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TUCKER RECORDS

According to the chart sent to me by Mrs. Holcomb, this search is for Rev. Willis Tucker and his son, Rev. Willis Cass Tucker, and their son and grand son, Richard M. Tucker, who was born in Sept. 1839. The only Willis Tucker I have been able to find of record anywhere, and I have examined many records, was the one of Cherokee County, Georgia. Most of the records of that county have been destroyed, so I was informed. The name is of record there on the deed books around 1842, which would be too late to fit this search, if the figures given in the chart as to dates are correct.

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A glance at the following records will show that to follow up, or even attempt to follow up all Tucker records in Georgia would entail an expense running up into several thousand dollars.

TUCKER RECORDS.

The following filed claims for Revolutionary service in South Carolina:

Benjamin, William, Joseph, John, Simon, Wood, David, Tudor Thomas (or Thomas Tudor) and Henry.

NOTE: This name is far too frequent of record in South Carolina for a research worker to do more than view the most important and interesting records in searching for a specific lineage connection. No attempt has been made to take all records on this name; otherwise the expense would run upward of several thousand dollars.

William Tucker, of Orangeburg - Will dated 13th. Sept. 1778. Sons, John, William and Isaac; daughter, Mary Tucker, all minors; nephews, William and John Tucker, also minors. Exor. Jacob Saylor, Philip Pearson and James Taylor, with son of testator, John Tucker, when old enough. (Charleston Wills, copied Vol. 19, page 242)

Mary Tucker - Receipt dated 2 Aug. 1792 - "Bermuda - "Received this 2nd. day of Aug. 1792, of my daughter, Elizabeth Shroudy, the sum of 25 pounds.....for a negro girl known by the name of Nancy." (Misc. Records 34, page 744, Hist. Comm. Columbia, S. C.)

Richard Tucker, dec'd. Sale of his personal property 23 April 1783; purchasers were: Mary Tucker (bought most of goods); Robert Willis, Wm. Hughs, Jeremiah Taylor, Joseph Sims, and Samuel Luckey. (Camden S. C. - Kershaw County Probate Records, Book A, page 95)

Lavinia Tucker, "Mrs." - Died at her residence in Laurens Dist., on 16th. ult., Consort of Gen. S. Tucker; age 86 years. (Laurensville Herald, Aug. 31, 1855)

Lavinia Tucker - Will dated 17 Dec. 1842; Legatees were: Her sister, Nancy, wife of Jas. B. Higgins; sister, Lavinia Moss; sister, Nancy Fowler and her son, Wm.
