




FOREWORD

The Tigers finished the remainder of the season in great style. Next at Athens the Clemsonites handed the Georgia Bulldogs a comic valentine

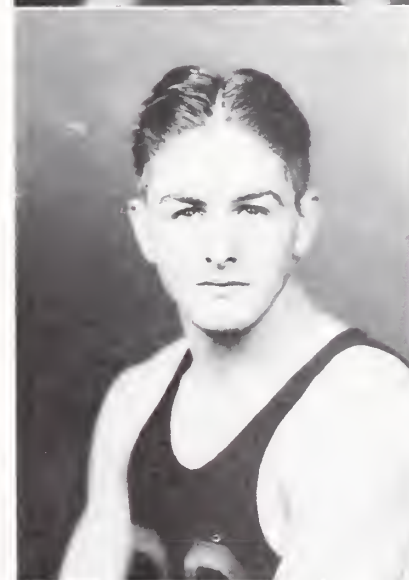

to the degree of 35 to 25. In a return match the Tigers outplayed the former Conference winner in a rough game winning 36 to 29.

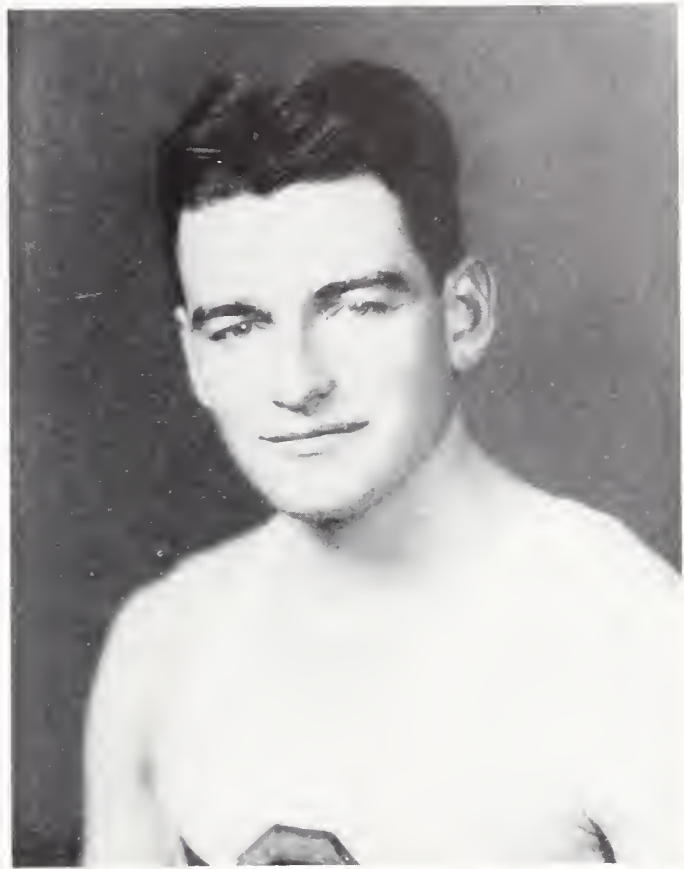

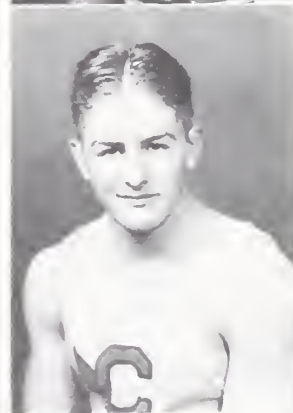

With seven letter men back and other promising material Coach Howard is planning a better team for 1933.

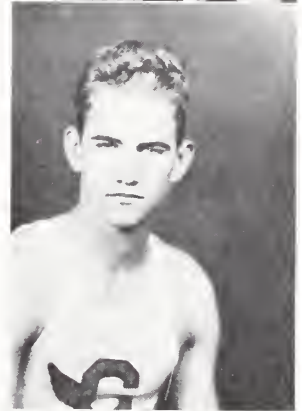
