Introduction

Extension work in 1937 was carried on by 6430 county extension agents and assistant agents (Table 1) assisted by 1163 full-time and 353 part-time subject-matter specialists.

The statistical information contained in this report is based on the annual reports submitted by 5524 extension agents whose reports also included the work of assistant agents.

National Program of Work

During 1937 the programs of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration. Soil Conservation, Farm Security, Rural Electrification, Tennessee Valley Authority, and other Federal agencies working in rural areas continued to receive major attention from county extension agents in general and particularly from county agricultural agents. Taking all county extension agents together, 15.05 percent of their time was devoted to A. A. and relief programs as compared to 18.94 percent in 1936; 27.87 percent in 1935; and 39.69 percent in 1934.

The distribution of agents' time and the field time of specialists, by projects, is given in Table 2. For purpose of comparison the corresponding percentages for 1936, 1935, 1934, and 1933 are also given.

As will be noted somewhat less emphasis was placed upon farm crops extension during 1937 than in 1936. The greatest decrease, however, was in agricultural economics where the proportion of time devoted to the line of work declined from 13.7 percent in 1936 to 8.7 percent in 1937. This lessened emphasis on agricultural economics extension can be partially, if not entirely, explained by the shift from county planning as a separate A. A. A. project closely identified with the agricultural economics specialists to extension program planning so organized in many States as to include the A. A. A. planning project. The percentage of time devoted to formulating the extension program increased from 10.9 percent in 1936 to 13.4 percent in 1937.

Result Demonstrations

The total number of adult result demonstrations conducted in 1937 was 867,504 as compared to 881,208 for 1936 and 788,615 for 1935. The number of projects completed by club members was 1,593,329 as compared to 1,432,846 in 1936 and 1,242,323 in 1935. (Table 3)

Regarding adult demonstrations, all projects showed an increase in 1937 over 1936 excepting horticulture, animal husbandry, poultry, agricultural engineering, agricultural economics, home health and sanitation, and miscellaneous. Largest increases occurred in foods and nutrition and legumes and forage crops.

In connection with 4-H club projects completed, there was an increase in 1937 over 1936 in all projects except legumes and forage crops and agricultural economics.

4-H Club Work

The upward trend in 4-H club enrollment indicated in 1935 and 1936 was further accelerated in 1937 when 46,877 more boys and girls participated in 4-H club activities than in either of the two previous years. The number of boys and girls completing the work outlined was 62,459 larger than in 1936. The number of projects started was higher in 1937 by 177,395 and the number of projects completed higher by 160,483 than in 1936. (Table 4)

The increased volume of 4-H club work was directly due to the enlarged Extension staff financed through Bankhead-Jones funds. The increase came largely through increased re-enrollment of former club members.

According to Table 5a, 69.16 percent of the boys and girls were enrolled in club work two years and under, 14.08 percent were enrolled three years, while the other 16.76 percent have been in club work for a period of four years or more. The average length of membership of 1937 club members was 2.24 years for boys and 2.20 years for girls, or 2.22 years for both boys and girls.

From Table 5b, it will be noted that 40.94 percent of the boys and girls in club work were 12 years old and under. 39.68 percent were 13 to 15 years inclusive, and the remainder, or 19.38 percent were from 16 to 20 years of age and older.

Extension Work with Young Farmers and Farm Women

In addition to the large increase in volume of 4-H club work during 1937, extension work with rural young people 16 to 25 years of age who were not in 4-H clubs increased materially also. The number of such organized groups increased from 2,020 in 1936 to 2,065 in 1937. The membership in such special groups increased from 51,204 in 1936 to 59,637 in 1937.

Summary of Extension Influence

The 1937 report summary indicates that on 3,445,046 farms changes in practices resulted from the agricultural extension program, while the home economics extension program influenced the adoption of improved practices in 1,238,420 farm homes and 426,466 other homes. (Table 6) The 1,192,385 4-H club members enrolled in 1937 came from 723,643 farm homes and 178,659 other homes.

A total of 4,888,955 rural families were definitely influenced by some phase of the 1937 extension program. Of this number 4,167,123 were farm families and 721,832 were other families. The farm families influenced represent approximately 61 percent of all the farm families in counties with extension agents.

This is, of course, difficult information for agents to obtain accurately so agents were instructed to make a conservative estimate based upon such records, surveys, and other sources of information as were available.

Statistical Summary

Detailed statistical information regarding extension activities and accomplishments during the year is listed in Table 6. Much of the information on general activities is given separately for home demonstration agents, 4-H club agents, and agricultural agents. In the case of projects only totals are given.

A complete summary of all 4-H club work is given in Table 7, page 51.

Work in Cooperation with Other Federal Agencies

In the Supplemental Report (Tables 8 and 9 pages 54 and 55) an attempt has been made to bring together for the first time all work done by county extension agents in relation to the programs of the A. A. A., Soil Conservation Service, and other Federal Agencies.
