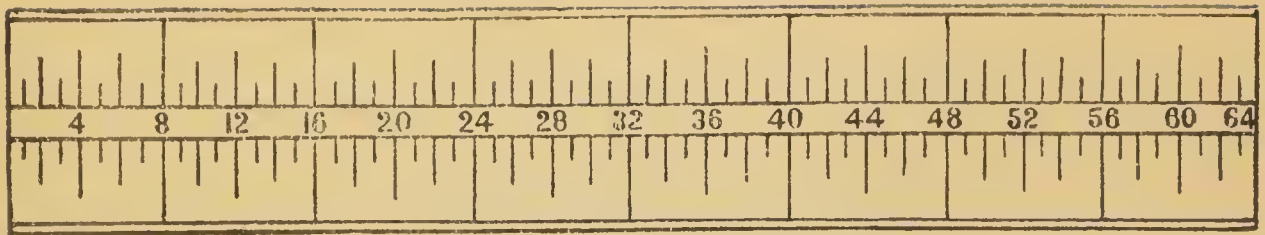

PREFACE.

IT IS TO THE INTEREST OF EVERY STUDENT AND INTENDING BUYER TO READ THIS.

In presenting each new edition of our Catalogues, we aim to give additional useful and attractive features. This will be apparent on comparison with previous issues. The information now added we hope will further aid the collector in the agreeable study and arrangement of that portion of his cabinet of which these pages treat. A numismatic library costing many hundreds of dollars, would scarcely furnish the information and details contained in this Catalogue. As in the 17th Edition of our Copper Catalogue, we are obliged to advance the price to 50c., owing to the increased cost of preparation.

We call especial attention to the heraldic descriptions, the ancient and Latin names of places, the Patron Saints, the system of numbering the issues of each country or place, the explanatory list of abbreviations, the glossary of heraldic terms, and the full index.

The general scope of the work is to supply, with reasonable abbreviations and consistent grouping, a Catalogue of the current coins of the world, together with those of the more prominent countries, and others having special numismatic interest, of the 16th, 17th and 18th centuries. We do not attempt, nor would it be practicable, or even possible, to make a complete Catalogue or include every country that has struck coins since the mediæval times, to fill the place of a Sale Catalogue, to put on the market for a small sum; nevertheless it will be found to be the most extensive Sale Catalogue of Silver and Gold Coins that has ever been published by a dealer, in any country or language.

There are very many pieces in the Gold part, and some in the Silver, which are unpriced, by reason of their rarity or being seldom in stock. We do not carry a full line of everything; it is simply impossible; but we shall be pleased to quote prices upon application, for such as we have or can obtain.

Where coins have been minted at different places, it must be understood that the price given is for any mint *we* may choose. Where a special one is wanted, the rate may be higher. Some mints, in certain years and values, are rare. Again, in filling orders where we quote years, as Haiti, 1846-60, we supply that which is the most common. We base the value upon the quantity on hand or obtainable, regardless of date. However, some years are rare, and we charge accordingly.

We sometimes have intermediate grades of U. S. Coins, as, for instance, we may quote fair 50c., good \$1.00, and yet have one we price at 75c.

Stock is constantly changing through the daily transactions of our business.

A long dash (—) shows where the legend divides, when one part reads upward and the other downward. An upright dash (|) shows that the legend is in lines and so divided.

Dates enclosed thus: (), signify the period or date of issue, when not on the piece.

Our experience is that collectors, when ordering, too often select the lowest priced coins. This is especially the case with the beginner. It must not, however, be considered as the best bargain by reason of being the cheapest or lowest grade. It affords in most instances what may be termed ordinary specimens, which, to the collector who remains in the field, soon become unsatisfactory.

The best returns are from the choicest specimens; a coin in absolute perfection is the pride of the advanced numismatist.

It is well to enumerate in your order a number of coins which will exceed in value the amount of your remittance.

