The Rhodesian Light Infantry (nicknamed "The Saints") was one of the most effective counterinsurgency units of all time. Using the devastingly efficient "fireforce" concept (airborne envelopment and annihilation of a guerrilla enemy), the RLI engaged in the fierce Zimbabwean bush war for more than 15 years against the overwhelming tide of communist-trained guerrillas.

Dubbed "The Killing Machine" by Charles D. Melson, chief historian of U.S. Marine Corps, the RLI was a veritable foreign legion, with more 20 nationalities serving in its ranks. Kill rates don't win wars, but during its 19-year existence, the RLI accounted for between 12,000 and 15,000 enemies killed, while losing only 135 of its men. The personal bravery of the troops can be seen in the medals awarded to the unit's troops: 4 Silver Crosses and 42 Bronze Crosses. And an RLI trooper holds the world record for operational parachute descents—a staggering 73 op jumps, most under 500 feet.

This glossy, coffee-table history contains hundreds of unique and previously unpublished color photos, maps, rolls, honors, awards, and personal memorabilia from former RLI members, as well as a tribute by Ian Smith and a foreword by the RLI's last commanding officer, Lt. CRIMINAL INVADERS FROM DOWN SOUTH A Former Border Patrol Agent Vents

Today, the morning news reported the arrest of a suspect in the killing of three teenagers in New Jersey. An illegal alien from Peru, Jose Carranza's, was pressured into turning himself in by an exhaustive manhunt. But there was more. It was reported that he had an extensive criminal record, and had been released from custody awaiting trial in the matter of having repeatedly raped a young girl for four years.

From 1977 until 2001, I was employed by the United States Border Patrol. For more than 24 years, I was assigned to the busiest, most active and most violent section of the border. When I reported for duty, there were 1,200 Border Patrol Agents in the entire country and an estimated 1.2 million illegal aliens. By the time I retired, we had something like 9,000 Border Patrol Agents and 12-15 million illegal aliens in the United States. Put plainly, my career was a failure.

Early in my career, the Border Patrol was given free reign to arrest illegal aliens wherever we found them. We routinely checked transportation terminals, and checked businesses and job sites. Back then we were part of the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS). We worked with state and local police, and other federal law enforcement agencies.

During the Clinton Administration, a decision was made to put the Border Patrol on the border. The plan was somewhat successful, as Operation Gatekeeper almost shut down the San Diego corridor while creating a huge problem in Arizona. Phoenix became the stolen car, residential burglary, methamphetamine and smuggling capital of the United States.

Part of their strategy was to be the hiring of thousands of criminal investigators to replace the departed Border Patrol presence, to conduct employer sanctions, and to ferret out illegal aliens in the interior. The investigators were not hired and the interior of the United States was left without immigration enforcement. After 9/11, and the creation of the Department of Homeland Security, the Border Patrol was combined with U.S. Customs to create Customs and Border Protection and Customs and INS Investigators were combined to create Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). Despite all of the promises to hire agents, control the border and so on, not one single administration in my memory has done squat to do anything meaningful with regards to the illegal alien issue. Note the ten-fold increase (at least) in illegal aliens in the country during my career.

Today, once an alien gets past the Border Patrol, they are all but assured of being home free. In many areas, here are three or four ICE agents responsible for covering several states. This means is that there is no effective internal enforcement of immigration laws. Ask your local cops what kind of response they get from ICE when they call to report that they have arrested an illegal alien. With few exceptions, they are told to release them because ICE lacks the manpower and funding to respond.

Which brings us back to Mr. Carranza. I will bet good money this is what happened; when he was initially arrested the local police were unable to identify him as an illegal alien, or hold him as one, because ICE was too busy or indifferent to respond. So they let the accused child rapist back out onto the street.

What should have happened was that Carranza's status would have been ascertained by an ICE agent doing a jail check. Said ICE agent would have placed an immigration hold on Mr. Carranza and he would not have been able to be released. He would not have had the opportunity to commit his string of crimes, culminating in the shooting of four young people in New Jersey.

The system is broken and people like Carranza are being released from jails all over the country on a daily basis. Why? Because there aren't enough ICE investigators, the government doesn't want to pay the local jails for housing aliens on holds and the investigators themselves are overworked and tired of doing many, many hours of paperwork just to try to get one more alien deported.

For the past 30 years I have witnessed this sort of travesty, over and over. The government seems to have assumed that we, the citizens of the United States, are supposed to accept the cost of this negligence. Our families are slaughtered on the highways by smuggling load drivers,

REMEMBER KEEBLE MOH WINNER?



It took all of three weeks for this system to get into the field, a success story for the Army's Rapid Equipping Force.

When IEDs go off, they don't just kill or wound our troops. They also do a lot of damage to vehicles – and as any

paramedic or policeman can tell you, a damaged vehicle can often trap a wounded person. Paramedics and cops, though, don't have to rescue a victim while under fire from insurgents/ terrorists. So, the Army has developed tools to rescue trapped troops quickly, but they also practice how to use them.

Well-behaved troops...

Some media reports create the impression that American troops in Iraq are rampaging thugs. But does it hold



up? Ralph Peters, in a New York Post column, did some number crunching – and the results are shocking.

In the 19 months since January 1, 2006, a total of 59 court-martials for various misdeeds have been convened. That comes out to a little over 3 per month. Compare that to the city of Santa Cruz, California, population 55,000. There, a total of 3,665 crimes that would require court-martials were committed in 2005, or about 300 per month. Ann Arbor, Michigan doesn't fare any better, having 3,758 similar crimes in 2005.


In other words, American troops are over 120 times better behaved than two of the more progressive cities in the United States.

About as true as that Koran-flushing claim...

An Army investigation revealed that sensational charges in a series of articles for the New Republic had no basis in fact. Major Steven F. Lamb, the deputy Public Affairs Officer for Multi National Division-Baghdad stated, "An investigation has been completed and

SOF AND HER HER WAR

A U.S. MERC TRAINS SALVADORAN SPEC OPS AND AIRBORNE

"When you've been on the battlefields in four countries that fell to communism, it stimulates and sharpens your focus. I'm really just a patriotic American concerned about a possible communist takeover of Central America. I've seen it happen before and I'd just as soon not see it happen here. Vietnam was halfway around the world, but El Salvador and its communist guerrillas are a lot closer to Houston than Houston is to DC. And if Communism expansionism is not stopped here, there's very little to keep it from expanding to our own borders, in our backyard. It's a much more real and immediate threat to the United States than it was in southeast Asia."

Harry Claflin, two-tour Marine Recon in Vietnam, told SOF in 1985.

In the second part of this series, Harry Claflin, who SOF sent to El Salvador in 1984 when the fierce civil war was raging, described his role in initiating a Special Forces Operations training program, the Grupo de Operaciones Especiales (GOE).

"I came up with the GOE project by combining two very successful projects that the Marine Corps ran in Vietnam, the Force Recon Stingray Project and the Small Independent Action Forces (SIEF)," Harry said.

Harry had learned Spanish in short order, as Gen. Bustillo forced everyone on the base to speak Spanish to the tall, tough looking, bearded Gringo.

Each GOE team was organized into a 28-man team of five groups--a command group, and four action teams. The command group would consist of one lieutenant, one sergeant, one radio operator and one medic. Each of the four action teams consisted of a team leader, assistant team leader, a radio operator, a machine gunner, a grenadier, and one sniper.

Harry spent four grueling weeks, 20 hours a day training GOE Team One.

The Salvadoran top brass demanded a graduation demonstration.

The team prepared a demo field, selected targets, inserted in helicopters,

established observation posts to gather Intel and executed ambushes that took out the 'enemy'.

Dr. Martin Brass

In spite of a series of career threatening, show-stopping equipment failures, the song and dance had convinced the 200 Salvadoran Jefes, and the GOE program was launched.

MEMORIES OF A MERC

IT WAS TIME for the elated, dogtired team to leave the relatively safe training fields for the guerilla filled jungles.

"Rene Cardenas, a retired SF Sergeant Major SOF had hired to be my interpreter and I were ordered back to Illopongo." Harry recalled his angst at being forced to throw his recruits out in the jungles without their leader.

"We were gearing up to go, but Col. Sigifredo Ochoa, Commander of the 4th Infantry Brigade, said 'No'! "We weren't supposed to be there. Had we been killed, there would have been a hell storm and heads would roll,"

the risk taking Harry smirked.

Harry has very fond memories of his boys of GOE Team One—those sorts of memories a merc thrown in the role of commander would relish.

GOE TEAM ONE MAKES ITS BONES

"GOE Team One was working in the mountains near Sensuntepeque when they heard a fire fight up ahead," Harry recalled with pride his first GOE team.

"When they approached, they found that the G's had pinned down a company sized infantry unit and had wounded and killed several.

"The team commander, a Lt. Eduardo, quickly hatched up a plot to bring some heat on the G's.

"Panama, one of the boys, carried an FAL rifle.

"Fire 'em up!' Eduardo ordered him.

"The G's were right on top of them. "Panama cut loose. The G's thought it was one of theirs since the rifle did not sound like an M-16.

"The G's were hollering for him to stop firing, giving the rest of the GOE team time to get into position. "The whole team opened fire on the G's, who thought they were being attacked by a much larger force and broke off contact with the infantry. They fled down into this deep ravine as Eduardo and the boys were coming down the opposite side.

"When the GOE team stopped to catch their breath near the bottom, they saw a G not 20 yards away just staring at them. Now, remember, they were dressed like G's, too, and he could not make up his mind whether they were friend or foe.

"Panama shot him and the war was on again. For the next hour it was a running gunfight. They killed 20 more of the Gs. The surviving bad guys fled.

"The choppers were called in to extract the dead and wounded and to re-supply ammo to the team.

"Eduardo and the GOE had saved the infantry company

from being wiped out.

LIKE 'FATHER' LIKE 'SON'-PAPA VIEJO AND BAMBINO

"In the northern part of Chalatenango, the FMLN had recruiters who used press gang tactics when they would go into the small towns. A couple of these recruiters were especially terrorizing the locals," Harry recalled the legend of the illustrious Sgt. Chan.

"GOE Team One's team leader Sgt. Chan, not liking the brutal way the G recruiters did things, decided to come to the aid of the helpless town folks.

"He picked two men in the team, one that looked ancient and one, a 16-18 year old who looked 12 but as tough as the rest, to carry on the mission. We called the ancient one 'Papa Viejo' and the kid 'Bambino'. They were to go into the village masquerading as father and son and follow Chan's instruction.

"They found the local cafe where the recruiters hung out and started to belly ache loudly about how they had been mistreated by the military. The recruiters, thrilled to find such easy converts, asked them if they would like to join the rebel cause.

"Papa Viejo and Bambino signed right

up, and the recruiters told them they would take them to their camp to meet the leader and become part of the great liberation of the people.

"A short distance out of town, Papa Viejo and Bambino pulled out their pistols and killed both of the recruiters.

CHAN TAKES OUT SOME GUERILLAS

"GOE Team One had been working near the Honduran border and found an FMLN base camp. They joined the G's, convincing them that they were from another guerilla group.

