
The "INTERCOM" Editions (starting with number one identified as "A") is in fact quite similar to our MStatic Room" and "Glass Arm" editions of the past.

A WIRELESS WHODUNIT

The very first occasion in which wireless was used to apprehend a criminal took place in the year

It was in July of that year that a most notorious British murderer by the name of Crippen escaped the clutches of Scotland Yard and fled to Belgium. There Dr. Crippen and his inamorata who had been his nurse and secretary, obtained passage on the Pacific Mail Liner MONTROSE in Antwerp. They set sail for Canada, sure that they had successfully evaded the law.

For the voyage, his secretary and nurse had cut her hair short and had disguised herself as a boy to allay suspicion. They kept strictly to themselves aboard ship and avoided all familiarity or social amenities with any of the passengers or ship's officers while walking on deck. They had all of their meals served to them in their stateroom and never entered the dining saloon.

The ship's captain observed their rather peculiar behavior and he was not at all convinced that the boy was really a boy at all. He communicated with his home office by wireless and described the doctor and his nurse (the 'boy').

The home office in return immediately sent him a detailed description of Dr. Crippen and his nurse, adding that they were wanted for murder. With this information in hand the Captain was convinced that the two of them were the fugitives and so informed his office.

Upon receiving this information, Chief Inspector Drew of Scotland Yard immediately sailed on the SS LAURENTIC, a vessel much faster than the MONTROSE.

Then began what seemed a transatlantic race between the two ships. It is interesting to note that the situation was known to the whole world by wireless, though the two fugitives had no inkling that the news of them was being flashed to all quarters of the globe and that the world at large was enthralled by the thrilling knowledge that the escapees were crossing the Atlantic in hot pursuit by Scotland Yard, and secure in their belief that they had successfully escaped and that their identities were completely unknown!

However, immediately upon their arrival in Canada they were arrested by Chief Inspector Drew, much to their astonishment, whereupon they were immediately returned to England to stand trial for murder.



WORLDRADIO has given us permission to reprint Leonore Jensen's article about 'Prexy' Jim. We think our members will enjoy reading it.



A no-code license? Jim Brown, W6VH, objects strongly! But no wonder. As the recently-elected president of the Society of Wireless Pioneers, he has good reason to know the value of CW. And we have good reason to respect his judgement; he's had a distinguished career, even a judgeship.

As for code, he believes, "Every radio amateur should acquire proficiency. We never know when we'll need it. Besides, we should not hand out licenses on a silver platter, as it were. The knowledge of code has always been a matter of pride to amateurs—a sort of glue binding us all together."

The more than 3,600 members of the

The more than 3,600 members of the Society have all actually earned a living with CW, especially as ship or shore operators. They are dedicated to perpetuating the history and traditions of wireless telegraphy.

James Harvey Brown wears many different "hats". It all started in a high school electricity class in 1920, when he was inspired to earn a commercial ticket. He accomplished that the following year, then gained his Amateur Radio license early in 1922. "As you know, there wasn't even a W before the number 6 in those days." He had both 6BKI and 6VH, finally settling for the

His dream of being a sea-going Chief Operator came true with passenger ships, such as the Ecuador, President Wilson, the Harvard and the Yale. Exciting

After 2½ years, he operated "on the beach" near San Francisco at KFS, the shore station of the Federal Telegraph Company At first, there were spark transmitters. Later, they operated from Daly City, keying the big rig at Palo Alto which fed antennas on towers on the salt flats.

Streams of messages would flow from ship and shore alike. He would wear earphones, "cans," with 600 meters on one ear and 2400 on the other — monitoring both frequencies simultaneously and handling as many as 200 messages at a stretch. Of particular challenge were the Japanese passenger ships bound for South America but stopping at San Francisco. Hours of traffic would come in English letters but Japanese words!

Moving to Long Beach, he picked up a new cap, that of a disc jockey at KFOX. He ran the board and played specially-selected records every single day, seven hours a day, for 2½ years. Jim gathered a lot of Hollywood fans, (including Bing Crosby, as well as singer/writer Harry Barris, who became a good friend). Then he served many years at KFAC/KFVD, Los Angeles, arriving at NBC Hollywood in 1937.


Meanwhile, he'd been seriously thinking about still another kind of hat and finally took the plunge in 1934 by enrolling in how school in his "off hours." Diligence was rewarded in 1939 when he was admitted to the bar.

Across the street from NBC, he opened a law office but continued his work as an engineering supervisor. Jim even becampresident of the engineers' union, now known as NABET.

Everything was interrupted by the war The Navy presented a new hat in 1943. He became a designer of Airborne IFF and radar beacons. But after peace was declared, he returned to NBC and his law practice. The latter won out, having become quite heavy.

His interest in his fellow man and his concern for civic affairs led to a big step. James Harvey Brown was urged to run for the Los Angeles City Council, a most important post. He served six years, representing the populous Hollywood area as well as a large section of the big city. One accomplishment was helping the city convert a crime-ridden slum into space for the great Dodger Stadium. It changed a costly area into a decided asset for the city.

Also, Jim chaired the committee which set up the city's centralized computer system as well as countless other vital projects. For instance, he was chairman of the State, County and Federal Affairs Committee which

meant many trips to Sacramento, representing the city to the state government. Financial problems were also among his special assignments.

