.

Sgt. Anderson believes the reservists from Ohio may not have been as vigilant as they should have been.

"I don't know what they were doing," said Anderson, "but a UAV [Unmanned Aerial Vehicle] caught them standing on a hill in Haditha. The two three-man teams had linked up at midday and were just chilling out when two or three insurgents began walking toward them from about 300 yards. Without warning, the insurgents opened fire, killing most of the Marines in the first volley," said Anderson.

"The insurgents got really, really close before they opened fire," Anderson added, "I don't know if the team

members were sleeping or suntanning themselves, but the enemy wound up with all of their gear. They got two 40s [M40A3 sniper rifles], two SAWs [Squad Automatic Weapons] and two M16A4s with combat optics. In addition, the enemy got the team's radios and ammunition," said Anderson.

But the insurgents didn't get their hands on a SASR. The reserve sniper team wasn't issued one of the .50 Barrett rifles. Only two sniper teams in 1/5 were issued SASRs — Seminole Bravo and Sierra Charlie.

By its very name, a Special Application Sniper Rifle is only used under certain conditions. It is not a Marine's primary weapon on a battlefield, but Corporal Matt Michael in Sierra Charlie carried his SASR everywhere he went in Ramadi. It was like his American Express card. The young Marine who was attached to Charlie Company during two previous combat tours in Iraq wouldn't leave Camp Snake Pit without the "big gun." The semi-automatic Barrett was apparently his security blanket.

Veterans Grieve the Loss of a Gunfighter

More than 1,100 Marines crossed the "Line of Departure" in Kuwait in the spring of 2003 when the "Fighting Fifth" invaded Iraq. Lance Corporal Jeff B. Starr was with Bravo Company. Starr was with this reporter at the Saddam Hussein Canal and later in Baghdad. He was back in Iraq with Bravo Co. when 1/5 entered Fallujah in the spring of 2004, and survived a merciless attack on his AAV [Amphibious Assault Vehicle] when it was hit by at least 9 rocket-propelled grenades and set ablaze, killing its gunner and almost blowing the leg off his platoon commander. Starr and other Marines the "Dirty Deuces," 2nd Squad, 2nd Platoon, bailed out of the burning amtrac deep in enemy territory, and fought for several hours until a Quick Reaction Force rescued them.

Corporal Starr returned to Ramadi as a team leader with 1st Squad, Weapons Platoon, Company B. He was killed by a sniper on Memorial Day while conducting operations against enemy forces. According to his battalion commander, Starr had celebrated his 22nd birthday five days earlier. He was scheduled to return to Camp Pendleton a month later and transition to civilian life.

"Ironically, he and this battalion share the same birthday," said LtCol Smith at Starr's memorial service. First Battalion, 5th Regiment was formed on May 25, 1917. Starr was born on the same date in 1983.

His best friend was Corporal Donald W. Ball, a team leader with 3rd Squad, Weapons Platoon, Bravo Co. The two infantrymen became acquainted in 2002 when they were new to the Corps. They fought alongside each other and forged a friendship that even death cannot destroy.

Ball wears a bracelet on his right wrist to honor his fallen comrade-in-arms. It's a thin, braded cloth band.


"All the Marines that have been here three times have a warfighter bracelet like this," said Ball as he held up his fist in front of his face to show off his badge of honor.

An Officer and a Gentleman

Sgt. Clayton T. Anderson has made his last deployment to Iraq with 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. Anderson has been accepted into MECEP, the Marine Enlistment Commissioning Education Program, and this coming fall the 24 year old Leatherneck from Cypress, Texas will enter Texas A&M University to complete his undergraduate degree.

Upon graduation, Anderson will be commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Marine Corps. He is preparing to tread the same path that many officers in 1st Battalion, 5th Marines have trod as prior enlisted, including Major Pete Farnum, the commanding officer of Weapons Company, the unit this reporter was embedded with during the invasion of Iraq.

