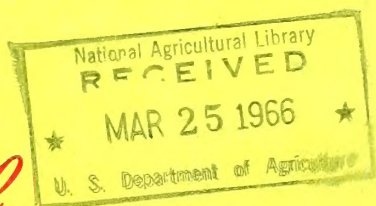

Matterhorn (above) Hybrid Tea. (Armstrong & Swim.) *Plant Pat. App. For.* Here is a new white Hybrid Tea of exceptional vigor. Matterhorn features ivory-white buds of near perfect form and shape on a very free-branching plant that produces an extraordinary number of long-stemmed flowers. The color is an exceptionally good, clear ivory-white turning to more of a cream at the base of the petals. Buds are urn shaped, well formed, and longer than average, with petals curving out exquisitely at the top of the bud. Flowers are high centered and quite double, with 30 or more petals. The plant is vigorous, tall, upright but branching with good strong canes and large, rich, glossy green foliage.

Indiana (see cover) Hybrid Tea. (The House of Meilland.) *Plant Pat. App. For.* Indiana is one of the brightest, most attractive red roses you've ever seen . . . a true red, a solid, bright cardinal-red that holds well. The bright red buds open to high-centered, fully double, cup-shaped blooms of excellent form and profile. The large blooms of 35 to 40 petals are held firmly on strong stems of medium length. The brilliant blooms are set so close to the compact, well-branched bush that they seem to become part of it—creating a rich tapestry of green and red. The foliage is heavy, large, deep green and plentiful, covering the medium tall plant in a solid mass. There is a light, pleasing fragrance. American Heritage (not illustrated) Hybrid Tea. (Lammerts.) *Plant Pat. App. For.* This new rose is distinguished by a continuous succession of changing color; shades of cream with light canary-yellow in the opening flower, contrasting with scarlet and vermilion at the half-open stage plus a flush of crimson on the petal edges of the mature bloom. In the bud, American Heritage is perfection itself—very long, tapering and urn shaped. The mature flowers, containing 50 to 60 petals, are quite large, 5 inches across and full bodied, with high centers. This is a tall vigorous plant with large, leathery, semi-glossy leaves of dark olive-green. A light tea fragrance adds the final touch of distinction to this worthwhile new addition to America's gardens.



Villa De Madrid (below) Hybrid Tea. (Pedro Dot.) Plant Pat. 2462. This rose has very beautiful, very exciting color which changes from a crisp, deep orange-pink in the newly opened bud to a bold barn-red with touches of scarlet at the petal edges. A tall, upright grower, Villa de Madrid produces free continuous bloom on strong stems of good cutting length. The medium size blooms are of excellent substance, come usually one to the stem and consist of 50 to 60 well-shaped, medium sized petals. Villa de Madrid is at its sparkling best in spring and fall, although bloom is very consistent throughout the season. Emerald-green, scarab-like leaves and a rare, light musk fragrance add to the "Old World" beauty of this new rose from the most famous Spanish hybridizer.

Camelot (below) Grandiflora. (Swim & Weeks.) *Plant Pat.* 2371. Camelot is a luminous, coral-pink rose with a shimmering iridescence. The buds, high centered at first, then somewhat cupped, open to blooms of classic beauty 5 inches and more across, each having a very rich, spicy fragrance. These abundantly petaled, double blooms of firm substance are borne usually three or more on long, strong-stemmed candelabra. Tall, sturdy canes hold them upright, ready for cutting or admiring. Bloom comes freely all summer long, with the lively coral-pink color remaining rich and radiant. This is an easy-to-care-for variety, too. The bud is medium large and pointed, opening slowly to add to the long-lasting quality of the flowers. The flower is solidly substantial, its 50 to 60 petals forming a large bloom which is high centered and very double, of excellent exhibition quality. Plant is tall, vigorous and upright with rich green foliage and light tea fragrance. An extraordinary rose.

King's Ransom (below) Hybrid Tea. (Morey.) *Plant Pat. 2103.* Here is a vibrant, big rose which produces splendid gleaming golden yellow blooms. From the medium size, tightly curled bud, big 5 to 6-inch, fully double, golden flowers show excellent form with delightful high centers. The bloom comes singly on long stems; excellent for cutting. The plant is medium tall and grows fairly upright with good strong, heavy canes. The foliage is a good shiny green on the upper sides and a satiny, darker green on the undersides. Good, lingering fragrance.

Fragrance is a light tea. *Garden State* should be planted in the "back row," where its impressive stature will not be lost. As a rose that can be grown and shown with pride, it was especially chosen to be named "*Garden State*" to honor the 300th Anniversary of the founding of the state of New Jersey.

