NO-SHOWS COST THE NHS £1.5

PATIENTS failed to turn up to nearly 15,000 appointments at Dudley's hospitals in just six months - costing the NHS £1.5 million.

Hundreds of hours of clinic time were lost due to people missing their

were lost due to people missing their out-patient appointments between January and June this year.

Paula Clark, chief executive of The Dudley Group NHS Foundation Trust, which runs Russells Hall Hospital and the Guest Outpatient Centre, both in Dudley, and Corbett Outpatient Centre in Stourbridge, said a total of 14,817 sessions were missed.

She is now urging patients to warn hospital staff if they can't make it, so someone else can have the slot.

Every time a patient fails to show, it costs the hospital trust an average of around £70. This

Every time a patient fails to show, it costs the hospital trust an average of around £70. This includes the staffing resource wasted and the cost of additional letters and time taken to reschedule appointments.

Ms Clark said: "When a patient doesn't attend on the day, it's too late to offer their slot to somebody else. If patients can't attend their appointment, it's really important that they let us know so we can reschedule for another time and offer the appointment to somebody else who needs it.

"To help reduce the number of DNAs (did not attends) we have introduced a text message reminder service which reminds patients a few

reminder service which reminds patients a few days before they are due to have an appoint-

ment."

The free text reminders contain the date and time of the appointment as well as the location and name of the clinician that the patient is due to see. The hospital trust has previously posted reminder messages on its website, urging people to contact staff if they are unable to attend.

Waste

Last year, between January 1 and December

Last year, between January 1 and December 31, a total of 40,719 appointments were missed by patients.

In July, health secretary Jeremy Hunt said missed hospital appointments cost the tax-payer £750m and missed GP appointments cost £162m. It's estimated 6.9 million slots go to worst because people do not turn up.

Mr Hunt said patients who miss appointments should be told how much they have cost the NHS. He also wants to display the cost of prescription medicines on packets in a bid to seduce reddient water. reduce medicine waste.

The bill at Dudley comes as bosses work to balance the books in the wake of Government funding cuts. Bosses have been reviewing the positions of temporary staff, those on fixed-term contracts, and bank and agency workers. They have also been looking at reducing overtime and recruitment to non-clinical vacancies to claw back costs.



Morrisons drop deal for Seven Stars

SUPERMARKET giant Morrisons has pulled out of a deal which would have seen a Sedgley pub demolished and replaced with a convenience store – much to the delight of cam-

Protesters who have been trying to save the Seven Stars in Sedgley were handed the unexpected boost as the troubled company withdrew its licensing application for a new store.

Morrisons had appeared all set to take over the pub after being granted planning permission when Dudley Council's decision to reject the appli-

cation was overturned at appeal. But the saga surrounding the Gospel End Road venue has taken another twist with the supermarket chain pulling

Earlier this month the firm an-Earner this month the firm announced that it was to sell off 140 M local convenience stores, many of which were making a loss. The new store to replace the Seven Stars was primed to be an M local store.

Then last week. Morrisons announced it was to close 11 of its supermarkets, including sites in West Bromwich and Oldbury.

It came after the company posted disappointing profits results in March, reporting a 52 per cent slump. Morrisons spokesman James French said: "I can confirm that we

have withdrawn the current licence application on the Seven Stars." Campaigners have claimed victory after hearing their news but there re-

mains a question mark over whether Greybull Capital, which purchased the M local stores, will take over from where Morrisons left off and try

to put a store on the site themselves.

A fierce campaign has been led by

try to save the pub since Morrisons first confirmed its interest late last

year.

Activists even staged a protest outside the headquarters of Marston's brewery, which owns the pub, in Wolverhampton to get their message

Wolverhampton to get their message across to bosses.
Sedgley Councillor and UKIP MEP
Bill Etheridge, who has been part of the campaign, said: "This is great news for the local community, who fought so long and so hard to keep their pub.".

Residents have been battling proposals by New River Retail to tear down the Maypole Inn, Halesowen, and replace it with a Co-Operative convenience store. They have also fought plans for a store on the car park of the Ashwood Inn, Wordsley.

The public gallery at Dudley Counci's development control committee was filled with cheers as both schemes were rejected.

development control committee was filled with cheers as both schemes were rejected on Monday. A similar plan to build a Co-Op store on the car park at The Crown, in Netherton, was approved after councillors received only four letters of objection.