POSTAGE.— The prices given do not include postage, which should be added at the rate of one cent per ounce, and eight cents for registration. The latter is optional, but if not registered, *they are sent at purchaser's risk*. It is much better to make selections to the amount of \$1 and upwards, and have them registered, than to send small orders at the risk of ordinary mail. Large or valuable packages should be sent by express.

Orders of less than twenty-five cents' value are respectfully declined.

Remittances should be made by draft on New York, or P. O. Money Order, payable to THE SCOTT STAMP & COIN CO., L'D, or in registered letter.

Orders should be written out plainly with the price of each piece wanted, and the full address given in each letter. Unless postage is remitted, we send by express.

We are always prepared to buy coins, and especially fine U. S. and American Colonial Coins. For particulars see our Premium List. Price, 10c.

NOTES.

During certain periods of Spanish rule in Mexico, Central and South America, the mints of Mexico (the city and provincial mints), Guatemala, Potosi in Bolivia, Lima in Peru and Santiago in Chili, struck coins of the same general type, distinguished only by mint marks. We arrange each series under the countries in which they were issued.

To the Mexican mints may be added :

O^A Oaxaca.

A (as well as As) Alamos.

“Arms and bust” in the Papal Series, indicates that the piece exists with either, but not together on one piece.

The cuts in this Catalogue precede the description of the piece.

OVER-DATES.—When a die made in one year is used in a later year by engraving one figure over another, the piece struck therefrom is said to be an “over-date.” For instance, the same die from which the half dollars of 1813 were struck, was used in 1817, by sinking a 7 over the 3, and portions of the latter figure are plainly visible. Hence the variety “1817 over 13.”

Base or billon pieces are composed of a mixture of copper and silver.

TERMS USED TO DEFINE THE VARIOUS PARTS OF COINS.

The front or face of a coin is called the *obverse*. O. Obv.

The back is called the *reverse*. R. Rev.

The principal device or object represented on a coin is called the *type*.

The area or space between the type and the circumference is called the *field*.

The lower portion of the area of a coin beneath the type and separated from the rest of the field by a horizontal line, is called the *exergue*. Ex. This particular place on coins, with or without the separating line, is commonly referred to as the *Ex*.

Small objects represented either in the field or the exergue as adjuncts to the main type are called *symbols*.

Portions of a coin which are sunk below the level of the surface are said to be *incuse*.

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GLOSSARY OF HERALDIC TERMS.

IN our Copper Catalogue we have given as full an explanation of the heraldry of coins as seems necessary for the ordinary collector, and to this we refer our friends who wish further information. Below we give a glossary of heraldic terms used in this Catalogue, which sufficiently explains them.

Addorsed — Back to back.

Allerions — Eagles without beaks or talons.

On the arms of Lorraine they have a legendary allusion to a famous shot, when a single arrow pierced three birds.

Argent — White or silver color.

Azure — Blue, represented by horizontal lines.

Barry — The field divided into narrow, horizontal stripes of differing color; the number is usually named. See 87, p. 121, where the four silver bars are said to allude to the four principal rivers of Hungary.

Bend — A diagonal stripe from upper left to lower right; see left side of cut, 86, p. 121.

Bezant — A small gold coin. As it is always represented yellow, or gold, its tincture is not often named.

Billettee — The field strewn with small oblong figures. See 7, p. 95.

Cantoned — A cross with devices placed in the angles about it is said to be cantoned.

Chief — Upper part of the shield.

Cinquefoil — A five-pointed rosette.

Courant — Running; said of a horse, a stag, and beasts of the chase.