"After a week of living with the bad guys, Chan and his boys got up early one morning, killed the guards and cut everybody's throat. They rigged evidence showing that another group of G's had done the evil deed, pitting the bad guys who were already waging turf wars one against the other.

"I asked Chan if he felt bad about killing these guys he had spent a week with.

"Why should I'? They were G's', he said."

A GRADUATION PARTY-WITH GUNFIRE

Throughout the war, Harry was the only U.S. advisor with the Salvadoran Airborne, and trained the Airborne Sergeants.

"For graduation, we had taken a forward air control recon platoon class up to the mountains for an FTX exercise, They had picked this area with no G activity at the base of Guazapa.

"The battalion commander said there was 'no problem'.

"Two choppers inserted us at night in a rainstorm. We got turned around in a sugar cane field 3 clicks from where we were supposed to be.

"Come morning, we realized we had been dumped in a guerilla base camp. We hid in the bush all day, watching the G's chopping bush. That night, we moved to where we were supposed to be to set up camp, and sent some Observation Post (OP) teams out.

"The OP guys told me that armed G's were on the road. I thought they were messing with me. All four teams reported G's and this went on all night. The next evening the OP teams pulled back to where we were. A rifle shot went off 25 yards up the mountain.

ELD ARMORY

I thought one of the guys had an accidental discharge. I grabbed Sgt Ramos of the command team and told him to bring the shooter back cause I was going to pound the hell out of him.

"One shot reverberated across the hill, then another, then another. The G's were answering each other with gunfire. Realizing the alarms were for real, we moved deeper into the bush at midnight and hunkered down. This guy above us did his blasted nerve wracking firing drill every night. On the 4th day, going stir crazy, we decided this couldn't go on forever.

"That night, we moved down the hill



about a mile to be picked up, but they didn't have any choppers to get us.

"We left early in the morning and got to a place to be picked up and called the base for an extraction. We saw no helicopters and couldn't establish commo.

"Sgt Ramos said that the Airborne had the emergency frequency turned off because they thought it was just a training exercise.

"I was madder than hell!

U.S. PILOTS TO THE RESCUE

"Finally we were in commo, and demanded an extraction. There were no Salvadoran pilots on the base. Rick Lima and Felix Rodriguez, the CIA operative that brought down Che Guevara, who had been a keynote speaker at the SOF convention in Tampa, just happened to walk through flight operations and found out about our plight.

"Lima, a U.S. helicopter instructor pilot and gun-slinger who had flown combat in Vietnam and Felix cranked up a Huey which had no door gunners.

"The commo boys forgot to tell the pilots that we were surrounded by G's. We shot an azimuth at the helo when we sighted it. Lima and Felix radioed for us to throw smoke. We told them, 'impossible, the G's were 100 yards from us, had us surrounded and were moving in closer!'

"They finally spotted us and landed. I hopped up on a skid. "Where are the rest of the helos?" I demanded.

"We are it,' Felix replied. "We threw eight on the chopper to

return to Illopongo.We waited to be

overrun, but for some unknown reason, the G's did not fire us up.

"We could see below a tree line swarming with 100 guerillas.

"When the Airborne launched a week later, they found a hospital compound.

AIN'T NO FUN NO MORE

"That was Cardenas' last opt. He decided did not want to play any more. "The G's did not want to start a war right there with a hospital complex. The Airborne found East German and French doctors and Red Cross workers' passports. These doctors and nurses were Communist sympathizers. The Airborne took the passports and made 'wanted' posters and plastered them on every telephone pole in San Salvador.

"But they must have gotten the hell out of Dodge, to Honduras, in a panic. "A lot of European socialist



Close-quarters combat, like this bayonet training, endeared Claflin to the troops of the Deep Reconnaissance Platoon. movements were supplying material and support to the G's. "The Airborne later reported 300 G's imbedded in the area.

RUNNING UPHILL UNDER GUNFIRE MAKES FOR A LONG DAY

"President Duarte's daughter had been kidnapped and intelligence believed she might be being held at this base camp.

"The Battalion was put in as a blocking force about a half-mile below the camp to cut off any escape. The recon Platoon was the attacking force. As we were coming in on the choppers, I could see the Gun ships raking the LZ and the tree line to the front of us.

"The LZ was about the size of a football field with tall grass. When the choppers started to land, we noticed there were very large rocks in the LZ and the choppers would not set down but dumped us off from about six to eight feet. We hit the ground, formed up, and started toward the tree line with the gun ships clearing the way for us.

"When we hit the tree line, we saw the first huts and spotted G's running down the hill in front of us. We spread out and started down through the huts looking for anybody that might still be there. Cooking fires were still burning, hammocks were still swinging and personal property was scattered everywhere.

"The only thing the G's had grabbed was their weapons. As we reached the end of the camp, we ran into a large bunker complex that we started working through.

"About this time, the G's hit the blocking force and a fierce fire fight broke out down the hill from us. We had to be careful because we were getting fire from our own troops firing up the hill.

"We saw the first G's charging back up the hill shooting at us. We decided to pull back to the LZ and wait for the choppers. The Lt. got on the radio and requested a pick up where we had been dumped off. We were about 500-600 yardsfrom the top of the hill and our LZ. We had not found any hostages and our job was done.

Sheehan wrote a letter of appreciation to Claflin, giving him credit for establishing the GOE program in 1985.

"Running up hill under fire makes for a long day. When we got to the top, the gun ships gave us cover while we got back on the choppers and got airborne. Sitting in the door and looking down to where you have just been, knowing you made it and going home is a feeling only someone that has been there can know.

ANOTHER DAY IN PARADISE

It was after 30 combat operations that Harry "picked up some iron.

"In 1985-6, I was with the 4th Brigade El Parisio. Col. Ochoa had deployed us on a clandestine mission, Operation Cobra. We were to destroy guerrilla units operating in the rugged terrain along the Salvadoran-Honduran border.



"I was leading GOE Team One from El Parisio up towards Guatemala to set up Ops. The G's started shooting from 50-60 yards.

"The first day, we got into a running gun-fight. We wound up killing three or four, but none of us got killed.

"I picked up some iron from a hand grenade.

"I wasn't hurt that bad and didn't think much about it, but the Minister of Defense found out about it later and decided I should have the Combat Wound Medal, similar to our Purple Heart and the Combat Solders Medal, the same as our combat infantry badge.

HARRY AND THE AIRBORNE

"Did you do all the GOE training?" RKB asked.

"I trained four units and I went back to retrain these units from time to time. In combat, you have attrition, new people come in, people get set in their ways, and you need to recall them back to go over the training to see what they are doing wrong, what they are doing right.

"Most of it was just hard work. I would go out with them first couple operations then turn them loose. I was in the command and control, picked units and supplied equipment. I didn't do a lot of shooting.

"I couldn't have done it without the U.S. Army Special Forces advisers, the MilGroup, and the Brigade Operational Planning and Assistance Training Team (OPATT).

"Col. Rankin, the top U.S. Air Force advisor and Salvo Air Force liaison, was concerned that there were no forward air controllers that had the capability of calling in air strikes in the airborne battalion. I worked out of his office."

"Why did the MilGroup not catch this?" RKB asked

"They were overwhelmed, involved in getting brigades organized and operating," he responded.

"At the time, the limp-dick Congress, worried about another Vietnam, had authorized only 55 advisors at one time in El Salvador.

"I wrote POI for the commander of the airborne battalion and set up to train the sergeants in the Airborne. Col Rankin got approval from the MilGroup and the El Salvadoran side for air assets to implement this program.

YOU HAVEN'T LIVED 'TIL YOU'VE ALMOST

A Fearless SOG Team Leader Hits a Goldmine of Enemy Intel

Zero (team leader) of RT Michigan, Sergeant Eldon Bargewell. No one who ever met him doubted his professionalism or determination. He was meticulous when preparing his team for a mission, a fearless leader when on the ground and he possessed a biting wit and an absolute intolerance when it came to fools and REMFs, which he considered to be redundant.

The moment of truth came in March 1969 during a mission in the target MA-14, which was northwest of the A Shau Valley. Bargewell's team included Don Sheppard as his One-One (assistant team leader) and Mike Moorehouse as his One-Two (radio operator). RT Michigan's mission was simple: locate a North Vietnamese Army (NVA) regimental headquarters and way station, pinpoint the base camp, and then call in a Hatchet Force from CCS led by Jerry "Mad Dog" Schriver, on temporary assignment to CCN.

During the team's early afternoon insertion, a fourth American on the team broke his arm jumping from the helicopter as the NVA peppered the team's landing zone (LZ) with mortar fire. Bargewell had one chopper evacuate the injured SF soldier. When the chopper left, the NVA mortars fell



of possible political complications, and feared I would get whacked. The DAO and people in upper echelons were aware of how much influence I had with the El Salvadorans.

"It was Gen. Bustillo who understood that I was down there doing 200% all the time and things were working fine. He made sure I could go anywhere in the country and get whatever I wanted.

"SOFers had a get out of jail free and permission to arrest people, but we never had to use it," RKB interjected.

"Yeah, these passes were a two edged sword," Harry continued. "You never knew who the guerillas were. If you got stopped, you had to think whether to show your I.D. or not. If they were guerillas, you give them your I.D. and you're history. The police most of the time let you go. Every brigade had its own individual I.D. card, as there was no national military I.D. card.

"Did you ever worry whether the G's knew who you were?" RKB asked

"The G's knew who I was and it did worry me from time to time. The police raided a FMLN safe house in San Salvador and found a picture of me and several of the other MiLGroup. We were told to be more careful. They knew I was a trainer but I do not think they knew my connection to the GOE teams.

THE LAND OF COUPS

From the time of the Spanish conquest in the 14th century through the coup that launched the ten-year civil war in 1980, El Salvador was torn by repeated coups. From 1930 to 1979 alone, the country lived though half a dozen bloody coups.

"The separate unit I.D.s had become military tradition," Harry continued. To keep the enemy out, each courtel had a kiosk at the gate and you put your weapons in and they gave you a tag. Captain Michael Sheehan, SF Advisor to the Salvadoran IV Bde In Chalatenango, was an outstanding officer who worked closely with Claflin. He exemplified the "can do" attitude of SF, using whatever assets were available to accomplish the mission.

"The I.D. I had, authorized by the Estado Mayor, was a national pass that gave me access to any base because they were all subordinate to the

Ministry of Defense.

"The 2nd Brigade at Santa Ana contacted me and off I went. The Salvadorans were now paying me, but I'm not quite sure where they were getting the dollars.

"You think someone might have been paying the El Salvadorans and they were paying you? " RKB asked

"I'm positive. I was making the same wages as a Colonel in the Salvadoran army, about \$2000 a month the four months I was up training the GOE teams.

THEY LAUGHED WHEN WE ASKED FOR ANESTHETICS

"It was about 11:00 at night and the rain was coming down in torrents. The SF adviser was with us on a training mission way up into the mountains.

"There was a creek about four feet wide. Rather than walk through the raging stream, I decided to jump across it at night with an 80-pound pack on wearing night vision goggles. When I landed on the other side, my boot went between two rocks. I heard a crunch. My foot ballooned in the jungle boots. I thought I had just hyper extended it.

"I'm laying there. It's cold. It's raining. Hypothermia is not that far away. My teeth were chattering.

