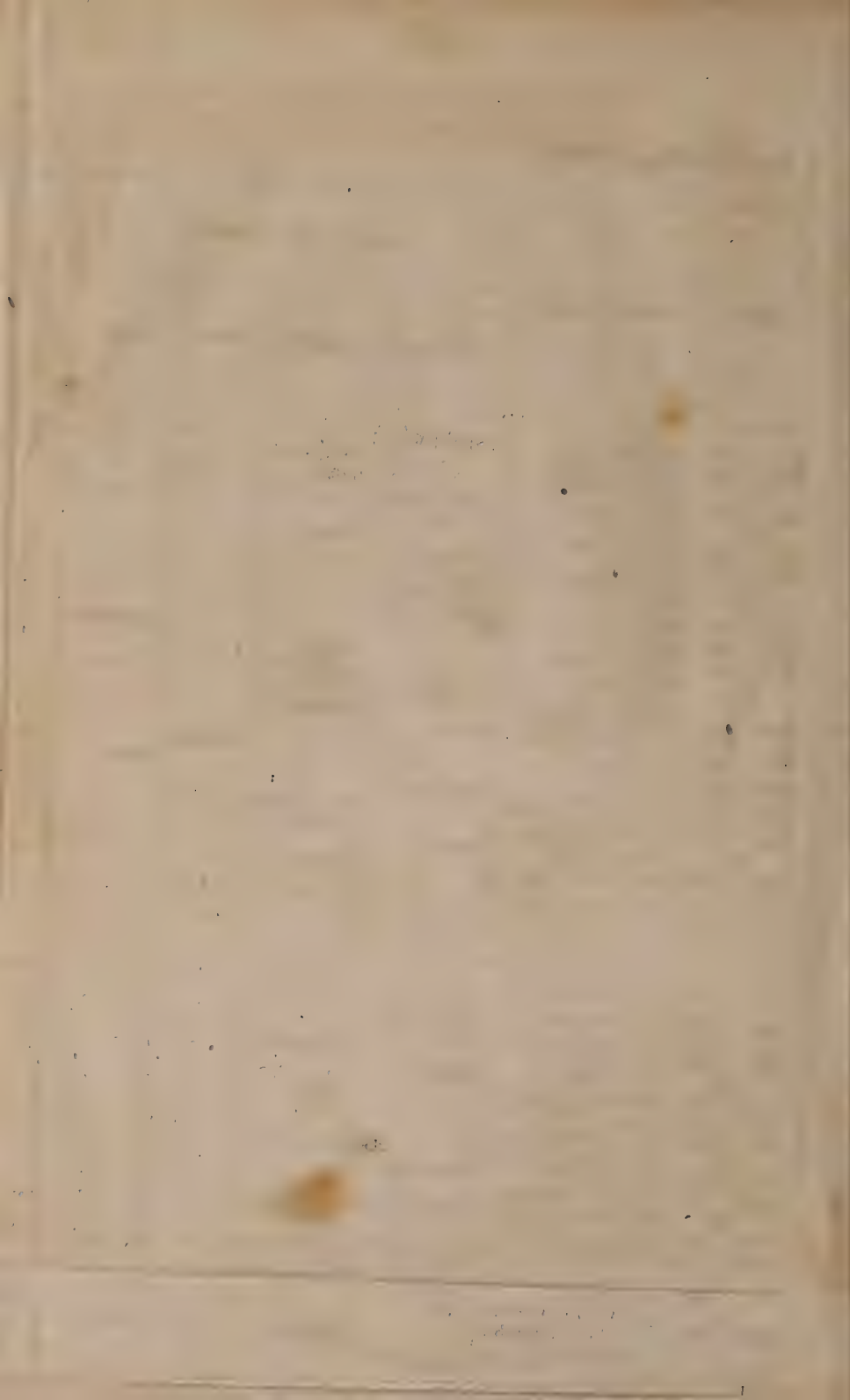

MAP OF LIBERIA.

