The plant is remarkably vigorous, of tall, compact habit and is covered with most attractive, medium green, holly-like foliage. This superb offspring of the famous Queen Elizabeth, with its vigor, disease-resistance, beauty, fragrance and free bloom, is bound to please all who grow it.

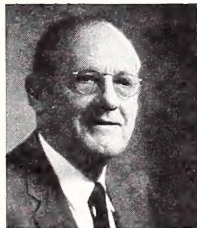

Hybrid Tea. (E. G. Hill.) Plant Pat. App. For. Summer Rainbow is a refreshingly beautiful rose that is strikingly different. With large petals of rich textured pink underlaid with a mist of fine chrome-yellow, it is the kind of rose that always seems to sparkle even in the hot mid-day sun. In bud and bloom, this rose has superb form. The bud is solid but sculptured, much like the famous Peace rose, and opens into a fully double bloom of 50 to 60 petals with good substance. The plant is of medium height, extremely sturdy with very full, medium green foliage. It is an excellent cutting rose, too, and will provide you with tremendous flushes of bloom throughout the season.

Dear Gardening Friends:

For years now, I have heartily recommended the fall planting of roses. In fact, we were the first rose growers to recognize the merits of fall planting and the first to make mature, fall-harvested roses available.

And I continue to recommend fall planting of roses from late October until the ground freezes. In fact, we prefer to plant roses in our gardens here in the fall for three basic reasons:

1. Roses planted in the fall become settled and established. Growth breaks faster and stronger when spring comes, giving a better plant and earlier bloom the first season.
2. The weather is likely to be more pleasant than in very early spring and the soil dryer and more suitable to work.

3. Spring is a busy time for every gardener. Fall planting gives you that much more free time to enjoy the beauties of spring.

Our roses are shipped to you fresh-dug from our fields, in prime condition for fall planting. And of course, every Star Rose is guaranteed to grow and bloom. Fall planting does make good sense and I sincerely hope that you will take advantage of the benefits it has to offer. One word of caution, however. To those of you living in areas where winter temperatures are apt to fall to 10° below zero or more, I would not recommend fall planting. Benefits here are borderline and I would suggest that you plant your roses in the spring.

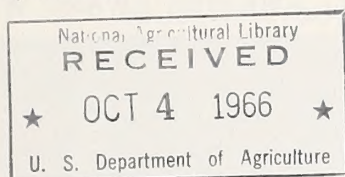

Lady X (right) NEW FOR 1967! Hybrid Tea. (The House of Meilland.) *Plant Pat. App. For.* Lady X is an exciting new color in roses—a soft, cool pink-lavender, ever so lightly brushed with polished silver. It's a refreshing color that's hard to describe, but quick to catch and please the eye. Though delicately beautiful, the color holds well, making Lady X a fine cutting rose. The "high-fashion" stylish bud is long and slender, opening slowly into a double, high-centered bloom made more attractive as the petal edges roll outward in scroll-like fashion. The long-lasting flowers are of good substance, medium large in size and held on tall graceful stems. A quite tall, well-branched, vigorous plant makes Lady X a "back-row" display rose. Thorns are scarce, and heavy green foliage is perfect for the height of the rose and complements its lovely color. Lady X is truly aristocratic as any great lady must be, and a light alluring fragrance identifies her as a woman of exquisite taste.