"I think I'm going into shock', I told the SF warrant officer. We pulled off the ambush site to get me off the hill. We were four- five miles from the road. We pulled back and they found some trees and I taught them how to jury rig a stretcher with their ponchos and I hauled my ass into it.

"Col. Kimball drove through 30-40 miles of enemy territory to pick me up. We got to the hospital over a very bumpy road.

"They were going to cut my boot off. "No Way!!!"—It was an order. There

are no more size 11 boots in the jungle'. They unlaced it and pulled it off. I about lost it at that point. It was broken.

"They laughed when we asked if they had anesthetics.

"This threw everything back about six weeks, but Col. Carlos Eugenio Vides Casanova, Director of the National Guard, who later became general and Defense Minister was not going to let me sit on my butt. I ran firearms maintenance and an explosive course hobbling around on crutches.

"I came home for a couple weeks then Kimball got a hold of me at home and wanted me to come back and train another team.

A WELCOME BACK TO THE JUNGLES

"When I got back down, Gus Taylor, OPATT at 1st Brigade, met me.

"We got everything waiting for you at first brigade', he said. At about this time Kimball rotated home.

"His replacement had a whole different approach to being a commander than Kimball did. We didn't hit it off real well. He had been in country for three days when I showed up and he didn't know me, nor understand why the Estado Mayor and MilGroup had put me there.

"We started preparation for a new GOE team. The new major and Fleenor, SF CWO at 2nd Brigade, cooked up obstacles like not wanting to work with me.

"I had a case of the ass. I told Rankin when I went back what was going on. I set up this new course and the major was standing in my way. Fleenor, the warrant officer, was upset when Col Rankin called Col Steele, the MilGroup commander and they called the Major, but he knew he had to cooperate.

THE DAY THE WAR STOOD STILL

"That's when the earthquake of 1986 hit. We were sitting in the office grumbling about how I'm getting too much money. Rankin has his feet up listening to us bickering.

"I thought somebody had bombed the building. Tiles came crashing down. File cabinets came falling down. Rankin fell over backward. The computers fell off the desk. It lasted six to eight seconds, that's a long son of a bitch. Eight people ran out the door at the same time.

"By now we know it's an earthquake instead of a bomb. It was a 6.8 on the Richter Scale. The whole city was in a cloud of dust. One guy radioed that there was a wave of ground four feet tall moving across like a water wave coming across the base. He's in a helicopter and he lands. Rankin and I jump in the helicopter to see what's going on.

"Oscar Danere, U.S. Air Force supply liaison to the Salvadorian Air Force who could scrounge up anything, and I are in one helicopter. Rick Lima in another. We're flying evacuations. At the end of 96 hours Rankin said, 'that's it! He



grounded us.

"We went to Danere's house and the four or us drank a gallon of whiskey, but we were still cold sober because of the adrenalin pump.We slept for a couple days, then got up and started over again.

"The earthquake stopped the war for a while. It destroyed the infrastructure of San Salvador. The Guerillas worked along side the MilGroup and the Army worked together. It took a couple of weeks for bulldozers to shove everything out of the streets before anyone could drive.

THEY PICKED UP THEIR GUNS AGAIN AND WENT AT IT

"After the clean up, everybody picked up their guns and went at it again. But the fire was out, they did not really want to do a lot of killing. The FLMN could have killed every Salvadoran officer and U.S. advisor in one night. They knew where every OPATT house was. There was no compound, so the guerillas knew where everyone was and none of the courtels were fortified.

"I don't think they wanted to escalate the war. If this had been the Viet Cong, the Salvadoran army would have ceased to exist in three months.

"The GOEs were very aggressive units that went out and shot individual guerilla leaders, concentrations of guerillas, and supply areas.

"Often, when they heard about a concentration of guerillas in certain areas, they would go in and dice up the guerilla camps and annihilate them. These 28 man teams had no fear of 100 man guerilla camps. They would go in with such a force of firepower the G's thought it was a whole battalion.

"The G's were fairly sophisticated. They were not a bunch of farmers. They had communications. Cubans and Nicaraguans that were training them were captured.

"I had already made up my mind I was going to stay there until the war ended. "Until my picture came out on the cover of Newsweek Nov. 1986 that is, when I became an exile. 🕱





The fleeing NVA jumped into a large hole in the wall inside the complex. Just as Bargewell entered into it. another NVA soldier fired a three- or four-round burst from his AK-47 at the charging SF soldier. One of the rounds

hit an AK-47 magazine in the vest that Bargewell was wearing. The round's impact stopped Bargewell dead in his tracks and knocked him backwards, as though he had been hit with a baseball bat. For a few moments, Bargewell thought he was dead. But then he realized that he was thinking and, if he was thinking, he must still be alive, albeit in a great deal of pain.

Contua fired an M-79 round into the hole. He heard it smack bone and flesh, but the round hadn't traveled far enough to arm itself and detonate. Regardless, firing that round gave Bargewell and Contua enough time to regroup, move out of the bunker and return to RT Michigan¹s secured perimeter. Embarrassed by his overzealousness, Bargewell didn't tell Sheppard or Moorehouse what had happened.

Sheppard told Covey to get the CCS Hatchet Force into the bunker complex. Covey said there were delays, so Bargewell returned to the command bunker that he had stumbled into earlier. He opened a map tube and found a map of the entire trail system within that portion of the Ho Chi Minh Trail, by far the best piece of enemy intelligence he had seen in recent memory.


One Vest Away From Eternity

As RT Michigan searched deeper into the command bunker they found tons of equipment, weapons, munitions, maps, surveying equipment, medical kits and vast caches of supplies. Everyone on the team was given something to carry back to the LZ and to CCN. As the team finally headed toward their LZ, Bargewell carried the map case and his souvenir AK-47, still wearing his NVA vest. The team made contact with the caretaker force left behind to guard the bunker complex, and made short work of the NVA REMFs.

RT Michigan was extracted and taken back to the Camp Eagle launch site where Major Clyde Sincere was there to greet them. Sincere asked if they had captured an NVA soldier because Sheppard had told Covey rider Ben "Indian" Nelson that Bargewell was chasing NVA soldiers into one of the bunkers.

With no NVA soldier to show for his efforts, Bargewell still didn¹t tell anyone at the launch site what had happened. Once back at CCN, Bargewell made his way to the hootch he had been sharing for the past three months with RT Virginia team member Doug LeTourneau. He had a kind of dazed look on his face as he told the Frenchman he'd been shot square in the chest. Bargewell took off the NVA vest and removed one of the AK-47 magazines. Sure enough, it had a bullet hole in it and when he gently shook the magazine, the bullet fell onto his bed. Bargewell and LeTourneau just stared at it. Finally, LeTourneau said, "Bargewell, you're one lucky son-of-abitch."

The following morning, Bargewell briefed Lieutenant General William Stillwell, the top general for the I Corps area of South Vietnam, on his mission and the planned Hatchet Force follow up. Stillwell told him that RT Michigan's mission was the single best intelligence-gathering operation in recent months. He thanked Bargewell and assured him that as soon as the Hatchet Force operation was concluded, a series of B-52 Arc Light sorties would be directed against targets garnered from the maps and intelligence reports



that Bargewell had retrieved from the regimental bunker complex.

Fifteen Helos Full of Stash

The following day, Schriver's Hatchet Force was inserted into the bunker complex, and encountered an NVA element of at least platoon strength. The CCS Hatchet Force, combined with several tactical airstrikes, pushed back the NVA forces and collected anything that wasn't nailed down. By the end of the day, the CCS Hatchet Force had collected enough supplies, maps, weapons and munitions to load 15 helicopters before finally returning to CCN to celebrate one of the more successful Hatchet Force operations in SOG history at that point in time.

In one of the typical, disorienting, Vietnam War ironies, two days later, LeTourneau and Bargewell found themselves on their way to Hawaii to spend time with their wives. To move from a near-death experience to being in the arms of the woman you love is, to say the least, an enlightening transition. Both love and the threat of death have a marvelous way of focusing a man's attention on the important things in life. It is not recorded what it was Sergeant Bargewell reflected upon while walking the beaches of Hawaii or what flavor life had at that moment, but it's safe to assume it was sweet.

A Hatchet Force was a platoon- or company-size force composed of indigenous forces – usually Montagnard, Nung, or South Vietnamese personnel led by Green Berets. insertion, a fourth American on the

team broke his arm jumping from the helicopter as the NVA peppered the team's landing zone (LZ) with mortar fire. Bargewell had one chopper evacuate the injured SF soldier. When the chopper left, the NVA mortars fell silent.

Believing the entire team had left the target, the NVA soldiers returned to their regular duties along the Ho Chi Minh Trail. RT Michigan moved out toward what intelligence officers said was the regimental headquarters. After moving only 200 meters, the point man saw an old bunker. Much to Bargewell's surprise, intelligence was accurate for a change. \varkappa

An international "oops" during the Korean War

"American Jets Attack Soviet Airfield," the headlines blared. It wasn't WWIII nor Star Wars. It was the Fall of 1950, the Korean War was only a few months old, and U.S. Air Force F-80 jets, flying under United Nations aegis, attacked the Soviet Union.

Knowing that close air support can break armored spearhead and human wave attacks, the U.S. commanders wisely used their limited supply of F-80s to strafe, bomb and rocket the masses of North Korean troops and armor that were rolling South.

F-80 patrols were also assigned search and destroy missions for airfields in North Korea, trying to destroy Communist air power on the ground. It was on just such a mission that two young F-80 pilots did something thousands of patriotic Americans would have loved to do then, beat up a Soviet military airfield inside Mother Russia.

The official operations summary for the 49th Ftr/Bmr Grp for 8 October 1950, indicates that Mission #9-8 involved three effective sorties in the Chengjin, North Korea area. The results of the official after-action report read: Twenty aircraft (P-63 and Yak 9 type) observed on undetermined airfield. Three passes were made, leaving one a/c destroyed and two damaged.

However, pilot notes from the mission debriefing indicated that P-39 aircraft were also on the ground and that a total of four aircraft were destroyed and five damaged. Neither report noted one other vital fact, that the airfield under attack and the aircraft shot up on the ground were more than fifty miles inside the Soviet Union, North of the Korean border.

Technically, the two American pilots had invaded a neutral country, a U.S. ally, and a founding member of the United Nations. Never mind that this same country, the USSR, was chief supplier of aircraft, weapons, supplies, strategy, advisers, money and other aid to the communist North Korean aggressors who were at war with the U.S. and the U.N. Regardless of the reality, the of the country. The 49th was located at K2, and Lts Allen Diefendorf and Alton Quanbeck were two of the pilots who flew F-80s for the Group's 9th Squadron.

An affable pilot who flew in WWII, Korea and Vietnam, the late Col. Diefendorf was a 25 year old Lieutenant at the time and already a combat vet. In a 1988 interview, he said of his historic mission, "It was a great, sunny Fall day when we met for preflight at K2. The afternoon sortie schedule posted Quanbeck, two others and me for a mission. It was just my fourth mission in Korea.

"The preflight briefing was pretty sketchy; we were to recce some airfield in

attack was a violation of international law , and, technically, an act of war. That one mission, largely unknown in U S military history, had major international implications for the Korean War.

