

Tetradrachm, 16.73g, Ake, 319/8 BC, head of young Heracles right, clad in lion's skin, rev ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ, Zeus seated left on throne, holding eagle and sceptre, on the left, date, under the throne, monogram (Price 3272). Nice style, about very fine. £150-180
- 2 Macedonia, Alexander III, the Great, Tetradrachm, countermarked with an anchor, Drachms (4). Fair to good fine. (5) £150-180
- 3* Attica, Athens, Tetradrachm, 17.10g, 393-c.300 BC, head of Athena right, the eye designed in profile, rev AΘE, incuse square, owl right, head facing, wings closed, olive-leaf and berry behind (SNG Cop 65-67). Good fine. £150-180
- 4* Attica, Athens, Tetradrachms (2), head of Athena right, the eye drawn in profile, rev AΘE, incuse square, owl right, head facing, wings closed, olive-leaf and berry behind. The first has a test cut, the second is an imitation, probably from Egypt, fine to good fine. (2) £150-180
- 5 Attica, Hellenistic Kingdoms, Miscellaneous Silver coins (3), of the Seleucid Kingdom, Tetradrachm of Antiochos I, Drachm and Diobol; with a bronze coin from the Ptolemaic Kingdom. *Varied state, generally about good fine.* (4) £100-120
- 6* Attica, silver coins (2), Obol of a Lycian satrap and a Drachm of Persis. *Good fine.* (2) £100-120
- 7* Parthia, Silver Tetradrachms (2), one of Vologoses III; Silver Drachms (4), Vardanes II and Pakaros II; Silver Obols (2). Fine to good very fine. (8)
- 8 Parthian Drachms (3), Phraataces, 2 BC-AD 4 (M 602-605), Artabanus II, AD 10-38 (M 619), Artabanus III, AD 80-81 (M 666). About very fine to extemely fine. (3) £150-200
- 9 Parthian Vassals, Persis, Hemidrachms (3), Artabanes II, AD 80-90 and Vologases III, 105-147 (2); together with an Indoscythian Drachm of Azes II, c.35 BC-AD 5. About very fine to extremely fine. (4) £80-100
- 10 Parthian Vassals, Elymais, Bronze Drachms (4), one of the Kamnaskirid Dynasty, 180 BC-c.AD 100, and three of the Arsacid dynasty, c.AD 100-227. About very fine to about extremely fine. (4) £40-50

- Parthia, Vonones I (c.AD 8-12), Tetradrachm, bust left with long beard and ear visible, rev Nike walking left holding wreath, date letters ΓΚΤ, c.AD 12, 10.76g (Sellwood 60.4). Fine and rare.

 - Vonones I enjoyed a temporary victory over Artabanus II who would in time claw back victory, and force Vonones to flee to Armenia where he secured the throne in about AD 12. Artabanus' continued attempts to remove him from Armenia were eventually successful and Vonones fled to Syria where he was kept by the Romans, but was later moved to Cilicia at Artabanus' request, and was murdered circa AD 19.
- Bactria, Demetrios I (c.200-185 BC), AE 29mm, elephant head right, bell round neck, rev BAΣIΛΕΩΣ ΔΗΜΗΤΡΙΟΥ, caduceus, monogram to left, 10.82g (SNG ANS 209-11; Bopearachchi 5, E). Dark green patina, good very fine. £150-200
- Bactrian Coins (6), silver Tetradrachm of Hermaios and Bronzes (5), including a hemiobol of Antalcidas. *Fine to very fine.* (6) £70-90
- Coins of Characene and Early India (7), including a bilion Tetradrachm of Attambelos I or II and a silver Obol of Yuchchi. Fine to about very fine. (7)

- Maues (95/85-65/60 BC), silver Drachm and bronze Unit. *About very fine to extremely fine.* (2) £30-50
- Sasanian Empire, Kavad I (second reign, AD 499-531), Copper Obol (SNS 3:283-287). Small edge flaw, fine, very rare. £60-80