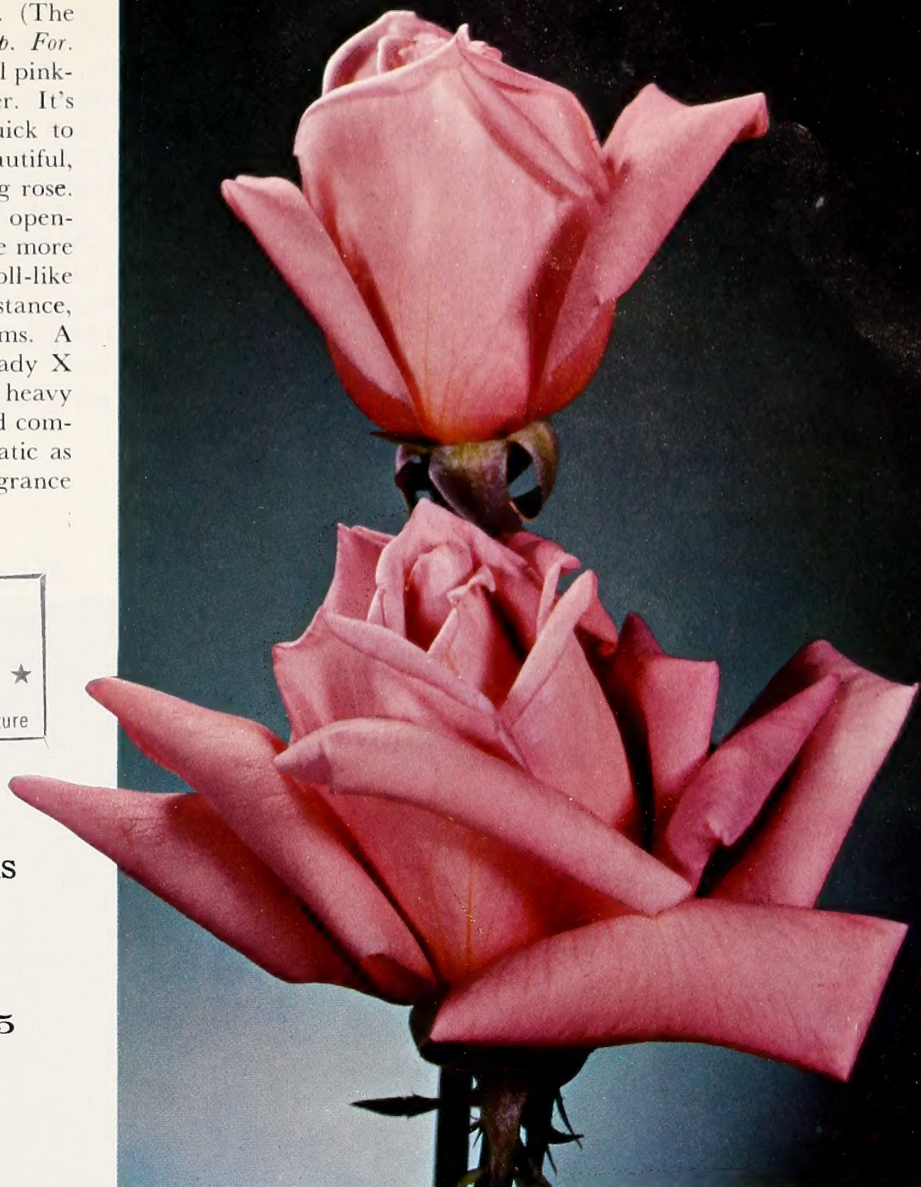

Mister Lincoln (left) Hybrid Tea. (Swim & Weeks.) *Plant Pat. 2370.* We believe this to



be the finest red rose of all time. Strong, vibrant and beautiful, Mister Lincoln produces masses of deep, velvety-red blooms, 6 inches wide, that stand tall on the plant and are very pleasing. The bud is long, full and well-pointed, becoming urn-shaped as the petals begin to curl back from their high centers. The flowers are ideal for cutting—long-stemmed beauties that hold their form and color well and look especially brilliant in a bouquet even under artificial lighting. With heavy, well-branched, long canes, Mister Lincoln, used as a plant standing alone or placed in the "back row," lifts your garden to new heights of beauty. Large, glossy, dark green leaves are tailor-made for this very vigorous plant.

Lucky Lady (right) Grandiflora.

 *Plant Pat. App. For.* This new Grandiflora is outstanding for the lovely and unusual pink color of the buds and flowers, for the exceptional vigor of the rounded, beautifully foliaged plant, and for the great quantities of blooms which it carries. The urn-shaped bud is larger than average and the double flower is made up of 25 to 30 large petals which recurve gracefully and give a fully double appearance throughout its life. The flower is actually a bicolor—light, clear pink on the face of the petal and deeper, reddish pink on the reverse—a most lively, cheerful shade of pink. Typical of a Grandiflora, this free-blooming variety carries some of its flowers in clusters, but many of them on single, strong stems. A tall, vigorous grower with excellent foliage.

American Heritage (right) Hybrid Tea. (Lammerts.) Plant Pat. App. For.

 Here is a new rose distinguished by a continuous succession of changing color—shades of cream with light canary-yellow in the opening flower, contrasting with scarlet and vermillion at the half-open stage plus a flush of crimson on the petal edges of the mature bloom. In the bud, American Heritage is perfection itself—very long, tapering and urn-shaped. The mature flowers, containing 50 to 60 petals, are quite large—5 inches across and more—full-bodied and high-centered. It is a tall vigorous plant with large, leathery, semi-glossy leaves having a striking red coloration blended with dark olive-green. HYBRID TEA ROSES

These are the roses one normally thinks of when the word “rose” is mentioned. Hybrid Tea roses, sometimes called “monthly,” usually have large pointed buds and normally come singly to a stem although sometimes three. Bloom is in the more classic style, being usually high-centered, with good form and substance.

Hybrid Tea roses many times grow to a height of 6 feet or more, although many are lower growing, with medium to long cutting stems. Colors and fragrance come in a wide range, depending upon the kind.

Grandiflora Roses can best be described as having the blooming habit of the Floribunda but with the height and growing habit of the Hybrid Tea.

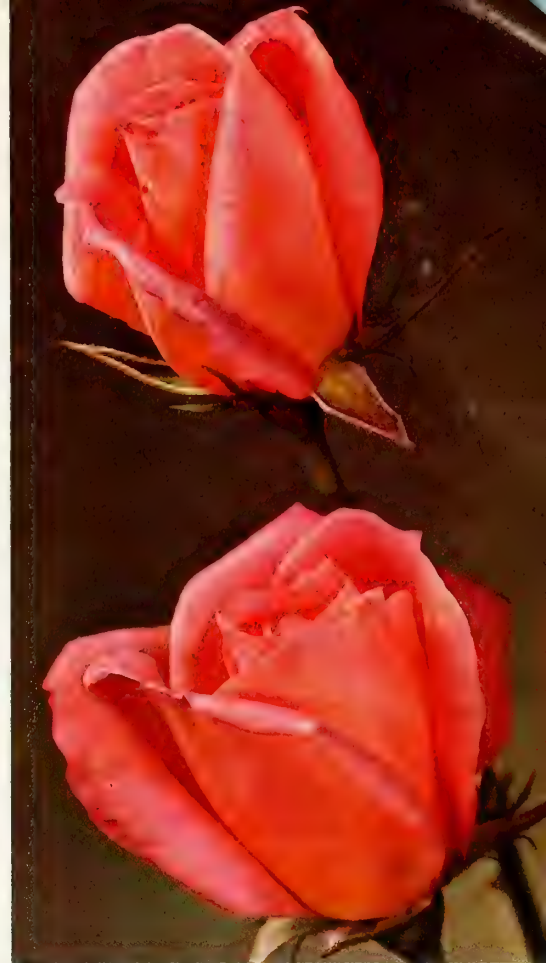
