Utica

UTICA, the "Forest City," dates back to old Fort Schuyler of Revolutionary days. It was incorporated as a city in 1832, with a population of 9.000. To-day it numbers 60,000 inhabitants. Because of Utica's central location in New York State, it is sometimes called the "Hub." Its altitude is 410 feet above sea level, and this fact, together with its excellent water supply, renders Utica a most healthful community. The city has a first-class street-car service, good schools, and fine churches.



Utica ranks high as a manufacturing city, and has unusual shipping facilities, boasting six railroads running in all directions.







ST. VINCENT INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL --- RUIGER STREET For destitute and truant children of Oneida and adjacent counties










