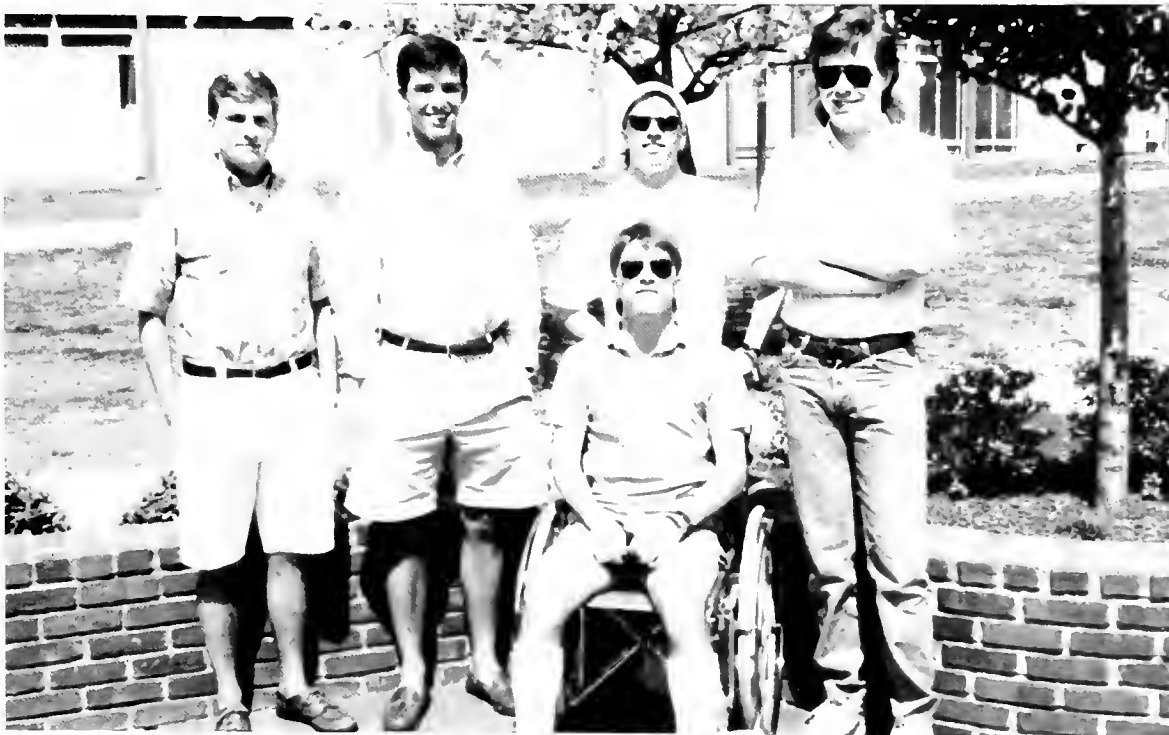


# BAPTIST CAMPUS MINISTRIES

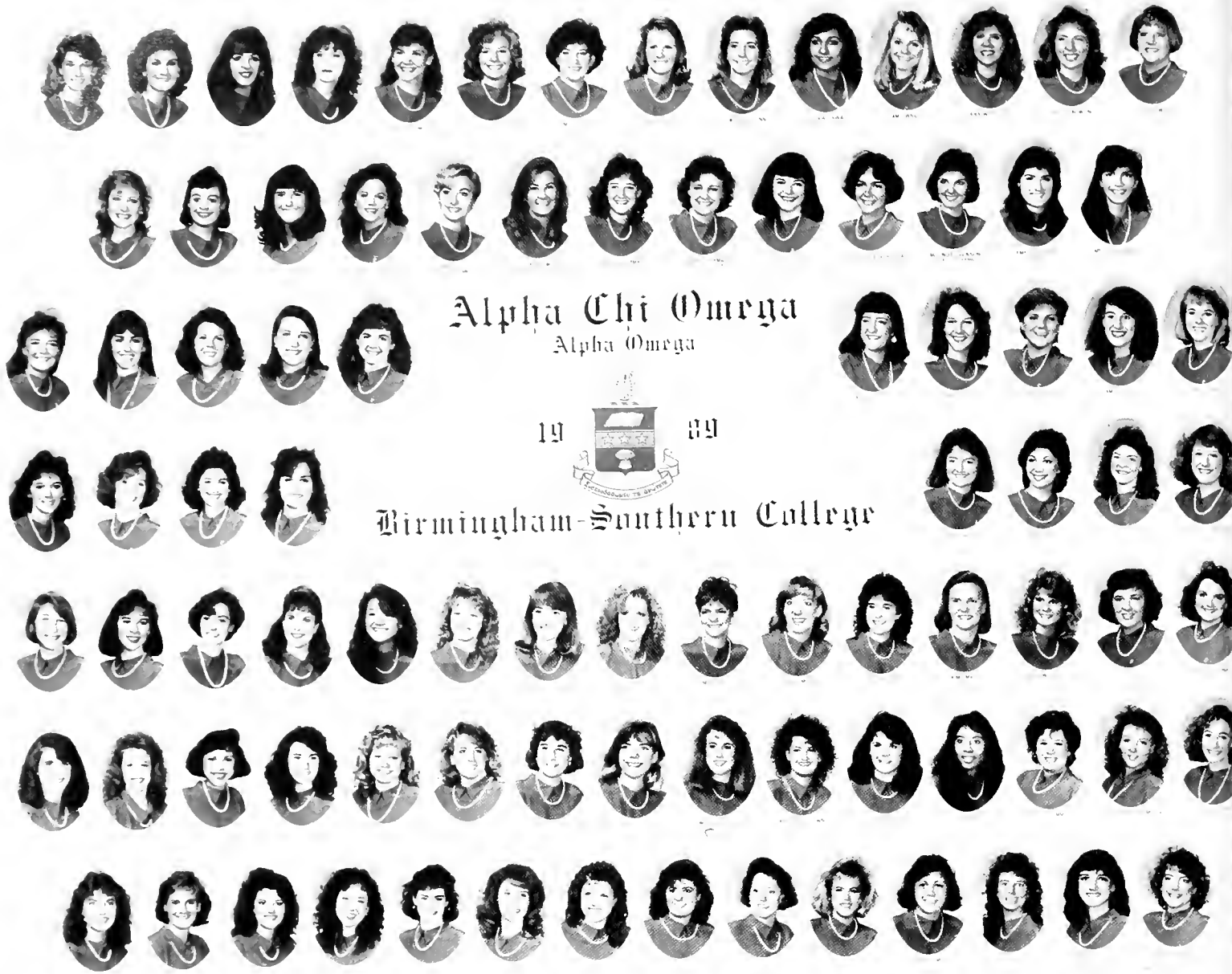

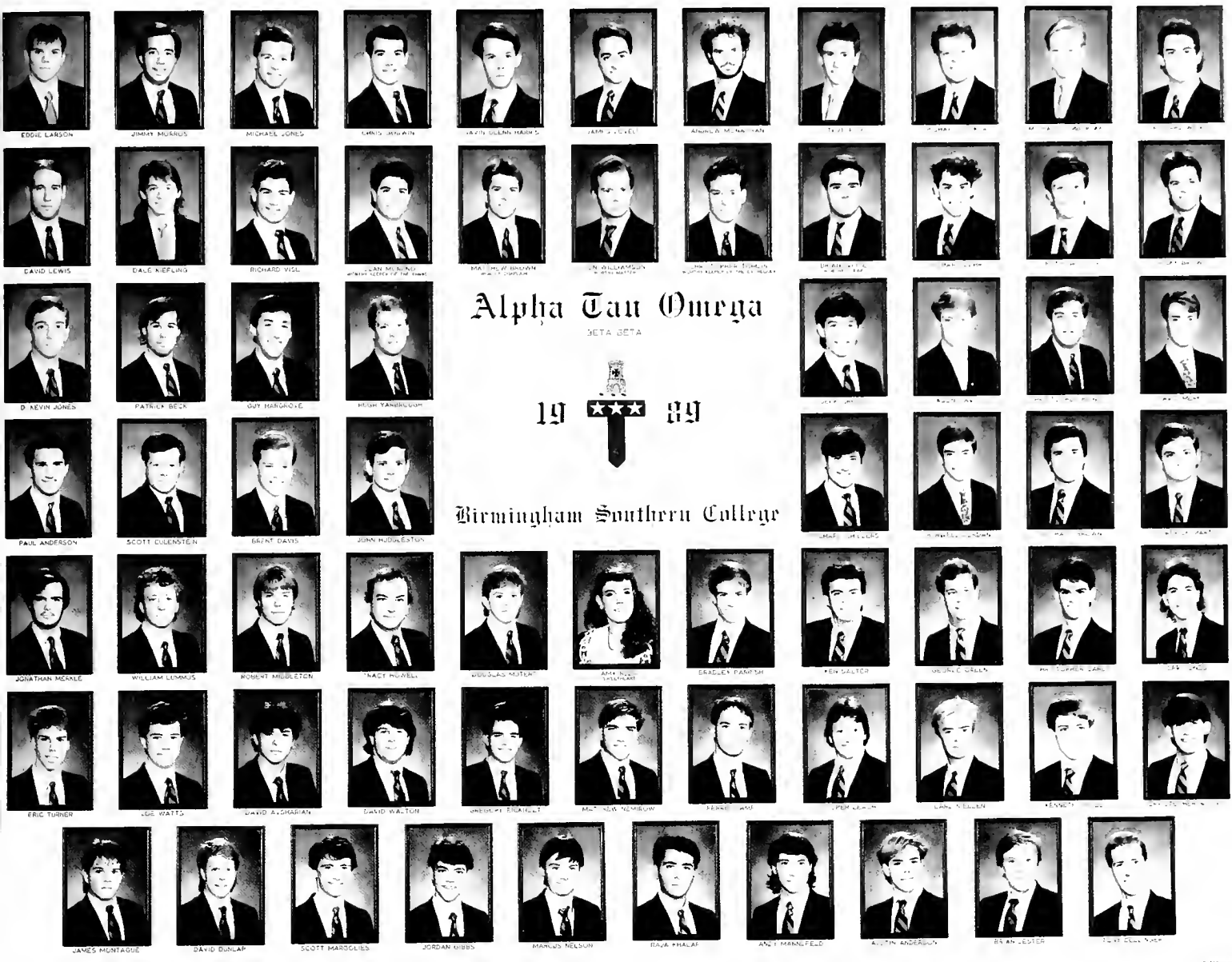


## ZETA TAU ALPHA

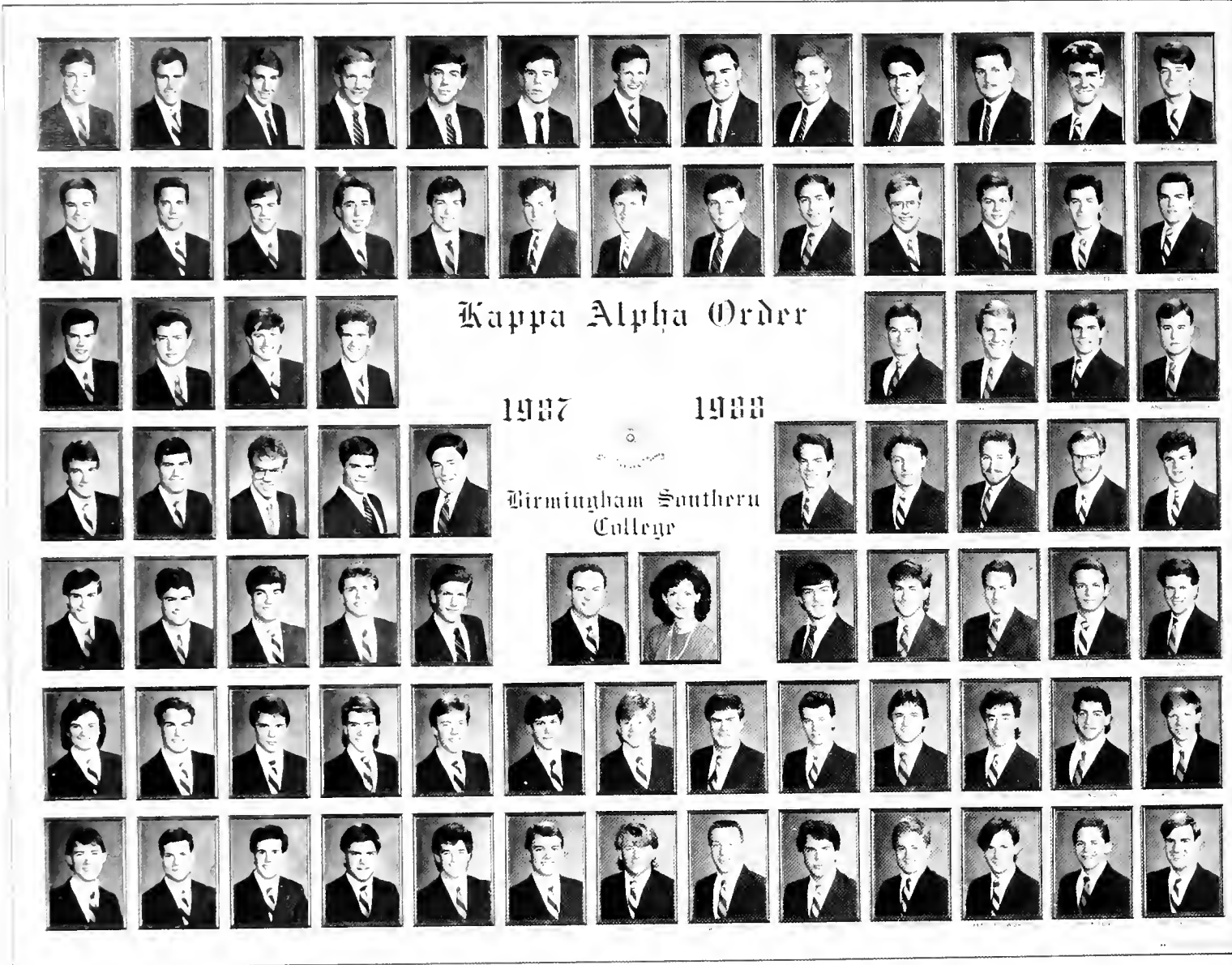

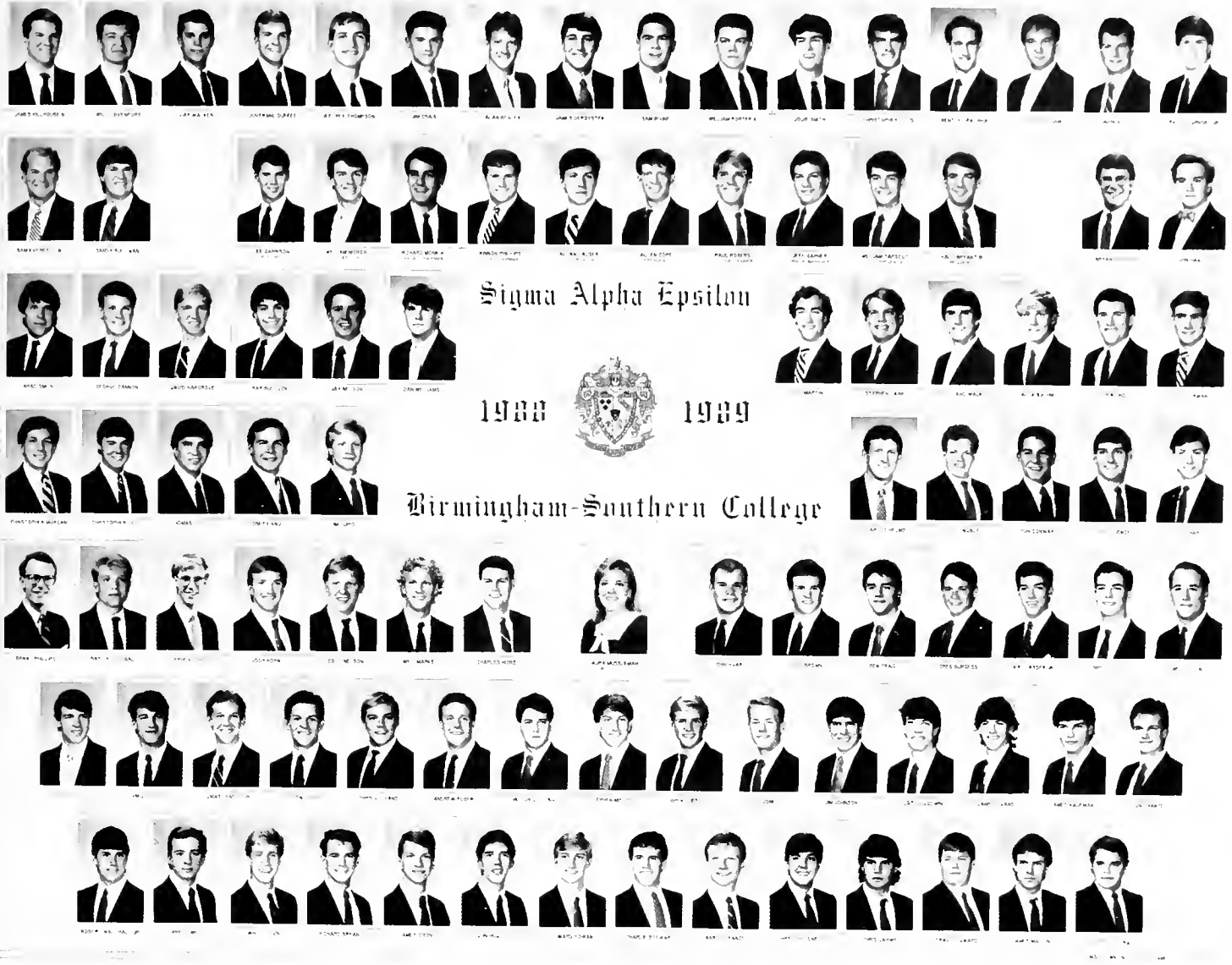
# KAPPA ALPHA ORDER

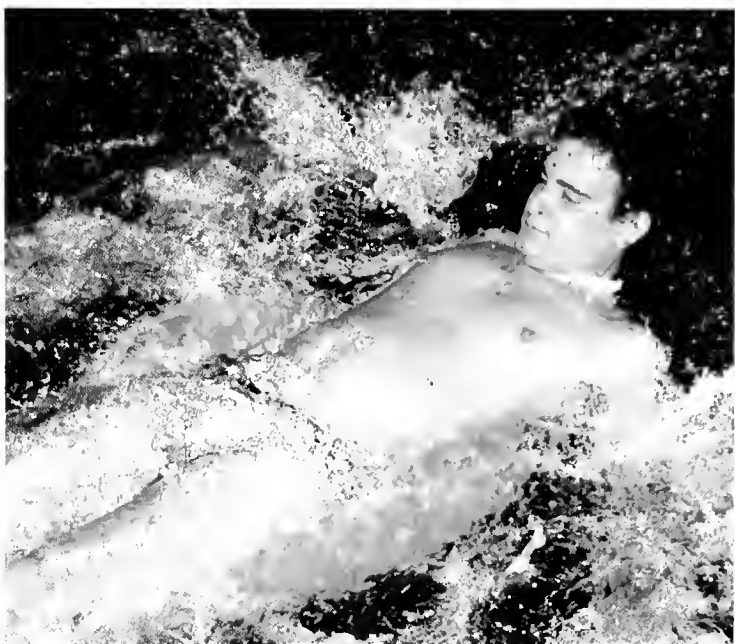
# GREEK WEEKEND

# EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Never before have I been so glad to be through with something. The thing which I