- 18* Syria, Demetrius II (second reign 129-125 BC), Tetradrachm, Ake-Ptolemais (Akko), diademed head right, stemma, rev ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ / ΔΗΜΗΤΡΙΟΥ ΘΕΟΥ / ΝΙΚΑ-ΤΟΡΟΣ, Zeus wearing himation, naked to waist, seated left, holding sceptre in his left hand, Nike flying off to crown him on his outstretched hand, 16.31g (Newell LSM, p.5, 4). Good style, some light weakness, very fine. £400-500
- Greek weights (3), c.1st Century BC AD 2nd Century, Lead 33mm x 32mm, 68.3g (2-Unciae), uncertain inscription in linear border, rev flat base with repeated xxxx pattern; Lead 33mm x 33mm, 22.5g (8-Drachms), double linear border, DH (8-Drachmae) in centre, rev plain (for a similar form of marking, cf Münz Zentrum, Gewichte aus drei Jahrtausenden, II, November 1979, no.4112); Greek weight, 19mm x 22mm including loop, 7.2g (2-Drachms), uncertain mark in linear border, rev plain. First with heavy carbonate surface deposit, fair to fine, other two fine. (3)

- 21* Trajan, Dupondius mule, obverse legend dating to AD 103-111, radiate bust right, drapery on left shoulder, rev TR POT COS II PP SC, Abundantia seated left on chair of two cornucopiae (RIC reverse 395). Brown patina, about extremely fine. £200-250
- 22* Septimius Severus, Aureus 6.80g, Rome AD 197, laureate, draped bust right, legend ends IMP VIIII, rev PROFECTIO AVG, Severus on horseback right (RIC 106). Two piercings, edge hammered up, fair. £150-200
- 23* Geta (AD 209-212), Denarius 3.0g, Rome AD 200-202, bare headed draped bust right, *rev* TEMP-OR FELI-CITAS, in three lines within wreath (RIC 22). Good very fine, rare. £200-250
- 24 Roman Imperial Denarii (8), Marcus Aurelius, Septimius Severus (2), Caracalla, Elagabalus (2) and Severus Alexandra (2). *Good fine to about very fine.* (8) £60-80

- Sextus Pompey, As, Sicily, 43-36 BC, laureate head of Janus, with features of Pompey the Great, rev Prow right (Cr 479/1; RCV 1394). Pitted, dark green patina, fine. £50-70
- 37 Mark Antony, Denarius, Asia Minor, 42-41 BC, bare head of Antony right, lituus behind, *rev* radiate head of Sol right (Cr 496/3; RCV 1468). *Some corrosion, dark old tone, fair to fine, rare.* £80-100
- 38* Augustus (27 BC AD 14), Cistophorus 11.89g, Pergamum, bare head right, rev MART-VLTO, temple of Mars Ultor (RIC 507). Double-struck on obverse, toned, fine. £200-250
- 39 Claudius (AD 41-54), As, bare head left, rev S-C, Minerva advancing right (RIC 100; BMC 149).



- First Century Quadrantes (8), comprising issues of Augustus (27 BC AD 14) (2), Caligula (AD 37-41) (2), Claudius (AD 41-54) (2), and Nero (AD 54-68) (2). Fair to fine. (8) £80-100
- Trajan (AD 98-117), Sestertius, AD 103-111, laureate bust right, drapery on left shoulder, rev S P Q R OPTIMO PRINCIPI S-C, Pax standing left, holding branch and cornucopiae, foot resting on Dacian (RIC 504). Rough surfaces, brown tone, fine. £80-100
- 43* Trajan, As, AD 103-111, laureate head right, drapery on left shoulder, rev Roma seated left, holding Victory and spear, arms behind (RIC 489). Glossy dark green-brown patina, surface marks, good fine.



- 44* Hadrian (AD 117-138), Denarius, head right, rev AEGYPTOS, Egypt reclining left (RIC 297). Toned, nearly extremely fine. £150-200
- Hadrian, Denarius, rev Africa (RIC 299); with Sabina (wife of Hadrian), Denarius, rev Concordia (RIC 399a). First about very fine, the second corroded, good fine. (2)

- Divus Antoninus Pius (d. AD 161), Denarius, rev CONSECRATIO, eagle on altar; together with Faustina Jnr (the wife of Marcus Aurelius), Denarius, Salus. First nearly very fine, the second very fine. (2)