New River Retail are now considering their next step. Defiant campaigners said they were ready to continue the battle. New River Retail has submitted plans at several pubs across the Black Country after brewery Marston's sold 202 pubs in a £90 million deal

Demolish

The plan to demolish the Maypole was discussed by the planning committee following a visit to the site. Chairman Councillor Qadar Zada said he could see no planning grounds to refuse the proposal. Councillors disagreed. Councillor Colin Elock said: "This is a great pub and we should take into consideration people do not want to lose it." The Bassnage Road pub has been listed as an 'asset of community value'. Members were told this carried no weight in planning terms.

But councillors refused on the grounds the pub was well used by the community and too close to existing retail outlets.

Councillors next discussed plans for the Ashwood Inn, in Sandringham Road. While the pub would be retained there were concerns over the loss of car parking spaces and traffic congestion. Councillor Paul Brothwood said: "The residents of Wordsley have made it absolutely clear they do not support this application."

Mr Martin Hughes, spokesman for New River Retail, said: "We have heard the grounds given for refusal and believe these will not be sustained at appeal." The plan to demolish the Maypole was



Prosecuting, Mr Narmola, said Southall had been living in various houses with her partner over the period she received the payments, with-out notifying the authorities.

He said the total overpayment of £40,323 consisted of £13,743 in income support, £23,345 in housing benefit and £3,234 in council tax ben-

THE big news this week, on the front pages and trumpeted by TV and radio, is that Facebook is to launch a "dislike" button. The small and rather neglected news is that North Korea has fired up its nuclear programme to make bigger and better hydrogen bombs. Interesting priorities.

"It's been wild and quite emotional too," he added.

Ethan Mills, 21, of West Bromwich; Benjamin Wilkes, 22, of Brierley Hill; Geoffrey Hackett, 46, of Halesowen; and Steven and Louise Cooper, both 37 of Halesowen; all pleaded guilty to affray earlier.

37 of Halesowen; all pleaded guilty to affray earlier. Mr Edward Soulsby, prosecuting, explained Louise Cooper, of Wesley Avenue, had been seen on the dance floor punching towards the other group.

Mills, of Claypit Lane, who was with the other party, then started to punch at Cooper's group.

Mills had been ejected but mother-of-four Cooper had continued to cause a disturbance. Her husband Steven Cooper then hit out at Mr Ellis.

Outside Hackett, of Apperley Way, had walked up and punched Mr Ellis to the back of the head.

Mr Soulsby said: "Police had arrived. One of the officers was approached by Wilkes who kicked him in the leg. This was the worst disorder the River Rooms has ever seen."

Judge James Burbitge QC said Mills and Louise Cooper, a home care assistant, had been the most

Cooper, a home care assistant, had been the most 'persistent' during the fracas.

Mills was sentenced to four months imprisonment

suspended for 12 months, ordered to carry out 100 hours of unpaid work and ordered to pay Mr Ellis compensation of £200.

Louise Cooper was sentenced to two months imprisonment suspended for a year. She was also ordered to carry out 130 hours unpaid work. Her

husband was given a community order for 12 months and 50 hours unpaid work. Hackett was given a four month prison sentence suspended for 12 months and 100 hours unpaid work. He was ordered to pay Mr Ellis £200 compensation.

Wilkes was given a 12-month community order, 150 hours unpaid work and ordered to pay £400 compensation to the police officer.

Strum-thing special for a father and son

SIMON PENFOLD meets a family duo who are hoping to make it in the music world with their carefully crafted guitars

IT has been a long, tough and sometimes heartbreaking journey, but engineer Tony Wright says he is now 'living the dream' - working alongside his youngest son, crafting hand-made guitars in a small workshop in Wolverhampton.

Like most teenagers, Tony picked up a guitar. But unlike most he kept on play-

guitar. But unlike most he kept on playing and eventually learned electric bass.

Now, 43 years on, he and son Sam are launching their own business, Lakestone Guitars, and rapidly building a strong reputation for the quality of their work and the beautiful tone produced by their guitars.

Father and son say they have been supported by their love for their craft as luthiers—a term their love for their craft as luthiers—a term

their love for their craft as luthiers - a term their love for their crait as ittiners – a term dating back to the original lute makers of the 15th and 16th centuries. Their current pro-fession is a million miles from where Tony started, training as an apprentice fitter with Robinson Brothers in West Bromwich in 1972.