have completed is the 1989 SOUTHERN ACCENT. I am sure that the members of my staff will agree that working on this yearbook has been one of the most difficult tasks attempted during the past school year. Working on the SOUTHERN ACCENT is very time consuming with little in the way of reward or recognition for that time. Of course, we receive monetary compensation for our time but it really doesn't make up for the things that we give up to work on the yearbook. For instance, time that could be spent studying, relaxing, or playing. Collectively the yearbook staff receives only \$433 a month in salary. That salary has to be divided among five staff members. The salary, also, doesn't make up for the huge amount of stress that is felt by every member because he knows that he is responsible for a publication that will be seen by 1500 of his peers.

These students have grown accustomed to having the best of everything. Unfortunately the best cost more money than the SGA is willing to expend on yearbook publication.

So with a very tight budget and a staff of four I set out to produce a book that would please the student and yet fall within my budget limitations. I cut out about 75 pages from the book to bring it under budget. I managed to keep the same amount of color pages as has been in the book in the past. I decided that a yearbook should be a picture book of a year of school activities. Keeping with this theme, I trimmed copy down to the bare essentials making more room for photographs. I, also, eliminated filler elements such as feature stories. This book is essentially a year in pictures at Birmingham-Southern. This book represents untold hours of hard work by myself and my staff. It is not the best yearbook ever produced but I can honestly say that we did our best to make it better than our resources would allow and I think we did.

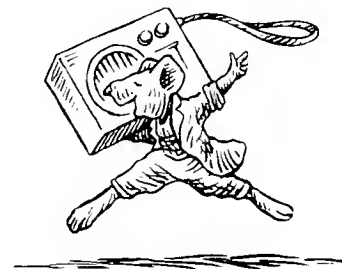