- Clodius Albinus (AD 195-197), Denarius, bare head right, rev MINER PACIF COS II, Minerva holding olive-branch, spear and shield (RIC 7; C 48). Ragged edge between 10 and 12 o'clock, toned, about very fine.
- 54 Septimius Severus (AD 193-211), Denarii (12); Julia Domna (the wife of Septimius Severus), Denarii (5), various types. *Toned, fine and better*. (17) £60-80
- Septimius Severus, Denarii (8); Caracalla (AD 198-217), Denarii (5); Geta (AD 209-212), Denarii (2). *Toned, fine to very fine*. (15) £60-80
- 56* Julia Domna (the wife of Septimius Severus), Denarius, draped bust right, rev Pietas left, dropping incense on altar (RIC 572). Good very fine. £40-50

- 57* Caracalla (AD 198-217), Denarius, laureate and draped bust right, *rev* two captives seated, mourning at foot of trophy (RIC 54b). *Good very fine*. £50-70
- 58* Diadumenian (AD 218), Denarius, bust right, rev Diadumenian standing, holding standard and sceptre, two standards to right (RIC 102; C 3). Short crack in flan, a little corrosion on obverse, very fine. £100-150
- 59 Elagabalus (AD 218-222), Denarii (4), and Antoninianus; Julia Soemias (the mother of Elagablaus), Denarius; Severus Alexander (AD 222-235), Denarii (9), various reverses. *All toned, fine and better.* (15) £60-80
- 60 Elagabalus, Denarii (5); Severus Alexander (AD 222-235), Denarii (9), various reverses. *All toned, fine and better.* (14) £60-80
- 61* Julia Paula (the wife of Elagabalus), Denarius, draped bust right, rev Concordia seated left, holding patera (RIC 211). Good very fine / very fine. £40-50
- 62* Julia Mamaea (mother of Severus Alexander), Denarius, diademed and draped bust right, *rev* Fecunditas left, holding hand of child (RIC 332). *Lustrous, extremely fine*. £60-80
- Philip I (AD 244-249), Antoniniani (9), various types. *Fine to very fine*. (9) £40-60
- Philip I, Antoniniani (5); with Philip II (AD 247-249), as Caesar, Antoniniani (4), various types. *Fine to very fine*. (9) £40-60
- Miscellaneous Antoniniani (3), Valerian (AD 253-260), Gallienus (AD 253-268), and Probus (AD 276-282); together with Tetrarchic and later Roman AE (16), including issues of Constantius II (AD 337-361), and Arcadius (AD 383-408). Fine and better. (19)



- 74* Aethelred II (978-1016), Crux Penny, Southwark, rev GODPINE ON SUÐBY (S 1148). Good very fine, toned, hairline crack on obverse (not restorated). £150-180
- 75* Edward III (1327-1377), Pre-Treaty Groat, London, class G (S 1570). Nearly very fine, small flan, good portrait. £60-80
- 76* Henry VI (1421-1460), Rosette-mascle Penny, York; Old-style Penny, Durham (S 1860, 2222). First very fine but double-struck, the latter poor. (2) £50-70
- 77* Edward IV (first reign 1461-1470), Light coinage, Groat, London, mm crown/sun mule (S 2000).

 Very fine. £100-120
- 78* Henry VII (1485-1509), Facing bust, Halfgroat, Canterbury, mm tun, class IIIc (S 2211). *Good fine*. £30-40
- 79* Henry VIII (1509-1547), First coinage, Groat, mm crowned portcullis (S 2316). Very fine, good portrait but with hairline split in flan on the obverse at 8 o'clock.
- 80* Henry VIII, Second coinage, Groat, mm lis (S 2337E).

 Better than very fine, toned but weak in part. £140-180
- 81* Edward VI (1547-1553), 'Fine' coinage, Sixpence, mm tun (S 2483). Good fine, nice portrait but bent and straightened (perhaps as a love token?). £60-80
- Philip and Mary (1554-1558), Groat, mm lis (S 2508). Good fine, decent face but with surface marks and uneven flan. £100-120