With such a rich background, it was not surprising when he was appointed to the Los Angeles Judicial District as a municipal judge in 1964. His experience was to be varied: years in traffic court, speaking with hundreds of citizens daily . . long trials, such as a Laetril case in which his judgement was verified later by the U.S. Supreme Court . . . a long series of Black Panther preliminary examinations . . . and the typical heavy schedule of routine cases.

Even after retirement, he was called by the Department of Motor Vehicles to be special consultant for the new system of traffic trials, increasing efficiency.

Meanwhile, there was always that one important hat to wear as often as possible—the Amateur Radio operator. Proud of his ability with a key, he still divides his time between phone and code. W6VH always has "high and low" band mobile rigs so he can keep in touch with his many friends. "I've been so fortunate, I've had so many amateur neighbors! Meaning, I've kept skeds with many close friends I've never had the pleasure to meet in person, plus so many long-time pals I can see frequently."

His attractive wife, Margaret, accompanies him to many club functions, such as those of the 50 Club (a group of professional people who are also amateurs), QCWA, OOTC, Morse Telegraph Club and other amateur groups. They also attend the prestigious events of the Pacific Pioneer Broadcasters. He is a former officer of the California Judges Association, as well.

Judge Brown retains his strong feelings about "the ballot box." He urges us all to take a greater interest in government matters.



UNIQUE QSP BY BLINKER

OR

BEWARE OF OPEN PORTHOLES By Matthew Camillo - 750-SGP



I was R/O on the SS ELBA/KKB of the Morgan Line bound from Galveston to New York, in January, 1920. Traveling northward along the southern Florida coast we could see people swimming off the beaches, even though, like southbound ships which hug fairly close to shore so as to avoid the strong Gulf-Stream current, we were taking advantage of the strongest flow of the current and were some few miles away. At the same time that the sun was shining brightly and there was little or no breeze to disturb the almost glassy surface, there were nevertheless heavy rolling swells coming in from some remote storm far to the east.

I grabbed my bucket, a towel and some hard-water soap and went aft for a salt-water bath, leaving my shack door and porthole open because of the balminess of the air. Like many freighters and tankers of that era, the ELBA had a scarcity of fresh water which was hoarded for use in boilers, for cooking and drinking, so that such a luxury as a fresh water shower (such as when it rained) was almost unknown to the crew.

Because the snip was rolling to a considerable extent in the heavy ground swell, I should have been forewarned of what happened, but if any caution crossed my mind, I brushed it aside. Be things as they were, when I returned to the radio shack, what a dismal sight met my eyes. A particularly heavy roller had hit the side of the ship and broke, thus sending a wall of seawater against the bulkhead outside the shack and, of course, into the door and the porthole.

There was more than two inches of water inside and my 106D and P5-RCA spark transmitter was soaked and dripping. I used my bucket to bail the water out and then, doing as best I could to dry off the bake-lite rods, etc., the primary and secondary helix and other components, I cautiously put the transmitter on low power.

For a few minutes nothing happened and all was calm except that there was no output at all. Then I began to see wisps of smoke coming from the rods; the wisps grew to belches, and I turned off the power. The salt water had done its worst.

The next day there was no improvement, and upon examination I saw that the quenched and rotary gaps were caked with damp salt. Even after I did what I could to remove this nasty stuff, I could still get no output from the transmitter. Now I was becoming

mighty nervous and jittery because I could hear WSC calling me - the receiver was luckily bone dry - and I had some traffic for him. What to do?

Now that the ship was north of Hatteras, the January weather had suddenly struck us with a vengeance. In the cold, blustery wind I went topside to the flying bridge and spoke to the third mate. The night air was clear but bitter cold.

We saw a ship coming our way out of New York.
Using the blinker, I signaled "what ship?" His reply,
coming promptly, was "SS BOSTON CITY/GDSB."

How can I ever forget that night? I told GDSB our transmitter was out of order but receiver working okay, and that WSC had traffic for us - and I had a docking message for him - "Would you please take the message and QSP to WSC, and tell him that I can hear him loud and clear, and to go ahead to me - I would copy. . . "

We were making about 15 knots and the BOSTON CITY was doing about 12, so that it didn't take long for him to pass us. However, he QSLd my blinker message and I immediately took off for the shack to listen. It was not long before I heard GDSB give the message to WSC, and then WSCs QSL. Then I heard "KKB de WSC QSY 700 mtrs," and there I was. "Recd msg ok fm GDSB. Hr 2 msgs for KKB."... and he sent each one twice to be sure I got them. I rushed up to the bridge as fast as I could in the dark. We were now some distance from the BOSTON CITY but not too far for him to catch my blinker signal: "OK on msgs please tell WSC many thanks and to you too for QSP 73 GN."

I went up to the office after the ELBA was docked. I handed in a report of what happened, to Mr. Dexter, who was in charge of the operators. (He was chief electrician for the Morgan Line, which operated its own rasio systems in its 30 ships, three of which carried passengers: the SS MOMUS/KKM, the SS CREOLE/KKR, and the SS COMUS/KKD. There were also two tankers, one of which was among the world's largest at that time, the SS TAMIAWA, 150,000 barerels capacity. The rest were freighters. Mr.Dexter did the hiring of R/Os; while I was with the Line I never heard of him firing anyone. One of the ships was equipped with cw. Later, the Line had the SS DIXIE built for them, an ultramodern ship (for that time), which had cw but not short-wave, which was practically unheard-of then. The hams had cw and spark around 200 meters.)

