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

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

Celtic Gaul, AE (2), Senones (c.100-50 BC), Celticized head right, rev Celticized eagle left; Pixtilos (c.50-30 BC), bearded head right, rev horseman right. Very fine. (2)





Thracian Islands, Thasos (c.248-80 BC), Silver Tetradrachm, head of Dionysos right, wearing ivywreath, rev Herakles standing left, holding club and lion's skin, 16.63g, 10h (SNG Cop 1038ff). Lightly toned, very fine.





Kingdom of Thrace, Lysimachos (323-281 BC), Silver Tetradrachm, mint of Magnesia, c.297-281 BC, diademed head of Alexander the Great right, wearing horn of Ammon, rev Athena enthroned left, with shield and spear, holding Nike, 16.84g, 12h (Thompson 115). Toned, about very fine.







Kingdom of Macedon, Alexander III, The Great (336-323 BC), Silver Tetradrachms (2), one with uncertain symbol, one mint of Miletos, head of young Herakles right, wearing lion's skin, rev Zeus enthroned left, holding eagle and sceptre, 16.63g, 16.44g (Price 2143). Good fine. (2)

Sasanian, Shapur II (AD 309-379), Gold Dinar, bust of Shapur right wearing turreted crown, two ribbons curve upwards from diadem, traces of legend, within dotted circle, rev fire altar with bust, facing right, in flames, attendant either side facing inwards, dotted circle around, 3h (Göbl Ia/6a; SNS 2 Ib1/3a). Very fine, set in loose ring mount soldered on by four loops, with suspension loop. £150-200



Tiberius (AD 14-37), Silver Denarius, mint of Lugdunum, TI CAESAR DIVI AVG F AVGVSTVS, laureate head right, rev PONTIF MAXIM, female figure (Livia?) seated right, holding sceptre and branch, 3.78g, 7h (RIC 30; RCV 1763). Nearly extremely fine.



Vespasian (AD 69-79), Silver Denarius, AD 70, IMP CAESAR VESPASIANVS AVG, laureate head right, rev CAESAR AVG F COS CAESAR AVG F PR, heads of Titus and Domitian facing each other, 2.94g, 7h (RIC 16; RCV 2399). Well-centred, about very fine, rare.



Domitian (AD 81-96), AE As, AD 92-94, IMP CAES DOMIT AVG GERM COS XVI CENS PER P P, laureate head right, rev FORTVNAE AVGVSTI, Fortuna standing left, holding rudder and cornucopiae, S-C in field, 11.17g, 6h (RIC 755; RCV 2805 var). Dark green patina, very fine. £70-90



Trajan (AD 98-117), AE Sestertius, AD 107, laureate bust right, drapery on left shoulder, rev S P Q R OPTIMO PRINCIPI / SC, Trajan, in military dress, holding thunderbolt and spear, standing left, being crowned by Victory, also standing, 22.62g (RIC 549; C 516; RCV 3202). Area of surface erosion on lower obverse, brown patina, very fine.



Antoninus Pius (AD 138-161), AE Sestertius, AD 140-144, ANTONINVS AVG PIVS P P TR P COS III, laureate head right, rev SALVS AVG, S-C, Salus standing left, feeding snake coiled round altar and holding rudder on globe, 22.58g, 10h (RIC 636; C 715). Flan crack, dark brown tone, very fine. £100-150



Gallienus (AD 253-268), Billon Antoninianus, mint of Cologne, AD 257-258, GALLIENVS PFAVG, radiate and cuirassed bust right, *rev* GERMANICVS MAX V, trophy between two captives, 4.22g, 12h (RIC 18; RCV 10224). *Good very fine*. £40-60



Allectus (AD 293-296), AE Antoninianus, mint of Londinium, IMP C ALLECTVS P F AVG, radiate and cuirassed bust right, rev PAX AVG, Pax standing left, holding olive-branch and sceptre, 2.52g, 7h (RIC 33).





4. AUCTION SALE

- 4.1. Before the auction, all potential Bidders must notify their name and address to the auctioneer and if required provide proof of identity to our satisfaction and bank or other credit references.

Except where these Conditions expressly state otherwise, no warranty is given to a Buyer concerning a Lot and each Lot is sold as shown with all faults, imperfections, errors of description (including authorship, origin, age, size, condition or value) or lack of authenticity or genuineness and neither we nor the Seller nor any of our agents or sub-contractors will be liable for any damages, costs, expenses or any other liability arising out of the same whether or not caused by negligence.
- $8.2.\,$ Our maximum liability under these Conditions is the amount of the Purchase Price paid by you.
- 8.3. Neither we nor any of our agents or sub-contractors shall be liable, whether in tort (including negligence or breach of statutory duty), contract, misrepresentation or otherwise:
- (a) for loss of profits or business, depletion of goodwill and/or similar losses; loss of contracts; or
- (b) any special, indirect, consequential or pure economic loss, costs, damages, charges or expenses.
- 8.4. We shall not be liable to you or be deemed to be in breach of these Conditions by reason of any delay in performing, or any failure to perform, any of our obligations in the Conditions, if the delay or failure was due to any cause beyond our reasonable control.
- 8.5. Nothing in these Conditions excludes or limits our liability for any matter which it would be illegal for us to exclude or attempt to exclude under English law or for our fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation.

9. DATA PROTECTION

9.1. By agreeing to these Conditions, a Bidder acknowledges and agrees that we will use personal information of a Bidder for the purpose of the auction and ancillary matters, including providing a Buyer's personal details to any other person where necessary to enforce our rights under these Conditions.

10. GENERAL

- 10.1. These Conditions and the Seller's Conditions constitute the entire agreement between us. - 10.2. All rights and benefits granted to a Bidder under these Conditions are personal to him and may not be assigned or in any other way transferred to any other person. Any such assignment or transfer will be invalid and unenforceable against us.
- 10.3. A notice required or permitted to be given by either of us to the other under these Conditions shall, in the case of a Bidder, be to the last address notified to us and in the case of Baldwin's, shall be to its registered office.
- 10.4. No failure or delay by us in exercising any of our rights under these Conditions shall be deemed to be a waiver of that right, and no waiver by us of any breach of these Conditions by you shall be considered as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other provision.
- 10.5. We may perform our obligations and exercise our respective rights through any of our group companies or assign our rights under these Conditions.