By October of 1950, U.N. ground forces had secured airfields in the interior of Korea, including the K2 field, five miles North of Taegu in the southern part northeastern Korea, near the coast. They told us the brass was worried about an invasion build-up there and wanted to have some intelligence on the airfield situation in case of possible Chinese or Soviet intervention.

"By takeoff the clouds had rolled in, so we punched through them and flew North. Our flight leader and #4 man,

Bud Evans, had aircraft malfunctions and returned to Taegu. Quanbeck took the lead and I flew as his wing.

"We flew above the clouds on our prescribed time, distance and heading. The clouds and a very high wind were factors we hadn't been briefed on, and when we saw water through a break in the clouds, we obviously knew we weren't over Korea.

Quanbeck decided to throttle way back and have us glide down in circles, heading West, back to the mainland of what we figured was Korea," Diefendorf recalled.

Quanbeck recalled the details of the attack, saying, "We got inland a few miles when Dief saw an airfield off to our right front, a grass combat strip where we saw aircraft parked, some covered with netting and branches. We saw a few buildings and some gun emplacements, but no people at all. We didn't see any signs of life, which was odd, just the aircraft. We saw no flag on the pole and only marking we saw on the aircraft were the large red stars on each.

"Dief called out over the radio, 'Look at that airfield. Let's get it!" This was the type of target every fighter pilot dreams about. We had only seconds to make up our minds, due to fuel concerns. We chose to attack.

Yak-9 type."

Quanbeck wrote that his decision was based on briefings that enemy planes were being quartered in North Korea for missions to the South, and both men thought they were well within North Korea. Also, Quanbeck noted that a machine gun had been fired at them as they crossed over a building several miles from the airfield, claiming "They fired on us first."

In a recent interview, he said that he had some pre-attack concerns, e.g., no P-39s had yet been spotted in action over Korea, plus the airfield they were about to hit did not exactly match the target airfield of their briefing.

Low on fuel, the two pilots headed their F-80Cs back toward Taegu, bucking a tremendous headwind and using lowpowered radio stations to confirm their flight path in the poor visibility.

Diefendorf recalled, "I bet our ground speed wasn't much over 100 knots because of that damned wind. We were very, very low on fuel when we finally made base. My engine actually flamed out as I reached the parking area."


Then came debriefing, when they were ordered to HQ Taegu, after evening chow. "The intelligence officers asked us a lot of detail because we were so long overdue and had shot up an undetermined field.

"Partidge told us both very quietly and a genuine soft smile that 'you boys did well, and you'll either get a Distinguished Service Cross or a court martial out of this mission .

This sly statement should have been the first clue that this "navigational error" mission might have been something totally different, e.g., a deliberate "mistake." But, that was the furthest thing from the minds of the two young fighter pilots.

According to the late LTC. Fletcher Prouty, who served as a USAF aide to the Joint Chiefs of Staff at the time, because they never expected an attack by us in that area, the Russians had no antiaircraft, no missiles and no jet aircraft to defend that small field. I'm sure their radar had tracked our two F-80s in, then probably lost them in ground clutter.

"Also, the F-80s made only three short runs over the strip, which doesn't take very much time. There was reaction afterwards, when their military leaders discovered how totally vulnerable they were." Prouty added. "That fuss about our guys being accidentally so far off course isn't realistic. There were many legitimate targets in North Korea, and that's a fairly small area in terms of size for jet aircraft to be operating. There was a message in this attack."

" I immediately turned right, away from my wingman and strafed the northern line of P-63s, Dief right behind me. We both made 180s and hit the Southern line of aircraft. Then, we turned left again and made a third firing pass over the northern line of targets. "

In a 1990 article for the WASHINGTON POST. Quanbeck wrote of that mission, "It was the kind of target fighter pilots dream about...20 parked aircraft of the P-39, P-63 and

They asked us about the types of aircraft at the field. There were U.S. built aircraft we figured were leftover from WWII Lend Lease to the Russians. By now the truth was starting to sink in as to what we'd done and where we'd done it," Diefendorf said.

Diefendorf said that Maj Gen Earl Partridge himself conducted some of the post mission briefing. As they were leaving the HQ, Diefendorf said that

By map reference, the small Soviet airfield is only 62 air miles from the Korean border and only 40 miles from Vladivostok, a major USSR port city. Despite the briefing and what appeared to be an obvious error, the intelligence men got on the hotline to higher HQ, including MacArthur's staff in Tokyo.

After that, things happened fast. Diefendorf said "The (stuff) really hit the fan the next day." Recalling that same day, Quanbeck wrote, "The game was to

be played at high levels. Dief and I became pawns as the big boys took over."

Quanbeck says that their flight leader, Bud Evans, had told him that orders for this mission ,"came down from very high up the chain of command "" and it was meant to send the Soviets a message that 'we can reach you." Quanbeck added that through the years, various folks have told him that that mission made a significant difference in the war, as the Soviets lessened their technical and materiel support for the North Koreans by



that Soviet aircraft were destroyed on a Soviet airfield. UN and some US officials worried that the Soviets might use the incident as an excuse to intervene or to pressure China to enter the war. On the other hand, other officials seemed to be pleased with the results.

Consider that the attack on Sukhaya Rechkja took place almost to the day that American divisions and other U.N. troops pushed North of the 38th parallel. Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Andre Gromyko delivered a formal protest to the United Nations on 9 Oct 1950, in a very detailed and accurate account of the "mistaken" air attack.

The question in Washington dealt

(Photo courtesy of USAF via author.) the conflict, but to let the idle millions of Communist China perform the task as part of the master plan to drain United States resources into geographical rat holes of the orient...No, the Soviet Union will not enter the conflict in any direct fashion.

In addition, according to LTC Prouty, "Remember that 1950 was only five years after the USSR had been bled nearly dry of men, material and finances by WWII. They were not anxious to face a strong, victorious United Nations military force at the time, especially over something as minor as a two-plane strafing attack on a wasteland grass airstrip full of old WWII aircraft. But, no question, the folks in the Kremlin had gotten the message 'that we can reach you' very clearly."

Indeed, as Willoughby predicted, Josef Stalin decided to disengage a good bit, and on 22 Oct 1950, ordered the USSR military to slow aid and supplies to North Korea in a sign to Washington that the Soviets did not wish to escalate tensions over the issue, all of which lends

> more support to the "planned secret mission" theory.

The only official explanation ever presented by the U.S. at the time was offered by Gen. MacArthur's HQ, which termed the incident " an accident due to weather, navigational error and poor judgment on the part of the pilots." Pres.



Truman did offer to pay for the damaged aircraft. In view of their Lend Lease origins, the President probably did this with great tongue in cheek.

So much for top-level diplomacy. What of the two pilots sitting in the judgment of political purgatory down



the end of 1950. Yet, the two pilots were officially grounded within the week after each had flown two more combat missions. Their commanding

officer, Col. Stanton Smith, was "fired" up the chain of command ladder to a job with 5th Air Force operations in Seoul. An investigating officer was assigned by the USAF to look into the full ramifications of the case, along with two people from the Department of State.

The potential was there for a full blown international incident. There was no question that the attack took place and

> with the likelihood of direct Soviet intervention. Gen. Charles Willoughby, chief of intelligence operations for Gen. Douglas MacArthur, Supreme Allied Commander in Korea, personally briefed President Harry Truman in a Top Secret session. His report to Truman noted:

"The Air Force's investigator really grilled Quanbeck and me," Diefendorf said. "He asked us everything from our politics to




and about the absence of any briefing on the high winds and cloud cover."

When it was over, the investigating officer, Maj Harry W Christian, concluded that there was no real evidence of any deliberate wrongdoing and recommended that no charges be filed. Because of the political pressures from the Suits in Washington, though, the air force recommended a full court martial. Diefendorf and Quanbeck were stunned and more than a little nervous about their USAF careers. According to Quanbeck, "I was told later that the Secretary of State Dean Acheson personally ordered our court martial to take place. Later, when I was an aide to BG Delmont Spivey, commanding general of the 314th Air Division in Nagoya, I was shown the wire sent directly by the Secretary of State stating, 'Relieve the appropriate commander and court martial the officers concerned.' I was perplexed that the directive came from the Secretary of State, rather than

the Secretary of Defense. It does give credence to the belief that Truman did not trust military channels at the time."

At that time two very nervous young



men, Al Diefendorf and Alton Quanbeck, remembered, "It may have been an international show for the big guys, but it was very real and personal to us. That Court had us very worried because the U.S. Air Force was our career and our lives, for both of us, " Diefendorf recalled.

"One of our flight leaders suggested we retain LTC Bernard Katz from Fifth Air Force HQ as our defense counsel. We did and he really was a first class lawyer for us, despite the political pressures not to be. When we got LTC Katz on our side, things began to be very much different and positive for Quanbeck and me. His work in and out of the court was just awesome. He was a helluva defense attorney and put the case against us to mush."

The two men faced their court martial and were judged to be not guilty of any charges. Both were reassigned from the 49th. Lt. Quanbeck went to Nagoya as an aide to BG. Spivey, while Lt. Diefndorf was assigned to an F-80 squadron at Misawa, and from there, to the Philippines.

"We were told the air force was taking us out of combat in the event we were shot down and captured things would not go well for us. That was the only thing about that situation that made any sense," Diefendorf said.

The reaction of their peers and most of their superior officers was one of celebration and jubilation. One field grade officer told Diefendorf, "You fellas should be decorated for firing the first shots of WWIII." There were positive editorials and commentaries in various military publications is support of Quanbeck and Diefendorf. Both were promoted to captain shortly after the media hoopla died down and their careers resumed.

"I saw Quanbeck only one other time after all of that, when I went to Nagoya in 1951 for some routine flight tests. We never discussed the incident. I have never seen him since, which is pretty strange, I guess, considering what we went through. Through the grapevine I learned that he'd become a spook of some sort, working for the CIA "

Alton Quanbeck flew F-86s, taught at both the U S Military Academy and the U S Air Force Academy. He earned a PhD, and became a strategic weapons planner for the air force, working out of the Pentagon. He also served as a systems analyst for the Secretary of Defense during the Vietnam war. He retired from the USAF as a full Colonel in 1970. Later, Quanbeck was a senior fellow at the Brookings Institute and served as a senior staff member to the U S Senate Select Committee on Intelligence. His final position before retiring from government service was as a senior executive on the staff of the Director of Central Intelligence.

As for Al Diefendorf, after Korea, his career took him through assignments all over the world, primarily doing what he loved most, flying aircraft. In 1964, LTC Al Diefendorf was flying F-4 Phantoms out of Cam Rahn Bay Air Base as Wing Commander of the 557th Tactical Fighter Squadron. He retired a full Colonel in 1975. He passed away in 1996.

Commenting on the case, Fletcher Prouty said, "The punishment and hassle that Quanbeck and Diefendorf went through was really overreaction and unjust, to be sure. But, did you ever wonder what the Russians must have done to the commanding officer of that little airbase for letting his place and ships get shot up like that without any opposition? I bet the Soviet brass stood that poor guy up against one of those burned out aircraft and shot him on the spot!"