Cross — Strictly speaking, the heraldic cross has four arms of equal breadth throughout, extending to the edge of the shield, as 21, p. 119. If the arms are cut off before reaching the edge, it is called a cross coupé, or a Greek cross, as in 6, p. 141. There are probably upwards of a hundred differing crosses, which are distinguished by

the shape of the arms, or their terminals. It would be impossible to describe these in our limits, and we simply refer to those mentioned in the descriptions. A patriarchal cross has two cross bars at the top,— that above, the shorter, see 166, p. 126. A Maltese cross has four arms of triangular form, apices at centre, and the outer edge indented so that the cross has eight distinct points. [The ends are as shown on 86, p. 120, emerging from behind the shield.] Portuguese coins have a “crutch” cross, see 31, p. 109. A cross “potent” resembles four T's united at their base.

Dexter — The side of the shield on the bearer's right, but on the observer's left.

Dexter hands — Right hands.

Displayed — With wings expanded and the points upward as on 13, p. 111.

Escutcheon of Pretence — A small shield bearing arms to which the wearer has a certain relation, generally by marriage, and added to his own personal arms. See 60, p. 104.

Fess — A broad horizontal band across the centre of the shield.

Guardant — Having the face turned to observer; applied to beasts of prey. A stag with head turned to observer is said to be “at gaze.”

Gules — Red, represented by perpendicular lines.

Hauriant — Fishes placed perpendicularly with their heads upward, are said to be hauriant.

Impaled — When two shields are conjoined perpendicularly, as for instance, the upper device of 345, p. 73, they are said to be impaled.

Indented — With serrated edges.

Inescutcheon — A small shield placed usually on the centre of a coat of arms. See 401, p. 75.

Mullets — Stars of five points.

Or — Gold color or yellow, represented by dots.

Orb — A small globe, usually surmounted with a cross — the emblem of sovereignty.

Orle — A border of double lines surrounding the field at some distance from the edge.

Pallets — Narrow perpendicular stripes (as for instance those on the National shield of the U. S.). When the number is mentioned the shield is described as paly of as many as there are stripes. The U. S. shield is "paly of thirteen pieces."

Panache — Feather coronet.

Passant — Moving or walking across the shield.

Per fess — When the shield is divided horizontally across the centre.

Per pale — When the shield is divided perpendicularly through the centre.

Plume — On English coins the three feathers of Wales. See 336, p. 72.

Proper — In its natural color.

Quarterly or Quartered — Divided into rectangular parts, four, six (see 86, p. 105), or more; if of more than four, the number is usually named.

Quarterly-quartered — When one (or more quarters) is quartered. See 288, p. 70.

Quatrefoil — A rosette of four leaves or points.

Rampant — A lion or any beast of prey erect on his hind legs as if in fighting attitude, is said to be rampant.

Sable — Black, represented by horizontal crossed by perpendicular lines.

Saltire — Two bands crossing each other and the shield diagonally; called St. Andrew's cross if the ends do not touch the edge of the shield.

Semee — When the field of a shield is strewn with minor objects, as lilies, hearts, etc.

Sinister — The side of the shield on the bearer's left, but on the observer's right.

Stars, in heraldry, have six or more points [see mullets].

Supporters — Figures standing at the sides of a shield, as if to support it.

Tierce in pale — A shield divided perpendicularly into three equal parts. See 4, p. 116.

Tincture — A term used in heraldry to express color, as distinguished from "metals." There are only two "metals," *or*, gold or yellow, and *argent*, silver or white, used; the tinctures are azure, gules, vert, sable, etc. It is incorrect to put metal on metal, or color on color; metal must be on color, and vice versa. The arms of Jerusalem, which form the only exception, are silver, a cross potent between four small crosses, gold, where the allusion is to Psalm lxviii. 13, and of the five crosses to the five wounds of our Lord.

Tressure — A border surrounding the edge of a shield. It may be single or double. The arms of Scotland have a double tressure "flory-counterflory" — that is, adorned with fleurs-de-lis, the points of the flowers turning in or out alternately. See 55, p. 78. (Not exactly correct as engraved.)

Vert — Green, represented by diagonal lines from upper left (dexter) to lower right (sinister)!

Volant — Flying, said of birds, bees, etc.