Redesigning

His engineering career went from strength to strength. Working for an engineering consultancy in Wolverhampton he found himself redesigning the machine at the Cadbury factory at Bournville that makes the Curly Wurly. "That was in 1982, and as far as I know it's still working today," said Tony, who lives in Gornal

Gornal.

After completing a two-year degree course at the former Wolverhampton Polytechnic, Tony switched to working in education, and was rapidly head-hunted as design lecturer at was rapidly head-hunted as design lecturer at Dudley College and then appointed as head of department. Meanwhile, he had taught himself to make electric guitars. "I had been asked to play with a group of musicians who were professionals or semi-pro, and I decided I needed something better than my old Squire bass. I bought one in Birmingham but didn't like the tone, and when I took it back I saw

Sam Wright, aged 25, and his father Tony, 59, one hanging on the shop wall that used to be owned by Mark King, from Level 42. It sounded fantastic, but I looked at the price and it was £3,500 – a lot of money in the 1980s. So it went back on the wall.

"I thought, I'm a design engineer, I can learn how to make one. I did it in my spare time, lunch hours in the college workshop."
But in 1989 Tony suffered a massive heart attack. He tried to return to work but the stress was too great and he had to take early retirement. He carried on with the guitar making and repairs in his garden shed, and also worked part-time as a pastor at his church. His guitars, meanwhile, were building a small but appreciative audience among ing a small but appreciative audience among skilled plavers.

skilled players.

Then, eight years ago, his wife of 30 years died from cancer. "Our faith helped get us through, but I just didn't want to make guitars any more," said Tony. Sam, the youngest son and a talented musician in his own right, was also struggling. "There were days he just didn't want to get out of bed," said Tony. "He had made his first guitar at 13 or 14, so I said

are making guitars together in Wolverhampton let's go and make guitars. I started making acoustics because it was something new for me, we could learn together."

Learning to make acoustic guitars well can take decades, but the Wrights had a stroke of luck. Tony had invented a device called a universal fret slotter that could accurately fit the frets on guitar necks to within one 4,000th of an inch. They have been sold globally and led to a call from world-renowned guitar maker George Lowden. Working on a series of projects at Lowden's factory in Northern Ireland resulted in a masterclass for Tony in the skills and intricacies of making acoustic guitars.

He's passed these skills on to Sam and to his musician friend Dan Clark, who offered the duo his garage in Wolverhampton as their workshop as the business outgrew the shed in Gornal. After months of work, which included turning the garage into a temperature and humidity-controlled environment, father and son are launching Lakestone Guitars – hoping to make at least two miters a month. Currently

pie, producing a warmer sound. Even on electric guitars, the wood makes a big difference. Maple, used for Fender-style guitars, will produce a brasher sound, while the mahogany used for a Gibson style instru-ment will offer a warmer tone.

Thinner

Alongside a craftsman's knowledge of his materials, Tony brings 21st century engineering nous. He likes making guitars with thinner necks and has come up with a way of using carbon fibre to strengthen them. He is also making guitars with a distinctive fan fret, like his mentor George Lowden. It improves the sound and is easier to play. The company name, Lakestone, comes from the old stone quarry near Tony's original shed in Gornal. Depending on the woods used, a Lakestone Guitar will be priced at around £2,500. Tony said: "The business hasn't made a penny yet but I hope it will provide a living for Sam and I, particularly for Sam. I am 59, so I'll have my pension soon, but Sam is only 25. I want this to be a long-running business."

Wolverhampton's highest profile contribution to the battle was the Boulton Paul Defiant fighter, built at Pendeford. Two squadrons of Defiants, No.141 and No.264, Swight alongside the more numerous Spitfought alongside the more numerous Spitfires and Hurricanes during the Battle, with dogfights taking place in the skies un-

with dogfights taking place in the skies until late October, 1940.
Indeed it was a Defant which shot down the Dornier bomber that was so publicly raised from the sea bed off the Kent coast over two years ago, and which is now under long-term restoration at the RAF Museum, in Cosford.

On Battle of Britain Day, Sunday September 20, the Tettenhall Transport Heritage Centre unveiled their new display about the Defiant, and raffled a unique framed photograph of a Defiant on test flight from Pendeford.