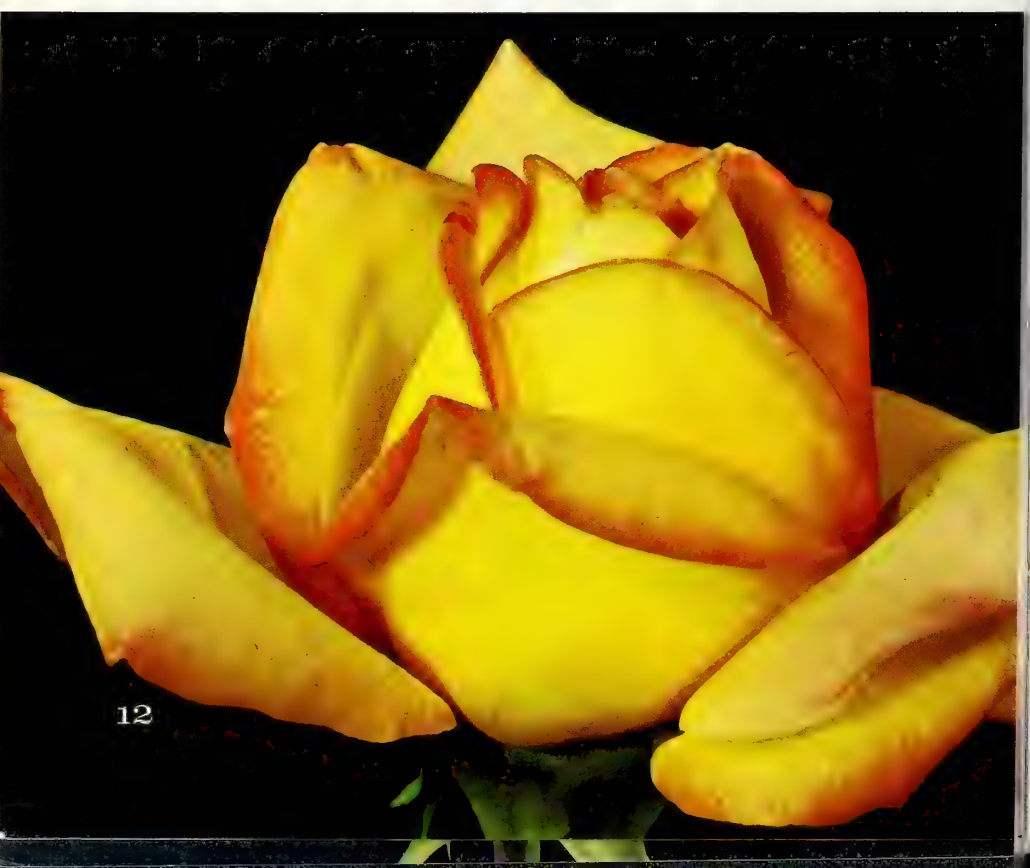

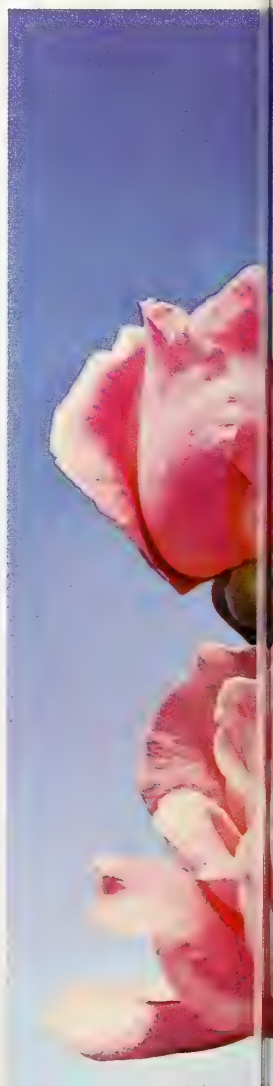


Confidence (above) Hybrid Tea. (The House of Meiland.) *Plant Pat. 1192*. One of the most rewarding roses you can have. Confidence is noted for the solid magnificence of its form. Its color is an intricate blend of pastel peach tones . . . light yellow at the base of the petals with a delicate shading of shrimp-pink at the petal edges, many times separated with a splash of luminous off-white. The long, streamlined buds open to high-centered, 5-inch blooms of exhibition quality. Confidence has a good sound plant, upright, bushy and solidly branched . . . a rose good enough to win the coveted "Most Beautiful Rose of France" Award.