Let Our Snipe Denying the Emp

Caught With Our Pants Down

"The true sniper is not actually, in one sense of the term, a real "soldier." His nature, job, and gifts are too individualistic." (Ion L. Idriess)

These words were written nearly one hundred years ago and are still applicable today.

Unfortunately, individualism in and of itself flies in the face of contemporary military thinking; for numerous reasons, many commanding officers simply do not understand the huge force multiplier they have with their sniper teams.

The worth of the sniper in warfare has been proven time and again, but these lessons have been largely forgotten after every conflict. That is, until the newest tyrant attempts to rule the world by force and welltrained and equipped snipers are urgently needed once again. This unfortunate cycle of being "caught with our pants down' results in stop-gap measures like the designated marksman program, issuing worn out M14 rifles for precision work, and pressuring sniper schools to push students through, just to get enough trained snipers in the field.

Many fully trained professional snipers currently in the fight feel that the designated marksman program, with its marginal training and inadequate equipment, is "watering down" the sniper program. They feel that every Soldier/Marine should be a welltrained marksman first and the snipers should be left to do what snipers know how to do best. They feel it is irresponsible and downright ludicrous to send young men half trained (at best) to do a sniper's job.

The III Equipped Designated Marksman

The designated marksmen, on the other hand (who come from various skill levels and backgrounds), are set on a tread wheel. Commanders who do not understand sniper tactics often task the snipers. The commanders assign these men to over watch missions but do not properly equip them for it. The designated marksmen have no choice but to follow orders and do the very best with what they have, or with what they can scrounge, inside or outside of their chains of command. Some do a great job and eventually attend sniper school upon their return from theater.

Many snipers believe they would be better served if they had their own command and support elements rather than being treated simply as an afterthought attached to a headquarters company. But lamentations from snipers to higher echelons for better gear and operational autonomy often fall on the deaf ears of officers primarily schooled in commanding battalions of tanks, artillery, and mechanized infantry. One comment overheard from an officer defending his position was stated as "Snipers don't win wars."

"Snipers Don't Win Wars"

That assessment may have been valid with the former "big army" threat of the Soviet Union, but may be somewhat arguable given the nature of current conflicts. Tanks and artillery are of limited use in the urban fighting of Iraq, where the number-one killer of our military personnel is the improvised explosive device, better known as the IED.

IEDs are placed by human insurgents, and one of the best ways to combat them is with a corps of well-equipped and welltrained snipers. Fully supported by their command, with common sense rules of engagement, and operating upon actionable intelligence (that they often develop themselves), Coalition Force snipers can methodically hunt these insurgents down and eliminate them (with no collateral damage to innocents whatsoever). The battles for Fallujah and Najaf are prime examples of virtual domination by US

sniper teams. Snipers are by their very nature hunters; due to their intensive training, snipers know their own capabilities better than anyone else. The same, however, cannot often be said of their commanding officers. Many company and field-grade officers have no training in sniper employment, do not understand their snipers' capabilities. and

have no idea how to deploy their snipers in a doctrinally correct manner.

Therefore, the sniper is caught in the proverbial Catch-22. Snipers require trust and autonomy from higher up in order to operate successfully (sometimes independently) and "do what they were taught to do." Unfortunately, most E5s are not going to be able to tell a commissioned officer much about how the snipers should be deployed or why the gear the sniper needs is different than the other troops' gear. After all, how could any E5 who has merely attended sniper school possibly know more about sniper employment than a commissioned officer who has not?

Enter the IED and Suicide Bombers

With the advent of the IED and the suicide bomber, many units that previously did not have snipers are now finding the sniper's intelligence-gathering and over

watch skills vital to mission success. Since a school-trained sniper usually carries an infantry MOS, these armor, artillery, and cavalry units are often deploying some form of designated marksman to counter current

threats.


Unfortunately, the gear and weaponry required for these men may not fall within the equipment guidelines of the type of unit deploying them. For example, an armor unit may have plenty



of budgetary resources for their vehicles or computer monitors for their CP, but no money for the optics, weaponry, and specialized equipment the designated marksmen desperately need to protect the unit from IEDs and suicide bombers. This is because their modified table of equipment may not denote anywhere that the unit even has designated marksmen!

A commonly heard reply to a sniper's request for gear and operational autonomy usually goes something like "You guys are nothing special and no different than the rest of the troops; so quit whining."

If this is so, then why are snipers hand picked, sent to one of the most rigorous and demanding forms of training the US military has to offer, and taught things other airmen, marines, sailors and soldiers are not? Why is a designated marksman chosen for his position over someone else if everyone is equally trained and no one is special? Anyone familiar with the sniper program knows that graduates from sniper school are rarely personnel you would consider "whiners." On the contrary, snipers typically are consummate professionals and perfectionists. That is their nature and one of the primary reasons they were chosen for the job in the first place.

We constantly hear from snipers in OIF how they would be much more effective if they were allowed to do the things and operate the way they were taught in sniper school. Snipers lament that their commanding officers often choose to employ them in places like water towers or guard towers and require them to take the same routes, to the same hide sites, time and time again. These are tactics taken straight out of Hollywood and suicidal for a sniper team.

On the opposite end of the spectrum, we hear that some sniper commanders are afraid to allow the sniper teams outside the wire unaccompanied, because if they get killed, higher will have hell to pay for losing men on their watch and having it displayed on the nightly news at home. The snipers feel that they knew the risks they signed on for when they took the job, but they can't very well kill the enemy if they are not allowed off the base without excessive protection. Snipers tell us that because some commanders have no knowledge of sniper operations, these same commanders simply do not understand why snipers need equipment that is different than standard infantry issue, and such requests are often passed

off as "gee whiz" items rather than the absolutely essential pieces of equipment they really are.

The Sniper-Eyes of **His Command**

One example here is the sniper's optics. Because a sniper serves as the eyes of his command, quality optical equipment is constantly in demand. Spotting scopes, rifle scopes, mini binoculars, and small laser range finders are almost universally needed and are absolutely essential pieces of sniper gear. How can snipers or designated marksmen determine if an insurgent is carrying a weapon or determine the insurgent's activities without optics? We are speaking here



of quality, ightweight optical equipment that will not hinder movement, and that will not add to an already massive combat load in 120-degree heat. Is the insurgent carrying a rifle or a hoe? Is he using a cell phone or a detonator? Or ... is he using the cell phone as the detonator? Current rules of engagement dictate that the sniper must know these things before he fires. Therefore his optical equipment is critical.

The "M49" designation for the M49 spotting scope stands for Model of ... 1949! The scopes are falling apart and many have no tripods. M14 rifles are being pulled out of long-term storage facilities and issued with cracked stocks and bedding and lacking optics, rear sight assemblies, and magazines! The US Army and Marine Corps have not officially used the M14 rifle since the early 1970s. When the current parts in inventory are gone, they are gone; and when a designated marksman points these things out as a potential problem, he is told to quit whining and get the job done.

Let Them Hunt!!!

The snipers do not need this gear ten years from now. They needed it in hand, ready to go, on September 10, 2001. The Rapid Fielding Initiative is certainly helping, and the author personally knows that some of the best logistics people in the United States military are absolutely doing all they can possibly do to fix these problems. But the red tape of the procurement process, the bids and the contracts and the tests and the trials and the massive slowas-molasses paperwork, business, money, and politics of it all ... suffocate even the best of their efforts. The man in the arena is the one who suffers. He needs a spotting scope right now so he can protect his people.

Commanders, if your snipers or designated marksmen ask for something needed to do their jobs more efficiently, chances are they are not whining at all. Listen to them. They wouldn't risk the heat from on high if they didn't really need the gear.

There was a time early in our

own history when the American people were fighting the greatest power in the world (England), and we ourselves were referred to as insurgents. Will we yet again forget the lessons of marksmanship in guerilla warfare as taught to us by our forefathers such as General Daniel Morgan?

The enemy is real and he is committed and America must remain steadfast. Yet; our snipers cannot operate without command authority to do so. The advent of the IED demands that we properly train and equip our snipers, and then ... let them hunt! The way they were taught to do and the way they have always done when we have called upon them.

the allegations made by PVT [Scott Thomas] Beauchamp were found to be false. His platoon and company were interviewed and no one could substantiate the claims."

In other words, these wild claims get to go next to those of Senator Richard Durbin (who compared guards at Guantanamo Bay to the Khmer Rouge) and Newsweek's reports of guards flushing a Koran (turned out it was a detainee) as not standing up to the scrutiny of investigation. Bloggers were among the first to notice discrepancies in the account and raise the alarm. To all of you bloggers, well done!

ValourIT – Helping Wounded Heroes

In June 2005, Captain William Ziegenfuss was wounded in action by the detonation of an IED, and was medevaced to Walter Reed. Already a somewhat-known milblogger, he longed to keep in touch with the men in his unit and to resume his blogging. He was facing a problem, though. The IED planted by terrorists had left him with serious hand injuries.

A reader sent him voicerecognition software that allowed him to do just that. From there, he collaborated with another blogger, and Project Valour IT began to provide the wounded heroes of the Global War on Terror with laptops equipped with voice-recognition software. So far, Project Valour IT has donated 600 laptops to these heroes.

That's the good news. The bad news is that there are wounded heroes still waiting for laptops. Each laptop costs \$800, no small chunk of change.

Mexico. This issue he continues his review of the ineffectual efforts on the part of government to stem the tide, and SOF publisher Robert K. Brown rides the border to file a first-hand report.

The Root Of The Problem

Enter the federal government. Border Patrol senior management told volunteer groups to stop filling the ratholes. Their rationale was that it was "interfering with sensors monitoring the border." When asked why these imaginary sensors had failed to detect the groups crossing unmolested month after month, the senior officials got silent. Border Patrol agents were withdrawn to the VCPs (vehicle control points), with 17 agents with vehicles at one checkpoint miles away from the border, no agents available to watch at the border, and hours-long waits to take custody of illegals apprehended. Suddenly, "comprehensive immigration reform," codewords for amnesty, became the order of the

day, explaining the shift in priorities.

So it became vital to document the situation.

Border Patrol agents change shifts every day, year round, coast to coast, at 0800, 1600, and midnight. They leave their observation points 1/2 hour to an hour before shift change. This has been -- and continues to be -- a guaranteed a half hour to an hour window for smugglers to cross anything and everything into the U.S. The smugglers know this and they use

The volunteer group recorded daily daytime crossings en masse. They photographed Mexican police crossing into America at will during this time, patrolling not Mexico, but plainly observing the American side to verify no BP presence prior to groups crossing from the south, over and over. In multiple cases, groups would arrive to cut the fence with blowtorches, pull posts out to make drive-through gates, and build ramps to drive over the fences, all during shift change with no Border Patrol presence for miles, nor for hours.

Finally, after high government

officials announced things were more secure, video was released to national networks showing groups of 20 strolling across the same holes, in the same places, day after day after day. Apparently, someone got a case of heartburn.

Enter the Notional Guard

The National Guard has a long and proud history of defending America. Shortly after the videos started showing up on Fox News and CNN, National Guard troops arrived to take over the job at the border, and assist the BP in observing. And did they ever. They deployed to high points around the clock, and crossings were bottled up. Drive-throughs of drugs became more desperate, and coyotes "rocking" agents, and other violence, including shootings by BP, increased, as proof of how actual security was putting the squeeze on the cartels who control the smuggling business.