The way the war in going, Anderson will probably wind up there again, after graduation in a couple of years. **X



E-Day in Iraq

RAMADI, IRAQ – The defeatists back home didn't think it could be done. But today, the Iraqi people, only recently liberated from a repressive dictatorship, held their third elec-

tion in the space of a year. After first choosing a transitional government in January, they returned to the polls in October to approve a constitution. In both cases, they turned out in great numbers under the threat of violence. Today, millions of those same Iraqi citizens trekked to one of thousands of polling places around the country to vote for candidates who will form a 275-member National Assembly that will take office on Dec. 31.

On election day, I was with the Marines of 3/7 atop an outpost in the heart of one of the most vicious neighborhoods in this very violent city of Ramadi. It was once a stronghold of the Sunni terrorist movement, but thanks to these Marines, it no longer is.

The election began at 7:00 a.m. with a bang, and the Marines were ready. They responded to the improvised explosive device (IED) and afterwards, for a time, the streets were nearly empty.

But imams, sheiks and local leaders urged people to get out and vote, and because they did, the turnout was dramatic. One local imam told his followers, "God will bless you with a great life if you go out and vote." That and similar messages were broadcast from mosques all around town.

At the end of this historic day, there was not a sound of gunfire, but instead, as the polls closed, there was a call to prayer. It was even an occasion for celebration as the neighborhood children were out in the streets, after dark, playing soccer with equipment that was given to them by Americans in uniform.

Capt. Brian Grant told me the turnout was "an overwhelming success." Indeed it was — there were lines that wrapped around the block and extended for hundreds of people. 10 polling places ran out of ballots and had to send out for more. The safe environment provided by the Marines, with the help of Iraqi security forces and local religious leaders, gave citizens the added confidence to go to the polls without worrying about their personal safety.

It is nothing short of remarkable. Because here in Ramadi, which is the capital of Iraq's largest province and the heart of the Sunni Triangle, there has been tremendous opposition from the jihadists who did everything they could to prevent this election from taking place. In fact, in this area during the last election, less than five percent of the people turned out to vote.

The violence is caused mostly by the IED – a terrible thing which remains the terrorists' weapon of choice. The Marines were confronted with several earlier in the week, but the

good news is that the security situation in Ramadi is a great deal better today than it was just a few months ago when I was last here.

It is better, in part, because there are now a lot more Iraqis providing security in this area, which was not the case during my last visit to this region. In fact, only a few months ago, there were no Iraqi areas of responsibility in this city. Today, there are Iraqi Army troops operating right next to soldiers and Marines. Now, they have their own areas of operation with some logistic support from the Americans.

As Lt. Chad Cliver told me, the Marines of 3/7 "work very closely with Iraqi Army troops as well as Iraqi police." Over the past several months, they have spent time training the Iraqis who are making a lot of progress – so much so that Cliver says, "before we leave here we will have turned over most of Ramadi to the Iraqis themselves."

But it is that kind of steady, persistent progress that American troops are making over here that accounted for the successful election today. Throughout the week leading

up to E-Day, numerous Marines with whom I spoke expressed confidence that the day would be a success.

I asked Lt. Col. Roger Turner, the commanding officer of 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines when I first arrived here, if he thought the terrorists could be held in check and that the elections would actually take place. Turner was confident, saying, "I think it will take place [because] the people of Ramadi very genuinely want to participate in elections." He explained that though the terrorists are desperate to disrupt the day, their violent tactics are backfiring on them and they are being "overtaken by events and the momentum that the democratic process starts to gain here."

When election day was over, I asked Lance Corporal Jeffrey Heath if the day was a success for the Marines. His reply: "Absolutely. This is why we're here — to help the Iraqi people gain the kind of freedoms that we take for granted back in the States."

A profound and inspiring explanation from a brave and dedicated Marine. If only the kind of optimism that is so abundant here in Iraq were more prevalent in Washington.