Anyway, Mr.Dexter complimented me on my quick thinking which, as he remarked, "saved the day."



One of our great handicaps which discourages membership here is the heavy cost of sending remittances (such as annual membership fees) via the postal system or private banks, which in a lot of cases cause irritation by long delays when one is sending money overseas.

Now, I am happy to say that these delays no longer exist as the Australian Commonwealth Bank now has a branch in New York (see cheque herewith) and now Australian SOWP members can send remittances via the New York branch* without the former hassle which was rather costly.

You speak of Ensign J.M.O'Niell*and Ralph Hazleton who served on the USS MILWAUKEE. My memory is not too good at 88, but the name Hazleton*sounds familiar. At the time - January-February, 1917 - the MILWAUKEE was undergoing repairs and overhaul at Mare Island Navy Yard with just a skeleton crew aboard, the rest on leave including the C.O. We were at short notice ordered to proceed to Samo Beach. Eureka, Cal. to try and pull the Submarine H-3 off the beach where she had gone aground. At that time the MILWAUKEE'S radio crew consisted of a Chief (I can't remember his name), a Radioman, and myself. The Radioman's name was Frank Field (deceased). I stood the last watch on the MILWAUKEE, flashing messages back and forth to the H-3's radioman who had set up a spark-gap transmitter in a tent on the beach, until the heavy pounding of the now doomed MILWAUKEE broke through its hull and flooded the engine room, cutting off all power.

Years ago this story was written up in the ELECTRICAL WORKERS JOURNAL of the IBEW. I have forgotten if I ever sent this story to SOWP or not.







TO THE EDITOR:

17 JANUARY, 1981

It's dues time again, so I am sending along \$25 for three years, and, like all OLD TIMERS, I hope it's not the last. At 77, I don't feel quite as spry as I used to.

The last issue of SPARKS JOURNAL sure brings back a pile of memories. The list of SOS signals including the one of the PRESIDENT PIERCE and Capt. Fred P. Willarts, reminded me of my first trip to the China coast on the SS GRAYS HARBOR, with F. P. Willarts as chief mate. He and I, as Purser/Radio operator, became quite good friends. On the next trip, Willarts, a first-class navigator, became the captain. We left Seattle for Shanghai, and instead of going through the Japanese Inland Sea, Fred decided to cut the trip short by a couple of days by going through the Hakodate Straits. After entering the Straits we ran into peasoup fog; the visibility was about 300 feet. It was too late to turn around, and with the whistle blowing and the chief engineer cursing, we kept going.

About four hours later the fog lifted and, believe it or not, we were in the center, and two-thirds through the Strait. Captain Willarts said it was good navigation, but the chief engineer said it was just plain luck.

Later on we entered Foochow Harbor (so-called) and dropped anchor. That evening I received warning of a typhoon from JOC which advised that the storm was off the South China coast and moving toward Foochow. The captain decided to remain at anchor, but the chief engineer wanted to lay off shore. We stayed at anchor. The typhoon changed its course, as these monstrous storms often do, and struck the lower end of Honshu Island. During the remainder of the trip the skipper and the chief did not talk to each other at all. We proceeded through the Philippines, Borneo, the Dutch East Indies, etc. while the two said not a word to each other!

On another trip we went through the center of a typhoon between Formosa and Honshu Island. We lost half of the bridge and two lifeboats, plus some deck cargo of lumber. After passing through the dead-calm eye of the typhoon, with the barometer down almost to 27inches, we got hit with winds from another quarter. Then I received an SOS from a Chinese coaster, saying they had a broken rudder chain and were broaching in

heavy seas. I gave their latitude and longitude to the bridge, and the ship's course was changed to their apparent location. The skipper said we about 80 miles from the distressed ship and we were making about three knots against head winds. At that rate it would have been up to twenty hours sailing time.

An hour later, the Chinese vessel called with a very loud signal, advising that they had set up a jury rudder and were working at rudder repairs; they said they were no longer in real trouble and therefore the SOS was canceled.

Funny things happen sometimes. A few minutes later I was looking out of a porthole when I saw a steamer off our starboard side apparently headed on a course parallel with us. The view lasted just a few seconds and then disappeared in the spindrift mist. I called the bridge and asked if they had seen the steamer. Answer: negative. Then I asked the Chinese vessel if they had seen us; again negative. The captain then called down and asked if I had been drinking something?

Shortly after that the troubled vessel called and advised they had repaired the rudder chain and were OK. It was not easy to understand the Chinese operator's mangled English.

The typhoon blew off the beading and trim around the ship. This decorative material offers no edge to restrict the wind. At least you would think so, but we decided that due to air trapped under ten or more coats of paint, and what with the very low pressure, the beading was actually blown off by air expansion!

I spent about ten years as radio operator, most of it at sea with the Grace Line, the States Steam-ship Co., Alaska Steam, Northland American Mail, Transportation, and the Canneries, selling gasoline to trollers of the Quilliute River area on their radio-equipped barges, etc. After that I went to Bur Air Commerce, the CAA and FAA for 30 years, most of it in Alaska. Many good and bad trips and some in between; all of it has left me with yards- even miles of memories and experiences.

SMALL WORLD

By JOSEPH E. (Josey) PUCKETT* 1792-SGP

SS POWHATAN/KQY named for relative of member JOEY PUCKETT of Oklahoma. Joey sends'73' to Youse and the Brass Pounders--present and past. His interesting letter of 'yesteryears' take us back in history to times we have nearly forgotten. We publish Joey's letter for its nostalgic flavor of the past.