The property owners and residents started getting sleep without thousands of midnight visitors. Wildlife returned to the area. Civilian groups and ranchers had time to clean up decades of trash and beef up fences instead of having to catch crossers. In short, a measure of sanity had returned to an area out of control. Right up until the elections of 2006.


Within hours of the Republican loss of the House and Senate in November of 2006, the National Guard stopped doing round-the-clock surveillance. Instead of doing a military relief-on-

post at watch points, they started doing a Border Patrol-style "show up two hours after shift change, if at all" style of observation. They were moved from effective positions to positions with poor observation and large gaps in visual coverage of the border. In Arizona, they pulled out when confronted. In California, civilians were in place near the border to prevent similar situations. Some troops were even observed and photographed sunning themselves or sleeping during their watch. They took hours-long lunch breaks, and were absent for hours and days at a time.



They went from being the National Guard to the "Notional Guard." Within weeks, years of effort were undone, and things returned to being as out of control as they've ever been: fences cut, groups coming through at will in droves, drug shipments being driven across the border fence in broad daylight.

And that's where they are at the moment. Border Patrol and the National Guard continue to leave huge time and space gaps in covering key border crossing points. Resources are mis-deployed and non-deployed. What resources there have been are poorly utilized, and the public is

rays when they're supposed to be watching miles of international border. Photo: U.S. Evolutions

deliberately misled in a politically motivated effort to open the illegal immigration floodgates. This leaves the border region wide open to criminals and terrorists in the midst of a Global War On

Terror, six years after 9/11. And border residents have reached a breaking point in tolerance for government ineptitude and duplicity.

Neither troops nor dedicated field agents make decisions to stop doing their jobs without orders from higher authorities, and the

capture of the coyotes' group crossing under darkness. They were so worried about the state of border surveillance, that they were observed by civilian border watch bringing along small children in this group. No USBP or National Guard was anywhere within miles when this group crossed. Photo: U.S. Evolutions higher authority responsible for this situation has to be somewhere very near the top. Until someone gets their attention, or they direct the people on the ground to start doing their jobs, it's going to be up to civilians to keep doing the job that the federal government is supposed to do. Raising the hue and cry has been a civic duty since the times of old English law – but it was based on the premise that the alarm would cause competent civil authority to step in.

This has not been the case along the U.S. border with Mexico, and as this kettle continues to bubble, each new confrontation threatens to boil over into violence. The government seems to be betting that will never happen. If they're wrong, the stakes are tremendous.

Leatherneck Publishing By John Stryker Meyer

During the summer of 2006, a friend told me about a new publishing company that had surfaced in Oceanside, California. With Camp Pendleton bordering Oceanside to the north, it seemed appropriate that the company was run by a retired Marine aviator who flew A-4 jets during the Vietnam War.

My Navy friend told me two things made Leatherneck Publishing unique: It gave writers the best royalty payment per book in the industry, and the firm's CEO, retired flight instructor Lt. Col. Neil Levin, went the extra yard for military writers, promising to go so far as to read at least three chapters of every manuscript presented to Leatherneck Publishing and, if rejected, to personally call the author to explain why it was rejected and to offer assistance in improving it.

In short order, I learned that Levin was a combat warrior, once shot down over North Vietnam, where he had to fly more than 25 miles with shrapnel wounds, before punching out of his A-4 at 16,000 feet over the Gulf of Tonkin. When he wrote a book about that combat scenario and his 20 years in the Corps, he ran into the traditional roadblock of big-time publishers: None gave a damn about military-genre nonfiction stories.

Undaunted, Levin did what any good Marine would do. He charged forward and established his own publishing company. Robert S. Jones, with 25 years experience in the publishing industry in the US, Asia, and Europe, was brought in as director of marketing, while retired marine Lt. Col. William G. Byrne Jr. became director of sales. Last, but not least, was editorial director Nancy King, who joined the Leatherneck staff.

In two years, Leatherneck Publishing printed four books, including Levin's "An Angel Rode My Wing" and it currently has four more books in various editing stages. Each week finds several new manuscripts, story suggestions and book inquiries on Levin's desk.

When I had finished co-authoring a book on Vietnam with fellow Green Beret John E. Peters, we needed a publisher. I called Levin, met Jones and Byrne over a cup of coffee, and within a short period of time, we were moving forward to publish my book.

Levin's message to me was the same as it appears on Leatherneck's Web site, "I'm in business to help military authors get published and marketed. I'm looking for Marines fresh back from combat in Iraq or Afghanistan because I'm a Marine first."

And, he'll help former service members, such as myself, whether they are Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard or Marine Corps veterans. "I can't stress it enough: We're totally dedicated to writers with good stories to tell."

When Gunnery Sgt. Patrick Tracy of Fox Company 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines, came to Leatherneck Publishing, he had a diary in hand and began working with the upstart publishing company detailing his Iraq tour of duty from August 2004 to April 2005. When it was published in 2006 by Leatherneck Publishing, Levin said, "This book is so good that every marine, soldier, sailor or airman should read it to learn about what combat in Iraq is like from the perspective of a boots-on-the-ground warrior."

And Tracy proves he's a Marine's Marine when, after losing a Marine in combat he wrote: "...you have to keep going on and keep staying focused...the Blackhearts will prevail because there ain't an ounce of quit in any Marine in Fox 2/5..."

Leatherneck Publishing recently netted book awards from the San Diego Public Library. Levin's book "An Angel Rode My Wing" was a best seller in Marine Corps Association book stores.

drugs are destroying our children, and we're supposed to accept the cost of having our homes broken into, our property and cars stolen and our children raped and murdered. All it takes is the political will.

And the next time thousands of illegal aliens have the nerve to demonstrate in an American city, I want to see hundreds of Border Patrol Agents rounding them up. And kicking their asses if they try to resist.

And I'm sick and tired of hearing politicians and pundits declare that it is too late to remove the illegal aliens already in the country. In 1954 we conducted Operation Wetback. Something like 70,000 illegal aliens were apprehended, while an estimated 400,000 got up and left. We could do it again.

Too many aliens and not enough agents, you say? Well, have you ever heard the old Texas Ranger motto of "One Ranger, One Riot"? We practiced this on a nightly basis, down on the border.

We must demand an end to government neglect and demand a forceful, effective resolution of this crisis.

The V-22 Tiltrotor Prepares for Battle, Conclusion

Marine Corps Air Station New River, N.C. Once again United States Marine Corps aviators are pushing the aerial envelope – this time in

the MV-22 Osprey, the world's first "tiltrotor" war bird.

Last month, we reviewed the extraordinary history of this unusual aircraft and its unique abilities as a fighting tool, and the support weapons it can carry in addition to its mission of rapidly inserting Marines to where they can wage war most effectively.

SOF was on hand at MCAS New River for a briefing by Marine Corps officials before the first flight of Ospreys took off for "Exercise Desert Talon" near Yuma, Arizona, the squadron's final operational test before it deploys for war in Iraq. By the time the briefing and background information was absorbed, the pilots at New River lit off the massive 6,150-horsepower turbo-shaft Rolls-Royce engines poking 21 feet into the air.

The first indication the Thunder Chickens were alive was the whine of servos that quickly gave way to clouds of dark blue-grey smoke belching from the exhausts ported through the bottom of the engine nacelles. When the 10 low-visibility grey-blue Ospreys cranked up, they virtually disappeared into the thick

fumes until the engines smoothed out.

"Don't worry," explained a aircraft was shut down until the leaks that perpetrated the incident were fixed. Not so in the Osprey. It is just one of the quirks it comes with: Since its engines are oriented mostly horizontal in flight and vertical during ground operations, its redundant hydraulic systems leak. Its redundant hydraulic systems leak. Several times the Marine Corps grounded the bird during its operational workup when nacelle fires threatened the safety of aircrews. Apparently the problems have been resolved to the Corps' satisfaction, New River PAO Chief Capt. Stuart J. Fugler explained.

"Nobody flying them is interested in committing suicide. The pilots and crews know when to be concerned. Those birds don't go in the air if there is even a question of a safety problem," Fugler said.

While the Ospreys wound up oneby-one, Master Gunnery Sergeant Richard P. Rogers waited to pounce on any Marine with the temerity to screw up. Some things just never change in the Corps. The steely-eyed maintenance chief with a Master Gunnery Sergeant's chevrons emblazoned on the back of his helmet hawkishly watched the show with one ear tuned to a radio and both eyes fixed on the flight line. Rogers' job is overseeing the carefully choreographed ground effort.

Under his supervision, crewmembers, maintenance specialists and flight line mechanics hustled around with tools and tall ladders checking each bird while it cranked up. With 20 Rolls-Royce

engines driving 38-foot-diameter proprotors on the flight line, normal conversation is impossible. The crews talked by radio, hand signals, and intercom. Observers are left to shout into each other's ears.

Take Off Like a Chopper, Fly Like a Plane, Fight Like a Marine

After an hour the parade that preceded the entire squadron of Ospreys taking off from New River finally began. Passing by the gathering crowd of Marines staying behind, the Thunder Chickens moved out in a stately \$710-million procession.

Waddling down the flight line on its dual-wheel tricycle landing gear, the Osprey raised questions about its aerial prowess. Those fears were quickly laid to rest when each aircraft reached the runway, turned, tilted its huge three-forward and almost silently whooshed bladed fans until they pitched slightly into the air. As the ungainly looking birds quickly gained altitude the huge engine nacelles drooped forward to the horizontal and the rotor blades transformed into huge, relatively slow-turning propellers that powered the Ospreys out of sight. Flying away they looked more like strange apparitions than airplanes.

The hybrid MV-22 can take off and land like a helicopter and fly like an airplane at a top speed of 330 miles per hour. The Marine Corps says it can ferry 24 Marines at a time at twice the speed, three times the payload, and three to five times the range of a conventional rotorcraft.

Critics say it is cumbersome,

Call 602-793-9399 or Register at: www.systema.us prone to strange aerodynamic quirks that make it unstable in vertical flight and has a rate of descent into hot landing zones so slow that this makes it a tempting target. Even the Marine Corps says it is limited to a rather stately 800-feet per minute descent in conversion mode -- about 13 feet per second. In Vietnam it wasn't extraordinary for a hot Huey pilot to drop into an LZ at 2,500 feet per minute and then flair at three or four hundred feet of altitude to slow the bird down enough so it didn't crash into the ground. It was effective for minimizing time as a target and was always very exciting.

If the Marine Corps is wrong in its thinking, turbulent skies are ahead for the V-22 Osprey program. The Thunder Chickens are in their final workup at Marine Corps Air Station, Yuma in preparation for combat in Iraq and two more 10-ship squadrons are already in the fleet. Eventually, the Osprey is slated to replace all the Vietnam-era CH-46 Sea Knights and aging CH-53D Sea Stallion helicopters that have been laboring in Marine Corps aviation since the early Seventies. Currently, the Marine Corps doesn't have an alternative program to replace its ancient fleet of mediumlift helicopters except for UH-60 Blackhawk or some other off-theshelf airframe. If the fledgling Osprey doesn't fly, more than sick birds are going to fall from the nest.