The photograph is signed by five former Defiant aircrew who fought in the Battle – pilots Eric Barwell and John Lauder, along with air

gunners Fred Gash and Fred Barker, the latter.

gunners Fred Gash and Fred Barker, the latter, becoming the highest scoring Defiant gunner, with 13 victories to his name.

It is possible therefore Fred might be the highest scoring air gunner of all time.

The fifth signatory, pilot Christopher Deanesly has very special Wolverhampton connections. Not only was he born in Wolverhampton in January 1910, his father Edward Deanesly was an eminent surgeon at the Royal Hospital, and the Deanesly Cancer Centre at New Cross is named after him.

Watson role filled if Hollywood calls



FOR years the European Union was the millstone around

the Tories' necks. Last week it turned into Labour's. Within hours of Jeremy Corbyn becoming the party's leader and by a landslide majority, Wolver-hampton North East MP Emma Reynolds joined an exodus of front benchers.

front benchers.
Chief among her concerns was that Mr Corbyn had been highly critical of the EU and might not only fail to campaign to stay in, he might even have wanted to join the side of 'out'.
She was not alone. Former shadow business secretary Chuka Umunna said: "It is my view that we should support the UK remaining a member of the EU, notwithstanding the outcome of any renegotiation by the Prime Minister, and I cannot envisage any circumstances where I would be campaigning alongside those who would argue for us to leave – Jeremy has made it clear to me that he does

would argue for us to leave – Jeremy has made it clear to me that he does wholeheartedly share this view."
Five days passed and another Wolverhampton MP, the south east's Pat McFadden, still did not know his future. As shadow Europe minister his role, while not in the shadow cabinet, was surely essential.
But it was Thursday night before he was given the news he wanted to hear – Jeremy Corbyn would campaign to stay in the EU. The crucial reassurance for pro-Europe Mr McFadden was that it was not just a passive promise not to campaign to leave. sive promise not to campaign to leave,

but an active one to fight to stay in. If Mr Corbyn could give such assurances to Mr McFadden, then why not to Mr He had said on Wednesday night.

He had said on Wednesday night that Labour's policy on Europe was 'developing'. By Thursday it was well and truly formed.

New move to form West Mids authority

Members of Dudley Council's Conservative group called for a decision to be made so work could finally begin. Earlier this month it was announced that ambitious £50 million regeneration plans, which would see restaurants, shops and housing built, had moved a step closer after 18 months of talks. But at a meeting of Dudley Council's cabinet last week, Tory councillors said greater progress should have been made.

greater progress should have been made. Conservative group leader Councillor Patrick Harley accused council leaders of failing to honour a commit-ment made last year that work would have started by

ment made last year that work would have started by now.

"Last year the ruling Labour group committed to real progress on this scheme by the summer," he said. "Well that has now come and gone so perhaps they meant next summer? In the time the council is taking to decide on which of the three development proposals for this site to pursue, Dudley College has completed three new buildings— all the size of Cavendish House.

"Also, in the same time, Dudley Canal Trust has sought funding from the European Union, designed and almost completed a visitor centre. Yet still the Cavendish House scheme has not started. Progress on this scheme has been as slow and painful as pulling teeth."

In 2014-15, 29 complaints were partly or fully endorsed at five trusts, compared with 13 the previous correct at five trusts, compared with 13 the previous year, despite the total number of complaints to the Parliamentary and Health Service Ombudsman falling, from 248 to 240.

Nationally, there was a 13 per cent rise in complaints, with errors in diagnosis, poor treatment and lack of communication toning the

communication topping the list. Poor attitudes and behaviour of staff were factors in 20 per cent of cases, with non-medical care a factor in almost half of all complaints

Investigations

Royal Wolverhampton NHS Trust saw the number of complaints made to the ombudsman fall from 69 in 2013-14 to 62 last year, although the number of upheld investigations rose from two to nine.

The ombudsman received The ombudsman received 37 inquires regarding care at Dudley Group NHS Foundation Trust, up from 31 in 2013-14, with three complaints upheld following 10 investigations.