Thank you so much for the Christmas Card that came today. It means even more to me than most of the members BECAUSE the ship was named for one of my ancestors. My dad was born in Indiana in 1863. He said that one branch of his family said that one pair of their ancestors was John Rolf and Pochantus-(daughter of Chief Powhatan... ONE of My great grandpapas, though most folk would not identify me as part Indian. I am part Cherokee and part Delaware. Some of my peoples were earlier Americans than the Mayflower passengers. Then, too, I have so enjoyed the picture of the Radio Shack.

Some of the things I can identify right off. The combination of Motor-Generator, the storage batteries, the Spark Gap and coil, what appears to be LYDEN JARS and a Helix. At N.S.S. we had a Helix. that filled one large room with the spark gaps attached. The faces of the breakers were renewed quite often by sodering dimes on the BREAKER mechanism. Then there are a number of coils that have individual leads instead of a continuous variable. I can see a rheostat at the end of one housing that must contain one or more coils. Then the key and headset. I can make out two double pole single throw switches.

At Annapolis we had some double and single blade switches that were mostly single throw and some of these had copper blades more than a yard long. When you opened or closed these switches you just didn't fool around-or you would have had just a two hand switch handle in your hands. We ran 380,000 volts with 625 Amps off the 24,000 pound antenna that was suspended from 610 ft. steel towers. I was glad that those towers were not one legged and made of wood. We climbed those 3 legged steel towers hand over fist the year around and in winter the frozen Chesapeak Bay fog was slicker than 'eel legs. Some mornings which made our trip up and down filled with: "Maybeso you will not slip TOO, much this time!" I hope! When that ice was melting just a wee bit it was plenty slick, I can tell you right off. I can! At that time, maybeso even yet already NSS was the most powerful transmitting station what was. Last picture I saw of NSS was in a magazine and they had added two more towers to the 4 we had back in 1918—1919. I'd admire to hear from some one who is stationed there now or have been since I left there in April 1919. We had two pedstal arc transmitters at NSS then.

A swab by the name of CUILIN from Craig County Oklahoma got blown into a hospital just before I got to that station. He was a bit lax in opening the combustion chamber on one of those transmitters and opened it TOO SOON and got blown (AND BURNED) and was hospitalized when a draft of about a dozen new swabs with 3rd grade crows reached Annapolis from Harvard by way of the 'Philla' Navy Yard. Cullin was an alright 'swab' and he had a lot of new skin on his face and hands when he came back to the station.

Ya don't just knock on the door of one of those Big arc transmitters. Ya gotta wait till the pressure has gone down or ELSE. With Cullin he didn't wait long 'nough and the thing went blooy right fast when the last of many large TAPS-nuts were removed that usually were kept in place until it was safe to remove 'em by God!. We brought in 6,600 volts from some place and stepped that up to scads of juice, and mixed it with in some amps and watts & stuff. I've seen the STATIC jump 10 ft. from the guy lines and set the dead grass afire. That stuff was quicker than a wagon load of gun-powder at the second battle of BULL RUN! I carried mail over 30 years and one of my patrons was wounded at the Battle of Gettysburg. He showed me the scar where the bullet entered his right wrist and skidded up the bones to near the elbow. Seems the powder up thar was a mite quick, too. He passed away end of 1932. Grandpa NAIR, as every one called him. Another time I was riding my bicycle in my home town when I was a teen ager and a veteran of the Civil 'WAH was crossing the street in BIG CABIN. I saw I was about to hit him so we started dodging each other and we came up with a tie. I run my bike's front wheel twixt his legs and we all piled up on the cross walk. I think that he said unkind things about me and some of my ancesters! I didn't hang around for a re-play of what he said, I didn't.

There used to be more of those guys that wore the blue or the gray

in our neighborhoods then, that were 'possums up a gum stump. They are all gone now and I'm most 81 my very own self. I've been shot by a farmer because me and some of my buddies were in his watermellon patch one night. I've been bitten by a full grown copper head, scared by a long string of a few thousand long horns from Texas on their way to a rail head in Kansas, lived among the Cheyennes and Arapahos in a dugout on the second or outer banks of the Washata, in the teepees to the 610 ft. towers at NSS. Had more fun and less profit than a MULE-MAN at an Indian square dance!! (MULE-MAN was the seller of WHITE-MULE for 50¢ a pint) at those early dances among the half civilized Cherokees back when the world was young. And mainly I've had the goodest time and the mostest fun.

Oh yeth, one time I was COON huntin along a CRICK (creek)— and my dogs treed four varments up one tree at the same time. Two were 'possums and two were either SKONKS or Civit Cats...the smell is so near alike that I couldn't tell the difference. We KILT the 'possums but the dogs bounced back from those Polecats FASTER nor they went to 'em in the fust place. I got some free "FUNE from that and other contacks while gathering pelts to send to FUNSTAN BROTHERS IN ST. LOUIE when I was a teen ager.