When Medium Tiltrotor Squadron (VMM) 263 finishes training in late July, the Osprey has overcome its last big hurdle before sending the squadron into harm's way, Fugler said. Sometime before the end of September, 2007 the squadron will deploy to Al Asad Air Base in southern Iraq to begin a new chapter in the bloody history of vertical envelopment. The Thunder Chickens are scheduled for a sevenmonth deployment to support coalition forces in Iraq. VMM-263 is scheduled to field 10 Ospreys and approximately 170 Marines and sailors when it leaves for Iraq,

Fugler says.

"The mission is medium-lift assault support," said Lt. Col. Paul J. Rock Jr., VMM-263's commanding officer. "We carry combat troops, supplies and equipment across the spectrum of expeditionary operations."

Multi-Missions for Flying Leathernecks

In simple terms, Rock means the Thunder Chickens are expected to complete every mission the CH-46 Sea Knights are currently assigned to do. That means combat assaults, emergency medivacs, emergency resupply, and reinforcements and extractions under enemy fire. No doubt they will take hits. At the risk of terribly mixing metaphors, Iraq will be where the rubber meets the road for the untested Osprey.

Rock's job is a huge challenge. In addition to shepherding his unit through a combat tour, he has to both defend and promote an unproven concept. It is a tough

took off again an off-beat, twicebusted crew chief named Pfc. Raymond "Mike" Clausen earned the Medal of Honor saving wounded and trapped Marines from a mine field. The rest of the crew earned enough medals to need a sling load to carry them out. It is a tough act to follow.

Apparently difficulty inspires

Rock. After "routine" tours that included operations in the Middle East, eastern Africa and former Yugoslavia, he reported to Naval Air Station Patuxent River to get in on the cutting edge of the V-22 program. During his tour at the Navy's premier aerial test facility, he[#] qualified in the V-22 as an aircraft commander, check pilot, test pilot, and instructor pilot in about every phase of Osprey flying there is.

After several more assignments developing and training to fly and fight the Osprey, Rock went to the 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing in Al Asad, Iraq as the Wing's G-3 planner for future operations. When he returned home to New River last year he took over the transitional unit that ultimately became VMM-263. He is its first commanding officer. In September he will be the first Marine to lead an Osprey squadron into combat.

Proponents and critics alike are waiting with baited breath to discover whether Rock's Ospreys will swoop down like the fierce

Rock and the rest of the Marine Corps are sure they will soar. Whatever happens next, the Thunder Chickens' mission in Iraq ends more than 40 years of tiltrotor experiments that started with the Bell XV-3 program in 1951.

The X-3 made its first flight as a helicopter in August 1955, but crashed two months later before completing a full conversion. It was an inauspicious beginning for the program. The XV-3 was followed by the bizarre looking X-22 – a very distant cousin of the V-22, the CL-84 and the XV-15, which closely resembles the Osprey. After a rocky beginning including two fatal crashes that killed 26 men, the V-22 Osprey entered full production

Pioneers Die Young

The first and most serious accident occurred in April 2000 when a crash in Arizona killed 19 Marines. Another crash in Jacksonville, N.C. eight months later killed seven men. Following the second fatal crash, skeptics of the Osprey got their day in court. For a time even the staunchest supporters of the program feared its high cost, complexity, and what some naysayers claim is substandard operational performance threatened to shut down the program.

Despite their clamor, the Osprey passed its operational evaluation in the summer of 2005. The MV-22 proponent's argument that the Osprey's potential as a speedy, far over-the-horizon, vertical envelopment platform outweighs the unfortunate human cost of developing the program prevailed. The Department of Defense agreed. In September, 2005 DoD approved full scale production of the Osprey when Bell Boeing was granted approval for Full Rate Production (FRP) of the V-22 Osprey. Current plans include the delivery of 360 aircraft to the U.S. Marine Corps, 50 for the U.S. Air Force and 48 for the U.S. Navy.



The

FRP authorized Bell to increase its production from 11 aircraft per year up to 48.

There is nothing cheap about the Osprey program. Depending on who is talking, it is the most expensive weapons platform the Marine Corps has ever been bequeathed by the usually stingy Navy. In a service that usually spends its money developing Marines instead of machinery, the Osprey is an anomaly. The last time Marine Corps aviation got such an expensive new weapons platform all its own it was the AV8A Harrier the critics said would never fly. It too killed some stout-hearted Marine pioneers before it went operational, but its secondgeneration cousin is still dropping bombs today.

The safety issues fatalities during the

raised by the fatalities during the aircraft's early development have clouded its value and graduate earned his wings in 1989 and settled into the well-worn seat of a CH-46 Sea Knight for initial operational training before being assigned to. HMM-263, the squadron where the Thunder Chickens would one day be conceived. Even then – while known as the "Blue Eagles" – the squadron had an illustrious history. During the Vietnam War a squadron CH-46 named "Blood, Sweat and Tears" carried a brave crew into a hot LZ in always-dangerous **Ouang Nam Province to medivac** a wounded Marine. Before it made its future uncertain among some Congressional leaders who don't possess the vision to see the Osprey's potential. What is certain is that 26 brave men died during its development so the nation would remain on the cutting edge of aviation technology. Even so, those setbacks put the entire program under a microscope that is still sharply focused on the extraordinary airplane.

In the meantime the Corps labors on. Marine Medium Tiltrotor Training Squadron (VMMT) 204 that shares the flight line with VMM-263 at New River is churning out qualified pilots as fast as it can. Ospreys are constantly in the air around the base, whistling almost noiselessly through the scudding clouds. It was eerie to sense

something overhead and notice an Osprey passing by with its huge fans slowly churning the air. One observer noted they look like strange airships propelled by oversized paddles madly thrashing the ether: Poetic but accurate.

If the Osprey could only climb as fast as its price tag it would already be a legend. In 1986 the cost of

a single V-22 was estimated at \$24 million a copy for 923 aircraft. In 1989 the first Bush administration cancelled the project when it reached \$35 million each for 602 aircraft. Vice President Richard B. Cheney hated the Osprey so much when he was the

first President Bush's Secretary of Defense he tried to whack the program completely until Congress threatened to take him to court. Facing election pressure from Texas and Pennsylvania where the Osprey is built, Cheney finally authorized spending \$1.5 billion in fiscal years 1992 and 1993 to keep the program alive. He preferred helicopters with known quantities, he said.

Ironically the program was revived by President William J. Clinton's administration and has since survived almost 14 years of knife fights. Clinton authorized building 458 Ospreys for \$37.3 billion or more than \$80 million apiece. That spending plan authorized the Marines 360 Ospreys, the Navy 48 and the Air Force 50 and that is where things remain today.

Now it is up to the Marines and U.S. Air Force Special Operations pilots and crews to prove the Osprey concept works. Proof may be in the pudding, one old aviator said, but the real test is when the Osprey gets a taste of war and discovers whether it has an appetite for it.





U.S. RIFLE, CALIBER .30 M1

"The best battle implement ever devised?"

Well, General George S. Patton certainly thought so, as those were his words in describing the M1 rifle during the last days of World War II. They have been echoed a thousand times since.

Born in Canada on New Year's day 1888, John C. Garand soon emigrated to America where, as a young boy, he went to work sweeping floors in a New England textile mill. Fascinated with the machinery in the mill, John was a machinist by the time he was eighteen, and later was hired as a tool and gauge maker by Brown and Sharpe in Providence, Rhode Island.

As early as 1900, the quest for a selfloading rifle had begun, later resulting in several examples of the Model 1903 Springfield being converted to a semiautomatic rifle, as well as a dozen European designs being studied. With America's entry into the World War, John Garand moved to New York to work as a design engineer. He became interested in the heated controversy over the need for a light machine gun, and decided to design one. This marked the beginning of a great journey.

With the help of a financial backer, John Garand completed a firing model of his first machine rifle in June, 1918. The .30-06 caliber weapon used a 20round box magazine and was operated by a primer-actuated mechanism. It was shown to Hudson Maxim, brother of Hiram Maxim, who recommended that

it be presented to the Naval Consulting Board, which referred Garand and his backer to the Army. Although Major Julian S. Hatcher reported that rifle offered little improvement over other machine rifles, Garand took his rifle to the National Bureau of Standards. There, John Garand was allowed to use the Bureau's machine shop to further develop the rifle. After winning a legal battle with his backer over the design of the rifle, Garand was hired by the National Bureau of Standards as "master gauge and gun experimenter."

With the war ending in August, 1918, the Army had adopted the Browning Automatic Rifle along with the family of Browning machine guns, and showed no interest in other designs. Nevertheless, Major Lee O. Wright, of the Ordnance Department, was impressed by Garand and his light machine gun, and in 1919, had him transferred to the Springfield Armory where he could be helpful in the search for a self-loading rifle.

Because of the establishment of the new Ordnance Committee, specifications for a new self-loading rifle were established along the lines of the Model

1903 Springfield rifle, and John Garand had to keep his developments within them. From 1920 to 1925 Garand worked on several designs, all of which had one thing in common: They were actuated by the rearward movement of the cartridge primer. Thus the firing pin not only ignited the cartridge, but also operated the locking mechanism of the breech. However, development of this unique idea was brought to a halt by the refusal of the Ordnance Department to adopt a special cartridge.

It must be remembered that the .30-06 cartridge was developed when black powder rounds were still in vogue and as such, like the .50 BMG, was somewhat of holdover with its



large powder capacity. In 1925 the propellant of the .30-06 cartridge was changed from a fast burning one to a more progressive powder, which would not operate the primer activation device. In addition was the adoption of a crimped primer pocket that prevented any primer set-back. But that wasn't all.

The .27dersen

In 1924, John D. Pedersen, inventor

the WWI Pedersen Device for the '03 Springfield, had also contracted with the Army to develop a self-loading rifle and had proposed a change in ammunition to the .276 Pedersen, a 7x53mm cartridge. The .276 Pedersen cartridge (there were some 10 versions tested) fired a 120-grain bullet at 2550 fps. By today's standards, the .276 Pedersen was not a particularly effective cartridge for its size, but its limitations were due more to the propellants available at the time than anything else. Even so, it out-performed the 7.62x39mm (M43) cartridge developed by the Soviets during World War II, which is still used in the AK-47. Today, the .276 Pedersen could be loaded to perform measurably better than its original loading.

When Pedersen convinced the Ordnance Department to make this change, Garand was ordered to design a new rifle in .276 Pedersen caliber. From 1927 to 1931 the Garand and Pedersen rifles were tested against each other as well as other entries, and by 1931 the choice lay between the two.

The .276 Pedersen rifle was of retarded blowback design, using a toggle breech reminiscent of that used in the German PO8 ("Luger") pistol. In 1932 the Ordnance Committee recommended the adoption of the .276 Garand rifle over the Pedersen. This was

similar to the Garand design we know today -- a gas-operated semi-automatic



6 PENCILS \$175.00 POST PAID 12 PENCILS \$300.00 POST PAID rifle using a long-stroke piston operation and a two-lug rotating bolt. The .276 Garand used a 10-round en bloc clip. However, it was not to be.

