FIRST ALARM, to be given by striking three or more rounds.

SECOND ALARM to be given by striking ten blows

blows. THIND ALARM to be given by striking twelve blows twice, thus: 12-12. In cases where the *entire department* are re-quired, signal to be given by striking twelve blows three times, thus: 12-12-12. In cases where Hook and Ladder Companies only are wanted, signal to be given by striking ten blows once, with the No. of the Company struck twice, thus: II. & L. No. 1, 10-1-1; II. & L. No. 2, 10-2-2, *etc.* If more than one Hook & Ladder Company is wanted, the signal will be given thus: II. & L. Nos. 1 and 3, 10-1-1-3-3; fI. & L. Nos. 2 and 4, 10-2-2-4-4, *etc.*