Am sending you a bit of postage for your nice Xmas cards. Best wishes and IF"N the members each would put in a few frog skins EXTRA when writing ya your operating funds might be MO-BETTER?? From within a Cheyenne's Chief's teepee to the top of those 610 towers at NSS. Not everyone has traveled more'n 5,000 miles in a covered wagon as I have—somestimes in a wagon train...headin out to where the grass is abit greener and the streams a little clearer. THOSE WERE THE DAYS and when ya eat a good big meal around a camp fire you really enjoyed it after a hard day of 20 miles in an old prarie schooner. No bridges. We crossed 'em where we found them. Sometimes, tieing down the wagon beds to the running gears to keep from floating down the rivers and larger CRICKS, or doubling up the snap team where the sands were dry and deep on the Cimmerone, Canadian, and/or the Arkansas. Some times our wagon bed leaked water into the trunks and we would have to camp and AIR-dray the clothes and bedding after one of these crossings. Once while gathering COW—CHIPS on the buffalo springs, my broother and I found an ababunded wolf den, dug back below the guysum rocks at a junction of two prarie streams...Or it could have been dug by Indians or even Buffalo Hunters...we never knew. It was a bit elaborate for a wolf's den we thought. It opened to the south west and was a real shelter in a winter storm, especially one that is known as a BLUE NORTHERNER. Now THOSE were storms to be remembered if you were caught out in the open. NO FOOLING. You JIST didn't fool aroun' with those.

Thanks alot for the X-mas card and the well wishes for the season. One warm afternoon in the fall I was picking cotton by my self in our own cotton patch and I heard an unusal noise. I seed west of me a couple of miles, a solid wall of rain coming my way at the speed of an express train. The wall of water looked to be at leastest %mile high. I was barefooted and I unhooked from the 9 ft. cotton sack and started east for our house. I got about half way to the house—some half mile away, when the storm caught up with me. That rain turned to ice as it hit the sand. When I got to the house I was covered on the back and some on the sides with a thin layer of ice! From there on the wather got worser by the minute. Yesum, those BLUE NORTHERNS jist don't fool around and neither will you, does ya get kotched out in the open in one of them, by dang! I got caught in another of those storms while I was delivering mail on a rural route out of Centralia, Okla. I was in a farm buggy with the top layed back when I seed this bluegreen wall of water. It MUST have been a mile high and the meanest looking storm cloud I've ever seen, except some tornadoes, and I've seen quite a few of these, too! Once near Joplin, MO, we weathered a tornado in a covered wagon. My dad saw the storm coming and anchored the wagon with ropes to some bushes on either side of the wagon. That old covered wagon, not only did the jitter-bug...got up and balled the jack for several minutes. That was in the spring of 1908. Yesum'it done scared me most too many, it did. Neither the wagon, the family, or the hosses were damaged it that whing-ding out side of being scaret outta of skins. Ya don't forget things like that, You don't. Well I'm gonna hit the sack. I feel like I need to do a wee bit of corking-off, I does, I does, I really doos. Bye now. You alls have a nice Christman, you heah? Ever, but I don't know why.


Anyway, Mom and I came out from St.Michael and Seattle on the SS SAMPSON in the fall of 1910. We'd spent the summer with Dad in Iditarod (he had gone in earlier that spring via Skagway, Chilkoot Trail, Whitehorse, Lower Lake le Barge, down the Yukon to Holy Cross, then up the Innoko to Iditarod). I don't remember what ship we went up on; probably the old VICTORIA, but we darn near lost the SAMPSON coming out. I was only about four years old at the time, so I don't remember whether we hit the storm on the Bering side or after we came through Unimak Pass, but it was a real dilly. It took the railings off most of the decks, a lot of lifeboats and rafts, not to mention the loss of a team of huskies the owner had insisted on putting topside in their cages.

I remember Mom had taken me with her to another stateroom to visit a friend of hers, and after we'd been there awhile, one of the mates came by and told us we would have to stay there all night as the railings were gone and it was too dangerous to be on deck.

The old SAMPSON sure looked like the wrath of God in the cold gray dawn the next morning! But we made Seattle OK.

Your article was the first time I ever knew about what happened to the old bucket. When we went to Knik (Anchorage) in the spring of 1914, it was on a green boat too, but I'm darned if I can remember which. I'm sure it wasn't the EVANS or the WATSON. Wasn't there another one of the Pacific Steamers lost right about that time (1914) or a little later?

About 1919 or 1920, just after I got my crystal receiver, Ford coil, and salt-water rheostat rigged up and was hamming all over Anchorage, one spring morning I heard the WATSON calling NZY from down by Kenai, asking how the ice was in the inlet. I called Mrs. Rathbun at the station; she said Walt was over in town at Chovins Electric. I was so excited, I just about killed my self bicycling downtown. I found



Walt and finally, when I could catch my breath, blurted out the dope. Never will I forget him saying: "Let's go to your place. I'll talk to him from there!"

He did, and everything turned out hunky dory; and man! I about busted all the buttons off my short, I was so proud! Walt sure chuckled when I reminded him of it a few months ago on the 80-meter net. Haven't heard him lately. He must be close to 90 by now!

Well, enough of the past. Guess I'll go watch the boob tube and see who's ahead in the Phoenix open.

Take care! Hi to Loren, Jerry, Ray, et al, when you see 'em.

PS: Guess I must have had the WATSON on my mind! Hi!

January 1981

Enclosed is my check for three years' dues -- a real bargain if I ever saw one.

As a footnote to one of the items in the most recent SPARKS JOURNAL, I note that only one U.S.Navy radioman is shown on the Wireless Memorial in New York's Battery Park: Ernest E. Dailey of the USS MACON.* The MACON was the last dirigible in commission at that time, the AKRON having been lost off New Jersey not too long before this. The fleet was engaged in a joint Army-Navy maneuver with the MACON operating out of Sunnyvale, California (I was serving in the USS MILWAUKEE/NISM; we had one of the Army generals and his staff aboard). As I remember, the maneuvers were supposed to end several days later with some sort of joint attack in the San Francisco area.