Sandwell and West Birmingham Hospitals (SWBH) NHS Trust saw the number of complaints upheld to the

NHS I rust saw the number of complaints made to the ombudsman fall from 90 in 2013-14 to 67 over the last 12 months. Investigations were held into 13 of the complaints, up from 12 the previous year. Seven com-

plaints were fully or partly upheld, up from two. The ombudsman received The ombudsman received 22 inquiries regarding care received at Mid Staffordshire NHS Foundation Trust, down from 25 in 2013-14. Four complaints were fully or partly upheld, up from three last year. Walsall Healthcare NHS Trust saw a steep rise in complaints from 33 to 52 with the number of com-

with the number of complaints upheld doubling to six over the last year. Najam Rashid, associ-ate medical director at the

WORLD-FAMOUS violin virtuoso Nicola Benedetti sobbed WORLD-FAMOUS violin virtuoso Nicola Benedetti sobbed her way through her first violin lesson, aged four. But the 28-year-old from Ayrshire, who was born to a Scottish mother and Italian father, went on to become one of the most popular classical violinists of her generation.

"I cried through my first violin lesson," remembered Nicola. "I was quite shy and am also left-handed, so I continually picked the instrument up the wrong way. My teacher probably got frustrated and I was just so nervous.

"But from the second lesson on I got the barg of it and

"But from the second lesson on I got the hang of it and really progressed quite quickly. Actually, it was the music moving me to tears that hooked me to the violin." At the age of eight she became leader of the National Children's Orchestra of Great Britain and by nine had already passed the eight grades of music exams. Since then she was won two Classical BRIT Awards for Best Female Artist and was awarded an MBE for services to classical music. 

We ordered a bottle of Malbec and made ourselves comfy while we waited for our table which we were told could be up to 45 minutes. But much to our delight, our table

minutes. But much to our delignt, our table was ready in 15 minutes.

There was almost a party atmosphere inside, with a real feeling of celebration being enjoyed by the other diners, so with it being so busy, I was worried that service would suffer. However, we were really well looked after. The starter menu has all the usual fa-

I'd describe as more unusual dishes. Take for example the liver tikka and the rabbit tikka which comes served with a strawberry chutney.

Tempting options included the chicken

I enjoyed the experience at Akbar's. I'd probably go for a different main course next time but my choice wouldn't stor me from

ave your hankies at the ready because one of the most moving ceremonies of the ear is with us again.

Of course, Carol Vorderman is no stranger to The Pride of Britain Awards, but she admits they don't get any easier to host after all these

"it's a massive show to do, the volume that you have to learn and hold and you have to get the tone right," she explains.

"It's a massive show for one It's a massive show no one person to do so I'm exhausted by the end of it, absolutely drained. But I'm also on a high. Then when I watch it, that's when the emotion comes out."

Now in its 17th year, the star-studded gala at London's Grosvenor House Hotel will be packed with uplifting and moving stories of courage, selflessness and achievement against the odds.

Carol admits she's rather proud to be involved once more

"I've been part of it for so long now, ever since it started 17 years

ago. I'm not just someone who is brought in on the night, I've lived it and breathed it."

Is there any winner that stood out for her?

"There have been loads really. The "I nere have been loads really. I ne saddest ones are the children who have been ill and then have either raised a lot of money for charity or done something remarkable and then get ill again and are no longer with us and that's really hard, it really knocks it home."

One of the reasons the shows works so well each year is the fact Carol and the winners get to know each other with a big dinner the night before.

"Because everybody travels down to London from all over the country, it's the first time they have met each other and we introduce them all.

"I try to sit and talk with everybody and at the end of the dinner I go through all of their stories, and what's remarkable is every single one of them turns around and says 'I shouldn't be here, I'm not worthy.'

One of the most poignant prizes of last year was the first posthumous award in honour of Stephen Sutton, the blogger and activist who spent his final days raising money for the Teenage Cancer Trust.

"I remember we pushed his fundraising over the £5million mark on the night," recalls Carol. "But it's not just about people who have been ill. The lifetime achievement awards are for ordinary people that we wouldn't read about in normal Proce. but they have done these. Press, but they have done these remarkable things; they aren't celebrity driven or media driven or anything, and the person who has won that this year is astonishing."

Carol admits plenty of winners made her cry this year.

"One in particular, it was one of the Children of Courage winners. We saw some film at the judging panel. When you read a story it's not the same as seeing it and what this little boy did was extraordinary – I blubbed."