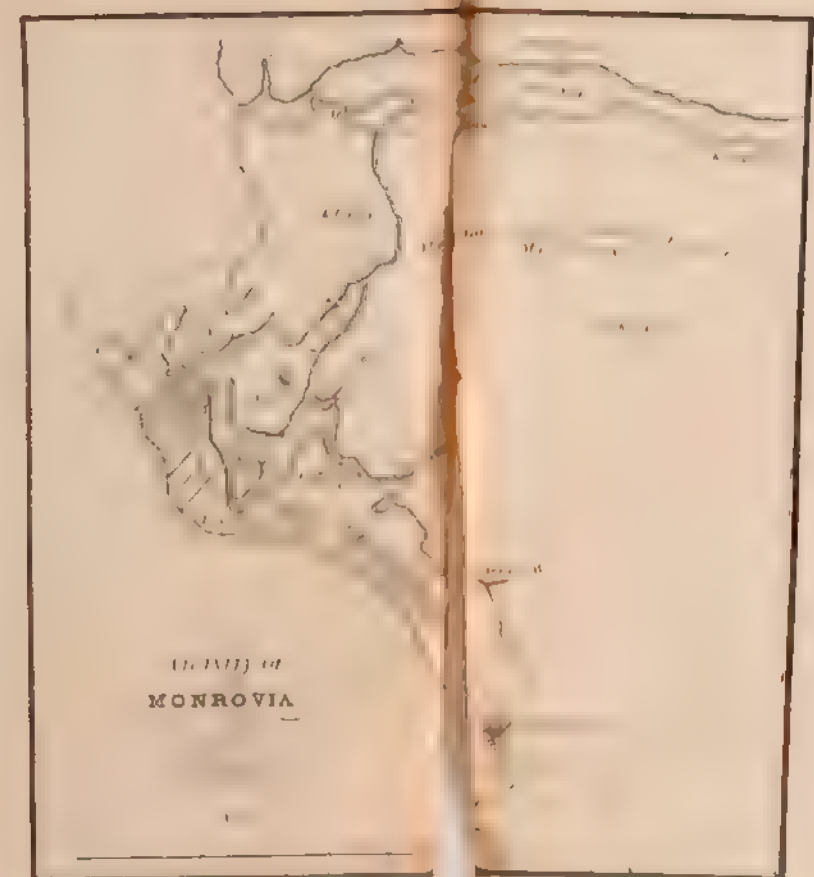

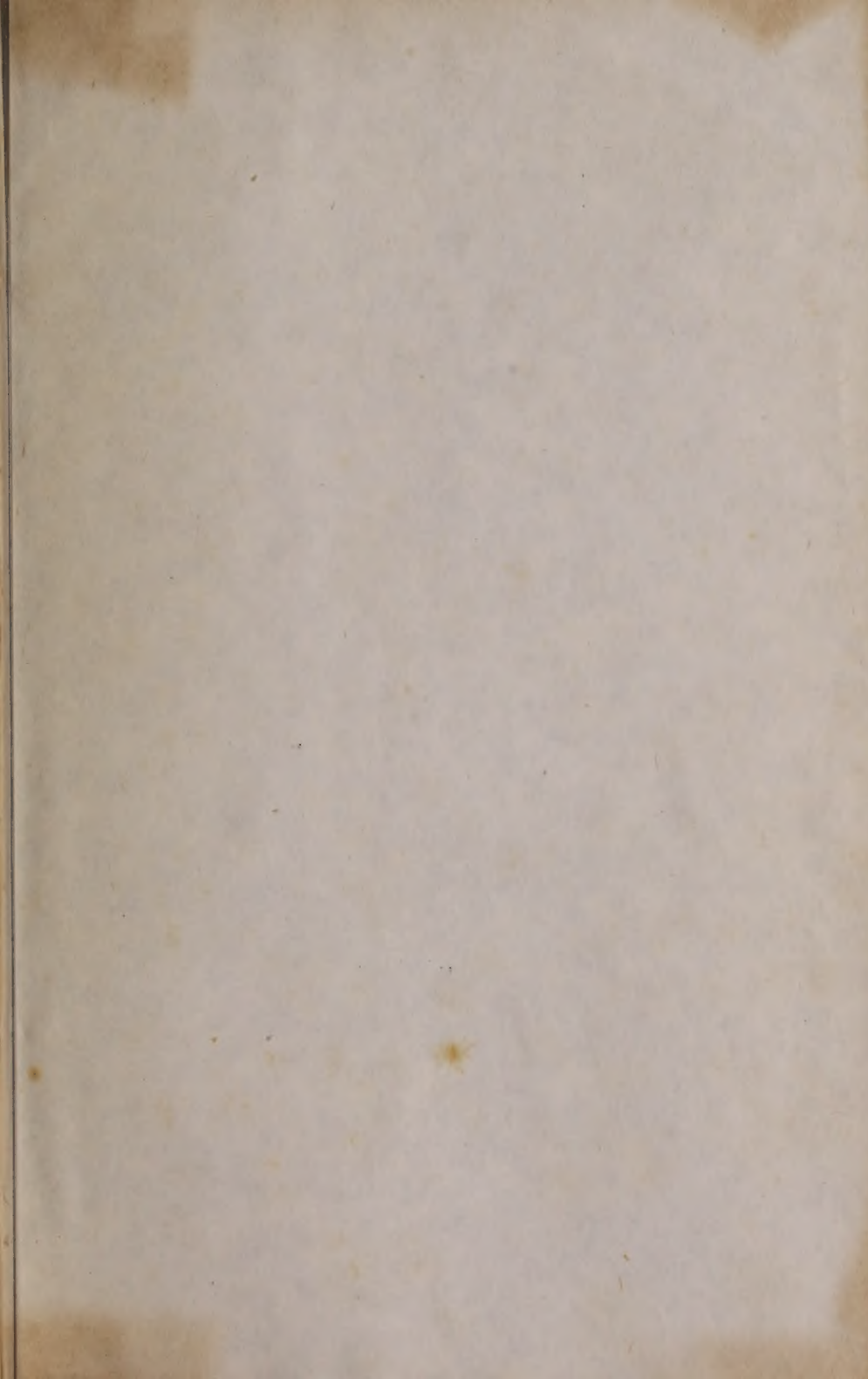

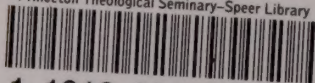