On the evening of the 12th I was manning the bridge radio position - a small cubbyhole just back of the bridge - to speed up the passing of instructions received by radio. The MACON was heading back to Sunnyvale shortly after dark, when it went down not too far off shore in the Big Sur area. The MILWAUKEE, one of the old "four-pipe" light cruisers (it looked like an oversized destroyer), was ordered in to pick up survivors. since it had quite a shallow draft. We picked up twelve, including the MACON'S skipper. The maneuvers were called off at that point and the whole fleet proceeded in to San Francisco. I believe that most of the MACON'S crew survived the accident, only three or four being lost.

May I take this opportunity to wish you the best of everything in the New Year with much that is new to see and do along with the good health to enjoy it all, and good friends to share it with.

RY COMPARISON

Early in 1953 during my Navy career, I convinced the XYL that ham radio was lots of fun, and that it wasn't too difficult to pass the FCC license exam.

So, even though she was not crazy about the idea, we started working at the course. I got some records of the code for her, and a license manual; and so with 88s I headed for my ship which was stationed in San Diego at the time.

We were at maneuvers most of the week, and sometimes came in on weekends. Upon arrival back in port I found that I had a very unhappy protege. She had tried to remember all of the electrical terms at once; also she stopped the records each time she made a mistake and went back to the beginning.

So we straightened that out. She finally achieved about 8 wpm and then decided that the whole thing wasn't worth the effort. But as for the electrical definitions, I suggested she try comparing them with something she could remember, such as in sound or relation.

Another trip to sea; and upon my return, this time I was greeted with big smiles and: "Honey, ask me some questions about the electrical words." (There were more terms in those days in the General exam than in the present books.)

I asked her what a unit of inductance was, and she came right back with: "A unit of inductance is a henry." "How did you remember that?" I asked.

"Well, you see, you said to compare the unit to something I could remember." Oh? And what did you compare it to?" "Oh well, your name is Harry; and that is close to Henry; and you induced me to marry you." "Very good; now what is the unit of magnetomotive force?" "Oh, that is a gilbert; I remember that because the people who lived across the street from us in Japan were named Kilbert, see?" "Again very good. Now, how about a unit of capacity?" "Oh, now, that is an easy one: that is a farad." "And-?" "Well, I remembered that because a farad is such a large unit that it is impractical. I compared the farad to King Farouk of Egypt. He is a huge person. So the farad has to be broken down into smaller parts to be usable." "Okay, fine; now how about an ohm?" "That's a unit of resistance' every girl knows about resistance." "Referring to your last, I take it that a mho, then, would be non-resistive—a non-resistive girl?"

I think you get the idea, but unfortunately that code perfection finally got to her and she QRT on me, and nothing I could do would make her change her mind. But isn't it an idea for remembering those hard-to-remember terms?

A WWII EXPERIENCE

I consider it an honor to be a member of such an illustrious group of Pioneers from the days of spark and arc. I've worked some of these chaps on 40 and 80 meters CW.

Although approaching age 60, and with nearly 40 years of brass-pounding behind me, I realize I'm but a Johnny-come-lately in this group, and it is with diffidence that I respond to your appeal for accounts of the use of the SOS or other distress signals.

Since neither of the two incidents I relate involved a genuine emergency, the only reason I can suggest for their inclusion in the continuing SOS/CUD RECORD is for laughs.

In December 1943 on the steam-schooner DOROTHY PHILIPS/KJVJ, our ninety-day wonder U.S. Navy ensign thought he saw a periscope while we were in the Santa Barbara Channel. Captain Cleasby ordered me to send SSSS (WWII signal for a submarine attack in lieu of SOS). Within minutes planes were buzzing around and the ensign ordered his gun crew to fire on the periscope, giving the range at 6,000 yards, coming close to shelling the beach at Santa Barbara. In the meantime, the captain saw that the "periscope" was only a tin can! He immediately cancelled the alert.



A LATER EPISODE

On April 21st, 1948, the NC-95425, a DC-4 (or C-54) of Northwest Airlines, bound to Shemya and Tokyo from Anchorage, Alaska, all four engines quit about 90 miles west of Naknek over the Bering Sea. The captain ordered me to send an SOS, which I transmitted to NWA (Anchorage) on the Company frequency by CW. No sooner had I completed the message than the captain ordered me to cancel it, at the same time - with a very red face - reached up and switched from empty to full gas tanks!

The reason our normally intrepid skipper had panicked (along with all the rest of us in the cockpit) was that this was the third such similar happening. On the previous day, first one engine and then two had quit at almost exactly the same place. Each time we returned to Anchorage for repairs. So it may be seen that on the third attempt as we approached that dreaded spot 90 miles west of Naknek, tension was mounting. It was a kind of northern version of the Bermuda Triangle, in a manner of speaking.

RJ'S TWO-HANDED CODING

In his book "My SF Story of the Waterfront and the Wireless," Dick Johnstone (RJ) relates how he and a buddy were determined to become operators at the old KPH Marconi station shortly after WWI. Operators at KPH were required to use a landline telegraph circuit as well as the wireless facilities. Although RJ and his friend were proficient in the wireless International code, they began to teach each other the American Morse used on the landlines. After six months of practice they not only mastered the additional code at fast operating speeds, but they learned to copy on a mill (typewriter) and to write with a pencil with either hand. They landed the KPH jobs.