- 83 Elizabeth I (1558-1603), Hammered Silver, Shilling, mm A, Sixpences (8), 1573, mm acorn, 1574, mm acorn, 1594 (6), mm woolpack (N 2014, 1997; S 2577, 2572). *Generally poor to fair.* (9) £80-100
- 84* Elizabeth I, Third issue, Threepence, 1575, mm eglantine; Henry VIII, Sovereign Penny, Durham, TW by shield (S 2566, 2352). Fine or better. (2) £80-100
- 85* James I (1603-1625), Second coinage, Shilling, third bust, mm lis (S 2654). *Good fine/very fine*. £60-80
- James I, Sixpences (9), 1605, mm lis, 1606, mm rose, 1607, mm coronet, 1608, mm coronet, 1609, mm key, 1613, mm trefoil, 1621, mm thistle, 1623, mm lis, 1624, mm trefoil (N 2102, 2103, 2126; S 2657, 2658, 2670). Generally poor to fine. (9) £80-100
- 87* James I, Second coinage, Halfgroat, TVEATVR legend both sides, mm plain cross, Penny, mm mullet, Halfpenny, mm grapes? (N 2105, 2106, 2107; S 2660A, 2661, 2663). Fine to very fine, the first rare. (3)
- 88* Charles I (1625-1649), Tower mint, Halfcrown, type 3a², mm triangle (S 2776). *Very fine, scarce thus, a little weak and irregular.* £120-150
- 89* Charles I, Tower mint, Halfcrown, type 4⁴, mm triangle in circle (S 2779). *Irregular as usual but nearly very fine, weak in parts.* £60-80
- 90* Charles I, Tower mint, Shilling, type 4^3 , mm anchor \downarrow / \rightarrow (S 2796). *Very fine and sharp but with an 'X' scratched in the field below value.* £80-100
- 91* Charles I, Shillings (3), Tower Group F, sixth bust of early and late style, mm eye, triangle in circle, P in brackets (N 2231, 2232; S 2799, 2800). Cleaned good fine, possibly ex-Middleham hoard. (3) £80-120
- 92* Commonwealth (1649-1660), Sixpence, 1651, mm sun (N 2726; S 3219). *Toned, a little creased, good fine.* £80-120
- 93* Charles II (1660-1685), Shilling, 1668, second bust (S 3375). *Attractively toned, very fine.* £300-350
- 94* Charles II, Proof Halfpenny, 1672, laureate and cuirassed bust left, rev Britannia, date in exergue (Peck 509). Impaired, very fine. £100-120
- 95* Charles II, Farthings (2), 1673, 1674, laureate and cuirassed bust left, toothed border both sides, CAROLVS.A.CAROLO., rev Britannia seated left, with shield, spear and spray of leaves, date in exergue, BRITAN NIA. (Peck 522, 527; S 3394). Good fine to nearly very fine. (2) £120-150



- 96* Charles II, Counterstamped Halfcrown, 1673, IW within crenellated heart counterstamp in centre of obverse. Coin worn/fine, counterstamp very fine.
- 97* William and Mary (1688-1694), Farthing, 1694 (\$ 3453). *Nearly very fine*. £60-80
- 98* William III (1694-1702), Guinea, 1701, second bust (S 3463). Traces of mounting on obverse, some other porosity, a bold fine. £200-250
- 99* William III, Halfcrown, 1696, first bust, small shields (S 3475). Good very fine but with adjustment marks. £150-180


Sir Charles (Karl) Alten had entered the service of the Elector of Hanover aged twelve. Commissioned in the Hannovarian Guards he first served in the Low Countries (1793-1795) before joining the King's German Legion (1803). He was at Copenhagen with Lord Cathcart (1805) and with Moore in both Sweden and Spain. Wellington promoted him to command the Light Division (1813) and he fought at several battles in the Peninsular. He was severely wounded commanding Wellington's 3nd Division at Waterloo. He returned to Hanover, achieved the rank of Field-Marshal and also served as a Minister of War and Foreign Affairs.



NEW YORK, 42mm (Baker 327, and pp.138-140; Ford II, 213-215). Pierced (as is usual), very fine and extremely rare. £400-500

The bust of Washington depicted on the medal is that by Jean-Antoine Houdon (1741-1828). His statue of George Washington, sculpted between 1785-1791, was erected in the capitol building in Richmond, Virginia, a commission that had been awarded at the recommendation of his friends Benjamin Franklin and Thomas Jefferson. The original terracotta bust from which the statue was worked remains at Mount Vernon. Later Washington Societies moved away from charity towards total abstinence, and it was one of these, "The Washington Benevolent Society, with their handsome banner", were a part of the celebrations at the dedication of the Washington Monument in 21st February, 1885. John Reich (Johan Matthias Reich), born 1768 in Fürth, Germany, the son of Johann Christian Reich, emigrated to America c. 1800, and employed by the US Mint in Philadelphia the following year