General Douglas McArthur, Army Chief of Staff, refused to approve the change to the .276 cartridge saying, "To make this change will introduce an element of chaos, confusion, and uncertainty which, magnified under war conditions, would more than counteract the beneficial effect of any semiautomatic rifle." The General stopped work on the .276 and ordered renewed attention to the development of a .30 caliber semi-automatic rifle. One can only wonder where we would be today had the .276 Pedersen cartridge been adopted.

Because of this setback, the United States would have fought World War II with First World War rifles if not for the foresight of one man – John Garand. Following the debate over the .276 cartridge closely, Garand concluded that it would never be adopted. He secretly developed an alternate design of his rifle chambered for the .30-06 cartridge on his own time! General McArthur was delighted and John C. Garand's rifle was adopted in 1936 as the U.S. Rifle M1, caliber .30, just in time for World War II. Garand had saved the day.

A .276 Garand?

Would America have been better off with a M1 rifle in .276 Pedersen? We'll never know the answer to this question, but think about it. The .276 performed very well in the 300-meter world in which soldiers live and die. As such it would have been ideal in the Pacific Theater of operations, as well as the vast majority of scenarios encountered in Europe. We would have issued an M1 that was not only shorter by at least one-half inch and lighter by roughly one-half pound, but also one that held 10 rounds of ammunition with far less recoil. What's more, the soldier could carry more rounds of .276 ammunition at any given weight. In addition, as one noted writer recently pointed out, had we adopted the .276, we probably wouldn't be using a varmint cartridge today. It's interesting to note that the 6.8mm SPC

round now being tested by the USMC, U.S. Special Forces and the Canadian Army is close in size and performance to the .276 Pedersen.

As initially adopted, the M1 used a gas trap in front of the muzzle to operate its long- stroke gas piston/operating rod. This term has been bastardized in recent years. A gas trap is a system employed in a weapon which has NO gas port. Soon after the M1 was adopted, the gas-trap design was abandoned in favor of a gas port just behind the muzzle, from which gas was bled into the gas cylinder. As with all Garands, the M1 was loaded by inserting a clip of cartridges into the magazine from the top with the bolt locked to the rear. Once the clip was locked in the action, the bolt was automatically released to move forward to contact the head of the top round. Usually the operating rod handle was given a push with the palm of the right hand to unseat the first round and chamber it.

Although the M1 Garand was supplemented with 1903 Springfield bolt-action rifles in the months following the sneak attack on American forces on 7 December 1941, production increases soon saw the rifle issued to all branches of the service, as America's main battle rifle (MBR). However, the bolt action Model 1903A1 Springfield continued to supplement the M1 throughout the war.

An 8-round clip could be loaded into

the Garand's magazine in a second and all rounds fired within a space of three seconds. With sufficient logistics, the M1 could be loaded and fired 2 1/2 times faster than the Model 1903, and if supplies of loaded clips were exhausted, the rifle could be fired quickly by loading single rounds pulled from machine gun belts.

Of particular interest is the M1's one-piece, long-stroke gas piston/ operating rod. Long-stroke gas piston systems are, by their nature, more reliable than (most) short-stroke gas piston systems. This is because the long stroke gas piston becomes part of the bolt group and its kinetic energy contributes to the reliability of the weapon.

Far superior to the sights of all other U.S. Military rifles, those of the Garand not only have a greater radius, but also are fineclick adjustable, with the rear sight consisting of a peep aperture. Also of interest is the positive safety of the M1. Located at the front of the trigger guard, this safety is a logical one, i.e., pulling it to the rear "keeps bullets to the rear," and pushing it forward "allows bullets to go forward." When applied, this safety totally removes the hammer from sear engagement and locks it there.

As first issued, the M1 used essentially the same 16-inch bayonet as the 1903 Springfield, but with black plastic scales and a synthetic scabbard. Later in World War II this bayonet was shortened to a 10-inch blade with the same double-edge tip. existing 16-inch bayonets were shortened to 10 inches by cutting and recreating a double-edge tip similar to the original, or a simple clip point. An even shorter and simpler version was issued during the Korean War. The M1 could also use a grenade

In addition, most

launcher to launch various grenades with a special blank cartridge. Two types of winter triggers were also designed for the M1 to be used while wearing mittens.

M1 Modifications

Never resting on its laurels, the M1 continued to undergo a number of improvements, as well as experimental versions and specialpurpose versions. The M1E family included the M1E5, a short barreled M1 with an under-folding stock, which evolved into the T26 "Tanker" model, but neither was ever produced beyond prototype. Some M1s were converted to use the BAR 20-round magazine and to fire full automatic using a bipod. These modifications led to the program under which the M14 rifle was developed.

M1 Sniper and National Match Rifles

Two versions of the M1 that did see series production were the M1C and M1D Sniper Rifles. The M1C used a Griffin & Howe dovetailed side base, which was bolted to the left side of the receiver. The long dovetail used a Griffin and Howe mount with two locking levers and the M84 telescopic sight. The USMC version used Stith 1-inch rings that allowed it to use any 1-inch diameter commercial scope. The M1C was issued with a conical flash hider that attached to the bayonet lug.

The M1D used a special barrelmounted scope base with a threaded hole and a mount with a large thumbscrew. This mounting concept evolved into the receiver scope base used on the M14 rifle. The M1D was issued with a prong-type flash suppressor. Like the M1C, it was assembled with specially selected components and was hand-bedded in its stock. Both of these M1 sniper rifles served during WW II and Korea and from the experience in developing them was born the M1 National Match rifle, which became immensely popular in competition at the National Matches at Camp Perry, Ohio. The early M1 NM rifle (commonly referred to as the Type 1) used a number of specially selected parts including its barrel, operating rod, gas cylinder and stock.

The rifle was


bedded into the stock by hand-fitting and was identified by the letters "NM" and a star stamped on the left side of the gas cylinder, as well as the National Match cartouche stamped on the left side of the stock above the trigger.

Later National Match M1s (Type 2) were equipped with a 1/2 MOA adjustable rear sight and were also bedded into the stock with fiberalass. On the later version the letters "NM" are engraved (not stamped) on the left side of the barrel (without the star) above the gas cylinder. "NM" is also stamped on the top of the operating rod near the cocking handle, on the right side of the rear sight base and usually on the bottom rear of the gas cylinder. On this model, special fitting is also done to the gas cylinder and front handguard. All NM Garands also have lighter trigger pulls. No original NM markings were ever included on the receiver of a true National Match M1, but M1s rebuilt to NM specifications by the U.S. Navy and USMC may bear special identifying markings engraved on the left side of the receiver, including the caliber change to 7.62NATO. Next, what the troops think about the Garand. 🕱

WASHINGTON -- For three years, politicians and pundits have been challenging the president's policy of spreading democracy around the world. Can't be done, particularly in the Middle East, they tell us. Won't help to make us safer, they claim. It's become a mantra of the left. To support their assertion that democracy has reached inevitable limits, they cite problems in Afghanistan with a resurgent Taliban and, of course, the U.S. "failure" in Iraq. Both of these issues were raised repeatedly with President Bush during his news conference on the economy this week.

Despite evidence of progress on the ground in Iraq, the masters of the media intend to continue their barrage of defeatism, and the majority in Congress appear unwilling to desist in their attacks. The mainstream media all but ignored news releases from Iraqi and coalition commands on successes against both Iranian-backed terror cells in Baghdad's Sadr City and Al Qaeda's network in Northern Iraq, Salahuddin, Diyala and Anbar provinces.

Instead of covering these stories with in-depth reporting from the front, the potentates of the press launched a shock-and-awe campaign of their own. The target? The Iraqi Parliament -- for taking a monthlong recess in the midst of a war.

Perhaps the media and politicians who are so outraged that the Iraqi legislature is on vacation should learn a bit of history. The British Parliament recessed for all but one holiday -- the summer of 1940 -throughout World War II. In keeping with this democratic tradition, the U.S. Congress has done the same thing during every war we have fought, including our own Revolution.

Rather than firing barbs at the Iraqi legislature, critics should focus their ire on Capitol Hill. The 110th Congress, led by Sen. Harry Reid and Speaker Nancy Pelosi, is setting new records for irresponsible behavior. Though they have found time to launch more than 600 investigatory hearings, our good senators and congressmen fled Washington this week for a month in the sun without passing any of a dozen appropriations bills, including those needed to support our troops in the field. This week, the shipment of new armored vehicles, necessary to protect U.S. soldiers from deadly Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs), was postponed for lack of funding.

Little of this congressional misfeasance -- or its consequences -- made its way onto the front pages of major U.S. newspapers or the network news. Nor was anything but scant attention paid to a recent nationwide USA Today/Gallup Poll showing the proportion of those who believe that additional U.S. troops are making the situation better in Iraq rose to 31 percent. That's up from 22 percent a month ago. Those who said it was not making much difference dropped from 51 percent to 41 percent.

Å shift in public opinion this significant would be hyped in any political campaign -- and likely make the pundits take notice. Instead, almost to prove the people wrong, we have been treated to yet another avalanche of headlines and lead stories bemoaning bad things in Iraq. "Five More Boycott Iraq Cabinet Sessions," said an Associated Press headline. "Iraqi Political Crisis Worsens," screamed ABC News. "26 U.S. Troops Killed in 1 Week in Iraq," blared a CBS headline. The Washington Post ran, "Weapons Given to Iraq Are Missing."

The Bush administration has, up to now, been able to alter the negative editorial perspective of those who decide what will and will not be reported about this war. For the past six months, that task has fallen to Gen. David Petraeus. He certainly has tried.

During an exclusive interview this week on FOX News Radio's Alan Colmes Show, Colmes asked the general bluntly, "Is the surge working?" His reply: "It is. We are making progress. We have achieved tactical momentum in many areas, especially against Al Qaeda in Iraq, and to a lesser degree against the militia extremists. We're also heartened by the number of Iraqi tribes and local?citizens who have rejected Al Qaeda."

Asked whether Iraqis could take

over their own security, the general replied, "They have actually taken over security in a number of different places . If you look at Samawa, Nasiriyah, Najaf, Karbala -- we hardly have any forces in those locations at all."

Though Alan Colmes is anything but a shill for the Bush administration, his liberal media colleagues simply ignored these previews of what Gen. Petraeus will tell Congress in September. One can only conclude that they don't want the American people to get any good news from the battlefield.

It's time to face facts. The American media simply isn't going to march in step with this war. My eight trips, embedded with U.S. units, letting our troops tell the story, haven't been enough. Having the battlefield commander tell the story hasn't worked. Neither have video conferences from the Situation Room, talking points issued by the Pentagon or news conferences such as this week's from the White House press room.

There is, however, a way to reach the American people while our Congress is on vacation. Chief Executive George W. Bush can't do it from Washington or his dad's place in Kennebunkport, Maine. After kissing French President Nicholas Sarkozy on the cheek and taking him out to fish, Commander in Chief George W. Bush needs to jump on Air Force One and fly to Iraq.

Now is the time to change the paradigm, Mr. President. Your visit will confound America's adversaries and reassure our allies. The troops will be forever grateful. And most Americans will admire you for going because it's the right thing to do.