RJ does not seem to have recorded it, but I've been told that eventually he was able to send equally well with either hand. He developed ambidexterity to the point that he could send a message in American Morse with one hand and in International Morse with the other simultaneously. At first blush, this would seem almost incredible if it were not for the various stage demonstrations we've all seen where, for example, the entertainer

will write on a blackboard, poetry with one hand, while at the same time with the other hand write down and add a long column of figures dictated to him by someone at random in the audience. And, of course, virtually all Morse telegraphers developed some of this kind of skill in sending with one hand while writing on the message blank (number, time sent, etc) with the other hand at the same time. No doubt a case of diligent and constant practice.

On quite another subject, almost everyone is familiar with the unofficial term SNAFU (Situation Normal All Fouled Up) which was born early in WWII and which was often applied to screwups or failures in telecommunications operations.

But there were three more additional terms, at least in the Navy, but which I do not think have yet been published anywhere:

SUSFU - Situation unchanged, still fouled up. TARFUN - Things are really fouled up now.

FUBAR - Fouled up beyond repair.

WHY SENDING IS DONE WITH THE LEFT FOOT ON THE LAKES

The Steamer L. E. BLOCK is named after Mr. Leopold Emanuel Block of Cincinnati, born on January 13, 1869, the son of Mr. Joseph Block, founder of the Inland Steel Company. L. E. Block became Chairman about 1920 and retired in 1940.

In 1934 I was R/O on the SS L.E.BLOCK. We had always wondered why operators on the Lakes had such a jerky way of sending. My experience on the L.E.BLOCK explains it.

When we left the Allouez (Wisconsin) dock on a stormy October evening, the R/O (me) was ordered to turn to and help batten down hatches and assist the winchman in dragging cables. After a muscle-

bound five hours and 36 hatch covers, I couldn't send my own name, let alone send a message.

In recent years the radiotelegraph transmitter has been replaced by radiotelephone which allows the captain or the mate to talk directly into a hookup with the long-distance telephone system. And now the ships will be able to talk anywhere in the world via the sky satellites.

The SS L.E.BLOCK broke a few tonnage records with trips to Indiana Harbor on Lake Michigan. She carried the largest cargo ever to pass through the Soo. In 1977 she will be fifty years old, having been launched in Lorain, Ohio, in 1927. She still has her original girlish figure she started with: 621' x 64' x 33' but now she wears a hearing aid-the radiotelephone.

Member Jeff Azoy has built a replica of this first transmitter and receiver & it is on display in the museum (Mean 1st in USA).

We have 35 members holding current commercial tickets. Some have continuous renewals from way back such as Dick Egolf 1911; Jeff Azoy 1914 and Ed Raser 1917. I wish to make up a list of all our members who are presently ticketed. Please give me that info.

Misc: Bud Waite is back home from short hospital stay and feeling much better. We are all waiting for you to finish that book, Bud. The for the KC4 QSL card you sent me. Bob Gleason got tired of this frigid east coast we and took off for Hawaii for a month. Enjoy yourselves in KHK land, Bob.

News from our sea going members: Tom Kilpatrick on beach since August due operation on back & shoulder. Hopes to resume his duties with Sun Oil next month. Ed McCarthy's vacation will be over next month when he returns to his home at sea, the SS Chesapeake, ex Hess Voyager. Al Allen on long vacation from the steamer Puerto Rico. Al almost had heart surgery but at last minute, doctors decided against it. He is doing great now with medication. Expects be back to work next month. Dwight Temple took a radio officers job on the SS American Argosy last fall after a 42 year absence from the sea, says What a change!

Following is a report on our Director's recent sea voyage as Radio Officer on board the training ship, State of Maine. I dont envy Milt Schwartz on that cold, rough seas cruise. Here's his story:

Re my trip, as you all know the North Atlantic is no place to be sailing in the winter and this winter we had conditions even worse than usual. I like to walk the decks but nd this trip. We left the Maritime School at Castine, Maine on Jan. 1, QRD Norfolk Naval Base where we stayed 5 days. Stayed at the Base most of time. Seems there's a lot of mugging, especially at night. Went to officers club couple times. We finally set sail and when we were 100 miles SE of Norfolk, NMN rebroadcast an SOS from a Greek ship 300 miles east of us. We advised NMN our position and would be able to reach the ship in 18 hours. This was passed to the rescue center in NY who then asked us to divert and make best possible speed to the distress. We headed east at 16-17 knots and reached the ship the following morning. Ship had been taking water in the holds and in a heavy storm. He was making 5 knots & headed for Baltimore. Meanwhile the Coast Guard had a cutter 8 hours away and proceeding to intercept us. We escorted the disabled ship until the cutter reached us and then we were released and proceeded to San Salvador Island in the southern Bahamas where we had a few days of warm weather. We rounded the island with out stopping and headed for Castine. Then the packing around our propeller shaft came loose and sea water began coming in, so we stopped the ship while the engineers made temporary repairs and we proceeded at 8 knots instead of 13 which brought us in 10 hours late. Nice weather until we got north of Hatteras and then again the storms hit us. Flew home from Bangor via Boston.

That concludes my experiences on the State of Maine for the winter cruise of the Maine Maritime Academy. I think my future cruises will be in the summer."