Wavy — Having undulating edges (sometimes called undee).

Wyvern — An imaginary creature, resembling a dragon, but with only two legs.

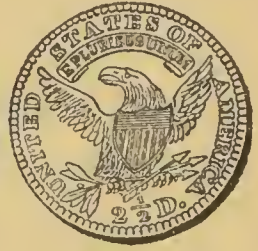

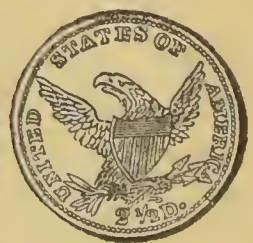

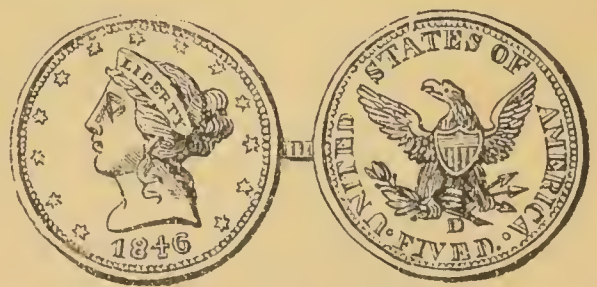

PRIVATE ISSUES OF GOLD COINS IN THE UNITED STATES.

With a single exception (Ephraim Brasher), this series was issued between the years 1830 and 1862, and by far the greater portion from 1849, the period of gold discovery, and consequent rapid settlement of California, to the last important development of gold in Colorado, the year following the breaking out of the Rebellion, which undoubtedly curtailed operations; and by the now existing laws of this country there can be no revival of private

coinages bearing such close resemblance to authorized mint issues. 1875 is about the closing year of ¼, ½ and \$1 pieces which possessed weight and fineness approximate to legal issues and were current; thereafter followed base representations, charms, bangles, etc., which we do not chronicle or traffic in.

Arrangement is alphabetical, by proper names found on the pieces (usually on the

head where such type is given). Those with CALIFORNIA, SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA GOLD MINES, etc., without other or further identity, together with those which have neither name nor place, will be found under CALIFORNIA. "Ins(cription) only," implies that there is no device on the coin. There are varieties in some of the issues beyond the difference in date. The Royal Arms of Denmark are displayed in full on this coin. The shield is divided into four quarters by the national white cross, having a border of red, to represent the red field of the Danish ensign. In the first quarter, Denmark, as described above; second, gold, two lions passant in pale azure, for Sleswick; third, per fess, in chief, Sweden; in base, gules, a stockfish argent, crowned gold, for Iceland; impaling azure, a buck passant argent, for Faroe Islands, and azure, a polar bear rampant argent, for Greenland; fourth, per fess, gold, ten hearts gules, a lion passant azure, in chief, for Jutland, and in base, gules, a wyvern gold, for Vandalia. On an inescutcheon quarterly, 1, Holstein; 2, a swan, for Stormark; 3, a knight for Ditzmers, and 4, a horse's head for Lauenburgh; on a smaller inescutcheon, Oldenburgh impaling Dalmenhurst.

Coins of Denmark ending with this reign, having crossed hammers (like second cut, second column, page 92), were struck for Norway.

The arms of Spain were quarterly 1 and 4 gulcs, a castle triple-towered gold, for Castile; 2 and 3 argent, a lion rampant gulcs, for Leon. In base a pomegranate for Granada. These were quartered by Ferdinand and Isabella in the first and fourth quarters, with Arragon which used the ancient arms of Provence, gold, four pallets gulcs, impaling Navarre, gulcs, a double orle, saltire and cross, composed of a chain from an annulet in the centre point, gold, in the second and third. Each of these devices has a symbolic significance, too long to be given here. The sheaf of arrows on the reverse of the coins illustrated below was also a device of Arragon.

Letters C. L. refer to Castile and Leon.