Milt was off Nantucket during the record-breaking cold wave where he had 20 below temps with lots of ice all over the ship. On top of that, gale force winds. Then I bet he said he wished he had stayed home.

Forgot to mention that John Yancho and Lou Roman, two other chapter members still pounding brass, have not reported in for some time. Give us a call, boys.

One last letter from Cy Brill. Cy says he is retiring on Jan 31st at age 62, from 30 years with ITT, the last 5 as manager of WSL. He has been making relief trips for years during vacation time, on ships as Radio Officer. Last one was in November to Bremerhaven and Rotterdam on the SS Sealand Galloway. This is a container ship about 950 ft long, as long as an aircraft carrier and 41,000 tons. It's capable of 34 knots but leisurely cruises at 21.50 man crew. Had an apprentice opr working for his 6 months endorsement. He gets \$600 a month for 6 months then sails alone for 1 year at about \$1600 per month, much less than a regular opr. The money is fabulous; however with 2 radars, a Digipilot, Speed Log, SSB Kmtrs(2) DF, 1 HF Kmtr, for CW, and 1 IF Kmtrs along with the normal emerg xmtr. Also 3 H/F receivers and 1 emerg IF receiver, Alden Fax, RTTY, ship's entertainment receivers thruout the vessel, 2 VHF Transceivers on the bridge and radio room and Epirb & Lifeboat xmtr.—Do you get the picture? He handled abt 85 msgs on the 3 week trip. (Theres more to Oy's letter later)

The information about a member's demise is then furnished to Vice President Eb Cady who sends a letter of sympathy and condolence to the member's spouse or family. We furnish information on a member's passing in the SKIPPER'S LOG for the "NECROLOGY" section of our Directories when published, and to publish verbatim in the SOWP INTERCOM.

We also inform other publications on occasion, and copy is usually furnished to QST for their report on SILENT KEYS.

There is generally a time lag of several weeks from the time the notice appears in the SKIPPER'S LOG from the date of death, and often Chapters do not receive the information in time to send their own cards of sympathy.

We might suggest that when members learn of another member's passing. they inform both HQ and also the secretary or director of the Chapter in their own area. This will allow Chapters to respond more quickly and perhaps on a more personal basis than we can do from HQ.

In recording future NECROLOGY REPORTS we will avoid repeating the words.... "Our sympathy (or) condolences to the wife and family of our late member...." also "A moment of silence on our nets in the memory of our late member." (The phraseology may vary in each case as circum-stances dictate; however we intend to convey this meaning to the survivors of all deceased members. This will be handled by Vice President Cady and the Chapter Directors.)



Interesting things

No antenna can be protected from a direct lightning bolt. Ham beam antennas on towers will normally take a direct stroke but the traps and rotator motors are almost certain to be blown. Sometimes the coaxial cable will conduct the stroke down to the ham shack and "fry" the front end of receivers.

In the case of large TV towers and tall steelreinforced buildings, the current pulses will be carried off to ground without damage, but most sizes of wire used in ham antennas will just vaporize when hit.

Some protection can be obtained against near strikes, say a block or so away. Here the current pulses are small enough so that most antennas will handle the current without too much difficulty. Oddly enough, once the current problem is solved, the remaining problem is one of voltage, which can, together with sizable currents, do damage to the front end of receivers, especially the new transistorized types. Often there is enough kick in the pulses to blow the transistors in the output stages of transistorized transmitters.


Voltage protection is best handled by using a bypass system. In the case of an antenna lead coming down the wall of a house and passing into the shack via an insulated feedthrough, there should be a spark-gap type lightning arrester installed at the feedthru point outside the shack, and the ground wire is to be run directly down the wall to a ground rod driven into the ground directly below the spark-gap arrester. There must be NO bends or turns in the ground lead; it must go STRAIGHT to the ground. The inductance of even a 90° turn will be enough to turn a pulse of lightning back into the shack.

Lightning strokes are highly unpredictable although they generally hit the highest object in the vicinity. If the antenna happens to be that object, it is almost certain to be selected as the first stroke victim.

TV and AM broadcast towers are heavily grounded at their bases; in addition they have several two- or three-foot rods with needle points at the top to attract the strokes. The idea is to have the stroke hit the tower and not the antennas. This works pretty well most of the time. But sometimes there are some leakage current pulses into the coaxial cable, in which case, in spite of spark-gap arresters and "electronic crowbar" automatic short-circuit protectors, there is all hell to pay!

When there are thunderstorms in your neighborhood, if you have taken all precautions, the only thing to do is to pray that you don't get hit!

Old-style IRC's no longer valid

As of 1 January 1981, the old-style international reply coupons are no longer redeemable for postage in the United States.

The old-style coupons, as can be seen in Figure 1, are easy to recognize because they are always imprinted with the name of the selling country and have an issue date prior to 1 January 1975. The new-style coupons, redeemable for postage stamps, were issued on or after 1 January 1975 and are not imprinted with the name of the selling country — see Figure 2.

International reply coupons are issued by countries that are members of the Universal Postal Union to provide a convenient method for sending reply postage with letters. The coupons can be exchanged for postage stamps at a post office in the destination country. People who possess the old-style reply coupons sent by correspondents in foreign countries may return them to the sender for replacement or redemption through the sending office. Unused old-style coupons issued in the United States may be exchanged at the post office.






If a typewriter is not available, please handwrite legibly, especially names and places.




